INSIDE THE GAME

PENN STATE OPENS 2021 CAMPAIGN AT WISCONSIN

- OPENING KICK:** No. 19/20 Penn State visits No. 12/15 Wisconsin in Camp Randall Stadium on Saturday for a Big Ten matchup to begin the 2021 season, presented by PSECU. Kickoff is set for 12 p.m. ET on FOX.
- BIG TEN SEASON OPENERS:** On Saturday, Penn State will compete in its fourth season opener against a Big Ten opponent. The first was against Minnesota, a 38-20 win, on September 4, 1993 in Beaver Stadium in Penn State's first game as a Big Ten conference member. The following year, the Nittany Lions began the season with a 56-3 win at Minnesota. Last year's shortened season started with a matchup at Indiana, a 36-35 overtime setback.
- ROAD WARRIORS:** Penn State will open Big Ten action on the road for the sixth straight season. Since 2016, Penn State has begun conference play at Michigan (2016), at Iowa (2017), at Illinois (2018), at Maryland (2019) and at Indiana (2020). PSU will also open Big Ten play on the road in 2022 (Purdue), 2023 (Illinois) and 2024 (Rutgers). In 29 seasons as a Big Ten member, Penn State has opened on the road 20 times in conference.
- SERIES HISTORY:** The Nittany Lions lead a tight series, 10-9, against Wisconsin. This is the seventh matchup when both teams are ranked. Penn State has won the last four matchups and six of the last seven contests. The latest battle was on November 10, 2018 when the Nittany Lions earned a 22-10 victory. Miles Sanders rushed for 159 yards and a touchdown while Jake Pinegar knocked in three field goals. The Penn State defense recorded five sacks and forced four turnovers.
- TOUGH OPPONENT:** Saturday's game marks the 13th time Penn State has opened the season against a ranked opponent. Penn State is 7-5 all-time when opening against a ranked opponent. The last time was on September 1, 2001 against No. 2 Miami when Penn State fell 33-7.
- THE OPPOSITION:** Wisconsin went 4-3 in 2020. The Badgers were dominant on the defensive side, pacing the Big Ten in total defense (299.9) and rushing defense (96.1), sitting fifth in the nation in both categories. Wisconsin led the Big Ten in third down defense (.287) and fourth down defense (.182), while ranking ninth in the nation in scoring defense (17.4). On offense, Wisconsin paced the country in time of possession (36:20).

PROGRAM NOTES

RECENT SUCCESS

Since 2016, Penn State holds a .742 winning percentage, with a record of 46-16, the seventh-best winning percentage among Power Five programs. Penn State has won at least nine games in four of the last five seasons, one of eight FBS programs to accomplish the feat.

ACADEMIC EXCELLENCE

A total of 509 of Penn State football student-athletes, including 29 in 2020, have earned Academic All-Big Ten honors since 1993 for owning at least a 3.0 grade point average and being a letterwinner.

ONE OF NATION'S TOUGHEST HOME VENUES

Penn State owns a superlative 299-77 (.795) record inside Beaver Stadium, the nation's second-largest facility, which opened in 1960 and has a capacity of 106,572. The Nittany Lions are 28-5 in Beaver Stadium since 2016, an .848 winning percentage, the eighth-best home record among Power Five teams.

HEAD COACH JAMES FRANKLIN

CAREER AT A GLANCE

- Franklin was named the 16th head football coach in the storied history of the Nittany Lion program on January 11, 2014.
- Franklin is one of six current FBS head coaches to lead his teams to a bowl game in each of his first nine seasons as a head coach.
- Franklin is one of three current Big Ten coaches (Ryan Day, Kirk Ferentz) to have won a Big Ten Championship.
- He owns an 84-43 career record with a winning record in eight of his nine seasons at the helm.
- Franklin has led his teams to three Top 10 finishes (3 at Penn State) and six Top 25 finishes (2 at Vanderbilt; 4 at Penn State).
- In the last five seasons, Penn State is one of six teams to rank in the top 12 of the CFP final rankings at least four times.
- From 2016-19, Franklin led the Nittany Lions to three New Year's Six bowls - 2016 (Rose), 2017 (Fiesta) and 2019 (Cotton), making Penn State one of eight teams to accomplish the feat during the four-year span. Penn State last went to three New Year's Six bowls in four years in 1980-83 (1980 Fiesta, 1982 Fiesta, 1983 Sugar).
- Franklin guided Penn State to back-to-back New Year's Six bowls in 2016 (Rose) and 2017 (Fiesta) for the first time since 1985 (Orange) and 1986 (Fiesta).
- From in 2016-19, Franklin led Penn State to 42 wins, the most in program history for the Big Ten era, and 28 league wins, a program record.
- Franklin has 26 years of coaching experience at the collegiate and NFL level.
- In his first 10 years as a head coach, Franklin mentored 82 players who have gone on to the NFL ranks.
- Since 2016, the Nittany Lions have had 29 players selected in the NFL Draft. With six selections in 2021, Penn State is one of five programs to produce at least five draft picks in each of the last four NFL Drafts.
- Franklin has secured top-25 recruiting classes each of his last nine seasons, including a top-5 class at Penn State in 2018.
- Franklin is second all-time in winning percentage by an FBS African American head coach (minimum 80 wins) and is third in total wins.

NITTANY LIONS ON THE FIELD

- In **2020**, with Franklin's emphasis on safety, along with the precautions set by him, the coaching staff, medical staff and support staff, Penn State was one of only two Big Ten teams to play all nine of its scheduled games during a shortened season due to the COVID-19 pandemic. With the emergence of young skill players on offense, true freshmen accounted for 1,486 of Penn State's 3,873 total yards (38 percent), marking a school record for most combined scrimmage yards by true freshmen in a single season.
- Penn State earned its third 11-win season in four years with an 11-2 record in **2019**, including a win over No. 17 Memphis in the Goodyear Cotton Bowl Classic. The Nittany Lions posted their fourth-straight top 12 finish in the final CFP rankings, coming in 10th, and were ranked ninth in the final Associated Press and Amway Coaches polls to earn their 25th AP Top 10 finish. Franklin was a finalist for the Paul "Bear" Bryant National Coach of the Year award for the second time at Penn State (2016) and third time in his head coaching career.
- In **2018**, the Nittany Lions posted their third-straight season with at least nine wins with a 9-4 overall record, earning a berth in the VRBO Citrus Bowl. Penn State finished No. 12 in the final CFP rankings and No. 17 in the Associated Press and Amway Coaches polls.
- Penn State dimmed as high as No. 2 in the rankings in **2017** and appeared in a second-straight New Year's Six bowl, earning a 35-28 win over No. 11 Washington in the PlayStation Fiesta Bowl. At 11-2, the Nittany Lions earned back-to-back 11-win seasons for the fifth time in program history and first time since 2008 and 2009. Penn State finished the season No. 8 in the Associated Press and Amway Coaches polls and No. 9 in the final CFP rankings.
- Penn State surged in **2016**, winning nine consecutive games en route to the Big Ten Championship, a Rose Bowl berth and an 11-3 overall record. Penn State finished the season ranked No. 5 in the College Football Playoff rankings and No. 7 in the Associated Press and Amway Coaches polls. It was Penn State's highest finish in the polls since 2005. The Lions claimed their fourth overall Big Ten Championship and first outright title since 1994 with a thrilling, 38-31 comeback win over Wisconsin in the Big Ten Championship Game. Franklin was honored as Sporting News National Coach of the Year and the Woody Hayes National Coach of the Year, as well as the Dave McLain Big Ten Coach of the Year and Associated Press Big Ten Coach of the Year.
- Franklin guided the Nittany Lions to a 7-6 record in **2015** and a berth in the TaxSlayer Bowl.
- Franklin's first season in **2014** was bookended with a pair of thrilling victories for the Nittany Lions. It began with a final-play 26-24 victory over UCF in Dublin, Ireland, in Penn State's first-ever international game and ended with a comeback, a 31-30 overtime win over Boston College in the New Era Pinstripe Bowl in Yankee Stadium. Franklin became just the third Penn State coach to lead the team to at least seven wins in his first season, joining Dick Harlow (1915) and Bill O'Brien (2012), and he guided the Nittany Lions to a 4-0 start, joining Harlow as the only first-year Penn State coaches to win their initial four games.

NITTANY LIONS IN THE CLASSROOM

- A program-record nine Nittany Lions were named 2019-20 Big Ten Distinguished Scholars.
- The Nittany Lions posted their first 1,000 single-year APR in program history in 2018-19, topping the previous high of 993 in 2014-15.
- Punter Blake Gillikin took home CoSIDA Academic All-America® first-team honors in 2019 for the second-straight year to become the 12th two-time first-team selection in Penn State history. He graduated with a perfect 4.0 grade-point average in May. Gillikin's two first-team CoSIDA Academic All-America honors increase Penn State football's total to 67 honorees, which ranks second in Division I football history.
- Trace McSorley was selected as a 2018 National Football Foundation (NFF) Scholar-Athlete and a finalist for the Campbell Trophy, known as the "Academic Heisman." He was the 18th Nittany Lion to be selected as an NFF Scholar-Athlete.
- The Nittany Lions had a program-record 35 student-athletes claim Academic All-Big Ten honors in the fall of 2017.
- Tyler Yazujian collected a berth on the CoSIDA Academic All-America® first team in 2016 after an appearance on the second team in 2015.

NITTANY LIONS IN THE COMMUNITY

- The Nittany Lions are active in the community, participating in activities such as Uplifting Athletes, THON, Pennsylvania Special Olympics Summer Games, State College Area Food Bank and Penn State Hershey Children's Hospital visits.
- On June 15, 2020, Franklin was named to the Big Ten Anti-Hate and Anti-Racism Coalition.
- As part of the Cotton Bowl festivities in 2019, Franklin and his family made a \$10,000 financial commitment to the Dallas Children's Hospital.
- In August 2019, Franklin was named a Penn State University Renaissance Fund honoree, which awards outstanding community members for helping students in need.

SERIES NOTES

HEAD COACH PAUL CHRYST

- Paul Chryst is in his seventh season as head coach at his alma mater. He is a former Wisconsin player and assistant coach and a Madison, Wisconsin, native.
- Wisconsin has finished with a winning record in each of his first six seasons, including appearances in the Cotton, Orange and Rose Bowl.
- In 2020, the Badgers went 4-3, finishing the season with a 42-28 win over Wake Forest in the Duke's Mayo Bowl.
- Chryst was the head coach at Pitt for three seasons (2012-14) and led the Panthers to bowl games in each.
- Prior to his stint at Pitt, Chryst was the Badgers' offensive coordinator for seven years. During those seven seasons, Wisconsin claimed a pair of Big Ten titles and compiled a 70-22 (.761) record, winning at least 10 games five times.
- Chryst was offensive coordinator and quarterbacks coach at Oregon State in 2003-04. That followed his first stint at Wisconsin in 2002, as tight ends coach.

SCOUTING THE BADGERS

- Wisconsin went 4-3 in 2020 with wins over Illinois (45-7), Michigan (49-11), Minnesota (20-17, OT) and Wake Forest (42-28).
- The Badgers continued their dominance on defense, leading the Big Ten in total defense (299.9) and rushing defense (96.1), sitting fifth in the nation in both categories. Wisconsin also paced the Big Ten in third down defense (.287) and fourth down defense (.182), while ranking ninth in the nation in scoring defense (17.4).
- On offense, Wisconsin paced the country in time of possession (36:20).
- Quarterback Graham Mertz returns after completing 61 percent of his passes for 1,238 yards and nine touchdowns.
- Jalen Berger is the leading returning rusher with 301 yards and two touchdowns in 2020.
- Tight End Jake Ferguson paced the Badgers with 30 receptions, 305 receiving yards and four touchdowns.
- Linebacker Jack Sanborn led Wisconsin with 52 tackles in 2020.
- Fellow linebackers Leo Chenal and Nick Herbig paced the Badgers with six tackles for loss and Chenal led the team with three sacks.

LAST MEETING NO. 20 PENN STATE STIFLES WISCONSIN, 22-10

No. 20 Penn State earned a 22-10 win over Wisconsin at Beaver Stadium. The Nittany Lions limited the Badgers to their lowest point total since 2016 and Miles Sanders rushed for 159 yards and a touchdown.

Wisconsin was first on the scoreboard with a touchdown on its first possession, but Penn State outscored the Badgers 22-3 over the remainder of the game for its 10th-straight win over a Big Ten West Division opponent and fourth-straight win over Wisconsin. Penn State clinched its 14th consecutive winning season with the win.

Miles Sanders surpassed the 1,000-yard mark for the season and Jake Pinegar converted three field goals, including a pair of 40-plus yard boots. Quarterback Trace McSorley finished 19-for-25 passing with 160 yards and a touchdown pass to DeAndre Thompkins to tie the Penn State record for quarterback wins with his 29th, equaling the mark set by Todd Blackledge and Tony Sacca.

Wisconsin running back Jonathan Taylor, the nation's leading rusher, totaled 185 yards on 20 carries, including a 71-yard touchdown run on the Badgers' first offensive possession. However, the Nittany Lion defense held the Badgers' fourth-ranked rushing attack (273.0 yards per game) to 209 rushing yards and just 60 passing yards.

Penn State totaled a season-high four turnovers. Nick Scott and Amani Oruwariye both recorded an interception and Micah Parsons finished with a team-best seven tackles.

Wisconsin was first on the scoreboard, needing just three plays to score, as Taylor broke free for a 71-yard touchdown run up the middle.

Penn State answered with an eight-play, 75-yard touchdown drive. McSorley completed four of five passes for 32 yards, including a 14-yard touchdown pass to Thompkins.

A fumbled snap gave Penn State the ball at its own 48, setting up a field goal drive. Pinegar converted from 49 yards out to give Penn State a 10-7 lead with 1:53 remaining in the first quarter.

The Nittany Lions extended their lead with 8:09 remaining in the second quarter on a Sanders 1-yard touchdown plunge over the goal line. The extra point kick sailed wide right though, leaving Penn State with a 16-7 lead.

Wisconsin started with the ball in the second half and pulled within six points on a 28-yard field goal by Rafael Gaglianone. However, Penn State restored its nine-point lead with a 42-yard field goal by Pinegar with 4:07 remaining in the third quarter.

Pinegar converted from 23 yards out for the final margin, 22-10, with 7:23 remaining.

Wisconsin moved into Penn State territory twice following the final score, but was stopped on fourth down with 2:49 remaining and intercepted by Scott with 34 seconds remaining.

S-ZONE

- Penn State's iconic S-Zone is a staple of college football and has taken many forms over the years. This year, thanks to the Lion Ambassadors, the Penn State Alumni Association's student alumni corps, the S-Zone is a banner stretching across 800 seats above the team tunnel at Beaver Stadium.
- Through a partnership with the Penn State Alumni Association, Blue & White Society, and Lion Ambassadors, the banner honors the Class of 2021 and Class of 2022 and features the names of members of those classes.
- This S-Zone banner is designed to celebrate and pay homage to both of these classes, who saw their Penn State experiences altered significantly in this past year. In the absence of fans, it also will help to show support for Penn State's student-athletes and coaches who will compete in Beaver Stadium this season.
- The banner is in place in Beaver Stadium through the end of this 2021 season.

ACADEMIC SUCCESS

- The Nittany Lions had 29 players selected as Academic All-Big Ten in Fall 2020.
- A program-record nine Nittany Lions were named 2019-20 Big Ten Distinguished Scholars.
- Penn State posted its first 1,000 single-year APR in program history in 2018-19, topping the previous high of 993 in 2014-15.
- In the 2020 fall semester, five Nittany Lions posted a 4.0 grade-point average (GPA). Thirty-seven made Dean's List (3.5 GPA or higher) and 86 posted a 3.0 GPA or higher with the University's alternative COVID-19 grading system in place. The team posted a 3.39 team GPA.
- The 2020 spring semester saw the Nittany Lions post 89 squad members with at least a 3.0 GPA with the University's alternative COVID-19 grading system in place.
- In 2019, punter Blake Gillikin took home CoSIDA Academic All-America® first-team honors for the second-straight year to become the 12th two-time first-team selection in Penn State history. He graduated with a perfect 4.0 grade-point average in May 2020.
- Gillikin's two first-team CoSIDA Academic All-America honors increase Penn State football's total to 67 honorees, which ranks second in Division I football history (FBS and FCS).

- Trace McSorley was selected as a 2018 National Football Foundation (NFF) Scholar-Athlete and a finalist for the Campbell Trophy, known as the "Academic Heisman." He was the 18th Nittany Lion to be selected as an NFF Scholar-Athlete.

OVERTIME OVER TIME

- College football introduced overtime during the bowl season in 1995 and adopted it for regular season games in 1996. Since then, Penn State has played 14 overtime games, including six over the 2012-14 seasons.
- Nine of the 14 overtime tilts have come at home, three in true road games, one in the 2006 Orange Bowl and one in the 2014 Pinstripe Bowl.
- Penn State is 8-6 all-time in overtime games, with a 5-4 record at Beaver Stadium, 1-2 mark in true road games and 2-0 in contests at a neutral site.
- Penn State's first two overtime contests came vs. Iowa in 2000 and 2002 at home. The Nittany Lions dropped their first three contests that went to the extra period, but won five straight overtime contests before falling to Nebraska on Nov. 23, 2013.

LIONS UNDER THE LIGHTS

- The 2021 season marks the 21st straight with at least one regular-season night game on the schedule.
- In 2019, Penn State played its most regular season night games in program history with four primetime tilts.
- Penn State is 55-32 at night all-time. The figure breaks down to 16-11 at home, 27-14 on the road and 12-7 in neutral site games. Penn State is 1-1 at regular season neutral sites, 11-6 in bowl games and 1-0 in conference championship games.
- On Oct. 12, 2013, the Lions claimed the longest game in Big Ten history when they edged Michigan under the lights, 43-40, in four overtimes in front of a sellout Beaver Stadium crowd of 107,844 on Homecoming.

- Penn State football head coach **James Franklin** announced redshirt seniors QB **Sean Clifford**, S **Jonathan Sutherland** and K/P **Jordan Stout**, seniors S **Jaquan Brisker** and DT **PJ Mustipher** and redshirt junior OL **Rasheed Walker** have been named team captains for the 2021 season.
- Clifford and Sutherland are captains for the third-straight season, the only three-time captains in program history.

URSCHEL NAMED TO CFP SELECTION COMMITTEE

- John Urschel, a former All-American lineman at Penn State, is in the second year of a three-year term on the CFP Selection Committee.
- Urschel was also a two-time All-Big Ten performer and a 4.0 GPA student at Penn State University. The Baltimore Ravens drafted him in the fifth round of the 2014 NFL draft. He retired after three seasons with the Ravens and enrolled at MIT to pursue a Ph.D. in applied mathematics, which he completed in 2021, which he began work on in January 2016 while he was still playing for the Ravens.
- Urschel earned a bachelor's degree in mathematics in 2012 (in less than three years) and a master's in mathematics a year later (again with a 4.0). During the spring 2013 semester, Urschel taught a section of trigonometry and analytic geometry to Penn State undergraduate students three days a week in addition to his own academic and football responsibilities. He won the Sullivan Award, given to the most outstanding amateur athlete in the country, in 2013. A two-time Academic All-American, he also won the 2013 Campbell Trophy, which recognizes college football's top scholar-athlete.

TEAM NOTES

FOUR FORMER LIONS ON 2021 HALL OF FAME BALLOT

- Penn State lettermen LaVar Arrington, Paul Posluszny and Steve Wisniewski have been selected as a part of the national ballot for the National Football Foundation's College Hall of Fame's Class of 2022. A total of 78 players and seven coaches from FBS are on the 2022 ballot.
- The trio of standouts have an opportunity to join 19 former Nittany Lion players and five Penn State coaches who have been inducted into the Hall.
- Also on the Hall of Fame ballot is former Nittany Lion student-athlete Glenn Killinger, who is among the candidates for the divisional coach Class of 2022. Killinger was inducted into the Hall of Fame as a player in 1966.
- Arrington, an outside linebacker for the Nittany Lions, was a first-team All-American in 1998 and 1999. In 1999, he was selected winner of the Butkus Award as the nation's top linebacker and Chuck Bednarik Award as the country's top defensive player, while also being a finalist for the Bronko Nagurski Trophy and Rotary Lombardi Award. The 12th Nittany Lion selected a two-time first-team All-American, Arrington finished ninth in balloting for the 1999 Heisman Trophy. Was the first sophomore selected Big Ten Defensive Player of the Year in 1998. In 1999, he made 72 tackles, with 20 TFL, nine sacks, one interception, one forced fumble, two fumble recoveries (one TD) and two blocked kicks. His leaping tackle over the offensive line of an Illinois runner was selected the 1998 Compaq Defensive Play of the Year.
- Posluszny, an outside linebacker for the Nittany Lions, was a first-team All-American in 2005 and 2006. Posluszny became just the second two-time winner of the Chuck Bednarik Award, presented to the nation's top defensive player, in 2006. In 2005, he also won the Butkus Award, presented to the nation's top linebacker and was a finalist for the 2006 honor. The 13th Nittany Lion to be named a two-time first-team All-American, Posluszny also was a two-time finalist for the Rotary Lombardi Award. The Nittany Lions' first two-time team captain since 1968-69, he became Penn State's career tackle leader with 372. A starter in the last 37 games of his career, Posluszny became the first Nittany Lion to lead the team in tackles three times and to post three 100-tackle seasons, recording 116 in 2006. Posluszny also was a two-time first-team ESPN the Magazine Academic All-American and was selected the 2006 Academic All-American of the Year among Division I football players.
- Wisniewski was a three-year starter at guard for the Nittany Lions who would go on to become an All-Pro lineman in the NFL. He was one of two sophomores to start on the 1986 National Championship team and he opened holes for two first-team All-America running backs, Blair Thomas (1987) and D.J. Dozier (1986). One of just four Penn State offensive linemen to earn a pair of first-team All-America honors, he was recognized in 1988 by the American Football Coaches (AFCA) and repeated All-America accolades from Sporting News. A 1988 team captain, Wisniewski is one of just two offensive linemen to earn Penn State's team MVP honor since its creation in 1978.
- From Harrisburg, Killinger was a Walter Camp All-American at quarterback for the Nittany Lions in 1921. He coached at Dickinson (1922), Rensselaer (1927-32), Moravian (1933) and West Chester (1934-41, 45-59). Killinger is the winningest coach in West Chester history and is a member of the Pennsylvania Sports Hall of Fame. He died in 1988.
- The 2021 College Football Hall of Fame Class Presented by ETT will be officially inducted during the 65th NFF Annual Awards Dinner on Dec. 7, 2021, at the ARIA Resort & Casino Las Vegas. They will also be honored at their respective schools with an NFF Hall of Fame On-Campus Salute, presented by Fidelity Investments, during the 2022 season.

OFFENSIVE NOTES

- **Mike Yurich** takes over as Penn State's offensive coordinator/quarterbacks coach after spending the 2020 season at Texas.
- In addition to Texas, Yurich has previous stints as the passing game coordinator/quarterbacks coach at Ohio State (2019) and the offensive coordinator and quarterbacks coach at Oklahoma State (2013-18).
- In 15 years as an offensive coordinator, Yurich's offenses have averaged 6.49 yards per play, ranking first among OCs since 2013.
- Yurich's offenses have averaged 14.03 yards per completion, also first among OCs since 2013.
- Since 2013, Yurich's offenses have scored 50 or more points 26 times and 40 or more points 51 times (50 percent of games coached) with both numbers leading FBS OCs.
- In 2020, Yurich led Texas' offense to rank eighth in the FBS in scoring offense (42.7 ppg), 16th in passing efficiency (156.2) and 19th in total offense (475.4 ypg).
- Since the start of the 2016 season, Penn State's offense is second in the Big Ten in scoring (35.6; 9th nationally), touchdown percentage (33.2, 13th), points per possession (2.2; 15th), scoring percentage (41.6; 17th), yards per pass attempt (8.2; 18th), yards per play (6.2; 23rd) and total offense (431.6).
- Penn State's offense has been explosive since the 2016 campaign, as it leads the Big Ten in 20-plus yard play percentage (8.19 percent; 10th), 70-plus (0.4, 8th) and 80-plus (0.2, 3rd), is second in 40-plus (2.1; 16th) and third in 30-plus (3.7; 20th), 50-plus (1.0; 29th) and 60-plus (0.6; 22nd).
- Additionally, the Nittany Lions are second in the Big Ten and 10th nationally in 15-plus yard passing play percentage since 2016 (20.3 percent).
- The Nittany Lions have gained 200 or more rushing yards 31 times in the **James Franklin** era. Penn State is 26-5 in those games.
- Penn State rushed for at least 245 yards in four of its final five games in 2020.
- The blue and white has rushed for over 200 yards in at least four games in each of the last five seasons.
- Penn State returns nine starters and 19 letterwinners (10 lost) on offense.
- Eight of Penn State's nine leading pass catchers from 2020 are back for 2021, including senior WR **Jahan Dotson** (52 receptions, 884 yards, 8 touchdowns), sophomore WR **Parker Washington** (36, 489, 6), sophomore TE **Brenton Strange** (17, 164, 2) and sophomore WR **KeAndre Lambert-Smith** (15, 138).
- Additionally, the Nittany Lions return four of its top five rushers from 2020, including sophomore RB **Keyvone Lee** (89 carries, 438 yards, 4 touchdowns), redshirt senior QB **Sean Clifford** (99, 335, 3), junior RB **Devyn Ford** (67, 274, 3) and sophomore RB **Caziah Holmes** (51, 227, 2).
- Redshirt sophomore RB **Noah Cain** suffered a season-ending injury on the first drive in the opener at Indiana in 2020.
- Cain scored eight touchdowns as a true freshman in 2019 and rushed for 443 yards.
- Dotson, redshirt junior OL **Mike Miranda** and redshirt junior OL **Rasheed Walker** earned second-team All-Big Ten honors a year ago, while Washington was named a Freshman All-American by The Athletic.
- Dotson was also a Phil Steele honorable mention All-American in 2020.
- During the 2020 season, Penn State true freshmen accounted for 1,486 total yards (38%) of Penn State's 3,873 yards on offense, a school record.
- Penn State has scored 40 points 20 times since 2016. By comparison, from 2008 until 2015, the Nittany Lions had 18 40-point outings.

QUARTERBACK NOTES

- Redshirt senior **Sean Clifford** enters his third season as Penn State's starting signal caller, having played in 25 career games, making 20 starts.
- Clifford was named a team captain for the 2021 season, his third consecutive year of being a captain.
- He joins S **Jonathan Sutherland** as the only three-time team captains in program history.
- Clifford begins the 2021 season on the watch lists for the Johnny Unitas Golden Arm, Manning Award Reese's Senior Bowl and Wuerffel Trophy.
- He is also a nominee for the NFF's William V. Campbell Trophy, awarded to the nation's top football scholar athlete, and the Allstate Good Works Team.
- The QB, who owns a 3.45 cumulative GPA, graduated with a degree in public relations in December 2020 and is pursuing a second degree in journalism.
- Clifford is just one of 11 Penn State players all-time to reach 5,000-plus yards of total offense and one of 12 quarterbacks to reach 4,000 career passing yards.
- He enters the 2021 campaign seventh all-time in program history in career total yards (5,466) and eighth in touchdowns responsible for (49).
- The Cincinnati, Ohio native is Penn State's current all-time leader in passing efficiency rating (146.8).
- Additionally, the three-time captain ranks second in career completion percentage (.600), third in yards per attempt (8.2), fourth in touchdown percentage (7.11), fifth in passing touchdowns (41), 11th in passing yardage (4,732) and completions (346), 12th in attempts (577) and tied for 14th in yards per completion (13.7).
- Clifford owns 21 career games with multi-TD passes, including eight with three or more TDs and two with four or more.
- The redshirt senior has tossed multiple touchdowns in a half on 11 occasions and eight different times, has thrown multiple touchdowns in a quarter.
- He is fifth in school history for 300-yard passing games (3) and tied for seventh for 200-yard games (11).
- Clifford owns five career games with at least 250 passing yards and three passing touchdowns.
- The quarterback has tossed four career touchdowns of 70-plus yards and has completed 63 career passes of 20 or more yards.
- Among Penn State quarterbacks, he is third all-time in rushing yardage (734) and tied for eighth in rushing touchdowns (8).
- In his career, Clifford has posted seven career rushes of 20 or more yards.
- Offensive coordinator **Mike Yurcich** also heads the Penn State quarterback room.
- Three quarterbacks Yurcich coached in college are currently on NFL rosters (Sam Ehlinger – Texas, Justin Fields – Ohio State, Mason Rudolph – Oklahoma State).
- Under Yurcich's guidance in 2020, Ehlinger tossed a Big 12-leading 25 touchdowns for Texas.
- Yurcich served as the passing game coordinator and quarterbacks coach at Ohio State in 2019, where quarterback Justin Fields was a finalist for the Heisman Trophy, Walter Camp Player of the Year Award and Davey O'Brien Award.

RUNNING BACK NOTES

- Penn State returns a deep running back corps. The room has combined to play in 78 games, including 30 starts. Four members have started at least one game.
- Three Nittany Lions landed on the preseason Doak Walker Award Watch List, including junior **Noah Cain**, sophomore **Keyvone Lee** and senior **John Lovett**.
- Penn State is the only school in the country to feature three running backs on the Doak Walker Award Watch List.
- The trio of junior **Devyn Ford**, sophomore **Caziah Holmes** and Lee combined for 207 carries, 939 yards and nine touchdowns in 2020.
- Cain returns after missing all but the first drive at Indiana in 2020.
- As a freshman in 2019, Cain rushed for 443 yards and eight touchdowns, while averaging 5.3 yards per carry.
- Cain's eight touchdowns set a Penn State freshman record.
- Ford started five games in 2020, rushing for 274 yards and three touchdowns, while averaging 4.1 yards per carry.
- Ford has rushed for 568 career yards and six touchdowns.
- Lee had a strong freshman campaign with a team-high 438 yards on 89 carries. He averaged 4.9 yards per carry and had four rushing scores.
- Holmes gained 227 yards on the ground in 2020 with 4.4 yards per carry and two touchdowns.
- Lovett joins the Nittany Lions after transferring from Baylor, where he ranks 16th on it's all-time list with 1,803 career rushing yards.
- Lovett sits 11th all-time at Baylor in yards per rushing attempt (5.07).
- Lovett started five games in 2020, rushing for 130 yards and a touchdown. He had 665 rushing yards in 2019 and 573 yards in 2018.
- Run game coordinator/running backs coach **Ja'uan Seider** has 13 yards of college coaching experience, including 10 at the Power Five level.
- Seider helped a young running backs group to rank fifth in the Big Ten in rushing in 2020.
- In 2019, Seider mentored Journey Brown, who had 11 rushes of 20 or more yards and posted a Cotton Bowl and Penn State bowl-record 202 rushing yards.
- In 2018, Penn State posted its highest rushing average (204.9) since 2008 (205.8), led by second-team All-Big Ten selection Miles Sanders.
- As a player at Florida A&M, he won the Doug Williams Award for National Offensive Player of the Year, Jake Gaither Award (considered the Heisman Trophy of Historically Black Colleges) and earned All-America honors after throwing for 2,622 yards and 27 touchdowns and rushing for 740 yards and 14 touchdowns in 1999.
- Seider, who was the 1999 MEAC Offensive Player of the Year, was selected in the sixth round of the 2000 NFL Draft by the San Diego Chargers.

WIDE RECEIVER NOTES

- Senior **Jahan Dotson** leads a talented wide receiver room.
- Dotson begins the 2021 campaign on the Biletnikoff and Maxwell Award watch lists. He's also on the Paul Hornung Award watch list for the most versatile player in the country.
- The senior has a reception in 29-straight games, dating back to October 20, 2018 against Indiana, which ranks seventh among current FBS players.
- Dotson sits 17th all-time at Penn State with 1,575 career receiving yards. He's also tied 13th in receiving touchdowns with 13.
- The Nazareth, Pa. native ranked 17th in the country with 884 receiving yards in 2020.
- Dotson's 17.0 yards per reception ranked fourth in the FBS and second among Power Five receivers for players with at least 50 catches in 2020.
- Dotson is one of three returning Power Five receivers, seven in FBS, that tallied at least 50 receptions, 880 receiving yards and eight receiving touchdowns in 2020. Dotson had 52 catches for 884 yards and eight scores.
- Dotson was one of nine FBS receivers, and three Power Five receivers, with multiple 70-yard touchdown receptions in 2020.
- Dotson has five career receiving touchdowns of 60 or more yards (75 and 70 vs. Illinois 2020; 68 vs. Iowa 2020; 60 at Indiana 2020; 72 vs. Purdue, 2019).
- Thirty-eight of Dotson's 52 receptions (73%) in 2020 gained a first down. That ranked third among players with at least 50 receptions in 2020.
- Dotson and sophomore **Parker Washington** (36) were the first Penn State duo with 30 or more catches in a season since 2017.
- Washington has a catch in all nine games of his career.
- Among true freshmen in 2020, Washington ranked third in receiving touchdowns (6), eighth in receptions per game (4.0) and eighth in receiving yards per game (54.3).
- Washington was the only FBS freshman with at least 36 catches, 480 receiving yards and six receiving touchdowns through the first nine games of the 2020 season.
- Dotson and Washington's combined 1,373 receiving yards in 2020 are third-most among Power Five returning receiver duos.
- Sophomore **KeAndre Lambert-Smith** joined Washington in being the first pair of true freshman receivers to start a game for Penn State since 2014 when they started against Maryland in 2020.
- Offensive recruiting coordinator/wide receivers coach **Taylor Stubblefield** enters his second season on the Penn State staff.
- Stubblefield is in his 14th year as a receivers coach, including five seasons with Power Five programs.
- As a player, Stubblefield caught 325 passes, which was an NCAA record at the completion of his career at Purdue. He still owns the Big Ten record for career receptions and ranks second in conference history with 3,629 yards.
- Stubblefield was a consensus All-American and a finalist for the Biletnikoff Award in 2004.

TIGHT ENDS NOTES

- A young, but talented tight end group, led by redshirt sophomore **Brenton Strange**, looks to continue a strong tight end tradition.
- Since **James Franklin** took over the program in 2014, three PSU tight ends have been taken in the NFL Draft, tied for fifth in the nation during that span (Pat Freiermuth – 2021, 2nd round; Mike Gesicki – 2018, 2nd round; Jesse James – 2015, 5th round).
- Strange hauled in 17 catches for 164 yards and two touchdowns in nine games (five starts) in 2020.
- He had a career-long 28-yard touchdown grab against Iowa and a 7-yard score against Illinois.
- Strange is a member of the Mackey Award Watch List.
- Sophomore **Theo Johnson** enjoyed a solid first year in Happy Valley.
- Johnson appeared in seven games, making one start.
- He made four receptions for 56 yards, including a career-long 23-yard reception against Illinois.
- Eight of Johnson and Strange's 21 catches in 2020 went for first downs.
- Redshirt freshman **Tyler Warren** saw playing time in two games and was the Coaching Staff's Developmental Squad Offensive Player of the Week following the Maryland game (11/7/20).
- Tight ends coach **Ty Howle** was named to the position on February 5, 2021 after serving as an offensive analyst in 2020, working closely with the offensive line and tight ends.
- Prior to returning to Happy Valley, Howle spent four seasons on the coaching staff at Western Illinois, serving as assistant head coach/co-offensive coordinator/offensive line coach in 2018-19.
- Howle was a four-year letterwinner on the Penn State offensive line from 2009-13. He started at center and left guard and was a four-time Academic All-Big Ten selection. He was a team captain in 2013.
- Howle played in 47 career games for the Nittany Lions, making 13 starts. He graduated in 2013 with a bachelor's degree in kinesiology.

OFFENSIVE LINE NOTES

- The returning members of the Penn State offensive line have combined to play in 131 games in Happy Valley, including 47 starts.
- Redshirt junior **Rasheed Walker**, on the preseason Outland Trophy and Rotary Lombardi Watch Lists, leads the returnees with 22 starts, all at left tackle.
- Walker was a third-team All-Big Ten selection in 2020.
- Redshirt senior **Mike Miranda** has been a valuable member of the line with his versatility. He's appeared in 35 games with 18 starts, nine at left guard and nine at right guard.
- Miranda is also on the Outland Trophy and Reese's Senior Bowl watch Lists.
- Redshirt sophomore **Caedan Wallace** made seven starts at right tackle in 2020, including the final six games, and owns 13 career appearances.
- Redshirt senior **Des Holmes** has appeared in 22 games, while redshirt senior **Anthony Whigan** has played in 11 and redshirt junior **Juice Scruggs** has played in 8.
- Senior **Eric Wilson** brings 20 college starts to Penn State after transferring from Harvard.
- The Penn State offensive line helped the Nittany Lions to rank second in the Big Ten in total offense (430.3).
- The Nittany Lion offense led the Big Ten with 223 first downs.
- Offensive line coach **Phil Trautwein** enters his second season at Penn State.
- He was named to the American Football Coaches Association (AFCA) Class of 2021 "35 Under 35" list, recognizing the top-35 football coaches under the age of 35. He was the only Big Ten coach and the only offensive line coach on the 2021 list.
- In his first season at Penn State, Trautwein helped four Penn State offensive linemen to earn All-Big Ten honors, including Will Fries (second team), Miranda (second team), Michal Menet (third team) and Walker (third team).
- He's coached 13 All-Conference selections over the last three seasons.
- Trautwein was a two-time All-SEC selection and two-time team captain as a left tackle at Florida, earning first-team honors in 2008 and second-team accolades in 2006.
- He was part of the Gators winning the BCS National Championship and SEC titles in the 2006 and 2008 seasons.
- Trautwein played four years in the NFL.

DEFENSIVE NOTES

- Defensive coordinator/linebackers coach **Brent Pry** enters his 30th year of coaching and his 15th at a Power Five program.
- Pry has helped the program's he's coached to Top-25 finishes in total defense in eight of his last 11 seasons, including four at Penn State.
- Over the last five seasons, PSU sits second nationally in sacks per game (3.10; trailing only Clemson), third in QB hurries (876), fourth in total pressures generated (1305), fifth in fewest passing TDs allowed per game (1.16), seventh in tackles for loss percentage (10.76) and ninth in fewest rushing yards per attempt (3.51).
- Penn State's 239 sacks over the last six years (2015-20) are third only to Clemson (289) and Alabama (256).
- Over the last six years, Penn State has cumulated a 9.03 percent sack percentage (239 sacks on 2,829 plays), which ranks third behind Clemson (10.25%) and Michigan (9.39%).
- Since 2014, Penn State has held opponents to seven or less points 21 times, tied for fourth-most among FBS teams. Fifteen of those 21 games have been against Big Ten opponents.
- Since 2014, Penn State has kept opponents under 300 total yards 41 times, the seventh-most games among FBS teams.
- The Nittany Lions have limited opponents to under 100 yards rushing 34 times since 2014. Penn State is 28-6 in those games.
- Penn State has registered 10 or more tackles for loss 24 times since 2014.
- In 2020, Penn State held third in the Big Ten in total defense (328.8; 17th nationally), second in passing defense (198.6; 24th) and tackles for loss (6.7) and fourth in rushing defense (130.2).
- Penn State returns seven starters and 19 letterwinners (7 lost) on defense.
- The Nittany Lions return four of their top five tackles from a year ago, including redshirt senior LB **Ellis Brooks** (team-best 60 tackles), senior LB **Jesse Luketa** (59), senior S **Jaquan Brisker** (57) and junior LB **Brandon Smith** (37).
- A total of 66.3 percent of Penn State tackling and 57.5 percent of its tackles for loss production returns for the 2021 campaign.
- A total of five All-Big Ten selections are back for 2021 including third team selections in Brisker and redshirt sophomore CB **Joey Porter Jr.**, and honorable mention selections in senior CB **Tariq Castro-Fields**, senior DT **PJ Mustipher** and Smith.
- Seven defensive players have made their way on 2021 preseason watch lists including Brisker (Bednarik, Thorpe, Nagurski, Senior Bowl), Mustipher (Rotary Lombardi, Lott IMPACT, Senior Bowl), Luketa (Butkus, Senior Bowl), Brooks (Senior Bowl), Castro-Fields (Senior Bowl), DE **Arnold Ebiketie** (Senior Bowl) and Smith (Butkus).

COACHING STAFF NOTES

COACHING STAFF CHANGES

- Penn State added Offensive Coordinator/Quarterbacks coach **Mike Yurich**, Tight Ends coach **Ty Howle** and Co-Defensive Coordinator/Safeties coach **Anthony Poindexter**.
- Yurich spent the 2020 season as Offensive Coordinator and Quarterbacks coach at Texas. He was the Offensive coordinator and Quarterbacks coach at Ohio State in 2019 and held the same position at Oklahoma State from 2013-18. Since 2013, Yurich's offenses have averaged 6.49 yards per play, ranking first nationally among OC's. His offenses have scored 50 or more points 26 times and 40 or more points in 51 games (50 percent of games coached).
- Howle was named Penn State's Tight Ends Coach after serving as an Offensive Analyst for the 2020 season, working closely with the offensive line and tight ends. Before returning to his alma mater, Howle served four years on the coaching staff at Western Illinois and was the Assistant Head Coach/Co-Offensive Coordinator/Offensive Line Coach in 2018-19.
- Poindexter, a 2020 College Football Hall of Fame inductee, brings 18 years of collegiate coaching experience and seven years as a Defensive or Co-Defensive Coordinator. He spent the last four seasons as Co-Defensive Coordinator/Safeties Coach at Purdue. As a player, Poindexter was a two-time Consensus All-American at Virginia and won a Super Bowl as a member of the Baltimore Ravens.

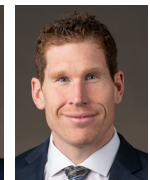

Six former Nittany Lions are patrolling the sidelines as part of NFL coaching staffs in 2021.

DEFENSIVE LINE NOTES

- The defensive line room has combined to play in 182 career games.
- Senior DT **PJ Mustipher** anchors the Nittany Lion defensive line room, having appeared in 34 career games and making 10 starts.
- A 2020 All-Big Ten honorable mention selection, Mustipher comes from a football family, as his father, Sam, played at West Virginia University and his brother, Sam, played at Notre Dame (2014-18) and is currently an offensive lineman for the Chicago Bears.
- A 2021 Rotary Lombardi Award, Lott IMPACT Trophy and Reese's Senior Bowl watch lister, Mustipher has made 86 career tackles, with two sacks, seven tackles for loss, two forced fumbles and a pass breakup.
- Mustipher was named to the Big Ten Equality Coalition in June 2020.
- Penn State added two experienced veterans to its defensive line during the offseason in redshirt senior DE **Arnold Ebiketie** and senior DT **Derrick Tangelo**.
- Ebiketie joins the Nittany Lions after a four-year stint at Temple (2017-20) where he posted 59 career tackles, six sacks and three forced fumbles.
- During his time with the Owls, Ebiketie was a 2020 All-American Athletic Conference (AAC) second team honoree and was twice named an AAC Defensive Player of the Week.
- He led Temple in tackles for loss (8.5), sacks (4) and forced fumbles (3) during the 2020 campaign and his 0.5 forced fumbles per game were tied for first in the conference.
- Tangelo comes to Penn State from Duke, where he played in 45 career games (27 starts).
- He has posted 114 career tackles, 12.0 tackles for loss, 4.5 sacks, five forced fumbles, two fumble recoveries, two QB pressures and a pass breakup.
- During the 2020 season with the Blue Devils, Tangelo recorded a team-best three forced fumbles to go along with 40 tackles, four tackles for loss and two sacks.
- **John Scott Jr.** enters his second season heading the Nittany Lion defensive line corps.
- Scott brings 17 years of collegiate coaching experience to the Penn State defensive line room with two additional years of coaching experience in the NFL.

LINEBACKERS NOTES

- In addition to leading the Nittany Lion defense, **Brent Pry** is in his eighth season coaching linebackers at Penn State.
- In his previous seven seasons, Pry has coached seven Penn State linebackers that have moved on to the NFL.
- Linebacker Micah Parsons was selected 12th overall by the Dallas Cowboys in the 2021 NFL Draft.
- Parsons was the highest drafted Penn State defensive player since Aaron Maybin went 11th overall to the Buffalo Bills in 2009.
- He was the first Nittany Lion defensive player drafted in the first round since Jared Odrick (2010; 28th overall to the Miami Dolphins) and the first PSU linebacker selected in the first round since LaVar Arrington (2000; second overall to the Washington Redskins).
- Parsons became the fifth Penn State linebacker to be selected in the first round, joining Arrington, Shane Conlan (1987; eighth overall to the Buffalo Bills), Ed O'Neil (1974; eighth overall to the Detroit Lions) and Dave Robinson (1963; 14th overall to the Green Bay Packers).
- Penn State has 69 linebackers drafted all-time, the most for any school.
- Redshirt senior **Ellis Brooks** is the veteran of a linebacker group that has combined for 130 career games.
- Brooks paces the group with 129 tackles in 35 career games and led the Nittany Lions with 60 tackles, finishing 10th in the Big Ten, a year ago.
- Senior **Jesse Luketa** and junior **Brandon Smith** each earned a spot on the 2021 Butkus Award Watch List.
- Luketa has appeared in 34 games (10 starts), recording 90 tackles and seven pass breakups.
- The Ottawa native made 59 stops last season.
- Smith started all nine games in 2020, registering 37 tackles, with a team-high eight tackles for loss, and two sacks.
- Sophomore **Curtis Jacobs** played in eight games last season, making nine stops.
- Redshirt junior **Charlie Katshir** has played in 15 career games.

DEFENSIVE BACKS NOTES

- The Nittany Lion defense includes a deep and talented secondary. The group has combined to play in 241 games and start 54 contests at the Power Five level.
- An All-Big Ten selection in 2019 and 2020, senior CB **Tariq Castro-Fields** returns to lead the secondary. He has 106 tackles, three interceptions and 19 pass breakups in his Penn State career.
- Senior S **Jaquan Brisker** leads the safeties after receiving All-American first team honors from Pro Football Focus in 2020.
- Brisker is on preseason watch lists for the Bednarik Award, Bronko Nagurski Trophy, Jim Thorpe Award and Reese's Senior Bowl. He additionally has been named a second-team Preseason All-American by the Associated Press.
- Redshirt sophomore CB **Joey Porter Jr.** started eight games in 2020, earning All-Big Ten third team honors after posting 33 tackles and four pass breakups.
- The cornerback room added two transfers. Junior **Johnny Dixon** transferred from South Carolina after playing in 22 games and starting nine. **AJ Lytton** arrives from Florida State where he also played in 22 games.
- Redshirt senior S **Jonathan Sutherland** has played in 35 games as a Nittany Lion, tallying 75 tackles and 4.5 tackles for loss.
- Junior S **Keaton Ellis** made the switch from cornerback to safety during the offseason. Ellis has made six starts and played in 19 games as a Nittany Lion. He has made 30 tackles to go with three forced fumbles, four pass breakups and an interception.
- Senior S **Ji'Ayir Brown** played in all nine games in 2020 in his first year in Happy Valley.
- In 2020, The Nittany Lions' passing defense ranked second in the Big Ten and 24th in the country allowing 198.6 yards per game.
- Penn State allowed less than 200 passing yards in six games last season, tied for the fifth-most among FBS teams through its first nine games of 2020.
- Since 2014, the Nittany Lions have allowed less than 200 passing yards in 51 games, tied for the fifth-most among FBS teams.
- Terry M. Smith** enters his eighth season as Penn State's cornerbacks coach. He is also the program's associate head coach and defensive recruiting coordinator.
- Over the last six seasons, Smith has tutored a secondary which has seen six defensive backs taken in the NFL Draft, tied for the ninth-most nationally.
- Smith was a four-year letterwinner (1988-91) and three-year starter at wide receiver at Penn State. He ranks tied for 10th in career receiving touchdowns (15), 13th in career receiving yardage (1,825) and 14th in career receptions (108).
- Co-Defensive coordinator/safeties coach **Anthony Poindexter** is in his first season on the Nittany Lion coaching staff.
- Poindexter has 18 years of collegiate coaching experience, including seven as a defensive or co-defensive coordinator.
- As a player, Poindexter was a two-time consensus All-American at Virginia and was chosen as the 1998 ACC Defensive Player of the Year.
- Poindexter was inducted into the College Football Hall of Fame in 2020.

SPECIAL TEAMS NOTES

- Penn State brings back starters at kicker, punter, long snapper, holder and punt returner in 2021.
- Senior PR **Jahan Dotson** averaged 24.6 yards per punt return in 2020, ranking first all-time at Penn State.
- He was named honorable mention All-Big Ten as a punt returner.
- Since 2000, Dotson is one of two FBS players to total at least 884 receiving yards and average 24.6 yards per punt return (minimum eight returns) in a season.
- Dotson has a 21.3 career punt return average on 11 returns.
- Dotson returned a punt 81 yards for a touchdown against Michigan State in 2020.
- With a 100-yard kick return for a touchdown by Lamont Wade vs. Illinois and the punt return for a score by Dotson vs. MSU, PSU was one of four Power Five schools in 2020 to have a kick and punt return for a TD.
- Senior K **Jake Pinegar** ranks fourth all-time at Penn State with 136 career extra points and sits ninth in career extra point percentage (96.5).
- Pinegar is sixth all-time at Penn State with a 73.5 field goal percentage. He's also tied for 10th in field goal attempts (49) and tied for 11th in field goals made (36).
- The Iowa native is also ninth on the all-time scoring list with 244 career points.
- Pinegar's 36 career field goals ranks third among current FBS kickers.
- Redshirt senior K/P **Jordan Stout** is tied for second all-time at Penn State with three field goals of 50 or more yards.
- Stout led the Big Ten and ranked seventh in the country with an 84.0 touchback percentage. He has a career touchback percentage of 82.3.
- In his first season handling the punting duties, Stout averaged 41.5 yards per punt and landed eight inside the 20.
- Senior SN **Chris Stoll** enters his third season as Penn State's primary long snapper. He's appeared in 22 career games.
- S **Drew Hartlaub** and S **Jonathan Sutherland** return as key contributors on the special teams units. Hartlaub has 11 tackles and two forced fumbles in his career.
- Sutherland will wear No. 0 for the second straight season as the team's special teams leader as part of a new tradition that began in 2020.
- Special teams coordinator **Joe Lorig** enters his third season at Penn State.
- Lorig has 24 years of coaching experience, including eight as a special teams coordinator.
- In 2019, the Penn State special teams unit was ranked first among Power Five schools, and tied for second in the FBS, in special teams efficiency according to ESPN.com.
