NO. 12 PENN STATE HEADS TO NORTH CAROLINA FOR NCAA **TOURNAMENT**

The Penn State men's soccer team, under third-year head coach Jeff Cook, heads to North Carolina for the 2020-21 NCAA Tournament. The Nittany Lions will face UMass in the second round of action on Sunday, May 2 at 1 p.m. on the campus of UNC-Greensboro in Greensboro, N.C.

PENN STATE IN THE NCAA TOURNAMENT

- Penn State is making its 34th appearance in the NCAA Tournament and second-straight appearance for the first time since the 2013-14 seasons.
- The Nittany Lions are 28-32-1 all-time in the national tournament. They are seeking their first NCAA win since beating Hartwick in the first round back in 2014.
- Penn State is one of three Big Ten teams in the 2020-21 NCAA Tournament. Indiana earned the conference's automatic bid and is the No. 3 overall seed. Maryland also earned an at-large bid.

PENN STATE AGAINST UMASS

- Penn State and UMass face off Sunday for just the second time in program history.
- The two teams last played nearly 31 years ago on Sept. 9, 1990 when the Nittany Lions were under the helm of Barry Gorman. Penn State won the game at UMass in overtime, 1-0, when both teams were apart of the Atlantic 10 Conference.

SCOUTING UMASS

- The University of Massachusetts Minutemen are led by sixth-year head coach Fran O'Leary. They come in to the NCAA Tournament with a 7-1-3 overall record while finishing with a 3-1-2 record in Atlantic 10 league play. UMass is receiving votes in the last United Soccer Coaches poll of the regular season.
- Like the Nittany Lions, the Minutemen also received an at-large berth into the 2020-21 NCAA Tournament.
- Freshman Alec Hughes is pacing the Minutemen with 16 points on a team-high seven goals and two assists. Hughes was named the Atlantic 10 Rookie of the Year while also earning first-team accolades. Graduate student Filippo Begliardi Ghidini adds six goals of his own while both junior Ben Shepherd (A-10 second

- team) and senior Yosuke Hanya (A-10 first team) have seven assists.
- In net, senior goalkeeper Marvyn Dorchin has played all 11 games for the Minutemen. He holds a 1.09 goals-against average and a .790 save percentage with 49 saves. He recorded three shutouts during the regular season.

LAST TIME OUT

- Penn State did extend its unbeaten streak to eight games with a 1-1 draw at No. 3 Indiana in the Big Ten Tournament Championship game, however it lost the trophy by a penalty kick shootout, 3-2.
- After a back-and-forth contest through the first 39 minutes of the match, the No. 1-seeded Hoosiers got on the board first in the 40th minute with a goal from Victor Bezerra.
- The Nittany Lions started to find their groove offensively in the second half, outshooting Indiana, 7-5.
- In the 81st minute, junior Danny Bloyou had a breakaway chance before he was pulled down by his jersey right outside the 18 by Indiana's Joey Maher who was then assessed a red card and gave Penn State the chance to play man-up for the remainder of the match.
- Penn State immediately capitalized on this advantage, earning a corner kick in the 82nd minute that was taken by sophomore Andrew Privett. After the initial pass was kicked back out to Privett, he passed it to junior **Seth Kuhn** at the top of the 18 who sent it in to sophomore Liam **Butts** in the six who was able to get his right foot on it and past goalkeeper Roman Celentano for the equalizer.
- The Nittany Lions controlled most of the overtime periods but could not find the golden goal to take home the trophy.
- Sophomore goalkeeper Kris Shakes made a huge PK save on Indiana's winning attempt to give Penn State life, but Celentano would make the next save to give the Hoosiers the Big Ten Tournament title.

COACHING CONNECTIONS

- Penn State head coach Jeff Cook and UMass head coach Fran O'Leary go way back.
- Cook was O'Leary's assistant at Dartmouth from 1994-95, and then took over for O'Leary at the helm of the Big Green in 2001.
- Both coaches also had stints in Major League Soccer with Cook at the Philadelphia Union and O'Leary at Toronto FC.

OFFENSIVE FIREPOWER

- Penn State is in the top two in the league in nearly every offensive category, while also ranking top-20 nationally in certain categories.
- The Nittany Lions are pacing the league in shots per game (13.00) and shots on goal per game

- (6.09).
- Penn State has scored four goals in two games this season, most recently against Michgian in the Big Ten Tournament semifinals on April 14.
- The Blue and White have taken at least 10 shots in nine of eleven games this season.
- Eleven players have recorded points this season. led by junior Danny Bloyou, redshirt senior Pierre Reedy, and freshman Peter Mangione with double-digit points each.

NATIONAL RECOGNITION

- Penn State climbed two spots to No. 12 in the final regular-season poll for United Soccer Coaches. The Nittany Lions also moved up two spots to No. 17 in Top Drawer Soccer's rankings.
- Through the NCAA Selection Show, the Nittany Lions remain the highest-ranked Big Ten team in the NCAA RPI standings at No. 18.

BUTTS IS BACK

- Sophomore Liam Butts has goals in back-to-back games now, most recently scoring the equalizer at No. 3 Indiana in the conference tournament championship game on April 17.
- His first goal of the season came against Michigan in the semifinal match on April 14 after he missed a handful of games near the end of the regular season due to injury.
- The 2019 first team All-Big Ten forward is another weapon to Penn State's powerful offense and to have him back is key.

BLOYOU BLASTS

- Junior transfer **Danny Bloyou** has incredible speed that he's been able to utilize to beat opposing defenders and find the back of the net.
- Bloyou has a team-high 16 points on a team-high seven goals and two assists.
- He has two multi-goal games this season, against Rutgers on March 15 and against Ohio State in the Big Ten quarterfinals on April 10.
- The Philadelphia, Pa., native recorded his first career game-winning goal at Northwestern on March 19 in overtime.
- Bloyou has earned National Player of the Week honors from College Soccer News (March 15-21) as well as two Top Drawer Soccer Team of the Week nods (March 23, April 13).
- His seven goals is second-most in the Big Ten as is his 16 total points. The total goals also ranked top 15 in the nation (13th) while total points are top 25 (24th).

REEDY'S LONG OVERDUE GOAL(S)

Redshirt senior and team captain **Pierre Reedv** has five goals on the season, including two game-winners against Rutgers on March 15 and Wisconsin on March 27. He also has three assists

- for 13 total points.
- His first goal of the season against Maryland in the season opener on Feb. 19 was his first since the 2016 season after missing the 2017 and 2018 seasons due to injury.
- The Kutztown, Pa., native was named Big Ten Co-Offensive Player of the Week on March 30 for the first time in his career.
- The team co-captain is fourth in the Big Ten and 43rd in the nation with his two game-winners. His five goals rank third in the league and 54th nationally.

HE'S THE MAN-GIONE

- Freshman midfielder/forward Peter Mangione has had quite the first year as a collegiate soccer player.
- The Hunt Valley, Md., native has five goals this season, including four game-winners. He also has three assists for 13 total points.
- Mangione is leading all of Division I men's soccer with a an 80 percent shot accuracy with his team-high 16 shots on goal. He is also tied first in the conference and third in the nation with his four game-winning goals.
- He was named Big Ten Offensive Player of the Week on Feb. 24 as well as being named to College Soccer News' Team of the Week.

SHAKE YOUR GROOVE THING

- Sophomore goalkeeper Kris Shakes had a solid second-half of the regular season, posting threestraight shutouts for the Nittany Lions against Northwestern, Ohio State and Wisconsin.
- Shakes holds a 0.85 goals-against average and a .789 save percentage with 30 saves.
- The Sunrise, Fla., native is second in the conference and 45th nationally for save percentage
- He was named Big Ten Co-Defensive Player of the Week on March 30 for the first time in his
- Shakes is 7-0-2 in net this season to move to 16-1-2 in his young career.

KUHN IN THE MIDDLE

- Junior Seth Kuhn has been a leader in the middle of the field for the Nittany Lions as a central
- The Wyomissing, Pa., native had a single-game career high three-point performance in Penn State's game against Rutgers on March 15 with one goal and an assist. He has a team-high four assists on the season, good for third in the Big Ten and top 65 in the nation (62nd).
- Kuhn was considered an honorable mention on Top Drawer Soccer's Team of the Week for the week of Feb. 15-21.

SEVEN NITTANY LIONS RECOGNIZED WITH ALL-**BIG TEN AWARDS**

- Seven Nittany Lions were honored by the Big Ten with All-Big Ten honors as announced by the conference office Friday.
- Junior **Danny Bloyou** and redshirt senior captains Pierre Reedy and Brandon Hackenberg were named to the All-Big Ten First Team.
- Junior Seth Kuhn and sophomore Kris Shakes were named to the All-Big Ten Second Team, and freshman Peter Mangione earned a spot on the Big Ten All-Freshman Team.
- Redshirt junior Nicholas Rieple is Penn State's Sportsmanship Award honoree.
- Penn State has three members on the first team for the second consecutive season for the first time since 2005-06. They also have at least one player on the all-freshman team for the sixthstraight year (2015-present).

200 CAREER WINS

- Head coach Jeff Cook picked up his 200th career win as a collegiate head coach in the victory at Rutgers on Feb. 23.
- Cook has 23 years of collegiate head coaching experience, with stints at Wheaton College, Cincinnati and Dartmouth before coming to Penn State in 2018.

HACKENBERG NAMED SENIOR CLASS AWARD **CANDIDATE**

- Redshirt senior Brandon Hackenberg was named one of 30 candidates for the 2020-21 Senior CLASS Award.
- To be eligible for the award, a student-athlete must be classified as an NCAA Division I senior, and have noteable achievements in four areas of excellence: community, classroom, character, and competition.
- Hackenberg is the second-straight candidate for the Nittany Lions, following Aaron Molloy in 2019.

PENN STATE DEBUTS

- Five Nittany Lions made their Penn State debuts during the regular season.
- Freshmen Peter Mangione and Femi Awodesu and junior transfer Danny Bloyou all made their debuts in the season opener against Maryland on
- Redshirt freshman Owen Elliott made his first career start in net at Rutgers on Feb. 23. Freshman Tyger Evans also debuted against Rutgers off the bench.
- Senior transfer Jose Palomeque debuted as a sub against Rutgers on March 15.

UNPRECEDENTED SEASON

MAC HERMANN TROPHY WATCH LIST

- Sophomore Liam Butts was one of 34 players named to the 2020-21 Men's MAC Hermann Trophy Watch List as announced by the United Soccer Coaches and Missouri Athletic Club on Jan. 28.
- The MAC Hermann Trophy, presented by World Wide Technology, is the most prestigious individual honor in NCAA Division I soccer, widely considered the equivalent of the Heisman Trophy.

HACKENBERG PICKED 22ND IN 2021 MLS SUPERDRAFT

- Redshirt senior Brandon Hackenberg was selected 22nd overall by Orlando City SC in the first round of the 2021 Major League Soccer (MLS) SuperDraft on Jan. 21.
- Hackenberg is the 16th Nittany Lion to be drafted by MLS and the third-highest draftee in program history.
- He is the second consecutive Penn State player to be drafted in the first round after former teammate Aaron Molloy was picked 16th overall in 2020, also marking the first time in program history that players have been taken in the first round in back-to-back years.
- He has decided to return this spring to play with Penn State and will be a team captain.

FAMILIAR NAMES, FAMILIAR FACES

- Penn State returns 19 players from the 2019 roster, including Big Ten Preseason Players to Watch Liam Butts, Brandon Hackenberg and Pierre Reedy.
- Sophomore goalkeeper Kris Shakes returns in between the pipes for the Nittany Lions after an impressive rookie campaign where he held a 0.691 goals-against average in 10 starts.

NEW KIDS ON THE BLOCK

- Penn State adds eight newcomers to the 2020-21 roster, which includes five freshmen, two transfers and one walk-on.
- Head coach Jeff Cook also added two new members to his staff in assistant coach Clint Long and volunteer assistant Methembe Ndlovu. Long is in charge of the goalkeepers and comes to Happy Valley from Oregon State.
