PENN STATE WELCOMES OHIO STATE TUESDAY

The Penn State men's soccer team, under third-year head coach Jeff Cook, is set to host the Ohio State Buckeyes on Tuesday, March 23 at Jeffrey Field. Kickoff is at 5 p.m. and will be streamed live on Big Ten Network+.

PENN STATE AGAINST OHIO STATE

- » Penn State and Ohio State face off Tuesday for the 39th time in program history. The Nittany Lions lead the all-time series over the Buckeyes, 20-14-4.
- » Last season, Penn State traveled to Columbus and picked up a 2-1 win in overtime to snap the Buckeyes' five-game win streak.
- » The game started late after a nearly 50-minute weather delay and it was a scoreless first half before the Nittany Lions struck first. Then-freshman **Andrew Privett** scored his first career goal in the 56th minute to give Penn State the initial lead before Ohio State tied it up 10 minutes later to eventually force extra minutes. Then-freshman **Liam Butts** scored the golden goal in the 97th minute to send the Nittany Lions home happy.

SCOUTING OHIO STATE

- » The Ohio State Buckeyes are led by third-year head coach Brian Maisonneuve. They are 3-2-1 nearing the last couple weeks of the regular season and are still ranked No. 25 by Top Drawer Soccer heading in to the week.
- » Freshman Parker Grinstead leads the Buckeyes with seven points on a team-high three goals and one assist. He is one of seven Ohio State players to score at least one goal this season, and one of 10 to record points.
- » In net, senior Noah Lawrence has played all six games and holds a 1.29 goals against average with 17 saves for a .680 save percentage. He has two shutouts against Maryland and Michigan State.

LAST TIME OUT

- » Penn State continued its winning ways Friday on the road in Evanston, Ill., taking down Northwestern, 1-0, in overtime at Martin Stadium live on Big Ten Network.
- » Junior transfer **Danny Bloyou** scored the golden goal for the Nittany Lions in the 92nd minute on the assist from freshman **Tyger Evans** as the two former Philadelphia Union Academy players have now connected for goals in two-straight games.
- » The Penn State offense showed a lot of patience to find the back

- » Sophomore goalkeeper **Kris Shakes** earned his third win of the season in net with four saves as he and the defense picked up their first shutout of the season.

EIGHTH ANNUAL MACK BRADY MATCH

- » Tuesday's match with Ohio State marks the eighth annual Mack Brady Match as the Nittany Lions help celebrate the life and legacy of one of their biggest fans.
- » At the age of eight, Brady passed away on Dec. 31, 2012 following an unexpected blood infection. To honor his life and love for soccer, especially goalkeeping, Mack's parents, Christian and Elizabeth Brady, created the "Mack Brady Memorial Soccer Fund." The fund is an endowment for Penn State goalkeepers to assist with recruiting, equipment and other needs.
- » Penn State has always found a way to win in the Mack Brady Match, with a 4-1-2 record in those games.

BLOYOU BLASTS

- » Junior transfer **Danny Bloyou** has incredible speed that he's been able to utilize to beat opposing defenders and find the back of the net.
- » Bloyou now has a team-high nine points on a team-high four goals and one assist.
- » After a three-goal week during the week of March 15-21, Bloyou was named College Soccer News' Men's National Player of the Week.
- » The Philadelphia, Pa., native recorded his first career multi-goal game against Rutgers on March 15 and his first career game-winning goal at Northwestern on March 19.
- » His four goals is third-most in the Big Ten as is his nine total points.

KUHN IN THE MIDDLE

- » Junior **Seth Kuhn** has been a leader in the middle of the field for the Nittany Lions as a central midfielder.
- » The Wyomissing, Pa., native had a single-game career high three-point performance in Penn State's game against Rutgers on March 15 with one goal and an assist.
- » Kuhn was considered an honorable mention on Top Drawer Soccer's Team of the Week for the week of Feb. 15-21.

OFFENSIVE FIREPOWER

- » Penn State offensively is taking a lot of shots, but a lot of good shots on target.
- » The Nittany Lions are pacing the league with an average 14.0 shots per game, recording 13 or more shots in four of five games this season. They are averaging 6.60 of those shots on net, a mark that is also top-20 in the nation (18th).
- » Penn State scored a season-high four goals

against Rutgers at Jeffrey Field on March 15, the most in a conference game since scoring six against Rutgers during the 2017 season (10/22/17).

- » Penn State took a season-high 20 shots against Rutgers, the most since taking 18 against Pitt last season (10/15/19).
- » Nine players have recorded points this season.

HE'S THE MAN-GIONE

- » Freshman midfielder/forward **Peter Mangione** had quite the first week as a collegiate soccer player to start the season.
- » The Hunt Valley, Md., native scored both the game-winning goals for Penn State against No. 21 Maryland and on the road at Rutgers. He also added an assist against Maryland.
- » Mangione is tied first in the conference and 15th in the nation with his two game-winners.
- » He was named Big Ten Offensive Player of the Week on Feb. 24 as well as being named to College Soccer News' Team of the Week.

TWO GAMES POSTPONED

- » Penn State's games at Michigan and Indiana scheduled for Wednesday, March 3 and Saturday, March 7, respectively, were postponed due to positive COVID-19 results among Penn State's Tier 1 personnel.
- » The institutions will work with the Big Ten Conference to identify rescheduling options.

200 CAREER WINS

- » Head coach Jeff Cook picked up his 200th career win as a collegiate head coach in the victory at Rutgers on Feb. 23.
- » Cook has 23 years of collegiate head coaching experience, with stints at Wheaton College, Cincinnati and Dartmouth before coming to Penn State in 2018.

REEDY'S LONG OVERDUE GOAL

- » Redshirt senior and team captain **Pierre Reedy** scored a goal against Maryland in the season opener, his first goal since the 2016 season.
- » The Kutztown, Pa., native netted the game-winning goal against Rutgers on March 15.
- » Reedy missed the 2017 and 2018 seasons due to injury. He contributed four assists in 2019.

PENN STATE DEBUTS

- » Five Nittany Lions have made their Penn State debuts this season.
- » Freshmen **Peter Mangione** and **Femi Awodesu** and junior transfer **Danny Bloyou** all made their debuts in the season opener against Maryland.
- » Redshirt freshman **Owen Elliott** made his first career start in net at Rutgers on Feb. 23. Freshman **Tyger Evans** also debuted against Rutgers off the bench.
- » Senior transfer **Jose Palomeque** debuted as a

sub against Rutgers on March 15.

UNPRECEDENTED SEASON

- » This season will be unlike any other for the Nittany Lions and the rest of the Big Ten Conference and most of the nation after the traditional fall season was postponed to the spring due to the ongoing COVID-19 pandemic.
- » Penn State will play a 10-game conference-only schedule for 2020-21, facing each opponent once while having a home-and-home with Maryland and Rutgers.
- » The 2020-21 NCAA Men's Soccer Tournament will feature a condensed field of 32 teams compared to a normal 48-team tournament.

MAC HERMANN TROPHY WATCH LIST

- » Sophomore **Liam Butts** was one of 34 players named to the 2020-21 Men's MAC Hermann Trophy Watch List as announced by the United Soccer Coaches and Missouri Athletic Club on Jan. 28.
- » The MAC Hermann Trophy, presented by World Wide Technology, is the most prestigious individual honor in NCAA Division I soccer, widely considered the equivalent of the Heisman Trophy.

NATIONAL RECOGNITION

- » After a tough loss to Michigan State on Feb. 27, Penn State fell out of the top 25 polls.
- » The Nittany Lions are still receiving votes for three-straight weeks now in the United Soccer Coaches ranking.

HACKENBERG PICKED 22ND IN 2021 MLS SUPERDRAFT

- » Redshirt senior **Brandon Hackenberg** was selected 22nd overall by Orlando City SC in the first round of the 2021 Major League Soccer (MLS) SuperDraft on Jan. 21.
- » Hackenberg is the 16th Nittany Lion to be drafted by MLS and the third-highest draftee in program history.
- » He is the second consecutive Penn State player to be drafted in the first round after former teammate Aaron Molloy was picked 16th overall in 2020, also marking the first time in program history that players have been taken in the first round in back-to-back years.
- » He has decided to return this spring to play with Penn State and will be a team captain.

BIG TEN PLAYERS TO WATCH LIST

- » Sophomore **Liam Butts** and redshirt seniors **Brandon Hackenberg** and **Pierre Reedy** were all named to the 2020-21 Big Ten Players to Watch List as announced by the conference office.
- » Butts earns preseason honors for the first time in his career. The forward was a first-team All-Big Ten honoree, a United Soccer Coaches All-North Region second-team honoree, and a member

of the Big Ten All-Freshman Team a season ago after leading the Nittany Lions with nine goals, including five game-winners, the most in the conference.

- » Hackenberg, a redshirt senior from Palmyra, Va., earns preseason honors for the second-straight season. The defender and team captain was a first-team All-Big Ten honoree and United Soccer Coaches All-North Region third-team honoree a season ago, starting all but one game on the backline and contributing to six shutouts.
- » Reedy, a redshirt senior from Kutztown, Pa., earns preseason honors for the second-straight season and third time in his career. The midfielder and team captain returned to the pitch in 2019 after missing the previous two seasons due to injury. Reedy had four assists last season in 16 games.

FAMILIAR NAMES, FAMILIAR FACES

- » The 2020-21 captaincy will be the second-straight year of leadership for Reedy while it is the first such honor for Hackenberg.
