NO. 14 PENN STATE SET FOR BIG TEN TOURNAMENT **CHAMPIONSHIP AGAINST NO. 3 INDIANA**

The Penn State men's soccer team, under third-year head coach Jeff Cook, is seeking a Big Ten Tournament title as its set to play in the 2020-21 championship game on Saturday, April 17 against No. 3 Indiana. Kickoff is set for 5 p.m. in Bloomington, Ind. and will be broadcast live on Big Ten Network with Dean Linke (pxp) and Chris Munroe (analyst) on the call.

PENN STATE IN THE BIG TEN TOURNAMENT

- Penn State is 32-22-5 (.585) all-time in the Big Ten Tournament since it started in 1991.
- The Nittany Lions are the No. 2 seed in the conference tournament for the second-straight season. They beat No. 7-seed Ohio State in the guarterfinals and No. 3-seed Michigan in the semifinals to advance to their first conference championship game since 2011.
- Penn State is 8-6-0 all-time as a two-seed but is 3-8-3 against a one-seed
- The Nittany Lions are 3-8-1 all-time in the championship game. Their last title came in 2005 under the program's winningest head coach. Barry Gorman.
- The Blue and White are 3-9-4 against the Hoosiers in tournament play. The teams last faced off in the Big Ten Tournament in 2017 in the quarterfinals. No. 7-seed Penn State fell to No. 2-seed Indiana, 1-0, in double overtime.
- However, the last time the two teams met in the tournament championship was the last time the Nittany Lions took home the title in 2005.

PENN STATE AGAINST INDIANA

- Penn State and Indiana face off Saturday for the 53rd time in program history and the 17th time in the Big Ten tournament.
- The Nittany Lions trail in both the all-time series, 14-34-4, and the conference tournament series, 3-9-4.
- The Nittany Lions and the Hoosiers did not meet during the regular season as the match was postponed due to positive COVID-19 results among Penn State's Tier 1 personnel. With the shortened season, the game was not rescheduled.

SCOUTING INDIANA

The Indiana Hoosiers are led by 11th-year head coach Todd Yeagley. They finished the regular season with a 7-1-0 record to

- claim the 2020-21 Big Ten regular season title and the No. 1 seed in the Big Ten Tournament. The Hoosiers beat No. 8-seed Northwestern, 3-0, in the guarterfinals and No. 4-seed Maryland, 2-0, in the semifinals.
- Indiana is ranked in the top five in both major polls: No. 3 by United Soccer Coaches and No. 4 by Top Drawer Soccer.
- Sophomore Victor Bezerra is pacing the Hoosiers with 23 points on a team-high 10 goals and three assists. He was named the Big Ten Offensive Player of the Year. Twelve other Hoosiers have recorded at least one point in 2020-21.
- In net, sophomore goalkeeper Roman Celentano holds a 0.20 goals-against average and a .941 save percentage with 32 saves. He has seven shutouts and one combined shutout and was named the Big Ten Goalkeeper of the Year. The Hoosiers have only allowed two goals the entire 2020-21 season for an impressive plus-22 goal differential.

LAST TIME OUT

- Penn State extended its unbeaten streak to seven games with a dominate 4-1 win over No. 3-seed Michigan in the Big Ten Tournament semifinals Wednesday.
- All four goals were scored by different players, listed in order: Danny Bloyou, Peter Mangione, Pierre Reedy and Liam Butts. Alex Stevenson and Seth Kuhn added assists as did Reedy and Mangione.
- The Nittany Lions started the scoring off in the seventh minute on a picture-perfect tactical play by the offense. Reedy passed the ball into the 18 to Stevenson who immediately flicked it over to Bloyou for the finish and 1-0 lead.
- Mangione then drew a foul in the box in the 18th minute to set up a penalty kick which he converted for a two-goal advantage.
- Michigan got on the board in the 29th minute to make it 2-1 which would hold going in to the
- In the second half, the defense held the Wolverines to just four shots while the offense fired off nine shots and scored two more goals for the convincing win.
- Reedy scored in the 63rd minute for the insurance goal after Mangione took the ball away from Michigan in Penn State's offensive zone and Reedy's shot went in between the near post and the goalkeeper to make it 3-1.
- Butts then sealed the deal for the Nittany Lions in the 88th minute for his first goal of the season on the direct rebound of Kuhn's initial shot.

OFFENSIVE FIREPOWER

- Penn State is in the top two in the league in nearly every offensive category, while also ranking top-20 nationally in certain categories.
- The Nittany Lions are pacing the league in shot

- accuracy (.477), shots per game (13.00), and shots on goal per game (6.20).
- Penn State has scored four goals in two games this season, most recently against Michgian in the semifinals. The four goals in the semifinal were the most for the Nittany Lions in a Big Ten Tournament game since 1992.
- The Blue and White have taken at least 10 shots in eight of ten games this season.
- Eleven players have recorded points this season, led by junior Danny Bloyou, redshirt senior Pierre Reedy, and freshman Peter Mangione with double-digit points each.

BLOYOU BLASTS

- Junior transfer **Danny Bloyou** has incredible speed that he's been able to utilize to beat opposing defenders and find the back of the net.
- Bloyou has a team-high 16 points on a team-high seven goals and two assists.
- He has two multi-goal games this season, against Rutgers on March 15 and most recently against Ohio State in the Big Ten quarterfinals on April
- The Philadelphia, Pa., native recorded his first career game-winning goal at Northwestern on March 19 in overtime.
- Bloyou has earned National Player of the Week honors from College Soccer News (March 15-21) as well as two Top Drawer Soccer Team of the Week nods (March 23, April 13).
- His seven goals is second-most in the Big Ten as is his 16 total points. The total goals also ranked top 15 in the nation (12th) while total points are top 25 (23rd).

BUTTS IS BACK

- Sophomore Liam Butts recorded his first goal of the season in the Big Ten Tournament semifinals against Michigan on April 14.
- Butts had missed a handful of games near the end of the regular season due to injury and only had an assist prior to the semifinal game.
- The 2019 first team All-Big Ten forward is another weapon to Penn State's powerful offense and to have him back is key.

REEDY'S LONG OVERDUE GOAL(S)

- Redshirt senior and team captain Pierre Reedy has five goals on the season, including two game-winners against Rutgers on March 15 and Wisconsin on March 27. He also has three assists for 13 total points.
- His first goal of the season against Maryland in the season opener on Feb. 19 was his first since the 2016 season after missing the 2017 and 2018 seasons due to injury.
- The Kutztown, Pa., native was named Big Ten Co-Offensive Player of the Week on March 30 for the

- first time in his career.
- The team co-captain is fourth in the Big Ten and 39th in the nation with his two game-winners. His five goals rank third in the league and 45th nationally.

HE'S THE MAN-GIONE

- Freshman midfielder/forward Peter Mangione has had quite the first year as a collegiate soccer
- The Hunt Valley, Md., native has five goals this season, including four game-winners. He also has three assists for 13 total points.
- Mangione is leading all of Division I men's soccer with a .789 shot accuracy with his teamhigh 15 shots on goal. He is also tied first in the conference and second in the nation with his four game-winning goals.
- He was named Big Ten Offensive Player of the Week on Feb. 24 as well as being named to College Soccer News' Team of the Week.

SHAKE YOUR GROOVE THING

- Sophomore goalkeeper Kris Shakes had a solid second-half of the regular season, posting threestraight shutouts for the Nittany Lions against Northwestern, Ohio State and Wisconsin.
- Shakes holds a 0.86 goals-against average and a .794 save percentage with 27 saves.
- The Sunrise, Fla., native is second in the conference and top 45 nationally (44th) for save percentage
- He was named Big Ten Co-Defensive Player of the Week on March 30 for the first time in his career.
- Shakes is 7-0-1 in net this season to move to 16-1-1 in his young career.

KUHN IN THE MIDDLE

- Junior **Seth Kuhn** has been a leader in the middle of the field for the Nittany Lions as a central midfielder.
- The Wyomissing, Pa., native had a single-game career high three-point performance in Penn State's game against Rutgers on March 15 with one goal and an assist. He has three assists on
- Kuhn was considered an honorable mention on Top Drawer Soccer's Team of the Week for the week of Feb. 15-21.

SEVEN NITTANY LIONS RECOGNIZED WITH ALL-**BIG TEN AWARDS**

- Seven Nittany Lions were honored by the Big Ten with All-Big Ten honors as announced by the conference office Friday.
- Junior **Danny Blovou** and redshirt senior captains Pierre Reedy and Brandon Hackenberg were named to the All-Big Ten First Team.
- Junior Seth Kuhn and sophomore Kris Shakes were named to the All-Big Ten Second Team, and

- freshman **Peter Mangione** earned a spot on the Big Ten All-Freshman Team.
- Redshirt junior Nicholas Rieple is Penn State's Sportsmanship Award honoree.
- Penn State has three members on the first team for the second consecutive season for the first time since 2005-06. They also have at least one player on the all-freshman team for the sixthstraight year (2015-present).

NATIONAL RECOGNITION

- Penn State is back in the top 15 this week in the United Soccer Coaches poll at No. 14. The team remains No. 19 in Top Drawer Soccer's rankings.
- The Nittany Lions are also the highest-ranked Big Ten team in the latest NCAA RPI standings at No. 19.

200 CAREER WINS

- Head coach Jeff Cook picked up his 200th career win as a collegiate head coach in the victory at Rutgers on Feb. 23.
- Cook has 23 years of collegiate head coaching experience, with stints at Wheaton College, Cincinnati and Dartmouth before coming to Penn State in 2018.

HACKENBERG NAMED SENIOR CLASS AWARD CANDIDATE

- Redshirt senior Brandon Hackenberg was named one of 30 candidates for the 2020-21 Senior CLASS Award.

- Five Nittany Lions made their Penn State debuts during the regular season.
- Freshmen Peter Mangione and Femi Awodesu and junior transfer Danny Bloyou all made their debuts in the season opener against Maryland on Feb. 19.
- Redshirt freshman Owen Elliott made his first career start in net at Rutgers on Feb. 23. Freshman Tyger Evans also debuted against Rutgers off the bench.
- Senior transfer Jose Palomeque debuted as a sub against Rutgers on March 15.

- Redshirt senior Brandon Hackenberg was selected 22nd overall by Orlando City SC in the first round of the 2021 Major League Soccer (MLS) SuperDraft on Jan. 21.
- Hackenberg is the 16th Nittany Lion to be drafted by MLS and the third-highest draftee in program history.
- He is the second consecutive Penn State player to be drafted in the first round after former teammate Aaron Molloy was picked 16th overall in 2020, also marking the first time in program history that players have been taken in the first round in back-to-back years.
- He has decided to return this spring to play with Penn State and will be a team captain.

- Penn State returns 19 players from the 2019 roster, including Big Ten Preseason Players to Watch Liam Butts, Brandon Hackenberg and Pierre Reedv.
