PENN STATE WHITE OUT WELCOMES MINNESOTA

- OPENING KICK: No. 16/16 Penn State hosts RV/- Minnesota for the Penn State White Out game on Saturday. Kickoff is set for 7:30 p.m. in Beaver Stadium with a broadcast on ABC. The 2022 Penn State football season is presented by PSECU.
- SERIES HISTORY: Penn State meets Minnesota for the 16th time in program history. The Nittany Lions lead 9-6 in the all-time series. The last two matchups have been decided by one possession. Penn State won 29-26 in overtime in 2016, on a touchdown by Saquon Barkley on PSU's first offensive snap of overtime. In 2019, Penn State fell 31-26 in TCF Bank Stadium. Journey Brown rushed for 124 yards and two touchdowns, while Sean Clifford threw for 340 yards and a score.
- PENN STATE WHITEOUT: The Nittany Lions are set to hold their 14th full-stadium Penn State White Out on Saturday. The tradition stretches back to a student section White Out in 2004. Penn State's first fullstadium White Out was against Notre Dame in 2007.
- MORE TAKEAWAYS: The Nittany Lions have forced 13 takeaways, including seven fumbles and six interceptions this season. Penn State added another takeaway to its total on Saturday at Michigan after a pass deflected by Chop Robinson was picked off by Curtis Jacobs and returned 47 yards for a touchdown. Penn State's 13 takeaways are good for 13th in the FBS.
- NO FLY ZONE: Penn State ranks fourth in the nation allowing a 51.6 opponent completion percentage. The Nittany Lions have held two opponents under a 50 completion percentage and four opponents under a 55 completion percentage. According to Coaches By The Numbers, cornerbacks Johnny Dixon (21 percent), Kalen King (37) and Joey Porter Jr. (38) are allowing under a 40.0 completion percentage when targeted.
- THE OPPOSITION: Minnesota is 4-2 this season, including 1-2 in Big Ten play, after falling 26-14 at No. 24 Illinois. Mohamed Ibrahim rushed for 127 yards and a touchdown on 15 carries. Tanner Morgan rushed for a 9-yard score. Tyler Nubin led Minnesota with 13 tackles, including two for loss. Jordan Howden and Braelen Oliver each had 10 stops.

HEAD COACH JAMES FRANKLIN

CAREER AT A GLANCE

- Franklin was named the 16th head football coach in the storied history of the Nittany Lion program on January 11, 2014.
- Franklin is one of six current FBS head coaches to lead his teams to a bowl game in each of his first nine seasons as a head coach and one of
 nine to do so in 10 of their first 11 seasons.
- Franklin is one of four current Big Ten coaches (Ryan Day, Kirk Ferentz, Jim Harbaugh) to have won a Big Ten Championship and became the first African American head coach to win a Big Ten title after Penn State's 2016 victory.
- He owns a 96-50 career record with a winning record in nine of 11 seasons at the helm.
- Franklin has led his teams to three Top 10 finishes (3 at Penn State) and six Top 25 finishes (2 at Vanderbilt; 4 at Penn State).
- In the last six seasons under Franklin, Penn State is one of six teams to rank in the top 12 of the CFP final rankings at least four times, joining Ohio State, Alabama, Georgia, Clemson and Oklahoma.
- From 2016-19, Franklin led the Nittany Lions to three New Year's Six bowls 2016 (Rose), 2017 (Fiesta) and 2019 (Cotton), making Penn State one of eight teams to accomplish the feat during the four-year span. Penn State last went to three New Year's Six bowls in four years in 1980-83 (1980 Fiesta, 1982 Fiesta, 1983 Sugar).
- Franklin guided Penn State to back-to-back New Year's Six bowls in 2016 (Rose) and 2017 (Fiesta) for the first time since 1985 (Orange) and 1986 (Fiesta).
- From 2016-19, Franklin led Penn State to 42 wins, the most in program history for the Big Ten era, and 28 league wins, a program record.
- Franklin has 27 years of coaching experience at the collegiate and NFL level.
- In his first 11 years as a head coach, Franklin mentored 90 players who have gone on to the NFL ranks.
- Franklin is second all-time in winning percentage by an FBS African American head coach (minimum 80 wins) and is third in total wins.

NITTANY LIONS ON THE FIELD

- The Nittany Lions earned a New Year's Day bowl berth against Arkansas in the Outback Bowl in 2021. With wins over No. 12/15 Wisconsin
 and No. 22/20 Auburn, Penn State tallied two wins over ranked teams within the first three games of the season for the first time in program
 history. The Nittany Lion defense allowed just 17.3 points per game in 2021, good for sixth in the country.
- In 2020, with the emergence of young skill players on offense, true freshmen accounted for 1,486 of Penn State's 3,873 total yards (38 percent), marking a school record for most combined scrimmage yards by true freshmen in a single season.
- Penn State earned its third 11-win season in four years with an 11-2 record in 2019, including a win over No. 17 Memphis in the Goodyear Cotton Bowl Classic. The Nittany Lions posted their fourth-straight top 12 finish in the final CFP rankings, coming in 10th, and were ranked ninth in the final Associated Press and Amway Coaches polls to earn their 25th AP Top 10 finish. Franklin was a finalist for the Paul "Bear" Bryant National Coach of the Year award for the second time at Penn State (2016) and third time in his head coaching career.
- In 2018, the Nittany Lions posted their third-straight season with at least nine wins with a 9-4 overall record, earning a berth in the VRBO Citrus Bowl. Penn State finished No. 12 in the final CFP rankings and No. 17 in the Associated Press and Amway Coaches polls.
- Penn State climbed as high as No. 2 in the rankings in 2017 and appeared in a second-straight New Year's Six bowl, earning a 35-28 win
 over No. 11 Washington in the PlayStation Fiesta Bowl. At 11-2, the Nittany Lions earned back-to-back 11-win seasons for the fifth time in
 program history and first time since 2008 and 2009. Penn State finished the season No. 8 in the Associated Press and Amway Coaches polls
 and No. 9 in the final CFP rankings.
- Penn State surged in 2016, winning nine consecutive games en route to the Big Ten Championship, a Rose Bowl berth and an 11-3 overall record. Penn State finished the season ranked No. 5 in the College Football Playoff rankings and No. 7 in the Associated Press and Amway Coaches polls. It was Penn State's highest finish in the polls since 2005. The Lions claimed their fourth overall Big Ten Championship and first outright title since 1994 with a thrilling, 38-31 comeback win over Wisconsin in the Big Ten Championship Game. Franklin was honored as Sporting News National Coach of the Year and the Woody Hayes National Coach of the Year, as well as the Dave McLain Big Ten Coach of the Year.
- Franklin guided the Nittany Lions to a 7-6 record in 2015 and a berth in the TaxSlayer Bowl.
- Franklin's first season in 2014 was bookended with a pair of thrilling victories for the Nittany Lions. It began with a final-play 26-24 victory
 over UCF in Dublin, Ireland, in Penn State's first-ever international game and ended with a comeback, a 31-30 overtime win over Boston
 College in the New Era Pinstripe Bowl in Yankee Stadium. Franklin became just the third Penn State coach to lead the team to at least seven
 wins in his first season, joining Dick Harlow (1915) and Bill O'Brien (2012), and he guided the Nittany Lions to a 4-0 start, joining Harlow as
 the only first-year Penn State coaches to win their initial four games.

NITTANY LIONS IN THE CLASSROOM

- The Nittany Lions posted their first 1,000 single-year APR in program history in 2018-19, topping the previous high of 993 in 2014-15.
- Sean Clifford (2021) and Trace McSorley (2018) were selected as a National Football Foundation (NFF) Scholar-Athletes and finalists for the Campbell Trophy, known as the "Academic Heisman." They are the 18th and 19th Nittany Lions to be selected as an NFF Scholar-Athlete.
- In 2019, punter Blake Gillikin took home CoSIDA Academic All-America® first-team honors for the second-straight year to become the 12th two-time first-team selection in Penn State history. He graduated with a perfect 4.0 grade-point average in May.
- Gillikin's two first-team CoSIDA Academic All-America honors increase Penn State football's total to 67 honorees, which ranks second in Division I football history (FBS and FCS).
- Tyler Yazujian collected a berth on the CoSIDA Academic All-America® first team in 2016 after an appearance on the second team in 2015.
- A program-record 10 Nittany Lions were named 2020-21 Big Ten Distinguished Scholars, besting the previous mark of nine set a year earlier.

NITTANY LIONS IN THE COMMUNITY

- The Nittany Lions are active in the community, participating in activities such as Uplifting Athletes, THON, Pennsylvania Special Olympics Summer Games, State College Area Food Bank and Penn State Hershey Children's Hospital visits.
 - On June 15, 2020, Franklin was named to the Big Ten Anti-Hate and Anti-Racism Coalition.
- As part of the Cotton Bowl festivities in 2019, Franklin and his family made a \$10,000 financial commitment to the Dallas Children's Hospital.
- In August 2019, Franklin was named a Penn State University Renaissance Fund honoree, which awards outstanding community members for helping students in need.

SERIES NOTES

HEAD COACH P.J. FLECK

- P.J. Fleck is in his sixth season as head coach at Minnesota, boasting a 39-24 record with the Golden Gophers.
- He has led Minnesota to three bowl games: 2018 Quick Lane Bowl, 2020 Outback Bowl and 2022 Guaranteed Rate Bowl.
- Fleck was previously the head coach at Western Michigan for four seasons. The Broncos were 1-11 in his first year in 2013, but ended the 2016 season with a No. 12 ranking, a 13-1 record, a conference championship and a berth in the Cotton Bowl.
- Fleck played receiver at Northern Illinois from 1999-2003 before going on to the NFL, playing for the San Francisco 49ers. He and Michigan's Jim Harbaugh are the only Power Five conference coaches who both played and coached in the NFL.

SCOUTING THE GOLDEN GOPHERS

- The Gophers are 4-2 this season, including a 1-2 mark in Big Ten play. Minnesota is receiving votes in the AP Poll.
- On offense, the Gophers lead the country in third down conversion percentage (66.2), while sitting 16th in rushing offense (227.3 ypg), 25th in yards per completion (13.86) and fifth in time of possession (34:58).
- RB Mohamed Ibrahim ranks fourth in the nation in rushing yards per game (138.8), 14th in total rushing yards (694), ninth in rushing touchdowns (9) and 11th in yards per carry (6.7).
- QB Tanner Morgan has thrown for 1,164 yards and seven touchdowns. He's second in the Big Ten averaging 14.02 yards per completion.
- On defense, the Gophers sit fourth in the country in scoring defense (11.7), sixth in total defense (263.7), fifth in pass defense (159.2) and 20th in rushing defense (104.5). Minnesota also leads the country in third down conversion percentage on defense (21.9).
- LB Mariano Sori-Marin leads the Gophers with 39 tackles, including three for loss, while DL Danny Striggow paces Minnesota with four tackles for loss and three sacks.
- K Matthew Trickett paces the Big Ten with an 85.7 field goal percentage and KR Quentin Redding leads the league with a 27.6 return average.

LAST MEETING NO. 17 MINNESOTA HANGS ON TO DEFEAT NO. 4 PENN STATE

No. 4 Penn State threatened to score the go-ahead touchdown in the final minutes, but No. 17 Minnesota was able to get a fourth-down stop to seal a 31-26 victory in TCF Bank Stadium.

Minnesota was led on offense by quarterback Tanner Morgan, who completed 18-of-20 passes for 339 yards and three touchdowns and receivers Rashod Bateman (7 catches, 203 yds, 1 TD) and Tyler Johnson (7 catches, 104 yds, 1 TD), and on defense by cornerback Antonie Winfield Jr., who had 11 tackles and two interceptions.

For Penn State, running back Journey Brown rushed for 124 yards and a pair of touchdowns, tight end Pat Freiermuth had a career-high 101 receiving yards on seven receptions, while wide receiver KJ Hamler had 119 yards on seven catches. Quarterback Sean Clifford had his second career 300-yard game, totaling 340 yards and a touchdown on 23-of-43 passing.

The Nittany Lions trailed by 12 early in the fourth quarter, but cut the deficit to five on a touchdown by Brown with 3:49 to go and got the ball back after a threeand-out. A 49-yard completion to Jahan Dotson gave Penn State first-and-10 at the Minnesota 11 with 1:56 to go, but on second-and-9, an offensive pass interference penalty moved the Lions back to the 25, and an incompletion and an interception in the end zone by Jordan Howden sealed the game for the Gophers.

The Gophers started strong, as Winfield Jr. intercepted a deep ball at the Minnesota 5 on the game's first drive, and then covered 95 yards on just five plays as Bateman was left open down the right sideline for a 66-yard touchdown.

Penn State answered with a 45-yard touchdown run by Brown, but the Gophers went back ahead with an 87-yard drive capped by a 21-yard touchdown reception by Chris Autman-Bell. Penn State cut the deficit to four with 2:12 remaining on a 33-yard field goal by Jake Pinegar.

In the second quarter, another Winfield Jr. interception setup a 38-yard touchdown reception by Johnson for a 21-10 lead. Both teams added field goals before the break, and Minnesota led 24-13 heading into the locker room.

Penn State pulled within five in the third quarter. Nick Bowers scored on a 10yard touchdown reception, but their two-point conversion attempt failed.

On the second play of the fourth quarter, Minnesota running back Seth Green punched the ball in from 1-yard out for a 31-19 lead.

The Nittany Lions pulled back within five points, 31-26, on a 6-yard touchdown by Journey Brown with 3:49 remaining.

GENERATIONS OF GREATNESS

- Penn State is turning back the clock for its "Generations of Greatness" game, as the Nittany Lions will don uniforms with design elements from uniforms past.
- Penn State is wearing its "Generations of Greatness" uniforms for the fifth time in the last six seasons. The threads debuted in 2017 against Indiana (W, 45-14) and Penn State donned them again against Purdue in 2019 (W, 35-7), Iowa in 2020 (L, 21-42) and Illinois in 2021 (L, 18-20, 90T)

Uniform Elements

- Numbers on Helmets The Nittany Lions had the number on the side of their helmet from 1959-61 and then again from 1967-74. A No. 42 also appeared on the side of every Penn State helmet in the season finale against Wisconsin in 2012 to honor injured senior Michael Mauti.
- Block Uniform Numbers The block uniform numbers are similar to those uniform numbers that donned the Blue & White from mid-1950s-66.
- White Stripe on Sleeve Penn State's uniform had a white stripe on the sleeve several times, including 1957-66, 1982-89 and 1992-2011.
- Stripe on the Pants The Nittany Lions had a blue stripe on their pants from 1952-68.
- Gray Facemask The gray facemask was donned by the Nittany Lions from 1959-86.
- White Cleats The white cleats were worn by the Nittany Lions in the 1979 Sugar Bowl.
- Gloves The gloves will feature the Lion Shrine on the palm of the hands.
- Lion Shrine The image of Lion Shrine appears on the "home plate" of the front of the jersey. It is an original element of the "Generations of Greatness" uniform to pay homage to the Lion Shrine that was a gift from the Class of 1940.
- Back Inside Collar The back inside collar of the jersey reads "Penn State 1959" in recognition of the first Liberty Bowl game, played in Philadelphia. Penn State defeated Alabama, 7-0.

SUCCESS ON HOMECOMING

- The Nittany Lions own a 72-24-5 record in 101 games in front of the alumni crowd since their 14-7 victory over Dartmouth in the first Homecoming game on Oct. 9, 1920.
- In 2021, Penn State fell 20-18 in nine overtimes against Illinois.

- Penn State has won seven out of its last 10 Homecoming tilts, defeating Purdue (2019), Rutgers (2017), Maryland (2016), Indiana (2015), Michigan (2013), Northwestern (2012) and Purdue (2011).
- The Nittany Lions have claimed 13 of their last 16 contests in front of the alumni crowd.

2012 TEAM RECOGNITION

- Penn State's 2012 football team will be recognized between the first and second quarters on Saturday.
- The 2012 team overcame a lot of adversity and banded together through unprecedented circumstances.
- The Nittany Lions won eight of the final 10 games of the season, including a 24-21 overtime win over Wisconsin to conclude the campaign.

RING THE BELL

- The Governor's Victory Bell is awarded to the victor of the Penn State-Minnesota contest.
- Instituted in 1993 by Governor Robert Casey of Pennsylvania and Governor Arne Carlson of Minnesota when the Nittany Lions began Big Ten play, the Bell is joined by the Land Grant Trophy (Michigan State) as Penn State's two trophy contests.
- Minnesota provided the opposition for Penn State's first Big Ten game on Sept. 4, 1993.
- Then-acting Governor Mark Singel of Pennsylvania and Carlson presented an artist's conception of the Governor's Victory Bell on that day prior to kickoff.

MINNESOTA CONNECTIONS

- Penn State redshirt freshman OL Landon Tengwall and Minnesota sixth-year RB Mohamed Ibrahim both played at Our Lady of Good Counsel High School in Maryland.
- Penn State offensive coordinator/quarterbacks coach Mike Yurcich was a graduate assistant at Indiana in 2003-04, when Minnesota assistant head coach/running backs coach Kenni Burns was a running back at Indiana.
- Minnesota offensive coordinator/quarterbacks coach Kirk Ciarrocca held the same position at Penn State in 2020.

MICHIGAN NOTES

- Penn State is 13-18 all-time in regular season games between Top-10 teams.
- QB Sean Clifford went over the 10,000-career total yard mark. He now has 10,027 career total yards (8,989 passing, 1,038 rushing)
- On a career-long 62-yard run, Clifford surpassed the 1,000-career rushing yard mark.
- LB Curtis Jacobs recorded a 47-yard pick-six in the second quarter.
- With DT **Coziah Izzard**'s sack in the fourth quarter, 11 different Penn State players have recorded at least one sack this season.

NORTHWESTERN NOTES

- The Nittany Lions have won eight of the last 10 matchups against the Wildcats.
- Penn State had 37:28 of possession, the most for the Nittany Lions since having 40:22 in the 2020 season opener at Indiana.

- With RB Kaytron Allen's 111-yard rushing performance, Penn State has had two true freshmen running backs post 100-yard games in a single season for the first time since 2019, when Devyn Ford (once) and Noah Cain (twice) each eclipsed the 100yard plateau.
- Penn State forced four opponent turnovers for the second consecutive game, the first time that the Nittany Lions have forced at least four turnovers in two straight games since forcing four by both Virginia and Navy early in the 2012 season.
- The Nittany Lions recorded two interceptions, including one each by S Zakee Wheatley and CB Johnny Dixon and two fumble recoveries, by LB Curtis Jacobs and CB Kalen King, marking the second-straight game where Penn State has forced four turnovers.
- Penn State registered 9 pass breakups in the first half and 13 in the game.
- The Nittany Lions recorded double-digit pass breakups in a game for the second time this season. Penn State had 16 pass breakups at Purdue.
- P Barney Amor landed three punts inside the 10.

AUBURN NOTES

- The Nittany Lions are 25-24 all-time against current members of the SEC. Penn State is 12-16 in regular season matchups against SEC opponents.
- Penn State became the first Big Ten school to sweep a homeand-home series against an SEC opponent since 2012, when Northwestern swept Vanderbilt in 2010 and 2012.
- The Nittany Lions' 29-point win is the Big Ten's second-largest margin of victory in a road game against an SEC opponent.
- The 29-point win marks the sixth time (third time in regular season) a Big Ten team has beaten an SEC team by 29 or more points and just the second time in a road game.
- Penn State owns two of those six wins, and both wins were against Auburn, the other coming in the 1996 Outback Bowl, a 43-14 win.
- Auburn's 29-point loss was its first home loss by 29-plus points since 2012 (38-0 loss to Georgia).
- It marked Auburn's largest margin of defeat in a non-conference home game since 1982 (41-7 loss to Nebraska).
- The 41 points allowed by Auburn are its most to a nonconference opponent at home since 2001 (41 vs. Louisiana Tech in a 48-41 overtime win).
- The Nittany Lions scored on five rushing touchdowns, the first time with five rushing touchdowns since the 2019 Cotton Bowl vs. Memphis.
- Prior to the Penn State game, Auburn had allowed just one rushing touchdown in its last seven contests.
- The Nittany Lions had two freshmen running backs (Kaytron Allen and Nicholas Singleton) each score two touchdowns.
 Since at least 2000, they are the only Penn State freshmen to both score two rushing touchdowns in a game.
- The Nittany Lions forced two fumbles and two interceptions. Penn State had four takeaways in a game for the first time since the Michigan State game in 2019.
- · Penn State recorded 11 tackles for loss and six sacks. Penn State

tallied 11 tackles for loss in a game for the first time since the lowa game in 2021.

- Penn State has won 19 of its last 21 home openers.
- Penn State welcomed 107,306 fans to Beaver Stadium. It was Penn State's highest attendance for a home opener since 2007.
- Nittany Lion freshmen (true and redshirt) combined for 423 of PSU's 572 yards (74 percent).
- In the first half, Sean Clifford completed passes to 10 different receivers.
- The Nittany Lions finished the game with a program-record 17 receivers catching a pass.
- Penn State had touchdown runs of 44 and 70 yards, both by Nicholas Singleton. The Nittany Lions had multiple 40+ yard touchdown runs in a game for the first time since 2018 at Illinois (Miles Sanders, 48 yards; Ricky Slade, 61 yards).
- Singleton's the first Nittany Lion with multiple 40+ yard touchdown runs in a game since Larry Johnson at Indiana on Nov. 16, 2002 (touchdown runs of 41, 43 and 69 yards).
- Singleton is the first Nittany Lion with three 40+ yard runs in a game since Johnson's performance against Indiana (runs of 41, 41, 43 and 69).
- The 179 rushing yards by Singleton is a Penn State record for a Beaver Stadium debut.
- Penn State caused a safety in the second quarter. A botched handoff by Ohio was recovered by the Bobcats in their own end zone.

PURDUE NOTES

- The Nittany Lions are now 112-22-2 all-time in season openers and 16-14 all-time in Big Ten openers.
- Penn State tallied 406 yards, including 308 through the air.
 QB Sean Clifford tied a career high with four passing
- touchdowns and added a rushing score.
 On the night, Clifford surpassed the 8,000-career passing yard mark and the 9,000-career total yards mark.
- Penn State broke up 16 passes.
- CB Joey Porter Jr. recorded a team-high eight tackles, a careerhigh six pass breakups and recovered a fumble.

ON TV

- Penn State has had 340 of its last 342 games televised, including 236 consecutive games.
- Over the last 15 seasons, every Penn State game has aired on either ABC, BTN, NBC or an ESPN or FOX channel.
- Penn State has made 319 regular season TV appearances since 1995, which is tied for the national lead.
- The Penn State-Auburn game drew 4.054 million viewers, the most-watched FBS game of the week.
- The Penn State-Purdue matchup drew 3.512 million viewers.

- The Nittany Lions have played 23 teams 20 or more times in the 136-year history of the program.
- Penn State owns a winning record against 18 of the 23 teams that it has met 20 or more times.
- Eight of the 23 teams are on the 2022 schedule, including Purdue (20), Northwestern (20), Michigan (26), Ohio State (37), Indiana (25), Maryland (45), Rutgers (32) and Michigan State (36).
- Penn State and Purdue played their 20th meeting to open the 2022 season. The Nittany Lions and Northwestern played the 20th time between the programs on October 1.
- Sixteen of the 21 programs are currently members of NCAA Division I FBS. Bucknell, Lehigh and Penn are in NCAA Division I FCS, while Gettysburg and Lebanon Valley are in Division III.

- With a 307-79 all-time record in Beaver Stadium, Penn State owns the sixth-best winning percentage (.795) in its current home venue amongst current FBS schools and leads the Big Ten.
- Penn State averaged 106,799 fans in seven home games in 2021, the seventh-highest average in program history and best season average since 2009.
- Only Alabama (.839) and Oklahoma (.816) have higher winning percentages in facilities older than Beaver Stadium.

LIONS UNDER THE LIGHTS

- The 2022 season marks the 22nd-straight with at least one regular-season night game on the schedule.
- Penn State opened the season with a 35-31 win at Purdue and will meet Minnesota for a 7:30 p.m. kickoff on Oct. 22.
- Penn State is 58-32 at night all-time. The figure breaks down to 18-11 at home, 28-14 on the road and 12-7 in neutral site games. Penn State is 1-1 at regular season neutral sites, 11-6 in bowl games and 1-0 in conference championship games.
- In 2019, Penn State played its most regular season night games in program history with four primetime tilts.
- On Oct. 12, 2013, the Lions claimed the longest game in Big Ten history when they edged Michigan under the lights, 43-40, in four overtimes in front of a sellout Beaver Stadium crowd of 107,844 on Homecoming.

OVERTIME OVER TIME

- College football introduced overtime during the bowl season in 1995 and adopted it for regular season games in 1996. Since then, Penn State has played 15 overtime games, including six over the 2012-14 seasons.
- Ten of the 15 overtime tilts have come at home, three in true road games, one in the 2006 Orange Bowl and one in the 2014 Pinstripe Bowl.
- Penn State is 8-7 all-time in overtime games, with a 5-5 record at Beaver Stadium, 1-2 mark in true road games and 2-0 in contests at a neutral site.
- Penn State's first two overtime contests came vs. Iowa in 2000 and 2002 at home. The Nittany Lions dropped their first three contests that went to the extra period, but won five straight overtime contests before falling to Nebraska on Nov. 23, 2013.

ARRINGTON A HALL OF FAMER

- Penn State national award winner and first-team All-America linebacker LaVar Arrington has been elected to the College Football Hall of Fame as part of the 2022 class.
- Arrington will be inducted to the Hall of Fame December 6, 2022 at the 64th National Football Foundation (NFF) Annual Awards Dinner.
- Arrington and the 21 inductees (18 players, 3 coaches) will also be recognized at their respective collegiate institutions with NFF Hall of Fame On-Campus Salutes, presented by Fidelity Investments, during the fall. Their accomplishments will be forever immortalized at the Chick-fil-A College Football Hall of Fame in Atlanta.
- Arrington is the 26th member (20 players, 6 coaches) of the Penn State football family to be elected to the College Hall of Fame. Quarterback Kerry Collins was the most recent player

2022 CAPTAINS

- Penn State football head coach James Franklin announced redshirt seniors QB Sean Clifford, S Jonathan Sutherland and LS Chris Stoll, seniors S Ji'Ayir Brown and DT PJ Mustipher and redshirt junior OL Juice Scruggs have been named team captains for the 2022 season.
- Clifford and Sutherland are captains for the fourth-straight season, the only four-time captains in program history.
- Mustipher is a captain for the second-consecutive season.

OFFENSIVE NOTES

- Since the start of the 2016 season, Penn State's offense is second in the Big Ten in yards per play (6.02; 35th) and total offense (422.4; 40th), and is third in touchdown percentage (31.3; 21st), points per possession (2.14; 27th), scoring percentage (39.98; 28th), yards per pass attempt (7.87; 30th) and scoring offense (33.0; 27th).
- Penn State's offense has been explosive since the 2016 campaign, as it leads the Big Ten in 80-plus yard play percentage (0.19; 2nd nationally) and 70-plus (0.39; 8th), ranks second in 40-plus (2.06; 13th) and 20-plus (7.80; 18th) and holds third in 30-plus (3.60; 20th), 50-plus (1.01; 27th) and 60-plus (0.56; 23rd).
- The Nittany Lions have tallied at least 55 plays of 20 or more yards in six of the last seven seasons (57 in 2021; 63 in 2019; 73 in 2018; 85 in 2017; 91 in 2016; 67 in 2015). PSU had 52 plays of 20 or more yards in 2020 (nine-game schedule).
- Additionally, the Nittany Lions are third in the Big Ten and 15th nationally in 15-plus yard passing play percentage since 2016 (19.47 percent).
- Penn State posted 406 total yards, including 308 through the air, against Purdue.
- Against Ohio, Penn State tallied 572 yards of total offense, the ninth-most in a game in the James Franklin era. Nittany Lion freshmen (true and redshirt) combined for 423 of the 572 yards (74 percent).
- Sean Clifford, Drew Allar and Christian Veilleux combined for 31 completions and 338 passing yards. Penn State's 31 completions on the day were tied for the fifth-most in a game since 2014.
- The Nittany Lions gained 234 yards rushing against Ohio and 245 yards at Auburn.
- In the first half against Ohio, Clifford completed passes to 10 different receivers. Penn State last had 10 receivers catch a pass in a half at Maryland in 2019 (first half).
- The Nittany Lions finished the game with a program-record 17 receivers catching a pass. Only 15 Nittany Lions caught a pass during the entire 2021 season.
- Since 1960, Penn State has had 11 seasons with 17 players catching at least one pass. The Nittany Lions had 17 pass catchers in the Ohio game.
- Penn State had touchdown runs of 44 and 70 yards, both by Nicholas Singleton, and a 48-yard run by Singleton. The Nittany Lions had multiple 40+ yard touchdown runs in a game for the first time since 2018 at Illinois (Miles Sanders, 48 yards; Ricky Slade, 61 yards).
- Penn State scored 41 points at Auburn, the most by a nonconference opponent in a game at Auburn since 2001 (41 by Louisiana Tech).
- Penn State had five rushing touchdowns in a game for the first time since the 2019 Cotton Bowl vs. Memphis.
- Prior to the game against Penn State, Auburn had allowed just one rushing touchdown in its last seven games.

- The Nittany Lions had two freshmen running backs (Kaytron Allen and Singleton) each score two touchdowns. Since at least 2000, they are the only Penn State freshmen to both score two rushing touchdowns in a game.
- Allen and Singleton became the first PSU freshmen duo to score a rushing touchdown in the same game for the first time since Noah Cain (13 yards) and Devyn Ford (1 yard) against Pitt in 2019.
- WR KeAndre Lambert-Smith completed a 25-yard pass to QB Sean Clifford in the second quarter.
- The Lambert-Smith to Clifford connection was the first reception by a quarterback from a non-quarterback since Christian Hackenberg's 14-yard touchdown reception from Nick Scott against Illinois in 2015.
- Penn State did not allow a sack against Auburn for the secondconsecutive season.
- With Allen's 111-yard rushing performance vs. Central Michigan, Penn State has had two true freshmen running backs post 100yard games in a single season for the first time since 2019, when Devyn Ford (once) and Noah Cain (twice) each eclipsed the 100yard plateau.
- Penn State rushed for 220 yards against Northwestern, including three running backs with 40 or more yards, for the 36th time in the James Franklin era that Penn State has surpassed 200 yards rushing. PSU is 31-5 in those games.
- The Nittany Lions had 37:28 of possession against Northwestern, PSU's most since the 2020 opener at Indiana (40:22).
- Mike Yurcich enters his second season as Penn State's offensive coordinator/quarterbacks coach.
- Yurcich (California University (Pa.)) and Franklin (East Stroudsburg) both played in the Pennsylvania State Athletic Conference (PSAC).
- As an FBS offensive coordinator, offenses under Yurcich have averaged 6.35 yards per play, ranking first among OC's since 2013 and 13.72 yards per completion, which is also first in that time frame.
- Since 2013, Yurcich's offenses have scored 50 or more points 26 times and 40 or more points 54 times (44.6 percent of games coached), both of which are tops among FBS offensive coordinators since 2013.
- His teams have averaged 55.2 touchdowns per year.
- Penn State has scored 40 points 23 times since 2016. By comparison, from 2008 until 2015, the Nittany Lions had 18 40-point outings.

- Sean Clifford was a 2021 National Football Foundation (NFF) Scholar-Athlete and finalist for the Campbell Trophy, known as the "Academic Heisman". He is the 19th Nittany Lion to be selected as an NFF Scholar-Athlete.
- Penn State posted its first 1,000 single-year APR in program history in 2018-19, topping the previous high of 993 in 2014-15.
- In 2019, punter Blake Gillikin took home CoSIDA Academic All-America® first-team honors for the second-straight year to become the 12th two-time first-team selection in Penn State history. He graduated with a perfect 4.0 grade-point average in May 2020.
- Gillikin's two first-team CoSIDA Academic All-America honors increase Penn State football's total to 67 honorees, which ranks second in Division I football history (FBS and FCS).

- Entering the 2022 season, 10 players have earned a combined 12 degrees.
- The Nittany Lion's nine Penn State graduates on the roster are: Barney Amor (master's in management & organizational leadership), Sean Clifford (advertising/public relations), Charlie Katshir (hospitality management), Grayson Kline (criminology), PJ Mustipher (journalism), Jake Pinegar (health policy & administration), Chris Stoll (kinesiology), Jonathan Sutherland (labor and employment relations) and Nick Tarburton (labor and human resources).
- Hunter Nourzad earned his bachelor's degree in engineering from Cornell, while Amor earned bachelor's degrees in sociology and education at Colgate.
- Clifford (journalism), Mustipher (telecommunications), Pinegar (media studies) and Stoll (health policy & administration) are pursuing second undergraduate degrees.
- Amor (supply chain management; second master's), Nourzad (management & organizational leadership), Sutherland (educational leadership) and Tarburton (organizational development) are pursuing master's degrees.

- Offensive coordinator Mike Yurcich also heads the Penn State quarterback room.
- Three quarterbacks Yurcich coached in college are currently on NFL rosters (Sam Ehlinger – Texas, Justin Fields – Ohio State, Mason Rudolph – Oklahoma State).
- Yurcich served as the passing game coordinator and quarterbacks coach at Ohio State in 2019, where quarterback Justin Fields was a finalist for the Heisman Trophy, Walter Camp Player of the Year Award and Davey O'Brien Award.
- Redshirt senior Sean Clifford is in his fourth season as Penn State's starting signal caller, having played in 44 career games, making 39 starts.
- Clifford joins Jonathan Sutherland as the only four-time team captains in program history.
- Against Purdue, Clifford joined Zack Mills (2001-04) and Tony Sacca (1988-92) as the only quarterbacks to start a game in four different seasons at Penn State.
- The Cincinnati native began the season on the Davey O'Brien Award, Manning Award, Maxwell Award, Johnny Unitas Golden Arm Award, Walter Camp Player of the Year Award and Wuerffel Trophy watch lists. Clifford is also on the Reese's Senior Bowl watch list.
- Clifford earned Big Ten Co-Offensive Player of the Week following his performance at Purdue, tallying 282 passing yards and tied a career high with four touchdown passes against Purdue. He also rushed for a 2-yard touchdown. The redshirt senior threw for two touchdowns in the second quarter and two in the fourth quarter.
- Clifford threw for 213 yards and a touchdown against Ohio, while adding a 1-yard rushing touchdown.
- Clifford threw for 178 yards and had a rushing touchdown at Auburn.
- Clifford passed for 216 yards and three touchdowns, and rushed for a 1-yard score, against Central Michigan. It was his 28th career game with multiple touchdown passes and 14th game with three or more TDs. He has four career games with four TD passes.
- Against CMU, Clifford recorded his 10th career game with both a passing and rushing touchdown. Penn State is 9-1 in those games.
- It was also his 22nd career game with 200+ passing yards. He sits second all-time at Penn State, behind only Trace McSorley (28; 2015-18).
- At Michigan, Clifford had a career-long 62-yard run in the second quarter.
- On the 62-yard run, Clifford surpassed the 1,000-career rushing yard mark, becoming the third PSU quarterback and 47th Nittany Lion to accomplish the feat.
- Clifford also went over the 10,000-career total yards mark, joining Trace McSorley (11,596; 2015-18) as the only Nittany Lions to go over 10,000 career total yards. He currently has 10,027 total yards.

- On a 9-yard completion, Clifford recorded his 694th career completion, moving past Hackenberg (693; 2013-15) for second all-time at Penn State. He now has 699 career completions.
- Clifford has tossed multiple touchdowns in a half on 19 occasions and 12 different times has thrown multiple touchdowns in a quarter.
- At Purdue, Clifford became the third Penn State quarterback to surpass the 8,000-career passing yard mark, joining Trace McSorley (9,899; 2015-18) and Christian Hackenberg (8,457; 2013-15).
- At Auburn, Clifford moved into second all-time at Penn State in passing yards, leaping Christian Hackenberg (8,457 yards; 2013-15). He currently has 8,989 passing yards.
- Clifford is just one of two Penn State players all-time to reach 10,000-plus yards of total offense and one of three quarterbacks to reach 8,000 career passing yards.
- Clifford is one of six current FBS quarterbacks and one of four Power Five conference quarterbacks with 8,900 passing yards and 1,000 rushing yards in his career.
- He ranks 14th among current FBS quarterbacks and eighth among Power Five conference quarterbacks with 8,989 career passing yards.
- The captain is one of 10 current FBS quarterbacks with at least 8,900 passing yards and 70 passing touchdowns in his career.
- Clifford is one of 12 current FBS quarterbacks with at least 690 career completions and ranks 11th among current FBS quarterbacks with a 60.2 completion percentage (min. 1,100 attempts).
- The redshirt senior currently sits as the all-time leader at Penn State in completion percentage (.602), while ranking second at PSU in completions (699), passing touchdowns (71) and passing yards (8,989), third in passing efficiency (140.9), attempts (1,161) and rushing yards by a quarterback (1,038), fourth in rushing touchdowns by a quarterback (14), tied fifth in wins as starting quarterback (26), sixth in lowest interception % (2.24), tied seventh in yards per pass attempt (7.8) and 10th in touchdown pass % (6.12).
- He owns nine career games with at least 250 passing yards and three passing touchdowns. He has tossed six career touchdowns of 70-plus yards and has completed 121 career passes of 20 or more yards.
- Clifford owns seven career 300-yard passing games.
- Freshman Drew Allar made his collegiate debut at Purdue, completing two-of-four passes for 26 yards.
- Allar completed six-of-eight passes for 88 yards and two touchdowns against Ohio.
- Allar connected with Omari Evans on a 32-yard touchdown for his first career touchdown pass. Allar hit Khalil Dinkins for a 28-yard score in the fourth quarter.
- Allar completed five passes for 37 yards at Michigan.
- Redshirt freshman Christian Veilleux completed six-of-seven passes against Ohio, tallying 37 yards.

RUNNING BACKS NOTES

- Co-offensive coordinator/running backs coach Ja'Juan Seider has 14 years of college coaching experience, including 11 at the Power Five level.
- Seider helped a young running backs group to rank fifth in the Big Ten in rushing in 2020.
- In 2019, Seider mentored Journey Brown, who had 11 rushes of 20 or more yards and posted a Cotton Bowl and Penn State bowl-record 202 rushing yards.
- In 2018, Penn State posted its highest rushing average (204.9) since 2008 (205.8), led by second-team All-Big Ten selection Miles Sanders.
- As a player at Florida A&M, Seider won the Doug Williams Award for National Offensive Player of the Year, Jake Gaither Award (considered the Heisman Trophy of Historically Black Colleges) and earned All-America honors after throwing for 2,622 yards and 27 touchdowns and rushing for 740 yards and 14 touchdowns in 1999.
- Seider, who was the 1999 MEAC Offensive Player of the Year, was selected in the sixth round of the 2000 NFL Draft by the San Diego Chargers.
- Sophomore Keyvone Lee has collected 1,062 career rushing yards (4.8 yards per carry) and six touchdowns. He also has 30 catches for 219 yards and a touchdown.
- Lee surpassed the 1,000 career rushing yard mark against Auburn. He became the 46th Nittany Lion to reach 1,000 career rushing yards.
- The sophomore is a member of the Doak Walker Award watch list.
- Against Purdue, Lee caught the game-winning 10-yard touchdown reception with 57 seconds remaining. It was his first career touchdown reception.
- Lee rushed for 40 yards on 10 carries against Northwestern.
- Freshmen Kaytron Allen and Nicholas Singleton both made their collegiate debuts against Purdue.
- Singleton rushed for 179 yards and two touchdowns on 10 carries against Ohio. He scored on runs of 44 and 70 yards and added a 48-yard rush. Singleton earned Big Ten Freshman of the Week honors for his efforts against the Bobcats.
- Singleton became the first Nittany Lion with multiple 40+ yard touchdown runs in a game since Larry Johnson at Indiana on Nov. 16, 2002 (touchdown runs of 41, 43 and 69 yards).
- Singleton is the first Nittany Lion with three 40+ yard runs in a game since Johnson's performance against Indiana (runs of 41, 41, 43 and 69).
- The freshman's 70-yard run is Penn State's longest run since an 85-yard run by Journey Brown against Pittsburgh in 2019.
- Singleton repeated as Big Ten Freshman of the Week after rushing for 124 yards and two touchdowns on 10 carries at Auburn.
- Singleton scored on two touchdown runs, a 1-yard rush and a 54-yard rush. He added a 53-yard carry.
- He became the first Penn State true freshman with back-toback 100-yard games since Noah Cain in 2019 (vs. Purdue and lowa).
- Singleton rushed for 42 yards against Central Michigan, including a 21-yard carry.
- Singleton tallied 87 yards and a touchdown on a career-high 21 carries against Northwestern. He scored on a 2-yard run in the second quarter. It was Singleton's fifth rushing touchdown of the season.
- Since 2000, only Noah Cain (8; 2019), Saquon Barkley (7; 2015) and Ricky Slade (6; 2018) have more rushing touchdowns in their freshman season than Singleton's five scores.
- Through six games, Singleton has 482 yards, averaging 80.3 per game and 6.99 per carry.
- Singleton ranks sixth in the country in yards per carry.
- The freshman leads the country with five 40+ yard runs and is tied for the FBS-lead with five 30+ yard runs this season. He is tied second with three 50+ yard runs. Three of his five 40+ yard runs have gone for touchdowns.

- Singleton ranks third among FBS freshmen and ranks 44th in the FBS with 80.3 rushing yards per game.
- Singleton is averaging 117.17 all-purpose yards per game, ranking 39th in the nation and first among FBS freshmen.
- Since 2000, Singleton has the third-most rushing yards by a Penn State freshman through the first six games of a season, trailing only Saquon Barkley (1,076; 2015) and Evan Royster (513; 2007).
- Allen had a 22-yard reception against Ohio. He rushed for 31 yards at Purdue and 23 yards vs. the Bobcats.
- Allen rushed for 52 yards and two touchdowns on nine carries at Auburn.
- Allen's first career rushing touchdown came on a 3-yard run in the second quarter. He added a 6-yard touchdown run in the third quarter.
- Against Central Michigan, Allen rushed for 111 yards, on 13 carries, marking the first 100-yard rushing game of his career.
- Allen scored on a 14-yard run in the second quarter. It was his third career touchdown, which have all come in the last two games.
- Allen had a career-long 37-yard run in the fourth quarter.
- For his efforts, Allen was named Big Ten Freshman of the Week.
 Allen collected 86 yards on a career-best 21 carries against
- Northwestern.
- Allen scored on a 1-yard run at Michigan, his fourth touchdown of the season.
- Allen ranks sixth among FBS freshmen averaging 5.06 yards per carry, ninth in rushing yards per game (53.2), ninth in rushing touchdowns (4) and 11th in rushing yards (319).
- With Allen's 111-yard rushing performance vs. CMU, Penn State has had two true freshmen running backs post 100-yard games in a single season for the first time since 2019, when Ford (once) and Noah Cain (twice) each eclipsed the 100-yard plateau.
- Penn State is the only FBS school with two true freshman who have rushed for 100 yards in a game this season.
- Allen and Singleton are combining to average 133.5 rushing yards per game. They rank 31st among FBS running back duos, 16th among Power Five running back duos and first among freshmen duos.
- The Allen-Singleton duo are averaging more rushing yards per game than 42 FBS teams (five Big Ten teams).
- The Nittany Lions had two freshmen running backs (Allen and Singleton) each score two touchdowns against Auburn. Since at least 2000, they are the only Penn State freshmen to both score two rushing touchdowns in a game.
- Allen and Singleton became the first PSU freshmen duo to score a rushing touchdown in the same game for the first time since Noah Cain (13 yards) and Devyn Ford (1 yard) against Pitt in 2019.

TIGHT ENDS NOTES

- Tight ends coach Ty Howle enters his second season coaching the Penn State tight ends and his third season overall on the staff
- Howle served as an offensive analyst in 2020, working closely with the offensive line and tight ends.
- Prior to returning to Happy Valley, Howle spent four seasons on the coaching staff at Western Illinois, serving as assistant head coach/co-offensive coordinator/offensive line coach in 2018-19.
- Howle was a four-year letterwinner on the Penn State offensive line from 2009-13. He started at center and left guard and was a four-time Academic All-Big Ten selection. He was a team captain in 2013.
- Howle played in 47 career games for the NIttany Lions, making 13 starts. He graduated in 2013 with a bachelor's degree in kinesioloav.
- Since James Franklin took over the program in 2014, three PSU tight ends have been taken in the NFL Draft, tied for eighth in the nation during that span (Pat Freiermuth – 2021, 2nd round; Mike Gesicki - 2018, 2nd round; Jesse James -2015, 5th round).
- An experienced tight end group, which has combined for 75 career games and 33 starts, looks to continue a strong tight end tradition
- Redshirt junior Brenton Strange leads the group and has appeared in 30 career games for the Nittany Lions, making 24 starts.
- Among FBS tight ends, Strange ranks 20th with 240 receiving yards and leads Penn State averaging 15.0 yards per reception (min. 10 receptions). He paces the team with four touchdown receptions.
- Late in the second quarter at Purdue, Strange caught a pass along the sideline and fought off multiple Boilermakers for a 67-yard touchdown. It was Strange's longest career reception and seventh career touchdown grab.
- Strange led the Nittany Lions with six catches for 80 yards at Auburn, including 59 yards after the catch.
- Strange caught five passes for 42 vards against Central Michigan, including touchdown receptions of 4 and 3 yards for his first career multi-touchdown catch game.
- Strange had a 20-yard touchdown grab vs. Northwestern.
- With his fourth receiving TD of the year, Strange has already set a career high for a season.
- Strange (7), sophomore Theo Johnson (4) and sophomore Tyler Warren (2) have combined for 13 20-plus yard receptions in their careers.
- Johnson and Strange are both on the Mackey Award watch list.
- In his first career start, Warren had three catches for 23 yards
- at Purdue.
- The sophomore made a key 15-yard catch to setup the gamewinning touchdown in the fourth quarter.
- Warren scored a 3-yard run against Villanova and a 2-yard rushing touchdown against Auburn in 2021.
- He made a key 2-yard touchdown reception on fourth and goal against Michigan, his first career receiving score.
- Redshirt freshman Khalil Dinkins caught a 28-yard touchdown pass in the fourth quarter vs. Ohio, his first career reception and touchdown reception.

WIDE RECEIVER NOTES

- Offensive recruiting coordinator/wide receivers coach Taylor Stubblefield is in his third season on the Penn State staff.
- As a player, Stubblefield caught 325 passes, which was an NCAA record at the completion of his career at Purdue.
- He still owns the Big Ten record for career receptions and ranks second in conference history with 3,629 yards.
- Stubblefield was a consensus All-American and a finalist for the Biletnikoff Award in 2004.
- Leading the wideout room is Parker Washington, who has caught a pass in all 28 games of his career.
- Washington had a 20-yard reception against Purdue, a 34-yard grab against Ohio, a 26-yard catch at Auburn, catches of 20 and 27 yards against Central Michigan and a 43-yard catch against Northwestern, giving him 26 career receptions of 20+ yards.
- He led PSU with six receptions and 64 receiving yards vs. CMU.
- The sophomore owns 123 career receptions, ranking 12th alltime at Penn State.
- Washington's 100 receptions in his first two seasons of his career are second-most ever at Penn State for a player in their first two years, trailing only DaeSean Hamilton (127 combined in 2014 and 2015).
- Washington and transfer Mitchell Tinsley (154) both have over 100 career receptions.
- Washington has recorded 1,627 career receiving yards, good for 18th in program history.
- With Tinsley (2,061) and Washington, Penn State has two players over 1,500 career receiving yards.
- Tinsley (21) and Washington (10) both have double-digit career receiving touchdowns.
- Tinsley and Washington were two of 30 FBS receivers entering the 2022 season with at least 100 receptions, 1,300 receiving yards and 10 receiving touchdowns in their career.
- Tinsley and Washington are both on the Biletnikoff Award watch list, while Washington is also on the Earl Campbell Tyler Rose Award watch list.
- KeAndre Lambert-Smith (521), Tinsley and Washington each recorded over 500 receiving yards last season. Penn State entered the season as one of nine FBS teams, and one of six Power Five teams, with three receivers on the roster who tallied 500+ receiving yards in 2021.
- · Lambert-Smith, who has started 23 career games, made 34 receptions for 521 yards and five touchdowns with a long reception of 83 yards in 2021.
- The 83-yard reception resulted in a touchdown against Villanova (9/25), marking the seventh-longest pass play in program history
- Eight of Lambert-Smith's 34 catches in 2021 were 20 or more yards and he finished sixth in the Big Ten in yards per reception (15.3).
- The sophomore had four catches for 58 yards at Purdue, including a 29-yard touchdown reception in the fourth quarter.
- · Lambert-Smith completed a 25-yard pass to Sean Clifford against Auburn.

- It was Penn State's first pass completed by a receiver since Jahan Dotson's 21-yard completion to Washington against Indiana in 2021
- Lambert-Smith had a reception in 20-straight games, before his streak was snapped against Northwestern.
- Penn State welcomed Tinsley as a transfer this past offseason. Tinsley spent the previous two seasons at Western Kentucky.
- Tinsley had a team-high seven catches for 84 yards at Purdue. • He had a 27-yard reception on PSU's game-winning drive in the
- fourth guarter at Purdue.
- · The senior hauled in a 12-yard touchdown reception in the second quarter against Ohio, his first reception and first touchdown as a Nittany Lion.
- Tinsley made a 34-yard grab against Auburn.
- · The senior made a 5-yard touchdown catch in the first quarter against Central Michigan. He added a 29-yard catch in the game.
- Tinsley had five catches for 57 yards at Michigan.
- Tinsley, a senior, has a reception in 32-straight games, tied for the ninth-longest reception streak in the nation.
- Among current FBS receivers, Tinsley ranks seventh in career receiving touchdowns (21), 21st in career receiving yards (2,061) and 27th in career receptions (154).
- Tinsley is one of nine FBS receivers with 150 receptions, 2,050 receiving yards and 20 receiving touchdowns in his career.
- Tinsley has 29 career receptions of 20 or more yards and six receptions of 40 or more yards.
- A second-team All-Conference USA selection in 2021, Tinsley finished second in the league in receiving yards (1,402, 8th nationally), receptions (87, 16th) and touchdown receptions (14, 5th).
- He started all 14 games for the Hilltoppers and averaged 100.1 yards receiving per game and 16.1 yards per reception.
- During the 2020 season, he played in all 12 games, making nine starts, pacing the Hilltoppers in receptions (43), yards (377) and touchdowns (4).
- · The Nittany Lions had a program-record 17 different passcatchers against Ohio.
- Since 1960, Penn State has had 11 seasons with 17 players catching at least one pass. The Nittany Lions had 17 pass catchers in the Ohio game.
- Against Ohio, redshirt freshman Liam Clifford, redshirt freshman Jaden Dottin, freshman Omari Evans, freshman Kaden Saunders and redshirt freshman Harrison Wallace III all made their first career receptions.
- Clifford had a 20-yard reception against Central Michigan.
- Evans hauled in a 32-vard touchdown pass in the third guarter. his first career reception and first career touchdown reception, against Ohio.
- Dottin made his first career start vs. Ohio.
- Wallace had four receptions for 35 yards against the Bobcats and a 26-yard reception vs. Central Michigan.
- Wallace hauled in a career-long 48-yard reception at Michigan. It's Penn State's longest reception by a wide receiver this season.

OFFENSIVE LINE NOTES

- Offensive line coach **Phil Trautwein** enters his third season at Penn State.
- He was named to the American Football Coaches Association (AFCA) Class of 2021"35 Under 35" list, recognizing the top-35 football coaches under the age of 35. He was the only Big Ten coach and the only offensive line coach on the 2021 list.
- In his two seasons at Penn State, Trautwein has helped seven Penn State offensive linemen to earn All-Big Ten honors.
- He's coached 17 All-Conference selections over the last four seasons, which includes a stint at Boston College as the offensive line coach.
- Trautwein was a two-time All-SEC selection and two-time team captain as a left tackle at Florida, earning first-team honors in 2008 and second-team accolades in 2006.
- He was part of the Gators winning the BCS National Championship and SEC titles in the 2006 and 2008 seasons.
- Trautwein played four years in the NFL.
- Redshirt senior center Juice Scruggs leads the offensive line unit and began the season on the Rimington Trophy watch list.
- In 2021, he was named All-Big Ten honorable mention by the coaches and media, earned Pro Football Focus All-Big Ten third team honors, and was the team's Dick Maginnis Memorial Award, recognizing the most outstanding offensive lineman.
- Scruggs has made 19 career starts on the offensive line, including starting at center in all six games this season.
- Redshirt junior tackle **Caedan Wallace** has 26 starts at right tackle and owns 32 career appearances.
- Sophomore **Olumuyiwa Fashanu** has appeared in 15 games and made eight starts at left tackle.
- In 49 pass protections against Purdue, Fashanu allowed zero pressures.
- Fashanu also allowed zero pressures against Ohio.
- According to Coaches By The Numbers, Fashanu (167 pass plays) and Scruggs (165) have not allowed a sack this season.
- Sophomore Nick Dawkins, redshirt senior Bryce Effner and redshirt freshman Landon Tengwall also saw playing time on the line in 2021.
- Redshirt junior Sal Wormley has started six games and returns after missing the 2021 season due to injury.
- Tengwall and Wormley made their first career starts at Purdue.
- Redshirt senior **Hunter Nourzad** made his first Penn State start at Michigan.
- The Nittany Lions allowed no sacks against Auburn.
- Penn State didn't allow a sack against Auburn in 2021 or 2022.
- Against the Tigers, the Penn State offensive line paved the way for the Nittany Lions to rush for 245 yards and five touchdowns.
- The PSU offensive line helped the Nittany Lions to rush for 220 yards against Northwestern, including three players over 40 yards.
- The Nittany Lion offensive line has aided **Nicholas Singleton** to lead the nation in 30+ yard runs (5), 40+ yard runs (5) and rank second in 50+ yard runs (3).
- The Penn State offensive line has helped Singleton and Kaytron Allen to earn 100-yard rushing games this season.




DEFENSIVE NOTES

- Manny Diaz was hired as Penn State's defensive coordinator and linebackers coach on Dec. 11, 2021.
- Diaz, who has 24 years of collegiate coaching experience, including three as a head coach and 13 as a defensive coordinator, joined the Nittany Lions after spending six seasons (2016-21) at the University of Miami, including three seasons as head coach (2019-21), where he coached the Hurricanes to three bowl appearances.
- Defenses under Diaz have been a force behind the line of scrimmage. From 2018-20, Miami's defense featured at least one player with 15 tackles for loss: Jaelan Phillips (15.5) in 2020, Gregory Rousseau (19.5) in 2019 and Jonathan Garvin (18.0) in 2018.
- During Diaz's tenure in Miami, the Hurricanes ranked in the top 10 nationally in tackles for loss each year. Miami was No. 9 in 2021 (7.75 per game), No. 4 in 2020 (8.6), No. 4 in 2019 (8.3), No. 1 in 2018 (10.5), No. 4 in 2017 (8.5) and No. 5 in 2016 (8.3).
- Penn State tallied a school-record 16 pass breakups at Purdue, including six by CB Joey Porter Jr. and four by S Keaton Ellis.
- Penn State's school-record 16 pass breakups at Purdue are the most by an FBS team in a game since Tulane had 20 vs. East Carolina in 2018.
- Porter's six pass breakups are a school record and tied a Big Ten single-game record, matching Michigan's Jourdan Lewis (vs. Michigan State, 2015) and Minnesota's Michael Carter (vs. Purdue, 2012).
- His six pass breakups are the most by an FBS player since Houston's William Jackson III had seven against Temple in 2015.
- The Nittany Lions held Purdue's Aidan O'Connell to 30-of-60 passing (50 percent) after he completed 71 percent of his passes in 2021.
- PSU limited Ohio to 264 total yards and Central Michigan to 88 rushing yards.
- Penn State caused a safety in the second quarter vs. Ohio, its first safety since 2018 at Pitt (holding in the end zone).
- Against Ohio, the Nittany Lions snapped a streak of 20-straight games forcing a turnover. In those 20 games, Penn State forced 29 total turnovers (19 interceptions, 10 fumbles).
- At Auburn, Penn State recorded 11 tackles for loss and six sacks.
- Penn State forced four takeaways (two fumbles, two interceptions). It was the Nittany Lions' first time with four takeaways since the Michigan State game in 2019.
- Against the Tigers, 28 Penn State players played double-digit snaps on defense.
- The Nittany Lions recorded four takeaways against Central Michigan, marking their second-straight game with four takeaways, the first time that the Nittany Lions have forced at least four turnovers in two straight games since forcing four by both Virginia and Navy early in the 2012 season.
- Penn State registered 9 pass breakups in the first half and 13 in the CMU game. The Nittany Lions recorded double-digit pass breakups in a game for the second time this season.
- The Nittany Lions held Northwestern to just 31 yards rushing on 28 carries. Twenty-nine of Northwestern's 31 yards came on one carry. Penn State held NU to two yards on the other 27 rushes.
- The Nittany Lions held Northwestern to zero or negative yards on 14 of the Wildcats' 28 rushes.
- Penn State held Northwestern without a first down in the first quarter and forced five three-and-outs to start the game, the most to start a game since seven against Idaho in 2019 and the most against a Big Ten foe since 2011 vs. Illinois (six).
- The Nittany Lions forced three turnovers against the Wildcats (two fumbles, one interception).
- Penn State forced 11 turnovers in a three-game span (Auburn, Central Michigan, Northwestern), the most in any three-game stretch since forcing 13 in 1996 (5 vs. Northwestern, 5 vs. Michigan, 3 vs. Michigan State).
- At Michigan, LB Curtis Jacobs recorded a 47-yard pick-six in the second quarter. It was PSU's first pick-six since Daequan Hardy's 17-yard interception return at Michigan State in 2021.

- The Nittany Lions held Michigan to 145 passing yards.
- Penn State leads the country with 52 pass breakups, 10 more than any other FBS team.
- The Nittany Lions have four players who rank among the Top 35 in the pass breakups per game.
- Porter Jr. holds second in the nation with 10 pass breakups and third in the country averaging 1.67 per game.
- CB Kalen King has nine pass breakups, while CB Johnny Dixon has six breakups and an interception. King is tied sixth in the country in pass breakups.
- Dixon and Ellis, both with six breakups, are tied 33rd in the nation.
- The Nittany Lions have 11 players who have recorded at least one sack this season, tied third-most in the nation and tied most among Power Five teams.
- The Nittany Lions hold 13th in the country with 13 takeaways this season (seven fumble recoveries, six interceptions).
- Penn State has held opponents to a 51.6 completion percentage (129-of-250), good for fourth in the country and second among Power Five teams.
- The Nittany Lions have forced a turnover on 25.7 percent of opponent possessions, ranking eighth in the nation and second among Power Five teams.
- Penn State ranks 11th in the country with seven fumble recoveries.
- The Nittany Lions hold sixth in the nation in passing efficiency defense (102.29) and 22nd in scoring defense (19.2).
- Penn State sits 28th in the country in red zone defense, allowing a 76.2 conversion rate. The Nittany Lions have made five red zone stops this season.
- According to Pro Football Focus, Penn State leads the country with 133 quarterback pressures this season.
- Over the last eight seasons, PSU sits second nationally in sacks per game (2.96; trailing only Clemson), third in QB hurries (928), fourth in total pressures generated (1,388), fourth in fewest passing TDs allowed per game (1.07), eighth in fewest passing yards per attempt (6.26), eighth in tackles for loss percentage (10.43) and 13th in fewest rushing yards per attempt (3.64).
- Penn State's 278 sacks over the last eight years (2015-22) are fourth behind Clemson (348), Alabama (332) and Pitt (304).
- Over the last eight years, Penn State has accumulated a 8.27 percent sack percentage (278 sacks on 3,843 plays), which ranks ninth in the FBS.
- Since 2014, Penn State has held opponents to seven or less points 24 times, tied sixth-most among FBS teams. Eighteen of those 24 games have been against Big Ten opponents.
- In the James Franklin era, Penn State has recorded seven shutouts, fifth-most among FBS teams.
- Penn State also has the fifth-most shutouts (12) in the FBS since 2007.
- Since 2014, PSU has held an opponent under 300 total yards 47 times, tied seventh-most among FBS teams.
- Since 2014, the Nittany Lions have allowed less than 200
 passing yards in 60 games, tied for the seventh-most among
 FBS teams, and have held opponents under 100 passing yards
 in 16 games in that span, tied ninth-most among FBS teams.
- Since 2014, Penn State has held opponents under 100 rushing yards on 43 occasions, tied 12th-most among FBS teams, and have held opponents under 50 rushing yards in 16 games, also 12th-most among FBS teams.
- Penn State has registered 10 or more tackles for loss 26 times since 2014, tied second-most among FBS teams.
- The Nittany Lions have forced multiple takeaways in a game on 45 occasions since 2014 and three times in 2022.

- · John Scott Jr. is in his third season heading the Nittany Lion defensive line corps. Scott brings 18 years of collegiate coaching experience to the Penn State defensive line room with two additional years of coaching experience in the NFL.
- In Scott's first two seasons at Penn State, the Nittany Lions had three first-team All-Big Ten selections in Odafe (Jayson) Oweh and Shaka Toney in 2020 and Arnold Ebiketie in 2021.
- Six Nittany Lions earned All-Big Ten accolades in the last two seasons.
- · The Nittany Lions defensive line room features 2021 All-Big Ten honoree DT PJ Mustipher.
- Mustipher, a senior and team captain, anchors the Nittany Lion defensive line room, having appeared in 46 career games and making 22 starts. In his Penn State career, Mustipher owns 130 tackles, 11.0 tackles for loss and three sacks.
- Mustipher is a team captain for the second-straight season.

- Robinson tallied four tackles against Northwestern.

- Diaz, who has 24 years of collegiate coaching experience, including three as a head coach and 13 as a defensive coordinator, joins the Nittany Lions after spending six seasons (2016-21) at the University of Miami, including three seasons as head coach (2019-21).
- Collins, who has 24 years of collegiate coaching experience, joins the Nittany Lions after spending the 2021 season as Boise State's special teams coordinator and edge coach.
- During the 2021 campaign, Collins' special teams unit blocked three punts (T-7th nationally) and four kicks overall to rank ninth in FBS. Of the three blocked punts, two were returned for touchdowns.
- · Losey, who was previously associate director of performance enhancement for football, will lead the performance enhancement staff for football. He replaces Dwight Galt III, who retired.

LETTERMEN MAKING THEIR RETURN

- Nine members of the coaching and support staff played at PSU.
- · Associate head coach/cornerbacks coach Terry M. Smith was a three-year starter at wide receiver from 1989-91. He ranks tied for 10th in career receiving touchdowns (15), 13th in career receiving yardage (1,825) and 14th in career receptions (108).
- Tight ends coach Ty Howle was a four-year letterwinner on the Penn State offensive line from 2009-13. He played in 47 career games, making 13 starts. The 2013 team captain made starts at center and left guard and was a four-time Academic All-Big Ten selection.
- Defensive graduate assistant Deion Barnes made 31 starts as a Nittany Lion from 2012-14. In 2014, Barnes tallied 12.5 tackles for loss and six sacks. He led PSU with 10 tackles for loss and six sacks in 2012 to earn consensus freshman All-American honors.
- Analyst and analytics coordinator Dan Connor was a two-time first team All-America linebacker for Penn State in 2006 and 2007, the 14th Nittany Lion to be named a two-time first-team All-American. He finished his career as Penn State's all-time leader with 419 tackles.
- · Analyst and analytics coordinator Danny Rocco lettered as a linebacker for the Nittany Lions in 1979 and 1980, playing for the Liberty and Fiesta Bowl teams.
- · Assistant director of performance enhancement Tyrone Smith was a defensive tackle for PSU and lettered during the 2014 season.
- · Assistant recruiting coordinator Alan Zemaitis was a four-year letterman and three-time All-Big Ten selection for the blue and white from 2002-05. Zemaitis sits tied fifth all-time at Penn State with 12 career interceptions. He also holds fifth all-time at Penn State with 46 passes defended. Zemaitis helped the Nittany Lions to a Big Ten Championship in 2005.
- Director of football academic services Todd Kulka lettered as a linebacker and graduated in 1995. He helped Penn State to a 9-3 record and an Outback Bowl victory in 1995.
- Director of the football letterman's club Wally Richardson was a four-year letterman as a quarterback in 1992 and 1994-96. Richardson ranks 12th all-time at Penn State with 4,419 career passing yards. He also sits eighth all-time with 378 completions and 12th all-time with 27 touchdown passes.

CORNERBACKS NOTES

- Terry M. Smith is in his ninth season as Penn State's cornerbacks coach. He is also the program's associate head coach and defensive recruiting coordinator.
- Over the last seven seasons, Smith has tutored a secondary which has seen eight defensive backs taken in the NFL Draft, including two in 2022, tied for the ninth-most nationally.
- Smith was a four-year letterwinner (1988-91) and three-year starter at wide receiver at Penn State. He ranks tied for 10th in career receiving touchdowns (15), 13th in career receiving yardage (1,825) and 14th in career receptions (108).
- Penn State's cornerbacks room is led by All-Big Ten returnee Joey Porter Jr., who has played in 31 career games with the Nittany Lions and has made 27 starts.
- Penn State has held opponents to a 51.6 completion percentage (129-of-250), good for fourth in the country and second among Power Five teams.
- Penn State leads the country with 52 pass breakups, 10 more than any other FBS team.
- The Nittany Lions have four players who rank among the Top 35 in the pass breakups per game.
- Porter Jr. holds second in the nation with 10 pass breakups and third in the country averaging 1.67 per game.
- Porter tallied a career-high six pass breakups against Purdue, earning Bednarik Award National Player of the Week honors.
- The junior added a team-high eight tackles and made his first career fumble recovery.
- Porter's six pass breakups vs. the Boilermakers set a school record and tied a Big Ten single-game record. He matched Michigan's Jourdan Lewis (vs. Michigan State, 2015) and Minnesota's Michael Carter (vs. Purdue, 2012).
- Porter's six pass breakups are tied for the most in a single game for an FBS player since Houston's William Jackson III had seven against Temple in 2015.
- According to Pro Football Focus, Porter's six forced incompletions tied for the most in a game by a Power Five cornerback since 2014.
- Porter began the 2022 campaign on watch lists for the Bednarik Award, Bronko Nagurski Trophy, Jim Thorpe Award and Lott IMPACT Trophy. Porter was also named Preseason All-America second team by Sports Illustrated.

- He recorded five tackles and three pass breakups vs. Central Michigan.
- Redshirt junior Daequan Hardy accounted for two tackles and two pass breakups, including a key breakup to force a Purdue punt late in the fourth quarter.
- Hardy broke up one pass against Northwestern.
- Hardy forced a fumble in the third quarter at Michigan.
- Sophomore Kalen King recorded one pass breakup at Purdue, had another pass breakup at Auburn and one vs. Northwestern.
- King forced and recovered a fumble against Central Michigan, his second career forced fumble and first recovery. He also broke up a career-best four passes.
- King registered a solo tackle for loss in the third quarter at Michigan.
- King has nine pass breakups this season, tied sixth in the nation.
- Junior Johnny Dixon registered his first career sack and broke up two passes against the Boilermakers.
- Dixon recorded a career-high 1.5 tackles for loss and a solo sack against Ohio.
- Dixon intercepted a pass in the second quarter and tallied three pass breakups against Central Michigan.
- He had a key pass breakup late in the fourth quarter vs. Northwestern.
- Dixon has six pass breakups and an interception this season. He is tied 33rd in the nation in pass breakups.
- According to Coaches By The Numbers, Dixon (21 percent), King (37) and Porter (38) are allowing under a 40.0 completion percentage when targeted.
- Junior Marquis Wilson made the switch back to cornerback after being listed as an athlete for the 2021 season. He's played in 32 games, including two starts, with 47 tackles, five pass breakups and two interceptions.
- · Wilson had two pass breakups vs. Ohio.
- Wilson tied for a team high with six tackles (four solo) and a halftackle for loss at Auburn.

 Sutherland is a semifinalist for the National Football
- Foundation's William V. Campbell Trophy.
- Sutherland is on the preseason Paul Hornung Award watch list.
- Sophomore **Tyler Elsdon** led the Nittany Lions with six tackles (three solo) against Ohio.
- Elsdon made his first career start against Purdue.
- Elsdon recorded four tackles and a tackle for loss at Auburn.
- Freshman Abdul Carter and redshirt freshman Dominic
 DeLuca each notched five tackles against Ohio.
- Carter made a career-high six stops at Auburn, tying for the team lead. All six tackles were solo.
- Carter added his first career sack, and tackle for loss, and forced a fumble in the second quarter, his first career forced fumble.
- Carter tallied five tackles and a pass breakup vs. Central Michigan.
- Carter registered a tackle for loss vs. Northwestern and a solo tackle for loss at Michigan, while recording five tackles (four solo) against the Wolverines.

- Poindexter has 18 years of collegiate coaching experience, including seven as a defensive or co-defensive coordinator.
- As a player, Poindexter was a two-time consensus All-American at Virginia and was chosen as the 1998 ACC Defensive Player of the Year.
- Poindexter was inducted into the College Football Hall of Fame in 2020
- Senior **Ji'Ayir Brown** leads the Penn State safeties.
- Brown accounted for five solo tackles at Purdue and tallied five tackles (four solo), a half-tackle for loss and a pass breakup vs. Ohio.
- Brown earned Big Ten Defensive Player of the Week honors after collecting five tackles (four solo), a solo sack, a forced fumble and an interception at Auburn.
- The strip-sack, in the third quarter, was his first career sack and second career forced fumble.
- The captain added an interception, returning it 27 yards.
- Brown was also named Bronko Nagurski National Defensive Player of the Week following his performance at Auburn.
- Brown intercepted a pass and returned it 30 yards against Northwestern for his eighth career interception.
- He also had a solo tackle for loss against the Wildcats to go with six tackles (five solo).
- Brown notched a team-high nine tackles (seven solo) at Michigan, including a solo tackle for loss. He had seven tackles in the first quarter.
- Brown has had a hand in 11 takeaways as a Nittany Lion (eight interceptions, two forced fumbles, one fumble recovery).
- Brown is on the watch lists for the Bednarik Award and Jim Thorpe Award.
- Junior **Keaton Ellis** brings a wealth of experience to the Penn State secondary, having appeared in 36 career games, making 13 starts.
- In his career, Ellis owns three forced fumbles, one fumble recovery, an interception and 10 pass breakups.
- · He tallied a career-best four pass breakups at Purdue.
- Ellis is tied 33rd in the nation with six pass breakups this year.
- Redshirt freshman Zakee Wheatley forced a fumble at Purdue, which led to a touchdown drive at the end of the second quarter.
- Wheatley recorded his first career interception in the first quarter at Auburn.
- Wheatley also had an interception against Central Michigan, returning it 34 yards. He also had a career-high five tackles.

2023 HALL OF FAME BALLOT

- Penn State lettermen Ki-Jana Carter, D.J. Dozier and Paul Posluszny have been selected as a part of the national ballot for the National Football Foundation's College Hall of Fame's Class of 2023. A total of 80 players and nine coaches from FBS are on the 2023 ballot.
- The trio of standouts have an opportunity to join 20 former Nittany Lion players and five Penn State coaches who have been inducted into the Hall.
- Also on the Hall of Fame ballot is former Nittany Lion studentathlete Glenn Killinger, who is among the candidates for the divisional coach Class of 2023. Killinger was inducted into the Hall of Fame as a player in 1966.
- Carter, a running back for the Nittany Lions, was a first-team All-American during the 1994 campaign. Carter staked a claim to being one of the most decorated Penn State running backs of all-time with a junior season in which he was fourth nationally in rushing (139.9), second in scoring (10.8 ppg) and fifth in allpurpose yardage (158.4). The Westerville, Ohio native led the Big Ten in all three categories. His 7.8 yards per carry was easily the best among the nation's Top 25 rushers. His 1994 statistics included 1,539 yards rushing, the then-No. 2 season total in Penn State history, and 23 touchdowns. Carter was runner-up for the Heisman Trophy and a finalist for the Maxwell Award. He was named co-MVP of the Rose Bowl with 156 rushing yards on 21 carries, including an 83-yard touchdown run on the Nittany Lions' first offensive play. When the Cincinnati Bengals selected Carter as the first overall player picked in the 1995 NFL Draft, he became the first Nittany Lion to be chosen No. 1.
- Dozier, a tailback for the Nittany Lions, matriculated to Happy Valley from Virginia Beach, Va. He earned first team All-America honors from the Walter Camp Football Foundation in 1986. Dozier is the only Nittany Lion to the lead the team in rushing four consecutive seasons, doing so from 1983-86. He ranks No. 5 on the school career rushing yardage list with 3,2227 yards, scoring 25 touchdowns and averaging 5.2 yards per attempt. Dozier gained 1,002 yards as a freshman and tallied 811 yards and 10 touchdowns as a senior and one of the instrumental players on the Nittany Lions' 12-0 squad. Dozier was the Most Valuable Offensive Player of the Game after rushing for 99 yards and scoring the game-winning touchdown in the fourth quarter against Miami in the 1987 Fiesta Bowl to secure Penn State's second national championship.
- Posluszny, an outside linebacker for the Nittany Lions, was a first-team All-American in 2005 and 2006. Posluszny became just the second two-time winner of the Chuck Bednarik Award, presented to the nation's top defensive player, in 2006. In 2005, he also won the Butkus Award, presented to the nation's top linebacker and was a finalist for the 2006 honor. The 13th Nittany Lion to be named a two-time first-team All-American, Posluszny also was a two-time finalist for the Rotary Lombardi Award. The Nittany Lions' first two-time team captain since 1968-69, he became Penn State's career tackle leader with 372. A starter in the last 37 games of his career, Posluszny became the first Nittany Lion to lead the team in tackles three times and to post three 100-tackle seasons, recording 116 in 2006. Posluszny also was a two-time first-team ESPN the Magazine Academic All-American and was selected the 2006 Academic All-American of the Year among Division I football players.
- From Harrisburg, Killinger was a Walter Camp All-American at quarterback for the Nittany Lions in 1921. He coached at Dickinson (1922), Rensselaer (1927-32), Moravian (1933) and West Chester (1934-41, 45-59). Killinger is the winningest coach in West Chester history and is a member of the Pennsylvania Sports Hall of Fame. He died in 1988.
- Penn State has 26 players and coaches who are members of the College Football Hall of Fame. Six coaches and 20 players have earned their way into the hall of fame.
- LaVar Arrington will be inducted into the College Football Hall of Fame on December 6, 2022 at the 64th National Football Foundation (NFF) Annual Awards Dinner.

SPECIAL TEAMS NOTES

- Stacy Collins is in his first season as Penn State's special teams coordinator/outside linebacker/nickels coach.
- Collins, who has 24 years of collegiate coaching experience, joined the Nittany Lions after spending the 2021 season as Boise State's special teams coordinator and edge coach.
- During the 2021 campaign, Collins' special teams unit blocked three punts, which tied for seventh in the nation, and four kicks overall to rank ninth in FBS. Of the three blocked punts, two were returned for touchdowns.
- Since 2019, Penn State's kick return defense ranks second in percentage of kickoffs returned inside the 25 (78.4; 1st in B1G), third in touchback percentage (76.5; 1st), fourth in the nation in percentage of kickoffs returned (15.5; 1st) and average kick return yards allowed (16.9; 2nd) and tied 11th in average opponent field position (25.1; 4th).
- Also since 2019, Penn State's punt return defense is ranked first in punts inside the 20 (47.6 percent) and inside the 10 (21.7) and fourth in net punting (41.7; 2nd in B1G).
- Senior K Jake Pinegar ranks second all-time at Penn State with 160 career extra points and sits 10th in career extra point percentage (95.8).
- Pinegar is seventh all-time at Penn State with a 72.4 field goal percentage. He's also 10th in field goal attempts (58) and sixth in field goals made (42). The lowa native is also third on the all-time scoring list with 286 career points.
- Pinegar converted all five extra points at Purdue and hit five extra points, and a 25-yard field goal, vs. Ohio.
- Pinegar hit field goals of 48 and 22 yards against Auburn as well as all five extra point attempts. He hit a 38-yard field goal and both extra point attempts vs. Northwestern.
- Pinegar converted a 27-yard field goal and two extra points at Michigan.
- Senior SN Chris Stoll is in his fourth season as Penn State's primary long snapper. He's appeared in 40 career games.
- The captain is a member of the Patrick Mannelly Award watch list. He is on the Allstate AFCA Good Works Team watch list.
- Redshirt senior P Barney Amor has placed 15 of his 26 punts inside the 20 (58 percent), ranking fourth in the country, and is pacing the nation in percentage of punts inside the 10 (46.2 percent).
- He's tied first in the nation in total punts inside the 10 (12) and is tied fifth with 15 punts inside the 20. Amor has eight punts of 50+ yards.
- Amor ranks 23rd in the FBS and fifth in the Big Ten with a 44.5 punt average.
- The redshirt senior is a member of the Ray Guy Award watch list.
- Amor was awarded a scholarship during preseason camp.
- Amor set a career high with eight punt attempts at Purdue, including a 52-yard punt and landed three punts inside the 20, including two inside the 10.
- Against Ohio, Amor landed two punts inside the 20 and hit two punts of 50+ yards to earn Ray Guy Great 8 honors.
- At Auburn, Amor placed two punts inside the 20.
- Against Central Michigan, Amor landed three punts inside the 10, placing them at the CMU 6, 10 and 3. He added a 51-yard punt.
- Amor placed four of his five punts inside the 20 against Northwestern, including three punts inside the 10. He landed punts at the 7-, 4- and 8-yard lines.
- Amor was named Big Ten Special Teams Player of the Week following the Northwestern game.
- At Michigan, Amor had a 50-yard punt which landed at the Michigan 17.
- S Jonathan Sutherland is wearing No. 0 for the thirdstraight season as the team's special teams leader as part of a new tradition that began in 2020.
- KR Nicholas Singleton had a 25-yard return at Purdue, two 20-yard kick returns vs. Ohio and a 30-yard return at Auburn.

GAME RECAP

WEST LAFAYETTE, Ind. - Sean Clifford connected with Keyvone Lee for a 10-yard touchdown to give the Penn State football team the lead with 57 seconds remaining as the Nittany Lions earned a 35-31 win over Purdue at Ross-Ade Stadium to begin the 2022 season

Clifford completed 20-of-37 passes for 282 yards and a career-high-tying four passing touchdowns, while adding a 2-yard rushing score. Mitchell Tinsley caught seven passes for 84 yards and a touchdown in his Penn State debut, while KeAndre Lambert-Smith had four receptions for 58 yards and a touchdown. Brenton Strange added a 67-yard touchdown reception.

Joey Porter Jr. led the Nittany Lions with eight tackles to go with six pass breakups and a fumble recovery. Johnny Dixon and Jonathan Sutherland each had a sack, while Dixon broke up two passes. Keaton Ellis broke up four passes and Zakee Wheatley forced a fumble.

HOW IT HAPPENED

The Boilermakers got on the board first, finishing a 73-yard drive with a 36-yard field goal by Mitchell Fineran with 3:38 left in the first quarter

Penn State answered with a 12-yard touchdown pass from Clifford to Tinsley with 13:09 left in the second quarter. The Nittany Lions finished a 12-play, 79-yard drive as Clifford found a wide-open Tinsley on a crossing route. The drive was sparked by a 20-yard reception by Parker Washington and a 12-yard catch by Devyn Ford. Penn State took a 7-3 lead.

Purdue responded with a touchdown drive, concluding with a 3-yard run by King Doerue. The Boilermakers' 75-yard drive was aided by a pair of penalties. Purdue led 10-7 with 9:43 left in the second quarter.

Penn State re-took the lead on a 2-yard touchdown rush by Clifford with 1:44 left in the first half. The eight-play, 43-yard drive including four runs by Nicholas Singleton and a 10-yard catch by Strange.

The Nittany Lions forced a turnover in Purdue territory with 30 seconds left in the half. On a reverse play, Wheatley knocked the ball loose and Porter Jr. recovered the ball at the Penn State 18.

Penn State took advantage of the turnover with a 67-yard touchdown reception by Strange. The redshirt junior caught the ball along the sideline and fought off multiple Boilermakers to break loose for the score and his longest career reception. Penn State held a 21-10 lead at the break. Purdue scored on a 2-yard run by Doerue on the opening drive of the

second half. A 75-yard drive included a 22-yard pass from Aidan O'Connell to Charlie Jones

The Boilermakers took the lead on a 7-yard touchdown pass from O'Connell to Jones late in the third quarter. Purdue denjoered a 10-play, 81-yard drive, which included a 26-yard reception by Mershawn Rice and a 23-yard catch by Payne Durham. Purdue led 24-21 with 1:11 left in the third quarter.

The Nittany Lions answered with a 29-yard touchdown reception by Lambert-Smith in the fourth quarter. After forcing a three-and-out, Penn State started the drive at their own 45 yard-line. Clifford hit Mitchell Tinsley for a 17-yard reception and Kaytron Allen for a nine-yard pass. Clifford connected with Lambert-Smith on a slant and the sophomore spun out of a tackle and took it to the end zone. Penn State held a 28-24 lead with 10:44 remaining. Purdue re-took the lead on a 72-yard pick-six by Chris Jefferson to hold a

31-28 advantage with 8:29 to go.

After a key third-down pass breakup by Hardy to force a Purdue punt, the Nittany Lions took over on their own 20 yard-line with 2:22 remaining. The drive began with an 8-yard completion to Tinsley and a 7-yard

reception by Lambert-Smith. Two plays later, Clifford connected with Tinsley towards the sideline for a 27-yard catch-and-run to the Purdue 30. On secondand-five at the Purdue 25, Clifford hit Tyler Warren for a 15-yard gain to the Purdue 10. On the next play, Clifford rolled out to his right and lofted a pass to Lee, who took it into the end-zone for the go-ahead score. Penn State took a 35-31 lead with 57 seconds remaining.

UNIVERSITY PARK, Pa. - The Penn State Football team defeated Ohio, 46-10, in its 2022 home opener at Beaver Stadium.

GAME 2 PENN STATE VS. OHIO

Freshman Nicholas Singleton had a breakout-performance with 10 carries for 179 yards, including 70 and 44-yard touchdowns and a 48-yard run. Singleton's first career touchdown was Penn State's longest run since Journey Brown's 85-yard run versus Pitt in 2019. His 179 yards are a school record for a Beaver Stadium debut.

Singleton became the first Nittany Lion with multiple 40+ yard touchdown runs in a game since Larry Johnson at Indiana on Nov. 16, 2002 (touchdown runs of 41, 43 and 69 yards). He is the first Nittany Lion with three 40+ yard runs in a game since Johnson's performance against Indiana (runs of 41, 41, 43 and 69).

Penn State produced 572 total yards, with 234 on the ground and 338 in the air. Sean Clifford was 19-for-27 passing for 213 yards and a touchdown along with a 1-yard touchdown run. Seventeen Nittany Lions registered at least one catch, led by Parker Washington with four for 60 yards

The Nittany Lions limited the Bobcats to just 264 yards, 16 first downs and just two plays over 20 yards. Tyler Elsdon had a team-high six tackles and Dominic DeLuca collected a team-high five solo tackles.

HOW IT HAPPENED

The Nittany Lions got on the board first as a 12-play, 77-yard drive finished with a 1-yard touchdown rush by Clifford. The redshirt senior completed all six passes attempted on the drive, tallying 62 yards. The drive included a 38-yard reception by Washington and a 15-yard grab by Tyler Warren. Clifford had a 15yard run to setup his touchdown rush. Penn State led 7-0 with 6:45 remaining in the first quarter.

Penn State needed just one play to score on its next drive as Singleton ran 70 yards for his first career touchdown, which doubled the Nittany Lions' lead with 2:28 left in the opening quarter.

Unable to score on a third-straight possession, Penn State responded with a safety on Ohio's first play of its drive. Pinned at the 1-yard line after a 45-yard punt by Barney Amor, the Bobcats botched a handoff in the endzone and were able to jump on the ball before a Nittany Lion defender could. Penn State added a field goal with 5:14 remaining in the second quarter

on Jake Pinegar's 25-yard kick.

Ohio got on the board in its final possession of the first half. The Bobcats turned in an eight-play, 75-yard drive capitalized by a one-yard rushing touchdown by Sieh Bangura.

Starting at its own 22-yard line with 1:29 left in the first half, Penn State effectively ran its two-minute offense for a 7-yard touchdown throw from Clifford to Mitchell Tinsley with 15 seconds left. Clifford made eight competitions for all 78 yards gained on the drive, including a 34-yard catch by Washington that preceded Tinsley's touchdown.

The Nittany Lions recorded the first score of the second half with a 32yard pass from Drew Allar to Omari Evans for both of their first collegiate touchdowns with 9:25 left in the third quarter. Starting from their 30-yard line, the five-play drive took only two minutes and eight seconds, which was aided by a 7-yard catch by Washington and 15-yard roughing the passer penalty added to it.

Singleton's second touchdown, of 44 yards, made it 40-7 with 4:33 left in the third quarter. All three plays in the 52-yard drive were Singleton rushes. Penn State's final touchdown was Allar's second touchdown, a 28-yard

pass to Khalil Dinkins for his first career touchdown, a minute and 16 seconds into the fourth quarter. The Nittany Lions orchestrated a 55-yard drive on nine plays, and the freshman quarterback accounted for all but one yard with four rushes for 17 yards and three completions for 37 yards.

Ohio notched a 21-yard field goal to complete a 15-play, 76-yard drive with 6:50 left in the game

GAME RECAP

AUBURN, Ala. – The No. 22/23 Penn State football team exploded in the second half to earn a 41-12 win over Auburn on Saturday in Jordan-Hare Stadium. The Nittany Lions scored 17 unanswered points in the third quarter and outscored the Tigers, 27-6, in the second half.

A balanced Penn State offense earned 477 total yards, including 245 on the ground and 232 through the air. Freshman Nicholas Singleton went over the 100-yard rushing mark for the second-straight game, tallying 124 yards and two touchdowns on 10 carries. Singleton had a 54-yard touchdown run and another 53-yard run. Fellow freshman Kaytron Allen added 52 yards and two touchdowns on the ground. Sean Clifford completed 14-of-19 passes for 178 yards and had a 7-yard touchdown run to go with a 25-yard reception.

The Penn State defense forced four takeaways, including two fumbles and two interceptions. The Nittany Lions recorded 11 tackles for loss and six sacks. Abdul Carter led Penn State with six tackles, including a sack, and a forced fumble. Ji'Ayir Brown added five tackles, a sack, a forced fumble and an interception. Adisa Isaac tallied three tackles for loss and a sack, while Chop Robinson registered a sack, a forced fumble and a fumble recovery. Zakee Wheatley made his first career interception.

Auburn threw for 296 yards. IJ Finley passed for 152 yards, while Robby Ashford had 144 yards and a touchdown. Jarquez Hunter had a 22-yard touchdown reception. Owen Pappoe led the Tigers with six tackles and a forced fumble.

HOW IT HAPPENED

Auburn got on the board with a 31-yard field goal by Anders Carlson. The Tigers led 3-0 with 8:20 to go in the opening quarter.

The Nittany Lions responded with a 9-play, 75-yard drive that ended with a 7-yard touchdown rush by Clifford. Allen had a 16-yard carry, while Mitchell Tinsley came up with two key catches on the drive, including a 34yard reception, to setup the Nittany Lions at the 7-yard line. Penn State led 7-3 with 4:21 remaining in the first quarter.

Wheatley came up with a key interception to end a potential Auburn scoring drive in the first quarter. On 3rd-and-6 at the Penn State 28-yard line, Finley was flushed out of the pocket and fired a throw that was caught by a diving Wheatley.

Auburn cut its deficit to one with a field goal in the second quarter. A 12play, 67-yard drive ended with a 22-yard kick by Carlson. The Nittany Lions held a 7-6 advantage with 6:59 left in the second quarter.

The Nittany Lions extended their lead on a 3-yard touchdown rush by Allen in the second quarter. The drive was highlighted by a 25-yard pass from KeAndre Lambert-Smith to Clifford to setup Penn State inside the Auburn 10. Penn State led 14-6 with 1:46 remaining in the first half.

Another key takeaway led to a Penn State field goal in the third quarter. After a strip-sack by Brown, and a fumble recovery by Robinson, Penn State took over at the Auburn 30-yard line. Jake Pinegar converted a 48-yard kick.

Penn State took advantage of an interception by Brown to add another score late in the third quarter. A 27-yard return by Brown, and an Auburn penalty, set up Penn State at the Auburn 48-yard line. Parker Washington hauled in 26- and 17-yard passes from Clifford to setup a 6-yard touchdown run by Allen.

Auburn responded with a 22-yard touchdown reception by Hunter, from Ashford, to finish a 6-play, 65-yard drive. Auburn's two-point conversion attempt was no good.

Penn State answered with a 54-yard touchdown run by Singleton. The Nittany Lions tallied the final score of the day, a 22-yard field goal by Pinegar.

GAME 4 PENN STATE VS. CENTRAL MICHIGAN

The Nittany Lions notched 166 rushing yards, averaging 5.2 yards per carry on the ground. Nicholas Singleton collected 46 yards on 12 attempts, and Sean Clifford had 23 yards and a touchdown on five carries.

Clifford went 22-of-34 passing for 217 yards and three touchdowns. Parker Washington caught a team-high six catches for 64 yards and Brenton Strange had five receptions for 42 yards and two touchdowns.

The Nittany Lions had a 4-0 turnover advantage, producing two interceptions and two fumbles. PJ Mustipher had a team-high six tackles, and Dani Dennis-Sutton picked up a game-high two sacks. Kalen King broke up a game-high four passes along with a forced fumble and fumble recovery. Johnny Dixon and Zakee Wheatley each recorded an interception.

The Chippewas' quarterback Daniel Richardson went 26-45 for 235 yards, two touchdowns and two interceptions. Carlos Carriere collected a game-high 111 receiving yards on 11 catches. Lew Nichols III rushed for 68 yards on 13 carries.

HOW IT HAPPENED

The Nittany Lions produced the game's first score on a Mitchell Tinsley 5-yard touchdown reception with 8:42 left in the first quarter. Forcing a threeand-out after the kickoff, Penn State went 59 yards on nine plays in 4:56 in their first possession. Clifford went three-for-three for 47 yards on the drive, including a 27-yard throw to Washington on the first play.

Penn State needed just three plays on its next drive for a second touchdown, a 4-vard reception from Strange with 6:38 remaining in the opening quarter. Zakee Wheatley put the ball on Central Michigan's 15-yard line after returning an interception 34 yards, which was aided by Ji'Ayir Brown hitting the quarterback on his throw.

Central Michigan got on the board with a 2-yard touchdown catch from Finn Hogan on fourth-and-goal with 12:39 left in the second quarter. The Chinnewas converted three third downs for first downs on the 11-play, 45yard drive.

The game was tied up with 6:25 remaining in the first half, as Richardson hit Joel Wilson for a 14-yard touchdown pass. After getting an incompletion on a Penn State fourth down at the Central Michigan 33-yard line, the Chippewas went all the way down the field on nine plays in 3:23. Richardson threw four completions for 56 yards, including a 20-yarder to Carriere to put Central Michigan in the redzone.

The Nittany Lions took back the lead with 1:58 remaining before halftime on a 14-yard rushing touchdown from Allen. He had three rushes for 33 yards in the five-play, 98-second drive. Washington gave Penn State excellent field position with a 14-yard punt return to Central Michigan's 34-yard line.

Penn State scored three minutes and five seconds into the second half on another short vardage touchdown catch from Strange, this time for 3 vards. The Chippewas gifted the Nittany Lions the ball in excellent field position, muffing a punt that Curtis Jacobs recovered at Central Michigan's seven-yard

Clifford ran in for a 1-yard touchdown, 17 seconds into the fourth quarter to make it 33-14. On the drive, Allen had a career-best 37-yard run to get the Nittany Lions into the red zone

The Nittany Lions tallied the final score of the day, a 22-yard field goal by Pinegar.

GAME RECAP

UNIVERSITY PARK, Pa. - No. 11/12 Penn State defeated Northwestern, 17-7, in its Big Ten home-opener on a soggy day in Beaver Stadium Saturday.

The Nittany Lions' defense set the tone in the victory with five three-and-outs on Northwestern's first five possessions, a feat which has not occurred against a Big Ten opponent since 2011. The unit recovered two fumbles, grabbed an interception and forced three fourth quarter turnover-on-downs, including a fourth-and goal stand at the 1-yard line with 11:51 left in regulation. Penn State was extremely successful in stopping the run, limiting the Wildcats to 31 yards on 28 carries. Penn State held Northwestern to zero or negative yards on 14 of 28 carries.

Penn State has forced 11 turnovers in the last three games, the most in any three-game stretch since forcing 13 in 1996 (five vs. Northwestern, five vs. Michigan, three vs. Michigan State).

PJ Mustipher had a team-high eight tackles, with four solo, including the one on Northwestern quarterback Ryan Hilinski on fourth down for the goal-line stand. Ji'Ayir Brown notched the interception and a team-high five solo tackles, including one for loss.

Nicholas Singleton rushed for 87 yards and a touchdown on 21 carries, while Kaytron Allen had 86 yards on 21 attempts. Sean Clifford was 10-of-20 for 140 passing yards and a touchdown. Wide receiver Parker Washington recorded team highs of four catches and 73 receiving yards. Tight end Brenton Strange had a 20-yard touchdown reception.

Hilinski went 15-of-37 for 210 passing yards and a touchdown to pace the Wildcats. Jacob Gill had a 47-yard touchdown grab.

HOW IT HAPPENED

The Nittany Lions got on the board first with a 20-yard Brenton Strange touchdown reception with 15 seconds left in the first guarter. Penn State needed just four plays to cover 60 yards for the score. Keyvone Lee had two carries for 15 yards, and Washington notched a 13-yard reception. The drive began at the Penn State 40yard line after Brown's interception.

Penn State doubled its lead on a 2-yard rushing touchdown from Singleton with 5:02 remaining in the first half. Singleton led a grinding seven-play, 45-yard drive in 3:47. He had five carries for 22 yards and an 11-yard reception. Lee converted a fourth-and-one with a 7-yard carry.

Northwestern got on the board with 2:10 left in the third guarter, as Gill caught a 47-yard touchdown reception. Starting from its own 18-yard line, the Wildcats used nine plays to score in 3:13.

Penn State responded with a 38-yard field goal from Jake Pinegar 31 seconds into the fourth quarter on a seven-play, 54yard drive in 2:41. Clifford hit Washington on a 43-yard pass on the second play, the longest play of the game for the Nittany Lions. Allen followed with a 13-yard rush to put the team in field goal position.

GAME RECAP

ANN ARBOR, Mich. — The No. 10/10 Penn State football team dropped its first contest of the 2022 campaign by a score of 41-17 to No. 5/4 Michigan in Michigan Stadium on Saturday afternoon.

GAME 6 **PENN STATE VS. MICHIGAN**

The Nittany Lions' defense held the Michigan offense to field goals on three of its four trips inside the red zone in the first half. It also recorded one of two Penn State touchdowns on the day, when Curtis Jacobs picked off a tipped pass and took it all the way to the end zone for a score. However, the Wolverine rushing attack gained significant momentum in the second half, with two 60-plus-yard touchdown runs by Donovan Edwards and Blake Corum, respectively, inflating the Michigan lead.

Penn State did its best to keep pace with the Wolverines, however only one offensive touchdown and one field goal on 268 yards of offense proved not enough.

On the defensive side of the ball, the Nittany Lions were led by Ji'Ayir Brown's nine total tackles, all of which came in the first half. His performance was highlighted by an impressive one-arm tackle-for-loss inside the fiveyard line to keep Michigan out of the end zone in the first half. Coziah Izzard pitched in with Penn State's only sack of the day, as the Wolverine rushing attack diverted attention away from the guarterback.

Offensively, a few big plays resulted in scoring drives for the Nittany Lions, including a 62-yard run from Sean Clifford and a 48-yard reception for Harrison Wallace III, but Penn State struggled to push the ball downfield for the majority of the game.

HOW IT HAPPENED

On the first possession of the game, Michigan took the ball deep into Penn State territory before the Nittany Lion defense stymied the drive and forced the Wolverines to a 29-yard field goal. After a Penn State three-and-out, the Wolverines took over at their own

17 and strung together a 13-play, 77-yard drive that the Nittany Lions stopped in the red zone once again to force another field goal that put Michigan up 6-0 with 1:25 left in the first quarter.

In the Wolverines' first drive of the second quarter, Corum punched in a 1-yard touchdown to put his team up 13-0. The Nittany Lions broke through with 6:11 left in the second guarter as

Kaytron Allen burst through the line for a touchdown run on a fourth-andgoal play from inside the 1yard line. The drive was highlighted by a 62-yard scamper by Clifford.

With 4:27 left in the second quarter and the Wolverines driving down the field, Chop Robinson tipped a pass at the line of scrimmage that was picked off by Curtis Jacobs and returned 47 yards to the house for a Penn State score. The pick-six was Jacobs' first as a Nittany Lion and gave Penn State a 14-13 advantage, its first of the game. Penn State's red zone defense kept the Wolverines out of the end zone for

the third time in the game, as Michigan settled for a 23-yard field goal. The Nittany Lions entered the break down, 16-14. Clifford came out firing in the second half and led a nine-play scoring drive

that was highlighted by a 16-yard dot to Mitchell Tinsley and a 48-yard pass to Harrison Wallace III. Jake Pinegar converted a 27-yard field goal with 13:15 left in the third quarter to give the Nittany Lions a 17-16 lead.

The Wolverines answered right back, as Donovan Edwards exploded for a 67-yard rushing touchdown. Michigan converted its two-point conversion attempt as well, resulting in a 24-17 lead.

After a Sean Clifford pass fell incomplete on fourth down, Blake Corum sped through the middle for a 61-yard score to extend the Wolverines' lead to 31-17 with 7:20 remaining in the third quarter.

Michigan tacked on three more points on a 37-yard field goal with 11:00 to go in the fourth and added another touchdown with 5:03 to play on Donovan Edwards' second touchdown run of the day to go ahead, 41-17.
