#### PENN STATE READY FOR MONDAY MATCH WITH RUTGERS ON BTN

The Penn State men's soccer team, under third-year head coach Jeff Cook, returns to the pitch Monday to host Rutgers at Jeffrey Field. Kickoff is set for noon and will be broadcast live on Big Ten Network with Chris Vosters (pxp) and Chris Doran (analyst) on the call.

#### **PENN STATE AGAINST RUTGERS**

- Penn State and Rutgers face off for the second time this season on the back end of a home-and-home series.
- The Nittany Lions won the first match against the Scarlet Knights, 2-1, in Piscataway back on Feb. 23, powered by goals from **Danny** Bloyou and Peter Mangione. Head coach Jeff Cook picked up his 200th career win with the victory.
- Penn State leads the all-time series over Rutgers, 15-8-0, including seven-straight wins.

## **SCOUTING RUTGERS**

- Rutgers, led by second-year head coach Jim McElderry is 3-2 through the first half of the regular season, including a convincing 2-0 win over Maryland.
- Senior Ritchie Barry leads the Scarlet Knights with six points on a team-high three goals while sophomore Jackson Temple also has six points on two goals and two assists. Temple had a penalty-kick goal against the Nittany Lions in the teams' first match-up this season.
- In net, sophomore Oren Asher has earned two Big Ten Defensive Player of the Week honors this season. He holds a 0.60 goals against average and a .880 save percentage with 22 total saves and three shutouts.

#### LAST TIME OUT

- Then-No. 20 Penn State lost a heartbreaker in the final minutes to Michigan State on Saturday, Feb. 27 at Holuba Hall.
- It was a close, back-and-forth defensive battle for the first 85 minutes of the game as neither team could find the back of the net.
- The Spartans were able to set up a corner kick in the 87th minute that set up a weird sequence of play in which Jack Beck's shot rang off the far post and was somehow able to find the back of the net for the eventual 1-0 winning scoreline.
- Both sophomore Liam Butts and junior transfer Danny Bloyou registered two shots for the Nittany Lions, but neither could find that goal Penn State needed.

# **NOTES AND HEADLINES**

## **TWO GAMES POSTPONED**

- Penn State's games at Michigan and Indiana scheduled for Wednesday, March 3 and Saturday, March 7, respectively, were postponed due to positive COVID-19 results among Penn State's Tier 1 personnel.
- The institutions will work with the Big Ten Conference to identify rescheduling options.

### **200 CAREER WINS**

- Head coach Jeff Cook picked up his 200th career win as a collegiate head coach in the victory at Rutaers.
- Cook has 23 years of collegiate head coaching experience, with stints at Wheaton College, Cincinnati and Dartmouth before coming to Penn State in 2018.
- He is 20-14-5 so far in his third season as the leader of the Nittany Lions.

#### **HE'S THE MAN-GIONE**

- Freshman midfielder/forward Peter Mangione had quite the first week as a collegiate soccer
- The Hunt Valley, Md., native scored both the game-winning goals for Penn State against No. 21 Maryland and on the road at Rutgers. He also added an assist against Maryland.
- He has five points through the first three games, good for fourth in the conference.
- Mangione is tied first in the conference and ninth in the nation with his two game-winners.
- He was named Big Ten Offensive Player of the Week on Feb. 24 as well as being named to College Soccer News' Team of the Week.

# **KUHN IN THE MIDDLE**

- Junior **Seth Kuhn** has been a leader in the middle of the field for the Nittany Lions as a central
- Kuhn was considered an honorable mention on Top Drawer Soccer's Team of the Week for the week of Feb. 15-21.

## **REEDY'S LONG OVERDUE GOAL**

- Redshirt senior and team captain Pierre Reedy scored a goal against Maryland in the season opener, his first goal since the 2016 season.
- Reedy missed the 2017 and 2018 seasons due to injury. He contributed four assists in 2019.

### **PENN STATE DEBUTS**

- Five Nittany Lions have made their Penn State debuts this season.
- Freshmen Peter Mangione and Femi Awodesu and junior transfer Danny Bloyou all made their debuts in the season opener against Maryland.
- Redshirt freshman **Owen Elliott** made his first career start in net at Rutgers. Freshman Tyger **Evans** also debuted against Rutgers off the bench.

#### UNPRECEDENTED SEASON

- This season will be unlike any other for the Nittany Lions and the rest of the Big Ten Conference and most of the nation after the traditional fall season was postponed to the spring due to the ongoing COVID-19 pandemic.
- Penn State will play a 10-game conference-only schedule for 2020-21, facing each opponent once while having a home-and-home with Maryland and Rutgers.
- The 2020-21 NCAA Men's Soccer Tournament will feature a condensed field of 32 teams compared to a normal 48-team tournament.

#### MAC HERMANN TROPHY WATCH LIST

- Sophomore Liam Butts was one of 34 players named to the 2020-21 Men's MAC Hermann Trophy Watch List as announced by the United Soccer Coaches and Missouri Athletic Club on Jan. 28.
- The MAC Hermann Trophy, presented by World Wide Technology, is the most prestigious individual honor in NCAA Division I soccer, widely considered the equivalent of the Heisman Trophy.

#### NATIONAL RECOGNITION

- After a tough loss to Michigan State, Penn State fell out of the top 25 polls.
- The Nittany Lions are still receiving votes for two-straight weeks now in the United Soccer Coaches ranking.

### **HACKENBERG PICKED 22ND IN 2021 MLS SUPERDRAFT**

- Redshirt senior **Brandon Hackenberg** was selected 22nd overall by Orlando City SC in the first round of the 2021 Major League Soccer (MLS) SuperDraft on Jan. 21.
- Hackenberg is the 16th Nittany Lion to be drafted by MLS and the third-highest draftee in program history.
- He is the second consecutive Penn State player to be drafted in the first round after former teammate Aaron Molloy was picked 16th overall in 2020, also marking the first time in program history that players have been taken in the first round in back-to-back years.
- He has decided to return this spring to play with Penn State and will be a team captain.

### **BIG TEN PLAYERS TO WATCH LIST**

- Sophomore Liam Butts and redshirt seniors Brandon Hackenberg and Pierre Reedy were all named to the 2020-21 Big Ten Players to Watch List as announced by the conference office.
- Butts earns preseason honors for the first time in his career. The forward was a first-team All-Big Ten honoree, a United Soccer Coaches All-North Region second-team honoree, and a member of the Big Ten All-Freshman Team a season ago after leading the Nittany Lions with nine goals,

- including five game-winners, the most in the conference.
- Hackenberg, a redshirt senior from Palmyra, Va., earns preseason honors for the second-straight season. The defender and team captain was a first-team All-Big Ten honoree and United Soccer Coaches All-North Region third-team honoree a season ago, starting all but one game on the backline and contributing to six shutouts.
- Reedy, a redshirt senior from Kutztown, Pa., earns preseason honors for the second-straight season and third time in his career. The midfielder and team captain returned to the pitch in 2019 after missing the previous two seasons due to injury. Reedy had four assists last season in 16 games.

## **FAMILIAR NAMES, FAMILIAR FACES**

- Penn State returns 19 players from the 2019 roster, including Big Ten Preseason Players to Watch Liam Butts, Brandon Hackenberg and Pierre Reedv.
- Sophomore goalkeeper Kris Shakes returns in between the pipes for the Nittany Lions after an impressive rookie campaign where he held a 0.691 goals-against average in 10 starts.

#### **NEW KIDS ON THE BLOCK**

- Penn State adds eight newcomers to the 2020-21 roster, which includes five freshmen, two transfers and one walk-on.
- Head coach Jeff Cook also added two new members to his staff in assistant coach Clint Long and volunteer assistant Methembe Ndlovu. Long is in charge of the goalkeepers and comes to Happy Valley from Oregon State.

## OH CAPTAIN, OUR CAPTAINS

- Redshirt seniors Brandon Hackenberg and Pierre Reedy were selected by their teammates as team captains of the 2020-21 Penn State men's soccer squad.
- The 2020-21 captaincy will be the secondstraight year of leadership for Reedy while it is the first such honor for Hackenberg.

#### **2019 IN REVIEW**

- Penn State finished the 2019 season with a 12-4-3 overall record and 6-1-1 record in Big Ten Conference play to finish second in the league. The 12 wins were the most since winning 13 times during the 2014 season while the six conference wins were the most since 2005.
- The Nittany Lions returned to the NCAA Tournament field for the first time since 2014 and earned a national seeding in the tournament for the first time since 2010.
- Penn State also went undefeated (6-0-1) on the road during the regular season for the first time since 1995 after not winning a single road game the season before.
- Offensively, 17 different Nittany Lions recorded

- points, totalling to 110 points as a team, the third most in modern program history. Penn State recorded 38 goals, the most since 2009.
- Then-senior Aaron Molloy and returning players Brandon Hackenberg and Liam Butts were named to the All-Big Ten First Team, the most first-team honorees for Penn State since 2013.
- Butts and classmates Jalen Watson and Kris Shakes were all voted to the Big Ten All-Freshman Team, the most for Penn State since 2008.

#### **NEXT TIME OUT**

Penn State will travel to Evanston, III. to face Northwestern on Friday, March 19. The game is slated for a 1 p.m. kickoff live on Big Ten Network.
