PENN STATE FACES MARYLAND FOR SECOND TIME IN REGULAR SEASON FINALE

The Penn State men's soccer team, under third-year head coach Jeff Cook, will travel to College Park, Md. to face the Maryland Terrapins for the second time this season on Wednesday, March 31. Kickoff is set for noon from Ludwig Field and will be broadcast live on Big Ten Network with Chris Vosters (pxp) and Chris Munroe (analyst) on the call.

PENN STATE AGAINST MARYLAND

- Penn State and Maryland face off Wednesday for the 50th time in program history and the second time this season.
- The Nittany Lions trail in the all-time series with the Terrapins, » 19-25-5, but did win the first contest between the teams back in February.
- In the 2020-21 season opener, then-No. 23 Penn State held on to beat then-No. 21 Maryland in Holuba Hall. Sophomore Andrew **Privett** scored the opening goal in the sixth minute from freshman Peter Mangione for the early lead. Redshirt senior Pierre Reedy added to the Nittany Lions' lead in the 26th minute with his first goal since 2016. Mangione then scored what would be the eventual game-winning goal in the 35th minute from junior transfer **Danny Blovou**.
- The Terrapins attempted to front a comeback, scoring two goals after Penn State's initial 3-0 lead, but the home team was able to hang on for the win.
- It marked Penn State's second-straight win over Maryland for the » first time since 2004-05.

SCOUTING MARYLAND

- The Maryland Terrapins are led by 27-year head coach Sasho Cirovski. After starting the season 0-3, the Terrapins have won four-straight games for a 4-3-0 record entering the last week of the regular season.
- Redshirt senior Paul Bin leads Maryland with a team-high seven » points on a team-high three goals and one assist. Redshirt sophomore Nick Richardson paces the team with two assists.
- In net, freshman Jamie Lowell and sophomore Niklas Neumann » have split time, playing four games and three games, respectively. Lowell played the most recent game for the Terrapins againt Northwestern for his first career win in between the pipes. He was in net back in February in the first match up in Holuba Hall. Neumann has the lone shutout for Maryland this season and holds

- » Penn State won its fourth-straight game Saturday with its third-straight 1-0 shutout victory over Wisconsin at Jeffrey Field.
- The Nittany Lions scored the lone goal of the game in the 87th minute after a scoreless first half. Freshman Tyger Evans drew a foul in the box to set up a penalty kick in which redshirt senior Pierre Reedy buried for the eventual game-winning goal.
- » Sophomore goalkeeper **Kris Shakes** finished with three saves for his third-straight clean sheet to move to 5-0-0 in net this season.

BIG PLAYERS OF THE WEEK

- » Redshirt senior **Pierre Reedy** and sophomore goalkeeper **Kris Shakes** earned Big Ten Player of the Week honors, as announced by the conference office Tuesday afternoon.
- » Reedy was named Big Ten Co-Offensive Player of the Week, sharing the award with Indiana's Ryan Wittenbrink, while Shakes was named Big Ten Co-Defensive Player of the Week, sharing the award with Indiana's Roman Celentano.
- » Reedy scored the game-winner for Penn State against Wisconsin and Shakes has posted three consecutive shutouts in between the pipes.
- » Both were the first weekly awards of their careers.

REEDY'S LONG OVERDUE GOAL(S)

- » Redshirt senior and team captain **Pierre Reedy** scored a goal against Maryland in the season opener on Feb. 19, his first goal since the 2016 season after missing the 2017 and 2018 seasons due to injury.
- » The Kutztown, Pa., native has since net two game-winning goals against Rutgers on March 15 and most recently against Wisconsin on March 27 on a PK.
- » The team co-captain is second in the Big Ten and 21st in the nation with his two game-winners, behind teammate Peter Mangione.

HE'S THE MAN-GIONE

- » Freshman midfielder/forward **Peter Mangione** has had quite the first year as a collegiate soccer player.
- » The Hunt Valley, Md., native has three goals this season, all game-winners, against No. 21 Maryland, at Rutgers, and most recently against Ohio State. He also has an assist for seven total points.
- » Mangione is first in the conference and seventh in the nation with his three game-winners.
- » He was named Big Ten Offensive Player of the Week on Feb. 24 as well as being named to College Soccer News' Team of the Week.

BLOYOU BLASTS

- » Junior transfer Danny Bloyou has incredible speed that he's been able to utilize to beat opposing defenders and find the back of the net.
- » Bloyou has a team-high nine points on a teamhigh four goals and one assist.
- » After a three-goal week during the week of March 15-21, Bloyou was named College Soccer News' Men's National Player of the Week. He was also named to Top Drawer Soccer's Team of the Week.
- » The Philadelphia, Pa., native recorded his first career multi-goal game against Rutgers on March 15 and his first career game-winning goal at Northwestern on March 19.
- » His four goals is third-most in the Big Ten as is his nine total points.

SHAKE YOUR GROOVE THING

- » Sophomore goalkeeper **Kris Shakes** is getting back in form in between the pipes, posting threestraight shutouts for the Nittany Lions against Northwestern, Ohio State and Wisconsin.
- » Shakes holds a 0.80 goals-against average and a .826 save percentage with 19 saves.
- » The Sunrise, Fla., native is second in the conference and 34th nationally for save percentage.
- » He is 5-0-0 in net this season to move to 14-1-0 in his young career.

HACKENBERG NAMED SENIOR CLASS AWARD CANDIDATE

- » Redshirt senior Brandon Hackenberg was named one of 30 candidates for the 2020-21 Senior CLASS Award.
- » To be eligible for the award, a student-athlete must be classified as an NCAA Division I senior, and have noteable achievements in four areas of excellence: community, classroom, character, and competition.
- » Hackenberg is the second-straight candidate for the Nittany Lions, following Aaron Molloy in 2019.

KUHN IN THE MIDDLE

- » Junior **Seth Kuhn** has been a leader in the middle of the field for the Nittany Lions as a central midfielder.
- » The Wyomissing, Pa., native had a single-game career high three-point performance in Penn State's game against Rutgers on March 15 with one goal and an assist. He has two assists on the season.
- » Kuhn was considered an honorable mention on Top Drawer Soccer's Team of the Week for the week of Feb. 15-21.

OFFENSIVE FIREPOWER

- » Penn State offensively is taking a lot of shots, but a lot of good shots on target.
- » The Nittany Lions are pacing the league with

an average 13.9 shots per game, recording 13 or more shots in five of seven games this season. They are averaging a league-high 6.29 of those shots on net, a mark that is also 30th in the nation.

- » Penn State scored a season-high four goals against Rutgers at Jeffrey Field on March 15, the most in a conference game since scoring six against Rutgers during the 2017 season (10/22/17).
- » Penn State took a season-high 20 shots against Rutgers, the most since taking 18 against Pitt last season (10/15/19).
- » Nine players have recorded points this season.

NATIONAL RECOGNITION

- » Penn State is back in the top 25 this week, ranked No. 21 by Top Drawer Soccer.
- » The Nittany Lions are receiving votes in the fifth week of the polls for United Soccer Coaches.

200 CAREER WINS

- » Head coach Jeff Cook picked up his 200th career win as a collegiate head coach in the victory at Rutgers on Feb. 23.
- » Cook has 23 years of collegiate head coaching experience, with stints at Wheaton College, Cincinnati and Dartmouth before coming to Penn State in 2018.

PENN STATE DEBUTS

- » Five Nittany Lions have made their Penn State debuts this season.
- » Freshmen Peter Mangione and Femi Awodesu and junior transfer Danny Bloyou all made their debuts in the season opener against Maryland.
- Redshirt freshman Owen Elliott made his first career start in net at Rutgers on Feb. 23.
 Freshman Tyger Evans also debuted against Rutgers off the bench.
- » Senior transfer **Jose Palomeque** debuted as a sub against Rutgers on March 15.

UNPRECEDENTED SEASON

- » This season will be unlike any other for the Nittany Lions and the rest of the Big Ten Conference and most of the nation after the traditional fall season was postponed to the spring due to the ongoing COVID-19 pandemic.
- » Penn State will play a 10-game conference-only schedule for 2020-21, facing each opponent once while having a home-and-home with Maryland and Rutgers.
- » The 2020-21 NCAA Men's Soccer Tournament will feature a condensed field of 32 teams compared to a normal 48-team tournament.

MAC HERMANN TROPHY WATCH LIST

» Sophomore Liam Butts was one of 34 players named to the 2020-21 Men's MAC Hermann Trophy Watch List as announced by the United Soccer Coaches and Missouri Athletic Club on Jan. 28.

» The MAC Hermann Trophy, presented by World Wide Technology, is the most prestigious individual honor in NCAA Division I soccer, widely considered the equivalent of the Heisman Trophy.

HACKENBERG PICKED 22ND IN 2021 MLS SUPERDRAFT

- » Redshirt senior Brandon Hackenberg was selected 22nd overall by Orlando City SC in the first round of the 2021 Major League Soccer (MLS) SuperDraft on Jan. 21.
- » Hackenberg is the 16th Nittany Lion to be drafted by MLS and the third-highest draftee in program history.
- » He is the second consecutive Penn State player to be drafted in the first round after former teammate Aaron Molloy was picked 16th overall in 2020, also marking the first time in program history that players have been taken in the first round in back-to-back years.
- » He has decided to return this spring to play with Penn State and will be a team captain.

BIG TEN PLAYERS TO WATCH LIST

- » Sophomore Liam Butts and redshirt seniors Brandon Hackenberg and Pierre Reedy were all named to the 2020-21 Big Ten Players to Watch List as announced by the conference office.
- » Butts earns preseason honors for the first time in his career. The forward was a first-team All-Big Ten honoree, a United Soccer Coaches All-North Region second-team honoree, and a member of the Big Ten All-Freshman Team a season ago after leading the Nittany Lions with nine goals, including five game-winners, the most in the conference.
- » Hackenberg, a redshirt senior from Palmyra, Va., earns preseason honors for the second-straight season. - » Reedy, a redshirt senior from Kutztown, Pa., earns preseason honors for the second-straight season and third time in his career. The midfielder and team captain returned to the pitch in 2019 after missing the previous two seasons due to injury. Reedy had four assists last season in 16 games.
