PENN STATE TRAVELS TO RUTGERS FOR MIDDAY MATCH

The Penn State men's soccer team, under third-year head coach Jeff Cook, hits the road for the first time in the 2020-21 season, traveling to Piscataway, N.J. to take on Rutgers on Tuesday, Feb. 23. Kickoff is set for noon at Iron Peaks Sports & Events, an indoor facility in Hillsborough, N.J.

PENN STATE AGAINST RUTGERS

- » Penn State and Rutgers will meet Tuesday for the 23rd time in program history. The Nittany Lions lead the all-time series, 14-8-0.
- » This will be the first of two meetings between the teams this season as they will play a home-and-home in the conference-only schedule.
- » Last season, Penn State beat Rutgers 2-1 in overtime in Piscataway in the regular-season finale. Rutgers took a 1-0 lead late in the second half before then-freshman **Liam Butts** tied the game with just over five minutes to play before then-senior Christian Sload sealed the victory in the first overtime period to clinch a second-place conference finish for the Nittany Lions.
- » Penn State has won the last six-straight contests against the Scarlet Knights.

SCOUTING RUTGERS

- Rutgers, led by second-year head coach Jim McElderry, beat Michigan State, 2-0, in its season opener on Friday.
- » Senior transfer Ritchie Barry and freshman Colin Beasley both scored goals for the Scarlet Knights while Jackson Temple contributed two assists.
- » Sophomore Oren Asher recorded the shutout in between the pipes with five saves.
- » Rutgers won its first Big Ten opener since the 2014 season.

SEASON-OPENER DUB

- » No. 23 Penn State hung on for a 3-2 win over No. 21 Maryland in the season opener Friday night in Holuba Hall.
- » Freshman Peter Mangione recorded three points on one goal and an assist in his collegiate debut, including the eventual gamewinner.
- » Sophomore Andrew Privett and redshirt senior Pierre Reedy also scored goals while junior transfer Danny Bloyou contributed an assist.
- » The Nittany Lions earned their second-straight win over a ranked Terrapins squad. This is the first time since 2004-05 that Penn

State has picked up back-to-back ranked wins over Maryland.

HE'S THE MAN-GIONE

- » Freshman midfielder/forward Peter Mangione had a stellar collegiate debut against Maryland on Friday, recording three points on one goal and one assist.
- » The Hunt Valley, Md. native cracked the starting lineup and played a crucial 59 minutes as the Nittany Lions held on to defeat No. 21 Maryland, 3-2.
- » Mangione scored his first collegiate goal and the eventual game winner in the 35th minute to make it 3-0 Penn State at the time.
- » He also contributed an assist on the first goal of the game for his teammate and roommate **Andrew Privett**.
- Mangione ranks second in the conference and ninth in the nation in points per game (3.00).
 He's also tied first in the conference and nationally for shot accuracy (1.000).

REEDY'S LONG OVERDUE GOAL

- » Redshirt senior and team captain **Pierre Reedy** scored a goal against Maryland in the season opener, his first goal since the 2016 season.
- » Reedy missed the 2017 and 2018 seasons due to injury. He contributed four assists in 2019.

PENN STATE DEBUTS

- » Three newcomers made their Penn State debut on Friday.
- » Freshman Peter Mangione was in the starting XI and recorded three points on one goal and one assist.
- » Junior transfer **Danny Bloyou** and freshman **Femi Awodesu** both came off the bench to help the Nittany Lions. Bloyou recorded one assist for his first collegiate point.

5 GAMES IN 17 DAYS

- » The days will surely fly by this season as the 2020-21 Big Ten schedule has teams playing games every four days.
- » Penn State will play five games in 17 days to kick off the year, including three road games in that stretch.

UNPRECEDENTED SEASON

- » This season will be unlike any other for the Nittany Lions and the rest of the Big Ten Conference and most of the nation after the traditional fall season was postponed to the spring due to the ongoing COVID-19 pandemic.
- » Penn State will play a 10-game conference-only schedule for 2020-21, facing each opponent once while having a home-and-home with Maryland and Rutgers.
- » The 2020-21 NCAA Men's Soccer Tournament will feature a condensed field of 32 teams compared

to a normal 48-team tournament.

MAC HERMANN TROPHY WATCH LIST

- Sophomore Liam Butts was one of 34 players named to the 2020-21 Men's MAC Hermann Trophy Watch List as announced by the United Soccer Coaches and Missouri Athletic Club on Jan. 28.
- » The MAC Hermann Trophy, presented by World Wide Technology, is the most prestigious individual honor in NCAA Division I soccer, widely considered the equivalent of the Heisman Trophy.

HACKENBERG PICKED 22ND IN 2021 MLS SUPERDRAFT

- » Redshirt senior Brandon Hackenberg was selected 22nd overall by Orlando City SC in the first round of the 2021 Major League Soccer (MLS) SuperDraft on Jan. 21.
- » Hackenberg is the 16th Nittany Lion to be drafted by MLS and the third-highest draftee in program history.
- » He is the second consecutive Penn State player to be drafted in the first round after former teammate Aaron Molloy was picked 16th overall in 2020, also marking the first time in program history that players have been taken in the first round in back-to-back years.
- » He has decided to return this spring to play with Penn State and will be a team captain.

BIG TEN PLAYERS TO WATCH LIST

- Sophomore Liam Butts and redshirt seniors Brandon Hackenberg and Pierre Reedy were all named to the 2020-21 Big Ten Players to Watch List as announced by the conference office.
- » Butts earns preseason honors for the first time in his career. The forward was a first-team All-Big Ten honoree, a United Soccer Coaches All-North Region second-team honoree, and a member of the Big Ten All-Freshman Team a season ago after leading the Nittany Lions with nine goals, including five game-winners, the most in the conference.
- » Hackenberg, a redshirt senior from Palmyra, Va., earns preseason honors for the second-straight season. The defender and team captain was a first-team All-Big Ten honoree and United Soccer Coaches All-North Region third-team honoree a season ago, starting all but one game on the backline and contributing to six shutouts.
- » Reedy, a redshirt senior from Kutztown, Pa., earns preseason honors for the second-straight season and third time in his career. The midfielder and team captain returned to the pitch in 2019 after missing the previous two seasons due to injury. Reedy had four assists last season in 16 games.

NATIONAL RECOGNITION

» After a win over a ranked Maryland squad, Penn State moved up three spots in the national

rankings from Top Drawer Soccer to No. 20.

- » Three other Big Ten teams are also ranked in the top 25: Indiana (No. 7), Maryland (No. 23) and Michigan (No. 24).
- » The Nittany Lions finished the 2019 season ranked No. 18 by United Soccer Coaches.
- » United Soccer Coaches had a modified ranking system during the traditional fall season with not every team playing and will return to a top-25 poll on Tuesday, Feb. 23.

FAMILIAR NAMES, FAMILIAR FACES

- » Penn State returns 19 players from the 2019 roster, including Big Ten Preseason Players to Watch Liam Butts, Brandon Hackenberg and Pierre Reedy.
- » Sophomore goalkeeper **Kris Shakes** returns in between the pipes for the Nittany Lions after an impressive rookie campaign where he held a 0.691 goals-against average in 10 starts.

NEW KIDS ON THE BLOCK

- » Penn State adds eight newcomers to the 2020-21 roster, which includes five freshmen, two transfers and one walk-on.
- Head coach Jeff Cook also added two new members to his staff in assistant coach Clint Long and volunteer assistant Methembe Ndlovu. Long is in charge of the goalkeepers and comes to Happy Valley from Oregon State.

OH CAPTAIN, OUR CAPTAINS

- » Redshirt seniors Brandon Hackenberg and Pierre Reedy were selected by their teammates as team captains of the 2020-21 Penn State men's soccer squad.
- » The 2020-21 captaincy will be the secondstraight year of leadership for Reedy while it is the first such honor for Hackenberg.

2019 IN REVIEW

- » Penn State finished the 2019 season with a 12-4-3 overall record and 6-1-1 record in Big Ten Conference play to finish second in the league. The 12 wins were the most since winning 13 times during the 2014 season while the six conference wins were the most since 2005.
- » The Nittany Lions returned to the NCAA Tournament field for the first time since 2014 and earned a national seeding in the tournament for the first time since 2010.
- » Penn State also went undefeated (6-0-1) on the road during the regular season for the first time since 1995 after not winning a single road game the season before.
- » Offensively, 17 different Nittany Lions recorded points, totalling to 110 points as a team, the third most in modern program history. Penn State recorded 38 goals, the most since 2009.
- » Then-senior Aaron Molloy and returning players Brandon Hackenberg and Liam Butts were

named to the All-Big Ten First Team, the most first-team honorees for Penn State since 2013.

» Butts and classmates Jalen Watson and Kris Shakes were all voted to the Big Ten All-Freshman Team, the most for Penn State since 2008.

NEXT TIME OUT

Penn State returns to University Park to face Michigan State on Saturday, Feb. 27 in Holuba Hall. Kickoff is set for 2 p.m. and the game will be streamed on Big Ten Network+.
