### **TEAM NOTES**

#### L-E-O EQUATES TO W-I-N

Indiana head coach  ${f Tom~Allen}$  is closing in on 30 career wins as the frontman for the Hoosiers, a feat accomplished by six other IU head coaches in program history.

Over the first five seasons, Allen's 26 wins were tied for the most by a Hoosier head coach with the program's all-time winningest coach, **Bill Mallory**.

Allen is on pace to join some legendary names on IU's list, which includes College Football Hall of Famer *Alvin "Bo" McMillin* and legendary college football coach/personality *Lee Corso*.

#### O CAPTAIN! MY CAPTAIN!

When Walt Whitman penned his famous metaphoric poem he wasn't referring to fall football camp when he said "our fearful trip is done," but the five captains for Indiana are ready to win the sought after prize.

Tight end AJ Barner, linebacker Cam Jones, safety Devon Matthews, comerback Tiawan Mullen and quarterback Jack Tuttle each earned the honor from their teammates.

While four of them are first-time captains, Jones becomes just the third Indiana football student-athlete to serve as team captain three times, joining **Antwan Randle EI** (1999-2000-01) and **Emmett King** (1895-96-97)

#### **BIG DEBUTS**

A pair of newcomers wrote their names into the Indiana record books on Friday (Sept. 2) against Illinois, as quarterback **Connor Bazelak** and wide receiver **Cam Camper** each had record-setting debuts.

For Camper, his 156 yards receiving are the most by an Indiana pass catcher in a debut in program history. He caught 11 passes, six that went for a first down, with three coming on the game-winning drive late in the fourth quarter.

Bazelak threw for 330 yards and completed 28 passes with one touchdown. His 330 yards passing are the most in a debut since **Antwaan Randle EI** threw for 385 against Western Michigan on September 12, 1998.

### LEO, 3-0

**PURDUE** 

Indiana improved to 3-0 on the season with its second come-frombehind victory of the season versus Western Kentucky on Sept. 17. It is the 19th time in IU history that a team began a season 3-0 and the third time under head coach **Tom Allen**.

Allen started the 2020 season with a 4-0 mark and the 2018 season with a 3-0 record. Prior to Allen, IU had started just two seasons 3-0 or better since 2010.

#### CENTURY MARK DUO

Indiana has been know for some bruising running backs in the past, but in the season opener against Illinois it was the receivers that stole the show. Junior **Cam Camper** (156 yards) and graduate student **D.J. Against Illinois, all 13 transfer student-athletes saw time on the field, with Bazelak, Jackson and Shivers each earning starts in Week One. Add in junior college transfers Cam Camper and Louis Moore and IU played 15 transfer student-athletes in the season opener.

#### FRESH FACES ON THE FIELD

Season openers are always memorable for the newcomers that get to see the field and versus Illinois, Indiana had 21 student-athletes make their debuts for the Cream and Crimson.

In all 34 players have made their debuts. The 2022 season has featured eight true freshmen, 16 transfer student-athletes and 10 current Hoosiers make debuts.

Offensive lineman Kahlil Benson and tight end James Bomba each made their collegiate debuts against Illinois, while 10 more have appeared for the first time this season after spending at least one year on campus.

True freshmen wide receiver Omar Cooper Jr., defensive back Phillip Dunnam, defensive lineman Nick James, outside linebacker Dasan McCullough and defensive back Jamari Sharpe all debuted in the opener, while running back Javlin Lucas and offensive lineman Brav Lynch debuted in game two. Defensive back James Monds III debuted against Michigan.

Sixteen transfer student-athletes also made their Indiana debut: Connor Bazelak, Cam Camper, Jared Casey, Andison Coby, LeDarrius Cox, Parker Hanna, Josh Henderson, Myles Jackson, Bradley Jennings Jr., Brylan Lanier, Patrick Lucas Jr., Louis Moore, Alejandro Quintero, Shaun Shivers, Emery Simmons and JH Tevis.

### BACK HOME IN INDIANA

The Hoosiers historically hit the road early in the season. The 2022 season was a different story with the first three games of the season inside the confines of Memorial Stadium.

A win over Idaho marked just the 30th time (since 1897 - 126 years) that the program played consecutive games at home to start a season.

It was just the fifth time since 2000 that Indiana played back-to-back games to open a season in front of the home crowd. IU started the 2015 (2-0), 2013 (1-1), 2009 (2-0) and 2008 (2-0) seasons with consecutive home games, as well

Over the 30 seasons with two straight at home to open the year, IU has gone 2-0 on 18 occasions and posted a 1-0-1 record during the 1900 season.

An overtime win over Western Kentucky in Week Three was the 12th time in IU history the program played three straight games at home to start a season

Going 3-0, IU joined the 2015 and 1917 teams as the only teams to start a season with three straight wins at home.

### SCHOLARSHIP SURPRISES

The week leading up to the season opener is always filled with excitement and head coach **Tom Allen** added to that for three student-athletes.

Allen awarded tight ends Ryan Barnes and James Bomba and wide receiver Christian Harris scholarships during the week.

Bomba is the third generation of his family to earn a football scholarship for Indiana, His father, Matt. was a letterman from 1990-92). while both grandfathers, Brad (1954-56) and Bob Van Pelt (1964-66) were each IU football student-athletes.

Barnes has appeared in seven games over his four years on campus and Harris owns 14 career appearances and was the 2020 Chris Beaty Outstanding Walk-On Player of the Year for the program.

### FRIDAY NIGHT LIGHTS

Parents, students and fans all remember those Friday nights sitting in the stands at local high schools around the country. However, Tom Allen was once roaming the high school sidelines in the Indiana as a head coach.

For the second time in his tenure as IU's head coach, Allen walked the sidelines coaching a college game.

The game marked the fifth time in program history that IU played on a Friday night in the fall and its first since 2018. Four of the five Friday night games have been Big Ten contests.

The 1995 contest was a battle for the Old Oaken Bucket and was the only other Friday night game played in Memorial Stadium.

The regular season non-Saturday history with Illinois started on November 26, 1931 in Champaign. That game ended in a 0-0 tie, but the win was awarded to Indiana by virtue of an 8-4 edge in first downs.

The first non-Saturday contest in IU history was against border rival Kentucky on Thursday, November 30, 1893. The two teams played to a 24-24 tie in Lexington.

In all, Indiana holds a 9-3-1 mark in non-Saturday games in program history, with the last non-Saturday contest a setback to Ohio State (49-21) to open the 2017 season at Memorial Stadium on Thursday.

### STAFF UPDATE

Head coach Tom Allen has two new coordinators and a total of five new coaches on his staff in 2022.

The offensive is led by **Walt Bell** in his sixth season as a collegiate offensive coordinator, to go along with three seasons as the head coach at UMass

Bell is joined on the offensive staff by a pair of NFL veteran coaches in associate head coach Craig Johnson and co-offensive coordinator Adam Henry. Johnson coaches the running backs, while Henry works with the wide receivers.

Defensively, **Chad Wilt** joined the staff as the defensive coordinator and linebackers coach. The defensive line is led by Paul Randolph.

Of the 15 countable on-field coaches for IU, nine of them were new faces for the 2022 season: all four GAs, along with the five position coaches mentioned above.

### RHETT RETURNS TO B-TOWN

As Don Fischer spends his 50th year in the radio booth for the Hoosiers, former letterwinner Rhett Lewis is in his first season on the call for Indiana Football.

A wide receiver for the Hoosiers for three seasons, he saw action in 27 games during the 2002, 04-05 seasons.

Kleinschmidt, who began using his middle name of Lewis as his last name professionally in 2014, is the son of Dean Kleinschmidt, a 1970 IU graduate and head football trainer at IU from 2004-06.

Dean was a head trainer in the NFL for 41 seasons - with the New Orleans Saints (31 years), Washington Redskins (2), and Detroit Lions (8).

Lewis is currently a host across several NFL Network programs, including NFL Now, NFL Total Access, and Path to the Draft. He also hosts various SiriusXM shows, including regular appearances on SiriusXM Big

### TWO HOOSIERS ON COLLEGE FOOTBALL HALL OF FAME BALLOT

A pair of Indiana All-Americans in running back Vaughn Dunbar (1990-91) and quarterback Antwaan Randle El (1998-2001) are on the ballot for the College Football Hall of Fame in 2022.

Randle El earned All-Big Ten distinction in 1999, 2000 and 2001, and was named Big Ten Freshman of the Year in 1998. The Big Ten MVP, and first-team All-American in 2001, Randle El finished sixth in the Heisman Trophy balloting that season.

The Riverdale, Illinois, native was the first in NCAA history to score 40 career touchdowns (45) and throw 40 career touchdown passes (42). He was also the first to record over 2,500 total yards in four seasons, and the first to both pass for over 6,000 and rush for over 3,000 career yards.

Dunbar was a first-team All-B1G pick and unanimous first-team All-American in 1991 when he led the nation in rushing (1,805) and finished sixth in Heisman voting.

The Fort Wayne, Indian, native posted consecutive 1,000-yard

seasons and finished his career No. 3 on the career rushing charts at IU with 3,029 yards, a total that currently sits No. 7 all-time in program history. He led IU to a pair of bowl appearances and a win in the 1991 Copper Bowl as the game's offensive MVP.

Six Indiana football student-athletes are already among the less than one percent enshrined in the CFB Hall of Fame: Zora Clevenger (HB: 1900-03), Alvin "Bo" McMillin (Coach; 1934-47), Pete Pihos (End/ FB' 1942-43, 45-47), George Taliaferro (HB; 1945, 47-48), Anthony **Thompson** (RB; 1986-89) and **John Tavener** (1941-44)

### FISCHER 50TH SEASON FEATURES NFF AWARD, IU HALL OF FAME HONORS

In his 50th season with the Indiana football program, the legendary "Voice of the Hoosiers" Don Fischer was named the 2022 recipient of the National Football Foundation and College Hall of Fame's Chris Schenkel Award.

His iconic career also earned him an induction into the IU Hall of Fame Class of 2022.

The Schenkel Award recognizes individuals who have had long, distinguished careers broadcasting college football with direct ties to a specific university. Fischer will be honored during the 64th NFF Annual Awards Dinner Presented by Las Vegas on Dec. 6.
Fischer is the second longest tenured radio play-by-play announcer in

college football, tied with Tommy Suggs of Clemson.

- Indiana's quarterback room has a pair of experienced quarterbacks that offensive coordinator and position coach Walt Bell can look to during 2022 in Connor Bazelak and Jack Tuttle
- Bazelak began his career at Missouri, where he was the 2020 SEC Co-Freshman of the Year after throwing for 2,366 yards and seven touchdowns in eight starts (10 games played).
- The Dayton, Ohio, native followed that up with 2,548 yards passing and 16 touchdowns in 11 starts in 2021.
- The four-star recruit out of Archbishop Alter finished his twoyear stay in Columbia, as just the ninth Tiger quarterback to pass for at least 5,000 yards in a career.
- At IU, Bazelak has engineered two game-winning or gametying drives in the fourth quarter to go along with four multi-TD pass games.
- Against Illinois in the season opener, he became the first IU quarterback to pass for 300 yards in a debut since **Antwaan Randle EI** (385) against Western Michigan on Sept. 12, 1998.
- A fourth-quarter touchdown drive and two-point conversion against Western Kentucky came with under four minutes left in the fourth quarter and **Charles Campbell** won it for IU with a 51-vard field goal in overtime.
- With a 31-for-66 outing at Cincinnati, Bazelak set a program single-game record for passing attempts. His 66 throws were one more than **Richard Lagow**'s 65 tosses against Ohio State in the 2017 season opener.
- Bazelak's 33 completions against Western Kentucky are tied for No. 8 on the single-game list at Indiana. His career high for completions is 34 versus Kentucky in 2021 at Missouri.
- Through eight games, Bazelak is among the IU single season leaders in multiple categories, closing in on the top 10 in program history in multiple categories.

- Jack Tuttle stepped into a starting role in both the 2020 and 2021 seasons after injuries and has appeared in 14 games with four starts in his Hoosier career.
- Stepping in for the final three games of the 2020 season, Tuttle went 44-of-72 (61.1 percent) for 362 yards with two touchdowns and one interception and led the Hoosiers to a pair of victories and a berth in the Outback Bowl.
- In his first career start, he guided IU to a 14-6 win at No. 16 Wisconsin, the program's first win in Madison since 2001. Tuttle completed 13-of-22 for 130 yards with two touchdowns and zero interceptions.
- The redshirt senior graduated with a supply chain management degree in May 2021 and is a two-time Academic All-Big Ten honoree and 2021 semifinalist for the William V. Campbell Trophy.
- Tuttle transferred from the University of Utah in 2018, practiced with the team, and was ruled eligible for the 2019 campaign in the spring. He did not see action at Utah.
- A graduate of Mission Hills High School in San Marcos, California, Tuttle was a Rivals and 247Sports four-star prospect, and the No. 4 and 5 pro-style quarterback per the publications, respectively. He was also rated the No. 13 player in California by 247Sports.
- Tuttle's father, Jay, was a walk-on kicker at IU (1986-88).
- Also in the quarterbacks room, **Grant Gremel**, who started the 2021 season finale at Purdue and was the first walk-on quarterback to start a game for IU since 1995.
- Redshirt sophomore **Dexter Williams II** is also among the quarterback stable, as he redshirted his first season on campus, before an ACL injury ended his 2021 season during spring practice.
- Williams was among the top dual-threat quarterbacks in the country as a senior at Mount de Sales Academy in Georgia.
   24/7Sports rated him the No. 13 dual-threat quarterback nationally.
- The newcomer to the room is freshman **Brendan Sorsby** of Lake Dallas High School in Corinth, Texas. He threw for 1,271 yards in seven games during an injury-shortened senior season.
- Sorsby was the No. 13 rated pocket passer nationally per ESPN after he threw for 14 touchdowns in 2021.

- Associate head coach and 38-year coaching veteran Craig Johnson is in his first season with the Cream and Crimson and his 21st in collegiate football.
- Johnson returns to the college sidelines in a coaching capacity for the first time since 1999, as he spent the 20 seasons in the NFL between 1999 and 2019.
- A quarterback during his time at the University of Wyoming, Johnson has tutored five NFL All-Pro selections, including running backs Saguon Barkley and Chris Johnson.
- The most experienced back in the room is Auburn transfer Shaun Shivers. His 50 games played are the second most college football games played on the IU roster (52, Fitzgerald).
- In four seasons at Auburn, Shivers compiled 1,464 all-purpose yards as a runner, receiver and kick returner. He rushed for 1,020 yards and eight touchdowns in his career.
- In his second appearance for the Cream and Crimson, Shivers rushed for a career-high 155 yards on a career-best 20 carries.
- He scored a rushing touchdown in the first two games of the season, which marked the third time in his career (2019, Samford & Alabama; 2018, Alabama State & LSU) he found the end zone on the ground in back-to-back games.
- Shivers caught a 2-yard touchdown pass then bounced outside for a 47-yard touchdown run at Cincinnati. He is first Hoosier running back with a rushing and receiving score in the same game since Stevie Scott against Northwestern (11/2/19).
- Against the Bearcats in the fourth game of the season, Shaun Shivers and Josh Henderson each caught touchdown passes to mark the first time since 2001. Henderson caught a 19-yard touchdown pass in the second quarter and Shivers grabbed a 2-yard scoring pass in the third quarter.

In 2001, **Jeremi Johnson** and **Levron Williams** each caught scoring passes versus Northwestern in a 56-21 victory at Memorial Stadium. **Antwaan Randle El** threw both touchdown passes, 27 yards to Williams and 10 yards to Johnson in the first quarter.

- `• Josh Henderson joined the program after appearing in 23 games during three seasons at North Carolina.
- Henderson scored rushing touchdowns in back-to-back games for the first time in his career with scores against Idaho and Western Kentucky. The score against Idaho was his first collegiate touchdown.
- The Pennington, New Jersey, native ranks tied for No. 8 in the Big Ten in scoring (30 points) and has scored at least one touchdown in five of the last six games.
- True freshman **Jaylin Lucas** enrolled and participated in spring practice and has worked his way into the running backs rotation as the season progresses.
- Lucas has seen time as a running back and kickoff return specialist, logging 477 all-purpose yards (123 rushing, 76 receiving, 278 kick return).
- His 30.9 yards per kickoff return currently lead the FBS and he is one of three true freshmen to return a kickoff for a touchdown in 2022
- With his kickoff return touchdown on the opening kickoff at Rutgers, Lucas became the first Hoosier to return a kickoff for a score since *Tevin Coleman* in 2012 (at Northwestern) and the first to return the opening kickoff since *Ray Fisher* in 2009 (at Akron).
- With 124 return yards at Rutgers, Lucas led the FBS in kickoff return yardage during Week 8 and his 190 all-purpose yards paced all Big Ten student-athletes for the week.
- Lucas was rated as the No. 12 all-purpose back in the class of 2022 by Rivals and earned first-team All-Louisiana during his senior season at Edna Carr High School in New Orleans. He played his first three prep seasons at Terrebonne High School prior to Hurricane Ida.
- On the track, Lucas finished No. 6 at the LHSAA state track and field championships as a senior.
- Five of the last six featured running backs have reached the NFL **Stevie Scott III** (New Orleans, Denver), **Devine Redding** (Kansas City, Tampa Bay), **Jordan Howard** (Philadelphia, Miami, Chicago), **Tevin Coleman** (New York Jets, San Francisco, Atlanta), and **Stephen Houston** (New England, Pittsburgh, Baltimore).

- First-year co-offensive coordinator and wide receivers coach **Adam Henry** returns to college coaching after spending the last seven years working with some of the best NFL wideouts.
- His previous two collegiate coaching stops both came in the state of Louisiana, as he spent 10 years at McNeese State and three at LSU.
- His time at LSU produced three NFL Draft picks from the wide receiver spot from just the 2014 draft class. Jarvis Landry, Odell Beckham Jr. and James Wright were all taken in the 2014 draft.
- **D.J. Matthews Jr.** is in his second year with the program after being a graduate transfer (Florida State) during the 2021 season, but his 2021 season was cut short by a knee injury in the fourth game of the season at Western Kentucky.
- Matthews Jr. posted his third career 100-yard receiving game second as a Hoosier with 109 yards on seven catches in the 2022 opener versus Illinois. His total included a 52-yard touchdown grab in the second quarter.
- In four 2021 games, Matthews Jr. caught 13 passes for 165 yards and returned four punts for 83 yards and one touchdown. He took a punt 81 yards for a score against Idaho in week two.
- In 35 games (16 starts) at FSU, Matthews had 84 receptions for 809 yards and five touchdowns to go along with one punt return TD.
- The Jacksonville, Florida, native finished his FSU career No. 10 on the program's career punt return yards (582) and returns (56). He also holds two of the top-4 single-game marks.
- Matthews did not play in 2020 while finishing his interdisciplinary social science degree.
- Emery Simmons joined the program after being recruited by IU out of high school, but spent three seasons at North Carolina before heading to Bloomington.
- Simmons has a reception in each of his eight games at IU, including three straight games with 6-or-more receptions in Weeks 5-7: at Nebraska (6 for 57 yards), against Michigan (7 for 57 yards) and versus Maryland (6 for 99 yards).

- Cam Camper is a self-proclaimed late bloomer and spent two seasons at Trinity Valley C.C. before he joined the Hoosiers, and has already left his mark on the program.
- Through four games, Camper had logged a pair of double-digit catch games and owned the most receptions for an IU wideout over the first four games of a season this century (33).
- Camper's two double-digit reception games are one shy of the program record for a single season, as he is just the eighth wideout (10th occurrence) in IU history with multiple games of 10-plus catches.

- With his 156 yards receiving, Camper totaled the highest yardage total in an Indiana debut in program history. He then caught his first collegiate touchdown pass to set up the gametying two-point conversion versus Western Kentucky in the fourth quarter of the overtime win.
- Camper was a football walk-on at Sam Houston State for one season before he spent two years at Trinity Valley C.C. in Texas where he caught 50 passes for 858 yards and four touchdowns.
- From his senior year of high school to this season, Camper grew five inches and gained 40 pounds thanks to a late growth spurt.
- One of the most followed storyline during fall camp was the move of sophomore **Donaven McCulley** from quarterback to wide receiver after one season on campus.
- After staring four games at quarterback in 2021, McCulley made the move to wide receiver during spring practice.
- Thus far in 2022, McCulley has 12 catches for 112 yards and caught a two-point conversion against Western Kentucky.

- In his third season coaching the tight ends, **Kevin Wright** entered with the most inexperienced group on the roster (44 career games played).
- The most experience in the room comes in the form of 6-foot-6 former high school linebacker AJ Barner and his 25 games played.
- Barner started the first five games before missing the contest against Michigan and Maryland due to injury. He returned at Rutgers and caught five passes for 11 yards in a start.
- He currently has a streak of 10 straight games with a reception dating back to Week 9 of the 2021 season. Eight of those games have featured multiple catches.
- His career ledger includes 32 receptions for 294 yards (9.2 ypr), with both career touchdowns coming against Idaho (76 yards, 2021; 43 yards, 2022).
- With a blocked punt during the 2021 season versus Idaho, Barner is a part of the special teams unit that has at least one blocked kick in each of special teams coordinator Kasey Teegardin's seasons in charge of the unit.
- $\bullet$  Barner was his conference defensive player of the year as a senior in high school.

- Behind Barner are a pair of redshirt freshmen in **James Bomba** and **Aaron Steinfeldt**, while true freshmen **Brody Foley** and **Ryan Miller** enter as heralded recruits.
- Bomba is an Indiana legacy, as his father, *Matt Bomba* (1990-92), and grandfathers, *Brad Bomba* (1954-56) and *Bob Van Pelt* (1964-66), all lettered in football at IU. His mother, Kelly, is an executive associate athletic director for the Hoosiers.
- Bomba and Steinfeldt each made their first career catches versus Western Kentucky in Week 3.
- Bomba went to Bloomington South High School and was a two-time all-state pick who joined the team as a walk-on in 2021 and earned a scholarship in 2022.
- Steinfeldt is a Bloomington North product and earned all-state honors twice as a prep standout. He was the Indiana Football Coaches Association Mr. Football positional winner as a senior.
- The 6-foot-5, 245-pounder made his first career start against Michigan on Homecoming and followed that up with his first career touchdown catch versus Maryland.
- A three-sport all-conference performer that also earned honorable mention all-state honors in basketball.
- He appeared in one game during his true freshman season, the series finale at Purdue.

- A three-year starter at center, **Rod Carey** returned to Bloomington as a quality control coach in 2022 and moved into the role of run game coordinator/offensive line coach after Week 6.
- Carey spent 10 seasons as an FBS head coach with seven years at Northern Illinois and three at Temple. His time at NIU featured a trip to the 2013 Orange Bowl.
- Senior **Matthew Bedford** planted roots on the Indiana offensive line upon his arrival in Bloomington and started 28 of 29 career games played for the Cream and Crimson.
- Bedford started the 2022 season opener, but will miss the remainder of the season due to injury. Graduate transfer **Parker** Hanna - a four-year starter at West Texas A&M - started the next six games at right tackle.
- IU's 2019 Offensive Newcomer of the Year, Bedford has made nine starts at right tackle, eight starts each at right guard and left tackle, and three starts at left guard.
- An honorable-mention All-Big Ten pick as a junior, Bedford saw 475 snaps in pass protection during the 2021 season and allowed just 20 total pressures for a 97.6% pass blocking efficiency rating from *Pro Football Focus*.
- Luke Haggard (6-7, 305) gained 30 pounds in the 2021 offseason after he started all six games he appeared in at left tackle in his FBS debut in 2021.
- Haggard was rated as the No. 9 NFL Draft offensive tackle prospect by *Pro Football Focus* during the 2022 offseason.
- Redshirt sophomore Mike Katic (6-4, 312) was named IU's 2020 Offensive Newcomer of the Year after starting four games at left guard with six appearances overall during his redshirt freshman season.

- After earning a starting spot in 2020, Katic has started 21 of his 23 career appearances. Of his 21 starts, 17 have come at right guard and four at center. He made his first career start at center at Nebraska (Oct. 1).
- Katic appeared in six games as a redshirt freshman, nine games in 2021 missing three due to injury and has started every game of the 2022 campaign.
- Per Pro Football Focus, Haggard and Katic have played the most snaps in the Big Ten by any offensive linemen at 636 snaps, which is tied for No. 4 in the FBS among offensive linemen and No. 5 in the FBS overall.
- **Zach Carpenter** (6-5, 320) joined the program as a transfer from the University of Michigan and has appeared in 11 games with nine starts during his IU career.
- He started the first two games of 2022 at center, injured his hand prior to the Western Kentucky game and returned at left guard at Nebraska and has started four straight at that spot on the line.
- Redshirt freshman and top-55 national prospect our of Brownsburg (Ind.) High School, **Joshua Sales Jr.** earned his first career start at right tackle at Rutgers. Sales Jr. has appeared in eight career games with one start, including seven games and one start in 2022.
- An ACL injury in fall camp in 2020 was followed by a redshirt season in 2021, but **Kahlil Benson** has appeared in all eight games on the offensive line this season and earned his first career start at Rutgers at right guard. He was the No. 38 offensive guard nationally by ESPN out of Southaven (Miss.) High School.
- The NFL features four former Hoosiers in *Dan Feeney* (6th season; New York Jets), *Caleb Jones* (1st season; Green Bay),
   Wes Martin (4th season; Washington) and *Rodger Saffold* (13th season; Buffalo).

- Special teams coordinator **Kasey Teegardin** is in his third season and has helped turn the unit into one of the more consistent in the Big Ten.
- Teegardin's units have blocked at least one kick in each of his three seasons as the corps leader. The ledger includes eight blocked kicks: three field goals, four punts and one extra point.
- Two of those blocks have come during the 2022 season, both field goals. The Hoosiers got a hand on an overtime kick versus Western Kentucky (Jaylin Williams) and Michigan (James Head Jr.).
- The kickoff return unit paved the way for the first return for a touchdown since *Tevin Coleman* in 2012, as **Jaylin Lucas** raced 93 yards on the opening kickoff for a score at Rutgers.
- Place kicker **Charles Campbell** continues his move up the kicking record books in 2022. He sits No. 8 on the career field goals made charts at 36 successful tries.
- His 175 career points are No. 14 all-time at Indiana, just five points away from **Jade Butler** (180; 1967-69).
- In 2022, Campbell ranks No. 2 in the Big Ten in field goals made per game (1.50), No. 5 in field goal percentage (.800), No. 10 in total points (54).
- Campbell owns five career games two in 2022 with at least three made field goals. Those games include Western Kentucky (4-for-4, 2022), Illinois (3-for-3, 2022), Michigan State (3-for-4; 2021), at Western Kentucky (4-for-4; 2021) and at Rutgers (3-for-3; 2020).
- His 13-point effort versus WKU marked his fourth career double-digit point game: Western Kentucky (13; 2022), Illinois (11, 2022), at Western Kentucky (15; 2021) and at Rutgers (13; 2020).
- He was Phil Steele's first-team All-Big Ten kicker in 2020 after he won the starting role during camp and connected on 10-of-11 field goals (90.9 percent) and all 25 extra points.
- The Jackson, Tennessee, native led the conference in field goal percentage (No. 9 nationally), finished third in field goals made and scoring per game among kickers (6.9), and tied for sixth in scoring per game among all players.

- Campbell made all three of his attempts from 50-plus yards in 2020 to become the second Hoosier to record three 50-yarders in one season (*Pete Stoyanovich*, 1988).
- The redshirt senior is No. 2 in IU history with four 50-yarder field goals in his career (Stoyanovich, 6). His makes came against Western Kentucky (2022), at Maryland (2021) and vs. Ole Miss (2; 2020).
- His 53-yarder versus Ole Miss in the Outback Bowl set an Indiana and Outback Bowl record and shares No. 3 in school history. His 55-yard make at Maryland is tied for No. 2 in program history.
- Campbell is a three-time Groza Star of the Week: a three field goal performance versus Rutgers (2020) and a program-record-tying four made field goals against Western Kentucky in 2021 and 2022.
- Campbell was a U.S. Army All-American and kicked in the 2018 U.S. Army All-American Bowl out of University School of Jackson.
- Sophomore **James Evans** took over the reins at punter in 2021 after he enrolled in 2021 spring classes and participated in practice after committing to Indiana sight unseen in person.
- In 2022, Evans ranks No. 3 in the B1G and No. 19 nationally in punting average at 44.5 yards per punt. The IU record for a season is 44.8 ypp by **Drew Hagan** in 1999.
- He trained under Nathan Chapman and John Smith at Prokick Australia and hadn't played a down of American football or visited the United States prior to his arrival in Bloomington.
- Sean Wracher earned third-team All-Big Ten honors from Phil Steele in each of his three seasons on campus and is a Patrick Mannelly Award watch list member entering 2022.
- He has started all 41 games since stepping foot on campus and has snapped for all-league kickers Justus (2019) and Campbell (2020), and a Ray Guy Award semifinalist in Whitehead (2020).
- The Akron, Ohio, native was a Kohl'sKicking.com five-star prospect and ranked the No. 1 long snapper nationally by Kornblue Kicking.

- There is no drop off at linebacker due to the departure of **Micah McFadden** to the NFL, as **Cam Jones** is back for his final collegiate season as the anchor of the IU defense.
- Jones piled up 55 tackles over the first five games, the most by an IU defender since at least 2005. He missed Weeks 6-8 due to injury and is projected out several weeks.
- Jones started off 2022 with his first career double-digit tackle effort, as he racked up 12 tackles six solo and added a first-quarter sack and fumble recovery versus Illinois.
- He racked up 13 tackles against Western Kentucky seven solo with 1.0 tackle for loss. He forced a fourth-quarter fumble that **Myles Jackson** recovered and led to an IU field goal.
- At Cincinnati and Nebraska, Jones piled up 11 stops each to lead the team.
- An honorable-mention All-Big Ten pick in 2020, a threetime team captain, and Academic All-Big Ten selection, Jones started his career at the husky position, but has appeared in 36 games at linebacker since moving in 2019.
- He made his first career start in the 2020 opener and win over No. 8 Penn State, where he made a then-career-best seven stops, one for loss, and matched a then-career-high with six solos.
- In 2021, Jones nearly doubled his career high in single season tackles with 64 after back-to-back 35-stops seasons in 2019 and 2020.
- Jones' 10 career takeaways are tied for the most among IU defenders with **Tiawan Mullen**. His takeaway ledger includes five forced fumbles, three fumble recoveries and two intercentions

- Aaron Casey dons the iconic No. 44 this season in honor of IU legend *George Taliaferro*, who was the first African American drafted by an NFL team.
- With his public financial management degree already complete, Casey earned the second starting linebacker spot and has started all eight games this season.
- In the first three games of 2022, Casey surpassed his career tackles for loss total entering the season (5.5) with 6.0.
- His first double-digit tackle game at Cincinnati (10 tackles) pushed his season total to 31 stops. That four-game total in 2022 surpassed his single-season career high of 25 in 2021.
- In Week 6, Casey stepped into the middle linebacker spot vacated by the injury to Jones. In three starts calling the defense, he has piled up 28 tackles, 2.0 tackles for loss, 1.0 sack and forced his first two fumbles both against Maryland.
- Casey currently ranks No. 3 in the Big Ten in solo tackles (42) and is No. 7 in total tackles (66) after Week 9. His total is bolstered by the first three career double-digit tackles games in 2022, inducing back-to-back games against Maryland (10) and at Rutgers (11).
- Transfers **Jared Casey** and **Bradley Jennings Jr.** add depth to an otherwise young corps.
- Casey played three seasons at Kentucky before arriving in Bloomington, where he appeared in 27 games with 30 tackles.
- Jennings Jr. is in his fifth season of college football with 43 games played and 115 tackles in a career that began at the University of Miami.
- In his first start for the Cream and Crimson, Jennings Jr. piled up his first double-digit tackle game against Michigan with 13 stops six solo.
- With three straight starts since the injury to Cam Jones, Jennings has 29 tackles, 2.0 tackles for loss and four pass breakups. That span also included his first two career doubledigit tackle games.

- While the defense returns the most experience on the team, the defensive line brought back 115 career games played at Indiana and 172 collegiate appearances entering the year.
- Along with three-year letterwinner and 2019 honorable mention All-Big Ten pick **Demarcus Elliott, Sio Nofoagatoto'a** (three letters) and **James Head Jr.** (four letters) have played their fair share of football.
- Elliott has started 38 of the 41 games in which he has appeared since his arrival in Bloomington from Garden City (Kan.) Community College in 2019, the most starts on the team.
- With his media degree in hand, Head Jr. has appeared in 45 games with 24 starts.
- Limited to just seven games due to injury in 2021, Head has produced 58 tackles in his 39 appearances with 10.0 tackles for loss in his career.
- The Miami, Florida, native produced a sterling career at Southridge High School, where he finished with 250 stops, 47 for loss and 45 sacks.
- Nofoagatoto'a was born in New Zealand and lived there until 2008, when he moved to American Samoa. He relocated to Australia in 2015, before attending his final two years of high school at Clearwater (Fla.) Academy International.
- He is the first Hoosier from American Samoa since offensive lineman *Pita Elisara* (1998-99).

- Even some of the new faces on the line entered the 2022 season with extensive experience in the college game, with transfer student-athletes **LeDarrius Cox** (Ole Miss), **Patrick Lucas Jr.** (Ole Miss) and **JH Tevis** (Cal) all appearing in double-digit games prior to arriving on campus.
- Tevis had the most experience with 21 career games at Cal, where he earned honorable-mention All-Pac-12 once during his three seasons
- His 2021 season featured 37 tackles, 5.5 for loss and one sack on his way to earning postseason honors from the Pac-12.
- Cox and Lucas Jr. appeared in 13 and 11 games, respectively, during their two seasons on the defensive line together at Ole Miss
- The true freshman trio of **Nick James**, **J'Mari Monette** and **Venson Sneed Jr**. are among those that impressed during fall camp
- Two of those three (James and Sneed) enrolled early and participated in spring classes and practice.
- James was among the top recruits nationally with a No. 229 ranking nationally per ESPN out of IMG Academy. A native of Alabama, he spent his first two prep seasons at Prattville High School.
- Monette was a part of the Louisiana High School Athletic Association 5A state runner up squad Alexandria High School.
- Sneed is another four-star prospect that was among the top-30 defensive end prospects, while he also participated in basketball and weight lifting at Winter Park (Fla.) High School.

- The cornerbacks room features **Tiawan Mullen** (1st team) and **Jaylin Williams** (2nd team), the first cornerback duo in Indiana history to earn All-Big Ten honors in the same season during the 2020 campaign.
- Mullen, who allowed just 14 completions in 2020, earned first-team All-America accolades from the Football Writers Association of America, the first cornerback in school history to collect first-team recognition and just the second (Tim Wilbur, 2nd team in 1980) to achieve All-America status.
- The Fort Lauderdale, Florida, native was the program's first cornerback to secure first-team all-conference honors since Tracy Porter in 2007.
- For the third straight season, Mullen finds himself on the preseason watch list for the Bednarik Award, as he tied for No. 1 on the team with 10 career takeaways (4 interceptions, 4 forced fumbles, and 2 fumble recoveries), with **Cam Jones**.
- In the 2020 victory at Michigan State, Mullen recorded the first two interceptions of his career to mark the first multi-pick game at IU since *Jonathan Crawford* vs. Purdue in 2016.
- Along with his 2020 All-America honors, Mullen was a Freshman All-American (247Sports, The Athletic) and honorable-mention All-Big Ten in 2019.
- His older brother, Trayvon, played cornerback at Clemson University (2016-18) and is a member of the Arizona Cardinals, and his cousin (mother's side), Lamar Jackson, played at Louisville (2015-17) and is the Baltimore Ravens quarterback.
- **Trevell Mullen** joins his older brother on the Indiana roster this season after a standout prep career that earned him a top-200 national ranking from ESPN and Rivals while at Coconut Creek High School in Fort Lauderdale, Florida.

- Williams, a senior out of Memphis, is the team's active leader in interceptions (6) and ranks No. 3 on the team in career games played (50).
- His seven career takeaways are tied for No. 3 on the team with **Bryant Fitzgerald**, and behind Jones (10) and Mullen (10). His 134 career stops are No. 4 on the team, as well.
- He opened 2020 with interceptions in three-consecutive games and finished with four overall, which tied for the team lead, ranked third in the Big Ten, and shared eighth nationally.
- After missing the final 10 games of the 2021 season due to injury, redshirt sophomore **Christopher Keys** has moved his way up the depth chart in 2022 and earned his first career start versus Michigan.
- The No. 15 prospect in Mississippi and No. 46 cornerback nationally by 247Sports, Keys has piled up 14 tackles and one pass breakup in seven appearances two starts in 2022.
- Redshirt sophomore **Lem Watley-Neely** and Alabama transfer **Brylan Lanier** add depth to a position that was ravaged with injury in 2021.
- Watley-Neely has nine appearances under his belt in his third season on campus. An all-state pick from Harper Woods (Mich.) High School, he played nine different positions in his senior season and hauled in three interceptions.
- It doesn't get more Alabama than Lanier, who attended Paul W. Bryant High School in Tuscaloosa and then walked on for the Crimson Tide in 2021. He received his redshirt season prior to transferring to Indiana.

- Big Ten football is nothing new for **Justin Jones**' group in 2022, as the room returns seven letterwinners on the back end.
- A 2020 third-team All-Big Ten selection, **Devon "Monster" Matthews** handles strong safety duties for the fourth straight season. His 48 career games played are tied for No. 5 on the team (**Alfred Bryant**).
- In nine games last season, Matthews racked up 54 tackles, 4.0 tackles for loss and hauled in one interception. He also missed three games due to injury.
- His 194 tackles rank No. 2 on the current team, behind **Cam Jones**' 209 stops.
- Versus Michigan, Matthews came up with this fourth career interception three coming against the Wolverines. He picked off a UM quarterback in 2022, 2021 and 2020, while grabbing a 2018 interception versus Ohio State.
- A Jacksonville, Florida, native, Matthews earned the nickname "Monster" as an 8-year old defensive end when he knocked a quarterback's helmet off on a sack.
- **Noah Pierre** was one of the unsung heroes on the back end of the 2021 defense with six starts in 12 appearances in a multitude of spots on the defense and moved to Husky in 2022.
- The versatile Pierre owns 3.0 sacks this season to rank tied for No. 17 in the Big Ten.
- Pierre came up with one of the bigger defensive plays against Western Kentucky in 2022 with a solo sack and forced fumble to force a third-and-long in overtime prior to the blocked field goal.
- His 35 tackles in 2021 were 7x his career total (7 in 19 games) and he added his first career interception against Michigan State (10/16/21) in his first career start.
- **Josh Sanguinetti** missed four games due to injury in 2021, but was productive on the back end in his eight appearances two starts with 17 stops and one interception.
- Sanguinetti got the first interception of the 2022 season with a diving interception to stop an Illinois scoring threat inside the IU 30-yard line.

- Bryant Fitzgerald leads all Hoosiers with 53 games played, which includes 31 starts overall (20 at husky).
- Fitzgerald's seven career takeaways are tied for No. 3 among IU defenders with Jaylin Williams.
- Fitzgerald owns 164 career tackles, which sits No. 3 on the team, just behind **Cam Jones** (209) and Matthews (194).
- With 10 stops against Western Kentucky, Fitzgerald posted his first career double-digit tackle game.
- He led the team with three interceptions during his redshirt freshman season, a total that was tied for the most among freshmen in the Big Ten and No. 7 nationally.
- After using his graduate transfer in 2021, **Jonathan Haynes** returns for his fourth season of Division I football (two at Ole Miss) after missing most of the 2021 campaign with injury.
- Haynes has appeared in 31 career games four in 2021 with 107 career tackles and two career interceptions.
- Newcomers in true freshman Phillip Dunnam and junior college transfer Louis Moore add depth on the back end after strong fall camp showings.
- The No. 40 safety nationally by ESPN, Dunnam played on both sides of the ball at North Miami (Fla.) Beach Senior High School and athleticism runs in the family. Cousins E.J. Biggers (cornerback) and Louis Delmas (safety) both played in the NFL and his uncle, Udonis Haslem, is a 19-year veteran in the NBA.
- A two-way player while at Navarro (Texas) College the last two seasons, Moore appeared in 16 games. He caught 48 passes as a wide receiver over two seasons and posted 18 tackles as a sophomore playing safety.
- Moore logged his first career sack and forced a fumble that was recovered in the end zone for a touchdown at Nebraska.

- The highest rated prospect to sign with Indiana, Dasan McCullough has already made an impact during his true freshman season on campus after starring as a senior at Bloomington South High School.
- Pro Football Focus has McCullough tied as the national leader among true freshmen in tackles for loss or no gain. He also ranks No. 2 in sacks (4) and No. 3 in total pressures (17) among true freshmen.
- With 19 stops a solo tackle or sack and leads to an offensive failure he ranks No. 3 nationally among true freshmen per Pro Football Focus.
- In his first career game versus Illinois, McCullough chipped in six tackles a total that led all B1G true freshmen defenders. His first stop came on special teams and he added a combined tackle for loss with **JH Tevis** in the fourth quarter.
- Game two of his career featured five tackles, each of them going for a loss or no gain against Idaho. He posted a solo sack and added two combined sacks to log the top pass rushing grade among true freshman in the FBS during Week Two. His 2.0 sacks were tied for the most in the FBS among true freshmen during the week.
- At Rutgers in Week 8, McCullough logged eight tackles and combined with **Alfred Bryant** for a tackle for loss. Four of his eight stops were solo.
- A consensus four-star recruit, McCullough was rated as the 40th prospect and No. 4 outside linebacker nationally, and the No. 1 prospect in Indiana by ESPN.
- He played his first three prep seasons at Blue Valley High School in Kansas, while his father, Deland, was a part of the Kansas City Chiefs coaching staff.

- After playing in 28 games during his first three seasons on the field, redshirt senior **Alfred Bryant** took over the starting role at the program's hybrid BULL position.
- After starting 17 straight games dating back to 2021, Bryant sits tied for No. 5 on the team with 48 career appearances (Devon Matthews).
- A career-high 26 tackles in 2021 is close to being eclipsed in 2022. The Fresno, Texas, native has 24 stops thus far in 2022, including his first career sack at Cincinnati.
- UCLA transfer **Myles Jackson** enrolled in the spring to attend classes and participate in spring practice and add another veteran for the group.
- Jackson made his biggest impact to date versus Western Kentucky with an interception in the end zone in the third quarter and a fourth-quarter fumble recovery in the red zone.
- His nose for the football showed again at Nebraska, as he recovered a fumble in the end zone for a touchdown in the second quarter.
- In eight career games at UCLA, Jackson made seven tackles with two for a loss. He also forced one fumble and came away with his first career sack at Arizona on Oct. 9, 2021.



- A 30-year coaching veteran, Allen was named the program's 29th head football coach on Dec. 1, 2016.
- Made his head coaching debut in the 2016 Foster Farms Bowl.
- The New Castle, Ind., native joined Indiana's staff as associate head coach/defense on Jan. 15, 2016, and he promptly went on to become a Broyles Award nominee.
- Allen has strong ties to the Hoosier state as he served as head coach at Ben Davis High School (2004-06), defensive coordinator at Ben Davis (1998-03) and Marion High School (1997), and earned his master's degree from IU (2002).
- Over the past 28 seasons, the teams for which Allen has been a member of the coaching staff have posted a combined record of 251-105 (.705).

### MAKING HISTORY (2020)

- Indiana (6-2, 6-1 B1G) finished the year ranked for a program record 10-consecutive weeks, including a No. 12 final rating from the Associated Press, its highest final ranking since 1967 (No. 4).
- IU played in consecutive January bowl games for the first time in school history with its invitation to the 2021 Outback Bowl.
- The Hoosiers were ranked in the Top 10 six times, the secondmost in program history behind the 1945 team (9 weeks).
- Indiana collected its first Top-10 ranking in the Nov. 8 AP Poll (No. 10) since Sept. 22, 1969 (No. 10).
- IU's No. 7 rating (Dec. 13, 20) was its best in the AP Poll since Nov. 27, 1967 (No. 4).
- The Hoosiers three Top-25 victories tied for the third-most in the country and matched the school record (1945).
- Indiana clinched a winning league record in consecutive seasons for the first time since 1987-88 and for the sixth time overall (1967-68, 1944-46, 1936-37).
- IU's six conference wins tied for the most in program history (1967, 1987).
- The Hoosiers 11 Big Ten victories over the 2019-20 seasons tied for the most in a two-year span in school history (1987-88).





### IU UNVEILS GEORGE TALIAFERRO STATUE IN GEORGE TALIAFERRO PLAZA

Former Indiana University President Michael A. McRobbie presided over the dedication of the George Taliaferro Plaza on Friday, Nov. 1, 2019, unveiling a bronze statue of Taliaferro, one of the most important and influential individuals in the history of Indiana University and IU Athletics.

McRobbie led the dedication ceremony, which took place on the newly-dedicated plaza located on the ground level of Memorial Stadium outside of the North End Zone facility. Other speakers at the event included IU Board of Trustee member Quinn Buckner, former Indiana University Vice President and Director of Intercollegiate Athletics Fred Glass, head football coach Tom Allen, Senior Associate Athletic Director Anthony Thompson and fifth-year senior linebacker Reakwon Jones.

"Throughout his life, not only did George Taliaferro excel as an athlete, but he also overcame the real-world struggles of racism and prejudice, of segregation and oppression," McRobbie said. "And in the process, he demonstrated courage, determination and perseverance, and earned a special place in the annals of our state and its flagship public university.

"In George Taliaferro Plaza and its centerpiece statue, every visitor to Indiana Memorial Stadium will be reminded of the enormous contributions George made to IU and to this community, as an outstanding athlete, as a champion of racial equality, as a dedicated educator and administrator, as a tireless community activist, and as a friend and mentor to many."

"It is fitting that during our Bicentennial year, we are dedicating this plaza and statue in honor of one of the most important figures in the history not only of Indiana University Athletics, but of Indiana University as a whole," said Glass. "I am particularly grateful to President McRobbie and Trustee Buckner for their support in permanently and prominently recognizing this Hoosier pioneer at the entryway of IU Football where he will be seen every day by IU players, coaches, and recruits."

Taliaferro, who passed away Oct. 8, 2018, at the age of 91, was a legendary Indiana University football player during the 1940s who shattered racial barriers on campus and in the sport. In doing so, he left an indelible mark on both.

The Gary, Ind., native was a three-time All-American at IU who led the Hoosiers' unbeaten 1945 Big Ten Championship team in rushing. He'd go on to lead the program in rushing twice and passing once, and following the 1948 season he became the first African-American drafted by an NFL team when the Chicago Bears selected him in the 13th round.

Taliaferro would eventually spend seven years in the NFL, earning Pro Bowl honors three times. He totaled 2,255 rushing yards, 1,300 receiving yards, 1,633 passing yards, and accounted for 37 touchdowns while playing for franchises in New York, Dallas, Baltimore, and Philadelphia. He also became the only player in league history to play seven positions — running back, quarterback, wide receiver, cornerback, punter, punt returner, and kickoff returner.

While those feats make him one of the most accomplished players in IU and Big Ten history, his contributions extended well beyond the collegiate and professional playing fields.

During the 1940s, Taliaferro and IU President Herman B Wells played a pivotal role in desegregating the IU campus and the City of Bloomington. During the era, Taliaferro was not allowed to eat at many local restaurants. When Wells found out that Taliaferro had to return home between classes because no nearby restaurants would serve him, Wells arranged for the two to have lunch at a nearby campus establishment. Wells and Taliaferro had lunch, and IU and the Bloomington community took a giant step toward desegregation.

Taliaferro's contributions did not end at the conclusion of his playing career. A 1951 IU graduate who later earned a Master's Degree from Howard University, Taliaferro returned to IU in 1972 and served as special assistant to IU President John Ryan. In that role and other roles on campus during the next two decades, he was a valuable and outspoken voice on social justice issues.

Taliaferro's lifetime of accomplishments are chronicled on the statue, which is the work of Brian Hanlon, owner of Hanlon Studios. Hanlon has produced more than 300 works in both public and private collections, including the five granite monuments commemorating IU Basketball's five national championships.





### TERRY TALLEN INDIANA FOOTBALL COMPLEX

The Terry Tallen Indiana Football Complex officially opened on Aug. 13, 2019. Former Indiana University Vice President and Director of Intercollegiate Athletics Fred Glass announced a major gift by alumnus and former IU Football captain Terry Tallen to the Indiana University Bicentennial Campaign for Athletics on April 20, 2018. This \$2 million commitment helped provide funding for the renovation of the football team area in Memorial Stadium. In recognition of his gift, the area is permanently named the Terry Tallen Indiana Football Complex.

The Terry Tallen Indiana Football Complex fills 25,000+ square feet underneath the west stands of Memorial Stadium. The complex includes the Trent and Julie Green Locker Room (named in 2003), coaches' locker room, team lounge, recruiting area, equipment room and Dr. John M. Miller Training Room (named in 1994).

Tallen graduated from the Indiana University Kelley School of Business in 1982, and while earning his degree, was also a three-year letterman. Terry was elected team co-captain in 1979 and 1980. The 1979 team was nationally ranked and won the Holiday Bowl, the Hoosiers first bowl victory. Terry was named the United Press International's Defensive Player of the Week following Indiana's Homecoming victory over Wisconsin in 1980.

In 2001, Terry founded Tallen Capital Partners, LLC, and remains the company's Chairman and CEO. ### **IN THE BOOTH**

Indiana University's football program receives some of the most extensive media coverage in the country. Learfield IMG College holds the exclusive rights as IU's official radio outlet.



#### DON FISCHER

Don Fischer is in his 50th year as the "Radio Voice" of Indiana University football and basketball games. The past 36 years, Fischer has worked as an independent contractor, and is currently serving the IU Radio Network, owned by Learfield. In addition to broadcasting the games, Fischer hosts the

weekly coaches talk shows for both football and basketball. Fischer also offers stations a weekly talk show about IU football and basketball that airs in several markets around the state during the school year.

During his years of work in Indiana, Fischer has been named the state's Sportscaster of the Year 31 times by two different organizations. The National Sports Media Association has awarded him 27 times, including the 2019 award, while the Indiana Sportswriters and Sportscasters Association has named him their honoree four times. In June of 2018 at the NSMA Awards program, Fischer was named the first recipient of the Woody Durham Voice of College Sports Award.

Fischer was inducted into the Indiana Sportswriters and Sportscasters Association Hall of Fame in 2004. He was inducted into the Indiana Broadcasters Association Hall of Fame in October 2010. Fischer has won several awards for best play by play, and has been honored by Indiana University with the J.W. Bill Orwig Medal, that goes to non-alumni for distinguished service to the University. In 2020, IU presented Fischer with the Bicentennial Medal in recognition of distinguished and distinctive service in support of the mission of Indiana University. He was also named an Honorary "I" Man in 1991.

Fischer has broadcast over 2,100 Indiana University games that include 12 bowl games, five NCAA basketball Final Fours, including four NCAA Championship games, and two NIT Championship games.

From 1973-87, he worked for ABC Radio, Canada's CBC, and several other major market radio stations, including WIRE in Indianapolis, as their source for reports during the month of May coverage of the Indianapolis 500. During that 14-year period, he also served Indianapolis radio station WIRE and Network Indiana, a statewide news network, as their sports director.

As an independent contractor, Fischer served the Indianapolis Colts as their preseason television anchor for 23 years from 1995-2017.

In addition, the City of Indianapolis, and the State of Indiana have each honored Fischer with a special "Recognition Day" for his service and abilities as a play-by-play broadcaster.

A native of Rochelle, Illinois, Fischer has been in the radio business for 56 years with stops in Butte, Montana; Ottawa, Illinois; Springfield, Illinois; and Terre Haute, Indiana

Fischer his wife, Susy, reside in Greenwood, Indiana, and have four sons, 12 grandchildren and one great grandchild.



#### RHETT LEWIS

Former Indiana wide receiver and current NFL Network broadcaster, Rhett Lewis is in his first season as Indiana's football radio analyst.

Lewis played at IU from 2001-05 and graduated with a B.S. in sports broadcasting (2005) and an M.S. in sports administration (2006).

Lewis is a host across several NFL Network programs, including NFL Now, NFL Total Access, and Path to the Draft. He also hosts various SiriusXM shows, including regular appearances on SiriusXM Big Ten Radio.

In 2014, Lewis spent five years as an anchor and reporter at WHDH in Boston, where he began using his middle name of Lewis as his last name professionally. He covered all four major pro championships (Super Bowl, NBA Finals, World Series, Stanley Cup Finals), and five championships total.

Before joining WHDH in May of 2009, Lewis spent eight months at WVUE, the FOX affiliate in his hometown of New Orleans. He also spent two years as the sports director at the CBS affiliate (KLBK) in Lubbock, Texas. Lewis also interned with WISH-TV in Indianapolis.

His father, Dean Kleinschmidt, served as Indiana's head football trainer from 2004-06. Dean was a head trainer in the NFL for 41 seasons — 31 with the New Orleans Saints, two with the Washington Redskins, and eight with the Detroit Lions.

A 1970 IU graduate, Dean is in the National Athletic Trainers Association Hall of Fame and the New Orleans Saints Hall of Fame.

Rhett's wife, Kayna - an honorary Hoosier, is also in television as a national correspondent for ABC News. They have two future Hoosier wide receivers, Conway (4) and Wylder (3).



### **JOE SMITH**

Joe Smith is celebrating his 40th season with the IU Radio Network. He has handled pregame, halftime, and post-game duties for Indiana football and men's basketball since 1983, and he will host the football post-game, call-in show in 2022.

Smith, the sports director of WGCL-AM 1370 in Bloomington, is in his 53rd year of radio broadcasting in Bloomington. He began his broadcasting career in 1969 at WAIK Radio in Galesburg, Illinois. From 1973-89, Smith worked on "RFD-4 Agri-Business Show" on WTTV-4 with the late Bob Cook.

In 1998, Smith was named Indiana Sportscaster of the Year; in April 2003, he was inducted into the Indiana Sportswriters/Sportscasters Hall of Fame; and in Aug. 2021, he was welcomed into the Monroe County Sports Hall of Fame. Smith handled the IU TV Warmup Shows from 1978-82, and he hosted several IU Coaches Shows from 1983-96 and again from 2002-04.

He received the J.W. Bill Orwig Medal that goes to non-IU alumni for distinguished service to the University in June 2004

In March 2020, Smith was given the IU Bicentennial Medal by President Michael A. McRobbie, awarded to organizations and individuals who, through their personal, professional, artistic or philanthropic efforts, have broadened the reach of Indiana University around the state, nation, and world.

He has two children, both of whom are Indiana University graduates. Jeff, resides in Brownsburg, Indiana, with his wife, Kristen, and their sons, Jayden, Kaleb, and Logan. Joe's daughter, Jamie, and her husband, Eric, reside in Bloomington with their son, Ethan, and two daughters, Emerson and Carolina.
