PENN STATE HOSTS MARYLAND TO OPEN 2020-21 SEASON

The Penn State men's soccer team, under third-year head coach Jeff Cook, is set to take the pitch for the first time in 453 days when it hosts Maryland to open the 2020-21 season Friday in Holuba Hall. Kickoff is set for 6 p.m. and will stream live on the subscription based Big Ten Network Plus.

KICKING OFF 2020-21 AT "HOME"

- » Penn State has opened nine of the last 10 seasons with a home game, including the last three-straight.
- » While not being able to play within the friendly confines of Jeffrey Field due to the weather, the Nittany Lions will still enjoy the home atmosphere within Holuba Hall.

PENN STATE AGAINST MARYLAND

- » Penn State and Maryland will meet Friday for the 49th time in program history but the first time as a season-opening game.
- » The Nittany Lions trail the Terrapins in the series, 18-25-5.
- » This will be the first of two meetings between the teams this season as they will play a home-and-home in the conference-only schedule.
- » Last season, Penn State beat Maryland in an overtime thriller at Jeffrey Field, coming back from a 2-0 deficit to win 3-2 in overtime. Then-senior Christian Sload scored the golden goal while the goals in regulation came from returning players **Brandon Hackenberg** and **Kyle May**.
- » The win snapped an eight-game losing streak to the Terrapins as Penn State picked up its first win over Maryland since 2005.

SCOUTING MARYLAND

- » Maryland went 11-8-2 overall and 3-3-2 in Big Ten play during the 2019 season. They lost in the second round of the NCAA Tournament to Wake Forest.
- » The Terrapins return their leading goal-scorer in senior Eric Matzelevich who scored six goals in 2019 and was named second team All-Big Ten.
- » Sophomore Niklas Neumann also returns between the pipes for Maryland. He posted a 9-6-2 record with nine shutouts and earned second-team All-Big Ten honors.
- » Maryland will start the season ranked No. 21 by Top Drawer Soccer.

NOTES AND HEADLINES

2019 IN REVIEW

- » Penn State finished the 2019 season with a 12-4-3 overall record and 6-1-1 record in Big Ten Conference play to finish second in the league. The 12 wins were the most since winning 13 times during the 2014 season while the six conference wins were the most since 2005.
- » The Nittany Lions returned to the NCAA Tournament field for the first time since 2014 and earned a national seeding in the tournament for the first time since 2010.
- » Penn State also went undefeated (6-0-1) on the road during the regular season for the first time since 1995 after not winning a single road game the season before.
- » Then-senior Aaron Molloy and returning players **Brandon Hackenberg** and **Liam Butts** were named to the All-Big Ten First Team, the most first-team honorees for Penn State since 2013.
- » Butts and classmates **Jalen Watson** and **Kris Shakes** were all voted to the Big Ten All-Freshman Team, the most for Penn State since 2008.

UNPRECEDENTED SEASON

- » This season will be unlike any other for the Nittany Lions and the rest of the Big Ten Conference and most of the nation after the traditional fall season was postponed to the spring due to the ongoing COVID-19 pandemic.
- » Penn State will play a 10-game conference-only schedule for 2020-21, facing each opponent once while having a home-and-home with Maryland and Rutgers.
- » The 2020-21 NCAA Men's Soccer Tournament will feature a condensed field of 32 teams compared to a normal 48-team tournament.

MAC HERMANN TROPHY WATCH LIST

- » Sophomore **Liam Butts** was one of 34 players named to the 2020-21 Men's MAC Hermann Trophy Watch List as announced by the United Soccer Coaches and Missouri Athletic Club on Jan. 28.
- » The MAC Hermann Trophy, presented by World Wide Technology, is the most prestigious individual honor in NCAA Division I soccer, widely considered the equivalent of the Heisman Trophy.

NO IFS, ANDS OR BUTTS ABOUT IT

- » Forward **Liam Butts** had a standout rookie season in 2019, recording 19 points on nine goals and one assist.
- » Butts earned United Soccer Coaches All-North Region second-team honors, first-team All-Big Ten honors, and was named to the Big Ten All-Freshman Team in 2019.
- » He registered five game-winning goals for the Nittany Lions, the most in the conference and a mark that stood 16th nationally.
- » His nine goals were the second most in the Big

- Ten and 55th in the nation while the 19 points were third most in the league and 94th nationally.
- » His nine goals is the most by an individual player since Connor Maloney had 10 in 2014.
- » Butts made Top Drawer Soccer's Preseason Best XI second team and is the 23rd-ranked player heading into 2020-21.

SHAKE YOUR GROOVE THING

- » Goalkeeper **Kris Shakes** returns in net for Penn State in 2020-21 after a stellar rookie campaign in 2019.
- » Shakes split time with veteran Josh Levine, playing over 900 minutes in between the pipes with a 0.69 goals against average and .851 save percentage in 10 starts.
- » His 0.691 goals against average is sixth best at Penn State since 1970. He finished second in the league and 11th nationally with that average and was first in the conference and second nationally in save percentage.
- » Shakes finished with a 9-1-0 record on the season with four shutouts.

HACKENBERG PICKED 22ND IN 2021 MLS SUPERDRAFT

- » Redshirt senior **Brandon Hackenberg** was selected 22nd overall by Orlando City SC in the first round of the 2021 Major League Soccer (MLS) SuperDraft on Jan. 21.
- » Hackenberg is the 16th Nittany Lion to be drafted by MLS and the third-highest draftee in program history.
- » He is the second consecutive Penn State player to be drafted in the first round after former teammate Aaron Molloy was picked 16th overall in 2020, also marking the first time in program history that players have been taken in the first round in back-to-back years.
- » He has decided to return this spring to play with Penn State and will be a team captain.

BIG TEN PLAYERS TO WATCH LIST

- » Sophomore **Liam Butts** and redshirt seniors **Brandon Hackenberg** and **Pierre Reedy** were all named to the 2020-21 Big Ten Players to Watch List as announced by the conference office.
- » Butts earns preseason honors for the first time in his career. The forward was a first-team All-Big Ten honoree, a United Soccer Coaches All-North Region second-team honoree, and a member of the Big Ten All-Freshman Team a season ago after leading the Nittany Lions with nine goals, including five game-winners, the most in the conference.
- » Hackenberg, a redshirt senior from Palmyra, Va., earns preseason honors for the second-straight season. The defender and team captain was a first-team All-Big Ten honoree and United Soccer Coaches All-North Region third-team honoree a season ago, starting all but one game on the

- » backline and contributing to six shutouts.
- » Reedy, a redshirt senior from Kutztown, Pa., earns preseason honors for the second-straight season and third time in his career. The midfielder and team captain returned to the pitch in 2019 after missing the previous two seasons due to injury. Reedy had four assists last season in 16 games.

WELL-ROUNDED OFFENSE

- » 17 different Nittany Lions of the 21 field players who played minutes recorded points in the 2019 season, including 13 different goal scorers. 12 of those players return for the 2020-21 season.
- » Penn State scored 38 goals last season, the most since 37 goals were scored during the 2009 season.
- » The Nittany Lions totalled 110 points as a team, the third most in modern program history.
- » Sophomore **Liam Butts** returns as the team's leading goal scorer (9) from 2019 while junior midfielder **Seth Kuhn** returns with the most assists (5) from a season ago.

NATIONAL RECOGNITION

- » Penn State finished the 2019 season ranked No. 18 by United Soccer Coaches.
- » The Nittany Lions cracked the top 25 back on Oct. 22 2019 for the first time since Sept. 22, 2015 and remained in the top 25 the remainder of the season.
- » United Soccer Coaches had a modified ranking system during the traditional fall season with not every team playing and will return to a top-25 poll on Tuesday, Feb. 23.
- » Penn State starts the 2020-21 season ranked No. 23 by Top Drawer Soccer.

FAMILIAR NAMES, FAMILIAR FACES

- » Penn State returns 19 players from the 2019 roster, including Big Ten Preseason Players to Watch **Liam Butts**, **Brandon Hackenberg** and **Pierre Reedy**.
- » Sophomore goalkeeper **Kris Shakes** returns in between the pipes for the Nittany Lions after an impressive rookie campaign where he held a 0.691 goals-against average in 10 starts.

NEW KIDS ON THE BLOCK

- » Penn State adds eight newcomers to the 2020-21 roster, which includes five freshmen, two transfers and one walk-on.
- » Head coach Jeff Cook also added two new members to his staff in assistant coach Clint Long and volunteer assistant Methembe Ndlovu. Long is in charge of the goalkeepers and comes to Happy Valley from Oregon State.

OH CAPTAIN, OUR CAPTAINS

- » Redshirt seniors **Brandon Hackenberg** and **Pierre Reedy** were selected by their teammates as team captains of the 2020-21 Penn State men's soccer

squad.

- » The 2020-21 captaincy will be the second-straight year of leadership for Reedy while it is the first such honor for Hackenberg.

NEXT TIME OUT

Penn State will hit the road for the first time this season, traveling to Piscataway, N.J. to face Rutgers on Tuesday, Feb. 23. The game is slated for a noon kickoff.
