## PENN STATE RETURNS TO BIG TEN PLAY AT MICHIGAN STATE

The Penn State men's soccer team, under fourth-year head coach Jeff Cook, returns to Big Ten Conference play with a road match at Michigan State in East Lansing, Mich. on Friday, Oct. 1. Kickoff is set for 7 p.m. from Demartin Stadium and will stream live on B1G+.

### LAST TIME OUT - PENN STATE TOPPED BY PRINCETON

- Penn State was topped by Princeton, 1-0, Saturday afternoon at Sherrerd
- Penn State controlled a lot of the game through the first 20 minutes with some good chances in the box, but the Princeton defense stood solid to clear the ball and keep the Nittany Lions out of the back of the net.
- On the opposite end, the Penn State defense stayed composed on the Princeton counterattacks as the Tigers threatened, especially on corner kicks.
- In the 44th minute, the Tigers had an initial shot blocked and then a cross sent in on the rebound was finished at the far post to give the home team a 1-0 lead into the break.
- The Nittany Lions got their first shot on goal in the 57th minute by redshirt senior Brandon Hackenberg but it went right at the Tigers' keeper.
- Penn State had its chances to find the equalizer, but Princeton would hold on for the 1-0 victory.

### **OFFENSIVE WEAPONS**

- Penn State's offense has weapons at every position on the pitch, making it difficult for opposing defenses to keep the ball out of the back of the net.
- Eight different players have already recorded points this season with sophomore Peter Mangione and junior Andrew Privett pacing the Nittany Lions with 11 points each. Mangione has a team-high five goals and one assist while Privett adds four goals and three assists.
- Captain of the midfield, Seth Kuhn, paces the team with four assists.
- Penn State is averaging 1.78 goals per game to pace the conference. The Nittany Lions also have the most total goals (16), assists (17) and points (49) in the Big Ten, all marks that also stand top-45 in the nation.

### MANGIONE MAGIC HAT TRICK -> BIG TEN CO-OFFENSIVE PLAYER OF THE WEEK

- Forward/midfielder Peter Mangione had three goals against Villanova (9/21) for a single-game career-high six points.
- It marked the program's first hat trick since Corey Hertzog did so against Old Dominion in the NCAA Tournament in 2010 (11/21/10).
- The hat trick earned Mangione a Big Ten Co-Offensive Player of the Week nod along with Michigan's Kevin Buca who also had a hat trick. It's Mangione's second career weekly award from the conference.
- Mangione now has a team-high five goals this season, one shy of tying his career best of six last season as a freshman. His goal total leads the Big Ten

### **SENIOR CLASS AWARD CANDIDATES**

- Redshirt seniors Brandon Hackenberg and Pierre Reedy and senior **Danny Bloyou** were all announced as top-30 candidates for the 2021 Senior CLASS Award on Thursday (9/30).
- To be eligible for the award, a student-athlete must be classified as an NCAA Division I senior or graduate student and have noteable achievements in four areas of excellence: community, classroom, character and competition.
- An acronym for Celebrating Loyalty and Achievement for Staving in School, the Senior CLASS Award focuses on the total student-athlete and encourages students to use their platform in athletics to make a positive impact as leaders in their communities.
- Hackenberg is a two-time candidate, also a top-30 candidate in 2020, while Reedy and Bloyou are first-time candidates.
- Penn State is one of four schools with multiple candidates. while its three candidates are the most of any school.

### **PRIVETT IN FORM**

- Junior midfielder **Andrew Privett** is really playing well to start the 2021 season, currently tied for the team lead in points with 11 on four goals and three assists.
- The Fallston, Md., native is fast on the wing in run of play and can also be dangerous in the box to find the back of the net.
- Privett recorded a single-game career-high three points on a goal and an assist against Villanova (9/21).
- His four goals is a career high as is his 11 total points, surpassing his previous best of two goals and seven points as a freshman in 2019.
- His three assists ties a career best from 2019.

### **CLASS FROM THE CAPTAIN**

- Redshirt senior and three-time team captain Pierre Reedy continues to set the program standard and philosophy of team over self.
- The Kutztown, Pa., native drew a penalty kick against Villanova (9/21) and instead of taking it himself let teammate Peter Mangione step up to the spot to earn a hat trick.
- Mangione recounted to the media postgame the situation: "Reedy, the exceptional guy he is, he gave it (the PK) to me and said 'I have all the faith in you, go get your hat trick."

# NO IFS, ANDS OR BUTTS ABOUT IT

- Junior striker Liam Butts is back doing what he does best and that is score goals.
- The Lawrenceville, Ga., native has four goals so far this season, including two game-winners.
- He recorded a multi-goal game against Northwestern in the Big Ten opener (9/17) his first of the season and third time in his career.
- His two game-winners are second in the conference and 31st in the nation.

### PENN STATE IN THE BIG TEN

- Penn State is now 4-0-0 in Big Ten openers in the Jeff Cook era (2018-pres.) after defeating Northwestern at Jeffrey Field in the 2021 opener (9/17/21).
- The Nittany Lions have finished runner-up in the league the last two seasons with a 6-1-1 Big Ten record and were picked to finish second again this season behind Indiana in the coaches' preseason poll.

### STEVO'S SUCCESS

- Junior defender/midfielder Alex Stevenson has been a versatile player for the Nittany Lions now in his third season, playing primarily on the wings of the backline and midfield.
- The Bel Air, Md., native has already set a career high with three assists, surpassing his previous best of two he's recorded the last two seasons.

### **KUHN IN THE MIDDLE**

- Senior vice captain **Seth Kuhn** has proven to be an integral piece in Penn State's play, especially on the offensive end creating scoring chances as a central midfielder.
- Kuhn paces the team with four assists to average 0.44 assists per game, a mark that is second in the league and 70th in the nation. The four total assists also is second in the Big Ten and 40th nationally.
- The Wyomissing, Pa., native has already matched his assist total from a season ago and is one shy of matching his career high (5, 2019).
- He recorded multi-assist games against Syracuse (8/29) and American (9/6) for two on the year.
- Kuhn's 15 career assists is 36th on the NCAA active career leaders list.

### **GAME-WINNERS ONLY FROM MANGIONE**

- Forward/midfielder **Peter Mangione** is clutch when needed most.
- The Hunt Valley, Md., native has five goals so far this season, with three the eventual game-winners.
- His three game-winning goals paces the Big Ten and is fifth nationally.
- Mangione has 11 career goals, seven of which are gamewinners.

### FIRSTS FOR FEMI

- Sophomore defender Femi Awodesu has had an outstanding start to year two in Happy Valley, recording his first career goal at West Virginia (9/3) and his first career assist against American (9/6).
- The Philadelphia, Pa., native is also defending well on the backline, making crucial tackles and causing turnovers to help out goalkeeper Kris Shakes and get the Nittany Lions back on offense.

## SHAKE YOUR GROOVE THING

- Junior goalkeeper Kris Shakes posted a shutout against Syracuse (8/29) with six saves in his first game of the season in between the pipes.
- Shakes has averaged 3.67 saves per game and has 22 total saves.
- The Parkland, Fla., native has eight career shutouts and 21-4-2 career record.
- His career save percentage of 0.802 is fifth in the NCAA active career leaders list.











# **NOTES AND HEADLINES**

### **HOME SWEET HOME**

- The Nittany Lions host nine home games within the friendly confines of Jeffrey Field during the 2021 regular
- Penn State Athletics is happy to welcome fans back to its venues in 2021-22 after having empty stands during the 2020-21 year due to the COVID-19 pandemic.
- The Penn State soccer student section, Park Avenue Army, and the State College community have come out in full force to support the program, as Penn State men's soccer ranks top-20 in average attendance (No. 19) with 1,399 fans.

### NATIONAL RECOGNITION

- After a couple of tough results against current ranked teams, Penn State dropped out of the United Soccer Coaches rankings, but has received votes for four-straight weeks.
- The Nittany Lions are also receiving votes in the College Soccer News poll.
- Penn State currently has four opponents ranked in the top 25 and an additional two receiving votes: West Virginia (No. 3; L, 9/3), Maryland (No. 8; 10/26), Pittsburgh (No. 16; L, 9/13), Rutgers (No. 24; 10/5), Akron (RV; 10/13), Indiana (RV; 10/17).

## **NATIONAL TV APPEARANCES**

- Penn State made its debut on national television when it hosted No. 15 Pitt live on FS1 (9/13)
- The Nittany Lions also have four conference games on the Big Ten Network in the month of October, including three crucial games at Jeffrey Field.

### MAC HERMANN TROPHY WATCH LIST

- Danny Bloyou and Pierre Reedy were both named to the MAC Hermann Trophy preseason watch list on August 26.
- Both are first-time members to the list after standout seasons in 2020-21 as United Soccer Coaches Third Team All-Americans and first team All-Big Ten members.

## **PRESEASON HONORS**

- Senior forward Danny Bloyou is considered a second team preseason All-American by College Soccer News.
- Bloyou was also named a Big Ten Player to Watch along with sophomore forward Peter Mangione and redshirt senior midfielder Pierre Reedy.
- Bloyou and redshirt senior defender Brandon Hackenberg have also been ranked as No. 34 and No. 39, respectively, by Top Drawer Soccer in the preseason top-100 individual player rankings.

## **KEEP IT 100**

- Penn State returned 100 percent of its scoring offense in 2021, including top point scorers in Danny Bloyou, Peter Mangione and Pierre Reedy.
- The Nittany Lions averaged 2.15 goals per game in 2020-21 to pace the league and rank 13th nationally.
- They also had three games with four goals for the most four-goal games in a season since 2010.

### **FAMILIAR NAMES, FAMILIAR FACES**

- Penn State returns 21 players from the 2020-21 roster, including Big Ten Preseason Players to Watch Danny Bloyou, Peter Mangione and Pierre Reedy.
- Redshirt senior Brandon Hackenberg also returns for extra season of eligibility granted by the NCAA due to the COVID-19 pandemic.
- Junior goalkeeper Kris Shakes returns in between the pipes for the Nittany Lions after another solid season where he held a 1.05 goals-against average and 0.782 save percentage in 11 starts.

### **NEW KIDS ON THE BLOCK**

- Penn State added four newcomers to the 2021 roster in four freshmen and one graduate transfer.

## **SCOUTING MICHIGAN STATE**

- Michigan State is led by 13th-year head coach Damon Rensing and is 4-4-1 overall and 0-1-1 in Big Ten play. The Spartans are coming off a narrow 1-0 home loss to Indiana in their Big Ten home opener on Sunday.
- Senior Farai Mutatu paces the Spartans with 11 total points on a team-high five goals and one assist. Mutatu is tied with Nittany Lions Peter Mangione and Andrew Privett for most points in the league while he and Mangione also pace the Big Ten in total goals.
- Senior Jack Beck leads Michigan State with six assists and has one goal for eight total points. Seven other players have recorded at least one point this season.
- In net, the Spartans have seen a total of four different keepers, but redshirt senior Hunter Morse has played the most minutes at 540:00. Morse holds a 1.33 goals-against average and a 0.636 save percentage with 14 saves. He had a clean sheet against Duquesne in the Spartans' last nonconference game (9/21).

# PENN STATE AGAINST MICHIGAN STATE

- Penn State holds a 23-17-2 all-time series advantage over Michigan State.
- However, the Spartans have had a 4-1-0 edge in the last five matchups over the Nittany Lions, including a 1-0 win last season in Holuba Hall with a goal in the final three minutes of the game.
- The last time Penn State was in East Lansing, the Nittany Lions won 3-0 including a brace by then-freshman Liam Butts (10/1/19).
