PENN STATE SET FOR MICHIGAN IN BIG TEN SEMIFINALS

The Penn State men's soccer team, under fourth-year head coach Jeff Cook, continues its postseason run in the Big Ten Tournament on Wednesday, Nov. 10 as its set to host Michigan at Jeffrey Field in the semifinals. Kickoff between the top-seeded Nittany Lions and No. 4-seed Wolverines is set for noon and will broadcast live on Big Ten Network with Chris Vosters (pxp) and Tim Lenahan (analyst) on the call.

PENN STATE IN THE BIG TEN TOURNAMENT

- » Penn State is 33-22-6 (.590) all-time in the Big Ten Tournament since it started in 1991.
- » After winning the Big Ten regular season title, the Nittany Lions received the No. 1 seed in the conference tournament for the first time since 2013 after spending the previous two seasons as the No. 2 seed.
- » Penn State is 3-1-1 all-time as a one-seed and is 1-2-0 against the four-seed.
- » The Nittany Lions are 4-3-0 against the Wolverines in tournament play.
- » Penn State and Michigan have met in the Big Ten Tournament each of head coach **Jeff Cook's** now four seasons at the helm, including the last two seasons in the semifinals. The Nittany Lions won last season's semifinal matchup, 4-1, at Jeffrey Field after falling 1-0 in 2019 in College Park, Md.

LAST TIME OUT - PENN STATE SHUTS OUT MICHIGAN STATE TO ADVANCE IN BIG TEN TOURNAMENT

- » With a goal from Big Ten Offensive Player of the Year **Peter Mangione** just 25 seconds into the match, Penn State set the pace early in the Big Ten Tournament quarterfinals and went on to shut out Michigan State, 2-0, Sunday at Jeffrey Field.
- » Off the opening kickoff, Penn State moved the ball up the field and earned a throw-in nearly in line with the box. **Alex Stevenson** threw the ball into the box, finding Mangione who flicked it over to **Liam Butts** who turned and took an initial shot at the near post that was saved by Michigan State's keeper. But with the ball still in play, Mangione took a diving header that hit off the near post and went in to give the Nittany Lions the lead less than 30 seconds in.
- » In the 17th minute, Butts forced a Spartan turnover around midfield and after fending off multiple green jerseys, Butts passed the ball to **Seth Kuhn** who slotted a perfect pass to **Andrew Privett** running up the left side. Privett took the ball into the box and made a move on a defender before taking a great right-footed strike that went right past the keeper to make it 2-0.
- » Michigan State came out of the halftime break looking to get on the scoreboard and back in the game, firing off a total of 10 shots in the second 45.
- » The Penn State backline in front of goalkeeper **Kris Shakes** stood strong to maintain the shutout while Shakes made three saves in the second half as the Nittany Lions would go on to advance in the tournament.

NOTES AND HEADLINES

GAME-WINNERS ONLY FROM MANGIONE

- » Forward/midfielder **Peter Mangione** is clutch when needed most.
- » The Hunt Valley, Md., native has a career-high seven goals this season, with four the eventual game-winners.
- » Mangione's latest game-winning goal came just 25 seconds into the Big Ten quarterfinal match against Michigan State (11/7).
- » His four game-winning goals is tied for first in the Big Ten and 15th nationally.
- » Mangione has 13 career goals, eight of which are game-winners.

BIG TEN REGULAR SEASON CHAMPIONS

- » For the first time since 2013 and for the sixth time in program history, Penn State won the Big Ten regular season crown, finishing with a 6-2-0 record in conference play to total 18 points.
- » The Nittany Lions had finished runner-up in the league the previous two seasons with a 6-1-1 Big Ten record and were picked to finish second again this season behind Indiana in the coaches' preseason poll.

COACH OF THE YEAR

- » Head coach **Jeff Cook** was named the unanimous 2021 Big Ten Coach of the Year as announced with the rest of the Big Ten Men's Soccer conference awards on Friday.
- » Cook earned the program's fourth overall Coach of the Year award and first since former head coach Bob Warming went back-to-back in 2012-13.
- » In his fourth season at the helm, Cook has brought the Penn State men's soccer program back into the national spotlight with two consecutive trips to the NCAA Tournament (2019, 2020-21) as well as winning this season's conference regular season title.
- » He holds a 37-21-8 overall record in Happy Valley and an impressive 21-7-4 (.719) record in Big Ten play.

OFFENSIVE PLAYER OF THE YEAR

- » Sophomore **Peter Mangione** was named the 2021 Big Ten Offensive Player of the Year as announced by the conference office Friday.
- » His Offensive Player of the Year award is the second Big Ten Player of the Year award under head coach **Jeff Cook's** tutelage, joining Aaron Molloy's Midfielder of the Year nod in 2019.
- » Mangione is the first Offensive Player of the Year since Connor Maloney in 2014.

SIX NITTANY LIONS HONORED IN BIG TEN SEASON AWARDS

- » Highlighted by **Peter Mangione's** Offensive Player of the Year nod as well as head coach **Jeff Cook's** unanimous selection of Coach of the Year, five additional Nittany Lions were honored by the Big Ten with 2021 season awards.
- » Additionally, Mangione and redshirt senior **Brandon Hackenberg** were named to the All-Big Ten First Team and midfielders **Andrew Privett**, **Seth Kuhn** and **Pierre Reedy** were all named to the All-Big Ten Second Team while junior **Alex Stevenson** is Penn State's Sportsmanship Award honoree.

YOU CAN CALL IT A COMEBACK

- » Penn State scored three unanswered goals to top then-No. 7 Maryland, 3-2, in overtime at Jeffrey Field on Tuesday (10/26).
- » The Nittany Lions erased a 2-0 deficit to win for the first time since 2019 when they also did so against a ranked Maryland squad at Jeffrey Field in overtime (10/29/19).
- » The win snapped a tough three-game losing streak for Penn State.

OFFENSIVE WEAPONS

- » Penn State's offense has weapons at every position on the pitch, making it difficult for opposing defenses to keep the ball out of the back of the net.
- » Ten different players have already recorded points this season with junior **Andrew Privett** pacing the Nittany Lions with 20 points on a team-high eight goals and four assists. Sophomore **Peter Mangione** and seniors **Seth Kuhn** and **Danny Bloyou** also each have double-digit points at 16, 13 and 12, respectively.
- » Captain of the midfield, **Seth Kuhn** paces the team with seven assists.
- » Penn State is averaging 1.67 goals per game and 4.94 points per game. The Nittany Lions are second in total goals (30) and total points (89), and third in total assists (29) in the Big Ten.
- » For full national statistical rankings, see page eight.

PRIVETT IN FORM

- » Junior midfielder **Andrew Privett** is really having a breakout year in 2021, currently leading the team in points with 20 on eight goals and four assists.
- » His total goals is tied for first in the conference and 44th in the nation while his total points stands first alone in the league and 62nd nationally.
- » The Fallston, Md., native recorded his first career game-winning goal in overtime against Maryland (10/26), and a single-game career-high three points on a goal and an assist against Villanova (9/21).
- » His statistics are all career highs, surpassing his previous bests of two goals, three assists and seven total points as a freshman in 2019.

KUHN IN THE MIDDLE

- » Senior vice captain **Seth Kuhn** has proven to be an integral piece in Penn State's play, especially on the offensive end creating scoring chances as a central midfielder.
- » Kuhn paces the team with seven assists which is tied for first in the Big Ten and 37th nationally.
- » The Wyomissing, Pa., native's seven assists are a career high, passing his previous of five from his first season in the Blue and White in 2019.
- » He recorded multi-assist games against Syracuse (8/29) and American (9/6) for two on the year. He registered a season-high three points on a goal and the game-winning assist against Maryland (10/26).
- » Kuhn also scored the equalizing goal against Maryland (10/26) for his first of the season and followed up that performance with his first career multi-goal game at Wisconsin (10/31) to help clinch the regular-season crown for the Nittany Lions.
- » Kuhn's 18 career assists is 31st on the NCAA active career leaders list.





NOTES AND HEADLINES

SHAKE YOUR GROOVE THING

- » Junior goalkeeper **Kris Shakes** has posted five shutouts in 2021 against Syracuse (8/29), at Michigan State (10/1), at Rutgers (10/5), at Wisconsin (10/31) and against Michigan State in the Big Ten quarterfinals (11/7).
- » Shakes has averaged 3.47 saves per game and has 52 total saves, third and second in the league, respectively, in those categories.
- » He set a season high with seven saves at Ohio State (10/22).
- » The Parkland, Fla., native has 12 career shutouts, including six in conference play, and 27-7-2 career record.
- » His career save percentage of 0.799 is eighth on the NCAA active career leaders list while his career goals-against average of 0.930 is 26th.

TOP-30 RPI

- » The fifth NCAA RPI ranking for the 2021 season was released Monday and has Penn State ranked No. 25, rising again after a win to start the conference tournament.
- » Five 2021 opponents currently rank ahead of the Nittany Lions: No. 4 Pittsburgh, No. 13 West Virginia, No. 16 Indiana, No. 21 Maryland, and No. 24 Akron.
- » Semifinal opponent Michigan sits just outside the top 30 at No. 33.

- » Earlier in the month, Reedy, along with classmate **Brandon Hackenberg** and senior **Danny Bloyou** were all announced as top-30 candidates for the award.

- » An acronym for Celebrating Loyalty and Achievement for Staying in School, the Senior CLASS Award focuses on the total student-athlete and encourages students to use their platform in athletics to make a positive impact as leaders in their communities.
- » Penn State was one of four schools with multiple candidates while its three candidates were the most of any school.

MIDSEASON TOP 100

- » Redshirt senior defender **Brandon Hackenberg** and senior forward **Danny Bloyou** both made Top Drawer Soccer's Midseason Top 100 update as announced Monday.
- » Hackenberg was ranked No. 46 and Bloyou No. 57.

BIG TEN OFFENSIVE PLAYERS OF THE WEEK

- » Senior midfielder **Seth Kuhn** is the most recent Nittany Lion to be named the Big Ten Offensive Player of the Week (11/2) after his seven-point (3G, 1A) week against Maryland and Wisconsin.
- » It marked Kuhn's first career conference weekly honor.
- » He was also named Top Drawer Soccer's National Player of the Week.
- » Senior forward **Danny Bloyou** (10/12) and sophomore forward/midfielder **Peter Mangione** (9/28) were also honored as Big Ten Offensive Players of the Week earlier this season.

- » Hoffman elected to use his extra year of eligibility granted by the NCAA due to the COVID-19 pandemic.

BLOW YOU AWAY

- » Senior forward **Danny Bloyou** made ESPN SportsCenters' Top 10 Tuesday evening after his amazing header goal against Rutgers came in at No. 2 on the list (10/5).
- » The Accra, Ghana, native scored the game-winning goals for Penn State in back-to-back games at Michigan State (10/1) and at Rutgers (10/5).
- » He totals three goals and six assists for 12 total points so far in 2021.
- » The six assists are second most on the team and surpass a career high of two from a season ago. It ranks fourth in the league and 67th nationally.

MANGIONE MAGIC HAT TRICK

- » Forward/midfielder **Peter Mangione** had three goals against Villanova (9/21) for a single-game career-high six points.
- » It marked the program's first hat trick since Corey Hertzog did so against Old Dominion in the NCAA Tournament in 2010 (11/21/10).
- » Mangione has six goals this season to tie his career best from a season ago. His goal total is fifth in the Big Ten.
