NO. 19 PENN STATE READY FOR OHIO STATE IN BIG TEN QUARTERFINALS

The Penn State men's soccer team, under third-year head coach Jeff Cook, starts the 2020-21 postseason in the Big Ten Tournament as the No. 2 seed and is set to host No. 7-seed Ohio State at Jeffrey Field on Saturday, April 10. Kickoff in the quarterfinal game is set for noon and will be broadcast live on Big Ten Network with Dean Linke (pxp) and Patrick Doody (analyst) on the call.

PENN STATE IN THE BIG TEN TOURNAMENT

- » Penn State is 30-22-5 (.570) all-time in the Big Ten Tournament since it started in 1991.
- » The Nittany Lions are the No. 2 seed in the conference tournament for the second-straight season.
- » Penn State is 6-6-0 all-time as a two-seed but a perfect 4-0-0 against the seven-seed.
- » The Nittany Lions are 5-3-0 against the Buckeyes in tournament play.

PENN STATE AGAINST OHIO STATE

- » Penn State and Ohio State face off Saturday for the 40th time in program history and the second time this season. This will be the teams' ninth all-time match up in the Big Ten Tournament.
- » The Nittany Lions lead the all-time series, 21-14-4, and the tournament series, 5-3-0.
- » Penn State won the regular-season contest at Jeffrey Field, 1-0, on March 23 for its third-straight win and second-straight shutout, at the time.
- » The Nittany Lions' goal came in the 75th minute from freshman **Peter Mangione**. Penn State earned a corner kick in the 73rd minute that was taken by junior **Seth Kuhn**, and after the ball was kicked out of the box back to Kuhn, he passed it right back in to find Mangione in the six to slot it home for the eventual game-winning goal.
- » Sophomore goalkeeper **Kris Shakes** finished with five saves in the victory in the Eighth Annual Mack Brady Match.

SCOUTING OHIO STATE

- » The Ohio State Buckeyes are led by third-year head coach Brian Maisonneuve. They finished the regular season with a 3-5-1 record to earn the No. 7 seed in the Big Ten Tournament.
- » Freshman Parker Grinstead paces Ohio State with a team-high eight points on three goals and two assists. Classmate Laurence

NOTES AND HEADLINES

Wootton has four points on one goal and two assists.

- » In net, senior goalkeeper Noah Lawrence holds a 1.30 goals-against average with 24 saves for a .667 save percentage. He had two shutouts during the regular season.

LAST TIME OUT

- » Penn State extended its unbeaten streak to five games with a 2-2 double-overtime draw at Maryland on March 31.
- » The Nittany Lions found the equalizer twice to force the draw and clinch the No. 2 seed in the upcoming Big Ten Tournament.
- » After the Terrapins found the early goal just 95 seconds into the match, Penn State scored the initial equalizer in the 20th minute on the long ball into the six by redshirt senior **Brandon Hackenberg** to find freshman **Peter Mangione** for his fourth goal of the season.
- » At the start of the second half, Maryland was awarded a penalty kick but sophomore goalkeeper **Kris Shakes** came up with the huge save to keep the game tied.
- » The Terrapins drew another foul in the box in the 63rd minute and this time converted on the PK to take the lead again.
- » Penn State refused to give up, however, and in the 86th minute, sophomore **Jalen Watson** made a short pass to redshirt senior **Pierre Reedy** right outside the six and he kept his shot low and to the far post for the equalizer with just four minutes to play.
- » Both teams had decent chances for the golden goal in both overtime players, but the thrilling match would end in a draw to conclude the regular season.

SEVEN NITTANY LIONS RECOGNIZED WITH ALL-BIG TEN AWARDS

- » Seven Nittany Lions were honored by the Big Ten with All-Big Ten honors as announced by the conference office Friday.
- » Junior **Danny Bloyou** and redshirt senior captains **Pierre Reedy** and **Brandon Hackenberg** were named to the All-Big Ten First Team.
- » Junior **Seth Kuhn** and sophomore **Kris Shakes** were named to the All-Big Ten Second Team, and freshman **Peter Mangione** earned a spot on the Big Ten All-Freshman Team.
- » Redshirt junior **Nicholas Rieple** is Penn State's Sportsmanship Award honoree.
- » Penn State has three members on the first team for the second consecutive season for the first time since 2005-06. They also have at least one player on the all-freshman team for the sixth-straight year (2015-present).

REEDY'S LONG OVERDUE GOAL(S)

- » Redshirt senior and team captain **Pierre Reedy** has four goals on the season, including two

game-winners against Rutgers on March 15 and Wisconsin on March 27.

- » His first goal of the season against Maryland in the season opener on Feb. 19 was his first since the 2016 season after missing the 2017 and 2018 seasons due to injury.
- » The Kutztown, Pa., native was named Big Ten Co-Offensive Player of the Week on March 30 for the first time in his career.
- » The team co-captain is second in the Big Ten and 28th in the nation with his two game-winners, behind teammate Peter Mangione.

HE'S THE MAN-GIONE

- » Freshman midfielder/forward **Peter Mangione** has had quite the first year as a collegiate soccer player.
- » The Hunt Valley, Md., native has four goals this season, including three game-winners. He also has an assist for a tied team-high nine points.
- » Mangione is leading all of Division I with a .769 shot accuracy. He is also first in the conference and seventh in the nation with his three game-winning goals.
- » He was named Big Ten Offensive Player of the Week on Feb. 24 as well as being named to College Soccer News' Team of the Week.

BLOYOU BLASTS

- » Junior transfer **Danny Bloyou** has incredible speed that he's been able to utilize to beat opposing defenders and find the back of the net.
- » Bloyou has a tied team-high nine points on a four goals and one assist.
- » After a three-goal week during the week of March 15-21, Bloyou was named College Soccer News' Men's National Player of the Week. He was also named to Top Drawer Soccer's Team of the Week.
- » The Philadelphia, Pa., native recorded his first career multi-goal game against Rutgers on March 15 and his first career game-winning goal at Northwestern on March 19.
- » His four goals is third-most in the Big Ten as is his nine total points.

SHAKE YOUR GROOVE THING

- » Sophomore goalkeeper **Kris Shakes** had a solid second-half of the regular season, posting three-straight shutouts for the Nittany Lions against Northwestern, Ohio State and Wisconsin.
- » Shakes holds a 0.96 goals-against average and a .793 save percentage with 23 saves.
- » The Sunrise, Fla., native is second in the conference and top 50 nationally (49th) for save percentage
- » He was named Big Ten Co-Defensive Player of the Week on March 30 for the first time in his career.
- » Shakes is 5-0-1 in net this season to move to 14-1-1 in his young career.





NOTES AND HEADLINES

KUHN IN THE MIDDLE

- » Junior **Seth Kuhn** has been a leader in the middle of the field for the Nittany Lions as a central midfielder.
- » The Wyomissing, Pa., native had a single-game career high three-point performance in Penn State's game against Rutgers on March 15 with one goal and an assist. He has two assists on the season.
- » Kuhn was considered an honorable mention on Top Drawer Soccer's Team of the Week for the week of Feb. 15-21.

OFFENSIVE FIREPOWER

- » Penn State offensively is taking a lot of shots, but a lot of good shots on target.
- » The Nittany Lions are pacing the league with an average 13.38 shots per game, recording 10 or more shots in six of eight games this season. They are averaging a league-high 6.00 of those shots on net, a mark that is also top 40 in the nation (39th).
- » Penn State scored a season-high four goals against Rutgers at Jeffrey Field on March 15, the most in a conference game since scoring six against Rutgers during the 2017 season (10/22/17).
- » Penn State took a season-high 20 shots against Rutgers, the most since taking 18 against Pitt last season (10/15/19).
- » Eleven players have recorded points this season.

NATIONAL RECOGNITION

- » Penn State is back in the top 25 this week in both of the major polls, ranked No. 19 by United Soccer Coaches and Top Drawer Soccer.
- » The Nittany Lions are also the highest-ranked Big Ten team in the latest NCAA RPI standings at No. 22.

200 CAREER WINS

- » Head coach Jeff Cook picked up his 200th career win as a collegiate head coach in the victory at Rutgers on Feb. 23.
- » Cook has 23 years of collegiate head coaching experience, with stints at Wheaton College, Cincinnati and Dartmouth before coming to Penn State in 2018.

HACKENBERG NAMED SENIOR CLASS AWARD CANDIDATE

- » Redshirt senior **Brandon Hackenberg** was named one of 30 candidates for the 2020-21 Senior CLASS Award.
- » To be eligible for the award, a student-athlete must be classified as an NCAA Division I senior, and have notable achievements in four areas of excellence: community, classroom, character, and competition.
- » Hackenberg is the second-straight candidate for the Nittany Lions, following Aaron Molloy in 2019.

PENN STATE DEBUTS

- » Five Nittany Lions made their Penn State debuts during the regular season.
- » Freshmen **Peter Mangione** and **Femi Awodesu** and junior transfer **Danny Bloyou** all made their debuts in the season opener against Maryland on Feb. 19.
- » Redshirt freshman **Owen Elliott** made his first career start in net at Rutgers on Feb. 23. Freshman **Tyger Evans** also debuted against Rutgers off the bench.
- » Senior transfer **Jose Palomeque** debuted as a sub against Rutgers on March 15.

UNPRECEDENTED SEASON

- » Penn State will play a 10-game conference-only schedule for 2020-21, facing each opponent once while having a home-and-home with Maryland and Rutgers.
- » The 2020-21 NCAA Men's Soccer Tournament will feature a condensed field of 32 teams compared to a normal 48-team tournament.

MAC HERMANN TROPHY WATCH LIST

- » Sophomore **Liam Butts** was one of 34 players named to the 2020-21 Men's MAC Hermann Trophy Watch List as announced by the United Soccer Coaches and Missouri Athletic Club on Jan. 28.
- » The MAC Hermann Trophy, presented by World Wide Technology, is the most prestigious individual honor in NCAA Division I soccer, widely considered the equivalent of the Heisman Trophy.

HACKENBERG PICKED 22ND IN 2021 MLS SUPERDRAFT

- » Redshirt senior **Brandon Hackenberg** was selected 22nd overall by Orlando City SC in the first round of the 2021 Major League Soccer (MLS) SuperDraft on Jan. 21.
- » Hackenberg is the 16th Nittany Lion to be drafted by MLS and the third-highest draftee in program history.
- » He is the second consecutive Penn State player to be drafted in the first round after former teammate Aaron Molloy was picked 16th overall in 2020, also marking the first time in program history that players have been taken in the first round in back-to-back years.
- » He has decided to return this spring to play with Penn State and will be a team captain.

BIG TEN PLAYERS TO WATCH LIST

- » Sophomore **Liam Butts** and redshirt seniors **Brandon Hackenberg** and **Pierre Reedy** were all named to the 2020-21 Big Ten Players to Watch

- » Butts earns preseason honors for the first time in his career. The forward was a first-team All-Big Ten honoree, a United Soccer Coaches All-North Region second-team honoree, and a member of the Big Ten All-Freshman Team a season ago after leading the Nittany Lions with nine goals, including five game-winners, the most in the conference.
- » Hackenberg, a redshirt senior from Palmyra, Va., earns preseason honors for the second-straight season. The defender and team captain was a first-team All-Big Ten honoree and United Soccer Coaches All-North Region third-team honoree a season ago, starting all but one game on the backline and contributing to six shutouts.
- » Reedy, a redshirt senior from Kutztown, Pa., earns preseason honors for the second-straight season and third time in his career. The midfielder and team captain returned to the pitch in 2019 after missing the previous two seasons due to injury. Reedy had four assists last season in 16 games.
