INSIDE THE GAME

PENN STATE HOST MARYLAND FOR BIG CONTEST

- OPENING KICK: No. 14/15/15 Penn State welcomes -/RV/- Maryland for a Big Ten matchup on Saturday at Beaver Stadium. Kickoff is set for 3:30 p.m. on FOX. The 2022 Penn State football season is presented by PSECU.
- SERIES HISTORY: Penn State meets Maryland for the 46th time in program history. The Nittany Lions own a 41-3-1 advantage in the all-time series. Penn State earned a 31-14 win over the Terrapins last year in College Park. Sean Clifford threw for 363 yards and three touchdowns. Jahan Dotson hauled in 11 catches for 242 yards and three scores. Ji'Ayir Brown helped seal the game with an 87-yard pick-six.
- STOPS BEHIND THE LINE: Penn State tied a program record with 16 tackles for loss against Indiana. The Nittany Lions matched the mark set in 2018 against Kent State. Penn State also recorded six sacks. The Nittany Lions recorded eight tackles for loss and three sacks in the first quarter and finished the first half with 13 tackles for loss. Eleven different Nittany Lions recorded a tackle for loss, the most in a game for Penn State since the tackle for loss became an official stat. On the season, 21 different Nittany Lions have at least a full tackle for loss and 12 have at least one sack.
- FORCING TAKEAWAYS: The Nittany Lions forced three takeaways against the Hoosiers, all interceptions. Dani Dennis-Sutton, Daequan Hardy and Kalen King each had a pick. The three interceptions preceded three Penn State touchdown drives. Penn State has forced 17 takeaways this season, including 10 interceptions and seven fumble recoveries.
- FRESHMAN RBS FIND THE END ZONE: Kaytron Allen scored on runs of 11, 6 and 6 yards against Indiana, while Nicholas Singleton scored on a 1-yard run. Both freshmen raised their season total to eight rushing touchdowns, tying the Penn State freshman record, set by Noah Cain in 2019. Allen's three rushing scores against Indiana are the most by a PSU freshman since Austin Scott's three against Kent State in 2003.
- THE OPPOSITION: Maryland is 6-3 overall and 3-3 in Big Ten action. The Terrapins fell 23-10 at Wisconsin last Saturday. Maryland was held to 189 total yards. Taulia Tagovailoa threw for 77 yards and connected on a 5-yard touchdown with Tai Felton. Roman Hemby rushed for 66 yards. Beau Brade led Maryland with seven tackles, while Greg China-Rose had two sacks and Tommy Akingbesote added a sack.

HEAD COACH JAMES FRANKLIN

CAREER AT A GLANCE

- Franklin was named the 16th head football coach in the storied history of the Nittany Lion program on January 11, 2014.
- Franklin is one of six current FBS head coaches to lead his teams to a bowl game in each of his first nine seasons as a head coach and one of
 nine to do so in 10 of their first 11 seasons.
- Franklin is one of four current Big Ten coaches (Ryan Day, Kirk Ferentz, Jim Harbaugh) to have won a Big Ten Championship and became the first African American head coach to win a Big Ten title after Penn State's 2016 victory.
- He owns a 98-51 career record with a winning record in nine of 11 seasons at the helm.
- Franklin has led his teams to three Top 10 finishes (3 at Penn State) and six Top 25 finishes (2 at Vanderbilt; 4 at Penn State).
- In the last six seasons under Franklin, Penn State is one of six teams to rank in the top 12 of the CFP final rankings at least four times, joining Ohio State, Alabama, Georgia, Clemson and Oklahoma.
- From 2016-19, Franklin led the Nittany Lions to three New Year's Six bowls 2016 (Rose), 2017 (Fiesta) and 2019 (Cotton), making Penn State one of eight teams to accomplish the feat during the four-year span. Penn State last went to three New Year's Six bowls in four years in 1980-83 (1980 Fiesta, 1982 Fiesta, 1983 Sugar).
- Franklin guided Penn State to back-to-back New Year's Six bowls in 2016 (Rose) and 2017 (Fiesta) for the first time since 1985 (Orange) and 1986 (Fiesta).
- From 2016-19, Franklin led Penn State to 42 wins, the most in program history for the Big Ten era, and 28 league wins, a program record.
- Franklin has 27 years of coaching experience at the collegiate and NFL level.
- In his first 11 years as a head coach, Franklin mentored 90 players who have gone on to the NFL ranks.
- Franklin is second all-time in winning percentage by an FBS African American head coach (minimum 80 wins) and is third in total wins.

NITTANY LIONS ON THE FIELD

- The Nittany Lions earned a New Year's Day bowl berth against Arkansas in the Outback Bowl in 2021. With wins over No. 12/15 Wisconsin
 and No. 22/20 Auburn, Penn State tallied two wins over ranked teams within the first three games of the season for the first time in program
 history. The Nittany Lion defense allowed just 17.3 points per game in 2021, good for sixth in the country.
- In 2020, with the emergence of young skill players on offense, true freshmen accounted for 1,486 of Penn State's 3,873 total yards (38 percent), marking a school record for most combined scrimmage yards by true freshmen in a single season.
- Penn State earned its third 11-win season in four years with an 11-2 record in 2019, including a win over No. 17 Memphis in the Goodyear Cotton Bowl Classic. The Nittany Lions posted their fourth-straight top 12 finish in the final CFP rankings, coming in 10th, and were ranked ninth in the final Associated Press and Amway Coaches polls to earn their 25th AP Top 10 finish. Franklin was a finalist for the Paul "Bear" Bryant National Coach of the Year award for the second time at Penn State (2016) and third time in his head coaching career.
- In 2018, the Nittany Lions posted their third-straight season with at least nine wins with a 9-4 overall record, earning a berth in the VRBO Citrus Bowl. Penn State finished No. 12 in the final CFP rankings and No. 17 in the Associated Press and Amway Coaches polls.
- Penn State climbed as high as No. 2 in the rankings in 2017 and appeared in a second-straight New Year's Six bowl, earning a 35-28 win
 over No. 11 Washington in the PlayStation Fiesta Bowl. At 11-2, the Nittany Lions earned back-to-back 11-win seasons for the fifth time in
 program history and first time since 2008 and 2009. Penn State finished the season No. 8 in the Associated Press and Amway Coaches polls
 and No. 9 in the final CFP rankings.
- Penn State surged in 2016, winning nine consecutive games en route to the Big Ten Championship, a Rose Bowl berth and an 11-3 overall record. Penn State finished the season ranked No. 5 in the College Football Playoff rankings and No. 7 in the Associated Press and Amway Coaches polls. It was Penn State's highest finish in the polls since 2005. The Lions claimed their fourth overall Big Ten Championship and first outright title since 1994 with a thrilling, 38-31 comeback win over Wisconsin in the Big Ten Championship Game. Franklin was honored as Sporting News National Coach of the Year and the Woody Hayes National Coach of the Year, as well as the Dave McLain Big Ten Coach of the Year.
- Franklin guided the Nittany Lions to a 7-6 record in 2015 and a berth in the TaxSlayer Bowl.
- Franklin's first season in 2014 was bookended with a pair of thrilling victories for the Nittany Lions. It began with a final-play 26-24 victory
 over UCF in Dublin, Ireland, in Penn State's first-ever international game and ended with a comeback, a 31-30 overtime win over Boston
 College in the New Era Pinstripe Bowl in Yankee Stadium. Franklin became just the third Penn State coach to lead the team to at least seven
 wins in his first season, joining Dick Harlow (1915) and Bill O'Brien (2012), and he guided the Nittany Lions to a 4-0 start, joining Harlow as
 the only first-year Penn State coaches to win their initial four games.

NITTANY LIONS IN THE CLASSROOM

- The Nittany Lions posted their first 1,000 single-year APR in program history in 2018-19, topping the previous high of 993 in 2014-15.
- Sean Clifford (2021) and Trace McSorley (2018) were selected as a National Football Foundation (NFF) Scholar-Athletes and finalists for the Campbell Trophy, known as the "Academic Heisman." They are the 18th and 19th Nittany Lions to be selected as an NFF Scholar-Athlete.
- In 2019, punter Blake Gillikin took home CoSIDA Academic All-America® first-team honors for the second-straight year to become the 12th two-time first-team selection in Penn State history. He graduated with a perfect 4.0 grade-point average in May.
- Gillikin's two first-team CoSIDA Academic All-America honors increase Penn State football's total to 67 honorees, which ranks second in Division I football history (FBS and FCS).
- Tyler Yazujian collected a berth on the CoSIDA Academic All-America® first team in 2016 after an appearance on the second team in 2015.
- A program-record 10 Nittany Lions were named 2020-21 Big Ten Distinguished Scholars, besting the previous mark of nine set a year earlier.

NITTANY LIONS IN THE COMMUNITY

- The Nittany Lions are active in the community, participating in activities such as Uplifting Athletes, THON, Pennsylvania Special Olympics Summer Games, State College Area Food Bank and Penn State Hershey Children's Hospital visits.
 - On June 15, 2020, Franklin was named to the Big Ten Anti-Hate and Anti-Racism Coalition.
- As part of the Cotton Bowl festivities in 2019, Franklin and his family made a \$10,000 financial commitment to the Dallas Children's Hospital.
- In August 2019, Franklin was named a Penn State University Renaissance Fund honoree, which awards outstanding community members for helping students in need.

HEAD COACH MICHAEL LOCKSLEY

- · Michael Locksley is in his fourth full season as Maryland's head coach
- · Locksley arrived at Maryland following a three-year stint at Alabama. He served as the Crimson Tide's offensive coordinator in 2018 after being co-offensive coordinator during Alabama's 2017 National Championship season.
- This is Lockley's third stint at Maryland. He most recently served as offensive coordinator and guarterbacks coach from 2012-15, and was the Terrapins' running backs coach and recruiting coordinator from 1997-2002. Locksley was Maryland's interim head coach for the final six games of the 2015 season.
- · His other Big Ten coaching experience came at Illinois where he served as offensive coordinator while coaching the tight ends in 2005 and guarterbacks from 2006-08.
- · Locksley is a head coach for the second time in his career. He was the head coach at New Mexico from 2009-11.

SCOUTING THE TERRAPINS

- Maryland is 6-3 overall and 3-3 in Big Ten play this season. Maryland fell 23-10 at Wisconsin last Saturday.
- The Terrapins own conference wins over Michigan State (27-13), Indiana (38-33) and Northwestern (31-24).
- On offense, Maryland ranks fourth in the Big Ten in scoring (31.4 ppg), fourth in total offense (425.4 ypg), fourth in passing offense (260.7) and seventh in rushing offense (164.8).
- Maryland is third in the conference in completion percentage (68.6) and red zone offense (93.8), ranking among the Top 10 in the nation in both categories.
- QB Taulia Tagovailoa sits fourth in the Big Ten in passing yards per game (259.8) and fifth in passing touchdowns (14).
- RB Roman Hemby holds second in the league in yards per carry (6.17) and sixth in rushing yards per game (83.0).
- On defense, the Terrapins rank eighth in scoring defense (24.0), 10th in total defense (377.4), 11th in passing defense (239.7) and 10th in rushing defense (137.8).
- Beau Brade paces Maryland with 60 tackles, while Durell Nchami leads the Terrapins with six tackles for loss and Greg China-Rose leads the squad with four sacks.
- Tarheeb Still leads the Big Ten with an 8.7 punt return average.

LAST MEETING BROWN'S TWO TAKEAWAYS, DOTSON'S RECORD DAY LEADS NITTANY LIONS OVER MARYLAND Led by a career day for wide receiver Jahan Dotson, the Penn State football team

defeated Big Ten foe Maryland, 31-14.

Dotson set the Penn State single-game receiving record with 242 yards, breaking Deon Butler's record of 216 set in 2006 vs. Northwestern. Dotson also tied career highs with 11 receptions and three touchdowns.

Quarterback Sean Clifford tallied his third 300-yard game of the 2021 season, completing 27-of-47 passes for 363 yards and three touchdowns. Clifford and Dotson connected for a season-long 86-yard touchdown.

The Penn State defense also recorded a score when Ji'Ayir Brown intercepted a Taulia Tagovailoa pass and returned it 87 yards for a touchdown. It marked Brown's first career touchdown and fourth career interception. He also recovered a fumble in the game and tied for the team lead with nine tackles.

The Nittany Lions struck first midway through the first quarter when Clifford found Dotson deep for a 38-yard score to put Penn State up 7-0.

Maryland would get on the board in the closing minutes of the half on a 2-yard run by Challen Faamatau. Penn State remained in front at the half as Maryland missed the extra point.

of the second half, capping off a 95-yard scoring drive with a 21-yard touchdown. With Maryland threatening in the red zone on the ensuing drive, the Penn State defense would collect the game's first turnover when Ji'Ayir Brown recovered a mishandled snap at the Penn State 15-yard line.

The Terrapins would strike back on the first play of the fourth quarter when Taulia Tagovailoa hit Corey Dyches for a 13-yard touchdown. Tagovailoa then connected with Chigoziem Okonkwo on a successful two-point conversion attempt to tie the game 14-14.

Penn State regained the lead less than a minute later when Clifford and Dotson connected again, this time on an 86-yard touchdown pass to give Penn State a 21-14 lead

Dotson broke free for another long gain to set up another scoring drive for Penn State, as his 42-yard catch in the fourth quarter set up a 24-yard field goal by Jordan Stout

The Penn State defense extended the lead late in the fourth when Brown jumped in front of a Tagovailoa pass and returned it 87 yards for the touchdown to extend Penn State's lead to 31-14.

- Penn State is now 24-2 all-time against Indiana, including 10-2 in Bloomington.
- With eight rushing touchdowns on the season, both RB Kaytron Allen and RB Nicholas Singleton are tied for the Penn State freshman record held by Noah Cain (8; 2019).
- Allen's three rushing touchdowns are the most by a Nittany Lion since Journey Brown's three scores against Rutgers in 2019.
- Allen is the first Penn State freshman with three rushing touchdowns in a game since Austin Scott against Kent State in 2003.
- Penn State finished the game with 16 tackles for loss and six sacks.
- The 16 tackles for loss are tied for the most in program history. Penn State had 16 tackles for loss against Kent State in 2018.
- The Nittany Lions had 11 players record at least one tackle for loss. The 11 players with a full tackle for loss are the most in a game for Penn State since the tackle for loss became an official stat.
- Penn State finished the first half with 13 tackles for loss and six sacks.

- With DT Coziah Izzard's sack in the fourth quarter, 11 different Penn State players have recorded at least one sack this season.

- The Nittany Lions have won eight of the last 10 matchups against the Wildcats.

- With RB Kaytron Allen's 111-yard rushing performance, Penn State has had two true freshmen running backs post 100-yard games in a single season for the first time since 2019, when Devyn Ford (once) and Noah Cain (twice) each eclipsed the 100yard plateau.
- Penn State forced four opponent turnovers for the second consecutive game, the first time that the Nittany Lions have forced at least four turnovers in two straight games since forcing four by both Virginia and Navy early in the 2012 season.

- The Nittany Lions are 25-24 all-time against current members of the SEC. Penn State is 12-16 in regular season matchups against SEC opponents.
- Penn State became the first Big Ten school to sweep a homeand-home series against an SEC opponent since 2012, when Northwestern swept Vanderbilt in 2010 and 2012.
- The Nittany Lions' 29-point win is the Big Ten's second-largest margin of victory in a road game against an SEC opponent.
- The 29-point win marks the sixth time (third time in regular season) a Big Ten team has beaten an SEC team by 29 or more points and just the second time in a road game.
- Penn State owns two of those six wins, and both wins were against Auburn, the other coming in the 1996 Outback Bowl, a 43-14 win.
- Auburn's 29-point loss was its first home loss by 29-plus points since 2012 (38-0 loss to Georgia).
- It marked Auburn's largest margin of defeat in a non-conference home game since 1982 (41-7 loss to Nebraska).
- The 41 points allowed by Auburn are its most to a nonconference opponent at home since 2001 (41 vs. Louisiana Tech in a 48-41 overtime win).
- The Nittany Lions scored on five rushing touchdowns, the first time with five rushing touchdowns since the 2019 Cotton Bowl vs. Memphis.
- Prior to the Penn State game, Auburn had allowed just one rushing touchdown in its last seven contests.
- The Nittany Lions had two freshmen running backs (Kaytron Allen and Nicholas Singleton) each score two touchdowns.
 Since at least 2000, they are the only Penn State freshmen to both score two rushing touchdowns in a game.
- The Nittany Lions forced two fumbles and two interceptions. Penn State had four takeaways in a game for the first time since the Michigan State game in 2019.

- Eight of the 23 teams are on the 2022 schedule, including Purdue (20), Northwestern (20), Michigan (26), Ohio State (38), Indiana (26), Maryland (45), Rutgers (32) and Michigan State (36).

OVERTIME OVER TIME

- College football introduced overtime during the bowl season in 1995 and adopted it for regular season games in 1996. Since then, Penn State has played 15 overtime games, including six over the 2012-14 seasons.
- Ten of the 15 overtime tilts have come at home, three in true road games, one in the 2006 Orange Bowl and one in the 2014 Pinstripe Bowl.
- Penn State is 8-7 all-time in overtime games, with a 5-5 record at Beaver Stadium, 1-2 mark in true road games and 2-0 in contests at a neutral site.
- Penn State's first two overtime contests came vs. Iowa in 2000 and 2002 at home. The Nittany Lions dropped their first three contests that went to the extra period, but won five straight overtime contests before falling to Nebraska on Nov. 23, 2013.

OFFENSIVE NOTES

- Since the start of the 2016 season, Penn State's offense is second in the Big Ten in yards per play (6.03; 32nd) and total offense (425.2; 37th), and is third in touchdown percentage (31.6; 20th), points per possession (2.16; 23rd), scoring percentage (40.22; 25th), yards per pass attempt (7.90; 30th) and scoring offense (33.4: 23rd)
- Penn State's offense has been explosive since the 2016 campaign, as it leads the Big Ten in 80-plus yard play percentage (0.19; 2nd nationally) and 70-plus (0.37; 9th), ranks second in 40-plus (2.03; 13th) and 20-plus (7.81; 17th) and holds third in 30-plus (3.59; 22nd), 50-plus (0.98; 34th) and 60-plus (0.54; 26th).
- The Nittany Lions have tallied at least 55 plays of 20 or more yards in seven of the last eight seasons (61 in 2022; 57 in 2021; 63 in 2019; 73 in 2018; 85 in 2017; 91 in 2016; 67 in 2015). PSU had 52 plays of 20 or more yards in 2020 (nine-game schedule).
- Additionally, the Nittany Lions are third in the Big Ten and 15th nationally in 15-plus yard passing play percentage since 2016 (19.49 percent).
- · Penn State posted 406 total yards, including 308 through the air, against Purdue
- · Against Ohio, Penn State tallied 572 yards of total offense, the ninth-most in a game in the James Franklin era. Nittany Lion freshmen (true and redshirt) combined for 423 of the 572 yards (74 percent).
- The Nittany Lions gained 234 yards rushing vs. Ohio, 245 yards at Auburn and 220 yards vs. Northwestern.
- · Penn State has surpassed 200 yards rushing 36 times in the James Franklin era. PSU is 31-5 in those games.
- In 2022, Penn State has had 20 different receivers catch a pass this season.
- The Nittany Lions finished the Ohio game with a programrecord 17 receivers catching a pass.
- Since 1960, Penn State has had 11 seasons with 17 players catching at least one pass. The Nittany Lions had 17 pass catchers in the Ohio game.
- Penn State had touchdown runs of 44 and 70 yards, both by Nicholas Singleton, and a 48-yard run by Singleton vs. Ohio. The Nittany Lions had multiple 40+ yard touchdown runs in a game for the first time since 2018 at Illinois (Miles Sanders, 48 yards; Ricky Slade, 61 yards).
- Penn State scored 41 points at Auburn, the most by a nonconference opponent in a game at Auburn since 2001 (41 by Louisiana Tech).
- Penn State had five rushing touchdowns in a game for the first time since the 2019 Cotton Bowl vs. Memphis.
- · Prior to the game against Penn State, Auburn had allowed just one rushing touchdown in its last seven games
- Penn State did not allow a sack against Auburn for the secondconsecutive season.
- The Nittany Lions had two freshmen running backs (Kaytron Allen and Singleton) each score two touchdowns.

- Since at least 2000, Allen and Singleton are the only Penn State freshmen to both score two rushing touchdowns in a game.
- Allen and Singleton became the first PSU freshmen duo to score a rushing touchdown in the same game for the first time since Noah Cain (13 yards) and Devyn Ford (1 yard) against Pitt in 2019
- WR KeAndre Lambert-Smith completed a 25-yard pass to QB Sean Clifford in the second quarter.
- · The Lambert-Smith to Clifford connection was the first reception by a quarterback from a non-quarterback since Christian Hackenberg's 14-yard touchdown reception from Nick Scott against Illinois in 2015.
- With Allen's 111-yard rushing performance vs. Central Michigan, Penn State has had two true freshmen running backs post 100yard games in a single season for the first time since 2019.
- Against Minnesota, PSU scored 45 points, its most in a Penn State Whiteout game, and outscored the Gophers, 28-7, in the second half and 21-0 in the third quarter.
- Penn State converted 5-of-11 third downs (45.4 percent). Minnesota entered the game holding teams to an FBS-best 21.9 percent on third downs.
- PSU's 32 completions vs. Ohio State are tied for the third-most in a game since 2014. PSU's 371 passing yards are tied for the eighth-most in a game in the Franklin era.
- At Indiana, Allen rushed for three touchdowns and Singleton added a 1-yard score.
- · With eight rushing touchdowns on the season, both Allen and Singleton are tied for the Penn State freshman record held by Noah Cain (8: 2019).
- Mike Yurcich enters his second season as Penn State's offensive coordinator/quarterbacks coach.
- Yurcich (California University (Pa.)) and Franklin (East Stroudsburg) both played in the Pennsylvania State Athletic Conference (PSAC).
- As an FBS offensive coordinator, offenses under Yurcich have averaged 6.34 yards per play, ranking first among OC's since 2013 and 13.68 yards per completion, which is also first in that time frame.
- Since 2013, Yurcich's offenses have scored 50 or more points 26 times and 40 or more points 56 times (45.2 percent of games coached), both of which are tops among FBS offensive coordinators since 2013.
- His teams have averaged 56.8 touchdowns per year.
- Penn State has scored 40 points 25 times since 2016. By comparison, from 2008 until 2015, the Nittany Lions had 18 40-point outings.

OUARTERBACK NOTES

- Offensive coordinator Mike Yurcich also heads the Penn State quarterback room
- Three quarterbacks Yurcich coached in college are currently on NFL rosters (Sam Ehlinger - Texas, Justin Fields - Ohio State, Mason Rudolph – Oklahoma State).
- Yurcich served as the passing game coordinator and guarterbacks coach at Ohio State in 2019, where guarterback Justin Fields was a finalist for the Heisman Trophy, Walter Camp Player of the Year Award and Davey O'Brien Award.
- · Redshirt senior Sean Clifford is in his fourth season as Penn State's starting signal caller, having played in 47 career games, making 42 starts. He joins Jonathan Sutherland as the only four-time team captains in program history.
- Against Purdue, Clifford joined Zack Mills (2001-04) and Tony Sacca (1988-92) as the only guarterbacks to start a game in four different seasons at Penn State.
- The Cincinnati native began the season on the Davey O'Brien Award, Manning Award, Maxwell Award, Johnny Unitas Golden Arm Award, Walter Camp Player of the Year Award and Wuerffel Trophy watch lists. Clifford is also on the Reese's Senior Bowl watch list.
- He is a semifinalist for the Wuerffel Trophy.
- · Clifford earned Big Ten Co-Offensive Player of the Week following his performance at Purdue, tallying 282 passing yards and tied a career high with four touchdown passes against Purdue. He also rushed for a 2-yard touchdown.
- Clifford threw for 213 yards and a touchdown against Ohio, while adding a 1-yard rushing touchdown.
- · Clifford passed for 216 yards and three touchdowns, and rushed for a 1-yard score, against Central Michigan.
- · At Michigan, Clifford had a career-long 62-yard run in the second quarter.
- On the 62-yard run, Clifford surpassed the 1,000-career rushing yard mark, becoming the third PSU quarterback and 47th Nittany Lion to accomplish the feat.
- Clifford completed 23 passes against Minnesota, tallying 295 yards and four touchdowns. He connected on two touchdown passes in both the second and third quarters. The four touchdown passes tied a career high.
- The senior was named Big Ten Offensive Player of the Week following the Minnesota game. He was also named one of the Davey O'Brien Award's Great 8 quarterbacks of the week.
- · Clifford completed 32 passes for 371 yards and three touchdowns against Ohio State.
- Against the Buckeves, became Penn State's all-time leader in passing touchdowns. He currently has 78.
- · He also became the program's leader in pass attempts. He currently has 1,262.
- At Indiana, Clifford threw for 229 vards.
- Clifford ranks ninth in Big Ten history with 9,884 career passing yards and eighth with 10,910 career total yards.
- · Clifford owns 30 career games with multiple touchdown passes, 16 games with three or more TDs and five games with four TD passes.

- · Clifford has recorded 10 career games with both a passing and rushing touchdown. Penn State is 9-1 in those games.
- · He owns 11 career games with at least 250 passing yards and three passing touchdowns. He has tossed six career touchdowns of 70-plus yards.
- · Clifford has completed 138 career passes of 20 or more yards, including 33 this season.
- Clifford has 25 games with 200+ passing yards. He sits second all-time at Penn State, behind only Trace McSorley (28; 2015-18). He owns eight career 300-yard passing games.
- · Clifford has tossed multiple touchdowns in a half on 22 occasions and 15 different times has thrown multiple touchdowns in a quarter.
- · Against Minnesota, Clifford became the all-time career completions leader at Penn State with 754, breaking Trace McSorley's record (720; 2015-18).
- · Clifford also reached the 9,000 career passing yards mark. He joins McSorley (9,899; 2015-18) as the only PSU QBs to top 9,000 yards. Clifford currently has 9,884 passing yards.
- Clifford also owns over 10,000 career total yards, joining Trace McSorley (11,596; 2015-18) as the only Nittany Lions to go over 10,000 career total yards. He currently has 10,910 total yards.
- · Clifford is one of four current FBS quarterbacks and one of two Power Five conference quarterbacks with 9,800 passing yards and 1,000 rushing yards in his career.
- · He ranks seventh among current FBS guarterbacks and third among Power Five conference guarterbacks with 9,884 career passing vards.
- The captain is one of six current FBS guarterbacks with at least 9,800 passing yards and 75 passing touchdowns in his career.
- Clifford is one of 11 current FBS quarterbacks with at least 760 career completions and ranks sixth among current FBS quarterbacks with a 60.9 completion percentage (min. 1,250 attempts).
- The redshirt senior currently sits as the all-time leader at Penn State in passing touchdowns (78), completions (769), attempts (1,262) and completion percentage (.609), while ranking second at PSU in passing yards (9,884), third in passing efficiency (142.2) and rushing yards by a guarterback (1,026), fourth in rushing touchdowns by a guarterback (14) and wins as starting quarterback (28), eighth in lowest interception % (2.46), tied seventh in yards per pass attempt (7.8) and 10th in touchdown pass % (6.18).
- · Freshman Drew Allar made his collegiate debut at Purdue, completing two-of-four passes for 26 yards.
- · Allar completed six-of-eight passes for 88 yards and two touchdowns against Ohio. Allar connected with Omari Evans on a 32-yard touchdown for his first career touchdown pass. Allar hit Khalil Dinkins for a 28-yard score in the fourth quarter.
- Allar completed five passes for 37 vards at Michigan.
- · Allar threw for 75 yards and two touchdowns at Indiana, throwing a 1-yard score to Harrison Wallace III and a 4-yard score to Theo Johnson.
- Redshirt freshman Christian Veilleux completed six-of-seven passes against Ohio, tallying 37 yards.

- · Sean Clifford was a 2021 National Football Foundation (NFF) Scholar-Athlete and finalist for the Campbell Trophy, known as the "Academic Heisman". He is the 19th Nittany Lion to be selected as an NFF Scholar-Athlete.
- Penn State posted its first 1,000 single-year APR in program history in 2018-19, topping the previous high of 993 in 2014-15.
- In 2019, punter Blake Gillikin took home CoSIDA Academic All-America® first-team honors for the second-straight year to become the 12th two-time first-team selection in Penn State history. He graduated with a perfect 4.0 grade-point average in May 2020.
- Gillikin's two first-team CoSIDA Academic All-America honors increase Penn State football's total to 67 honorees, which ranks second in Division I football history (FBS and FCS).

- Co-offensive coordinator/running backs coach Ja'Juan Seider has 14 years of college coaching experience, including 11 at the Power Five level.
- Seider helped a young running backs group to rank fifth in the Big Ten in rushing in 2020.
- In 2019, Seider mentored Journey Brown, who had 11 rushes of 20 or more yards and posted a Cotton Bowl and Penn State bowl-record 202 rushing yards.
- In 2018, Penn State posted its highest rushing average (204.9) since 2008 (205.8), led by second-team All-Big Ten selection Miles Sanders.
- As a player at Florida A&M, Seider won the Doug Williams Award for National Offensive Player of the Year, Jake Gaither Award (considered the Heisman Trophy of Historically Black Colleges) and earned All-America honors after throwing for 2,622 yards and 27 touchdowns and rushing for 740 yards and 14 touchdowns in 1999.
- Seider, who was the 1999 MEAC Offensive Player of the Year, was selected in the sixth round of the 2000 NFL Draft by the San Diego Chargers.
- Freshmen Kaytron Allen and Nicholas Singleton both made their collegiate debuts against Purdue.
- Allen and Singleton each have eight rushing touchdowns, tying Noah Cain (8; 2019) for the Penn State freshman record.
- Singleton rushed for 179 yards and two touchdowns on 10 carries against Ohio. He scored on runs of 44 and 70 yards and added a 48-yard rush. Singleton earned Big Ten Freshman of the Week honors for his efforts against the Bobcats.
- Singleton became the first Nittany Lion with multiple 40+ yard touchdown runs in a game since Larry Johnson at Indiana on Nov. 16, 2002 (touchdown runs of 41, 43 and 69 yards).
- Singleton is the first Nittany Lion with three 40+ yard runs in a game since Johnson's performance against Indiana (runs of 41, 41, 43 and 69).
- The freshman's 70-yard run is Penn State's longest run since an 85-yard run by Journey Brown against Pittsburgh in 2019.
- Singleton repeated as Big Ten Freshman of the Week after rushing for 124 yards and two touchdowns on 10 carries at Auburn. Singleton scored on two touchdown runs, a 1-yard rush and a 54-yard rush. He added a 53-yard carry.
- He became the first Penn State true freshman with back-toback 100-yard games since Noah Cain in 2019 (vs. Purdue and lowa).
- Singleton rushed for 42 yards against Central Michigan, including a 21-yard carry.
- Singleton tallied 87 yards and a touchdown on a career-high 21 carries against Northwestern. He scored on a 2-yard run in the second quarter. It was Singleton's fifth rushing touchdown of the season.
- The freshman scored on two rushing touchdowns, of 16 and 30 yards, against Minnesota. It was his third game with multiple rushing touchdowns this season. He added a career-long 22yard reception.
- Singleton has four rushing touchdowns of 30 or more yards.
- Through nine games, Singleton has 679 yards, averaging 75.4 per game and 6.06 per carry.
- Singleton ranks 22nd in the country and second among FBS freshmen in yards per carry.
- The freshman is tied for second in the FBS with six 30+ yard runs and five 40+ yard runs and is tied third with three 50+ yard runs. Three of his five 40+ yard runs have gone for touchdowns.
- Singleton ranks fifth among FBS freshmen and ranks 56th in the FBS with 75.4 rushing yards per game.
- Singleton is averaging 103.8 all-purpose yards per game, ranking 60th in the nation and third among FBS freshmen.
- Since 2000, Singleton has the second-most rushing yards by a Penn State freshman in a season, trailing only Saquon Barkley (1,076; 2015).
- Singleton rushed for 73 yards and scored on a 1-yard run at Indiana.

- Allen had a 22-yard reception against Ohio. He rushed for 31 yards at Purdue and 23 yards vs. the Bobcats.
- Allen rushed for 52 yards and two touchdowns on nine carries at Auburn. His touchdowns came on runs of 3 and 6 yards.
- Against Central Michigan, Allen rushed for 111 yards, on 13 carries, marking the first 100-yard rushing game of his career.
- Allen scored on a 14-yard run in the second quarter. It was his third career touchdown.
- Allen had a career-long 37-yard run in the fourth quarter.
- For his efforts, Allen was named Big Ten Freshman of the Week.
- Allen collected 86 yards on a career-best 21 carries against Northwestern.
- Allen scored on a 1-yard run at Michigan, his fourth touchdown of the season.
- He rushed for 77 yards on 15 carries against Minnesota.
- Allen totaled 158 scrimmage yards at Indiana. He rushed for 86 yards and three touchdowns on 18 carries, while adding catches of 27 and 45 yards.
- Allen scored on runs of 11, 6 and 6 yards against the Hoosiers.
- Allen's three rushing touchdowns are the most by a Nittany Lion since Journey Brown's three scores against Rutgers in 2019.
- Allen is the first Penn State freshman with three rushing touchdowns in a game since Austin Scott against Kent State in 2003.
- Allen ranks seventh among FBS freshmen in total rushing yards (558), eighth averaging 5.17 yards per carry and ninth in rushing yards per game (62.0).
- With Allen's 111-yard rushing performance vs. CMU, Penn State has had two true freshmen running backs post 100-yard games in a single season for the first time since 2019, when Ford (once) and Noah Cain (twice) each eclipsed the 100-yard plateau.
- Penn State is the only FBS school with two true freshman who have rushed for 100 yards in a game this season.
- Penn State is also the only school with two players with 500+ rushing yards and 8+ rushing touchdowns this season.
- Since 2000, Allen and Singleton are two of 12 Penn State players (13 occasions) with 500+ rushing yards and 8+ rushing touchdowns in a season.
- Allen and Singleton are combining to average 137.4 rushing yards per game. They rank 31st among FBS running back duos, 19th among Power Five running back duos and first among freshmen duos.
- The Allen-Singleton duo are averaging more rushing yards per game than 48 FBS teams (six Big Ten teams).
- Allen and Singleton are tied third among FBS freshmen with eight rushing touchdowns.
- The Nittany Lions had two freshmen running backs (Allen and Singleton) each score two touchdowns against Auburn. Since at least 2000, they are the only Penn State freshmen to both score two rushing touchdowns in a game.
- Allen and Singleton became the first PSU freshmen duo to score a rushing touchdown in the same game for the first time since Noah Cain (13 yards) and Devyn Ford (1 yard) against Pitt in 2019.
- Sophomore Keyvone Lee has collected 1,062 career rushing yards (4.8 yards per carry) and six touchdowns. He also has 30 catches for 219 yards and a touchdown.
- Lee surpassed the 1,000 career rushing yard mark against Auburn. He became the 46th Nittany Lion to reach 1,000 career rushing yards.
- The sophomore is a member of the Doak Walker Award watch list.
- Against Purdue, Lee caught the game-winning 10-yard touchdown reception with 57 seconds remaining. It was his first career touchdown reception.
- Lee rushed for 40 yards on 10 carries against Northwestern.



TIGHT ENDS NOTES

- Tight ends coach Ty Howle enters his second season coaching the Penn State tight ends and his third season overall on the staff
- Howle served as an offensive analyst in 2020, working closely with the offensive line and tight ends.
- Howle was a four-year letterwinner on the Penn State offensive line from 2009-13. He started at center and left guard and was a four-time Academic All-Big Ten selection. He was a team captain in 2013.
- Howle played in 47 career games for the NIttany Lions, making 13 starts. He graduated in 2013 with a bachelor's degree in kinesioloay.
- Since James Franklin took over the program in 2014, three PSU tight ends have been taken in the NFL Draft, tied for eighth in the nation during that span (Pat Freiermuth – 2021, 2nd round; Mike Gesicki - 2018, 2nd round; Jesse James -2015, 5th round).
- An experienced tight end group, which has combined for 85 career games and 39 starts, looks to continue a strong tight end tradition.
- Redshirt junior Brenton Strange leads the group and has appeared in 33 career games for the Nittany Lions, making 27 starts.
- Strange paces PSU tight ends with 287 receiving yards. He is tied for the team lead with four touchdown receptions.
- Late in the second guarter at Purdue, Strange caught a pass along the sideline and fought off multiple Boilermakers for a 67-yard touchdown. It was Strange's longest career reception.
- Strange led the Nittany Lions with six catches for 80 yards at Auburn, including 59 yards after the catch.
- Strange caught five passes for 42 yards against Central Michigan, including touchdown receptions of 4 and 3 yards for his first career multi-touchdown catch game.
- Strange had a 20-yard touchdown grab vs. Northwestern and a 25-yard catch at Indiana.
- With his four receiving TDs this year, Strange has already set a career high for a season.
- Strange (8), sophomore Theo Johnson (7) and sophomore Tyler Warren (3) have combined for 18 20-plus yard receptions in their careers.
- Johnson and Strange are both on the Mackey Award watch list.
- Johnson had a career-high 75 yards on five receptions against Minnesota. The 75 yards included an 18-yard touchdown
- reception and a 25-yard grab. Johnson had a career-long 42-yard catch vs. Ohio State.
- Johnson hauled in a 4-yard score at Indiana. He added a 29yard grab.
- In his first career start, Warren had three catches for 23 yards at Purdue. The sophomore made a key 15-yard catch to setup the game-winning touchdown in the fourth guarter.
- Warren made a 38-yard touchdown grab against the Gophers. It was his second career touchdown reception and the longest catch of his career.
- Redshirt freshman Khalil Dinkins caught a 28-yard touchdown pass in the fourth quarter vs. Ohio, his first career reception and touchdown reception.
- Dinkins had a 17-yard catch at Indiana

WIDE RECEIVER NOTES

- Offensive recruiting coordinator/wide receivers coach Taylor Stubblefield is in his third season on the Penn State staff.
- As a player, Stubblefield caught 325 passes, which was an NCAA record at the completion of his career at Purdue.
- He still owns the Big Ten record for career receptions and ranks second in conference history with 3,629 yards.
- Stubblefield was a consensus All-American and a finalist for the Biletnikoff Award in 2004.
- Leading the wideout room is Parker Washington, who has caught a pass in all 31 games of his career.
- He led PSU with six receptions and 64 receiving yards vs. CMU.
- Washington tallied seven catches for 70 yards and a 35-yard touchdown against Minnesota.
- The sophomore earned career highs with 11 receptions for 179 yards. He had a 58-yard touchdown reception to go with catches of 27 and 26 yards.
- He joined Jahan Dotson as the only PSU players to have multiple 100-yard receiving games against Ohio State.
- He has 30 career receptions of 20+ yards, including 10 in 2022.
- The sophomore owns 145 career receptions, ranking ninth alltime at Penn State.
- Washington's 100 receptions in his first two seasons of his career are second-most ever at Penn State for a player in their first two years, trailing only DaeSean Hamilton (127 combined in 2014 and 2015).
- Washington and transfer Mitchell Tinsley (168) both have over 100 career receptions.
- Washington has recorded 1,906 career receiving yards, good for 12th in program history.
- With Tinsley (2,206) and Washington, Penn State has two players over 1,500 career receiving yards.
- Tinsley (22) and Washington (12) both have double-digit career receiving touchdowns.
- Tinsley and Washington were two of 30 FBS receivers entering the 2022 season with at least 100 receptions, 1,300 receiving yards and 10 receiving touchdowns in their career.
- Tinsley and Washington are both on the Biletnikoff Award watch list, while Washington is also on the Earl Campbell Tyler Rose Award watch list.
- KeAndre Lambert-Smith (521), Tinsley and Washington each recorded over 500 receiving yards last season. Penn State entered the season as one of nine FBS teams, and one of six Power Five teams, with three receivers on the roster who tallied 500+ receiving yards in 2021.
- Lambert-Smith has started 24 career games and had a reception in 20-straight games, before his streak was snapped against Northwestern.
- The sophomore had four catches for 58 yards at Purdue, including a 29-yard touchdown reception in the fourth guarter.
- Lambert-Smith completed a 25-yard pass to Sean Clifford against Auburn.
- It was Penn State's first pass completed by a receiver since Jahan Dotson's 21-yard completion to Washington against Indiana in 2021.

- Lambert-Smith scored on a 23-yard reception against Ohio State. He added a 35-yard grab.
- Penn State welcomed Tinsley as a transfer this past offseason. Tinsley spent the previous two seasons at Western Kentucky.
- Tinsley had a team-high seven catches for 84 yards at Purdue.
- He had a 27-yard reception on PSU's game-winning drive in the fourth quarter at Purdue.
- · The senior hauled in a 12-yard touchdown reception in the second quarter against Ohio, his first reception and first touchdown as a Nittany Lion.
- Tinsley made a 34-yard grab against Auburn.
- The senior made a 5-vard touchdown catch in the first guarter against Central Michigan. He added a 29-yard catch in the game.
- Tinsley had five catches for 57 yards at Michigan.
- The senior collected four catches for 58 yards and a 20-yard score against Minnesota. He added a 30-yard catch.
- · Tinsley had five catches vs. Ohio State.
- Tinsley recorded a team-high five receptions for 63 yards at Indiana, including a 27-yard grab.

- · The Nittany Lions had a program-record 17 different passcatchers against Ohio.
- Since 1960, Penn State has had 11 seasons with 17 players catching at least one pass. The Nittany Lions had 17 pass catchers in the Ohio game.
- Against Ohio, redshirt freshman Liam Clifford, redshirt freshman Jaden Dottin, freshman Omari Evans, freshman Kaden Saunders and redshirt freshman Harrison Wallace III all made their first career receptions.
- Clifford had a 20-yard reception against Central Michigan.
- Clifford had three catches for 31 yards at Indiana.
- Evans hauled in a 32-yard touchdown pass in the third guarter, his first career reception and first career touchdown reception, against Ohio.
- · Dottin made his first career start vs. Ohio.
- Wallace had four receptions for 35 vards against the Bobcats and a 26-yard reception vs. Central Michigan.
- Wallace hauled in a career-long 48-yard reception at Michigan. It's Penn State's longest reception by a wide receiver this season.

- He was named to the American Football Coaches Association (AFCA) Class of 2021"35 Under 35"list, recognizing the top-35 football coaches under the age of 35. He was the only Big Ten coach and the only offensive line coach on the 2021 list.
- In his two seasons at Penn State, Trautwein has helped seven Penn State offensive linemen to earn All-Big Ten honors.
- He's coached 17 All-Conference selections over the last four seasons, which includes a stint at Boston College as the offensive line coach.
- Trautwein was a two-time All-SEC selection and two-time team captain as a left tackle at Florida, earning first-team honors in 2008 and second-team accolades in 2006.
- He was part of the Gators winning the BCS National Championship and SEC titles in the 2006 and 2008 seasons.
- Redshirt senior center Juice Scruggs leads the offensive line
 unit and began the season on the Rimington Trophy watch list.
- Scruggs has made 22 career starts on the offensive line, including starting at center in all eight games this season.
- Redshirt junior tackle **Caedan Wallace** has 27 starts at right tackle and owns 33 career appearances.
- Sophomore **Olumuyiwa Fashanu** has appeared in 17 games and made 10 starts at left tackle.
- In 49 pass protections against Purdue, Fashanu allowed zero pressures.
- Fashanu also allowed zero pressures against Ohio.
- According to Coaches By The Numbers, Fashanu (285 pass plays) and Scruggs (283) have not allowed a sack this season.
- Sophomore Nick Dawkins, redshirt senior Bryce Effner and redshirt freshman Landon Tengwall also saw playing time on the line in 2021.
- Redshirt junior Sal Wormley has started nine games and returns after missing the 2021 season due to injury.
- Tengwall and Wormley made their first career starts at Purdue.
- Redshirt senior **Hunter Nourzad** made his first Penn State start at Michigan.
- Freshman **Drew Shelton** made his first career start at Indiana.
- The Nittany Lions allowed no sacks against Auburn, Northwestern or Minnesota.
- Penn State didn't allow a sack against Auburn in 2021 or 2022.
- The Nittany Lions rank 33rd in the nation allowing 1.44 sacks per game.
- Against the Tigers, the Penn State offensive line paved the way for the Nittany Lions to rush for 245 yards and five touchdowns.
- The PSU offensive line helped the Nittany Lions to rush for 220 yards against Northwestern, including three players over 40 yards.
- Penn State rushed for 175 yards and two scores against Minnesota.
- PSU gained 179 yards and scored four times on the ground at Indiana.
- Allen scored three rushing touchdowns, becoming first Penn State freshman with three rushing touchdowns in a game since Austin Scott against Kent State in 2003.
- The Nittany Lion offensive line has aided **Nicholas Singleton** to rank second in the nation in 30+ yard runs (6) and 40+ yard runs (5) and third in 50+ yard runs (3).
- The Penn State offensive line has helped Singleton and **Kaytron Allen** to earn 100-yard rushing games this season.
- Allen and Singleton both have two multi-rushing touchdown games this season.


DEFENSIVE NOTES

- Manny Diaz was hired as Penn State's defensive coordinator and linebackers coach on Dec. 11, 2021.
- Diaz, who has 24 years of collegiate coaching experience, including three as a head coach and 13 as a defensive coordinator, joined the Nittany Lions after spending six seasons (2016-21) at the University of Miami, including three seasons as head coach (2019-21), where he coached the Hurricanes to three bowl appearances.
- Defenses under Diaz have been a force behind the line of scrimmage. From 2018-20, Miami's defense featured at least one player with 15 tackles for loss: Jaelan Phillips (15.5) in 2020, Gregory Rousseau (19.5) in 2019 and Jonathan Garvin (18.0) in 2018.
- During Diaz's tenure in Miami, the Hurricanes ranked in the top 10 nationally in tackles for loss each year. Miami was No. 9 in 2021 (7.75 per game), No. 4 in 2020 (8.6), No. 4 in 2019 (8.3), No. 1 in 2018 (10.5), No. 4 in 2017 (8.5) and No. 5 in 2016 (8.3).
- Penn State tallied a school-record 16 pass breakups at Purdue, including six by CB Joey Porter Jr. and four by S Keaton Ellis.
- Penn State's school-record 16 pass breakups at Purdue are the most by an FBS team in a game since Tulane had 20 vs. East Carolina in 2018.
- Porter's six pass breakups are a school record and tied a Big Ten single-game record.
- His six pass breakups are the most by an FBS player since Houston's William Jackson III had seven against Temple in 2015.
- PSU limited Ohio to 264 total yards.
- Penn State caused a safety in the second quarter vs. Ohio, its first safety since 2018 at Pitt (holding in the end zone).
- Against Ohio, the Nittany Lions snapped a streak of 20-straight games forcing a turnover. In those 20 games, Penn State forced 29 total turnovers (19 interceptions, 10 fumbles).
- At Auburn, Penn State recorded 11 tackles for loss and six sacks.
- Penn State forced four takeaways (two fumbles, two interceptions). It was the Nittany Lions' first time with four takeaways since the Michigan State game in 2019.
- Against the Tigers, 28 Penn State players played double-digit snaps on defense.
- The Nittany Lions recorded four takeaways against Central Michigan, marking their second-straight game with four takeaways, the first time that the Nittany Lions have forced at least four turnovers in two straight games since forcing four by both Virginia and Navy early in the 2012 season.
- Penn State registered 9 pass breakups in the first half and 13 in the CMU game. The Nittany Lions recorded double-digit pass breakups in a game for the second time this season.
- The Nittany Lions held Northwestern to just 31 yards rushing on 28 carries. The Nittany Lions held Northwestern to zero or negative yards on 14 of the Wildcats' 28 rushes.
- Penn State held Northwestern without a first down in the first quarter and forced five three-and-outs to start the game, the most to start a game since seven against Idaho in 2019 and the most against a Big Ten foe since 2011 vs. Illinois (six).
- The Nittany Lions forced three turnovers against the Wildcats (two fumbles, one interception).
- Penn State forced 11 turnovers in a three-game span (Auburn, Central Michigan, Northwestern), the most in any three-game stretch since forcing 13 in 1996 (5 vs. Northwestern, 5 vs. Michigan, 3 vs. Michigan State).
- At Michigan, LB Curtis Jacobs recorded a 47-yard pick-six in the second quarter. It was PSU's first pick-six since Daequan Hardy's 17-yard interception return at Michigan State in 2021.
- The Nittany Lions held Michigan to 145 passing yards and limited Minnesota to 175 passing yards.
- Penn State held Minnesota to 2-of-13 (15.3 percent) on third down. The Gophers began the game 0-of-6 after entering the game with an FBS-leading 66.2 conversion percentage.
- The Nittany Lions held Ohio State to 98 rushing yards.
- PSU also forced a red-zone stop against the Buckeyes, after OSU entered the game with a perfect red-zone conversion rate.
- Penn State finished the Indiana game with 16 tackles for loss and six sacks.

- The 16 tackles for loss are tied for the most in program history. Penn State had 16 tackles for loss against Kent State in 2018.
- The Nittany Lions recorded eight tackles for loss and three sacks in the first quarter. Penn State finished the first half with 13 tackles for loss and six sacks.
- The Nittany Lions had 11 players record at least one tackle for loss. The 11 players with a full tackle for loss are the most in a game for Penn State since the tackle for loss became an official stat.
- Penn State has limited six opponents to less than 100 rushing yards this season (Purdue, 61; Ohio, 99; Central Michigan, 88; Northwestern, 31; Ohio State, 98; Indiana, 65).
- Penn State leads the country with 63 pass breakups, 13 more than any other FBS team.
- The 63 PBUs are Penn State's most since 74 in 1998.
- The Nittany Lions have three players who rank among the Top 50 in the pass breakups per game.
- CB Kalen King and Porter Jr. are tied fourth in the nation with 11 pass breakups. King also has one interception.
- CB Johnny Dixon has seven breakups, tied 49th in the nation, and an interception.
- The Nittany Lions have 12 players who have recorded at least one sack this season, tied seventh-most in the nation and thirdmost among Power Five teams.
- The Nittany Lions hold 21st in the country with 17 takeaways this season (seven fumble recoveries, 10 interceptions).
- Penn State has held opponents to a 53.7 completion percentage (180-of-335), good for eighth in the country and third among Power Five teams.
- PSU has held three teams under a 50 completion percentage this season (Ohio, 42.5; Northwestern, 40.5; Minnesota 40.9).
- Penn State leads the Big Ten with 64 tackles for loss.
- Twenty-one different Nittany Lions have at least a full tackle for loss.
- The Nittany Lions hold sixth in the nation in passing efficiency defense (108.67).
- Penn State sits 13th in the country in red zone defense, allowing a 73.5 conversion rate. The Nittany Lions have made nine red zone stops this season.
- Over the last eight seasons, PSU sits second nationally in sacks per game (2.96; trailing only Clemson), third in QB hurries (939), fourth in total pressures generated (1,408), fifth in fewest passing TDs allowed per game (1.08), seventh in fewest passing yards per attempt (6.30), seventh in tackles for loss percentage (10.57) and 13th in fewest rushing yards per attempt (3.63).
- Penn State's 287 sacks over the last eight years (2015-22) are fourth behind Clemson (354), Alabama (342) and Pitt (314).
- Over the last eight years, Penn State has accumulated a 8.30 percent sack percentage (287 sacks on 4,034 plays), which ranks ninth in the FBS.
- Since 2014, Penn State has held opponents to seven or less points 24 times, seventh-most among FBS teams. Eighteen of those 24 games have been against Big Ten opponents.
- In the James Franklin era, Penn State has recorded seven shutouts, tied fifth-most among FBS teams.
- Penn State also has the fifth-most shutouts (12) in the FBS since 2007.
- Since 2014, PSU has held an opponent under 300 total yards 48 times, eighth-most among FBS teams.
- Since 2014, the Nittany Lions have allowed less than 200
 passing yards in 62 games, tied for the seventh-most among
 FBS teams, and have held opponents under 100 passing yards
 in 16 games in that span, tied 12th-most among FBS teams.
- Since 2014, Penn State has held opponents under 100 rushing yards on 45 occasions, 12th-most among FBS teams, and have held opponents under 50 rushing yards in 16 games, also 12thmost among FBS teams.
- Penn State has registered 10 or more tackles for loss 27 times since 2014, third-most among FBS teams.
- The Nittany Lions have forced multiple takeaways in a game on 46 occasions since 2014 and four times in 2022.

- In Scott's first two seasons at Penn State, the Nittany Lions had three first-team All-Big Ten selections in Odafe (Jayson) Oweh and Shaka Toney in 2020 and Arnold Ebiketie in 2021.
- Six Nittany Lions earned All-Big Ten accolades in the last two seasons.
- · The Nittany Lions defensive line room features 2021 All-Big Ten honoree DT PJ Mustipher.
- Mustipher, a senior and second-year team captain, anchors the Nittany Lion defensive line room, having appeared in 49 career games and making 25 starts. In his Penn State career, Mustipher owns 134 tackles, 11.0 tackles for loss and three sacks.
- Mustipher began the season on watch lists for the Comeback Player of the Year Award, Rotary Lombardi Award, Bronko Nagurski Trophy and Outland Trophy.
- · The senior led Penn State with six tackles (three solo) against Central Michigan and eight tackles (four solo) vs. Northwestern. He added a half-tackle for loss against the Wildcats.

- Diaz, who has 24 years of collegiate coaching experience, including three as a head coach and 13 as a defensive coordinator, joins the Nittany Lions after spending six seasons (2016-21) at the University of Miami, including three seasons as head coach (2019-21).
- Collins, who has 24 years of collegiate coaching experience, joins the Nittany Lions after spending the 2021 season as Boise State's special teams coordinator and edge coach.
- During the 2021 campaign, Collins' special teams unit blocked three punts (T-7th nationally) and four kicks overall to rank ninth in FBS. Of the three blocked punts, two were returned for touchdowns.
- · Losey, who was previously associate director of performance enhancement for football, will lead the performance enhancement staff for football. He replaces Dwight Galt III, who retired.

LETTERMEN MAKING THEIR RETURN

- Nine members of the coaching and support staff played at PSU.
- · Associate head coach/cornerbacks coach Terry M. Smith was a three-year starter at wide receiver from 1989-91. He ranks tied for 10th in career receiving touchdowns (15), 13th in career receiving yardage (1,825) and 14th in career receptions (108).
- Tight ends coach **Ty Howle** was a four-year letterwinner on the Penn State offensive line from 2009-13. He played in 47 career games, making 13 starts. The 2013 team captain made starts at center and left guard and was a four-time Academic All-Big Ten selection.
- Defensive graduate assistant Deion Barnes made 31 starts as a Nittany Lion from 2012-14. In 2014, Barnes tallied 12.5 tackles for loss and six sacks. He led PSU with 10 tackles for loss and six sacks in 2012 to earn consensus freshman All-American honors.
- Analyst and analytics coordinator Dan Connor was a two-time first team All-America linebacker for Penn State in 2006 and 2007, the 14th Nittany Lion to be named a two-time first-team All-American. He finished his career as Penn State's all-time leader with 419 tackles.
- · Analyst and analytics coordinator Danny Rocco lettered as a linebacker for the Nittany Lions in 1979 and 1980, playing for the Liberty and Fiesta Bowl teams.
- · Assistant director of performance enhancement Tyrone Smith was a defensive tackle for PSU and lettered during the 2014 season.
- · Assistant recruiting coordinator Alan Zemaitis was a four-year letterman and three-time All-Big Ten selection for the blue and white from 2002-05. Zemaitis sits tied fifth all-time at Penn State with 12 career interceptions. He also holds fifth all-time at Penn State with 46 passes defended. Zemaitis helped the Nittany Lions to a Big Ten Championship in 2005.
- Director of football academic services Todd Kulka lettered as a linebacker and graduated in 1995. He helped Penn State to a 9-3 record and an Outback Bowl victory in 1995.
- Director of the football letterman's club Wally Richardson was a four-year letterman as a quarterback in 1992 and 1994-96. Richardson ranks 12th all-time at Penn State with 4,419 career passing yards. He also sits eighth all-time with 378 completions and 12th all-time with 27 touchdown passes.

- Porter had a pass breakup and a QB hurry vs. Minnesota.
- Redshirt junior **Daequan Hardy** accounted for two tackles and two pass breakups, including a key breakup to force a Purdue punt late in the fourth quarter.
- Hardy forced a fumble in the third quarter at Michigan.
- Hardy picked off a pass and returned it 18 yards at Indiana.
- King recorded one pass breakup at Purdue, had another pass breakup at Auburn and one vs. Northwestern.
- King forced and recovered a fumble against Central Michigan, his second career forced fumble and first recovery. He also broke up a career-best four passes.

- Penn State's linebacker corps is led by 2021 All-Big Ten honoree Curtis Jacobs, who has played in 29 career games and made 20 starts.
- The sophomore made five stops, a half-tackle for loss and a pass breakup against Ohio.
- Jacobs collected three tackles, including a solo sack, at Auburn.
- Jacobs earned his first career fumble recovery on a muffed punt by Central Michigan. He added three solo tackles in the game. Jacobs also recovered a fumble against Northwestern.
- The Maryland native recorded a 47-yard pick-six in the second quarter at Michigan. It was his second career interception and first career pick-six.
- Jacobs registered a career-high 14 tackles (7 solo) and two tackles for loss vs. Minnesota. He had six tackles in the first quarter.
- Redshirt senior Jonathan Sutherland brings a wealth of experience to the linebackers room, having played in 54 career games. Sutherland made the switch to a full-time linebacker (from safety) for the 2022 season.

- Sutherland is a semifinalist for the National Football Foundation's William V. Campbell Trophy and was on the preseason Paul Hornung Award watch list.
- Sutherland notched three tackles, including his first career full sack, and his 100th career tackle at Purdue.
- The senior tallied his first career fumble recovery at Auburn.
- Sophomore Tyler Elsdon led the Nittany Lions with six tackles (three solo) against Ohio. He recorded four tackles and a tackle for loss at Auburn.
- Freshman Abdul Carter and redshirt freshman Dominic DeLuca each notched five tackles against Ohio.
- Carter was named a semifinalist for the Shaun Alexander Freshman of the Year Award.
- Carter made a six stops (all solo) at Auburn, tying for the team lead. Carter added his first career sack, and tackle for loss, and forced a fumble in the second quarter, his first career forced fumble.
- Carter registered a tackle for loss vs. Northwestern and a solo tackle for loss at Michigan, while recording five tackles (four solo) against the Wolverines.
- Making his first career start, Carter collected a career-best eight tackles against Minnesota.
- Carter had four tackles and a solo sack vs. Ohio State.
- Redshirt freshman Kobe King collected a career-best eight tackles, including 2.5 for loss, at Indiana.
- King had five tackles (four solo) at Auburn.
- Redshirt senior Charlie Katshir registered a solo tackle for loss at Indiana.
- Linebacker Micah Parsons was selected 12th overall by the Dallas Cowboys in the 2021 NFL Draft.
- Parsons was the highest drafted Penn State defensive player since Aaron Maybin went 11th overall to the Buffalo Bills in 2009.
- Penn State has 71 linebackers drafted all-time, the most for any school.

- Co-Defensive coordinator/safeties coach **Anthony Poindexter** is in his second season on the Nittany Lion coaching staff.
- Poindexter has 18 years of collegiate coaching experience, including seven as a defensive or co-defensive coordinator.
- As a player, Poindexter was a two-time consensus All-American at Virginia and was chosen as the 1998 ACC Defensive Player of the Year.
- Poindexter was inducted into the College Football Hall of Fame in 2020
- Senior **Ji'Ayir Brown** leads the Penn State safeties.
- Brown earned Big Ten Defensive Player of the Week honors after collecting five tackles (four solo), a solo sack, a forced fumble and an interception at Auburn. The strip-sack, in the third quarter, was his first career sack and second career forced fumble. The captain added an interception, returning it 27 yards.
- Brown was also named Bronko Nagurski National Defensive Player of the Week following his performance at Auburn.
- Brown intercepted a pass and returned it 30 yards against Northwestern for his eighth career interception.
- He also had a solo tackle for loss against the Wildcats to go with six tackles (five solo).
- Brown notched a team-high nine tackles (seven solo) at Michigan, including a solo tackle for loss. He had seven tackles in the first quarter.
- Brown had seven tackles and an interception against Minnesota. He returned the interception 35 yards.
- He had a team-high eight tackles vs. Ohio State. He added a solo sack at Indiana.
- Since 2000, Brown has the third most career interception return yards (204) at Penn State, trailing only Alan Zemaitis (269; 2003-05) and Anthony Scirrotto (234; 2005-08).
- Brown has had a hand in 12 takeaways as a Nittany Lion (nine interceptions, two forced fumbles, one fumble recovery).
- Brown is on the watch lists for the Bednarik Award and Jim Thorpe Award.
- Junior Keaton Ellis brings a wealth of experience to the Penn State secondary, having appeared in 39 career games, making 16 starts.
- In his career, Ellis owns three forced fumbles, one fumble recovery, an interception and 10 pass breakups. He has six pass breakups this year.
- He tallied a career-best four pass breakups at Purdue.
- Ellis had five tackles and a solo tackle for loss vs. Ohio State.
- Redshirt freshman Zakee Wheatley forced a fumble at Purdue, which led to a touchdown drive at the end of the second quarter.
- Wheatley recorded his first career interception in the first quarter at Auburn.
- Wheatley also had an interception against Central Michigan, returning it 34 yards. He also had a career-high five tackles.
- Sophomore Jaylen Reed made three tackles in each game against Purdue, Auburn, Central Michigan and Northwestern.
- Reed recorded four tackles at Michigan and a career-high five tackles, including a tackle for loss, at Indiana.
- Freshman Kevin Winston Jr. made his debut against Ohio, recording three tackles.

2023 HALL OF FAME BALLOT

- Penn State lettermen Ki-Jana Carter, D.J. Dozier and Paul Posluszny have been selected as a part of the national ballot for the National Football Foundation's College Hall of Fame's Class of 2023. A total of 80 players and nine coaches from FBS are on the 2023 ballot.
- The trio of standouts have an opportunity to join 20 former Nittany Lion players and five Penn State coaches who have been inducted into the Hall.
- Also on the Hall of Fame ballot is former Nittany Lion studentathlete Glenn Killinger, who is among the candidates for the divisional coach Class of 2023. Killinger was inducted into the Hall of Fame as a player in 1966.
- Carter, a running back for the Nittany Lions, was a first-team All-American during the 1994 campaign. Carter staked a claim to being one of the most decorated Penn State running backs of all-time with a junior season in which he was fourth nationally in rushing (139.9), second in scoring (10.8 ppg) and fifth in allpurpose yardage (158.4). The Westerville, Ohio native led the Big Ten in all three categories. His 7.8 yards per carry was easily the best among the nation's Top 25 rushers. His 1994 statistics included 1,539 yards rushing, the then-No. 2 season total in Penn State history, and 23 touchdowns. Carter was runner-up for the Heisman Trophy and a finalist for the Maxwell Award. He was named co-MVP of the Rose Bowl with 156 rushing yards on 21 carries, including an 83-yard touchdown run on the Nittany Lions' first offensive play. When the Cincinnati Bengals selected Carter as the first overall player picked in the 1995 NFL Draft, he became the first Nittany Lion to be chosen No. 1.
- Dozier, a tailback for the Nittany Lions, matriculated to Happy Valley from Virginia Beach, Va. He earned first team All-America honors from the Walter Camp Football Foundation in 1986. Dozier is the only Nittany Lion to the lead the team in rushing four consecutive seasons, doing so from 1983-86. He ranks No. 5 on the school career rushing yardage list with 3,2227 yards, scoring 25 touchdowns and averaging 5.2 yards per attempt. Dozier gained 1,002 yards as a freshman and tallied 811 yards and 10 touchdowns as a senior and one of the instrumental players on the Nittany Lions' 12-0 squad. Dozier was the Most Valuable Offensive Player of the Game after rushing for 99 yards and scoring the game-winning touchdown in the fourth quarter against Miami in the 1987 Fiesta Bowl to secure Penn State's second national championship.
- Posluszny, an outside linebacker for the Nittany Lions, was a first-team All-American in 2005 and 2006. Posluszny became just the second two-time winner of the Chuck Bednarik Award, presented to the nation's top defensive player, in 2006. In 2005, he also won the Butkus Award, presented to the nation's top linebacker and was a finalist for the 2006 honor. The 13th Nittany Lion to be named a two-time first-team All-American, Posluszny also was a two-time finalist for the Rotary Lombardi Award. The Nittany Lions' first two-time team captain since 1968-69, he became Penn State's career tackle leader with 372. A starter in the last 37 games of his career, Posluszny became the first Nittany Lion to lead the team in tackles three times and to post three 100-tackle seasons, recording 116 in 2006. Posluszny also was a two-time first-team ESPN the Magazine Academic All-American and was selected the 2006 Academic All-American of the Year among Division I football players.
- From Harrisburg, Killinger was a Walter Camp All-American at quarterback for the Nittany Lions in 1921. He coached at Dickinson (1922), Rensselaer (1927-32), Moravian (1933) and West Chester (1934-41, 45-59). Killinger is the winningest coach in West Chester history and is a member of the Pennsylvania Sports Hall of Fame. He died in 1988.
- Penn State has 26 players and coaches who are members of the College Football Hall of Fame. Six coaches and 20 players have earned their way into the hall of fame.
- LaVar Arrington will be inducted into the College Football Hall of Fame on December 6, 2022 at the 64th National Football Foundation (NFF) Annual Awards Dinner.

SPECIAL TEAMS NOTES

- Stacy Collins is in his first season as Penn State's special teams coordinator/outside linebacker/nickels coach.
- Collins, who has 24 years of collegiate coaching experience, joined the Nittany Lions after spending the 2021 season as Boise State's special teams coordinator and edge coach.
- Since 2019, Penn State's kick return defense ranks fourth in the nation in percentage of kickoffs returned (16.2; 1st in B1G), tied-fourth in average kick return yards allowed (17.2; 2nd), fifth in touchback percentage (75.0; 1st), seventh in percentage of kickoffs returned inside the 25 (73.8; 2nd) and tied 11th in average opponent field position (25.2; 4th).
- Also since 2019, Penn State's punt return defense is second in the country in punts inside the 10 (20.3 percent; 2nd B1G), ranked third in punts inside the 20 (45.5 percent; 2nd) and fifth in net punting (41.5; 2nd).
- Senior K Jake Pinegar ranks second all-time at Penn State with 176 career extra points and sits tied ninth in career extra point percentage (96.2).
- Pinegar is tied fifth all-time at Penn State with a 73.8 field goal percentage. He's also tied sixth in field goal attempts (61) and tied fifth in field goals made (45). The lowa native is also third on the all-time scoring list with 311 career points.
- Pinegar converted all five extra points at Purdue and hit five extra points, and a 25-yard field goal, vs. Ohio.
- Pinegar hit field goals of 48 and 22 yards against Auburn as well as all five extra point attempts. He hit a 38-yard field goal and both extra point attempts vs. Northwestern.
- He had four extra points and a 44-yard field goal against Ohio State.
- Pinegar hit a career-long 50-yard field goal and made six extra points at Indiana.
- Senior SN Chris Stoll is in his fourth season as Penn State's primary long snapper. He's appeared in 43 career games.
- The captain is a member of the Patrick Mannelly Award watch list. He is on the Allstate AFCA Good Works Team watch list.
- Redshirt senior P Barney Amor has placed 17 of his 37 punts inside the 20 (45.9 percent), ranking ninth in the country, and is second in the nation in percentage of punts inside the 10 (32.4 percent).
- He's tied second in the nation in total punts inside the 10 (12) and is tied 24th with 17 punts inside the 20. Amor has 10 punts of 50+ yards.
- Amor ranks 19th in the FBS and sixth in the Big Ten with a 44.6 punt average. The 44.6 average is the second-best in a season at PSU.
- The redshirt senior is a member of the Ray Guy Award watch list.
- Amor was awarded a scholarship during preseason camp.
- Amor set a career high with eight punt attempts at Purdue, including a 52-yard punt and landed three punts inside the 20, including two inside the 10.
- Against Ohio, Amor landed two punts inside the 20 and hit two punts of 50+ yards to earn Ray Guy Great 8 honors.
- At Auburn, Amor placed two punts inside the 20.
- Against Central Michigan, Amor landed three punts inside the 10, placing them at the CMU 6, 10 and 3. He added a 51-yard punt.
- Amor placed four of his five punts inside the 20 against Northwestern, including three punts inside the 10. He landed punts at the 7-, 4- and 8-yard lines. Amor was named Big Ten Special Teams Player of the Week.
- At Michigan, Amor had a 50-yard punt which landed at the Michigan 17. He had a 59-yard punt vs. Ohio State.
- Amor landed two punts inside the 20 and drilled a 51-yard punt at Indiana.
- KR Nicholas Singleton ranks sixth in the Big Ten with a 19.1 kick return average.
- LB **Dominic DeLuca** blocked a punt against Minnesota, PSU's first since Journey Brown against Buffalo in 2019.
- S Jonathan Sutherland is wearing No. 0 for the thirdstraight season as the team's special teams leader as part of a new tradition that began in 2020.

GAME RECAP

WEST LAFAYETTE, Ind. - Sean Clifford connected with Keyvone Lee for a 10-yard touchdown to give the Penn State football team the lead with 57 seconds remaining as the Nittany Lions earned a 35-31 win over Purdue at Ross-Ade Stadium to begin the 2022 season.

Clifford completed 20-of-37 passes for 282 yards and a career-high-tying four passing touchdowns, while adding a 2-yard rushing score. Mitchell Tinsley caught seven passes for 84 yards and a touchdown in his Penn State debut, while KeAndre Lambert-Smith had four receptions for 58 yards and a touchdown. Brenton Strange added a 67-yard touchdown reception.

Joey Porter Jr. led the Nittany Lions with eight tackles to go with six pass breakups and a fumble recovery. Johnny Dixon and Jonathan Sutherland each had a sack, while Dixon broke up two passes. Keaton Ellis broke up four passes and Zakee Wheatley forced a fumble.

HOW IT HAPPENED

The Boilermakers got on the board first, finishing a 73-yard drive with a 36-yard field goal by Mitchell Fineran with 3:38 left in the first quarter.

Penn State answered with a 12-yard touchdown pass from Clifford to Tinsley with 13:09 left in the second quarter. The Nittany Lions finished a 12play, 79-yard drive as Clifford found a wide-open Tinsley on a crossing route. The drive was sparked by a 20-yard reception by Parker Washington and a 12yard catch by Devyn Ford. Penn State took a 7-3 lead.

Purdue responded with a touchdown drive, concluding with a 3-yard run by King Doerue. The Boilermakers' 75-yard drive was aided by a pair of penalties. Purdue led 10-7 with 9:43 left in the second quarter.

Penn State re-took the lead on a 2-yard touchdown rush by Clifford with 1:44 left in the first half. The eight-play, 43-yard drive including four runs by Nicholas Singleton and a 10-yard catch by Strange.

The Nittany Lions forced a turnover in Purdue territory with 30 seconds left in the half. On a reverse play, Wheatley knocked the ball loose and Porter Jr. recovered the ball at the Penn State 18.

Penn State took advantage of the turnover with a 67-yard touchdown reception by Strange. The redshirt junior caught the ball along the sideline and fought off multiple Boilermakers to break loose for the score and his longest career reception. Penn State held a 21-10 lead at the break. Purdue scored on a 2-yard run by Doerue on the opening drive of the

Purdue scored on a 2-yard run by Doerue on the opening drive of the second half. A 75-yard drive included a 22-yard pass from Aidan O'Connell to Charlie Jones.

The Boilermakers took the lead on a 7-yard touchdown pass from O'Connell to Jones late in the third quarter. Purdue engineered a 10-play, 81-yard drive, which included a 26-yard reception by Mershawn Rice and a 23-yard catch by Payne Durham. Purdue led 24-21 with 1:11 left in the third quarter.

The Nittany Lions answered with a 29-yard touchdown reception by Lambert-Smith in the fourth quarter. After forcing a three-and-out, Penn State started the drive at their own 45 yard-line. Clifford hit Mitchell Tinsley for a 17-yard reception and Kaytron Allen for a nine-yard pass. Clifford connected with Lambert-Smith on a slant and the sophomore spun out of a tackle and took it to the end zone. Penn State held a 28-24 lead with 10:44 remaining.

took it to the end zone. Penn State held a 28-24 lead with 10:44 remaining. Purdue re-took the lead on a 72-yard pick-six by Chris Jefferson to hold a 31-28 advantage with 8:29 to go.

After a key third-down pass breakup by Hardy to force a Purdue punt, the Nittany Lions took over on their own 20 yard-line with 2:22 remaining. The drive began with an 8-yard completion to Tinsley and a 7-yard

The drive began with an 8-yard completion to Tinsley and a 7-yard reception by Lambert-Smith. Two plays later, Clifford connected with Tinsley towards the sideline for a 27-yard catch-and-run to the Purdue 30. On secondand-five at the Purdue 25, Clifford hit Tyler Warren for a 15-yard gain to the Purdue 10. On the next play, Clifford rolled out to his right and lofted a pass to Lee, who took it into the end-zone for the go-ahead score. Penn State took a 35-31 lead with 57 seconds remaining.

GAME RECAP

UNIVERSITY PARK, Pa. – The Penn State Football team defeated Ohio, 46-10, in its 2022 home opener at Beaver Stadium.

BEAVER STADIUM | ABC | 9/10/22 | 107,306

Freshman Nicholas Singleton had a breakout-performance with 10 carries for 179 yards, including 70 and 44-yard touchdowns and a 48-yard run. Singleton's first career touchdown was Penn State's longest run since Journey Brown's 85-yard run versus Pitt in 2019. His 179 yards are a school record for a Beaver Stadium debut.

Singleton became the first Nittany Lion with multiple 40+ yard touchdown runs in a game since Larry Johnson at Indiana on Nov. 16, 2002 (touchdown runs of 41, 43 and 69 yards). He is the first Nittany Lion with three 40+ yard runs in a game since Johnson's performance against Indiana (runs of 41, 41, 43 and 69).

Penn State produced 572 total yards, with 234 on the ground and 338 in the air. Sean Clifford was 19-for-27 passing for 213 yards and a touchdown along with a 1-yard touchdown run. Seventeen Nittany Lions registered at least one catch, led by Parker Washington with four for 60 yards.

The Nittany Lions limited the Bobcats to just 264 yards, 16 first downs and just two plays over 20 yards. Tyler Elsdon had a team-high six tackles and Dominic DeLuca collected a team-high five solo tackles.

HOW IT HAPPENED

The Nittany Lions got on the board first as a 12-play, 77-yard drive finished with a 1-yard touchdown rush by Clifford. The redshirt senior completed all six passes attempted on the drive, tallying 62 yards. The drive included a 38-yard reception by Washington and a 15-yard grab by Tyler Warren. Clifford had a 15yard run to setup his touchdown rush. Penn State led 7-0 with 6:45 remaining in the first quarter.

Penn State needed just one play to score on its next drive as Singleton ran 70 yards for his first career touchdown, which doubled the Nittany Lions' lead with 2:28 left in the opening quarter.

Unable to score on a third-straight possession, Penn State responded with a safety on Ohio's first play of its drive. Pinned at the 1-yard line after a 45-yard punt by Barney Amor, the Bobcats botched a handoff in the endzone and were able to jump on the ball before a Nittany Lion defender could. Penn State added a field goal with 5:14 remaining in the second quarter

Penn State added a field goal with 5:14 remaining in the second quarter on Jake Pinegar's 25-yard kick.

Ohio got on the board in its final possession of the first half. The Bobcats turned in an eight-play, 75-yard drive capitalized by a one-yard rushing touchdown by Sieh Bangura.

Starting at its own 22-yard line with 1:29 left in the first half, Penn State effectively ran its two-minute offense for a 7-yard touchdown throw from Clifford to Mitchell Tinsley with 15 seconds left. Clifford made eight competitions for all 78 yards gained on the drive, including a 34-yard catch by Washington that preceded Tinsley's touchdown.

The Nittany Lions recorded the first score of the second half with a 32yard pass from Drew Allar to Omari Evans for both of their first collegiate touchdowns with 9:25 left in the third quarter. Starting from their 30-yard line, the five-play drive took only two minutes and eight seconds, which was aided by a 7-yard catch by Washington and 15-yard roughing the passer penalty added to it.

Singleton's second touchdown, of 44 yards, made it 40-7 with 4:33 left in the third quarter. All three plays in the 52-yard drive were Singleton rushes. Penn State's final touchdown was Allar's second touchdown, a 28-yard

pasts to Khall Dinkins for his first career touchdown, a minute and 16 seconds into the fourth quarter. The Nittany Lions orchestrated a 55-yard drive on nine plays, and the freshman quarterback accounted for all but one yard with four rushes for 17 yards and three completions for 37 yards.

Ohio notched a 21-yard field goal to complete a 15-play, 76-yard drive with 6:50 left in the game.

GAME RECAP

AUBURN, Ala. - The No. 22/23 Penn State football team exploded in the second half to earn a 41-12 win over Auburn on Saturday in Jordan-Hare Stadium. The Nittany Lions scored 17 unanswered points in the third quarter and outscored the Tigers, 27-6, in the second half.

GAME 3 **PENN STATE VS. AUBURN**

A balanced Penn State offense earned 477 total yards, including 245 on the ground and 232 through the air. Freshman Nicholas Singleton went over the 100-yard rushing mark for the second-straight game, tallying 124 yards and two touchdowns on 10 carries. Singleton had a 54-yard touchdown run and another 53-yard run. Fellow freshman Kaytron Allen added 52 yards and two touchdowns on the ground. Sean Clifford completed 14-of-19 passes for 178 yards and had a 7-yard touchdown run to go with a 25-yard reception.

The Penn State defense forced four takeaways, including two fumbles and two interceptions. The Nittany Lions recorded 11 tackles for loss and six sacks. Abdul Carter led Penn State with six tackles, including a sack, and a forced fumble. Ji'Ayir Brown added five tackles, a sack, a forced fumble and an interception. Adisa Isaac tallied three tackles for loss and a sack, while Chop Robinson registered a sack, a forced fumble and a fumble recovery. Zakee Wheatley made his first career interception.

Auburn threw for 296 yards. TJ Finley passed for 152 yards, while Robby Ashford had 144 yards and a touchdown. Jarguez Hunter had a 22-yard touchdown reception. Owen Pappoe led the Tigers with six tackles and a forced fumble.

HOW IT HAPPENED

Auburn got on the board with a 31-yard field goal by Anders Carlson. The Tigers led 3-0 with 8:20 to go in the opening quarter.

The Nittany Lions responded with a 9-play, 75-yard drive that ended with a 7-yard touchdown rush by Clifford. Allen had a 16-yard carry, while Mitchell Tinsley came up with two key catches on the drive, including a 34yard reception, to setup the Nittany Lions at the 7-yard line. Penn State led 7-3 with 4:21 remaining in the first quarter.

Wheatley came up with a key interception to end a potential Auburn scoring drive in the first quarter. On 3rd-and-6 at the Penn State 28-yard line, Finley was flushed out of the pocket and fired a throw that was caught by a diving Wheatley

Auburn cut its deficit to one with a field goal in the second quarter. A 12play, 67-yard drive ended with a 22-yard kick by Carlson. The Nittany Lions held a 7-6 advantage with 6:59 left in the second quarter.

The Nittany Lions extended their lead on a 3-yard touchdown rush by Allen in the second quarter. The drive was highlighted by a 25-yard pass from KeAndre Lambert-Smith to Clifford to setup Penn State inside the Auburn 10. Penn State led 14-6 with 1:46 remaining in the first half.

Another key takeaway led to a Penn State field goal in the third quarter. After a strip-sack by Brown, and a fumble recovery by Robinson, Penn State took over at the Auburn 30-yard line. Jake Pinegar converted a 48-yard kick.

Penn State took advantage of an interception by Brown to add another score late in the third quarter. A 27-yard return by Brown, and an Auburn penalty, set up Penn State at the Auburn 48-yard line. Parker Washington hauled in 26- and 17-yard passes from Clifford to setup a 6-yard touchdown run by Allen.

Auburn responded with a 22-yard touchdown reception by Hunter, from Ashford, to finish a 6-play, 65-yard drive. Auburn's two-point conversion attempt was no good.

Penn State answered with a 54-vard touchdown run by Singleton. The Nittany Lions tallied the final score of the day, a 22-yard field goal by Pinegar.

GAME RECAP

UNIVERSITY PARK, Pa. – The No. 14/15 Penn State football team used 19 unanswered points to defeat Central Michigan, 33-14, Saturday afternoon at Beaver Stadium. Freshman running back Kaytron Allen recorded his first career 100-yard rushing game, racking up 111 and a touchdown on just 13 carries.

The Nittany Lions notched 166 rushing yards, averaging 5.2 yards per carry on the ground. Nicholas Singleton collected 46 yards on 12 attempts, and Sean Clifford had 23 yards and a touchdown on five carries.

Clifford went 22-of-34 passing for 217 yards and three touchdowns. Parker Washington caught a team-high six catches for 64 yards and Brenton Strange had five receptions for 42 yards and two touchdowns.

The Nittany Lions had a 4-0 turnover advantage, producing two interceptions and two fumbles. Pl Mustipher had a team-high six tackles, and Dani Dennis-Sutton picked up a game-high two sacks. Kalen King broke up a game-high four passes along with a forced fumble and fumble recovery. Johnny Dixon and Zakee Wheatley each recorded an interception.

The Chippewas' quarterback Daniel Richardson went 26-45 for 235 yards, two touchdowns and two interceptions. Carlos Carriere collected a game-high 111 receiving yards on 11 catches. Lew Nichols III rushed for 68 yards on 13 carries.

HOW IT HAPPENED

The Nittany Lions produced the game's first score on a Mitchell Tinsley 5-yard touchdown reception with 8-42 left in the first quarter. Forcing a threeand-out after the kickoff, Penn State went 59 yards on nine plays in 4:56 in their first possession. Clifford went three-for-three for 47 yards on the drive, including a 27-yard throw to Washington on the first play.

Penn State needed just three plays on its next drive for a second touchdown, a 4-yard reception from Strange with 6:38 remaining in the opening quarter. Zakee Wheatley put the ball on Central Michigan's 15-yard line after returning an interception 34 yards, which was aided by Ji'Ayir Brown hitting the quarterback on his throw.

Central Michigan got on the board with a 2-yard touchdown catch from Finn Hogan on fourth-and-goal with 12:39 left in the second quarter. The Chippewas converted three third downs for first downs on the 11-play, 45yard drive.

The game was tied up with 6:25 remaining in the first half, as Richardson hit Joel Wilson for a 14-yard touchdown pass. After getting an incompletion on a Penn State fourth down at the Central Michigan 33-yard line, the Chippewas went all the way down the field on nine plays in 3:23. Richardson threw four completions for 56 yards, including a 20-yarder to Carriere to put Central Michigan in the redzone.

The Nittany Lions took back the lead with 1:58 remaining before halftime on a 14-yard rushing touchdown from Allen. He had three rushes for 33 yards in the five-play, 98-second drive. Washington gave Penn State excellent field position with a 14-yard punt return to Central Michigan's 34-yard line.

Penn State scored three minutes and five seconds into the second half on another short yardage touchdown catch from Strange, this time for 3 yards. The Chippewas gifted the Nittany Lions the ball in excellent field position, muffing a punt that Curtis Jacobs recovered at Central Michigan's seven-yard line.

Clifford ran in for a 1-yard touchdown, 17 seconds into the fourth quarter to make it 33-14. On the drive, Allen had a career-best 37-yard run to get the Nittany Lions into the red zone.

The Nittany Lions tallied the final score of the day, a 22-yard field goal by Pinegar.

UNIVERSITY PARK, Pa. - No. 11/12 Penn State defeated Northwestern, 17-7, in its Big Ten home-opener on a soggy day in Beaver Stadium Saturday.

GAME 5 PENN STATE VS. NORTHWESTERN

The Nittany Lions' defense set the tone in the victory with five three-and-outs on Northwestern's first five possessions, a feat which has not occurred against a Big Ten opponent since 2011. The unit recovered two fumbles, grabbed an interception and forced three fourth quarter turnover-on-downs, including a fourth-and goal stand at the 1-yard line with 11:51 left in regulation. Penn State was extremely successful in stopping the run, limiting the Wildcats to 31 yards on 28 carries. Penn State held Northwestern to zero or negative yards on 14 of 28 carries.

Penn State has forced 11 turnovers in the last three games, the most in any three-game stretch since forcing 13 in 1996 (five vs. Northwestern, five vs. Michigan, three vs. Michigan State).

PJ Mustipher had a team-high eight tackles, with four solo, including the one on Northwestern quarterback Ryan Hilinski on fourth down for the goal-line stand. Ji'Ayir Brown notched the interception and a team-high five solo tackles, including one for loss.

Nicholas Singleton rushed for 87 yards and a touchdown on 21 carries, while Kaytron Allen had 86 yards on 21 attempts. Sean Clifford was 10-of-20 for 140 passing yards and a touchdown. Wide receiver Parker Washington recorded team highs of four catches and 73 receiving yards. Tight end Brenton Strange had a 20-yard touchdown reception.

Hilinski went 15-of-37 for 210 passing yards and a touchdown to pace the Wildcats. Jacob Gill had a 47-yard touchdown grab.

HOW IT HAPPENED

The Nittany Lions got on the board first with a 20-yard Brenton Strange touchdown reception with 15 seconds left in the first guarter. Penn State needed just four plays to cover 60 yards for the score. Keyvone Lee had two carries for 15 yards, and Washington notched a 13-yard reception. The drive began at the Penn State 40yard line after Brown's interception.

Penn State doubled its lead on a 2-yard rushing touchdown from Singleton with 5:02 remaining in the first half. Singleton led a grinding seven-play, 45-yard drive in 3:47. He had five carries for 22 yards and an 11-yard reception. Lee converted a fourth-and-one with a 7-yard carry.

Northwestern got on the board with 2:10 left in the third guarter, as Gill caught a 47-yard touchdown reception. Starting from its own 18-yard line, the Wildcats used nine plays to score in 3:13.

Penn State responded with a 38-yard field goal from Jake Pinegar 31 seconds into the fourth guarter on a seven-play, 54yard drive in 2:41. Clifford hit Washington on a 43-yard pass on the second play, the longest play of the game for the Nittany Lions. Allen followed with a 13-yard rush to put the team in field goal position.

GAME RECAP

ANN ARBOR, Mich. — The No. 10/10 Penn State football team dropped its first contest of the 2022 campaign by a score of 41-17 to No. 5/4 Michigan in Michigan Stadium on Saturday afternoon.

The Nittany Lions' defense held the Michigan offense to field goals on three of its four trips inside the red zone in the first half. It also recorded one of two Penn State touchdowns on the day, when Curtis Jacobs picked off a tipped pass and took it all the way to the end zone for a score. However, the Wolverine rushing attack gained significant momentum in the second half, with two 60-plus-yard touchdown runs by Donovan Edwards and Blake Corum, respectively, inflating the Michigan lead.

Penn State did its best to keep pace with the Wolverines, however only one offensive touchdown and one field goal on 268 yards of offense proved not enough.

On the defensive side of the ball, the Nittany Lions were led by Ji'Ayir Brown's nine total tackles, all of which came in the first half. His performance was highlighted by an impressive one-arm tackle-for-loss inside the fiveyard line to keep Michigan out of the end zone in the first half. Coziah Izzard pitched in with Penn State's only sack of the day, as the Wolverine rushing attack diverted attention away from the quarterback.

Offensively, a few big plays resulted in scoring drives for the Nittany Lions, including a 62-yard run from Sean Clifford and a 48-yard reception for Harrison Wallace III, but Penn State struggled to push the ball downfield for the majority of the game.

HOW IT HAPPENED

On the first possession of the game, Michigan took the ball deep into Penn State territory before the Nittany Lion defense stymied the drive and forced the Wolverines to a 29-yard field goal.

After a Penn State three-and-out, the Wolverines took over at their own 17 and strung together a 13-play, 77-yard drive that the Nittany Lions stopped in the red zone once again to force another field goal that put Michigan up 6-0 with 1:25 left in the first quarter.

In the Wolverines' first drive of the second quarter, Corum punched in a 1-yard touchdown to put his team up 13-0. The Nittany Lions broke through with 6:11 left in the second quarter as

The Nittany Lions broke through with 6:11 left in the second quarter as Kaytron Allen burst through the line for a touchdown run on a fourth-andgoal play from inside the 1yard line. The drive was highlighted by a 62-yard scamper by Clifford.

With 4:27 left in the second quarter and the Wolverines driving down the field, Chop Robinson tipped a pass at the line of scrimmage that was picked off by Curtis Jacobs and returned 47 yards to the house for a Penn State score. The pick-six was Jacobs' first as a Nittany Lion and gave Penn State a 14-13 advantage, its first of the game. Penn State's red zone defense kept the Wolverines out of the end zone for

Penn State's red zone defense kept the Wolverines out of the end zone for the third time in the game, as Michigan settled for a 23-yard field goal. The Nittany Lions entered the break down, 16-14. Clifford came out firing in the second half and led a nine-play scoring drive

Clifford came out firing in the second half and led a nine-play scoring drive that was highlighted by a 16-yard dot to Mitchell Tinsley and a 48-yard pass to Harrison Wallace III. Jake Pinegar converted a 27-yard field goal with 13:15 left in the third quarter to give the Nittany Lions a 17-16 lead.

The Wolverines answered right back, as Donovan Edwards exploded for a 67-yard rushing touchdown. Michigan converted its two-point conversion attempt as well, resulting in a 24-17 lead.

After a Sean Clifford pass fell incomplete on fourth down, Blake Corum sped through the middle for a 61-yard score to extend the Wolverines' lead to 31-17 with 7:20 remaining in the third quarter.

Michigan tacked on three more points on a 37-yard field goal with 11:00 to go in the fourth and added another touchdown with 5:03 to play on Donovan Edwards' second touchdown run of the day to go ahead, 41-17.

UNIVERSITY PARK, Pa. - The No. 16/16 Penn State football team (6-1, 3-1 Big Ten) defeated Minnesota (4-3, 1-3 Big Ten), 45-17, Saturday night in front of a raucous Penn State White Out crowd of 109,813 fans.

GAME 7 PENN STATE VS. MINNESOTA

Sean Clifford threw for 295 yards and four touchdowns, while Nicholas Singleton led the rushing attack with 79 yards and two touchdowns on 13 carries, and Kaytron Allen notched 77 yards. Wide receiver Parker Washington recorded seven catches for 70 yards and a touchdown, and tight end Theo Johnson collected 75 yards and a touchdown on five catches.

The Nittany Lion defense stifled the Golden Gophers in the first half, forcing Minnesota to an 0-for-6 start on third downs and 2-for-13 overall on the game. The Gophers entered the game leading FBS in third down conversion percentage (66.2%). The Penn State White Out crowd made its mark on the game, as the Golden Gophers were called for five false start penalties before the break.

Curtis Jacobs recorded a career-high 14 tackles (7 solo), including two for a loss. Ji'Ayir Brown had an interception and seven tackles.

Both sides of the ball excelled after halftime, as Penn State outscored Minnesota, 28-7, in the last two quarters. The Nittany Lions racked up touchdowns on each of their first four drives of the half and finished the game with 479 vards.

HOW IT HAPPENED

The Golden Gophers got on the board first with a field goal on a drive started by a 37-yard interception return to the Nittany Lions' 14-yard line. Penn State's defense, helped by another false start penalty, pushed Minnesota back 3 yards, forcing the 35-yard field goal.

Jake Pinegar knocked a 41-yard field goal through the uprights to tie the game up just over a minute into the second guarter.

A 22-yard catch-and-run by Singleton set up a 38-yard touchdown pass from Clifford to Tyler Warren with 9:05 left in the second quarter to give the Lions a 10-3 lead.

Penn State scored on its third consecutive drive, once again on a touchdown grab by a tight end. Johnson hauled in the 18-yard pass from Clifford to put the Nittany Lions up 17-3 with 4:01 to play in the first half. The score was keyed by a 30-yard catch by Mitchell Tinsley that put the Nittany Lions just outside the red zone.

Minnesota scored its first touchdown of the contest on a 3-yard run by Mohammed Ibrahim to cut the Penn State lead to 17-10 heading into halftime

Washington hauled in a huge 35-yard touchdown ball with 11:59 left in the third guarter to cap a four-play 64-yard scoring drive to put the Nittany Lions up 24-10.

Penn State's defense capitalized on the momentum and intercepted Minnesota on the ensuing drive. Brown picked off Athan Kaliakmanis at the Penn State 10 and returned the ball 35 yards to set the offense up with a short field. The Nittany Lions offense capitalized on the turnover and excellent field position, as scoring another touchdown via a 16-yard scamper by Singleton for a 31-10 lead.

Mitchell Tinsley became the fourth Nittany Lion to haul in a touchdown catch in the game with his 20-yard score late in the third quarter.

The Gophers manufactured their second touchdown, a 4-yard Brevyn Spann-Ford catch, with 8:03 left.

After Penn State recovered an onside kick, Singleton picked up his second touchdown, a 30-yard rush, to put the Nittany Lions up 45-17.

GAME RECAP

UNIVERSITY PARK, Pa. – The No. 13 Penn State football team (6-2, 3-2 Big Ten) dropped a back-and-forth decision to No. 2 Ohio State (8-0, 5-0 Big Ten), 44-31, in front of a lively crowd of 108,433 fans for the annual Penn State Stripe Out game.

Wide receiver Parker Washington had a career-high 179 receiving yards to become just the second Nittany Lion in program history with two 100-yard receiving games against Ohio State, joining Jahan Dotson.

Quarterback Sean Clifford claimed a pair of Penn State career passing records against the Buckeyes, tossing his 78th career touchdown passes to break Trace McSorley's career mark of 77. Clifford also claimed the Penn State record for career pass attempts, finishing the game with 1,239 to bypass McSorley (1,215; 2015-18) for second place and Christian Hackenberg (1,235; 2013-15) for the top spot.

Clifford threw for 371 yards and three touchdowns, finding Washington for 11 catches, a career best, and a score. KeAndre Lambert-Smith and Kaytron Allen were also on the receiving end of Clifford touchdown passes.

On the defensive side, Ji'Ayir Brown led the Nittany Lions with eight total tackles (6 solo). Johnny Dixon and Abdul Carter both picked up sacks, contributing to Penn State's total of seven tackles for loss.

HOW IT HAPPENED

The Buckeyes got on the board first with a 38-yard field goal on the game's opening drive. On the ensuing Penn State possession, the Buckeyes tipped a pass at the line of scrimmage and intercepted the ball at the Penn State 47-yard line, but the Nittany Lion defense held firm and the Buckeyes' 53-yard field goal attempt went wide right.

Following another Penn State interception, Ohio State scored on a 4-yard touchdown run by Miyan Williams to put the Buckeyes up 10-0 with 2:48 to go in the first quarter.

Penn State got on the board early in the second quarter on a 58-yard catch-and-run from Sean Clifford to Parker Washington with 11:13 left in the half to cut the Buckeye lead to 10-7. On their next possession, the Nittany Lions found the end zone once again with a 23-yard pass to KeAndre Lambert-Smith to put Penn State up, 14-10.

The Buckeyes answered with a 37-yard field goal to close within one point at 14-13 with 3:14 left in the first half.

The squads exchanged possessions for most the third quarter until the Buckeyes connected on a 40-yard field goal with 0:10 remaining in the third quarter to retake the lead at 16-14.

The Nittany Lions converted a 4th-and-1 play inside their own 10-yard line and Kaytron Allen followed with another fourth-down conversion, this time for a touchdown, to increase the Penn State lead to 21-16 with 9:26 left in the fourth quarter.

A 41-yard touchdown run by TreVeyon Henderson put Ohio State in front again, 23-21, with 8:51 to play in the game. A 24-yard pass from C.J. Stroud to Cade Stover added another touchdown for the Buckeyes, bringing the score to 30-21 with 8:17 to play.

Despite a 27-yard run from Allen on first down, Ohio State's defense held the Nittany Lions to a 44-yard field goal from Jake Pinegar to cut the score to 30-24 with 5:49 remaining.

Another set of back-to-back touchdowns for Ohio State in the final three minutes of the game gave them a 20-point lead. After a 7-yard rushing touchdown for the Buckeye offense, Sean Clifford's first down pass was intercepted by Ohio State's defense and returned for a touchdown. Ohio State's lead increased to 44-24 with 2:42 left in the game.

The Nittany Lions scored the game's final touchdown as Clifford connected with Allen for a 5-yard score to make it 44-31 with 1:12 left.

GAME RECAP

UNIVERSITY PARK, Pa. — The No. 15/16/16 Penn State football team defeated the Indiana Hoosiers, 45-14, Saturday afternoon at Memorial Stadium.

GAME 9

The game featured a complementary effort on both sides of the ball with the offense racking up 483 total yards and the defense registering 16 tackles for loss. Freshman running back Kaytron Allen highlighted the offense's performance with 158 scrimmage yards and three rushing touchdowns.

Of the defense's 16 TFLs, six of them were sacks, while the unit also pulled in three interceptions in a dominant performance. Twelve different players picked up at least a 0.5 tackle for loss in the contest. The 16 TFLs ties the program record for TFLs since it became an NCAA statistics in 2000. The Lions also had 16 TFLs against Kent State in 2018.

With their rushing scores, freshmen running backs Allen and Nicholas Singleton have both accumulated eight rushing touchdowns on the season to tie Noah Cain for the freshman season program record.

Sean Clifford completed 15-of-23 passes for 229 yards and one interception. Drew Allar pitched in 75 passing yards and two scores, going 9-for-12. Ten different receivers caught passes from the two signal callers, led by Mitchell Tinsley with five catches for 63 yards.

Kobe King paced the defense with eight total tackles, including 2.5 tackles for loss. Kalen King and Dani Dennis-Sutton both recorded their first career interceptions in the contest.

HOW IT HAPPENED

The Nittany Lions scored first on a 1-yard touchdown carry by Singleton with 6:50 remaining in the first quarter. The score was set up by a 27-yard catch by Tinsley to put Nittany Lions inside the 5-yard line. Indiana tied the game on the next possession, constructing an eight-play, 75-yard scoring drive, capped off by an 11-yard touchdown reception by A.J. Barner.

Penn State was intercepted on its own 31-yard line on the next drive, but the Nittany Lion defense stood tall and pushed the Hoosiers back 13 yards to force a punt.

Allen broke the tie with an 11-yard touchdown run with 9:25 left in the second quarter. Allen also hauled in a 27-yard pass that led to his own score. Penn State's drive was kickstarted by a 19-yard punt return by Parker Washington that set up the offense inside Indiana territory. The Nittany Lions opened up a two-score lead on another Allen rushing

The Nittany Lions opened up a two-score lead on another Allen rushing touchdown. This time, it was a 6-yard score with 5:04 left in the first half. With less than a minute left in the second quarter, Jake Pinegar connected on a career-long 50-yard field goal to put the Nittany Lions up 24-7. Kalen King recorded his first career interception with 11:15 left in the third

Kalen King recorded his first career interception with 11:15 left in the third quarter. The pick came as the Hoosiers were trying for a long strike into the red zone, and it gave Penn State the ball at their own 4-yard line. The Nittany Lions promptly marched 96 yards down the field on seven plays to score and take a 31-7 advantage. The touchdown was Allen's third rushing score of the day, and his eighth this season.

Penn State scored once again off an interception late in the third quarter as Drew Allar hit Harrison Wallace III. The score was Wallace's first of his career. This time it was Dani Dennis-Sutton that recorded the pick that led to the Nitrany Lion touchdown.

On the ensuing possession, Daequan Hardy recorded the Nittany Lions' third interception of the game and returned the ball 18 yards to the Indiana 4-yard line. Allar then found Theo Johnson in the end zone to put Penn State up 45-7.

Indiana rounded out the scoring for the game with a 1-yard score by Jaylin Lucas with 6:16 left in the fourth quarter.


