PENN STATE SET TO HOST MICHIGAN STATE SATURDAY

The Penn State men's soccer team, under third-year head coach Jeff Cook, is back home to host Michigan State on Saturday, Feb. 27 at 2 p.m. in Holuba Hall. The game will be streamed live on Big Ten Network+.

PENN STATE AGAINST MICHIGAN STATE

- » Penn State and Michigan State will face off Saturday for the 42nd time in program history. The Nittany Lions lead the all-time series, 23-16-2.
- » Last season, Penn State beat Michigan State, 3-0, in the first road conference game of the year to extend its unbeaten streak to seven games at the time. Then-freshman **Liam Butts** recorded his first multi-goal game of his career and his second game-winning goal of the season.

SCOUTING MICHIGAN STATE

- » Michigan State, led by 12th-year head coach Damon Rensing, comes to Happy Valley with a 0-2-0 record with losses to Rutgers and Michigan to start the season.
- » The Spartans have been unable to find the back of the net yet this season, but not without effort. As a team, MSU is averaging 7.5 shots per game, led by Farai Mutatu who has a team-high four shots.
- » In net, Hunter Morse has four saves on the year.

LAST TIME OUT

- » No. 20 Penn State beat Rutgers, 2-1, Tuesday afternoon at Iron Peaks Sports & Events in Hillsborough, N.J. for its first road win of the season and its seventh-straight win over the Scarlet Knights.
- » Head coach Jeff Cook picked up his 200th career win as a collegiate head coach with the victory.
- » Freshman **Peter Mangione** scored the game-winning goal for the second-straight game, finding the back of the net in the 36th minute, just about 90 seconds after Rutgers scored the equalizer.
- » Junior transfer **Danny Bloyou** scored his first career goal and the first of the game in the ninth minute after sophomore **Alex Stevenson** played a long ball in from the right side to Bloyou in the box.
- » Redshirt freshman **Owen Elliott** made his first career start in net and earned the victory with three big saves.
- » The Nittany Lions start the season 2-0 for the first time since 2014 when that team started 3-0.

NOTES AND HEADLINES

200 CAREER WINS

- » Head coach Jeff Cook picked up his 200th career win as a collegiate head coach in Tuesday's victory at Rutgers.
- » Cook has 23 years of collegiate head coaching experience, with stints at Wheaton College, Cincinnati and Dartmouth before coming to Penn State in 2018.
- » He is 20-13-5 so far in his third season as the leader of the Nittany Lions.

BIG TEN OFFENSIVE PLAYER OF THE WEEK

- » Freshman midfielder/forward **Peter Mangione** was named the Big Ten Offensive Player of the Week on Wednesday, Feb. 24.
- » Mangione earned the honor after scoring two-straight game-winning goals against Maryland and Rutgers and adding an assist in his first week of collegiate soccer.
- » He was also named to College Soccer News' Team of the Week.

HE'S THE MAN-GIONE

- » Freshman midfielder/forward **Peter Mangione** had quite the first week as a collegiate soccer player.
- » The Hunt Valley, Md., native scored both the game-winning goals for Penn State against No. 21 Maryland and on the road at Rutgers. He also added an assist against Maryland.
- » He has five points through the first two games, good for second in the conference. His average 2.50 points per game is also second in the Big Ten and a top-20 mark in the country.
- » Mangione is first in the conference and third in the nation with his two game-winners.

KUHN IN THE MIDDLE

- » Junior **Seth Kuhn** has been a leader in the middle of the field for the Nittany Lions as a central midfielder.
- » Kuhn was considered an honorable mention on Top Drawer Soccer's Team of the Week for the week of Feb. 15-21.

REEDY'S LONG OVERDUE GOAL

- » Redshirt senior and team captain **Pierre Reedy** scored a goal against Maryland in the season opener, his first goal since the 2016 season.
- » Reedy missed the 2017 and 2018 seasons due to injury. He contributed four assists in 2019.

PENN STATE DEBUTS

- » Five Nittany Lions have made their Penn State debuts this season.
- » Freshmen **Peter Mangione** and **Femi Awodesu** and junior transfer **Danny Bloyou** all made their debuts in the season opener against Maryland.
- » Redshirt freshman **Owen Elliott** made his first career start in net at Rutgers. Freshman **Tyger Evans** also debuted against Rutgers off the

bench.

5 GAMES IN 17 DAYS

- » The days will surely fly by this season as the 2020-21 Big Ten schedule has teams playing games every four days.
- » Penn State will play five games in 17 days to kick off the year, including three road games in that stretch.

UNPRECEDENTED SEASON

- » This season will be unlike any other for the Nittany Lions and the rest of the Big Ten Conference and most of the nation after the traditional fall season was postponed to the spring due to the ongoing COVID-19 pandemic.
- » Penn State will play a 10-game conference-only schedule for 2020-21, facing each opponent once while having a home-and-home with Maryland and Rutgers.
- » The 2020-21 NCAA Men's Soccer Tournament will feature a condensed field of 32 teams compared to a normal 48-team tournament.

MAC HERMANN TROPHY WATCH LIST

- » Sophomore **Liam Butts** was one of 34 players named to the 2020-21 Men's MAC Hermann Trophy Watch List as announced by the United Soccer Coaches and Missouri Athletic Club on Jan. 28.
- » The MAC Hermann Trophy, presented by World Wide Technology, is the most prestigious individual honor in NCAA Division I soccer, widely considered the equivalent of the Heisman Trophy.

HACKENBERG PICKED 22ND IN 2021 MLS SUPERDRAFT

- » Redshirt senior **Brandon Hackenberg** was selected 22nd overall by Orlando City SC in the first round of the 2021 Major League Soccer (MLS) SuperDraft on Jan. 21.
- » Hackenberg is the 16th Nittany Lion to be drafted by MLS and the third-highest draftee in program history.
- » He is the second consecutive Penn State player to be drafted in the first round after former teammate Aaron Molloy was picked 16th overall in 2020, also marking the first time in program history that players have been taken in the first round in back-to-back years.
- » He has decided to return this spring to play with Penn State and will be a team captain.

BIG TEN PLAYERS TO WATCH LIST

- » Sophomores **Liam Butts** and redshirt seniors **Brandon Hackenberg** and **Pierre Reedy** were all named to the 2020-21 Big Ten Players to Watch List as announced by the conference office.
- » Butts earns preseason honors for the first time in his career. The forward was a first-team All-Big Ten honoree, a United Soccer Coaches All-North

Region second-team honoree, and a member of the Big Ten All-Freshman Team a season ago after leading the Nittany Lions with nine goals, including five game-winners, the most in the conference.

- » Hackenberg, a redshirt senior from Palmyra, Va., earns preseason honors for the second-straight season. The defender and team captain was a first-team All-Big Ten honoree and United Soccer Coaches All-North Region third-team honoree a season ago, starting all but one game on the backline and contributing to six shutouts.
- » Reedy, a redshirt senior from Kutztown, Pa., earns preseason honors for the second-straight season and third time in his career. The midfielder and team captain returned to the pitch in 2019 after missing the previous two seasons due to injury. Reedy had four assists last season in 16 games.

NATIONAL RECOGNITION

- » After a win over a ranked Maryland squad, Penn State moved up three spots in the national rankings from Top Drawer Soccer to No. 20.
- » Three other Big Ten teams are also ranked in the top 25: Indiana (No. 7), Maryland (No. 23) and Michigan (No. 24).
- » The Nittany Lions finished the 2019 season ranked No. 18 by United Soccer Coaches.
- » United Soccer Coaches had a modified ranking system during the traditional fall season with not every team playing and will return to a top-25 poll on Tuesday, March 2.

FAMILIAR NAMES, FAMILIAR FACES

- » Penn State returns 19 players from the 2019 roster, including Big Ten Preseason Players to Watch **Liam Butts**, **Brandon Hackenberg** and **Pierre Reedy**.
- » Sophomore goalkeeper **Kris Shakes** returns in between the pipes for the Nittany Lions after an impressive rookie campaign where he held a 0.691 goals-against average in 10 starts.

NEW KIDS ON THE BLOCK

- » Penn State adds eight newcomers to the 2020-21 roster, which includes five freshmen, two transfers and one walk-on.
- » Head coach Jeff Cook also added two new members to his staff in assistant coach Clint Long and volunteer assistant Methembe Ndlovu. Long is in charge of the goalkeepers and comes to Happy Valley from Oregon State.

OH CAPTAIN, OUR CAPTAINS

- » Redshirt seniors **Brandon Hackenberg** and **Pierre Reedy** were selected by their teammates as team captains of the 2020-21 Penn State men's soccer squad.
- » The 2020-21 captaincy will be the second-straight year of leadership for Reedy while it is the first such honor for Hackenberg.

2019 IN REVIEW

- » Penn State finished the 2019 season with a 12-4-3 overall record and 6-1-1 record in Big Ten Conference play to finish second in the league. The 12 wins were the most since winning 13 times during the 2014 season while the six conference wins were the most since 2005.
- » The Nittany Lions returned to the NCAA Tournament field for the first time since 2014 and earned a national seeding in the tournament for the first time since 2010.
- » Penn State also went undefeated (6-0-1) on the road during the regular season for the first time since 1995 after not winning a single road game the season before.
- » Offensively, 17 different Nittany Lions recorded points, totalling to 110 points as a team, the third most in modern program history. Penn State recorded 38 goals, the most since 2009.
- » Then-senior Aaron Molloy and returning players **Brandon Hackenberg** and **Liam Butts** were named to the All-Big Ten First Team, the most first-team honorees for Penn State since 2013.
- » Butts and classmates **Jalen Watson** and **Kris Shakes** were all voted to the Big Ten All-Freshman Team, the most for Penn State since 2008.

NEXT TIME OUT

Penn State hits the road for a two-game roadstand to kick off the month of March. The Nittany Lions will first play at Michigan on Wednesday, March 3. Kickoff is currently set for 11 a.m.
