NO. 14 PENN STATE FACES MICHIGAN IN BIG TEN SEMIFINALS FOR **SECOND-STRAIGHT YEAR**

The Penn State men's soccer team, under third-year head coach Jeff Cook, looks to continue its run in the 2020-21 Big Ten Tournament with a semifinals match-up against No. 3-seed Michigan at Jeffrey Field on Wednesday, April 14. Kickoff is set for 5 p.m. and will be broadcast live on Big Ten Network with Dean Linke (pxp) and Patrick Doody (analyst) on the call.

PENN STATE IN THE BIG TEN TOURNAMENT

- Penn State is 31-22-5 (.577) all-time in the Big Ten Tournament since it started in 1991.
- The Nittany Lions are the No. 2 seed in the conference tournament for the second-straight season. They beat No. 7-seed Ohio State in the quarterfinals to advance to the semifinals for the second-straight season, their first back-to-back semifinal appearance since 2013-14.
- Penn State is 7-6-0 all-time as a two-seed but is 5-6-0 against a three-seed.
- The Nittany Lions are 3-3-0 against the Wolverines in tournament play. Last season, Penn State was knocked out of the tournament by Michigan in the semifinals match.

PENN STATE AGAINST MICHIGAN

- Penn State and Michigan face off Wednesday for the 27th time in program history and the seventh time in the Big Ten Tournament.
- The all-time series is tied, 11-11-4, as is the conference tournament series, 3-3-0.
- The Nittany Lions and the Wolverines did not meet during the regular season as the match was postponed due to positive COVID-19 results among Penn State's Tier 1 personnel. With the shortened season, the game was not rescheduled.

SCOUTING MICHIGAN

- The Michigan Wolverines are led by ninth-year head coach Chaka Daley. They finished the regular season with a 5-3-1 record to earn the No. 3 seed in the Big Ten Tournament and then went on to beat No. 6-seed Michigan State, 1-0, in the quarterfinals Saturday.
- Michigan sits at No. 21 by Top Drawer Soccer in this week's polls while dropping out of the top 25 in the United Soccer Coaches rankings (they are the team receiving the most amount of votes).
- Junior Kevin Buca and senior Marc Ybarra pace Michigan with nine points each. Buca has three goals and three assists

while Ybarra has two goals and a team-high five assists. Senior Jackson Ragen leads the Wolverines with four goals. 12 Michigan plays have recorded at least one point in 2020-21.

In net, sophomore goalkeeper Owen Finnerty holds a 0.72 goals-against average and .778 save percentage with 21 saves. He has four total shutouts, including one in the quarterfinals Saturday against Michigan State.

LAST TIME OUT

- Penn State extended its unbeaten streak to six games with a 3-1 win over No. 7-seed Ohio State in the Big Ten Tournament quarterfinals Saturday.
- The Nittany Lions were led offensively by junior transfer Danny Bloyou's career-high five-point performance with two goals and one assist. It marked the forward's second multi-goal game of the season.
- Bloyou started the scoring off for Penn State in the 22nd minute as he cleaned up the shot by freshman **Peter Mangione** that was originally saved by Ohio State's goalkeeper.
- Just about seven minutes later, freshman Tyger **Evans** subbed into the game in the 29th minute and found the back of the net not even 15 seconds later. After a throw-in by classmate Femi Awodesu, redshirt senior Pierre Reedy and Bloyou both had touches before Bloyou sent a perfect ball across the box to Evans to slot it home for a two-goal advantage and the first of his career.
- Barely 10 minutes into the second half, the Nittany Lions made it 3-0 with Bloyou's second goal of the day. Reedy worked through the Ohio State defense and then passed it to sophomore Alex Stevenson who crossed it back to Reedy and then over to Bloyou who finished upper 90.
- The Buckeyes spoiled Penn State's shutout hopes in the 88th minute.

BLOYOU BLASTS

- Junior transfer **Danny Bloyou** has incredible speed that he's been able to utilize to beat opposing defenders and find the back of the net.
- Bloyou has a team-high 14 points on a team-high six goals and two assists.
- He has two multi-goal games this season, against Rutgers on March 15 and most recently against Ohio State in the Big Ten quarterfinals on April
- The Philadelphia, Pa., native recorded his first career game-winning goal at Northwestern on March 19 in overtime.
- Bloyou has earned National Player of the Week honors from College Soccer News (March 15-21) as well as two Top Drawer Soccer Team of the Week nods (March 23, April 13).
- His six goals is second-most in the Big Ten as is his 14 total points. The total goals also ranked top 30 in the nation (27th) while total points are top

40 (39th).

SEVEN NITTANY LIONS RECOGNIZED WITH ALL-**BIG TEN AWARDS**

- Seven Nittany Lions were honored by the Big Ten with All-Big Ten honors as announced by the conference office Friday.
- Junior Danny Bloyou and redshirt senior captains Pierre Reedy and Brandon Hackenberg were named to the All-Big Ten First Team.
- Junior Seth Kuhn and sophomore Kris Shakes were named to the All-Big Ten Second Team, and freshman **Peter Mangione** earned a spot on the Big Ten All-Freshman Team.
- Redshirt junior Nicholas Rieple is Penn State's Sportsmanship Award honoree.
- Penn State has three members on the first team for the second consecutive season for the first time since 2005-06. They also have at least one player on the all-freshman team for the sixthstraight year (2015-present).

REEDY'S LONG OVERDUE GOAL(S)

- Redshirt senior and team captain Pierre Reedy has four goals on the season, including two game-winners against Rutgers on March 15 and Wisconsin on March 27. He also has two assists for 10 total points.
- His first goal of the season against Maryland in the season opener on Feb. 19 was his first since the 2016 season after missing the 2017 and 2018 seasons due to injury.
- The Kutztown, Pa., native was named Big Ten Co-Offensive Player of the Week on March 30 for the first time in his career.
- The team co-captain is fourth in the Big Ten and 34th in the nation with his two game-winners.

HE'S THE MAN-GIONE

- Freshman midfielder/forward Peter Mangione has had quite the first year as a collegiate soccer player.
- The Hunt Valley, Md., native has four goals this season, including three game-winners. He also has two assists for 10 total points.
- Mangione is leading all of Division I men's soccer with a .812 shot accuracy with his teamhigh 13 shots on goal. He is also tied first in the conference and eighth in the nation with his three game-winning goals.
- He was named Big Ten Offensive Player of the Week on Feb. 24 as well as being named to College Soccer News' Team of the Week.

SHAKE YOUR GROOVE THING

- Sophomore goalkeeper Kris Shakes had a solid second-half of the regular season, posting threestraight shutouts for the Nittany Lions against Northwestern, Ohio State and Wisconsin.
- Shakes holds a 0.84 goals-against average and a .806 save percentage with 25 saves.

- The Sunrise, Fla., native is second in the conference and top 35 nationally (32nd) for save percentage
- He was named Big Ten Co-Defensive Player of the Week on March 30 for the first time in his
- Shakes is 6-0-1 in net this season to move to 15-1-1 in his young career.

KUHN IN THE MIDDLE

- Junior **Seth Kuhn** has been a leader in the middle of the field for the Nittany Lions as a central midfielder.
- The Wyomissing, Pa., native had a single-game career high three-point performance in Penn State's game against Rutgers on March 15 with one goal and an assist. He has two assists on the season.
- Kuhn was considered an honorable mention on Top Drawer Soccer's Team of the Week for the week of Feb. 15-21.

OFFENSIVE FIREPOWER

- Penn State offensively is taking a lot of shots, but a lot of good shots on target.
- The Nittany Lions are pacing the league with an average 13.11 shots per game, recording 10 or more shots in seven of nine games this season. They are averaging a league-high 6.00 of those shots on net, a mark that is also top 45 in the nation (43rd).
- Penn State scored a season-high four goals against Rutgers at Jeffrey Field on March 15, the most in a conference game since scoring six against Rutgers during the 2017 season (10/22/17).
- Penn State took a season-high 20 shots against Rutgers, the most since taking 18 against Pitt last season (10/15/19).
- Eleven players have recorded points this season.

NATIONAL RECOGNITION

- Penn State is back in the top 15 this week in the United Soccer Coaches poll at No. 14. The team remains No. 19 in Top Drawer Soccer's rankings.
- The Nittany Lions are also the highest-ranked Big Ten team in the latest NCAA RPI standings at No. 23.

200 CAREER WINS

- Head coach Jeff Cook picked up his 200th career win as a collegiate head coach in the victory at Rutgers on Feb. 23.
- Cook has 23 years of collegiate head coaching experience, with stints at Wheaton College, Cincinnati and Dartmouth before coming to Penn State in 2018.

HACKENBERG NAMED SENIOR CLASS AWARD CANDIDATE

Redshirt senior Brandon Hackenberg was named

- one of 30 candidates for the 2020-21 Senior CLASS Award.
- To be eligible for the award, a student-athlete must be classified as an NCAA Division I senior. and have noteable achievements in four areas of excellence: community, classroom, character, and competition.
- Hackenberg is the second-straight candidate for the Nittany Lions, following Aaron Molloy in 2019.

PENN STATE DEBUTS

- Five Nittany Lions made their Penn State debuts during the regular season.
- Freshmen Peter Mangione and Femi Awodesu and junior transfer Danny Bloyou all made their debuts in the season opener against Maryland on Feb. 19.
- Redshirt freshman Owen Elliott made his first career start in net at Rutgers on Feb. 23. Freshman Tyger Evans also debuted against Rutgers off the bench.
- Senior transfer Jose Palomeque debuted as a sub against Rutgers on March 15.

UNPRECEDENTED SEASON

- This season will be unlike any other for the Nittany Lions and the rest of the Big Ten Conference and most of the nation after the traditional fall season was postponed to the spring due to the ongoing COVID-19 pandemic.
- Penn State will play a 10-game conference-only schedule for 2020-21, facing each opponent once while having a home-and-home with Maryland and Rutgers.
- The 2020-21 NCAA Men's Soccer Tournament will feature a condensed field of 32 teams compared to a normal 48-team tournament.

MAC HERMANN TROPHY WATCH LIST

- Sophomore Liam Butts was one of 34 players named to the 2020-21 Men's MAC Hermann Trophy Watch List as announced by the United Soccer Coaches and Missouri Athletic Club on Jan. 28.
- The MAC Hermann Trophy, presented by World Wide Technology, is the most prestigious individual honor in NCAA Division I soccer, widely considered the equivalent of the Heisman Trophy.

HACKENBERG PICKED 22ND IN 2021 MLS SUPERDRAFT

- Redshirt senior Brandon Hackenberg was selected 22nd overall by Orlando City SC in the first round of the 2021 Major League Soccer (MLS) SuperDraft on Jan. 21.
- Hackenberg is the 16th Nittany Lion to be drafted by MLS and the third-highest draftee in program history.
- He is the second consecutive Penn State player to be drafted in the first round after former teammate Aaron Molloy was picked 16th overall











- - in 2020, also marking the first time in program history that players have been taken in the first round in back-to-back years.
- He has decided to return this spring to play with Penn State and will be a team captain.

FAMILIAR NAMES. FAMILIAR FACES

- Penn State returns 19 players from the 2019 roster, including Big Ten Preseason Players to Watch Liam Butts, Brandon Hackenberg and Pierre Reedy.
- Sophomore goalkeeper Kris Shakes returns in between the pipes for the Nittany Lions after an impressive rookie campaign where he held a 0.691 goals-against average in 10 starts.

NEW KIDS ON THE BLOCK

- Penn State adds eight newcomers to the 2020-21 roster, which includes five freshmen, two transfers and one walk-on.
- Head coach Jeff Cook also added two new members to his staff in assistant coach Clint **Long** and volunteer assistant **Methembe Ndlovu**. Long is in charge of the goalkeepers and comes to Happy Valley from Oregon State.

OH CAPTAIN, OUR CAPTAINS

- Redshirt seniors Brandon Hackenberg and **Pierre Reedy** were selected by their teammates as team captains of the 2020-21 Penn State men's soccer squad.
- The 2020-21 captaincy will be the secondstraight year of leadership for Reedy while it is the first such honor for Hackenberg.

NEXT TIME OUT

The winner of the semifinal match between Penn State and Michigan will play the winner of the Indiana/Maryland semifinal match in the Big Ten Tournament Championship on Saturday, April 17. The game will be played on the campus of the highest remaining seed.
