SERIES HISTORY

- Penn State trails 41-3 in the all-time series with Maryland but the teams split the most recent two matchups. The Lions won in 2019, while the Terrapins won earlier this season.
- The teams first played in 1916.
- Penn State trailed by just one goal, 5-4, at the half of the first meeting between the teams this season, but Maryland pulled away with a 4-1 advantage in the third quarter. Seven players scored for the Nittany Lions, while **Sutton Boland** had five ground balls.

SCOUTING MARYLAND

- Maryland is ranked third in the country and holds a two-game lead in the Big Ten standings with an unbeaten 6-0 record.
- The Terrapins ranks first in the nation in assists/game (10.67) and shot percentage (.399).
- Jared Bernhardt ranks first in the Big Ten and sixth in the nation in points/game (5.83), while Logan Wisnauskas ranks second in the conference and 11th nationally at 5.50.

GAME 6 RECAP

DSII

- Penn State added another one to the win column with an 11-8 victory over then-No. 17 Johns Hopkins at Panzer Stadiun. The win was the 200th of head coach **Jeff Tambroni's** career.
- The Lions received big-time performances in every aspect of the game. Mac O'Keefe led the offense with four goals and one assist, Nick Cardile led the defense with three ground balls and three caused turnovers, and Colby Kneese came up huge in goal with 15 saves on 23 chances. They were named the Big Ten Offensive Player, Defensive Player, and Specialist of the Week, respectively.
- Gerard Arceri may have been Kneese's top competition for Specialist of the Week. He went 15-19 on faceoffs. Jake Glatz was 3-4 at the x.
- The game was tied 8-8 with 12:52 to play. O'Keefe scored the go-ahead goal with 9:55 left on the clock and then made it a two-goal game with 4:42 remaining.

UP NEXT

- Penn State hosts No. 8 Rutgers at noon on April 10.
- The Scarlet Knights are 4-2 following a 13-9 loss to No. 3 Maryland in its most recent game. Both of the team's losses this season came to the Terrapins.

PENN STATE VS. BIG TEN

- Penn State is 56-104 (.350) all-time against current members of the Big Ten. The Lions are 25-19 (.568) against those same teams during head coach Jeff Tambroni's 11 seasons with the team.
- The Lions are 16-15 (.516) in Big Ten regular season games since the league added lacrosse in 2015. They have winning records in league play over Michigan, Ohio State and Rutgers.

O'KEEFE GOAL STREAK

- Mac O'Keefe is first among active players with a 38game goal-scoring streak.
- O'Keefe has 139 goals during that stretch.
- The last game O'Keefe didn't score a goal was in a 9-7 loss to Cornell on March 10, 2018.

O'KEEFE NCAA RECORD WATCH

- Mac O'Keefe has 206 career goals and needs seven to become the NCAA's all-time career goals leader.
- The record is currently held by Duke's Justin Guterding, who scored 212 goals in 75 games from 2015-18.
- O'Keefe needs one goals to pass Zack Greer (Duke, 2005-08) for second on the list.
- O'Keefe's 206 goals have come in 61 games.

PANZER STADIUM SUCCESS

- Penn State opened Panzer Stadium with a 15-14 win over Penn on March 2, 2019. Grant Ament assisted on Nick Spillane's game-winning goal with 2:39 left.
- The Lions are 9-2 at Panzer Stadium.

TEAM CAPTAINS

- Penn State head coach Jeff Tambroni named Nick
 Cardile and Mac O'Keefe captains for the 2021 season.
- The pair will serve as captains for the second consecutive season.

TONER THERE FROM THE START

• Associate head coach **Peter Toner** joined the Penn State coaching staff for head coach Jeff Tambroni's first season and has been on the staff for each season since. He spent the first four seasons as an assistant coach before being promoted to his current position of associate head coach.'

HAUS READIES THEM FOR THE PROS

- Since John Haus joined the Penn State staff as an assistant coach prior to the 2018 season, every offensive starter for the Lions has been drafted to play professional lacrosse.
- The most recent notable draft pick was Grant Ament, who was selected No. 1 overall in the 2020 PLL Draft.

SPECIAL JERSEY NUMBERS

#11

- Graduate student **Dylan Foulds** will wear the No. 11 jersey for the first time this season.
- The No. 11 is presented to a young man who has persevered in the face of adversity. The No. 11 jersey, worn by Michael Jacober, 2002-05, has become symbolic of the strength and compassion of the 2005 Penn State lacrosse team who rallied around Michael after his family was tragically killed in a plane crash during his senior season.

#16

- Graduate student **Nick Cardile** will wear the No. 16 jersey for a second season.
- Cardile was selected by former Nittany Lion Chris Sabia to next wear the number, which has been presented annually, since 2016, to a senior who best represents the "Heart of a Competitor" in honor of our "Teammate for Life" Connor Darcey. Connor passed away tragically on June 12, 2015 in a car accident, prior to his redshirt junior season. The No. 16 is passed down by the student-athlete who had the honor of wearing the No. 16 during the previous season.

TAMBRONI NEARING MILESTONE

- **Jeff Tambroni**, who is in his 21st season as a head coach, is 200-98.
- His .671 winning percentage ranks sixth among all active NCAA Division I coaches.
- Tambroni's 91 wins at Penn State are the second-most in program history.
- Tambroni's .610 winning percentage at Penn State is easily the best in program history. Glenn Thiel is second at .559.
- Tambroni has had just one losing season in his 20 completed seasons as head coach.

BIG WINS DURING THE TAMBRONI ERA

- Penn State has 11 wins all-time against opponents ranked in the top five nationally, and seven of those wins have come during head coach Jeff Tambroni's 11 seasons with the team.
- During the Tambroni era, Penn State has one win over a top-ranked team, one win over a second-ranked team, two wins over third-ranked teams, one win over a fourthranked team and two wins over fifth-ranked teams.
- Three of the Lions' wins over top-five teams under Tambroni came against Big Ten teams, with the most recent coming over No. 3 Maryland in 2019.

CAREER RECORD HOLDERS

- Mac O'Keefe is the Big Ten and Penn State record holder with 206 career goals.
- O'Keefe needs seven goals to break the NCAA career record of 212 currently held by Duke's Justin Guterding (2015-18).
- O'Keefe broke the previous school record of 127 held by Will Driscoll (1999-2002) with his first goal in a 17-7 win at Michigan on April 13, 2019.
- O'Keefe broke the previous Big Ten record of 184 held by Johns Hopkins' Terry Riordan (1992-95) with his third goal in an 18-17 overtime win at Penn on Feb. 29, 2020.

FIVE RETURNING ALL-AMERICANS

The Lions have five players that have combined to earn eight USILA All-America honors, including honorable mentions. Mac O'Keefe is a three-time All-American, Gerard Arceri has won two All-America awards, and Jack Kelly, Nick Cardile and Colby Kneese each have one All-America award.

NOT OUR FIRST PANDEMIC

- Unfortunately, the 2020 and 2021 seasons weren't the first Penn State lacrosse seasons to be postponed or altered because of a pandemic.
- The Spanish Flu caused the cancellation of the 1918 season. That team was coached by Doc Lewis, who was the second head coach in program history.
- Of course, back then way less games were affected.
 The team averaged just 3.6 games per season in the five years before the Spanish Flu and just 4.0 games in the following five seasons.

PENN STATE ON TV

- Penn State still has two TV games left on its schedule, including one on ESPNU (Ohio State April 24) and one on Big Ten Network (Michigan April 16).
- In total this regular season, five of the Lions' 10 games will be/were on TV, including three on ESPNU and two on Big Ten Network.

Jeff Tambroni returns for his 11th year as the head coach of Penn State men's lacrosse in 2021. One of the sport's most

decorated coaches, he enters the season seventh among all active Division I coaches in career win percentage (198-94, .678).

The 2019 Nittany Lions racked up program firsts on their way to a 16-2 record, winning their first-ever Big Ten regular season and tournament titles and advancing to their first-ever NCAA Semifinal. They went a perfect 5-0 against league opponents during the regular season, including the team's first-ever varsity win over Maryland, which led to Tambroni being named the Big Ten Coach of the Year. A program-record nine players were recognized on the USILA All-America list, including Grant Ament and Chris Sabia on the first team. Nick Spillane and Mac O'Keefe earned spots on the second team, Gerard Arceri and Jack Kelly made the third team, and Colby Kneese, Tommy Wright, and Nick Cardile were selected as honorable mentions. Ament was selected as the Big Ten Offensive Player of the Year, while Sabia was the Defensive Player of the Year.

The 2019 team was easily the top offensive team in the nation, finishing first in the NCAA in assists per game (10.83), man-up offense (.613), points per game (28.78), scoring margin (+6.89), scoring offense (17.94), and shot percentage (.434), The Lions broke single-season school records in wins (16), goals (323), and winning streak (13), and a single-game record for goals with 27 in a win over Robert Morris.

Grant Ament and Mac O'Keefe led the charge for the nation's top offense. Ament was a finalist for the prestigious Tewaaraton Award while setting NCAA records for assists (96) and assists per game (5.65), and a Big Ten and program record points (129). O'Keefe tied a Big Ten and program record for goals in a season (78).

In 2018, the Nittany Lions went 8-6, 2-3 in Big Ten play. Throughout the season, Penn State grabbed ranked wins over No. 13 Penn, 10-7, and the program's first win over No. 5 Johns Hopkins, 14-12. Gerard Arceri made a name for himself on a national level with a 68.1-winning percentage at the 'x,' earning 216 wins on the season. He scooped up an impressive 145 ground balls, for 10.36 per game, adding a career-best six goals, while dishing out one assist. His percentage at the face and his ground balls per game were both good for fourth in the NCAA and led the Big Ten. He was named the Big Ten Specialist of the Year, first Team All-Big Ten, and a USILA Third Team All-American. Mac O'Keefe was also named first Team All-Big Ten, and was a USILA honorable mention All-American along with Chris Sabia. Ryan Keenan was selected to the USILA North-South Teams, and was drafted 54th in the MLL Draft to the Ohio Machine.

In 2017, Tambroni led the Nittany Lions to a 12-4 record, just the seventh season with double-digit win season, and just the second in the last 20 seasons (2013, 2017). Penn State set a program record after opening the season with a 10-0 record, the best start in school history. The 10th win highlighted the streak as Penn State took down No.5 Ohio State, 9-4, to earn just the eighth win in program history over a top-five team. Penn State also earned their first winning record in Big Ten play, going 3-2. Tambroni saw three earn USILA All-American honorable mention honors, while Nick Aponte added a USILA Scholar All-American honor as well.

The program's 12 wins in 2017 tied the record. There have been four USILA Scholar All-America honorees under Tambroni and 14 USILA All-Americans during his time at Penn State.

During the 2016 season, Tambroni guided Penn State to its fifth season going .500 or above under his guidance. Most notably of the 2016

campaign, he led Penn State to defeat a top-ranked opponent for the first time in program history on March 26, when the Nittany Lions earned a 15-10 victory over defending national champions and No. 1 ranked Denver, snapping the opponent's 20-game win streak. Penn State notched two other wins over ranked opponents during the 2016 campaign as well, knocking off No. 18 Cornell and No. 8 Harvard in the process.

Tambroni led Penn State to be one of the most efficient teams in the country in 2016, with the team finishing second in Division I in turnovers per game while finishing sixth in the country in shooting percentage. Penn State earned its first unanimous All-Big Ten selection in attackman Nick Aponte, while Grant Ament and Mike Aronow earned All-Big Ten honorable mentions. Tambroni also led TJ Sanders to be named Penn State's ninth USILA Scholar All-America selection.

Tambroni guided the Nittany Lions through a historic season in 2015 that brought Penn State's first appearance in the Big Ten Tournament following the first ever season of Big Ten lacrosse. The Nittany Lions opened the season ranked No. 14 in the USILA DI Preseason Coaches' Poll and knocked off No. 16/11 Penn during the 2015 season. Tambroni also led Penn State to its first two Big Ten conference victories as well as a berth to the conference tournament. He also mentored rising senior TJ Sanders to USILA All-America honorable mention honors.

In 2014, Tambroni led Penn State to its fourth consecutive above-.500 season. His student-athletes earned the eighth USILA All-American and third Scholar All-America honors of Tambroni's Penn State career. He also coached goalkeeper Austin Kaut to his school record third All-America honor and conference-best All-CAA first team award.

Penn State's 2013 campaign saw Tambroni lead Penn State to one of the greatest seasons in program history while celebrating its 100th season. The Nittany Lions set records for wins (12) and earned the program's first outright regular season conference title by sweeping the CAA with a 6-0 record. PSU rattled off 10 straight wins from March through May to earn the school's third NCAA bid and first chance to host an NCAA game.

Tambroni was named CAA Coach of the Year for the second time in his career (2011), while Kaut (under Tambroni's tutelage) was named Ensign C. Markland Kelly, Jr. Award for the nation's best goalie. Also, Kaut was CAA Player and Defensive Player of the Year. Sanders was named Rookie of the Year and the Nittany Lions placed six on the All-CAA first team.

During the 2012 campaign, Tambroni led the Nittany Lions to a secondplace CAA finish with two USILA All-Americans and six All-CAA honorees. Penn State finished with a 9-6 overall record and a 5-1 mark in conference action.

The 2011 CAA Co-Coach of the Year, Tambroni led the Nittany Lions to a 7-7 record and their first-ever CAA tournament berth during his first year at the program's helm.

In 2011, eight Nittany Lions garnered All-CAA recognition and freshman Kaut earned Rookie of the Year honors while being named a USILA Honorable Mention All-American.

Prior to Penn State, Tambroni spent 10 seasons as head coach at Cornell (2001-10). He guided the Big Red to a 109-40 record and three NCAA Semifinal appearances (2007, 2009-10), including the 2009 National Championship game.

Tambroni was named USILA Division I Coach of the Year following the 2009 season and was tabbed the 2007 and 2009 Field Turf/NCAA Division I Coach of the Year. Tambroni was also the 2004 and 2009 Ithaca Journal Male Coach of the Year and a three-time National Coach of the Week.

While at Cornell, Tambroni became the 10th-fastest coach to reach the 100-win mark when he accomplished the feat in his 134th career game in March 2010.



In addition, 39 players garnered All-America recognition.

Prior to serving as Cornell's head coach, he spent four seasons as a Big Red assistant coach (1997-2000). Tambroni also served as assistant coach at Loyola College in 1997 and at his alma mater, Hobart College, for three seasons. With the Statesmen, he helped the program reach the 1994 NCAA Division III National Championship game.

A 1992 graduate, Tambroni earned his bachelor's degree in American studies. He earned first-team All-America honors as a senior and was twice named a second-team All-American (1990-91). The MVP of the 1990 NCAA title game, Tambroni helped lead the team to back-to-back NCAA titles (1990-91) and left Hobart tied for seventh on the school's all-time scoring

list with 202 points.

Before embarking upon his collegiate coaching career, Tambroni coached the Heaton Mersey Lacrosse Club of the English Lacrosse Union for one year and served as a visiting coach for the Czech-American Lacrosse Foundation in Prague in the summer of 1996.

Tambroni and his wife, Michelle, have three daughters, Carissa, Madison, and Ella. Michelle played field hockey at Penn State from 1988-90 and earned All-America honors as a senior.
