PENN STATE WRAPS UP HOMESTAND WITH VILLANOVA TUESDAY

The Penn State men's soccer team, under fourth-year head coach Jeff Cook, wraps up a three-game homestand and takes a break from conference play this week with two nonconference match-ups, first welcoming the Villanova Wildcats to Jeffrey Field on Tuesday, Sept. 21. Kickoff is set for 7 p.m. and will stream live on Big Ten Network+.

LAST TIME OUT - BUTTS' BRACE LEADS NITTANY LIONS PAST WILDCATS IN BIG TEN OPENER

- » Behind a brace from junior forward **Liam Butts**, Penn State came back from a goal down to beat Northwestern, 2-1, Friday evening in the Big Ten opener at Jeffrey Field.
- » The visitors got on the board first in the 12th minute and would carry that advantage into the halftime break despite the Nittany Lions outshooting the Wildcats, 12-4.
- » The offensive pressure continued for Penn State into the second half, so quickly that Butts found the equalizer just 19 seconds in on a great strike from the top of the box on the pass from classmate **Andrew Privett**.
- » About five minutes later, senior **Danny Bloyou** was able to fend off a Northwestern defender and crossed the ball to Butts in the six who finished the ball with his right foot to the near post for the go-ahead goal.
- » Penn State continued to press once ahead, looking for the insurance goal to put a stamp on the conference opener. In the 75th minute, junior **Alex Stevenson** had a shot that deflected off a Wildcat defender and trickled into the back of the net, but an unfortunate offside call overturned the goal.
- » Northwestern had a few chances in the closing minutes to find its equalizer, but goalkeeper **Kris Shakes** and the defense maintained their attempts to give the Nittany Lions the win.

OFFENSIVE WEAPONS

- » Penn State's offense has weapons at every position on the pitch, making it difficult for opposing defenses to keep the ball out of the back of the net.
- » Eight different players have already recorded points this season with juniors **Liam Butts** and **Andrew Privett** pacing the Nittany Lions with eight points each. Butts has a team-high four goals while Privett adds three goals and two assists.
- » Captain of the midfield, **Seth Kuhn**, paces the team with four assists.
- » Penn State averages 14.00 shots per game and 6.00 shots on goal per game, both second in the conference and nearly top-50 nationally.

PENN STATE IN THE BIG TEN

- » Penn State is now 4-0-0 in Big Ten openers in the Jeff Cook era (2018-pres.) after defeating Northwestern at Jeffrey Field in the 2021 opener (9/17/21).
- » The Nittany Lions have finished runner-up in the league the last two seasons with a 6-1-1 Big Ten record and were picked to finish second again this season

NO IFS, ANDS OR BUTTS ABOUT IT

- » Junior striker **Liam Butts** is back doing what he does best and that is score goals.
- » The Lawrenceville, Ga., native currently paces the team with four total goals, including two game-winners.
- » He recorded a multi-goal game against Northwestern in the Big Ten opener (9/17) his first of the season and third time in his career.
- » His total goals are tied for first in the Big Ten and 25th in the nation while the two game-winning goals are tied for first in the conference and 13th nationally along with teammate Peter Mangione.

PRIVETT IN FORM

- » Junior midfielder **Andrew Privett** is really playing well to start the 2021 season, currently tied for the team lead in points with eight on three goals and two assists.
- » The Fallston, Md., native is fast on the wing in run of play and can also be dangerous in the box to find the back of the net.
- » His three goals is a career high as is his eight total points, surpassing his previous best of two goals and seven points as a freshman in 2019.

STEVO'S SUCCESS

- » Junior defender/midfielder **Alex Stevenson** has been a versatile player for the Nittany Lions now in his third season, playing primarily on the wings of the backline and midfield.
- » The Bel Air, Md., native has already set a career high with three assists, surpassing his previous best of two he's recorded the last two seasons.
- » His three total assists rank fourth in the Big Ten and 43rd nationally while his 0.43 assists-per-game average is also fourth in the league.

KUHN IN THE MIDDLE

- » Senior vice captain **Seth Kuhn** has proven to be an integral piece in Penn State's play, especially on the offensive end creating scoring chances as a central midfielder.
- » Kuhn paces the team with four assists to average 0.57 assists per game, a mark that is second in the league and top-50 in the nation (43rd). The four total assists also is second in the Big Ten and 18th nationally.
- » The Wyomissing, Pa., native has already matched his assist total from a season ago and is one shy of matching his career high (5, 2019).
- » He recorded multi-assist games against Syracuse (8/29) and American (9/6) for two on the year.
- » Kuhn's 15 career assists is 30th on the NCAA active career leaders list.

GAME-WINNERS ONLY FROM MANGIONE

- » Forward/midfielder **Peter Mangione** is clutch when needed most.
- » The Hunt Valley, Md., native has two goals so far this season, both eventual game-winners.
- » His two game-winning goals paces the Big Ten and is 13th nationally, tied with teammate Liam Butts.
- » Mangione has eight career goals, six of which are game-winners.

FIRSTS FOR FEMI

- » Sophomore defender **Femi Awodesu** has had an outstanding start to year two in Happy Valley, recording his first career goal at West Virginia (9/3) and his first career assist against American (9/6).
- » The Philadelphia, Pa., native is also defending well on the backline, making crucial tackles and causing turnovers to help out goalkeeper Kris Shakes and get the Nittany Lions back on offense.

SHAKE YOUR GROOVE THING

- » Junior goalkeeper **Kris Shakes** posted a shutout against Syracuse (8/29) with six saves in his first game of the season in between the pipes.
- » Shakes has averaged 3.67 saves per game and has 22 total saves to stand second and first in the conference, respectfully.
- » The Parkland, Fla., native has eight career shutouts and 21-4-2 career record.
- » His career save percentage of 0.802 is sixth in the NCAA active career leaders list while his 0.945 career goals-against average is 21st.

NATIONAL RECOGNITION

- » After a couple of tough results against current top-5 teams, Penn State dropped out of the United Soccer Coaches rankings, but has received votes for two-straight weeks.
- » The Nittany Lions are still in the top 25 in two other polls, sitting at No. 23 for both Top Drawer Soccer and College Soccer News.
- » Penn State currently has five opponents ranked in the top 25: West Virginia (No. 4; L, 9/3), Pittsburgh (No. 5; L, 9/13), Akron (No. 7; 10/13), Maryland (No. 8; 10/26), Indiana (No. 11; 10/17).

NATIONAL TV DEBUT

- » Penn State made its debut on national television when it hosted No. 15 Pitt live on FS1 (9/13)
- » The Nittany Lions also have four conference games on the Big Ten Network in the month of October, including three crucial games at Jeffrey Field.

MAC HERMANN TROPHY WATCH LIST

- » **Danny Bloyou** and **Pierre Reedy** were both named to the MAC Hermann Trophy preseason watch list on August 26.
- » Both are first-time members to the list after standout seasons in 2020-21 as United Soccer Coaches Third Team All-Americans and first team All-Big Ten members.

PRESEASON HONORS

- » Senior forward **Danny Bloyou** is considered a second team preseason All-American by College Soccer News.
- » Bloyou was also named a Big Ten Player to Watch along with sophomore forward **Peter Mangione** and redshirt senior midfielder **Pierre Reedy**.
- » Bloyou and redshirt senior defender **Brandon Hackenberg** have also been ranked as No. 34 and No. 39, respectively, by Top Drawer Soccer in the preseason top-100 individual player rankings.





NOTES AND HEADLINES

KEEP IT 100

- » Penn State returned 100 percent of its scoring offense in 2021, including top point scorers in **Danny Bloyou**, **Peter Mangione** and **Pierre Reedy**.
- » The Nittany Lions averaged 2.15 goals per game in 2020-21 to pace the league and rank 13th nationally.
- » They also had three games with four goals for the most four-goal games in a season since 2010.

FAMILIAR NAMES, FAMILIAR FACES

- » Penn State returns 21 players from the 2020-21 roster, including Big Ten Preseason Players to Watch **Danny Bloyou**, **Peter Mangione** and **Pierre Reedy**.
- » Redshirt senior **Brandon Hackenberg** also returns for extra season of eligibility granted by the NCAA due to the COVID-19 pandemic.
- » Junior goalkeeper **Kris Shakes** returns in between the pipes for the Nittany Lions after another solid season where he held a 1.05 goals-against average and 0.782 save percentage in 11 starts.

NEW KIDS ON THE BLOCK

- » Penn State added four newcomers to the 2021 roster in four freshmen and one graduate transfer.
- » The freshmen include midfielders **Sean Bettenhausen** (Media, Pa.), **Van Danielson** (Columbia, Md.), and **Ben Liscum** (Lewisburg, Pa.).
- » Goalkeeper **Christopher Palacios** (Washington, D.C.) joins the Nittany Lions as a graduate transfer from Dartmouth.

OH CAPTAIN, OUR CAPTAINS

- » Redshirt seniors **Brandon Hackenberg** and **Pierre Reedy** will lead the Nittany Lions for the second-straight season as team co-captains.
- » Senior **Seth Kuhn** and sophomore **Peter Mangione** have been added as vice captains for a broader leadership group.

NEXT TIME OUT

Penn State starts a three-game road trip over the weekend, traveling to Princeton, New Jersey to take on Princeton on Saturday, Sept. 25. Kickoff from Sherrerd Field at Class of 1952 Stadium is set for 4 p.m. and will stream live on ESPN+.
