FOOTBALL HOSTS No. 22 PENN STATE

Auburn (2-0, 0-0 SEC) hosts the Penn State Nittany Lions (2-0, 1-0 Big Ten) on Saturday, September 17, in the first-ever visit by a Big Ten team to Jordan-Hare Stadium in Auburn, Ala. CBS will televise the 2:30 p.m. CT non-conference matchup.

Fans are asked to wear orange. Recognitions include winners of the PNC Achievers award, 2022 Alabama Sports Hall of Fame inductee William Andrews and Starr-Sullivan Achievement Award winner Stan White, and Auburn's 2022 SEC champion men's basketball team.

SERIES HISTORY

- >> Penn State leads the all-time series with Auburn 2-1. The Nittany Lions were 28-20 winners at Beaver Stadium last season; both other previous meetings came in bowl games. The Nittany Lions won the first matchup, a 43-14 victory in Tampa's Outback Bowl after the 1995 season. Auburn was a 13-9 winner in Orlando's Capital One Bowl following the 2002 campaign.
- "> This will be Auburn's fourth-ever regular season game against a Big Ten team after last season's September visit to Penn State. Prior to that, the last was a 1931 7-7 tie at Wisconsin (the Tigers' only other regular-season road game at a Big Ten stadium) and the first was a 0-0 tie with Ohio State in a game played in Montgomery, Ala., in 1917.


The Tigers played a home-and-home with Nebraska in 1981-92 and faced Maryland in 1952, 1958 and 1983 when those schools were members of other leagues.

The Tigers are 12-11-2 all-time against current members of the Big Ten, including games against Indiana, Rutgers, Maryland, Michigan, Michigan State, Minnesota, Nebraska, Northwestern, Ohio State, Penn State, Purdue and Wisconsin.

KICKOFF COVERAGE

- Auburn's 2022 campaign is its 130th season of college football. The Tigers have 790 wins alltime, 13th-most among FBS schools
- » Sophomore tailback Jarquez Hunter leads the SEC In scoring at 12.0 points per game; he has four rushing touchdowns already this season
- Auburn has shut out its first two opponents in both the first and third quarters, one of eight teams -- Georgia, Iowa, Oklahoma, Ole Miss, Purdue, Toledo and Tulane -- that has done so this season
- Auburn opens with five consecutive home games at Jordan-Hare Stadium for the first time since the 2016 season

- Auburn has won 17 straight home games against non-conference opponents dating back to the 2016 season
- Preseason all-SEC Tigers as selected by the league's coaches include Derick Hall and Tank Bigsby (first team), Colby Wooden and Oscar Chapman (second team) and Anders Carlson (third team)
- Auburn continues the longest FBS current span of games (168) without having a punt blocked; Auburn last had a punt blocked vs. Mississippi State in 2009.
- SEC Nation, Marty & McGee, CBS Sports HQ, Late Kick with Josh Pate and Touchdown Radio will all originate from the Plains this Saturday





STUDENT-ATHLETE EXPERIENCE: ACADEMICS

THE GRADUATES

» On the 2022 Auburn roster, 17 players have already received bachelor's degrees: Marcus Bragg (Western Kentucky), Nick Brahms; Marquis Burks; Zach Calzada (Texas A&M); Anders Carlson; Brandon Council (Akron); Luke Deal; Alec Jackson; Shedrick Jackson; Morris Joseph Jr. (Memphis); Eku Leota (Northwestern); Barton Lester; Jacob Quattlebaum; John Samuel Shenker; Kameron Stutts; Austin Troxell; and Kilian Zierer.

COSIDA ACADEMIC ALL-AMERICA

» Kicker Anders Carlson and center Nick Brahms earned 2021 CoSIDA first team Academic All-America honors, only the second time that Auburn has had two first-team honorees in the prestigious program, which recognizes the nation's top student-athletes. LB Gregg Carr and K/P Matt Hawkins were both first-team honorees in 1984. Carlson, a 2020 first team Academic All-American, is just the second two-time honoree in Auburn history, along with Hawkins (1984-85). Carlson graduated in December, 2020, with a 3.92 GPA in professional flight management and has since completed his MBA. Brahms graduated in December, 2020, with a 3.89 GPA in professional flight management and also completed his MBA.

SEC HONOR ROLLS

There were 43 Auburn representatives on the SEC Academic Honor Roll for the 2021 season, including current team members John Reese Bellew, Tank Bigsby, Jackson Billigs, Nick Brahms, Anders Carlson, Oscar Chapman, Sammy Cohen, Luke Deal, Brandon Frazier, Tyler Fromm, Reed Hughes, Alec Jackson, Tate Johnson, Keiondre Jones, Barton Lester, Jake Levant, Trey Lindsey, Trent Mason, Evan McGuire, Marshall Meyers, Tommy Nesmith, Sawyer Pate, Jacob Quattlebaum, John Samuel Shenker, Wesley Steiner, Zykeivous Walker, Jeremiah Wright and Kilian Zierer.

Team members had a 3.0 GPA for the previous school year or a cumulative 3.0 GPA or higher. These student-athlete leaders are also recognized as Academic Top Tigers.

» Auburn football had six representatives on the SEC First-Year Academic Honor Roll, recognizing freshmen and transfer student-athletes with a cumulative 3.0 GPA or higher. Current team members honored included Cort Bradley, Jarquez Hunter, Donovan Kaufman, Kyle Vaccarella and Garrison Walker.

AD HONOR ROLL

» Undergraduate student-athletes earn a spot on the AD Honor Roll with a combined 3.50 GPA or higher for the school year. 2022 AUBURN FOOTBALL

>> Auburn holds an all-time football record of 6-3-2 against teams from the state of Pennsylvania, going 1-2 against Penn State, 4-1-2 against Villanova and 1-0 in a 1914 game with the Carlisle Institute.

IN SEPTEMBER

Auburn is 183-59-5 (.751) all-time in the month of September; the Tigers are 117-22-1 (.839) all-time at home in September, and 66-37-4 (.632) away from Auburn in that month.

Since 1970, the Tigers have had a winning record in the month of September in 45 of 52 seasons. The Tigers are 4-4 all-time in games played on September 17 and 4-3 at home on that date.

TOTAL OFFENSE

Auburn has scored in 119 consecutive games, the second-longest streak in school history. The Tigers are averaging 31.89 ppg (3,795 total points) during that stretch. Auburn was last shut out by No. 2 Alabama 49-0 in Tuscaloosa in 2012.

The longest streak of not being shut out in program history is 149 games, beginning with a 55-16 victory over Richmond on Oct. 4, 1980, in Doug Barfield's final season as the Tigers' head coach and lasting until the final game of Pat Dye's 12-year tenure as Auburn head coach when the Tigers lost 17-0 to No. 2 Alabama in the 1992 Iron Bowl.

Junior tailback Tank Bigsby got his 2022 campaign off to a productive start with 147 rushing yards and a pair of rushing touchdowns in the season opener against Mercer. His 39-yard score was the longest rushing TD of his career.

The 19th player in Auburn history to rush for

more than 2,000 career yards, he ranks 17th with 2,131 career yards and 18 career scores. Bigsby's 10 career 100-yard rushing games are tied for 12th in program history.

With 1,099 yards last season, Bigsby became Auburn's first 1,000-yard rusher since Kerryon Johnson in 2017. Bigsby rushed for 100 yards+ in the first three games of the 2021 campaign.

He ranks third among Auburn rushers in yards gained through their sophomore season: Michael Dyer (2,355/2010-11); Bo Jackson (2,042/1982-83); Tank Bigsby (1,933/2020-21).

In 2020, Bigsby, the SEC Freshman of the Year, was eighth in the SEC in all-purpose average (122.4/gm, third among FBS freshmen); his 834 rushing yards ranked second among all FBS freshmen. Bigsby was the first Tiger to average 6.0 yards per carry since James Bostic in 1993.

>> Jarquez Hunter opened his sophomore campaign by rushing for three touchdowns on only eight carries against Mercer. It was Hunter's first career game with multiple rushing touchdowns. Hunter's three rushing scores against the Bears matched his total in 13 games as a freshman.

He is the first Auburn player to rush for three touchdowns since JaTarvious Whitlow did so against Mississippi State in 2019.

Hunter (3 rushing TDs vs. Mercer) and Bigsby (2 rushing TDs vs. Mercer) are the first Auburn teammates to rush for multiple touchdowns in the same game since Whitlow and Joey Gatewood each rushed for a pair of scores against Kent State in 2019.

Hunter added another rushing score against San Jose' State to give him four for the season. He leads the SEC in scoring at 12.0 points per game.

Hunter ranked ninth among Auburn freshman rushers for a season with 597 yards as a true freshman during 2021.

Hunter rushed for 147 yards on just eight carries against Alabama State, the highlight being a 94-yard touchdown run, the longest run in Auburn history; the previous long was 92 yards by Ralph O'Gwynn vs. Loyola in 1936. That recordsetting run tied for seventh longest in the nation that season.

Hunter was SEC freshman of the week for his 65 yards rushing with the gamewinning touchdown against LSU.

Against Akron last season, Hunter rushed for 110 yards and a nine-yard touchdown. He was the first Auburn freshman to rush for 100 yards in a season opener since Onterio McCalebb (148 vds vs. Louisiana Tech in 2009). The last Auburn freshman to rush for 100 yards in a season opener before McCalebb? It was Bo lackson vs. Wake Forest in 1982.

- Hunter and Bigsby make Auburn one of seven FBS schools with multiple players who have already run for at least three scores this season, along with Georgia Southern, Kansas, Miami, Minnesota, Nebraska and Nevada.
- Tight end John Samuel Shenker is seventh in career catches by an Auburn tight end with 53, and he is now fourth in career tight end receiving yardage at 635, passing Philip Lutzenkirchen (628 yards from 2009-12).

Shenker's 33 catches during the 2021 campaign set an Auburn record for receptions by a tight end in a season. His 413 receiving yards also set an Auburn TE season record.

>> Shenker's 102-yard production on five catches at LSU last season was the first 100yard game by an Auburn tight end since 1994 (Andy Fuller, 115 yards vs. Florida).

Shenker had five catches in a game four times last season (vs. Akron for 38 yards, at Penn State for 62 yards, vs. Houston in Birmingham Bowl for 54 yards). He had four receptions for 50 yards at Texas A&M.

>> Junior Ja'Varrius Johnson led Auburn with 117 yards on four receptions in the Tigers' season-opening win over Mercer. It was Johnson's second career 100-yard receiving game (107 yards vs. Mississippi State in 2021).

Johnson's 117 receiving yards were the most by an Auburn player since Anthony Schwartz finished with 123 yards and a TD on four catches against LSU in 2020. The last Auburn 100-yard receiver was Shedrick Jackson (111) last season at South Carolina.

>> Ja'Varrius Johnson now has 26 career receptions for 432 yards. Shedrick Jackson now has 55 career receptions for 721 yards.

FOR THE DEFENSE

>> Auburn has shut out each of its first two opponents in both the first and third quarters, outscoring opponents 14-0 in the first quarter and 24-0 in the third quarter.

The Tigers are among 23 teams that haven't allowed a first-quarter point this season, one of 20 teams that has not allowed a third-quarter point, and one of eight teams -- joining Georgia, Iowa, Oklahoma, Ole Miss, Purdue, Toledo and Tulane -- that have not allowed a point in the first and third quarter this season.

For the season, Auburn is 10th nationally allowing 64.0 rushing yards per game, ranks 11th in the country allowing 2.13 yards per rush and is tied for 14th having allowed only the one rushing touchdown.

Prior to allowing a 1-yard rushing TD against San Jose' State, Auburn had held its opponents without a rushing touchdown in six straight games dating back through the 2021 season, the longest such streak for the Tigers since not allowing a rushing score in eight straight games during the middle of the 2016 campaign.

Auburn is 63-27 when it forces a turnover since the start of the 2013 season and 38-10 when it forces multiple turnovers over that span, compared to just 13-15 when it fails to force a turnover.

The Tigers lost only 11 turnovers last season in 898 plays: seven fumbles and four interceptions. That tied for 10th nationally.

Linebacker Cam Riley's 16 tackles against Mercer were a career high for the junior; he led the team in tackles for the first time in his career. Riley had the most tackles by an Auburn player since Zakoby McClain had 17 tackles against Texas A&M in 2020.

Riley leads the Tigers this season with 21 tackles through the first two contests. He had 23 career tackles entering the season.

» Current players with 100 career tackles at Auburn; Morris Joseph Jr. had 117 total tackles in three seasons at Memphis. Derick Hall (97 career tackles) is closing in on that milestone:

Owen Pappoe (176) Colby Wooden (112)

» Senior Derick Hall has 13.5 career sacks, all in his last 21 games dating back to the middle of the 2020 season. Hall's 12.5 sacks the last two seasons tied for fourth in the SEC over that period.

Hall and Eku Leota, who registered 7.0 sacks in 2021, join Alabama's Will Anderson and Dallas Turner as the only returning SEC teammates after each recorded at least 7.0 sacks in 2021.

Hall has 18.5 career tackles for loss and 97 career tackles overall.

Leota, who had three tackles and a sack against San Jose' State, now has 12.0 TFL and 8.0 sacks during his Auburn career. Adding two seasons played at Northwestern, he has 22.0 TFL and 14.5 sacks.

Auburn was fourth in the SEC and ranked 17th nationally in tackles for a loss, recording 96 last season (7.39/gm).

Derick Hall (12.5), Eku Leota (10.0), Smoke Monday (9.0), Colby Wooden (8.5), Zakoby McClain (8.0), T.D. Moultry (7.5) and Marcus Harris (6.0) led the Tigers individually; 23 different Auburn defenders had a hand in at least one TFL last season.

>> The number of career games current players have led the team in tackles:

- Auburn is fifth among FBS teams allowing just 62 rushing TD since the start of the 2016 season; the Tigers have allowed only 176 total TD during that 80-game span (2.2 per game).
- >> Auburn's defense has allowed only 24 first-quarter touchdowns in its last 68 games.
- The Tigers had nine interceptions for the 2021 season as a team. Career interceptions by current Auburn players:

N.O.T. GOING TO LOSE

Auburn is 25-1 since the start of the 2013 season in games when scoring a nonoffensive touchdown, the latest being Marcus Harris' recovery of a fumble in the endzone at Arkansas last season.

Before the 2020 Outback Bowl, Auburn had won 21 straight games when the Tigers scored a non-offensive touchdown (NOT). During that string, the Tigers scored 24 non-offensive touchdowns, including three kickoffs, five punts (2 blocked), four fumbles, 11 interception returns and one missed field goal.

SPECIAL TEAMS

- » All-America kicker Anders Carlson returns for a fifth season of action after suffering a season-ending knee injury at the end of the 2021 Mississippi State game.
- Carlson, a 2020 Lou Groza Award semifinalist, has moved into second place in Auburn career scoring with 364 points, passing Wes Byrum (363 points from 2007-10).

He ranked ninth in the SEC in scoring at 7.7 points per game last season and was fifth in the league with 1.40 field goals made per game.

- >> Auburn has 28 former lettermen on NFL opening week rosters, representing 20 different NFL teams
- >> Former Auburn lettermen on NFL rosters who finished their college careers elsewhere: Byron Cowart (Indianapolis), Malik Wllis (Tennessee)
- >> Auburn players on NFL practice squads: Chandler Wooten (Arizona), Seth Williams (Jacksonville), Big Kat Bryant (Miami)
- >> Auburn has had 31 players taken in the first round of the NFL draft (most recent in 2020 Derrick Brown 1/7 and Noah Igbinoghene 1/30) and four No. 1 overall draft picks: Cam Newton (Carolina, '11), Aundray Bruce (Atlanta, '88), Bo Jackson (Tampa, '86) and Tucker Frederickson (NY Giants, '65)
- » At least one former Tiger has been selected to 18 of the last 22 Pro Bowls (LS Josh Harris last season), and Auburn has had at least one former player in 14 of the last 17 Super Bowls, including C.J. Uzomah (Cincinnati) and Blake Countess (LA Rams) in Super Bowl LVI

A 2020 second team All-American, Carlson is fourth in career PAT made (160) at Auburn and is second in career field goals made (68). He needs 16 made PATs to crack the SEC's career top 10.

He was 14-21 on field goal attempts and 35-36 on PAT in 2021. Carlson has made 37 of his last 40 field goal attempts dating back to late in 2019, including a career-long string of 16 consecutive FG makes to start the 2021 season.

- >> Carlson, whose older brother Daniel (a three-time Lou Groza Award finalist) holds the season scoring record with the NFL's Las Vegas Raiders, has five career FG of at least 50 yards:

- >> With 838 combined career kicking points, the Carlsons (Daniel and Anders) are the alltime leaders in the most points scored by a duo of brothers who kicked for the same college, passing Kris and Drew Brown at Nebraska (743 points from 1995-98, 2014-17).
- Punter Oscar Chapman earned preseason all-SEC recognition from a number of sources.

Second among SEC punting leaders last season, Chapman had a then-career-high seven punts at Texas A&M. His four punts inside the 20 against the Aggies were also a career high.

His 63-yard punt in the third quarter was the third-longest of the Aussie's career. With his 65-yarder vs. Ole Miss, it marked the first time that Chapman recorded 60+ yard punts in back-to-back games in his career.

- >> Auburn ranked third in the SEC in net punting (41.79) and 20th nationally in that stat in 2021. Oscar Chapman was second in the SEC with a 44.1-yard punting average, 30th nationally.
- Keionte Scott leads the SEC with a 14.0 punt return average, ranking 11th nationally.

- Auburn continues the longest FBS current span of games (168) without having a punt blocked; Auburn last had a punt blocked vs. Mississippi State in 2009.
- Auburn has seven field goal blocks and nine punt blocks since the start of 2016.

- >> Auburn is 116-172-6 all-time facing ranked opponents. The Tigers are 54-45-2 at home against ranked teams, 29-74-2 on the road and 33-53-2 on a neutral field.

Pappoe, who was also a 2021 captain, is just the fourth two-time captain in Auburn annals, along with Reese Dismukes (2013-14), Gusty Yearout (1966-67) and Curtis Kuykendall (1944-45).

Along with its three permanent team captains, Auburn will select an additional game captain each week:

Auburn is hosting a Big Ten team on campus for the first time Saturday; four other schools -- Georgia, Ole Miss, Mississipi State, Tennessee -- have yet to do so.

- >> There are 17 players on the Auburn roster who have already earned their bachelor's degrees, second best in the SEC behind South Carolina (20).
- Auburn all-time in overtime: 8-8; Home OT games: 6-4; the last was a 2021 40T loss to Alabama 24-22;

Road OT games: 0-3; the last was a 2015 40T loss at Arkansas 54-46;

Neutral site OT games: 2-1; the last was a 34-31 loss to Wisconsin in the 2015 Outback Bowl:

» Auburn is now 101-27-2 (.787) all-time in season openers. The Tigers have won 14 of their past 16 openers dating back to the 2006 season; last season, Auburn defeated Akron 60-10 in the season opener at Jordan-Hare Stadium.

Auburn is 55-8-1 (.867) in season openers at home, 16-5-1 (.750) in openers on the road and 30-14 (.682) in openers at neutral-site locations. Auburn's total of 101 season-opening victories is behind only Alabama (103) and tied with Arkansas (101) for the most among current SEC schools.

The Tigers are 104-16-3 (.858) all-time in home openers; there were no games played in Auburn in 1892, 1893, 1894, 1895, 1897, 1937 and 1938. Although Jordan-Hare Stadium opened in 1939, the Tigers did not open a season there until 1951; since then, Auburn is 69-12-2 at the stadium in home openers.

The Tigers have won 15 of their last 16 home openers, the only loss coming to eventual national champion Clemson in 2016 by a 19-13 score.

Auburn is 57-15 (.792) in 72 season openers against non-conference opponents since the inception of the SEC in 1933.

Coach Bryan Harsin is 9-1 in season openers (2-0 at Auburn, 6-1 at Boise State, 1-0 at Arkansas State).

- » In all-time SEC play, Auburn holds a 333-262-18 mark back through 1933. In SEC games played in Auburn, the Tigers are 142-64-6 all-time; away from Auburn, the Tigers are 191-197-12 overall.
- >> In non-conference play, Auburn's all-time regular season record since 1933 is 259-70-6 (.782). Auburn has won 17 straight home games against non-conference opponents dating back to the 2016 season.
- >> The Tigers have 790 total victories since 1892, 13th among the all-time winningest FBS football programs. All-time, 32 FBS programs have posted more than 700 wins.
- On the current Auburn roster, 42 players have at least one college start to their credit, 24 on offense and 18 on defense.

Seven Tigers have started 20 or more collegiate games: Brandon Council 40 (24 at Akron), Owen Pappoe 31, John Samuel Shenker 29, Colby Wooden 26, Derick Hall 21, Nehemiah Pritchett 21 and Keiondre Jones 20 games.

- » Auburn and Arkansas were the only teams to have five AP preseason Top 25 teams on the 2022 schedule. The Tigers will face Georgia (3), Ole Miss (21), Arkansas (19), Texas A&M (6) and Alabama (1) from the preseason rankings.
- Pregame honorees this Saturday include winners of the PNC Achievers award and 2022 Alabama Sports Hall of Fame inductee William Andrews and Starr-Sullivan Achievement Award winner Stan White.

The 2022 SEC champion men's basketball team will be recognized during the game.

Next up, the Tigers open SEC action hosting Missouri September 24 at Jordan-Hare Stadium in an 11 a.m. Homecoming contest that will be televised by ESPN. Penn State hosts Central Michigan that day.

THE LAST TIME VS. PENN STATE PENN STATE 28; AUBURN 20

>> Playing in front of the largest crowd ever to witness an Auburn football game, the No. 22 Tigers had two potential game-tying possessions in the final seconds before falling to No. 10 Penn State 28-20 at Beaver Stadium.

Trailing by eight with 7:02 to play, Auburn drove 73 yards in four minutes before an incomplete pass on fourth-and-goal at PSU's 2-yard line with 3:08 left.

Auburn's defense forced a punt, giving the Tigers another opportunity, starting at AU's 38-yard line with 38 seconds and no timeouts.

Bo Nix completed three passes to advance to PSU's 26, but his final throw fell incomplete against Penn State's prevent defense as time expired.

Tank Bigsby recorded his third 100-yard game of the season, rushing for 102 yards on 23 carries with two touchdowns. Freshman Jarquez Hunter added 63 yards on nine carries.

Auburn's defense stopped Penn State on fourth-and-1 on the opening drive to give the Tigers possession on Auburn's 44.

Bigsby rushed for 18 yards on the Tigers' first play and Anders Carlson gave Auburn a 3-0 lead with a 45-yard field goal.

The Nittany Lions scored on Sean Clifford's 4-yard touchdown pass to Jahan Dotson to cap an 88-yard drive to lead 7-3 with 2:24 left in the first quarter.

Auburn answered with an 11-play, 75-yard drive, converting three third downs. Nix connected with John Samuel Shenker for 10 yards

on third-and-2, then on thirdand-12, Nix hit Kobe Hudson for 36 yards to PSU's 13.

Bigsby took over from there with three consecutive runs, completing the drive with a 4-yard touchdown run on thirdand-1 to regain the lead for Auburn, 10-7 at the 12:28 mark of the second quarter.

Penn State responded with a 91-yard touchdown drive, reclaiming a 14-10 lead on Clifford's 2-yard pass to Brenton Strange with 1:23 remaining in the half.

Roger McCreary intercepted a pass at AU's 3-yard line in the closing seconds of the half.

Penn State took advantage of an Auburn turnover on the opening play of the second half, driving 20 yards in four plays and taking a 21-10 lead on Tyler Warren's 2-yard rush.

Trailing by 11, Auburn responded to the adversity with a run-oriented, 15-play drive, rushing 12 times for 59 yards, including Bigsby's 6-yard touchdown run on a toss sweep to trim PSU's lead to 21-17 with 5:52 left in the third guarter.

Auburn then stopped Penn State short of a first down on a fake punt, leading to Carlson's 43-yard field goal on the first play of the fourth quarter that pulled the Tigers within one point at 21-20.

The Nittany Lions extended their lead to 28-20 on Noah Cain's 3-yard run to cap a 75-yard drive with 10:48 to play, but Chandler Wooten's tackle for loss on third down forced a punt that led to the first of Auurn's two late scoring chances. Wooten led Auburn with 10 tackles, including 1.5 tackles for loss.

Nix was 21 of 37 for 185 yards, adding 29 rushing yards. Clifford completed 28 of 32 attempts for 280 yards, two touchdowns and an interception.

- >> Bryan Harsin was named the 28th head football coach in Auburn's 127-year history on December 22, 2020. Harsin spent the previous seven seasons as head coach at Boise State, where he compiled a 69-19 record while winning three Mountain West Conference titles.
- >> A former Boise State quarterback, assistant coach and offensive coordinator, Harsin is 83-31 overall as a head coach including one season at Arkansas State and has directed his programs to bowl games each season.
- >> His impressive resume at Boise saw him lead the Broncos to five 10-win seasons, seven consecutive bowl appearances and six MWC West Division Championships.
- >> In his BSU debut season Harsin led his alma mater back to where it rose to national prominence. Boise State went 12-2 in 2014, winning its first outright Mountain West Championship and capping the campaign with a 38-30 victory over Arizona in the 2014 VIZIO Fiesta Bowl.
- >> The only alumnus to lead the Broncos as head coach in the history of Boise State, Harsin has won conference championships as a student-athlete, assistant coach and head coach.
- >> Boise State also captured MW titles in 2017 and 2019, giving Harsin three in six seasons. In 2017, the Broncos capped the championship campaign with a 38-28 victory over Oregon in the Las Vegas Bowl. The Broncos concluded the year at 11-3 overall and ranked No. 22 in both the Associated Press and Coaches Polls.
- >> For his efforts in 2014, Harsin was named a finalist for the Paul "Bear Bryant" National Coach of the Year Award, the Eddie Robinson National Coach of the Year Award and the Dodd Trophy, given annually by the Bobby Dodd National Coach of the Year Foundation. He was also named the nation's top first-year head coach by the Football Writers Association of America.
- >> Harsin earned his first head coaching opportunity at Arkansas State in 2013, which claimed a share of the Sun Belt Conference championship and a berth in the GoDaddy.com Bowl that season.

Pat Dye Field at Jordan-Hare Stadium, the nation's 12th-largest on-campus stadium with a capacity of 87,451, is in its 81st year as home to the Auburn Tigers.

On football Saturdays in Auburn, Jordan-Hare Stadium becomes Alabama's sixth-largest city. More than 75,000 season tickets have been sold to Auburn home games in each of the last 24 years.

The stadium is named for Ralph "Shug" Jordan, Auburn's all-time winningest football coach, and Clifford Leroy Hare, a member of Auburn's first football team, president of the old Southern Conference and long-time chairman of Auburn's Faculty Athletic Committee.

Legendary coach Pat Dye has also had his name forever attached to Jordan-Hare Stadium, as the turf officially became known as Pat Dye Field at Jordan-Hare Stadium prior to the 2005 Iron Bowl. Dye, who served as coach and athletics director at Auburn (1981-92) and was inducted into the College Football Hall of Fame (2005), led Auburn to a 99-39-4 record and four SEC titles in his 12 seasons on the Plains.

What is now Jordan-Hare Stadium was dedicated November 30, 1939, at the Auburn-Florida game. Babe McGehee, who passed away in 2005, scored the first touchdown in what was then called "Auburn Stadium," by catching a pass from Dick McGowen. McGowen, who later coached at Auburn under Jordan, kicked the extra point and Auburn tied Florida, 7-7.

That first stadium held 7,500 seats and consisted of what is now the bottom part of the lower west stands. When the stadium was renamed "Cliff Hare Stadium" in 1949, 14,000 seats—the present lower east stands—had been added, raising capacity to 21,500.

Jordan became head coach in 1951 and the stadium underwent three major expansions in 15 years. More than 40,000 seats, virtually half of the stadium's present capacity, were added while Jordan was the coach.

Cliff Hare Stadium became Jordan-Hare Stadium in 1973. It was the first stadium in the country to be named for an active coach.a

Overall, Auburn has played 431 games in Jordan-Hare Stadium, winning 340, losing 88 and tying seven for a winning percentage of .789 against some of the best teams in college football.

After lightning delayed Auburn's season opener for 90 minutes in the third quarter, Tank Bigsby provided his own lightning strike, racing 39 yards for a touchdown on the first play after the game resumed

Generating explosive plays on the ground and in the air, Auburn kicked off the 2022 season by defeating Mercer 42-16 at Jordan-Hare Stadium.

The big-play Tigers produced seven plays of 20 yards or more

Auburn scored touchdowns on four of its first five drives with Jarquez Hunter scoring the season's first points on a 19-yard run on the Tigers' first drive.

Auburn gained 88 yards in two plays on its second possession on a 49-yard run by quarterback Robby Ashford and a 39-yard pass from T.J. Finley to Ja'Varrius Johnson. Auburn made it 14-0 on Finley's 2-yard touchdown pass to John Samuel

Hunter's 2-yard touchdown put the Tigers on top 21-0 early in the second quarter with 84,562 in attendance. Bigsby, who led Auburn with 147 rushing yards on 16 carries, scored on a 2-yard touchdown run to give Auburn a 28-0 lead with 5:04 remaining in the first half.

Mercer capitalized on an Auburn interception to score on a 5-yard touchdown pass with 20 seconds left in the half.

Derick Hall recorded a third-down sack to force a punt in the third quarter. Ashford threw a 56-yard pass to Johnson to

set up Hunter's third touchdown, a 1-yarder that gave Auburn a 35-7 lea'd before lightning within eight miles of Pat Dye Field delayed the game late in the third quarter.

The Bears added nine fourth-quarter points on a field goal and a touchdown with 25 seconds remaining

Linebacker Cam Riley led Auburn with a career-high 15 tackles, exceeding his 2021 season total of 14.

Johnson made four receptions for 117 yards, averaging 29.3 yards per catch.
Ashford, a redshirt freshman, produced 168 yards of total offense, completing 4-of-7 passes for 100 yards while rushing for 68 yards on six carries.

Auburn converted fourth downs on two touchdown drives while allowing only one TD to beat San Jose' State 24-16 at Jordan-Hare Stadium, improving to 2-0.

Trailing 10-7 at halftime, Auburn went for it on fourth-and-3 from San Jose' State's 46-yard-line. On fourth-and-3, T.J. Fin-Iralling 10-7 at hairtime, Auburn went for it on fourth-and-3 from San Jose State's 46-yard-line. On fourth-and-3, I.J. Fin-ley fumbled a snap, recovered and threw to Tank Bigsby for 11 yards to San Jose' State's 35-yard-line. Bigsby rushed 19 yards to the 1, then scored on the next play to give Auburn a 14-10 lead early in the third quarter. Keionte Scott's 22-yard punt return led to a 45-yard field goal from Anders Carlson that put the Tigers ahead 17-10 with 4:48 left in the third. San Jose' State answered with a 27-yard field goal at the start of the fourth quarter, trimming the Tigers'

lead to 17-13 Robby Ashford raced 30 yards on the first play of Auburn's next possession, crossing midfield. Finley fired to Ja'Varrius

Johnson for 24 yards to the 4, then scored on a quarterback keeper to give Auburn a double-digIt lead at 24-13 with 12:45 left in the game.

The Spartans made it a one-possession game with their third field goal with 2:11 left but their on-side kick went out of bounds and Auburn rushed for a first down and ran out the clock.

Finley completed 13 of 20 passes for 167 yards. Ashford led Auburn's rushing attack with 61 yards on seven carries. Bigsby and the complete of the completeadded 51 yards on 13 carries while pacing the Tigers with four receptions for 29 yards. Derick Hall led Auburn with eight tackles while Owen Pappoe added seven.

Auburn's defense provided a spark while the offense struggled in the first quarter. On the opening possession, Colby Wooden recorded the first of six first-half Tiger tackles for loss. Marcus Harris made three of them, including a sack. Eku Leota and Scott also had sacks in the first half.

After Auburn's second interception at the end of the first quarter on the Tigers' 28-yard-line, the Spartans had first-andgoal at the 1, but Auburn's defense kept San Jose State out of the end zone, forcing a 33-yard field goal.

Trailing 3-0, Auburn answered with a 75-yard drive on nine plays. Freshman running back Damari Alston rushed for 35 yards on the second play, Auburn's biggest gain of the game. From there, Jarquez Hunter started running to his left, then cut up the middle for his fourth touchdown of the season to give Auburn a 7-3 lead with 6:31 remaining in the second quarter.

San Jose' State regained the lead, driving 75 yards on 12 plays and scoring on a 1-yard touchdown run to go ahead 10-7 with 58 seconds left in the half. Auburn held the Spartans to 54 rushing yards on 29 carries, an average of 1.9 yards per rush.
