#### PENN STATE VISITS AUBURN ON SATURDAY

- OPENING KICK: No. 22/23 Penn State goes on the road to take on Auburn on Saturday. Kickoff is set for 3:30 p.m. on CBS. The 2022 Penn State football season is presented by PSECU.
- **SERIES HISTORY:** The Nittany Lions will take on Auburn for the fourth time in program history. Penn State earned a 28-20 win over the Tigers last year in Beaver Stadium. Sean Clifford threw for 280 yards and connected on touchdown passes with Jahan Dotson and Brenton Strange. Tyler Warren scored on a
- NITTANY LIONS AGAINST THE SEC: Penn State holds a 24-24 record against current members of the SEC. Of the 48 matchups, 21 have come in bowl games, including Penn State's most recent game against an SEC opponent, the 2022 Outback Bowl with Arkansas, and last year's matchup vs. Auburn. Penn State is 11-16 in regular season contests against the SEC.
- · LONG RUNS: Nicholas Singleton had an impressive Beaver Stadium introduction on Saturday. The freshman rushed for 179 yards, the most by any player in a Beaver Stadium debut, and two touchdowns on 10 carries. Singleton scored on runs of 70 and 44 yards, while adding a 48-yard rush. Singleton is the first Nittany Lion with multiple touchdown runs of 40+ yards and the first Nittany Lion with three 40+ yard runs in a game since Larry Johnson at Indiana in 2002.
- SPREADING THE WEALTH: Sean Clifford, Drew Allar and Christian Veilleux combined to distribute completions to 17 different receivers on Saturday. The 17 receivers are a program record in a game. Since 1960, Penn State has had 11 seasons with 17 different pass-catchers. Clifford connected with 10 different receivers in the first half.
- THE OPPOSITION: Auburn is 2-0 to begin the 2022 season. The Tigers earned a 24-16 win over San Jose State last Saturday. Auburn tallied 378 total yards, including 210 on the ground. Tank Bigsby, TJ Finley and Jarquez Hunter each scored rushing touchdowns. TJ Finley and Robby Ashford split time at quarterback with Finley throwing for 167 yards and rushing for 18, while Ashford ran for 61 yards on seven carries. Marcus Harris collected three tackles for loss and a sack.

#### **HEAD COACH JAMES FRANKLIN**

#### **CAREER AT A GLANCE**

- Franklin was named the 16th head football coach in the storied history of the Nittany Lion program on January 11, 2014.
- Franklin is one of six current FBS head coaches to lead his teams to a bowl game in each of his first nine seasons as a head coach and one of nine to do so in 10 of their first 11 seasons.
- Franklin is one of four current Big Ten coaches (Ryan Day, Kirk Ferentz, Jim Harbaugh) to have won a Big Ten Championship and became the first African American head coach to win a Big Ten title after Penn State's 2016 victory.
- He owns a 93-49 career record with a winning record in nine of 11 seasons at the helm.
- Franklin has led his teams to three Top 10 finishes (3 at Penn State) and six Top 25 finishes (2 at Vanderbilt; 4 at Penn State).
- In the last six seasons under Franklin, Penn State is one of six teams to rank in the top 12 of the CFP final rankings at least four times, joining Ohio State, Alabama, Georgia, Clemson and Oklahoma.
- From 2016-19, Franklin led the Nittany Lions to three New Year's Six bowls 2016 (Rose), 2017 (Fiesta) and 2019 (Cotton), making Penn State one of eight teams to accomplish the feat during the four-year span. Penn State last went to three New Year's Six bowls in four years in 1980-83 (1980 Fiesta, 1982 Fiesta, 1983 Sugar).
- Franklin guided Penn State to back-to-back New Year's Six bowls in 2016 (Rose) and 2017 (Fiesta) for the first time since 1985 (Orange) and 1986 (Fiesta).
- From 2016-19, Franklin led Penn State to 42 wins, the most in program history for the Big Ten era, and 28 league wins, a program record.
- Franklin has 27 years of coaching experience at the collegiate and NFL level.
- In his first 11 years as a head coach, Franklin mentored 90 players who have gone on to the NFL ranks.
- · Franklin is second all-time in winning percentage by an FBS African American head coach (minimum 80 wins) and is third in total wins.

#### NITTANY LIONS ON THE FIELD

- The Nittany Lions earned a New Year's Day bowl berth against Arkansas in the Outback Bowl in **2021**. With wins over No. 12/15 Wisconsin and No. 22/20 Auburn, Penn State tallied two wins over ranked teams within the first three games of the season for the first time in program history. The Nittany Lion defense allowed just 17.3 points per game in 2021, good for sixth in the country.
- In **2020**, with the emergence of young skill players on offense, true freshmen accounted for 1,486 of Penn State's 3,873 total yards (38 percent), marking a school record for most combined scrimmage yards by true freshmen in a single season.
- Penn State earned its third 11-win season in four years with an 11-2 record in 2019, including a win over No. 17 Memphis in the Goodyear
  Cotton Bowl Classic. The Nittany Lions posted their fourth-straight top 12 finish in the final CFP rankings, coming in 10th, and were ranked
  ninth in the final Associated Press and Amway Coaches polls to earn their 25th AP Top 10 finish. Franklin was a finalist for the Paul "Bear"
  Bryant National Coach of the Year award for the second time at Penn State (2016) and third time in his head coaching career.
- In 2018, the Nittany Lions posted their third-straight season with at least nine wins with a 9-4 overall record, earning a berth in the VRBO Citrus Bowl. Penn State finished No. 12 in the final CFP rankings and No. 17 in the Associated Press and Amway Coaches polls.
- Penn State climbed as high as No. 2 in the rankings in 2017 and appeared in a second-straight New Year's Six bowl, earning a 35-28 win
  over No. 11 Washington in the PlayStation Fiesta Bowl. At 11-2, the Nittany Lions earned back-to-back 11-win seasons for the fifth time in
  program history and first time since 2008 and 2009. Penn State finished the season No. 8 in the Associated Press and Amway Coaches polls
  and No. 9 in the final CFP rankings.
- Penn State surged in 2016, winning nine consecutive games en route to the Big Ten Championship, a Rose Bowl berth and an 11-3 overall record. Penn State finished the season ranked No. 5 in the College Football Playoff rankings and No. 7 in the Associated Press and Amway Coaches polls. It was Penn State's highest finish in the polls since 2005. The Lions claimed their fourth overall Big Ten Championship and first outright title since 1994 with a thrilling, 38-31 comeback win over Wisconsin in the Big Ten Championship Game. Franklin was honored as Sporting News National Coach of the Year and the Woody Hayes National Coach of the Year, as well as the Dave McLain Big Ten Coach of the Year and Associated Press Big Ten Coach of the Year.
- Franklin guided the Nittany Lions to a 7-6 record in 2015 and a berth in the TaxSlayer Bowl.
- Franklin's first season in **2014** was bookended with a pair of thrilling victories for the Nittany Lions. It began with a final-play 26-24 victory over UCF in Dublin, Ireland, in Penn State's first-ever international game and ended with a comeback, a 31-30 overtime win over Boston College in the New Era Pinstripe Bowl in Yankee Stadium. Franklin became just the third Penn State coach to lead the team to at least seven wins in his first season, joining Dick Harlow (1915) and Bill O'Brien (2012), and he guided the Nittany Lions to a 4-0 start, joining Harlow as the only first-year Penn State coaches to win their initial four games.

#### NITTANY LIONS IN THE CLASSROOM

- The Nittany Lions posted their first 1,000 single-year APR in program history in 2018-19, topping the previous high of 993 in 2014-15.
- Sean Clifford (2021) and Trace McSorley (2018) were selected as a National Football Foundation (NFF) Scholar-Athletes and finalists for the Campbell Trophy, known as the "Academic Heisman." They are the 18th and 19th Nittany Lions to be selected as an NFF Scholar-Athlete.
- In 2019, punter Blake Gillikin took home CoSIDA Academic All-America® first-team honors for the second-straight year to become the 12th two-time first-team selection in Penn State history. He graduated with a perfect 4.0 grade-point average in May.
- Gillikin's two first-team CoSIDA Academic All-America honors increase Penn State football's total to 67 honorees, which ranks second in Division I football history (FBS and FCS).
- Tyler Yazujian collected a berth on the CoSIDA Academic All-America® first team in 2016 after an appearance on the second team in 2015.
- A program-record 10 Nittany Lions were named 2020-21 Big Ten Distinguished Scholars, besting the previous mark of nine set a year earlier.

#### **NITTANY LIONS IN THE COMMUNITY**

- The Nittany Lions are active in the community, participating in activities such as Uplifting Athletes, THON, Pennsylvania Special Olympics Summer Games, State College Area Food Bank and Penn State Hershey Children's Hospital visits.
- On June 15, 2020, Franklin was named to the Big Ten Anti-Hate and Anti-Racism Coalition.
- As part of the Cotton Bowl festivities in 2019, Franklin and his family made a \$10,000 financial commitment to the Dallas Children's Hospital.
- In August 2019, Franklin was named a Penn State University Renaissance Fund honoree, which awards outstanding community members for helping students in need.

#### LAST MEETING NITTANY LIONS KNOCK OFF AUBURN IN PENN STATE WHITE OUT GAME

The No. 10/12 Penn State football team celebrated the annual Penn State White Out game with a 28-20 win over No. 22/20 Auburn.

The win was Penn State's first regular-season victory over an SEC opponent since the Nittany Lions defeated Alabama 9-0 in 1990.

Penn State's high-powered offense was on display in this primetime contest, compiling 391 total yards in the game.

Quarterback Sean Clifford continued his fast start to the 2021 campaign, completing 28-of-32 passes for 280 yards and two touchdowns. Wide receiver Jahan Dotson corralled 10 catches for 78 yards and a touchdown in the contest.

Penn State sealed the victory in the closing minutes, forcing Auburn to turn the ball over on downs at the Penn State two-yard line with 3:08 remaining in the game. Brandon Smith paced the Nittany Lion defense with career-high 10 tackles.

After Penn State turned the ball over on downs on its opening drive, Auburn got on the board first with a 45-yard field goal by Anders Carlson.

The Nittany Lions got the offense going on their third possession. Clifford delivered long passes to his tight ends on back-to-back plays, before hitting Dotson

in the back of the end zone for a 4-yard touchdown to give Penn State a 7-3 lead.

Auburn reclaimed the lead on its ensuing drive on a 4-yard touchdown run by Tank Bigsby.

In the closing minutes of the second, Penn State would go on a 14-play, 91-yard drive to jump back in front. The long scoring drive was capped off by a 4-yard TD pass from Clifford to Strange to put the Nittany Lions ahead 14-10 at the half.

On the first play of the second half, a botched trick play by Auburn resulted in Derrick Tangelo falling on a loose ball to set Penn State up at the Auburn 20-yard line. The Nittany Lions would extend the lead on Tyler Warren's first career rushing touchdown to give Penn State a 21-10 advantage.

Bigsby would reach the end zone for the second time in the game with 5:52 remaining in the third, when his 6-yard TD run cut the Penn State lead to 21-17. The Tigers added three more when Carlson converted on a 43-yard field goal attempt.

Penn State would fire back on the following drive as Noah Cain found the end zone on a 5-yard run.

- On the night, Clifford surpassed the 8,000-career passing yard mark and the 9,000-career total yards mark.
- The Nittany Lions forced and recovered a fumble in the second quarter to extend their takeaway streak to 20 games, tied with Oklahoma for the second-longest streak in the FBS.
- Penn State broke up 16 passes and held Aidan O'Connell to a 50.0 completion percentage after he completed 71 percent of his passes in 2021.
- CB Joey Porter Jr. recorded a team-high eight tackles, a career-high six pass breakups and recovered a fumble.

#### **HOME SWEET HOME**

- With a 305-79 all-time record in Beaver Stadium, Penn State owns the sixth-best winning percentage (.794) in its current home venue amongst current FBS schools and leads the Big Ten.
- Penn State averaged 106,799 fans in seven home games in 2021, the seventh-highest average in program history and best season average since 2009.
- Only Alabama (.838) and Oklahoma (.817) have higher winning percentages in facilities older than Beaver Stadium.

#### LIONS UNDER THE LIGHTS

- The 2022 season marks the 22nd-straight with at least one regular-season night game on the schedule.
- Penn State opened the season with a 35-31 win at Purdue and will meet Minnesota for a 7:30 p.m. kickoff on Oct. 22.
- Penn State is 58-32 at night all-time. The figure breaks down to 18-11 at home, 28-14 on the road and 12-7 in neutral site games. Penn State is 1-1 at regular season neutral sites, 11-6 in bowl games and 1-0 in conference championship games.
- In 2019, Penn State played its most regular season night games in program history with four primetime tilts.
- On Oct. 12, 2013, the Lions claimed the longest game in Big Ten history when they edged Michigan under the lights, 43-40, in four overtimes in front of a sellout Beaver Stadium crowd of 107,844 on Homecoming.

- Penn State has won 15 consecutive games against teams that are not members of a Power Five conference.
- Penn State has won 14 consecutive games over non-conference opponents during the regular season, dating back to a win over Temple in 2016.
- Penn State has won 20-straight non-conference home games, dating back to a win over Kent State in 2013.

#### **HISTORIC SERIES**

- The Nittany Lions have played 22 teams 20 or more times in the 136-year history of the program.
- Penn State owns a winning record against 17 of the 22 teams that it has met 20 or more times.
- Seven of the 22 teams are on the 2022 schedule, including Purdue (20), Michigan (25), Ohio State (37), Indiana (25), Maryland (45), Rutgers (32) and Michigan State (36).
- Penn State and Purdue played their 20th meeting to open the 2022 season.

#### **OVERTIME OVER TIME**

- College football introduced overtime during the bowl season in 1995 and adopted it for regular season games in 1996. Since then, Penn State has played 15 overtime games, including six over the 2012-14 seasons.
- Ten of the 15 overtime tilts have come at home, three in true road games, one in the 2006 Orange Bowl and one in the 2014 Pinstripe Bowl.
- Penn State is 8-7 all-time in overtime games, with a 5-5 record at Beaver Stadium, 1-2 mark in true road games and 2-0 in contests at a neutral site.
- Penn State's first two overtime contests came vs. lowa in 2000 and 2002 at home. The Nittany Lions dropped their first three contests that went to the extra period, but won five straight overtime contests before falling to Nebraska on Nov. 23, 2013.

#### RETURNING LETTERWINNERS/ STARTERS

- Penn State returns 33 lettermen from last year's squad 14 on offense, 18 on defense and one on special teams.
- A total of 37 lettermen are returning for the Nittany Lions. In addition to the 33 lettermen returning from 2021, Hakeem Beamon, Adisa Isaac, Jake Pinegar and Marquis Wilson also have letterman status.
- The Nittany Lions lost the services of 22 lettermen 12 on offense, nine on defense and one specialist.
- Penn State returns 12 starters six on offense, five on defense and one on special teams.
- Twelve additional Penn Staters have starting experience four on offense, seven on defense and one specialist.
- Among returners is 2021 All-Big Ten second team honoree PJ Mustipher, third team honoress Ji'Ayir Brown and Joey Porter Jr., and honorable mention selections Sean Clifford, Curtis Jacobs, Juice Scruggs and Brenton Strange.

#### ARRINGTON A HALL OF FAMER

- Penn State national award winner and first-team All-America linebacker LaVar Arrington has been elected to the College Football Hall of Fame as part of the 2022 class.
- Arrington will be inducted to the Hall of Fame December 6, 2022 at the 64th National Football Foundation (NFF) Annual Awards Dinner
- Arrington and the 21 inductees (18 players, 3 coaches) will also be recognized at their respective collegiate institutions with NFF Hall of Fame On-Campus Salutes, presented by Fidelity Investments, during the fall. Their accomplishments will be forever immortalized at the Chick-fil-A College Football Hall of Fame in Atlanta.
- Arrington is the 26th member (20 players, 6 coaches) of the Penn State football family to be elected to the College Hall of Fame. Quarterback Kerry Collins was the most recent player inductee in 2018.



- Penn State football head coach James Franklin announced redshirt seniors QB Sean Clifford, S Jonathan Sutherland and LS Chris Stoll, seniors S Ji'Ayir Brown and DT PJ Mustipher and redshirt junior OL Juice Scruggs have been named team captains for the 2022 season.
- Clifford and Sutherland are captains for the fourth-straight season, the only four-time captains in program history.
- Mustipher is a captain for the second-consecutive season.

#### **OFFENSIVE NOTES**

- Since the start of the 2016 season, Penn State's offense is second in the Big Ten in touchdown percentage (31.6; 19th nationally) and yards per play (6.04; 34th) and is third in points per possession (2.15; 24th), scoring percentage (40.25; 24th), yards per pass attempt (7.92; 27th), scoring offense (33.6; 27th) and total offense (425.0; 40th).
- Penn State's offense has been explosive since the 2016 campaign, as it leads the Big Ten in 80-plus play percentage (0.20; T-2nd nationally) and 70-plus (0.41; T-7th), ranks second in 40-plus (2.07; 13th), and holds third 20-plus (7.80; 15th), 30-plus (3.63; 20th), 50-plus (1.00; 33rd) and 60-plus (0.57; 22nd).
- The Nittany Lions have tallied at least 55 plays of 20 or more yards in six of the last seven seasons (57 in 2021; 63 in 2019; 73 in 2018; 85 in 2017; 91 in 2016; 67 in 2015).
- Penn State had 52 plays of 20 or more yards in 2020 (nine-game schedule).
- Additionally, the Nittany Lions are third in the Big Ten and 17th nationally in 15-plus yard passing play percentage since 2016 (19.57 percent).
- Penn State posted 406 total yards, including 308 through the air, against Purdue.
- Against Ohio, Penn State tallied 572 yards of total offense, the ninth-most in a game in the James Franklin era.
- Nittany Lion freshmen (true and redshirt) combined for 423 of the 572 yards (74 percent).
- Sean Clifford, Drew Allar and Christian Veilleux combined for 31 completions and 338 passing yards.
- Penn State's 31 completions on the day were tied for the fifthmost in a game since 2014.
- The Nittany Lions gained 234 yards rushing, the 34th time in the James Franklin era that Penn State has surpassed 200 yards rushing. PSU is 29-5 in those games.
- In the first half, Clifford completed passes to 10 different receivers. Penn State last had 10 receivers catch a pass in a half at Maryland in 2019 (first half).
- The Nittany Lions finished the game with a program-record 17 receivers catching a pass. Only 15 Nittany Lions caught a pass during the entire 2021 season.
- Since 1960, Penn State has had 11 seasons with 17 players catching at least one pass. The Nittany Lions had 17 pass catchers in the Ohio game.
- Penn State had touchdown runs of 44 and 70 yards, both by Nicholas Singleton, and a 48-yard run by Singleton. The Nittany Lions had multiple 40+ yard touchdown runs in a game for the first time since 2018 at Illinois (Miles Sanders, 48 yards; Ricky Slade, 61 yards).

- Singleton became first Nittany Lion with multiple 40+ yard touchdown runs in a game since Larry Johnson at Indiana on Nov. 16, 2002 (touchdown runs of 41, 43 and 69 yards).
- Singleton is the first Nittany Lion with three 40+ yard runs in a game since Johnson's performance against Indiana (runs of 41, 41, 43 and 69).
- Mike Yurcich enters his second season as Penn State's offensive coordinator/quarterbacks coach.
- Yurcich (California University (Pa.)) and Franklin (East Stroudsburg) both played in the Pennsylvania State Athletic Conference (PSAC).
- As an FBS offensive coordinator, offenses under Yurcich have averaged 6.36 yards per play, ranking first among OC's since 2013 and 13.76 yards per completion, which is also first in that time frame.
- Since 2013, Yurcich's offenses have scored 50 or more points 26 times and 40 or more points 53 times (45.3 percent of games coached), both of which are tops among FBS offensive coordinators since 2013.
- · His teams have averaged 53.9 touchdowns per year.
- Penn State has scored 40 points 22 times since 2016. By comparison, from 2008 until 2015, the Nittany Lions had 18

- Sean Clifford was a 2021 National Football Foundation (NFF)
  Scholar-Athlete and finalist for the Campbell Trophy, known as the
  "Academic Heisman". He is the 19th Nittany Lion to be selected as
  an NFF Scholar-Athlete.
- Penn State posted its first 1,000 single-year APR in program history in 2018-19, topping the previous high of 993 in 2014-15.
- In 2019, punter Blake Gillikin took home CoSIDA Academic All-America® first-team honors for the second-straight year to become the 12th two-time first-team selection in Penn State history. He graduated with a perfect 4.0 grade-point average in May 2020.
- Gillikin's two first-team CoSIDA Academic All-America honors increase Penn State football's total to 67 honorees, which ranks second in Division I football history (FBS and FCS).

- Offensive coordinator Mike Yurcich also heads the Penn State quarterback room.
- Three quarterbacks Yurcich coached in college are currently on NFL rosters (Sam Ehlinger – Texas, Justin Fields – Ohio State, Mason Rudolph – Oklahoma State).
- Yurcich served as the passing game coordinator and quarterbacks coach at Ohio State in 2019, where quarterback Justin Fields was a finalist for the Heisman Trophy, Walter Camp Player of the Year Award and Davey O'Brien Award.
- Redshirt senior Sean Clifford is in his fourth season as Penn State's starting signal caller, having played in 40 career games, making 35 starts.
- Clifford joins **Jonathan Sutherland** as the only four-time team captains in program history.
- Against Purdue, Clifford joined Zack Mills (2001-04) and Tony Sacca (1988-92) as the only quarterbacks to start a game in four different seasons at Penn State.
- The Cincinnati native began the season on the Davey O'Brien Award, Manning Award, Maxwell Award, Johnny Unitas Golden Arm Award, Walter Camp Player of the Year Award and Wuerffel Trophy watch lists. Clifford is also on the Reese's Senior Bowl watch list.
- Clifford earned Big Ten Co-Offensive Player of the Week following his performance at Purdue.
- Clifford tallied 282 passing yards and tied a career high with four touchdown passes against Purdue. He also rushed for a 2-yard touchdown. The redshirt senior threw for two touchdowns in the second quarter and two in the fourth quarter.
- Clifford threw for 213 yards and a touchdown against Ohio, while adding a 1-yard rushing touchdown.
- Clifford recorded his ninth career game with both a passing and rushing touchdown. Penn State is 8-1 in those games.
- Clifford has tossed multiple touchdowns in a half on 18 occasions and 11 different times has thrown multiple touchdowns in a quarter.
- The Ohio native tallied his 27th career game with multiple TD passes against Purdue, including 13 with three or more TDs, the most by a PSU quarterback since 2000, and four games with four fourthdowns
- At Purdue, Clifford became the third Penn State quarterback to surpass the 8,000-career passing yard mark, joining Trace McSorley (9,899; 2015-18) and Christian Hackenberg (8,457; 2013-15). Clifford currently has 8,334 career passing yards.
- Against Purdue, Clifford also topped the 9,000-career total yards mark. He currently has 9,247 total yards.

- Clifford is just one of three Penn State players all-time to reach 9,000-plus yards of total offense and one of three quarterbacks to reach 8,000 career passing yards.
- Clifford is one of five current FBS quarterbacks and one of three Power Five conference quarterbacks with 8,300 passing yards and 900 rushing yards in his career.
- He ranks 10th among current FBS quarterbacks and sixth among Power Five conference quarterbacks with 8,334 career passing yards.
- The captain is one of 10 current FBS quarterbacks with at least 8,300 passing yards and 65 passing touchdowns in his career.
- Clifford is one of 10 current FBS quarterbacks with at least 645 career completions and ranks eighth among current FBS quarterbacks with a 60.4 completion percentage (min. 1,000 attempts).
- The redshirt senior currently sits as the all-time leader at Penn State in completion percentage (.604), while ranking second at PSU in passing touchdowns (67), third in passing yards (8,334), completions (646) and passing efficiency (141.9), fourth in attempts (1,069), tied seventh in yards per pass attempt (7.8) and ranks exeenth in wins as starting quarterback (23), eighth in lowest interception % (2.34) and ninth touchdown pass % (6.27).
- He owns nine career games with at least 250 passing yards and three passing touchdowns and nine games with both a passing and rushing touchdown. He has tossed six career touchdowns of 70-plus yards and has completed 111 career passes of 20 or more yards.
- Clifford owns seven career 300-yard passing games and 21 career 200-yard games.
- Clifford is tied with Christian Hackenberg (2013-15) for the second-most 200-yard passing games at Penn State.
- Freshman **Drew Allar** made his collegiate debut at Purdue, completing two-of-four passes for 26 yards.

#### **RUNNING BACKS NOTES**

- Co-offensive coordinator/running backs coach Ja'Juan Seider has 14 years of college coaching experience, including 11 at the Power Five level.
- Seider helped a young running backs group to rank fifth in the Big Ten in rushing in 2020.
- In 2019, Seider mentored Journey Brown, who had 11 rushes of 20 or more yards and posted a Cotton Bowl and Penn State bowl-record 202 rushing yards.
- In 2018, Penn State posted its highest rushing average (204.9) since 2008 (205.8), led by second-team All-Big Ten selection Miles Sanders
- As a player at Florida A&M, Seider won the Doug Williams Award for National Offensive Player of the Year, Jake Gaither Award (considered the Heisman Trophy of Historically Black Colleges) and earned All-America honors after throwing for 2,622 yards and 27 touchdowns and rushing for 740 yards and 14 touchdowns in 1999.
- Seider, who was the 1999 MEAC Offensive Player of the Year, was selected in the sixth round of the 2000 NFL Draft by the San Diego Chargers.
- Sophomore Keyvone Lee has collected 998 career rushing yards (4.8 yards per carry) and six touchdowns. He also has 30 catches for 219 yards and a touchdown.
- The sophomore is a member of the Doak Walker Award watch list
- Against Purdue, Lee caught the game-winning 10-yard touchdown reception with 57 seconds remaining. It was his first career touchdown reception.
- Junior Devyn Ford has rushed for 629 career yards and six touchdowns, while adding 18 receptions and 101 receiving yards
- Freshmen Kaytron Allen and Nicholas Singleton both made their collegiate debuts against Purdue.
- Singleton rushed for 179 yards and two touchdowns on 10 carries against Ohio. He scored on runs of 44 and 70 yards and added a 48-yard rush. Singleton earned Big Ten Freshman of the Week honors for his efforts against Ohio.
- Singleton became the first Nittany Lion with multiple 40+ yard touchdown runs in a game since Larry Johnson at Indiana on Nov. 16, 2002 (touchdown runs of 41, 43 and 69 yards).
- Singleton is the first Nittany Lion with three 40+ yard runs in a game since Johnson's performance against Indiana (runs of 41, 41, 43 and 69).
- The freshman's 70-yard run is Penn State's longest run since an 85-yard run by Journey Brown against Pittsburgh in 2019.
- Through two games, Singleton has 210 yards, averaging 105.0 per game and 10.5 per carry.
- Singleton leads the country in yards per carry, ranks 13th in rushing yards per game, 22nd in total rushing yards and 10th in all-purpose yards per game (157.0). Singleton paces FBS freshmen in rushing yards per game and all-purpose yards per game
- Since 2000, only Saquon Barkley (260; 2017) and Larry Johnson (215; 2002) have more rushing yards than Singleton through the first two games of a season.
- Allen had a 22-yard reception against Ohio. He rushed for 31 yards at Purdue and 23 yards vs. the Bobcats.

#### **TIGHT ENDS NOTES**

- Tight ends coach Ty Howle enters his second season coaching the Penn State tight ends and his third season overall on the staff
- Howle served as an offensive analyst in 2020, working closely with the offensive line and tight ends.
- Prior to returning to Happy Valley, Howle spent four seasons on the coaching staff at Western Illinois, serving as assistant head coach/co-offensive coordinator/offensive line coach in 2018-19.
- Howle was a four-year letterwinner on the Penn State offensive line from 2009-13. He started at center and left guard and was a four-time Academic All-Big Ten selection. He was a team captain in 2013.
- Howle played in 47 career games for the NIttany Lions, making 13 starts. He graduated in 2013 with a bachelor's degree in kinesiology.
- Since James Franklin took over the program in 2014, three PSU tight ends have been taken in the NFL Draft, tied for eighth in the nation during that span (Pat Freiermuth – 2021, 2nd round; Mike Gesicki – 2018, 2nd round; Jesse James – 2015, 5th round).
- Penn State had four tight ends on opening week NFL rosters in 2021 (Nick Bowers, Freiermuth, Gesicki and James), trailing only Stanford (5) among FBS programs.
- An experienced tight end group, which has combined for 66 career games and 28 starts, looks to continue a strong tight end tradition.
- Redshirt junior Brenton Strange leads the group and has appeared in 26 career games for the Nittany Lions, making 20 starts.
- Late in the second quarter at Purdue, Strange caught a pass along the sideline and fought off multiple Boilermakers for a 67-yard touchdown.
- It was Strange's longest career reception and seventh career touchdown grab.
- Strange (5), sophomore Theo Johnson (4) and sophomore Tyler Warren (2) have combined for 11 20-plus yard recentions in their careers
- Johnson had a career-best 37-yard reception against Auburn in 2021.
- $\,$  Johnson and Strange are both on the Mackey Award watch list.
- In his first career start, Warren had three catches for 23 yards at Purdue.
- The sophomore made a key 15-yard catch to setup the gamewinning touchdown in the fourth quarter.
- Warren scored a 3-yard run against Villanova and a 2-yard rushing touchdown against Auburn in 2021.
- He made a key 2-yard touchdown reception on fourth and goal against Michigan, his first career receiving score.
- Redshirt freshman Khalil Dinkins caught a 28-yard touchdown pass in the fourth quarter vs. Ohio, his first career reception and touchdown reception.

#### **WIDE RECEIVER NOTES**

- Offensive recruiting coordinator/wide receivers coach Taylor Stubblefield is in his third season on the Penn State staff.
- As a player, Stubblefield caught 325 passes, which was an NCAA record at the completion of his career at Purdue.
- He still owns the Big Ten record for career receptions and ranks second in conference history with 3,629 yards.
- Stubblefield was a consensus All-American and a finalist for the Biletnikoff Award in 2004.
- Leading the wideout room is **Parker Washington**, who has caught a pass in all 24 games of his career.
- Washington had a 20-yard reception against Purdue and a 34yard grab against Ohio, giving him 22 career receptions of 20+ yards.
- The sophomore owns 106 career receptions, 17th all-time at Penn State.
- Washington's 100 receptions in his first two seasons of his career are second-most ever at Penn State for a player in their first two years, trailing only DaeSean Hamilton (127 combined in 2014 and 2015).
- Washington and transfer Mitchell Tinsley (137) both have over 100 career receptions. Penn State entered the season as one of nine FBS schools and one of four Power Five programs with multiple players over 100 career receptions.
- Washington has recorded 1,339 career receiving yards, good for 22nd in program history.
- With Tinsley (1,779) and Washington, Penn State began the year as one of 10 FBS teams, and one of five Power Five teams, with two players over 1,300 career receiving yards.
- Tinsley (19) and Washington (10) both have double-digit career receiving touchdowns. Penn State entered the season as one of seven FBS teams, and one of three Power Five teams, with multiple players collecting 10+ career receiving touchdowns.
- Tinsley and Washington are two of 30 FBS receivers entering the 2022 season with at least 100 receptions, 1,300 receiving yards and 10 receiving touchdowns in their career.
- Tinsley and Washington are both on the Biletnikoff Award watch list, while Washington is also on the Earl Campbell Tyler Rose Award watch list.
- KeAndre Lambert-Smith (521), Tinsley and Washington each recorded over 500 receiving yards last season. Penn State entered the season as one of nine FBS teams, and one of six Power Five teams, with three receivers on the roster who tallied 500+ receiving yards in 2021.
- Lambert-Smith returns for his third season in Happy Valley.
- Lambert-Smith, who has started 20 career games, made 34 receptions for 521 yards and five touchdowns with a long reception of 83 yards in 2021.
- The 83-yard reception resulted in a touchdown against Villanova (9/25), marking the seventh-longest pass play in program history.

- Eight of Lambert-Smith's 34 catches in 2021 were 20 or more yards and he finished sixth in the Big Ten in yards per reception (15.3)
- The sophomore had four catches for 58 yards at Purdue, including a 29-yard touchdown reception in the fourth quarter.
- · Lambert-Smith has a reception in 18-straight games.
- Sophomore Malick Meiga reached the end zone for the first time in his career, on a 67-yard strike from Christian Veilleux, in the third quarter against Rutgers in 2021.
- Penn State welcomed Tinsley as a transfer this past offseason.
   Tinsley spent the previous two seasons at Western Kentucky.
- Tinsley had a team-high seven catches for 84 yards at Purdue.
- The senior hauled in a 12-yard touchdown reception in the second quarter against Ohio, his first reception and first touchdown as a Nittany Lion.
- He had a 27-yard reception on PSU's game-winning drive in the fourth quarter.
- Tinsley, a senior, has a reception in 28-straight games, tied for the eight-longest reception streak in the nation.
- Among current FBS receivers, Tinsley ranks sixth in career receiving touchdowns (20), 18th in career receiving yards (1,890) and 26th in career receptions (140).
- Tinsley is one of six FBS receivers with 140 receptions, 1,800 receiving yards and 20 receiving touchdowns in his career.
- Tinsley has 27 career receptions of 20 or more yards and six receptions of 40 or more yards.
- A second-team All-Conference USA selection in 2021, Tinsley finished second in the league in receiving yards (1,402, 8th nationally), receptions (87, 16th) and touchdown receptions (14,5th).
- He started all 14 games for the Hilltoppers and averaged 100.1 yards receiving per game and 16.1 yards per reception.
- During the 2020 season, he played in all 12 games, making nine starts, pacing the Hilltoppers in receptions (43), yards (377) and touchdowns (4).
- The Nittany Lions had a program-record 17 different passcatchers against Ohio.

- In his two seasons at Penn State, Trautwein has helped seven Penn State offensive linemen to earn All-Big Ten honors.
- He's coached 17 All-Conference selections over the last four seasons, which includes a stint at Boston College as the offensive line coach.
- Trautwein was a two-time All-SEC selection and two-time team captain as a left tackle at Florida, earning first-team honors in 2008 and second-team accolades in 2006.
- He was part of the Gators winning the BCS National Championship and SEC titles in the 2006 and 2008 seasons.
- · Trautwein played four years in the NFL.
- Redshirt senior center Juice Scruggs leads the offensive line unit and began the season on the Rimington Trophy watch list.
- In 2021, he was named All-Big Ten honorable mention by the coaches and media, earned Pro Football Focus All-Big Ten third team honors, and was the team's Dick Maginnis Memorial Award, recognizing the most outstanding offensive lineman.
- Scruggs has made 15 career starts on the offensive line, including starting at center against Purdue and Ohio.
- Redshirt junior tackle **Caedan Wallace** returns and has 22 starts at right tackle and owns 28 career appearances.
- Sophomore **Olumuyiwa Fashanu** has appeared in 11 games and made four starts at left tackle.
- In 49 pass protections against Purdue, Fashanu allowed zero pressures.
- · Fashanu also allowed zero pressures against Ohio.
- Sophomore Nick Dawkins, redshirt senior Bryce Effner and redshirt freshman Landon Tengwall also saw playing time on the line in 2021.
- Redshirt junior **Sal Wormley** has appeared in four games and returns after missing the 2021 season due to injury.
- Tengwall and Wormley made their first career starts at Purdue.

#### **2023 HALL OF FAME BALLOT**

- Penn State lettermen Ki-Jana Carter, D.J. Dozier and Paul Posluszny have been selected as a part of the national ballot for the National Football Foundation's College Hall of Fame's Class of 2023. A total of 80 players and nine coaches from FBS are on the 2023 ballot.
- The trio of standouts have an opportunity to join 20 former Nittany Lion players and five Penn State coaches who have been inducted into the Hall.
- Also on the Hall of Fame ballot is former Nittany Lion studentathlete Glenn Killinger, who is among the candidates for the divisional coach Class of 2023. Killinger was inducted into the Hall of Fame as a player in 1966.
- Carter, a running back for the Nittany Lions, was a first-team All-American during the 1994 campaign. Carter staked a claim to being one of the most decorated Penn State running backs of all-time with a junior season in which he was fourth nationally in rushing (139.9), second in scoring (10.8 ppg) and fifth in allpurpose yardage (158.4). The Westerville, Ohio native led the Big Ten in all three categories. His 7.8 yards per carry was easily the best among the nation's Top 25 rushers. His 1994 statistics included 1,539 yards rushing, the then-No. 2 season total in Penn State history, and 23 touchdowns. Carter was runner-up for the Heisman Trophy and a finalist for the Maxwell Award. He was named co-MVP of the Rose Bowl with 156 rushing yards on 21 carries, including an 83-yard touchdown run on the Nittany Lions' first offensive play. When the Cincinnati Bengals selected Carter as the first overall player picked in the 1995 NFL Draft, he became the first Nittany Lion to be chosen No. 1.
- Dozier, a tailback for the Nittany Lions, matriculated to Happy Valley from Virginia Beach, Va. He earned first team All-America honors from the Walter Camp Football Foundation in 1986. Dozier is the only Nittany Lion to the lead the team in rushing four consecutive seasons, doing so from 1983-86. He ranks No. 5 on the school career rushing yardage list with 3,2227 yards, scoring 25 touchdowns and averaging 5.2 yards per attempt. Dozier gained 1,002 yards as a freshman and tallied 811 yards and 10 touchdowns as a senior and one of the instrumental players on the Nittany Lions' 12-0 squad. Dozier was the Most Valuable Offensive Player of the Game after rushing for 99 yards and scoring the game-winning touchdown in the fourth quarter against Miami in the 1987 Fiesta Bowl to secure Penn State's second national championship.
- Posluszny, an outside linebacker for the Nittany Lions, was a first-team All-American in 2005 and 2006. Posluszny became just the second two-time winner of the Chuck Bednarik Award, presented to the nation's top defensive player, in 2006. In 2005, he also won the Butkus Award, presented to the nation's top linebacker and was a finalist for the 2006 honor. The 13th Nittany Lion to be named a two-time first-team All-American, Posluszny also was a two-time finalist for the Rotary Lombardi Award. The Nittany Lions' first two-time team captain since 1968-69, he became Penn State's career tackle leader with 372. A starter in the last 37 games of his career, Posluszny became the first Nittany Lion to lead the team in tackles three times and to post three 100-tackle seasons, recording 116 in 2006. Posluszny also was a two-time first-team ESPN the Magazine Academic All-American and was selected the 2006 Academic All-American of the Year among Division I football players.
- From Harrisburg, Killinger was a Walter Camp All-American at quarterback for the Nittany Lions in 1921. He coached at Dickinson (1922), Rensselaer (1927-32), Moravian (1933) and West Chester (1934-41, 45-59). Killinger is the winningest coach in West Chester history and is a member of the Pennsylvania Sports Hall of Fame. He died in 1988.
- Penn State has 26 players and coaches who are members of the College Football Hall of Fame. Six coaches and 20 players have earned their way into the hall of fame.
- LaVar Arrington will be inducted into the College Football Hall of Fame on December 6, 2022 at the 64th National Football Foundation (NFF) Annual Awards Dinner.

#### **DEFENSIVE NOTES**

- Manny Diaz was hired as Penn State's defensive coordinator and linebackers coach on Dec. 11, 2021.
- Diaz, who has 24 years of collegiate coaching experience, including three as a head coach and 13 as a defensive coordinator, joined the Nittany Lions after spending six seasons (2016-21) at the University of Miami, including three seasons as head coach (2019-21).
- Diaz coached the Hurricanes to three bowl appearances in his
  three seasons at the helm, which included an 8-3 record and
  7-2 mark in ACC play during the 2020 season. It marked the
  second time with Diaz on staff as well as the second time in
  program history Miami won seven ACC games.
- Defenses under Diaz have been a force behind the line of scrimmage. From 2018-20, Miami's defense featured at least one player with 15 tackles for loss: Jaelan Phillips (15.5) in 2020, Gregory Rousseau (19.5) in 2019 and Jonathan Garvin (18.0) in 2018.
- During Diaz's tenure in Miami, the Hurricanes ranked in the top 10 nationally in tackles for loss each year. Miami was No. 9 in 2021 (7.75 per game), No. 4 in 2020 (8.6), No. 4 in 2019 (8.3), No. 1 in 2018 (10.5), No. 4 in 2017 (8.5) and No. 5 in 2016 (8.3).
- Penn State tallied a school-record 16 pass breakups at Purdue, including six by CB Joey Porter Jr. and four by S Keaton Ellis.
- Penn State's school-record 16 pass breakups at Purdue are the most by an FBS team in a game since Tulane had 20 vs. East Carolina in 2018.
- Porter's six pass breakups are a school record and tied a Big Ten single-game record, matching Michigan's Jourdan Lewis (vs. Michigan State, 2015) and Minnesota's Michael Carter (vs. Purdue. 2012).
- His six pass breakups are the most by an FBS player since Houston's William Jackson III had seven against Temple in 2015.
- The Nittany Lions held Purdue's Aidan O'Connell to 30-of-60 passing (50 percent) after he completed 71 percent of his passes in 2021.
- PSU limited Ohio to 264 total yards, the 46th time its held an opponent under 300 total yards since 2014, the seventh-most games among FBS teams.
- Penn State caused a safety in the second quarter vs. Ohio, its first safety since 2018 at Pitt (holding in the end zone).
- Against Ohio, the Nittany Lions snapped a streak of 20-straight games forcing a turnover. The streak dated back to the Nebraska game in 2020.
- In those 20 games, Penn State forced 29 total turnovers (19 interceptions, 10 fumbles).
- Over the last seven seasons, PSU sits second nationally in sacks per game (3.0; trailing only Clemson), third in QB hurries (910), fourth in total pressures generated (1360), fifth in fewest passing TDs allowed per game (1.03), seventh in fewest passing yards per attempt (6.26), eighth in tackles for loss percentage (10.50) and 12th in fewest rushing yards per attempt (3.60).
- Penn State's 268 sacks over the last eight years (2015-22) are fourth behind Clemson (335), Alabama (316) and Pitt (291).
- Over the last eight years, Penn State has accumulated a 8.37 percent sack percentage (268 sacks on 3,550 plays), which ranks sixth in the FBS.
- Since 2014, Penn State has held opponents to seven or less points 23 times, seventh-most among FBS teams. Seventeen of those 23 games have been against Big Ten opponents.
- In the James Franklin era, Penn State has recorded seven shutouts, fifth-most among FBS teams.
- Penn State also has the fifth-most shutouts (12) in the FBS since 2007
- Since 2014, the Nittany Lions have allowed less than 200 passing yards in 59 games, tied for the sixth-most among FBS teams
- Penn State has held opponents under 100 passing yards in 16 games since 2014, tied eighth-most among FBS teams.
- Since 2014, Penn State has held opponents under 100 rushing yards on 40 occasions, 13th-most among FBS teams.
- Penn State has registered 10 or more tackles for loss 25 times since 2014, the third-most among FBS teams.

#### **DEFENSIVE LINE NOTES**

- John Scott Jr. is in his third season heading the Nittany Lion defensive line corps. Scott brings 18 years of collegiate coaching experience to the Penn State defensive line room with two additional years of coaching experience in the NFL.
- In Scott's first two seasons at Penn State, the Nittany Lions had three first-team All-Big Ten selections in Odafe (Jayson) Oweh and Shaka Toney in 2020 and Arnold Ebiketie in 2021.
- Six Nittany Lions earned All-Big Ten accolades in the last two
  seasons
- The Nittany Lions defensive line room features 2021 All-Big Ten honoree DT PJ Mustipher.
- Mustipher, a senior and team captain, anchors the Nittany Lion defensive line room, having appeared in 42 career games and making 18 starts. In his Penn State career, Mustipher owns 108 tackles, 10 tackles for loss and three sacks.
- Mustipher is a team captain for the second-straight season.
- Despite suffering a season-ending injury at lowa on Oct.
   9, Mustipher was named a 2021 All-Big Ten second team selection by the coaches.
- Mustipher began the season on watch lists for the Rotary Lombardi Award, Bronko Nagurski Trophy and Outland Trophy.
- Mustipher was a 2021 semifinalist for the Rotary Lombardi Award, a quarterfinalist for the Lott IMPACT Trophy and was on the Reese's Senior Bowl watch list in 2021.
- The senior had a defensive line-high seven tackles at Wisconsin, recorded a sack against Villanova and tallied six tackles and a tackle for loss against Indiana in 2021.
- Redshirt senior DE Nick Tarburton has appeared in 24 career games, making 10 starts.
- He recovered a fumble in the red zone, the first of his career, in the second quarter against Wisconsin in 2021.
- Tarburton made an assist on a sack against Illinois in 2021 that resulted in a forced fumble and recovery for Penn State.

- Sophomore DE Adisa Isaac earned his first career start against Purdue
- Isaac tallied two stops and a tackle for loss vs. Ohio.
- Sophomore **DE Amin Vanover** registered two tackles vs. the

  Reilarmakors
- Sophomore DT Coziah Izzard made his first career start against Illinois and started seven-straight games to finish the 2021 season.
- Izzard, who made 21 tackles, two sacks and three tackles for loss in 2021, recorded a strip-sack against Rutgers.
- Redshirt junior DT **Dvon Ellies** has also seen valuable time at defensive tackle, playing in all 13 games in 2021.
- Ellies recovered a fumble in the second quarter against Illinois, his first career recovery.
- Redshirt junior DE Smith Vilbert recorded three sacks in the Outback Bowl vs. Arkansas, the most sacks by a Penn State player in a single game since Shaka Toney had three against Purdue in 2019.
- The three sacks also set a Penn State bowl record.
- Penn State welcomed sophomore DE Chop Robinson to the program this summer. Robinson transfered from the University of Maryland.
- Robinson was a 2021 ESPN Midseason True Freshman All-American, appearing in all 13 games with one start, totaling 19 tackles (12 solo), 2.5 tackles for loss for 18 yards and two sacks for 16 yards.
- Robinson collected two tackles, a tackle for loss and a pass breakup against Ohio.
- In his Penn State debut, Robinson had a key QB hurry to force an incompletion on Purdue's final play of the game.
- Freshman DT Zane Durant made his collegiate debut against Purdue, registering a tackle.

#### **COACHING STAFF NOTES**

#### **COACHING STAFF CHANGES**

- Penn State added defensive coordinator/linebackers coach Manny Diaz, special teams coordinator/outside linebacker/nickels coach Stacy Collins and assistant athletic director for football performance enhancement Chuck Losey.
- Diaz, who has 24 years of collegiate coaching experience, including three as a head coach and 13 as a defensive coordinator, joins the Nittany Lions after spending six seasons (2016-21) at the University of Miami, including three seasons as head coach (2019-21).
- Collins, who has 24 years of collegiate coaching experience, joins the Nittany Lions after spending the 2021 season as Boise State's special teams coordinator and edge coach.
- During the 2021 campaign, Collins' special teams unit blocked three punts (T-7th nationally) and four kicks overall to rank ninth in FBS.
   Of the three blocked punts, two were returned for touchdowns.
- Losey, who was previously associate director of performance enhancement for football, will lead the performance enhancement staff for football. He replaces Dwight Galt III, who retired.

#### LETTERMEN MAKING THEIR RETURN

- Nine members of the coaching and support staff played at PSU.
- Associate head coach/cornerbacks coach Terry M. Smith was a three-year starter at wide receiver from 1989-91. He ranks tied for 10th in career receiving touchdowns (15), 13th in career receiving yardage (1,825) and 14th in career receptions (108).
- Tight ends coach Ty Howle was a four-year letterwinner on the Penn State offensive line from 2009-13. He played in 47 career games, making 13 starts. The 2013 team captain made starts at center and left guard and was a four-time Academic All-Big Ten selection.
- Defensive graduate assistant Deion Barnes made 31 starts as a Nittany Lion from 2012-14. In 2014, Barnes tallied 12.5 tackles for loss and six sacks. He led PSU with 10 tackles for loss and six sacks in 2012 to earn consensus freshman All-American honors.
- Analyst and analytics coordinator Dan Connor was a two-time first team All-America linebacker for Penn State in 2006 and 2007, the 14th Nittany Lion to be named a two-time first-team All-American. He finished his career as Penn State's all-time leader with 419 tackles.
- Analyst and analytics coordinator Danny Rocco lettered as a linebacker for the Nittany Lions in 1979 and 1980, playing for the Liberty and Fiesta Bowl teams.
- Assistant director of performance enhancement Tyrone Smith was a defensive tackle for PSU and lettered during the 2014 season.
- Assistant recruiting coordinator Alan Zemaitis was a four-year letterman and three-time All-Big Ten selection for the blue and white from 2002-05. Zemaitis sits tied fifth all-time at Penn State with 12 career interceptions. He also holds fifth all-time at Penn State with 46 passes defended. Zemaitis helped the Nittany Lions to a Big Ten Championship in 2005.
- Director of football academic services Todd Kulka lettered as a linebacker and graduated in 1995. He helped Penn State to a 9-3 record and an Outback Bowl victory in 1995.
- Director of the football letterman's club Wally Richardson was a four-year letterman as a quarterback in 1992 and 1994-96. Richardson ranks 12th all-time at Penn State with 4,419 career passing yards. He also sits eighth all-time with 378 completions and 12th all-time with 27 touchdown passes.

- Penn State's linebacker corps is led by 2021 All-Big Ten honoree Curtis Jacobs
- Jacobs, who earned All-Big Ten honorable mention recognition in 2021, has played in 22 career games and made 13 starts.
- Jacobs tallied six tackles, including three solo, at Purdue.
- The sophomore made five stops, a half-tackle for loss and a pass breakup against Ohio.
- Redshirt senior Jonathan Sutherland brings a wealth of experience to the linebackers room, having played in 47 career games.
- Sutherland notched three tackles, including his first career full sack, and his 100th career tackle at Purdue.
- Sutherland, who played both safety and linebacker in 2021, made the switch to a full-time linebacker for the 2022 season.
- He joins Sean Clifford as the only four-time team captains in program history.
- Sutherland is on the preseason Paul Hornung Award watch list.
- Sophomore Tyler Elsdon led the Nittany Lions with six tackles (three solo) against Ohio.
- Elsdon made his first career start against Purdue.
- Freshman Abdul Carter and redshirt freshman Dominic DeLuca each notched five tackles against Ohio.
- Linebacker Micah Parsons was selected 12th overall by the Dallas Cowboys in the 2021 NFL Draft.
- Parsons was the highest drafted Penn State defensive player since Aaron Maybin went 11th overall to the Buffalo Bills in 2009.
- He was the first Nittany Lion defensive player drafted in the first round since Jared Odrick (2010; 28th overall to the Miami Dolphins) and the first PSU linebacker selected in the first round since LaVar Arrington (2000; second overall to the Washington Redskins).
- Penn State has 71 linebackers drafted all-time, the most for any school.

#### **CORNERBACKS** NOTES

- Terry M. Smith is in his ninth season as Penn State's cornerbacks coach. He is also the program's associate head coach and defensive recruiting coordinator.
- Over the last seven seasons, Smith has tutored a secondary which has seen eight defensive backs taken in the NFL Draft, including two in 2022, tied for the ninth-most nationally.
- Smith was a four-year letterwinner (1988-91) and three-year starter at wide receiver at Penn State. He ranks tied for 10th in career receiving touchdowns (15), 13th in career receiving yardage (1,825) and 14th in career receptions (108).
- Penn State forced 14 interceptions and held opposing offenses to a 111.04 passing efficiency in 2021.
- Penn State's cornerbacks room is led by All-Big Ten returnee Joey Porter Jr.
- Porter tallied a career-high six pass breakups against Purdue, earning Bednarik Award National Player of the Week honors.
- Porter's six pass breakups vs. the Boilermakers set a school record and tied a Big Ten single-game record. He matched Michigan's Jourdan Lewis (vs. Michigan State, 2015) and Minnesota's Michael Carter (vs. Purdue, 2012).
- Porter's six pass breakups are tied for the most in a single game for an FBS player since Houston's William Jackson III had seven against Temple in 2015.
- According to Pro Football Focus, Porter's six forced incompletions tied for the most in a game by a Power Five cornerback since 2014.
- The junior added a team-high eight tackles and made his first career fumble recovery.
- Porter began the 2022 campaign on watch lists for the Bednarik Award, Bronko Nagurski Trophy, Jim Thorpe Award and Lott IMPACT Trophy. Porter was also named Preseason All-America second team by Sports Illustrated.
- Porter, who has played in 27 career games with the Nittany Lions and has made 23 starts, recorded his first career interception against Indiana in 2021.
- Redshirt junior **Daequan Hardy**, who owned nine passes defended in 2021, recorded his first career interception against Ball State
- Hardy accounted for two tackles and two pass breakups, including a key breakup to force a Purdue punt late in the fourth quarter.
- Sophomore **Kalen King** recorded one pass breakup at Purdue.
- Junior **Johnny Dixon** registered his first career sack and broke up two passes against the Boilermakers.
- Dixon recorded a career-high 1.5 tackles for loss and a solo sack against Ohio.
- Dixon ranks fourth in the Big Ten averaging 1.0 sacks per contest.
- Junior Marquis Wilson made the switch back to cornerback after being listed as an athlete for the 2021 season. He's played in 29 games, including two starts, with 39 tackles, five pass breakups and two interceptions.

The senior has broken up seven passes as a Nittany Lion.

   Poindexter is in his second season on the Nittany Lion
   coaching staff.
- Poindexter has 18 years of collegiate coaching experience, including seven as a defensive or co-defensive coordinator.
- As a player, Poindexter was a two-time consensus All-American at Virginia and was chosen as the 1998 ACC Defensive Player of the Year.
- Poindexter was inducted into the College Football Hall of Fame in 2020
- Senior Ji'Ayir Brown leads the Penn State safeties.
- Brown accounted for five solo tackles at Purdue.
- The senior tallied five tackles (four solo), a half-tackle for loss and a pass breakup vs. Ohio.
- Brown is on the preseason watch lists for the Bednarik Award and Jim Thorpe Award.
- Brown, a third-team All-Big Ten honoree in 2021, tied for the nation's lead with six interceptions.
- The six picks, which are tied for 10th-most in a single season at Penn State, are the most by a Penn State player since Anthony Scirrotto also had six in 2006.
- The senior had a hand in eight takeaways in 2021 (six interceptions, two fumble recoveries).
- He is the first Nittany Lion with six interceptions and two fumble recoveries in a season since Alan Zemaitis in 2005 (six interceptions, two fumble recoveries).
- The Trenton, N.J. native tallied two interceptions vs. Arkansas in the Outback Bowl, tying a Penn State bowl record.
- Junior Keaton Ellis brings a wealth of experience to the Penn State secondary, having appeared in 32 career games, making nine starts.
- In his career, Ellis owns three forced fumbles, one fumble recovery, an interception and nine pass breakups.
- · He tallied a career-best four pass breakups at Purdue.
- During their true freshmen campaigns in 2021, sophomore Jaylen Reed (8 games) and redshirt freshman Zakee Wheatley (4 games) each gained playing experience in the secondary.
- Wheatley forced a fumble at Purdue, which led to a touchdown drive at the end of the second quarter.
- · Wheatley added a career-best two tackles.
- Reed made a career-high three tackles against the Boilermakers.
- Freshman **Kevin Winston Jr.** made his debut against Ohio, recording three tackles.

#### **SPECIAL TEAMS NOTES**

- Stacy Collins is in his first season as Penn State's special teams coordinator/outside linebacker/nickels coach.
- Collins, who has 24 years of collegiate coaching experience, joined the Nittany Lions after spending the 2021 season as Boise State's special teams coordinator and edge coach.
- During the 2021 campaign, Collins' special teams unit blocked three punts, which tied for seventh in the nation, and four kicks overall to rank ninth in FBS. Of the three blocked punts, two were returned for touchdowns.
- Under Collins, the Broncos finished fifth in the nation and led the Mountain West Conference in punt returns with a 15.77 yards per return. In addition, Boise State's kickoff return defense was second the MWC and 36th in FBS with a 19.03 average.
- Since 2019, Penn State's kick return defense ranks second in the nation in touchback percentage (79.6; 1st in B1G) and percentage of kickoffs returned (13.0; 1st), third in average kick return yards allowed (16.5; 1st) and percentage of kickoffs returned inside the 25 (82.1; 1st), and tied eighth in average opponent field position (25.1; 3rd).
- Also since 2019, Penn State's punt return defense is ranked third in net punting (41.8; 2nd in B1G), sixth in punts inside the 20 (46.0 percent; 2nd) and seventh in punts inside the 10 (19.0 percent; 4th).
- Senior K Jake Pinegar ranks third all-time at Penn State with 148 career extra points and sits 10th in career extra point percentage (96.1).
- Pinegar is eighth all-time at Penn State with a 71.7 field goal percentage. He's also 10th in field goal attempts (53) and tied 10th in field goals made (38). The lowa native is also sixth on the all-time scoring list with 262 career points.
- Pinegar's 37 career field goals rank 21st among current FBS kirkers
- Pinegar converted all five extra points at Purdue and hit five extra points, and a 25-yard field goal, vs. Ohio.
- Senior SN Chris Stoll is in his fourth season as Penn State's primary long snapper. He's appeared in 36 career games.
- The captain is a member of the Patrick Mannelly Award watch list. He is on the Allstate AFCA Good Works Team watch list.
- Redshirt senior P Barney Amor ranks seventh in the FBS and second in the Big Ten with a 45.7 punt average.
- Amor has landed five punts inside the 20 and six punts of 50+ vards.
- Amor set a career high with eight punt attempts at Purdue, including a 52-yard punt and landed three punts inside the 20, including two inside the 10.
- Against Ohio, Amor landed two punts inside the 20 and hit two punts of 50+ yards to earn Ray Guy Great 8 honors.
- The redshirt senior is a member of the Ray Guy Award watch list
- Amor was awarded a scholarship during preseason camp.
- S Jonathan Sutherland is wearing No. 0 for the thirdstraight season as the team's special teams leader as part of a new tradition that began in 2020.
- KR Nicholas Singleton averaged 21.3 yards per return at Purdue, including a 25-yard return in the third quarter.
- Singleton had two 20-yard kick returns vs. Ohio.
- Singleton ranks third in the Big Ten with a 20.8 kick return average.

#### **GAME RECAP**

WEST LAFAYETTE, Ind. - Sean Clifford connected with Keyvone Lee for a 10-yard touchdown to give the Penn State football team the lead with 57 seconds remaining as the Nittany Lions earned a 35-31 win over Purdue at Ross-Ade Stadium to begin the 2022 season.

Clifford completed 20-of-37 passes for 282 yards and a career-high-tying four passing touchdowns, while adding a 2-yard rushing score. Mitchell Tinsley caught seven passes for 84 yards and a touchdown in his Penn State debut, while KeAndre Lambert-Smith had four receptions for 58 yards and a touchdown. Brenton Strange added a 67-yard touchdown reception.

Joey Porter Jr. led the Nittany Lions with eight tackles to go with six pass breakups and a fumble recovery. Johnny Dixon and Jonathan Sutherland each had a sack, while Dixon broke up two passes. Keaton Ellis broke up four passes and Zakee Wheatley forced a fumble.

#### HOW IT HAPPENED

The Boilermakers got on the board first, finishing a 73-yard drive with a 36-yard field goal by Mitchell Fineran with 3:38 left in the first quarter.

Penn State answered with a 12-yard touchdown pass from Clifford to Tinsley with 13:09 left in the second quarter. The Nittany Lions finished a 12-play, 79-yard drive as Clifford found a wide-open Tinsley on a crossing route. The drive was sparked by a 20-yard reception by Parker Washington and a 12-yard catch by Devyn Ford. Penn State took a 7-3 lead.

Purdue responded with a touchdown drive, concluding with a 3-yard run by King Doerue. The Boilermakers' 75-yard drive was aided by a pair of penalties. Purdue led 10-7 with 9:43 left in the second quarter.

Penn State re-took the lead on a 2-yard touchdown rush by Clifford with 1:44 left in the first half. The eight-play, 43-yard drive including four runs by Nicholas Singleton and a 10-yard catch by Strange.

The Nittany Lions forced a turnover in Purdue territory with 30 seconds left in the half. On a reverse play, Wheatley knocked the ball loose and Porter Jr. recovered the ball at the Penn State 18.

Penn State took advantage of the turnover with a 67-yard touchdown reception by Strange. The redshirt junior caught the ball along the sideline and fought off multiple Boilermakers to break loose for the score and his longest carper reception. Penn State held a 21-10 lead at the break

Purdue scored on a 2-yard run by Doerue on the opening drive of the
second half. A 75-yard drive included a 22-yard pass from Aidan O'Connell to
Charlie lones.

The Boilermakers took the lead on a 7-yard touchdown pass from O'Connell to Jones late in the third quarter. Purdue engineered a 10-play, 81-yard drive, which included a 26-yard reception by Mershawn Rice and a 23-yard catch by Payne Durham. Purdue led 24-21 with 1:11 left in the third quarter.

The Nittany Lions answered with a 29-yard touchdown reception by Lambert-Smith in the fourth quarter. After forcing a three-and-out, Penn State started the drive at their own 45 yard-line. Clifford hit Mitchell Tinsley for a 17-yard reception and Kaytron Allen for a nine-yard pass. Clifford connected with Lambert-Smith on a slant and the sophomore spun out of a tackle and took it to the end zone. Penn State held a 28-24 lead with 10:44 remaining.

took it to the end zone. Penn State held a 28-24 lead with 10:44 remaining. Purdue re-took the lead on a 72-yard pick-six by Chris Jefferson to hold a 31-28 advantage with 8:29 to go.

After a key third-down pass breakup by Hardy to force a Purdue punt, the Nittany Lions took over on their own 20 yard-line with 2:22 remaining.

The drive began with an 8-yard completion to Tinsley and a 7-yard

The drive began with an 8-yard completion to Tinsley and a 7-yard reception by Lambert-Smith. Two plays later, Clifford connected with Tinsley towards the sideline for a 27-yard catch-and-run to the Purdue 30. On second-and-five at the Purdue 25, Clifford hit Tyler Warren for a 15-yard gain to the Purdue 10. On the next play, Clifford rolled out to his right and lofted a pass to Lee, who took it into the end-zone for the go-ahead score. Penn State took a 35-31 lead with 57 seconds remaining.

#### **GAME RECAP**

**UNIVERSITY PARK, Pa.** – The Penn State Football team defeated Ohio, 46-10, in its 2022 home opener at Beaver Stadium.

Freshman Nicholas Singleton had a breakout-performance with 10 carries for 179 yards, including 70 and 44-yard touchdowns and a 48-yard run. Singleton's first career touchdown was Penn State's longest run since Journey Brown's 85-yard run versus Pitt in 2019. His 179 yards are a school record for a Beaver Stadium debut.

Singleton became the first Nittany Lion with multiple 40+ yard touchdown runs in a game since Larry Johnson at Indiana on Nov. 16, 2002 (touchdown runs of 41, 43 and 69 yards). He is the first Nittany Lion with three 40+ yard runs in a game since Johnson's performance against Indiana (runs of 41, 41, 43 and 69).

Penn State produced 572 total yards, with 234 on the ground and 338 in the air. Sean Clifford was 19-for-27 passing for 213 yards and a touchdown along with a 1-yard touchdown run. Seventeen Nittany Lions registered at least one catch, led by Parker Washington with four for 60 yards.

The Nittany Lions limited the Bobcats to just 264 yards, 16 first downs and just two plays over 20 yards. Tyler Elsdon had a team-high six tackles and Dominic DeLuca collected a team-high five solo tackles.

#### **HOW IT HAPPENED**

The Nittany Lions got on the board first as a 12-play, 77-yard drive finished with a 1-yard touchdown rush by Clifford. The redshirt senior completed all six passes attempted on the drive, tallying 62 yards. The drive included a 38-yard reception by Washington and a 15-yard grab by Tyler Warren. Clifford had a 15-yard run to setup his touchdown rush. Penn State led 7-0 with 6:45 remaining in the first quarter.

Penn State needed just one play to score on its next drive as Singleton ran 70 yards for his first career touchdown, which doubled the Nittany Lions' lead with 2:28 left in the opening quarter.

Unable to score on a third-straight possession, Penn State responded with a safety on Ohio's first play of its drive. Pinned at the 1-yard line after a 45-yard punt by Barney Amor, the Bobcats botched a handoff in the endzone and were able to jump on the hall before a Nittany Lion defender could

able to jump on the ball before a Nittany Lion defender could.

Penn State added a field goal with 5:14 remaining in the second quarter on Jake Pinegar's 25-yard kick.

Ohio got on the board in its final possession of the first half. The Bobcats turned in an eight-play, 75-yard drive capitalized by a one-yard rushing touchdown by Sieh Bangura.

Starting at its own 22-yard line with 1:29 left in the first half, Penn State effectively ran its two-minute offense for a 7-yard touchdown throw from Clifford to Mitchell Tinsley with 15 seconds left. Clifford made eight competitions for all 78 yards gained on the drive, including a 34-yard catch by Washington that preceded Tinsley's touchdown.

The Nittany Lions recorded the first score of the second half with a 32-yard pass from Drew Allar to Omari Evans for both of their first collegiate touchdowns with 9:25 left in the third quarter. Starting from their 30-yard line, the five-play drive took only two minutes and eight seconds, which was aided by a 7-yard catch by Washington and 15-yard roughing the passer penalty added to it.

Singleton's second touchdown, of 44 yards, made it 40-7 with 4:33 left in the third quarter. All three plays in the 52-yard drive were Singleton rushes. Penn State's final touchdown was Allar's second touchdown, a 28-yard

Penn State's final touchdown was Alfar's second touchdown, a 28-yard pass to Khalil Dinkins for his first career touchdown, a minute and 16 seconds into the fourth quarter. The Nittany Lions orchestrated a 55-yard drive on nine plays, and the freshman quarterback accounted for all but one yard with four rushes for 17 yards and three completions for 37 yards.

Ohio notched a 21-yard field goal to complete a 15-play, 76-yard drive with 6:50 left in the game.


