INSIDE THE GAME

PENN STATE MEETS VILLANOVA FOR IN-STATE BATTLE

- OPENING KICK:** No. 6/8 Penn State welcomes Villanova on Saturday in Beaver Stadium to complete the non-conference portion of the 2021 season, presented by PSECU. Kickoff is set for Noon ET on Big Ten Network.
- SERIES HISTORY:** The Nittany Lions will meet Villanova for the first time since 1951. Penn State is 5-3-1 all-time against the Wildcats. The series began in 1902 with a Penn State 32-0 win. The Nittany Lions won five of the first six matchups in the series, the other being a tie. However, Villanova owns the last three wins in the series, dating back to 1936.
- PENN STATE VS. PENNSYLVANIA SCHOOLS:** Penn State is 170-96-12 all-time against current FBS and FCS Pennsylvania programs. The Nittany Lions have won four-straight games against Pennsylvania opponents. Penn State has won 18-straight home games against Pennsylvania programs, dating back to a 42-3 win over Temple on September 16, 1989.
- TOUCH IN THE RED ZONE:** The Nittany Lions held Auburn to two-of-three inside the red zone on Saturday. On 11 opponent trips inside the red zone, Penn State has kept teams from scoring on five occasions. Penn State has forced three takeaways, a turnover on downs and blocked a field goal.
- DOTSON EXTENDING STREAKS:** Jahan Dotson caught a 4-yard touchdown against Auburn. The senior has a receiving touchdown in each of his last four games and has found the end zone in five straight games, including an 81-yard punt return against Michigan State in 2020. Dotson hauled in 10 receptions against the Tigers, giving him five straight games with at least five receptions. Dotson's 32-straight games with a reception rank fifth among FBS receivers.
- THE OPPOSITION:** Villanova is 3-0 this season. The Wildcats are ranked 11th in the STATS FCS Poll and seventh in the FCS Coaches Poll. Villanova earned a 34-27 win over No. 21/18 Richmond last Saturday. Daniel Smith connected with Rayjoun Pringle for a go-ahead 47-yard touchdown with 38 seconds remaining. The Wildcats gained 480 total yards, including 350 through the air. Smith also rushed for two touchdowns.

PROGRAM NOTES

RECENT SUCCESS

Since 2016, Penn State holds a .754 winning percentage, with a record of 49-16, the sixth-best winning percentage among Power Five programs. Penn State has won at least nine games in four of the last five seasons, one of eight FBS programs to accomplish the feat.

ACADEMIC EXCELLENCE

A total of 509 of Penn State football student-athletes, including 29 in 2020, have earned Academic All-Big Ten honors since 1993 for owning at least a 3.0 grade point average and being a letterwinner.

ONE OF NATION'S TOUGHEST HOME VENUES

Penn State owns a superlative 301-77 (.796) record inside Beaver Stadium, the nation's second-largest facility, which opened in 1960 and has a capacity of 106,572. The Nittany Lions are 30-5 in Beaver Stadium since 2016, an .857 winning percentage, the sixth-best home record among Power Five teams.

HEAD COACH JAMES FRANKLIN

CAREER AT A GLANCE

- Franklin was named the 16th head football coach in the storied history of the Nittany Lion program on January 11, 2014.
- Franklin is one of six current FBS head coaches to lead his teams to a bowl game in each of his first nine seasons as a head coach.
- Franklin is one of three current Big Ten coaches (Ryan Day, Kirk Ferentz) to have won a Big Ten Championship.
- He owns an 87-43 career record with a winning record in eight of his nine seasons at the helm.
- Franklin has led his teams to three Top 10 finishes (3 at Penn State) and six Top 25 finishes (2 at Vanderbilt; 4 at Penn State).
- In the last five seasons, Penn State is one of six teams to rank in the top 12 of the CFP final rankings at least four times.
- From 2016-19, Franklin led the Nittany Lions to three New Year's Six bowls - 2016 (Rose), 2017 (Fiesta) and 2019 (Cotton), making Penn State one of eight teams to accomplish the feat during the four-year span. Penn State last went to three New Year's Six bowls in four years in 1980-83 (1980 Fiesta, 1982 Fiesta, 1983 Sugar).
- Franklin guided Penn State to back-to-back New Year's Six bowls in 2016 (Rose) and 2017 (Fiesta) for the first time since 1985 (Orange) and 1986 (Fiesta).
- From 2016-19, Franklin led Penn State to 42 wins, the most in program history for the Big Ten era, and 28 league wins, a program record.
- Franklin has 26 years of coaching experience at the collegiate and NFL level.
- In his first 10 years as a head coach, Franklin mentored 82 players who have gone on to the NFL ranks.
- Since 2016, the Nittany Lions have had 29 players selected in the NFL Draft. With six selections in 2021, Penn State is one of five programs to produce at least five draft picks in each of the last four NFL Drafts.
- Franklin has secured top-25 recruiting classes each of his last nine seasons, including a top-5 class at Penn State in 2018.
- Franklin is second all-time in winning percentage by an FBS African American head coach (minimum 80 wins) and is third in total wins.

NITTANY LIONS ON THE FIELD

- In **2020**, with Franklin's emphasis on safety, along with the precautions set by him, the coaching staff, medical staff and support staff, Penn State was one of only two Big Ten teams to play all nine of its scheduled games during a shortened season due to the COVID-19 pandemic. With the emergence of young skill players on offense, true freshmen accounted for 1,486 of Penn State's 3,873 total yards (38 percent), marking a school record for most combined scrimmage yards by true freshmen in a single season.
- Penn State earned its third 11-win season in four years with an 11-2 record in **2019**, including a win over No. 17 Memphis in the Goodyear Cotton Bowl Classic. The Nittany Lions posted their fourth-straight top 12 finish in the final CFP rankings, coming in 10th, and were ranked ninth in the final Associated Press and Amway Coaches polls to earn their 25th AP Top 10 finish. Franklin was a finalist for the Paul "Bear" Bryant National Coach of the Year award for the second time at Penn State (2016) and third time in his head coaching career.
- In **2018**, the Nittany Lions posted their third-straight season with at least nine wins with a 9-4 overall record, earning a berth in the VRBO Citrus Bowl. Penn State finished No. 12 in the final CFP rankings and No. 17 in the Associated Press and Amway Coaches polls.
- Penn State climbed as high as No. 2 in the rankings in **2017** and appeared in a second-straight New Year's Six bowl, earning a 35-28 win over No. 11 Washington in the PlayStation Fiesta Bowl. At 11-2, the Nittany Lions earned back-to-back 11-win seasons for the fifth time in program history and first time since 2008 and 2009. Penn State finished the season No. 8 in the Associated Press and Amway Coaches polls and No. 9 in the final CFP rankings.
- Penn State surged in **2016**, winning nine consecutive games en route to the Big Ten Championship, a Rose Bowl berth and an 11-3 overall record. Penn State finished the season ranked No. 5 in the College Football Playoff rankings and No. 7 in the Associated Press and Amway Coaches polls. It was Penn State's highest finish in the polls since 2005. The Lions claimed their fourth overall Big Ten Championship and first outright title since 1994 with a thrilling, 38-31 comeback win over Wisconsin in the Big Ten Championship Game. Franklin was honored as Sporting News National Coach of the Year and the Woody Hayes National Coach of the Year, as well as the Dave McLain Big Ten Coach of the Year and Associated Press Big Ten Coach of the Year.
- Franklin guided the Nittany Lions to a 7-6 record in **2015** and a berth in the TaxSlayer Bowl.
- Franklin's first season in **2014** was bookended with a pair of thrilling victories for the Nittany Lions. It began with a final-play 26-24 victory over UCF in Dublin, Ireland, in Penn State's first-ever international game and ended with a comeback, a 31-30 overtime win over Boston College in the New Era PinStripe Bowl in Yankee Stadium. Franklin became just the third Penn State coach to lead the team to at least seven wins in his first season, joining Dick Harlow (1915) and Bill O'Brien (2012), and he guided the Nittany Lions to a 4-0 start, joining Harlow as the only first-year Penn State coaches to win their initial four games.

NITTANY LIONS IN THE CLASSROOM

- A program-record nine Nittany Lions were named 2019-20 Big Ten Distinguished Scholars.
- The Nittany Lions posted their first 1,000 single-year APR in program history in 2018-19, topping the previous high of 993 in 2014-15.
- Punter Blake Gillikin took home CoSIDA Academic All-America® first-team honors in 2019 for the second-straight year to become the 12th two-time first-team selection in Penn State history. He graduated with a perfect 4.0 grade-point average in May. Gillikin's two first-team CoSIDA Academic All-America honors increase Penn State football's total to 67 honorees, which ranks second in Division I football history.
- Trace McSorley was selected as a 2018 National Football Foundation (NFF) Scholar-Athlete and a finalist for the Campbell Trophy, known as the "Academic Heisman." He was the 18th Nittany Lion to be selected as an NFF Scholar-Athlete.
- The Nittany Lions had a program-record 35 student-athletes claim Academic All-Big Ten honors in the fall of 2017.
- Tyler Yazujian collected a berth on the CoSIDA Academic All-America® first team in 2016 after an appearance on the second team in 2015.

NITTANY LIONS IN THE COMMUNITY

- The Nittany Lions are active in the community, participating in activities such as Uplifting Athletes, THON, Pennsylvania Special Olympics Summer Games, State College Area Food Bank and Penn State Hershey Children's Hospital visits.
- On June 15, 2020, Franklin was named to the Big Ten Anti-Hate and Anti-Racism Coalition.
- As part of the Cotton Bowl festivities in 2019, Franklin and his family made a \$10,000 financial commitment to the Dallas Children's Hospital.
- In August 2019, Franklin was named a Penn State University Renaissance Fund honoree, which awards outstanding community members for helping students in need.

HEAD COACH MARK FERRANTE

- Mark Ferrante is in his fifth year as head coach at Villanova.
- The Wildcats are 24-18 under Ferrante and made an FCS Playoffs appearance in 2019.
- Ferrante has been on the Villanova staff since 1987, serving as an assistant coach for legendary coach Andy Talley from 1987-2016. Ferrante was the assistant head coach from 1999-2016.
- During his time at Villanova, the Wildcats have made 13 FCS Playoffs appearances, including three appearances in the FCS Semifinals and an FCS National Title in 2009.
- Villanova was 2-2 in an abbreviated Spring 2021 season.

SCOUTING THE WILDCATS

- Villanova is 3-0 this season. The Wildcats are coming off a 34-27 win over No. 21/18 Richmond.
- The Wildcats also own wins over Lehigh (47-3) and Bucknell (55-3).
- Villanova is ranked No. 11 in the Stats Perform FCS Poll and No. 7 in the FCS Coaches Poll.
- Villanova has competed well against FBS teams over the last decade, highlighted by a 19-17 win over Temple in 2018.
- The Wildcats forced FBS teams into one-score finishes in 2010 (Temple, 31-24), 2014 (Syracuse, 27-26, 2 OT), 2015 (UConn, 20-15) and 2017 (Temple, 16-13).
- The Wildcats' offense ranks eighth in the FCS in scoring offense (45.3), 18th in rushing offense (212.7), 19th in total offense (454.7) and fifth in third down conversion percentage (.525).
- Graduate QB Daniel Smith has thrown for 598 yards and sits seventh in the FCS with eight passing touchdowns.
- RB Justin Covington ranks fourth in the FCS with 307 rushing yards, 11th with 102.3 rushing yards per game and ninth with 6.98 yards per carry.
- Villanova's defense holds eighth in the FCS in scoring defense (11.0), second in total defense (184.7), third in rushing defense (29.3), 19th in passing defense (155.3) and paces the FCS with eight interceptions.
- Senior DB Christian Benford has four interceptions this season, ranking second in the FCS. He also has three pass breakups.
- LB Forrest Rhyne leads Villanova with 13 tackles.
- LB Amin Black has posted 12 tackles, including three tackles for loss and a sack.

LAST MEETING PENN STATE FALLS 20-14 AGAINST WILDCATS (OCTOBER 6, 1951)

Penn State fell 20-14 against Villanova at Allentown High School as the Wildcats used a strong rushing attack to earn the victory.

The Nittany Lions trailed by six with four minutes to go, but Villanova stopped the Penn State passing attack to preserve the win.

Villanova scored first in the opening quarter. After recovering a fumble on the Penn State 16, a pass from Bill Brannau to Dick Bedesem got the Wildcats to the 4 yard-line before Bob Haner scored. However, Haner missed the extra point.

Penn State answered by scoring with just 14 seconds left in the first half as Tony Rados hit Ted Shattuck with a 46-yard touchdown pass. An extra point by Bill Leonard gave Penn State the lead going into halftime.

The Wildcats scored twice in the final three minutes of the third quarter. Haner scored again, on a 1-yard run, after Villanova recovered a Penn State fumble.

Haner reached the end zone for the third time, this time on a 2-yard run, to put Villanova ahead, 20-6.

Early in the fourth quarter, two 15-yard penalties moved Penn State to the Villanova 33. Pete Shopa gained 12 yards on a run for a first down. On the next play, Shopa caught a pass from Rados to get down to the 1 yard-line. Shopa scored and Leonard converted the extra point to bring Penn State within six, 20-14.

On the final drive, a long pass from Rados on first down was dropped and the next three passes were batted down by the Villanova defense.

MILLEN ON BTN BROADCAST TEAM

- Former Penn State and NFL standout Matt Millen will be calling Saturday's meeting between the Nittany Lions and Wildcats.
- Millen earned first-team All-America honors as a junior in 1978, helping the unbeaten and No. 1 ranked Nittany Lions earn a berth vs. Alabama in the dramatic 1979 Sugar Bowl for the national title. Millen was a team co-captain in 1979, but missed most of his senior year with an injury. He also helped Penn State earn the first of two consecutive 11-1 records in 1977, capped by a win in the Fiesta Bowl.
- The Oakland Raiders selected Millen the second round of the 1980 NFL Draft to begin a 12-year career that would see him earn four Super Bowl rings. Millen played for the Oakland/Los Angeles Raiders (1980-88), San Francisco 49ers (1989-90) and Washington Redskins (1991). He was a Pro Bowl selection in 1988.
- Millen began his broadcasting career in 1992, working NFL games for CBS and then FOX. The Lehigh Valley native left broadcasting in 2001 and was team president of the Detroit Lions for the next eight years. Millen returned to broadcast booth as a college football and NFL analyst with ESPN and the NFL Network in 2009. He joined FOX Sports and BTN in 2015.

NATIONAL AUDIENCE

- Penn State is annually one of the most watched teams in college football.
- The Nittany Lions' opening week win over Wisconsin, on FOX, drew an audience of 5.409 million viewers.
- The Wisconsin game was the third-highest viewed game on September 4 and it's the fifth-highest viewed game of the 2021 season.

- The 2021 season marks the 21st-straight with at least one regular-season night game on the schedule.
- Penn State is 56-32 at night all-time. The figure breaks down to 17-11 at home, 27-14 on the road and 12-7 in neutral site games. Penn State is 1-1 at regular season neutral sites, 11-6 in bowl games and 1-0 in conference championship games.
- In 2019, Penn State played its most regular season night games in program history with four primetime tilts.

TEAM NOTES

OVERTIME OVER TIME

- College football introduced overtime during the bowl season in 1995 and adopted it for regular season games in 1996. Since then, Penn State has played 14 overtime games, including six over the 2012-14 seasons.
- Nine of the 14 overtime tilts have come at home, three in true road games, one in the 2006 Orange Bowl and one in the 2014 Pinstripe Bowl.
- Penn State is 8-6 all-time in overtime games, with a 5-4 record at Beaver Stadium, 1-2 mark in true road games and 2-0 in contests at a neutral site.
- Penn State's first two overtime contests came vs. Iowa in 2000 and 2002 at home. The Nittany Lions dropped their first three contests that went to the extra period, but won five straight overtime contests before falling to Nebraska on Nov. 23, 2013.

ACADEMIC SUCCESS

- The Nittany Lions had 29 players selected as Academic All-Big Ten in Fall 2020.
- A program-record nine Nittany Lions were named 2019-20 Big Ten Distinguished Scholars.
- Penn State posted its first 1,000 single-year APR in program history in 2018-19, topping the previous high of 993 in 2014-15.
- In 2019, punter Blake Gillikin took home CoSIDA Academic All-America® first-team honors for the second-straight year to become the 12th two-time first-team selection in Penn State history. He graduated with a perfect 4.0 grade-point average in May 2020.
- Gillikin's two first-team CoSIDA Academic All-America honors increase Penn State football's total to 67 honorees, which ranks second in Division I football history (FBS and FCS).
- Trace McSorley was selected as a 2018 National Football Foundation (NFF) Scholar-Athlete and a finalist for the Campbell Trophy, known as the "Academic Heisman." He was the 18th Nittany Lion to be selected as an NFF Scholar-Athlete.

2021 CAPTAINS NAMED

- Penn State football head coach **James Franklin** announced redshirt seniors QB **Sean Clifford**, S **Jonathan Sutherland** and K/P **Jordan Stout**, seniors S **Jaquan Brisker** and DT **PJ Mustipher** and redshirt junior OL **Rasheed Walker** have been named team captains for the 2021 season.
- Clifford and Sutherland are captains for the third-straight season, the only three-time captains in program history.

DEGREES ON THE WALL

- The Nittany Lions have 13 Penn State graduates on the roster: **Ellis Brooks** (psychology), **Tariq Castro-Fields** (sociology), **Max Chizmar** (corporate innovation & entrepreneurship), **Sean Clifford** (advertising/public relations), **Fred Hansard** (journalism), **Drew Harlaub** (Telecommunications), **Des Holmes** (broadcast journalism), **Jesse Luketa** (criminology), **Mike Miranda** (media studies), **Chris Stoll** (kinesiology), **Jordan Stout** (telecommunications), **Cam Sullivan-Brown** (journalism), **Jonathan Sutherland** (labor and employment relations), **Justin Weller** (finance, masters in real estate analysis and development) and **Anthony Whigan** (Recreation, Parks and Tourism Management).
- Brooks and Clifford are working on a second degree in journalism. Hansard and Holmes are working on a second degree in media studies. Luketa is working on a second degree in sociology. Stoll is working on a second degree in health policy and administration. Sullivan-Brown is working on a second degree in telecommunications.
- Sutherland is pursuing a master's degree in international affairs. **Barney Amor**, **Arnold Ebiketie**, **Winston Eubanks** and **Derrick Tangelo** joined the Nittany Lions after graduating from their previous schools.

URSCHEL ON CFP SELECTION COMMITTEE

- John Urschel, a former All-American lineman at Penn State, is in the second year of a three-year term on the CFP Selection Committee.
- Urschel was also a two-time All-Big Ten performer and a 4.0 GPA student at Penn State University. The Baltimore Ravens drafted him in the fifth round of the 2014 NFL draft. He retired after three seasons with the Ravens and enrolled at MIT to pursue a Ph.D. in applied mathematics, which he completed in 2021, which he began work on in January 2016 while he was still playing for the Ravens.
- Urschel earned a bachelor's degree in mathematics in 2012 (in less than three years) and a master's in mathematics a year later (again with a 4.0). During the spring 2013 semester, Urschel taught a section of trigonometry and analytic geometry to Penn State undergraduate students three days a week in addition to his own academic and football responsibilities. He won the Sullivan Award, given to the most outstanding amateur athlete in the country, in 2013. A two-time Academic All-American, he also won the 2013 Campbell Trophy, which recognizes college football's top scholar-athlete.

OFFENSIVE NOTES

- **Mike Yurcich** is in his first season as Penn State's offensive coordinator/quarterbacks coach after spending the 2020 campaign at Texas.
- In addition to Texas, Yurcich has previous stints as the passing game coordinator/quarterbacks coach at Ohio State (2019) and the offensive coordinator and quarterbacks coach at Oklahoma State (2013-18).
- Yurcich (California University (Pa.)) and Head Coach **James Franklin** (East Stroudsburg) both played in the Pennsylvania State Athletic Conference (PSAC).
- In 15 years as an offensive coordinator, Yurcich's offenses have averaged 6.48 yards per play, ranking first among OCs since 2013.
- Yurcich's offenses have averaged 13.95 yards per completion, also first among Power Five OCs since 2013.

2021 HALL OF FAME BALLOT

- Penn State lettermen LaVar Arrington, Paul Posluszny and Steve Wisniewski have been selected as a part of the national ballot for the National Football Foundation's College Hall of Fame's Class of 2022. A total of 78 players and seven coaches from FBS are on the 2022 ballot.
- The trio of standouts have an opportunity to join 19 former Nittany Lion players and five Penn State coaches who have been inducted into the Hall.
- Also on the Hall of Fame ballot is former Nittany Lion student-athlete Glenn Killinger, who is among the candidates for the divisional coach Class of 2022. Killinger was inducted into the Hall of Fame as a player in 1966.
- Arrington, an outside linebacker for the Nittany Lions, was a first-team All-American in 1998 and 1999. In 1999, he was selected winner of the Butkus Award as the nation's top linebacker and Chuck Bednarik Award as the country's top defensive player, while also being a finalist for the Bronko Nagurski Trophy and Rotary Lombardi Award. The 12th Nittany Lion selected a two-time first-team All-American, Arrington finished ninth in balloting for the 1999 Heisman Trophy. Was the first sophomore selected Big Ten Defensive Player of the Year in 1998. In 1999, he made 72 tackles, with 20 TFL, nine sacks, one interception, one forced fumble, two fumble recoveries (one TD) and two blocked kicks. His leaping tackle over the offensive line of an Illinois runner was selected the 1998 Compaq Defensive Play of the Year.
- Posluszny, an outside linebacker for the Nittany Lions, was a first-team All-American in 2005 and 2006. Posluszny became just the second two-time winner of the Chuck Bednarik Award, presented to the nation's top defensive player, in 2006. In 2005, he also won the Butkus Award, presented to the nation's top linebacker and was a finalist for the 2006 honor. The 13th Nittany Lion to be named a two-time first-team All-American, Posluszny also was a two-time finalist for the Rotary Lombardi Award. The Nittany Lions' first two-time team captain since 1968-69, he became Penn State's career tackle leader with 372. A starter in the last 37 games of his career, Posluszny became the first Nittany Lion to lead the team in tackles three times and to post three 100-tackle seasons, recording 116 in 2006. Posluszny also was a two-time first-team ESPN the Magazine Academic All-American and was selected the 2006 Academic All-American of the Year among Division I football players.
- Wisniewski was a three-year starter at guard for the Nittany Lions who would go on to become an All-Pro lineman in the NFL. He was one of two sophomores to start on the 1986 National Championship team and he opened holes for two first-team All-America running backs, Blair Thomas (1987) and D.J. Dozier (1986). One of just four Penn State offensive linemen to earn a pair of first-team All-America honors, he was recognized in 1988 by the American Football Coaches (AFCA) and repeated All-America accolades from Sporting News. A 1988 team captain, Wisniewski is one of just two offensive linemen to earn Penn State's team MVP honor since its creation in 1978.
- From Harrisburg, Killinger was a Walter Camp All-American at quarterback for the Nittany Lions in 1921. He coached at Dickinson (1922), Rensselaer (1927-32), Moravian (1933) and West Chester (1934-41, 45-59). Killinger is the winningest coach in West Chester history and is a member of the Pennsylvania Sports Hall of Fame. He died in 1988.
- The 2021 College Football Hall of Fame Class Presented by ETT will be officially inducted during the 65th NFF Annual Awards Dinner on Dec. 7, 2021, at the ARIA Resort & Casino Las Vegas. They will also be honored at their respective schools with an NFF Hall of Fame On-Campus Salute, presented by Fidelity Investments, during the 2022 season.

- Since 2013, Yurcich's offenses have scored 50 or more points 26 times and 40 or more points 52 times (50 percent of games coached) with both numbers leading FBS Offensive Coordinators.
- In 2020, Yurcich led Texas' offense to rank eighth in the FBS in scoring offense (42.7 ppg), 16th in passing efficiency (156.2) and 19th in total offense (475.4 ypg).
- Since the start of the 2016 season, Penn State's offense is second in the Big Ten in touchdown percentage (33.0; 12th nationally), points per possession (2.24; 14th), scoring percentage (41.6; 17th), yards per pass attempt (8.1; 20th), yards per play (6.2; 26th) and total offense (425.0; 35th). Penn State is third in the Big Ten in scoring offense (34.6; 16th) in that time frame.
- Penn State's offense has been explosive since the 2016 campaign, as it leads the Big Ten in 70-plus yard play percentage (0.42; 9th) and 80-plus (0.2; 4th), ranks second in 20-plus (8.19 percent; 11th), 40-plus (2.12; 15th) and third in 50-plus (1.02; 33rd), 30-plus (3.69; 19th) and 60-plus (0.55; 31st).
- Additionally, the Nittany Lions are second in the Big Ten and 11th nationally in 15-plus yard passing play percentage since 2016 (20.3 percent).
- Penn State has gained 200 or more rushing yards 32 times in the James Franklin era. Penn State is 27-5 in those games.
- PSU has rushed for over 200 yards in at least four games in each of the last five seasons (2016-20).
- Penn State completed 29 passes against Auburn, tied for the sixth-most in a game in the James Franklin era.
- The Nittany Lions scored on a 14-play, 91-yard drive covering 6:49 in the second quarter. It was Penn State's longest drive for plays and yards since a 16-play, 98-yard drive against Maryland in 2020. The 6:49 drive was Penn State's longest since a scoring drive covering 7:01 against Indiana in 2020.
- The Nittany Lions hit the 200-yard rushing plateau against Ball State, finishing with 240 rushing yards on the ground.
- Penn State tallied 32 first downs against the Cardinals, tied for second in the James Franklin era with 32 against Nebraska in 2017.
- PSU finished with 10 players recording a reception against Ball State, the most since 13 Nittany Lions had receptions at Maryland in 2019.
- The Nittany Lions used a 254-yard offensive effort in the second half at No. 12/15 Wisconsin to secure the win.
- Penn State returned nine starters and 19 letterwinners (10 lost) on offense from the 2020 season. Eight of Penn State's nine leading pass catchers and four of its top five rushers from 2020 are back for 2021.
- During the 2020 season, Penn State true freshmen accounted for 1,486 total yards (38%) of Penn State's 3,873 yards on offense, a school record.
- Penn State has scored 40 points 21 times since 2016. By comparison, from 2008 until 2015, the Nittany Lions had 18 40-point outings.

QUARTERBACK NOTES

- Redshirt senior **Sean Clifford** is in his third season as Penn State's starting signal caller, having played in 28 career games, making 23 starts.
- Clifford began the 2021 season on the watch lists for the Johnny Unitas Golden Arm, Manning Award, Reese's Senior Bowl and Wuerffel Trophy.
- He is also a nominee for the NFF's William V. Campbell Trophy, awarded to the nation's top football scholar athlete, and the Allstate Good Works Team.
- The QB, who owns a 3.45 cumulative GPA, graduated with a degree in public relations in December 2020 and is pursuing a second degree in journalism.
- Against Auburn, Clifford completed a career-high 28 passes, on 32 attempts.

- Per ESPN, Clifford's 87.5 completion percentage is the highest by a Penn State quarterback in the last 25 years.
- Clifford was named to the Manning Award Stars of the Week and Davey O'Brien Award Great 8 lists.
- Clifford ranks 17th in the country in completion percentage (71.3) and 23rd in completions per game (22.3), sitting third in the Big Ten in both categories.
- Since 2000, Clifford's 71.3 completion percentage is the highest through three games by a Penn State quarterback since Christian Hackenberg (71.7) in 2013.
- Clifford is just one of seven Penn State players all-time to reach 6,000-plus yards of total offense and one of 10 quarterbacks to reach 5,000 career passing yards.
- Clifford is one of 12 current FBS quarterbacks with over 6,000 total yards and over 5,000 passing yards in his career.
- He currently sits sixth all-time in program history in career total yards (6,318) and fourth in touchdowns responsible for (54).
- The Cincinnati, Ohio native is Penn State's current all-time leader in passing efficiency rating (147.3) and completion percentage (61.5).
- Additionally, the three-time captain ranks third in yards per attempt (8.2), fourth in passing touchdowns (45), sixth in touchdown percentage (6.71), seventh in completions (413), seventh in passing yardage (5,489), ninth in attempts (671) and 18th in yards per completion (13.3).
- Clifford owns 22 career games with multi-TD passes, including eight with three or more TDs and two with four or more.
- The redshirt senior has tossed multiple touchdowns in a half on 12 occasions and eight different times has thrown multiple touchdowns in a quarter.
- He is fifth in school history for 300-yard passing games (3) and sixth for 200-yard games (14).
- Clifford owns five career games with at least 250 passing yards and three passing touchdowns.
- The quarterback has tossed four career touchdowns of 70-plus yards and has completed 70 career passes of 20 or more yards.
- With a 49-yard TD strike to Jahan Dotson in the win at Wisconsin, Clifford brought his career TD pass total of 40-plus yards to 11.
- Among Penn State quarterbacks, he is third all-time in rushing yardage (829) and eighth in rushing touchdowns (9).
- Redshirt sophomore **Ta'Quan Roberson** completed his first pass as a Nittany Lion against Ball State, a 23-yard touchdown strike to TE **Theo Johnson**.
- Offensive coordinator **Mike Yurcich** also heads the Penn State quarterback room.
- Three quarterbacks Yurcich coached in college are currently on NFL rosters (Sam Ehlinger – Texas, Justin Fields – Ohio State, Mason Rudolph – Oklahoma State).
- Under Yurcich's guidance in 2020, Ehlinger tossed a Big 12-leading 25 touchdowns for Texas.
- Yurcich served as the passing game coordinator and quarterbacks coach at Ohio State in 2019, where quarterback Justin Fields was a finalist for the Heisman Trophy, Walter Camp Player of the Year Award and Davey O'Brien Award.

- Penn State is 49-16 over the past six seasons (2016-21), which is the ninth-best record in FBS and the second-best in the Big Ten (Ohio State, 58-8).
- Dating back to 2015, Penn State has won 36 of its last 42 home games.
- Penn State's 134-59 record over the last 16 years (2006-21) ranks 14th in FBS and third in the Big Ten (Ohio State, 170-28; Wisconsin, 145-52).
- Head coach **James Franklin** guided his teams to a winning record each of his first eight seasons (2 at Vanderbilt, 6 at Penn State).
- Since 2016, Franklin's 75.4 percent (49-16) winning percentage ranks fourth among current FBS coaches.

RUNNING BACK NOTES

- Penn State boasts a deep running back corps. The room has combined to play in 87 games, including 33 starts. Four members have started at least one game.
- Junior **Noah Cain** leads the running backs group and returns after missing all but the first drive at Indiana in 2020.
- Cain gained 45 yards and scored on a 3-yard run against Auburn. It was Cain's 11th career rushing touchdown.
- Cain has a rushing touchdown in all three games this season.
- Cain has a rushing touchdown in each of the first three games of a season for the second time in his career (2019, 2021).
- Cain rushed for 69 yards and a 5-yard touchdown against Ball State. He also set a career high with 30 receiving yards on three catches.
- Cain averaged 6.0 yards per carry against Wisconsin. The sophomore had a career-long 34-yard carry in the fourth quarter against the Badgers.
- Cain reached the 500-yard mark for his career with a 48-yard day against Wisconsin.
- As a freshman in 2019, Cain rushed for 443 yards and eight touchdowns, while averaging 5.3 yards per carry. Cain's eight touchdowns set a Penn State freshman record.
- Senior RB **John Lovett** made his Penn State debut against Auburn and had an 18-yard reception.
- The trio of sophomore **Keyvone Lee**, junior **Devyn Ford** and sophomore **Caziah Holmes** combined for 207 carries, 939 yards and nine touchdowns in 2020.
- Lee averaged 8.5 yards per carry against Ball State with eight carries for 68 yards. He added a career-long 24-yard reception.
- Lee had a strong freshman campaign in 2020 with a team-high 438 yards on 89 carries. He averaged 4.9 yards per carry and had four rushing scores.
- Ford started five games in 2020, rushing for 274 yards and three touchdowns, while averaging 4.1 yards per carry.
- Ford has rushed for 601 career yards and six touchdowns.
- Holmes gained 227 yards on the ground in 2020 with 4.4 yards per carry and two touchdowns.
- Run game coordinator/running backs coach **JaJuan Seider** has 13 years of college coaching experience, including 10 at the Power Five level.
- Seider helped a young running backs group to rank fifth in the Big Ten in rushing in 2020.
- In 2019, Seider mentored Journey Brown, who had 11 rushes of 20 or more yards and posted a Cotton Bowl and Penn State bowl-record 202 rushing yards.
- In 2018, Penn State posted its highest rushing average (204.9) since 2008 (205.8), led by second-team All-Big Ten selection Miles Sanders.
- As a player at Florida A&M, he won the Doug Williams Award for National Offensive Player of the Year, Jake Gaither Award (considered the Heisman Trophy of Historically Black Colleges) and earned All-America honors after throwing for 2,622 yards and 27 touchdowns and rushing for 740 yards and 14 touchdowns in 1999.
- Seider, who was the 1999 MEAC Offensive Player of the Year, was selected in the sixth round of the 2000 NFL Draft by the San Diego Chargers.

WIDE RECEIVER NOTES

- Senior **Jahan Dotson** leads a talented wide receiver room.
- Dotson began the 2021 campaign on the Biletnikoff and Maxwell Award watch lists. He's also on the Paul Hornung Award watch list for the most versatile player in the country.
- The senior has a reception in 32-straight games, dating back to October 20, 2018 against Indiana, which ranks fifth among current FBS players.
- Dotson had a career-best 10 receptions against Auburn.
- He became the first Penn State player with double-digit receptions in a game since Saquon Barkley's 12 against Iowa in 2017 and the first receiver with double-digit receptions since DaeSean Hamilton's 14 against Ohio State in 2014.
- Dotson caught a 4-yard touchdown against the Tigers.
- Dotson has a touchdown reception in all three games this season.
- Dotson's three receiving touchdowns lead the Big Ten in 2021.
- Dotson has a touchdown reception in four-straight games dating back to the Illinois game in 2020. He has reached the end zone in five consecutive games, including an 81-yard punt return against Michigan State in 2020.
- Dotson had a five-game touchdown reception streak in 2019-20 (Rutgers, Memphis 2019; Indiana, Ohio State, Maryland 2020).
- Dotson completed a 22-yard pass to redshirt freshman **TE Tyler Warren** in the second quarter. It was Dotson's first career pass attempt and completion.
- Dotson has five or more receptions in five straight games, dating back to the Michigan State game in 2020.
- Since 2000, Dotson and Allen Robinson are the only Nittany Lions to catch at least five passes in five consecutive games. Robinson did so in 2013 (6 straight).
- Dotson sits 14th all-time at Penn State with 1,820 career receiving yards. He's also tied eighth in receiving touchdowns with 16 and 12th in receptions with 112.
- With five receptions for 102 yards against Wisconsin, Dotson earned his seventh 100-yard receiving game.
- Dotson's seven career 100-yard receiving games ties him with O.J. McDuffie (1988-92) for seventh-most at Penn State.
- Against Wisconsin, Dotson recorded his third-straight 100-yard receiving game, dating back to the Michigan State game in 2020 (108 yards). He followed that game with a career-high 189 receiving yards against Illinois.
- Dotson became the first Penn State receiver to record three consecutive 100-yard receiving games since Allen Robinson in 2013 (133 vs. Syracuse; 129 vs. Eastern Michigan; 143 vs. UCF).
- Dotson turned a screen pass into a 25-yard touchdown against Ball State.
- Only three current FBS Power Five receivers have more career 100-yard receiving games than Dotson's seven, Purdue's David Bell (12), Texas Tech's Kaylon Geiger (10) and Ohio State's Chris Olave (8).
- Against Wisconsin, Dotson hauled in a 49-yard touchdown grab, his eighth career touchdown reception of 40 or more yards.
- Dotson has five career receiving touchdowns of 60 or more yards (75 and 70 vs. Illinois 2020; 68 vs. Iowa 2020; 60 at Indiana 2020; 72 vs. Purdue, 2019).

- Dotson's 16.25 yards per reception in his career is third among current Power Five receivers and sixth among FBS receivers with at least 100 catches.
- Fellow sophomore **Parker Washington** has a catch in all 12 games of his career.
- Washington made eight grabs against Auburn.
- Washington sits sixth in the Big Ten averaging six catches per game.
- Sophomore **KeAndre Lambert-Smith** had career highs with five receptions for 71 yards against Wisconsin, including a career-best 54-yard catch.
- Lambert-Smith matched his career best with four catches against Auburn.
- Junior ATH **Marquis Wilson** made his first career reception in the first quarter against Ball State, making him the first Penn State player to earn snaps on both sides of the ball in the same game since Dae'Lun Darien in 2017 against Maryland.
- Offensive recruiting coordinator/wide receivers coach **Taylor Stubblefield** is in his second season on the Penn State staff.
- Stubblefield is in his 14th year as a receivers coach, including five seasons with Power Five programs.
- As a player, Stubblefield caught 325 passes, which was an NCAA record at the completion of his career at Purdue. He still owns the Big Ten record for career receptions and ranks second in conference history with 3,629 yards.
- Stubblefield was a consensus All-American and a finalist for the Biletnikoff Award in 2004.

TIGHT ENDS NOTES

- A young, but talented tight end group, led by redshirt sophomore **Brenton Strange**, looks to continue a strong tight end tradition.
- Since **James Franklin** took over the program in 2014, three PSU tight ends have been taken in the NFL Draft, tied for fifth in the nation during that span (Pat Freiermuth – 2021, 2nd round; Mike Gesicki – 2018, 2nd round; Jesse James – 2015, 5th round).
- Penn State had four tight ends on opening week NFL rosters (Nick Bowers, Freiermuth, Gesicki and James), trailing only Stanford (5) among FBS programs.
- Strange is a member of the Mackey Award Watch List.
- Strange set career highs with four catches for 71 yards against Auburn, including a career-long 40-yard reception.
- Sophomore **Theo Johnson** caught a 23-yard touchdown pass in the fourth quarter against Ball State, his first career touchdown reception.
- Johnson had a career-best 37-yard reception against Auburn.
- Redshirt freshman **Tyler Warren** scored a 2-yard rushing touchdown against Auburn.
- Warren added a career-long 22-yard reception.
- Tight ends coach **Ty Howle** was named to the position on February 5, 2021 after serving as an offensive analyst in 2020, working closely with the offensive line and tight ends.
- Prior to returning to Happy Valley, Howle spent four seasons on the coaching staff at Western Illinois, serving as assistant head coach/co-offensive coordinator/offensive line coach in 2018-19.
- Howle was a four-year letterwinner on the Penn State offensive line from 2009-13. He started at center and left guard and was a four-time Academic All-Big Ten selection. He was a team captain in 2013.



Tyler Warren

- Howle played in 47 career games for the Nittany Lions, making 13 starts. He graduated in 2013 with a bachelor's degree in kinesiology.

OFFENSIVE LINE NOTES

- The returning members of the Penn State offensive line have combined to play in 156 games in Happy Valley, including 61 starts.
- The Nittany Lion offensive line protected **Sean Clifford** as he completed a career-high 28 passes against Auburn.
- Penn State did not allow a sack against Auburn.
- The Penn State offensive line helped the Nittany Lions to rush for 240 yards and two touchdowns against Ball State.
- Redshirt junior **Rasheed Walker**, on the preseason Outland Trophy and Rotary Lombardi Watch Lists, leads the returnees with 25 starts, all at left tackle.
- Redshirt senior **Mike Miranda** has been a valuable member of the line with his versatility. He's appeared in 39 games with 21 starts, including nine at left guard, nine at right guard and three at center.
- Miranda made his first career start at center against Wisconsin.
- Miranda is also on the Outland Trophy and Reese's Senior Bowl watch Lists.
- Redshirt sophomore **Caedan Wallace** has 10 starts at right tackle, including the final six games of 2020, and owns 16 career appearances.
- Senior **Eric Wilson** made his first start as a Nittany Lion against Ball State after making his first appearance against Wisconsin. Wilson brought 20 college starts to Penn State after transferring from Harvard.
- Redshirt senior **Anthony Whigan** and redshirt junior **Juice Scruggs** made their first career starts against the Badgers. Whigan has played in 12 career games and Scruggs has played in 11 with three starts.
- Redshirt senior **Des Holmes** has appeared in 25 games.
- The Penn State offensive line helped the Nittany Lions to rank second in the Big Ten in total offense (430.3) in 2020.
- The Nittany Lion offense led the Big Ten with 223 first downs a year ago.
- Offensive line coach **Phil Trautwein** is in his second season at Penn State.
- He was named to the American Football Coaches Association (AFCA) Class of 2021 "35 Under 35" list, recognizing the top-35 football coaches under the age of 35. He was the only Big Ten coach and the only offensive line coach on the 2021 list.
- In his first season at Penn State, Trautwein helped four Penn State offensive linemen to earn All-Big Ten honors, including Will Fries (second team), Miranda (second team), Michal Menet (third team) and Walker (third team).
- He's coached 13 All-Conference selections over the last three seasons.
- Trautwein was a two-time All-SEC selection and two-time team captain as a left tackle at Florida, earning first-team honors in 2008 and second-team accolades in 2006.
- He was part of the Gators winning the BCS National Championship and SEC titles in the 2006 and 2008 seasons.
- Trautwein played four years in the NFL.

DEFENSIVE NOTES

- Defensive coordinator/linebackers coach **Brent Pry** is in his 30th year of coaching and his 15th at a Power Five program.
- Pry has helped the programs he's coached to Top-25 finishes in total defense in eight of his last 11 seasons, including four at Penn State.
- Over the last seven seasons, PSU sits second nationally in sacks per game (3.10; trailing only Clemson), third in QB hurries (887), fourth in total pressures generated (1311), fourth in fewest passing TDs allowed per game (0.98), sixth in tackles for loss percentage (10.75), 10th in fewest passing yards per attempt (6.30) and 12th in fewest rushing yards per attempt (3.57).
- Penn State's 242 sacks over the last seven years (2015-21) are third only to Clemson (295) and Alabama (260).
- Over the last seven years, Penn State has accumulated a 8.74 percent sack percentage (242 sacks on 3,074 plays), which ranks fourth in the FBS.
- Since 2014, Penn State has held opponents to seven or less points 21 times, tied for fourth-most among FBS teams. Fifteen of those 21 games have been against Big Ten opponents.
- Since 2014, Penn State has kept opponents under 300 total yards 42 times, the seventh-most games among FBS teams.
- The Nittany Lions have limited opponents to under 100 yards rushing 35 times since 2014. Penn State is 29-6 in those games.
- Penn State has registered 10 or more tackles for loss 24 times since 2014.
- Penn State is one of five FBS teams that has not allowed a passing touchdown this season and has faced the most passing attempts (121) among those teams.
- Since 2000, 121 is the most passing attempts Penn State has faced without allowing a passing touchdown to start the season.
- Penn State is allowing opponents only a 54.5 conversion rate in the red zone this season, ranking 10th in the country.
- Through three games, Penn State has four interceptions, already equaling its total for the 2020 season.
- Penn State has forced five takeaways, ranking fifth in the FBS.
- DT **Derrick Tangelo** recovered a fumble against Auburn.
- CB **Daequan Hardy** and DE/LB **Jesse Luketa** recorded interceptions against Ball State. Luketa returned his 16 yards for a touchdown.
- Against Wisconsin, Penn State limited the Badgers to just one-of-four inside the red zone. The Nittany Lions forced two red zone takeaways.
- The Nittany Lions forced three takeaways in the season opener, including a fumble recovery by DE **Nick Tarburton** and interceptions by S **Jaquan Brisker** and S **Ji'Ayir Brown**.
- Penn State returned seven starters and 19 letterwinners (7 lost) on defense. The Nittany Lions returned four of their top five tacklers from a year ago.
- A total of 66.3 percent of Penn State tackling and 57.5 percent of its tackles for loss production returned for the 2021 campaign.

DEFENSIVE LINE NOTES

- The defensive line room has combined to play in 208 career games.
- Senior DT **PJ Mustipher** anchors the Nittany Lion defensive line room, having appeared in 37 career games and making 13 starts.
- A 2021 All-Big Ten honorable mention selection, Mustipher comes from a football family, as his father, Sam, played at West Virginia University and his brother, Sam, played at Notre Dame (2014-18) and is currently an offensive lineman for the Chicago Bears.
- A 2021 Rotary Lombardi Award, Lott IMPACT Trophy and Reese's Senior Bowl watch lister, Mustipher has made 86 career tackles, with two sacks, seven tackles for loss, two forced fumbles and a pass breakup.
- Mustipher was named to the Big Ten Equality Coalition in June 2020.
- Mustipher and redshirt senior DE **Arnold Ebiketie** tied for the defensive line lead with seven tackles against Wisconsin.
- Ebiketie joined the Nittany Lions after a four-year stint at Temple (2017-20) where he posted 59 career tackles, six sacks and three forced fumbles.
- Ebiketie had an impressive Penn State debut with seven solo tackles, two tackles for loss and a sack, while also adding a blocked field goal.
- Ebiketie's sack came at a crucial moment of the game, with the Badgers facing 2nd-and-10 at the PSU 25. Ebiketie recorded a 7-yard sack and forced an intentional grounding penalty.
- Ebiketie paced the defensive line with four tackles and a tackle for loss against Ball State.
- Senior **Jesse Luketa** has split time between defensive end and linebacker. He recorded eight tackles and a tackle for loss against Auburn.
- Redshirt junior DE **Nick Tarburton** had a career-high two tackles and recovered a fumble, the first of his career, in the second quarter against Wisconsin.
- Penn State added two experienced veterans to its defensive line during the offseason in Ebiketie and senior DT **Derrick Tangelo**.
- Tangelo recovered a fumble against Auburn.
- Tangelo, who has started all three games this season, came to Penn State from Duke, where he played in 45 career games (27 starts).
- He posted 114 career tackles, 12.0 tackles for loss, 4.5 sacks, five forced fumbles, two fumble recoveries, two QB pressures and a pass breakup.
- During the 2020 season with the Blue Devils, Tangelo recorded a team-best three forced fumbles to go along with 40 tackles, four tackles for loss and two sacks.
- **John Scott Jr.** is in his second season heading the Nittany Lion defensive line corps.
- Scott brings 17 years of collegiate coaching experience to the Penn State defensive line room with two additional years of coaching experience in the NFL.

LINEBACKERS NOTES

- In addition to leading the Nittany Lion defense, **Brent Pry** is in his eighth season coaching linebackers at Penn State.
- In his previous seven seasons, Pry has coached seven Penn State linebackers that have moved on to the NFL.
- Linebacker Micah Parsons was selected 12th overall by the Dallas Cowboys in the 2021 NFL Draft.
- Parsons was the highest drafted Penn State defensive player since Aaron Maybin went 11th overall to the Buffalo Bills in 2009.
- He was the first Nittany Lion defensive player drafted in the first round since Jared Odrick (2010; 28th overall to the Miami Dolphins) and the first PSU linebacker selected in the first round since LaVar Arrington (2000; second overall to the Washington Redskins).
- Parsons became the fifth Penn State linebacker to be selected in the first round, joining Arrington, Shane Conlan (1987; eighth overall to the Buffalo Bills), Ed O'Neil (1974; eighth overall to the Detroit Lions) and Dave Robinson (1963; 14th overall to the Green Bay Packers).
- Penn State has 69 linebackers drafted all-time, the most for any school.
- Senior **Jesse Luketa** and junior **Brandon Smith** each earned a spot on the 2021 Butkus Award Watch List.
- Smith was named Big Ten Defensive Player of the Week after a career-high 10 tackles, a tackle for loss and a pass breakup against Auburn.
- Luketa was named the Pro Football Focus National Defensive Player of the Week following her performance vs. Ball State.
- Luketa recorded his first career interception against Ball State, returning it 16 yards for a touchdown.
- Sophomore **Curtis Jacobs**, making his first career start, notched a career-best five tackles in the season opener.
- Jacobs posted his first career sack against Ball State.
- Redshirt senior **Ellis Brooks** is the veteran of a linebacker group that has combined for 147 career games.
- Brooks paced the Nittany Lions with 11 tackles, eight solo, against Wisconsin. Brooks added a solo sack in the first quarter.
- Brooks tied his career high for tackles and earned his second career double-digit tackle performance.
- Redshirt junior **Charlie Katshir** had a career high-tying three spots against Ball State.

DEFENSIVE BACKS NOTES

- The Nittany Lion defense includes a deep and talented secondary. The group has combined to play in 279 games and start 66 contests at the Power Five level.
- Against Wisconsin, two Lackawanna College alums played a big role. Senior S **Jaquan Brisker** and senior S **Ji'Ayir Brown** each recorded interceptions in the closing minutes to seal the victory.
- Brisker's interception stopped a Wisconsin drive inside the Penn State 10. He returned the interception 41 yards. Brisker added a tackle for loss and a pass breakup on the day.
- Brown made his first start and tallied his first interception, as time expired, as a Nittany Lion.
- Brisker is on preseason watch lists for the Bednarik Award, Bronko Nagurski Trophy, Jim Thorpe Award and Reese's Senior Bowl. He additionally was named a second-team Preseason All-American by the Associated Press.
- An All-Big Ten selection in 2019 and 2020, senior CB **Tariq Castro-Fields** returns to lead the cornerbacks. He has 106 tackles, three interceptions and 19 pass breakups in his Penn State career.
- Redshirt sophomore CB **Joey Porter Jr.** started eight games in 2020, earning All-Big Ten third team honors after posting 33 tackles and four pass breakups.
- Porter matched a career high with six tackles against Wisconsin and made a key pass breakup on third down before Brisker's interception.
- Redshirt senior S **Jonathan Sutherland** led the PSU secondary with seven tackles, six solo, against the Badgers.
- Redshirt sophomore CB **Daquan Hardy** recorded his first career interception against Ball State.
- Freshman CB **Kalen King** posted three tackles and his first career forced fumble against Ball State.
- S **Tyler Rudolph** made a career-high five tackles against the Cardinals.
- Since 2014, the Nittany Lions have allowed less than 200 passing yards in 53 games, tied for the sixth-most among FBS teams.
- **Terry M. Smith** is in his eighth season as Penn State's cornerbacks coach. He is also the program's associate head coach and defensive recruiting coordinator.
- Over the last six seasons, Smith has tutored a secondary which has seen six defensive backs taken in the NFL Draft, tied for the ninth-most nationally.
- Smith was a four-year letterwinner (1988-91) and three-year starter at wide receiver at Penn State. He ranks tied for 10th in career receiving touchdowns (15), 13th in career receiving yardage (1,825) and 14th in career receptions (108).
- Co-Defensive coordinator/safeties coach **Anthony Poindexter** is in his first season on the Nittany Lion coaching staff.
- Poindexter has 18 years of collegiate coaching experience, including seven as a defensive or co-defensive coordinator.
- As a player, Poindexter was a two-time consensus All-American at Virginia and was chosen as the 1998 ACC Defensive Player of the Year.
- Poindexter was inducted into the College Football Hall of Fame in 2020.

COACHING STAFF NOTES

LETTERMEN MAKING THEIR RETURN

- Several members of the Penn State coaching and support staffs played at Penn State.
- Cornerbacks Coach **Terry M. Smith** was a three-year starter at wide receiver from 1989-91. He ranks tied for 10th in career receiving touchdowns (15), 13th in career receiving yardage (1,825) and 14th in career receptions (108).
- Tight Ends Coach **Ty Howle** was a four-year letterwinner on the Penn State offensive line from 2009-13. He played in 47 career games, making 13 starts. The 2013 team captain made starts at center and left guard and was a four-time Academic All-Big Ten selection.
- Defensive Graduate Assistant **Deion Barnes** made 31 starts as a Nittany Lion from 2012-14. In 2014, Barnes tallied 12.5 tackles for loss and six sacks. He led PSU with 10 tackles for loss and six sacks in 2012 to earn consensus freshman All-American honors.
- Offensive Graduate Assistant **Wendy Laurent** played in 34 games and made eight starts as a Nittany Lion from 2013-16. Laurent was a key member of the line that helped Penn State to a Big Ten Championship in 2016.
- Assistant Recruiting Coordinator **Alan Zemaitis** was a four-year letterman and three-time All-Big Ten selection for the blue and white from 2002-05. Zemaitis sits tied fifth all-time at Penn State with 12 career interceptions. He also holds fifth all-time at Penn State with 46 passes defended. Zemaitis helped the Nittany Lions to a Big Ten Championship in 2005.
- Director of Football Academic Services **Todd Kulka** lettered as a linebacker and graduated in 1995. He helped Penn State to a 9-3 record and an Outback Bowl victory in 1995.
- Director of the Football Letterman's Club **Wally Richardson** was a four-year letterman as a quarterback in 1992 and 1994-96. Richardson ranks 12th all-time at Penn State with 4,419 career passing yards. He also sits eighth all-time with 378 completions and 12th all-time with 27 touchdown passes.

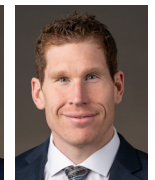

SPECIAL TEAMS

- Penn State brought back starters at kicker, punter, long snapper, holder and punt returner in 2021.
- Redshirt senior **Jordan Stout** has served as Penn State's kicker, for both field goals and extra points, punter and kickoff specialist in all three games this season.
- On kickoffs, Stout has hit 23 straight touchbacks.
- Led by Stout, Penn State ranks third in the country in net punting (46.5).
- Stout is second in the country, and leads the Big Ten, with a 52.2 punt average.
- Stout has averaged at least 50.0 yards per punt in all three games this season.
- Against Auburn, Stout averaged 50.0 yards per punt with two over 50 yards and one downed inside the 20.
- Stout earned Big Ten Special Teams Player of the Week honors for the first time in his career after averaging 53.9 yards on seven punt attempts against Wisconsin.
- His 53.9 punt average ranks second-best in a game at Penn State behind only Ralph Giacomarro (54.75; 1981 at Syracuse).
- Stout hit five punts of 50-plus yards, including a 76-yarder.
- The 76-yard punt is the longest of Stout's career and tied for third-longest in program history.
- Stout has 12 career punts of 50+ yards.
- Stout hit three field goals against the Cardinals, including a 45-yarder.
- Five of Stout's eight career field goals are longer than 40 yards.
- Senior PR **Jahan Dotson** averaged 24.6 yards per punt return in 2020, ranking first all-time at Penn State. He was named honorable mention All-Big Ten as a punt returner.
- Dotson's 17.8 career punt return average ranks first all-time at Penn State.
- Dotson's 17.8 career punt return average (15 returns) is the second-best among current FBS players with more than 15 returns trailing only Kansas State's Phillip Brooks (18.0).
- Dotson returned a punt 81 yards for a touchdown against Michigan State in 2020.
- With a 100-yard kick return for a touchdown by Lamont Wade vs. Illinois and the punt return for a score by Dotson vs. MSU, PSU was one of four Power Five schools in 2020 to have a kick and punt return for a TD.
- Senior DE **Arnold Ebiketie** blocked a Wisconsin 25-yard field goal attempt in the second quarter. It was PSU's first blocked field goal since Shaka Toney against Michigan State in 2019.
- Senior SN **Chris Stoll** is in his third season as Penn State's primary long snapper. He's appeared in 24 career games.
- S **Jonathan Sutherland** will wear No. 0 for the second straight season as the team's special teams leader as part of a new tradition that began in 2020.
- Special teams coordinator **Joe Lorig** is in his third season at Penn State.
- Lorig has 24 years of coaching experience, including eight as a special teams coordinator.
- In 2019, the Penn State special teams unit was ranked first among Power Five schools, and tied for second in the FBS, in special teams efficiency according to ESPN.com.

GAME RECAP

MADISON, Wis. - The No. 19/20 Penn State football team opened its 2021 campaign with a 16-10 road victory against Big Ten foe No. 12 Wisconsin.

The Nittany Lion defense shined in the game, tallying three takeaways in the contest including two in the game's final minutes. Linebacker Ellis Brooks led all players with a career-high 11 tackles. He also recorded a sack. Arnold Ebiketie was strong off the edge, adding a sack, two tackles for a loss and a blocked field goal. Penn State sealed the victory with key interceptions by Jaquan Brisker and Ji'Ayir Brown.

Penn State (1-0, 1-0 Big Ten) gained 297 total yards, with 247 yards coming from its passing attack. Quarterback Sean Clifford completed 18-33 passes for 247 yards and a touchdown. Senior Jahan Dotson had a big day on the outside, highlighted by a 49-yard touchdown reception in the third quarter and a 42-yard grab in the fourth that led to Penn State's second touchdown of the game. Noah Cain capped off that drive with a two-yard TD run in his first game since Penn State's season opener in 2020.

Wisconsin (0-1, 0-1 Big Ten) found success on the ground on Saturday, led by a 31-carry 121-yard day from junior Chez Mellusi. Penn State held Wisconsin quarterback Graham Mertz to 185 yards passing and forced two interceptions.

The win is Penn State's first season-opening victory against a ranked opponent since 1999 when the Nittany Lions defeated No. 4 Arizona, 41-7. The Nittany Lions have now won their last five contests against Wisconsin.

HOW IT HAPPENED

Both defenses were on display in a scoreless opening quarter. Wisconsin threatened on its first drive of the second, getting inside Penn State's five-yard line. The Nittany Lions would stand strong, holding the Badgers to a field goal attempt that was blocked by Arnold Ebiketie to keep Wisconsin off the board.

The Badgers would once again reach the red zone on their next drive, when their 12-play drive ended on the game's first turnover. Nick Tarburton jumped on a fumbled exchange between Wisconsin's Graham Mertz and Chez Mellusi to give the Nittany Lions their first takeaway of the 2021 season.

The game would remain scoreless at the half, marking the first time since 2011 that Penn State and an opponent were tied 0-0 at halftime.

The Nittany Lions struck first on their opening drive of the second half when Sean Clifford found Jahan Dotson deep down field for a 49-yard touchdown. Penn State went 86 yards on just four plays for its first score of the year.

Wisconsin would even the score on the ensuing drive, capping off a 10-play, 75-yard drive with a 3-yard touchdown run by Mellusi.

The Badgers took their first lead of the game early in the fourth on a 43-yard field goal by Collin Larsh to make it 10-7.

Penn State followed with a field goal of their own, when Jordan Stout knocked a 24-yarder through the uprights. The drive was highlighted by a 34-yard carry by Noah Cain.

The Nittany Lions jumped back in front, 16-10, with 9:17 remaining in the fourth on a two-yard touchdown rush by Cain. Clifford and Dotson once again connected on a big play on the drive, this time on a 42-yarder to get Dotson over the 100-yard receiving mark.

The Penn State defense continued to make big plays to close out the victory. With Wisconsin threatening inside the 5-yard line, the Nittany Lion defense stood strong with three consecutive stops, capped off by an interception by Jaquan Brisker on fourth down.

The Badgers would get the ball back with 1:10 remaining and quickly got into the red zone again. The Nittany Lions closed out the game with two big defensive plays, first a sack by Ebiketie, followed by a game-sealing interception by Ji'Ayir Brown to clinch the 16-10 victory.

Notes

- Penn State is now 11-9 all-time against Wisconsin. The Nittany Lions have won their last five contests over the Badgers.
- The Nittany Lions snapped Wisconsin's 25-game win streak in home openers.
- Penn State is now 3-1 all-time when opening the season against a Big Ten opponent.
- The Nittany Lions are now 8-5 all-time when opening against a ranked opponent.
- The Nittany Lions earned a road win over a ranked Big Ten opponent for first time since October 12, 2019 against Iowa (17-12).
- Both teams were scoreless at halftime. It marked the first time a Penn State game has been scoreless since October 29, 2011 against Illinois.
- WR Jahan Dotson earned his seventh career 100-yard receiving game (102 yards). It was his third-straight 100-yard receiving game dating back to the Michigan State game in 2020.
- Dotson hauled in a 49-yard touchdown grab in the third quarter. It was Dotson's 14th career touchdown catch, moving him into sole possession of 13th all-time at Penn State.
- Dotson now has eight career touchdown receptions of 40 or more yards.
- With 1,677 career receiving yards, Dotson sits 16th all-time at Penn State, passing KJ Hamler (1,658).
- QB Sean Clifford now has 4,979 career passing yards, moving into sole possession of 10th all-time at Penn State, passing Todd Blackledge (4,812; 1980-82).
- The redshirt senior now has 42 career passing touchdowns, breaking a tie for fifth all-time at Penn State.
- S Jaquan Brisker recorded an interception in the fourth quarter, his fourth career interception.
- S Ji'Ayir Brown intercepted a pass to seal the victory in the fourth quarter. It was his first career interception.
- LB Ellis Brooks tallied 11 tackles to match a career best. Brooks also had 11 tackles against Ohio State in 2020.
- DE Nick Tarburton recovered a fumble in the second quarter. It was his first career fumble recovery.
- K/P Jordan Stout averaged 53.9 yards per punt, on seven punts, ranking second-best in a game at Penn State.
- Stout hit five punts of 50+ yards, including a 76-yard punt, in the third quarter, which is the longest of Stout's career. It's tied for the third-longest punt in program history with Chris Clauss (vs. Rutgers, 1987).
- DE Arnold Ebiketie blocked a Wisconsin 25-yard field goal attempt in the second quarter. It was Penn State's first blocked field goal since Shaka Toney against Michigan State on October 26, 2019.

GAME RECAP

UNIVERSITY PARK, Pa. - For the first time in 22 months, fans filled the seats of Beaver Stadium as the Penn State football team opened its home schedule with a 44-13 victory over Ball State on Saturday. It was Penn State's 300th win in Beaver Stadium.

The crowd of 105,323 saw a strong offensive performance from the No. 11/13 Nittany Lions, as Penn State compiled 493 yards of total offense on the day.

Quarterback Sean Clifford completed 21 of 29 passes for 230 yards and a touchdown. He also added 66 yards and a touchdown on the ground. The passing score came on a 25-yard connection with Jahan Dotson in the second quarter. Dotson has now reached the end zone in four consecutive games dating back to last season.

Penn State was also strong on the ground, as the Nittany Lion rushing attack compiled 240 yards with three different players tallying 60-plus yards. Noah Cain was the team's leading rusher with 69 yards and his second touchdown of the season.

After a three-takeaway day in the team's season-opener against Wisconsin, the ball-hawking Penn State defense added two more interceptions on the day, highlighted by a 16-yard interception return for a touchdown by linebacker Jesse Luketa.

The Nittany Lions now turn their attention to No. 25/RV Auburn as the two teams are set to meet next Saturday night at Beaver Stadium for the annual Penn State White Out game.

HOW IT HAPPENED

The Nittany Lions methodically marched down the field on their opening possession, driving 13 plays on 78 yards resulting in a Noah Cain 5-yard touchdown run.

Penn State would double its lead on its ensuing drive, highlighted by 20-plus yard completions by Clifford to Parker Washington and Keyvone Lee to set the Nittany Lions up inside the five-yard line. Clifford completed the drive with a 1-yard touchdown run to give Penn State a 14-0 lead.

Ball State would get on the board in the opening minute of the second quarter on a Jake Chanove 24-yard field goal.

Big Ten Special Teams Player of the Week Jordan Stout would follow with a field goal of his own, connecting from 45-yards to extend the Penn State lead to 17-3.

The Nittany Lions would score once more in the first half, when Sean Clifford found Jahan Dotson for a 25-yard catch and run to make it 24-3. Ball State would end the half with a 23-yard field goal by Chanove as time expired.

The Penn State defense got the scoring started in the second half with 5:56 remaining in the third quarter when Jesse Luketa intercepted a Drew Plitt pass and returned it 16 yards for a touchdown. It was Penn State's first pick-six since John Reid intercepted a pass for a touchdown in 2019 against Buffalo.

Stout would add three more to the scoreboard in the closing minutes of the third on a 26-yard field goal to give Penn State a 34-6 lead.

The Nittany Lions got another takeaway on Ball State's next drive on Daequan Hardy's first-career interception.

Penn State would add another field goal with 9:59 to go in the fourth when Stout connected on a 22-yarder.

Ball State scored its first points of the second half on a 6-yard touchdown run by Carson Steele with 6:58 to go.

Penn State would add one final score with 2:10 remaining in the game when Ta'Quan Roberson tossed his first career touchdown pass, a 23-yarder to Theo Johnson to cap off the 44-13 victory.

GAME RECAP

UNIVERSITY PARK, Pa. - The No. 10/12 Penn State football team celebrated the annual Penn State White Out game with a 28-20 win over No. 22/20 Auburn on Saturday night.

The Nittany Lions have defeated two ranked opponents in their first three games of the season for the first time in program history. The win is Penn State's first regular-season victory over an SEC opponent since the Nittany Lions defeated Alabama, 9-0, in 1990.

Penn State's high-powered offense was on display in this prime time contest, compiling 391 total yards.

Quarterback Sean Clifford continued his fast start to the 2021 campaign, completing 28-of-32 passes for 280 yards and two touchdowns.

Wide receiver Jahan Dotson hauled in a career-high 10 catches for 78 yards and a touchdown in the contest. He has now reached the end zone in five consecutive games dating back to last season. Tight End Brenton Strange also put together a career-best performance, setting a new high mark with 71 yards on four catches and a touchdown.

The Penn State defense would seal the victory in the closing minutes, forcing Auburn to turn the ball over on downs at the Penn State 2 yard-line with 3:08 remaining in the game. Brandon Smith paced the Nittany Lion defense with a career-high 10 tackles.

The crowd of 109,958 was the ninth largest in Beaver Stadium history.

HOW IT HAPPENED

After Penn State turned the ball over on downs on its opening drive, Auburn got on the board first with a 45-yard field goal by Anders Carlson.

The Nittany Lions got the offense going on their third possession. Sean Clifford delivered two long passes to his tight ends on back-to-back plays, first a 23-yarder to Brenton Strange and then a 37-yarder to Theo Johnson to set Penn State up inside the five. Penn State would score on the next play when Clifford hit Jahan Dotson in the back of the end zone for a 4-yard touchdown to give Penn State a 7-3 lead.

Auburn would reclaim the lead on its ensuing drive on a 4-yard touchdown run by Tank Bigsby.

In the closing minutes of the second quarter, Penn State would go on a 14-play, 91-yard drive to jump back in front. The long scoring drive was capped off by a 4-yard TD pass from Clifford to Strange to put the Nittany Lions ahead 14-10 at the half.

On the first play of the second half, a botched trick play by Auburn resulted in Derrick Tangelo falling on a loose ball to set Penn State up at the Auburn 20 yard-line. The Nittany Lions would extend the lead on Tyler Warren's first career rushing touchdown to give Penn State a 21-10 advantage.

Bigsby would reach the end zone for the second time in the game with 5:52 remaining in the third, when his 6-yard TD run cut the Penn State lead to 21-17. The Tigers would add three more on the first play of the fourth quarter when Carlson converted on a 43-yard field goal attempt.

Penn State would fire back on the following drive, highlighted by a 40-yard connection between Clifford and Strange that put the Nittany Lions inside the five. Noah Cain would find the end zone for the third time this season with a 5-yard TD run to give Penn State a 28-20 lead.

The Nittany Lion defense would put the finishing touches on the victory, forcing Auburn to turn the ball over on downs at the Penn State 2 yard-line with 3:08 remaining in the game.

- With wins over No. 12/15 Wisconsin and No. 22/20 Auburn, Penn State has two wins over ranked teams within the first three games of the season for the first time in program history.
