PENN STATE HOSTS WISCONSIN IN HOME FINALE

The Penn State men's soccer team, under third-year head coach Jeff Cook, will host the Wisconsin Badgers on Saturday, March 27 in the regular-season home finale at Jeffrey Field. Kickoff is set for 2 p.m. and will be streamed live on Big Ten Network+. The program will also honor three of its seniors postgame, presented by the Penn State Alumni Association: Dax Hoffman, Jose Palomeque, and Nicholas Rieple.

PENN STATE AGAINST WISCONSIN

- Penn State and Wisconsin face off Saturday for the 36th time in program history. The Nittany Lions lead the all-time series over the Badgers, 20-12-3.
- Last season, Penn State and Wisconsin met twice, once during the regular season and again in the quarterfinals of the Big Ten Tournament.
- The Nittany Lions won in Madison in Oct. 2019, 2-1, and then again, 3-0, on Jeffrey Field in the quarterfinals of the conference tournament.
- Callum Pritchatt, Liam Butts and Josh Dabora are the returning goal scorers from those two games last season, while Jalen Watson, Seth Kuhn and Andrew Privett added assists. Goalkeeper Kris Shakes won both games in net.

SCOUTING WISCONSIN

- The Wisconsin Badgers are led by 10th-year head coach John Trask. They are 1-5-1 nearing the last few games of the regular
- Junior Andrew Akindele leads the Badgers with a team-high four points on two goals. Freshman Murat Calkap paces the team with two assists.
- In net, graduate student Sven Kleinhans has played the most minutes at 504:26 and has 12 saves with a 2.50 goals-against average. Sophomore Carter Abbott started the most recent game in between the pipes for the Badgers against Ohio State, making five saves and holding a clean sheet for the victory in his first career start. He was named Big Ten Co-Defensive Player of the Week for his efforts.

LAST TIME OUT

- Penn State won its third-straight game Tuesday with a 1-0 shutout victory over No. RV/25 Ohio State at Jeffrey Field.
- The Nittany Lions scored the lone goal of the game in the 75th

SENIOR DAY

Postgame Saturday, Penn State will honor three of the program's seniors, presented by the Penn State Alumni Association: Dax Hoffman, Jose Palomeque, and Nicholas Rieple.

HE'S THE MAN-GIONE

- Freshman midfielder/forward Peter Mangione has had quite the first year as a collegiate soccer
- The Hunt Valley, Md., native has three goals this season, all game-winners, against No. 21 Maryland, at Rutgers, and most recently against Ohio State. He also has an assist for seven total
- Mangione is first in the conference and sixth in the nation with his three game-winners.
- He was named Big Ten Offensive Player of the Week on Feb. 24 as well as being named to College Soccer News' Team of the Week.

BLOYOU BLASTS

- Junior transfer **Danny Bloyou** has incredible speed that he's been able to utilize to beat opposing defenders and find the back of the net.
- Bloyou has a team-high nine points on a teamhigh four goals and one assist.
- After a three-goal week during the week of March 15-21, Bloyou was named College Soccer News' Men's National Player of the Week. He was also named to Top Drawer Soccer's Team of the Week.
- The Philadelphia, Pa., native recorded his first career multi-goal game against Rutgers on March 15 and his first career game-winning goal at Northwestern on March 19.
- His four goals is third-most in the Big Ten as is his nine total points.

SHAKE YOUR GROOVE THING

- Sophomore goalkeeper Kris Shakes is getting back in form in between the pipes, posting backto-back shutouts for the Nittany Lions against Northwestern and Ohio State.
- Shakes has posted two-straight shutouts twice now in his career, doing so last season against Stetson (9/8/19) and Villanova (9/13/19).
- Shakes holds a 1.00 goals-against average and a .800 save percentage with 16 saves.
- The Sunrise, Fla., native is tied for first in the conference with an average 4.00 saves per game,

- a mark that is also 37th nationally, and is second in the league in save percentage.
- He is 4-0-0 in net this season to move to 13-1-0 in his young career.

HACKENBERG NAMED SENIOR CLASS AWARD CANDIDATE

- Redshirt senior **Brandon Hackenberg** was named one of 30 candidates for the 2020-21 Senior CLASS Award.
- To be eligible for the award, a student-athlete must be classified as an NCAA Division I senior, and have noteable achievements in four areas of excellence: community, classroom, character, and competition.
- Hackenberg is the second-straight candidate for the Nittany Lions, following Aaron Molloy in 2019.

KUHN IN THE MIDDLE

- Junior Seth Kuhn has been a leader in the middle of the field for the Nittany Lions as a central
- The Wyomissing, Pa., native had a single-game career high three-point performance in Penn State's game against Rutgers on March 15 with one goal and an assist. He has two assists on the season.
- Kuhn was considered an honorable mention on Top Drawer Soccer's Team of the Week for the week of Feb. 15-21.

OFFENSIVE FIREPOWER

- Penn State offensively is taking a lot of shots, but a lot of good shots on target.
- The Nittany Lions are pacing the league with an average 13.17 shots per game, recording 13 or more shots in four of six games this season. They are averaging 6.00 of those shots on net, a mark that is also top-35 in the nation (33rd).
- Penn State scored a season-high four goals against Rutgers at Jeffrey Field on March 15, the most in a conference game since scoring six against Rutgers during the 2017 season (10/22/17).
- Penn State took a season-high 20 shots against Rutgers, the most since taking 18 against Pitt last season (10/15/19).
- Nine players have recorded points this season.

TWO GAMES POSTPONED

- Penn State's games at Michigan and Indiana scheduled for Wednesday, March 3 and Saturday, March 7, respectively, were postponed due to positive COVID-19 results among Penn State's Tier 1 personnel.
- The institutions will work with the Big Ten Conference to identify rescheduling options.

200 CAREER WINS

Head coach Jeff Cook picked up his 200th career win as a collegiate head coach in the victory at

- Rutgers on Feb. 23.
- Cook has 23 years of collegiate head coaching experience, with stints at Wheaton College, Cincinnati and Dartmouth before coming to Penn State in 2018.

REEDY'S LONG OVERDUE GOAL

- Redshirt senior and team captain Pierre Reedy scored a goal against Maryland in the season opener, his first goal since the 2016 season.
- The Kutztown, Pa., native netted the gamewinning goal against Rutgers on March 15.
- Reedy missed the 2017 and 2018 seasons due to injury. He contributed four assists in 2019.

PENN STATE DEBUTS

- Five Nittany Lions have made their Penn State debuts this season.
- Freshmen Peter Mangione and Femi Awodesu and junior transfer Danny Bloyou all made their debuts in the season opener against Maryland.
- Redshirt freshman Owen Elliott made his first career start in net at Rutgers on Feb. 23. Freshman **Tyger Evans** also debuted against Rutgers off the bench.
- Senior transfer Jose Palomeque debuted as a sub against Rutgers on March 15.

UNPRECEDENTED SEASON

- This season will be unlike any other for the Nittany Lions and the rest of the Big Ten Conference and most of the nation after the traditional fall season was postponed to the spring due to the ongoing COVID-19 pandemic.
- Penn State will play a 10-game conference-only schedule for 2020-21, facing each opponent once while having a home-and-home with Maryland and Rutgers.
- The 2020-21 NCAA Men's Soccer Tournament will feature a condensed field of 32 teams compared to a normal 48-team tournament.

MAC HERMANN TROPHY WATCH LIST

- Sophomore Liam Butts was one of 34 players named to the 2020-21 Men's MAC Hermann Trophy Watch List as announced by the United Soccer Coaches and Missouri Athletic Club on Jan. 28.
- The MAC Hermann Trophy, presented by World Wide Technology, is the most prestigious individual honor in NCAA Division I soccer, widely considered the equivalent of the Heisman Trophy.

HACKENBERG PICKED 22ND IN 2021 MLS SUPERDRAFT

- Redshirt senior Brandon Hackenberg was selected 22nd overall by Orlando City SC in the first round of the 2021 Major League Soccer (MLS) SuperDraft on Jan. 21.
- Hackenberg is the 16th Nittany Lion to be drafted by MLS and the third-highest draftee in program

- history.
- He is the second consecutive Penn State player to be drafted in the first round after former teammate Aaron Molloy was picked 16th overall in 2020, also marking the first time in program history that players have been taken in the first round in back-to-back years.
- He has decided to return this spring to play with Penn State and will be a team captain.

BIG TEN PLAYERS TO WATCH LIST

- Sophomore **Liam Butts** and redshirt seniors Brandon Hackenberg and Pierre Reedy were all named to the 2020-21 Big Ten Players to Watch List as announced by the conference office.
- Butts earns preseason honors for the first time in his career. The forward was a first-team All-Big Ten honoree, a United Soccer Coaches All-North Region second-team honoree, and a member of the Big Ten All-Freshman Team a season ago after leading the Nittany Lions with nine goals, including five game-winners, the most in the conference.
- Hackenberg, a redshirt senior from Palmyra, Va., earns preseason honors for the second-straight season. The defender and team captain was a first-team All-Big Ten honoree and United Soccer Coaches All-North Region third-team honoree a season ago, starting all but one game on the backline and contributing to six shutouts.
- Reedy, a redshirt senior from Kutztown, Pa., earns preseason honors for the second-straight season and third time in his career. The midfielder and team captain returned to the pitch in 2019 after missing the previous two seasons due to injury. Reedy had four assists last season in 16 games.
