PENN STATE HEADS TO NORTHWESTERN FRIDAY

The Penn State men's soccer team, under third-year head coach Jeff Cook, heads to Evanston, III. to face the Northwestern Wildcats on Friday, March 19. The game is set for a 1 p.m. ET/noon CT kickoff and will be broadcast live on Big Ten Network with Dean Linke (pxp) and Chris Doran (analyst) on the call.

PENN STATE AGAINST NORTHWESTERN

- Penn State and Northwestern face off for the 38th time in program history Friday. The Nittany Lions lead the all-time series, 26-8-4.
- The Nittany Lions and the Wildcats last matched up during the 2019 season. The regular-season game at Jeffrey Field on Oct. 12, 2019 went to overtime after being tied 2-2 at the end of regulation. Then-freshman Liam Butts scored twice in the contest, including the golden goal in overtime.

SCOUTING NORTHWESTERN

- » The Northwestern Wildcats are led by head coach Tim Lenahan who is in his 19th and final season at the helm in Evanston.
- » Northwestern is 2-3-1 so far this season, including a 1-0 shutout of Indiana back on Feb. 27.
- Sophomore Ugo Achara Jr. paces the Wildcats with 11 points on five goals and one assist. His five goals are tied for first in the conference and is 11th in the nation while the 11 total points are also tied first in the league and 18th nationally. Achara Jr. was named Top Drawer Soccer's and College Soccer News' Player of the Week on March 2 after recording two goals and an assist in a win over Wisconsin.
- » In net, senior Miha Miskovic has seen the most minutes for Northwestern at 331:09. He holds a 2.45 goals-against average and a .609 save percentage with 14 total saves and one shutout. Miskovic was named Big Ten Defensive Player of the Week on March 2 after a win in net over Indiana.
- » Grad student Ethan Bandre has played 225:02 minutes in between the pipes, including the post recent game against the Badgers of Wisconsin, and holds a 1.60 goals-against average and .714 save percentage with 10 saves.

LAST TIME OUT

After a two-week lay off from game action due to COVID postponements and a regularly-scheduled bye week, Penn State returned to the pitch on Jeffrey Field in high fashion with a

convincing 4-2 win over Rutgers live on Big Ten Network on Monday, March 15.

- » The Nittany Lion offense put together what head coach Jeff Cook said was "as dangerous as we've looked going forward in recent time," led in part by junior transfer Danny Bloyou's two goals and junior Seth Kuhn's goal and assist in the outing.
- » Bloyou scored the opening goal in the 25th minute on assists from sophomores Liam Butts and Andrew Privett to get Penn State on the board first.
- » Not even three minutes later, Rutgers was issued a yellow card right outside the 18 that set up a Penn State free kick that Kuhn took right to the back of the net for a two-goal advantage.
- » The Scarlet Knights got back within one in the 34th minute to make it a 2-1 game going into the break.
- » The offensive firepower continued right out of halftime as Kuhn chipped a long pass to captain **Pierre Reedy** who beat the Rutgers goalkeeper for his second goal of the season and another two-goal lead.
- » Rutgers countered right back with a goal in the 54th minute but Penn State was able to put the game out of reach in the 77th minute as freshman **Tyger Evans** battled the Rutgers defense in the box to find Bloyou who blasted it with his left foot for his second goal of the game.
- » Penn State won its eighth-straight game over Rutgers and moved to 3-1-0 on the season.

BLOYOU BLASTS

- » Junior transfer Danny Bloyou has incredible speed that he's been able to utilize to beat opposing defenders and find the back of the net.
- » Bloyou now has a team-high seven points on a team-high three goals and one assist after a two-goal performance against Rutgers on Monday.
- » It marked the Philadelphia, Pa., native's first career multi-goal game for a single-game career-high four points.
- » All three of Bloyou's goals so far this season have come against the Scarlet Knights.
- » His three goals is fourth-most in the Big Ten as is his seven total points.

KUHN IN THE MIDDLE

- » Junior Seth Kuhn has been a leader in the middle of the field for the Nittany Lions as a central midfielder.
- » The Wyomissing, Pa., native had a single-game career high three-point performance in Penn State's most recent game against Rutgers with one goal and an assist.
- » Kuhn was considered an honorable mention on Top Drawer Soccer's Team of the Week for the week of Feb. 15-21.

OFFENSIVE FIREPOWER

» Penn State had an offensive outbreak in its most

recent game, scoring a season-high four goals at Jeffrey Field against Rutgers on Monday.

- The four goals are the most in a conference game for the Nittany Lions since scoring six against Rutgers during the 2017 season (10/22/17).
- » Penn State took a season-high 20 shots during the game, the most since taking 18 against Pitt last season (10/15/19). The team is averaging 13.75 shots per game to lead the Big Ten.
- » Nine players have recorded points this season.

HE'S THE MAN-GIONE

- » Freshman midfielder/forward **Peter Mangione** had quite the first week as a collegiate soccer player.
- The Hunt Valley, Md., native scored both the game-winning goals for Penn State against No. 21 Maryland and on the road at Rutgers. He also added an assist against Maryland.
- » Mangione is tied first in the conference and 11th in the nation with his two game-winners.
- » He was named Big Ten Offensive Player of the Week on Feb. 24 as well as being named to College Soccer News' Team of the Week.

TWO GAMES POSTPONED

- » Penn State's games at Michigan and Indiana scheduled for Wednesday, March 3 and Saturday, March 7, respectively, were postponed due to positive COVID-19 results among Penn State's Tier 1 personnel.
- » The institutions will work with the Big Ten Conference to identify rescheduling options.

200 CAREER WINS

- » Head coach Jeff Cook picked up his 200th career win as a collegiate head coach in the victory at Rutgers on Feb. 23.
- » Cook has 23 years of collegiate head coaching experience, with stints at Wheaton College, Cincinnati and Dartmouth before coming to Penn State in 2018.

REEDY'S LONG OVERDUE GOAL

- » Redshirt senior and team captain **Pierre Reedy** scored a goal against Maryland in the season opener, his first goal since the 2016 season.
- » Reedy missed the 2017 and 2018 seasons due to injury. He contributed four assists in 2019.

PENN STATE DEBUTS

- » Five Nittany Lions have made their Penn State debuts this season.
- » Freshmen **Peter Mangione** and **Femi Awodesu** and junior transfer **Danny Bloyou** all made their debuts in the season opener against Maryland.
- » Redshirt freshman Owen Elliott made his first career start in net at Rutgers. Freshman Tyger Evans also debuted against Rutgers off the bench.





NOTES AND HEADLINES

UNPRECEDENTED SEASON

- » This season will be unlike any other for the Nittany Lions and the rest of the Big Ten Conference and most of the nation after the traditional fall season was postponed to the spring due to the ongoing COVID-19 pandemic.
- » Penn State will play a 10-game conference-only schedule for 2020-21, facing each opponent once while having a home-and-home with Maryland and Rutgers.
- » The 2020-21 NCAA Men's Soccer Tournament will feature a condensed field of 32 teams compared to a normal 48-team tournament.

MAC HERMANN TROPHY WATCH LIST

- » Sophomore Liam Butts was one of 34 players named to the 2020-21 Men's MAC Hermann Trophy Watch List as announced by the United Soccer Coaches and Missouri Athletic Club on Jan. 28.
- » The MAC Hermann Trophy, presented by World Wide Technology, is the most prestigious individual honor in NCAA Division I soccer, widely considered the equivalent of the Heisman Trophy.

NATIONAL RECOGNITION

- » After a tough loss to Michigan State on Feb. 27, Penn State fell out of the top 25 polls.
- » The Nittany Lions are still receiving votes for three-straight weeks now in the United Soccer Coaches ranking.

HACKENBERG PICKED 22ND IN 2021 MLS SUPERDRAFT

- » Redshirt senior Brandon Hackenberg was selected 22nd overall by Orlando City SC in the first round of the 2021 Major League Soccer (MLS) SuperDraft on Jan. 21.
- » Hackenberg is the 16th Nittany Lion to be drafted by MLS and the third-highest draftee in program history.
- » He is the second consecutive Penn State player to be drafted in the first round after former teammate Aaron Molloy was picked 16th overall in 2020, also marking the first time in program history that players have been taken in the first round in back-to-back years.
- » He has decided to return this spring to play with Penn State and will be a team captain.

BIG TEN PLAYERS TO WATCH LIST

- » Sophomore Liam Butts and redshirt seniors Brandon Hackenberg and Pierre Reedy were all named to the 2020-21 Big Ten Players to Watch List as announced by the conference office.
- » Butts earns preseason honors for the first time in his career. The forward was a first-team All-Big Ten honoree, a United Soccer Coaches All-North Region second-team honoree, and a member of the Big Ten All-Freshman Team a season ago after leading the Nittany Lions with nine goals,

including five game-winners, the most in the conference.

- » Hackenberg, a redshirt senior from Palmyra, Va., earns preseason honors for the second-straight season. The defender and team captain was a first-team All-Big Ten honoree and United Soccer Coaches All-North Region third-team honoree a season ago, starting all but one game on the backline and contributing to six shutouts.
- » Reedy, a redshirt senior from Kutztown, Pa., earns preseason honors for the second-straight season and third time in his career. The midfielder and team captain returned to the pitch in 2019 after missing the previous two seasons due to injury. Reedy had four assists last season in 16 games.

FAMILIAR NAMES, FAMILIAR FACES

- » Penn State returns 19 players from the 2019 roster, including Big Ten Preseason Players to Watch Liam Butts, Brandon Hackenberg and Pierre Reedy.
- » Sophomore goalkeeper Kris Shakes returns in between the pipes for the Nittany Lions after an impressive rookie campaign where he held a 0.691 goals-against average in 10 starts.

NEW KIDS ON THE BLOCK

- » Penn State adds eight newcomers to the 2020-21 roster, which includes five freshmen, two transfers and one walk-on.
- Head coach Jeff Cook also added two new members to his staff in assistant coach Clint Long and volunteer assistant Methembe Ndlovu. Long is in charge of the goalkeepers and comes to Happy Valley from Oregon State.

OH CAPTAIN, OUR CAPTAINS

- » Redshirt seniors Brandon Hackenberg and Pierre Reedy were selected by their teammates as team captains of the 2020-21 Penn State men's soccer squad.
