THE STARTING LINEUP

SETTING THE SCENE

- Central Michigan heads to Penn State at Beaver Stadium on Saturday, Sept. 24.
- The contest is scheduled for a noon kickoff and will be broadcast on Big Ten Network with talent Mark Followill (play-by-play), Matt Millen (analyst) and Matt McGloin (reporter).
- CMU's last victory over a ranked team was in 2016 at Oklahoma State. The Cowboys entered that game ranked 22nd by the Associated Press, 17th in the Coaches Poll. The victory was CMU's first over a ranked opponent in a quarter century. Its previous win was when it knocked off No. 18 Michigan State, 20-3, on Sept. 14, 1991, at Spartan Stadium.

SERIES VS. PENN STATE

- This will be the second meeting between Central Michigan and Penn State. The Nittany Lions won the first meeting, 40-3, in 2005.
- The Chippewas are 6-27 all-time against the Big Ten. CMU has won two of its last six games versus Big Ten foes a 32-31 victory at Iowa in 2012 and a 38-17 win at Purdue in 2014.

ZORDICH RETURNS

- CMU defensive backs coach Michael Zordich returns to State College this weekend after an illustrious career with the Nittany Lions.
- Zordich was a four-year letterwinner from 1982-85 at defensive back. He was selected as an All-American by the Football Writers Association of America in 1985.
- As a player, Zordich helped Penn State to the 1982 national title and in '85 he captained the Nittany Lions to a final national ranking of No. 3.
- The 1982 national championship team will celebrate its 40th anniversary this weekend.

ON TO THE NFL

- Three former Chippewas who played critical roles in CMU's 9-4

finish in the 2021 season are now in the NFL.

- They are offensive linemen Bernhard Raimann and Luke Goedeke and defensive lineman Troy Hairston.
- Goedeke was selected by the Tampa Bay Buccaneers in the second round (57th overall pick) and has started both games at guard.
- Raimann was taken by the Indianapolis Colts in the third (77th) and has seen action in Indy's first two games.
- Hairston made the 53-man roster with the Houston Texans as an undrafted free agent. Hairston has moved to fullback with the Texans. Hairston caught one pass for five yards in his first game of the season and played in both games.
- Goedeke was the second and Raimann the third players taken from MAC institutions.
- Wide receiver Kalil Pimpleton was signed to the New York Giants practice squad after spending preseason training camp with the Detroit Lions.

STATE COLLEGE, Pa. - Penn State senior quarterback Michael Robinson completed 14-of-23 passes for 274 yards and three touchdowns as the Nittany Lions defeated Central Michigan University, 40-3, on Saturday, Sept. 27, 2005.

While Robinson navigated an offense that piled up 519 yards of offense, the Penn State defense held CMU to 172 total yards and sacked Kent Smith eight times.

Penn State (3-0) jumped to a 23-0 second-quarter lead behind Robinson, who scored on a two-yard run on the Nittany Lions' opening possession and tossed scoring passes of 54 and 24 yards to Deon Butler.

Rick Albreski converted a 31-yard field goal with 29 seconds left in the half to get CMU (1-2) on the board. Derrick Williams, however, returned the kickoff to the Chippewa 38, and Kevin Kelly hit a 37-yard field goal on the final play of the quarter to send Penn State into the locker room up 26-3.

Penn State extended the lead to 33-3 on the opening drive of the second half. Robinson hit Terrell Gordon down the middle for 47 yards and the score just 1:46 into the period. A 55-yard pass from Anthony Morelli to Ethan Kilmer midway through the fourth closed out the scoring.

Morelli completed 8-of-13 passes for 107 yards in relief of Robinson. Butler finished with five catches for 108 yards and was one of 11 Nittany Lions to catch passes.

Smith finished 23-of-36 for 143 yards. Damien Linson and Justin Harper caught six passes apiece.

Daniel Bazuin finished with five tackles, including two sacks, and forced a fumble which set up Albreski's second-quarter field goal. He also broke up two passes. Bazuin now has five sacks this season, including at least one in each game, and three forced fumbles.

NEWS & NOTES

CHIPPEWA NAME

The Central Michigan University Board of Trustees has approved the continued use of the nickname "Chippewas" in association with CMU. The university's goals are to use the name with honor and respect, increase supportive connections between CMU and Native Americans, and improve efforts to sensitize students, faculty, and staff to Native American traditions and cultures.

Media representatives have been extremely cooperative as we have worked to address this important issue. In nearly all cases, print and broadcast reporters have supported CMU's efforts to eliminate the use of symbols, headlines, and copy that present inappropriate and inaccurate images of Native Americans.

Central Michigan University is grateful for your help, and we ask for your continued cooperation and sensitivity. With your assistance, we can continue to use the Chippewa name with dignity and respect.

RICHARDSON RECOGNIZED

- Quarterback Daniel Richardson was named the MAC West Division Offensive Player of the Week for his performance in the Chippewas' 58-44 season-opening loss at Oklahoma State.
- Richardson, a sophomore from Miami, completed 36 of his 49 pass attempts for 424 yards and four touchdowns. His completions, attempts and yards were career highs and he tied his career high in TD tosses.

PRESEASON RECOGNITION

- Heading into the 2022 season, RB Lew Nichols III was named a preseason All-American by Pro Football Network. He also is on the watch lists for the Walter Camp Award, the Doak Walker Award, and the Maxwell Award.
- CMU punter Luke Elzinga, a sophomore, was named to the 2022 Ray Guy Award Watch List.

QB1

- Sophomore Daniel Richardson is the Chippewas' clear-cut starting quarterback for the first time in his career.
- Known to teammates as D-Rich, the sophomore from Miami played in all 13 games in 2021, starting the final nine. He completed 60.4 percent of his passes for 2,633 yards while tossing 24 TD passes against just six interceptions.
- Richardson has appeared in 22 games in his three years in a Chippewa uniform, 15 of them starts.
- In the COVID-shortened 2020 season, Richardson started the first four games and was injured in the fourth game, a 31-23 win at Eastern Michigan. He did not appear in CMU's final two games of the season. Richardson was named the starter ahead of the opener that season after a tight three-way battle in camp and the incumbent, David Moore, was ruled ineligible by the NCAA.
- In 2021, Jacob Sirmon started the first four games at QB for CMU.

Richardson, who had played in each of the first three games, came off the bench in that fateful fourth game, throwing three fourth-quarter TD passes and sparking a 31-27 come-from-behind victory at home over Florida International on Sept. 25 at Kelly/Shorts Stadium.

BIG FEET

- Punter Luke Elzinga and place kicker Marshall Meeder have been major bright spots for CMU over the past two seasons.
- Last season, Elzinga averaged 41.3 yards per punt and 10 of his punts traveled more than 50 yards; 25 of his 57 punts pinned opponents inside their own 20-yard line. He earned All-MAC First Team honors from Pro Football Focus and third team accolades from Phil Steele.
- In 2020, Elzinga became the first CMU punter to earn First Team All-MAC honors since the Chippewas joined the league in 1975.
- Meeder, also a sophomore, was good on 49 of his 51 extra-point kicks and 17 of his 26 field goal tries in 2021. His 17 field goals tied for the second most in program history and his 49 PATs rank as the third most in a season in program history.
- Meeder converted from 49, 52 and 43 yards in the Chippewas' 24-21 victory over Washington State in the Tony the Tiger Sun Bowl. He earned the Special Teams Most Valuable Player Award in the game.
- Meeder was named First Team All-MAC and to The Athletic Freshman All-America team in 2020 when he made all eight of his field goal attempts and 16 of his 17 extra-point tries.
- Meeder's 53-yard field goal vs. Toledo in 2020 ties for the fourth-longest in program history.
- In his career, Meeder has made 25 of his 34 field goal attempts. He is 5-for-6 from 50-plus yards, 9-for-13 from 40-49, and 7-for-9 from 30-39.
- In 2020, Meeder became the third

Chippewa place kicker to earn First Team All-MAC honors. The others are Rade Savich, 1977, and Chuck Selinger, 1993.

ON THE OUTSIDE

- Central Michigan graduated two top wideouts in Kalil Pimpleton and JaCorey Sullivan.
- Dallas Dixon is the top returnee at the wide receiver position. He ranked third on the team with 45 catches and was second with 701 yards in 2021. He made eight TD receptions, which was also second on the team.
- He and Sullivan earned Third Team All-MAC recognition, while Pimpleton was a first team pick.

STRONG UP FRONT

- While the Chippewas' offensive line lost two players to the NFL, they do return three veterans up front in center Jamezz Kimbrough and guards Deiyantei Powell-Woods and Tyden Ferris.
- Kimbrough has started 22 consecutive games and played in 33 in his career.
- Ferris has appeared in 36 career games, 19 of them starts. He started 12 of the Chippewas' 13 games in 2021.
- Powell-Woods has appeared in 32

career games with 17 starts. He started 11 games in 2021 and three in 2020.

BLOSSOMING

- CMU tight end Joel Wilson played in all 13 games in 2021 with 11 starts. He made 31 catches for 367 yards and six touchdowns. He ranked third on the team in TD receptions, fourth in receiving yards and fifth in receptions. Wilson entered the 2021 season with seven catches for 62 yards in his career.

DEFENSIVE NOTES

- Central Michigan ranked third in the Mid-American Conference in defense in 2021. CMU surrendered an average of 363 yards per game.
- CMU was first in the MAC and 18th nationally in rush defense in 2021 (114.6 yards per game).
- CMU's defense shared the MAC lead and tied for fourth nationally with 43 sacks in 2021.
- CMU ranked No. 1 in the nation with 8.2 tackles-for-loss per game. The Chippewas totaled 106 tackles-for-loss, ranking sixth nationally.
- CMU's defense was sixth in the nation in 2021 in third-down efficiency as it allowed opponents to convert on just 29.8 percent of third downs.

TOP RETURNEES

- Cornerback Donte Kent is among the top returnees on defense. The sophomore made 55 tackles (45 solos) and posted 14 pass breakups in 2021. Kent is CMU's leading returning tackler.
- Kent, who had one interception, ranked third in the MAC and tied for eighth in the nation with 15 passes defended.
- Kent led the team in pass breakups and was named to the Football Writers Association of America Freshman All-America Team.
- Linebackers Kyle Moretti and Justin Whiteside shined in their respective freshmen seasons.
- Both played in all 13 games; Moretti made 47 tackles, while Whiteside had 28 including three sacks among seven tackles-for-loss.
- Among others who return on defense who logged significant playing time in 2021 are defensive backs Trey Jones and Rolliann Sturkey; linemen Jacques Bristol, Thomas Incoom, LaQuan Johnson, John Wesley Whiteside, Tyrece Woods and Robi Stuart.

HONORING TWO GREATS

- Central Michigan University honored two of the giants of its storied football history by naming the field at Kelly/Shorts Stadium in their honor before the South Alabama game. The playing surface at the stadium is now named Kramer/Deromedi Field, in recognition of legendary coaches Roy Kramer and Herb Deromedi.
- Kramer, with Deromedi as his defensive coordinator, led the Chippewas to the Division II national championship in 1974. Statues of both men stand proudly outside the Chippewa Champions Center, located at the north end of Kelly/Shorts Stadium, and both are members of the Central Michigan University Marcy Weston Athletics Hall of Fame.
- Kramer guided the Chippewas to an 83-32-2 record in his 11 seasons as head coach and in 1974 was named the Division II National Coach of the Year. Kramer went on to serve as the

athletic director at Vanderbilt and later became the commissioner of the Southeastern Conference.

- Deromedi joined Kramer's coaching staff as an assistant in 1967 and then succeeded his longtime mentor as the head coach in 1978.
- He posted a remarkable 110-55-10 record over 16 seasons, leading the Chippewas to MAC titles in 1979, '80 and '90. He was twice named MAC Coach of the Year and was inducted into the College Football Hall of Fame in 2008. After hanging up his whistle, Deromedi served with distinction for 13 years as CMU's director of athletics and was a member of the College Football Playoff Committee from 2016-18.
- The naming of the field in honor of Kramer and Deromedi was the result of a \$1 million fundraising effort supported by numerous CMU football alumni and friends of Kramer and Deromedi.

SWEET LEW

- Running back Lew Nichols III has had a sensational career at CMU, earning the Mid-American Conference Freshman of the Year Award in 2021 and the MAC Offensive Player of the Year Award in 2022.
- Nichols became the sixth CMU player to be named the MAC Offensive Player of the Year. The others are quarterbacks Jeff Bender (1988) and Dan LeFevour (2006), running backs Silas Massey (1995) and Jerry Seymour (2003), and wide receiver Antonio Brown (2007).
- Though this is Nichols' fourth year as a Chippewa, he maintains sophomore eligibility. In 2019, he played in four games, the maximum number allowable to preserve his redshirt; the COVID-shortened 2020 season did not count against his eligibility.
- Last season, Nichols led the nation in rushing with 1,848 yards, rushing yards per game (142.2), all-purpose yardage (2,186), all-purpose yards per game (168.2), and carries (341).
- Nichols' 341 carries and 1,848 rushing yards are both second in program history.
- Nichols tied for ninth nationally in rushing touchdowns (16) and tied for 11th in total TDs (18) in the nation in 2021.
- Nichols ran for at least 100 yards in 10 games including seven of at least 150, in 2021. He had two 200-yard efforts.
- Nichols was named the Offensive MVP in CMU's 24-21 victory over Washington State in the Tony the Tiger Sun Bowl. He carried 30 times for 138 yards and one TD and caught two passes for 36 yards.

CHIPPEWA CHAMPIONS CENTER

- The Central Michigan football coaches, student-athletes and support staff utilize the Chippewa Champions Center in the north end of Kelly/Shorts Stadium. Highlights of the building include:
- More than 50,000 square feet dedicated to the student-athlete excellence.
- A 7,000 square foot, state-of-the-art performance center focused on the growth and development of football student-athletes.
- Expanded sport medicine and rehabilitation facility with hydrotherapy pools serving as the primary hub for the CMU Athletics training team.
- A Champions Plaza at the entrance of the facility showcasing the rich history of CMU Athletics.
- The 4,000-square-foot Isabella Bank Field level club and 16 Loge boxes on the second level.
- Two fuel stations to accommodate the nutrition needs of nearly 500 student-athletes.
- A 4,200 square foot football locker room.
- More than 7,100 square feet of coaches offices and meeting spaces.
- The CCC project included a new 3,200 square foot videoboard on the south end of the stadium. It is twice as large as the second-biggest videoboard in the MAC. The project also included a new state-of-the-art audio system.





HEAD COACH JIM McELWAIN

FOURTH SEASON 21-15 AT CMU, 65-42 CAREER

In his three seasons in charge of the Central Michigan football program, Jim McElwain has delivered on his promise of making the Chippewas a contender in the Mid-American Conference.

McElwain guided the 2021 Chippewas to a 9-4 finish including 6-2 in MAC games -- earning CMU the MAC West co-championship -- and a 24-21 victory over Pac-12 representative Washington State in the Tony the Tiger Sun Bowl.

It marked the Chippewas' first bowl win since 2012 and their first victory over a Power 5 opponent since 2017.

CMU's 2021 ledger included wins over in-state rivals Western Michigan and Eastern Michigan, bringing the Michigan MAC Trophy back to Mount Pleasant for the first time since 2017. McElwain and Co. put that trophy on display alongside the Victory Cannon, which CMU reclaimed with a 42-30 win over Western.

Those two victories highlighted a season-ending five-game win streak and, in keeping with McElwain's well-established blueprint for success, the Chippewas flexed their offensive prowess in averaging 37.6 points per game during that stretch and finished the season averaging 33.2 points per game, which ranked second in the MAC.

CMU's potent offense was spearheaded by running back Lew Nichols III, the nation's leading rusher, and receivers Kalil Pimpleton and JaCorey Sullivan.

Head Coach Jim McElwain was named the 2019 MAC Coach of the Year. It marked the third time in his career that McElwain has earned a league coach of the year award. He was named the Mountain West Coach of the Year while leading Colorado State in 2014 and he earned the Southeastern Conference Coach of the Year Award at Florida in 2015. McElwain is just the fourth individual to earn COY honors in three Division I conferences. The others are Brady Hoke, Gary Patterson and Dennis Stolz.

HEAD COACH JIM McELWAIN (CONTINUED)

Nichols ran for 1,848 yards and scored 18 touchdowns, while Pimpleton and Sullivan combined for 111 catches, 1,647 yards, and 14 TDs through the air. The electrifying Pimpleton led the nation in punt-return average (19.1 yards) and punts returned for touchdowns (2).

McElwain's offense, which averaged 449.6 points per game, was led up front by a pair of outstanding bookend tackles in Bernhard Raimann and Luke Goedeke, both of whom are expected to be taken in the 2022 NFL Draft.

The nine wins marked the most by a Chippewa squad since 2009 and the six MAC wins matched CMU's best since that season. Four times since 2009 the Chippewas have registered six conference victories; two of those six-win seasons have come during McElwain's three-year tenure.

The Chippewas are 20-13 including 15-7 in MAC games under McElwain. In his two full seasons in charge of the program, the Chippewas have won or shared the MAC West crown.

There was no shortage of individual accolades for McElwain's charges in 2021 as Raimann earned a nod on the Sporting News All-America Second Team and was named an All-American and the Mid-American Conference Offensive Player of the Year by Pro Football Focus.

In addition, cornerback Donte Kent earned a berth on the Football Writers Association of America Freshman All-America Team, Nichols was named the MAC Offensive Player of the Year, and Pimpleton earned the MAC Special Teams Player of the Year Award. It marked the first time since 2009 that a Chippewa had garnered either award.

In all, 10 Chippewas earned All-MAC honors in 2021 and 13 were named All-MAC by Phil Steele.

In the abbreviated 2020 season, McElwain led CMU to a 3-3 finish both overall and in the MAC as 10 Chippewas earned all-conference honors, including defensive end Troy Hairston II, who earned the co-MAC Defensive Player of the Year Award; and Nichols, who was named the league Freshman of the Year.

Hairston became the first Chippewa since 2005 to earn the league's top individual award for a player on the defensive side of the ball, and Nichols was the first Chippewa since 2007 to be named the conference's top freshman.

In 2019, McElwain's first season in Mount Pleasant, he led the Chippewas to a remarkable turnaround as they won the MAC West and earned a berth in the New Mexico Bowl.

McElwain inherited a program that won one game in 2018 and transformed it immediately into a winner, leading CMU to an 8-6 record.

The seven-win improvement was the best among Football Bowl Subdivision programs in 2019 and the Chippewas made their first appearance in the MAC Championship Game in more than a decade. McElwain earned the MAC Coach of the Year Award.

McElwain lived up to his reputation as an offensive mastermind as the 2019 Chippewas nearly doubled their 2018 yardage total and scored 426 points, a 246-point improvement over the previous season.

CMU running backs Jonathan Ward and Kobe Lewis both surpassed 1,000 yards rushing, marking the first time in the long and illustrious history of Chippewa football that two players reached the 1,000-yard milestone in the same season.

Pimpleton led the league in both receptions (90) and receiving yardage (934) and earned First Team All-MAC honors as both a wide receiver and as

a punt returner. Sullivan also earned first team all-conference honors. They were two of eight Chippewas to earn All-MAC honors in 2019.

McElwain was named to head the program on Dec. 2, 2018, arriving with an exceptional resumé that included successful runs in heading the programs at Florida and at Colorado State, along with membership on coaching staffs of national-championship teams.

- McElwain coached at Florida from 2015-17, compiling a 22-12 overall record, two SEC East titles and two SEC Championship Game appearances. He earned the SEC Coach of the Year Award in 2015.
- Those titles made him the first coach in league history to reach the SEC Championship Game in his first two seasons as head coach. Just two other coaches reached the title game in their first season.
- He led Colorado State to a 10-3 finish in 2014, earning the Mountain West Conference Coach of the Year Award.
- He earned American Football Coaches Association regional coach of the year awards in both 2014 and 2015.
- As the offensive coordinator/quarterbacks coach under Nick Saban at Alabama from 2008-11, McElwain helped the Crimson Tide to two national titles and coached 2009 Heisman Trophy winner Mark Ingram.
- McElwain served as an assistant at Michigan under Jim Harbaugh in 2018, helping the Wolverines to a 10-2 regular-season finish and a top-10 ranking.

In nearly 30 years of collegiate coaching, McElwain has consistently displayed an ability to build winning teams with a focus on academic success, an eagerness to engage fans and the community, and a determination to maintain integrity throughout the program.

A native of Missoula, Mont., McElwain played quarterback at Eastern Washington from 1980-83 and began his climb up the coaching ladder at his alma mater, first as a graduate assistant and then as the quarterbacks/wide receivers coach from 1987-94.

He moved on to Montana State in 1995, serving as the Bobcats' offensive coordinator, wide receivers coach, and special teams coordinator.

McElwain served as the wide receivers team/special teams coordinator at Louisville from 2000-02 and at Michigan State as the assistant head coach, wide receivers coach, and special teams coordinator from 2003-05.

In 2006, McElwain moved on to the NFL as the quarterbacks coach for the Oakland Raiders. He returned to the collegiate level in 2007, helping lead Fresno State to a 9-4 finish while serving as the offensive coordinator/quarterbacks coach.

In 2008, McElwain joined Saban's staff at Alabama. The Crimson Tide amassed an incredible 48-6 combined record in McElwain's four years on the staff, winning national titles in 2009 and 2011.

In 2012-14, McElwain led Colorado State to a combined 22 victories including 10 in 2014. The 10 wins tied for the second most in program history. Colorado State had won just nine games in the combined three years prior to McElwain's arrival.

McElwain and his wife, Karen, have three children: JoHanna, Elizabeth and Jerret.

STILLWATER, Okla. - Bright spots? Sure. There almost always are no matter the final score.

And there were for fourth-year coach Jim McElwain and his Central Michigan football team on Thursday as the Chippewas kept coming and coming despite a deep early deficit against the 12th-ranked team in the nation.

"Since we've been here and started to establish the program, there's a certain mentality that it takes to be a Chippewa," said McElwain after CMU's 58-44 nonconference loss to Oklahoma State before 53,808 at the Cowboys' Boone Pickens Stadium.

"It's cliché, but it's a never-say-die deal. I'm proud of them; we'll fight 'til the bitter end and that's who we are and that's what we've established as a program."

The Chippewas couldn't duplicate the magic they conjured up the last time they visited Boone Pickens in 2016, when they won on a Hail Mary touchdown pass with no time remaining.

But they likely found something deep within themselves that should serve them well going forward in 2022. They trailed 37-7 late in the second quarter and then 51-15 early in the third.

Playing from behind and with the Chippewa run game bottled up, QB Daniel Richardson completed 36 of 49 pass attempts for 424 yards and four touchdowns. His completions, attempts and yards were career highs and he tied his career high in TD tosses.

Richardson triggered an offense that produced 44 points against a defense that ranked fifth in the nation a year ago. CMU's run game produced 122 yards, 72 of that - on 26 carries - came from Lew Nichols III, the 2021 national rushing leader.

The Richardson-led CMU offense finally caught fire, but only after falling into a deep hole. It was 7-7 after Richardson hit Carlos Carriere for a 15-yard TD midway through the first quarter.

Then the Cowboys hit with a flurry, scoring on six consecutive possessions and adding a safety for a 51-15 lead less than a minute into the third quarter.

Richardson brought the Chippewas back within striking distance by throwing three second-half TD passes and Nichols scored on a 15-yard run. Richardson's final scoring pass of the night, a 54-yarder to Jalen McGaughey, came with 3:15 to play and drew the Chippewas to within two TDs, 58-44.

The Cowboys covered CMU's onside kick and that effectively ended the Chippewas' last legitimate hope.

MOUNT PLEASANT, Mich. - South Alabama scored on five of its first seven possessions and Central Michigan never recovered on Saturday as the Chippewas dropped a 38-24 nonleaguer to the Jaguars on Kramer/Deromedi Field at Kelly/Shorts Stadium.

The Chippewas, who trailed 38-10 early in the fourth quarter, slipped to 0-2. They entertain Bucknell in a nonconference game on Saturday, Sept. 17 (1 p.m.).

South Alabama quarterback Carter Bradley threw for 354 yards and three touchdowns, and the Jaguars finished with 502 yards in total offense.

Bradley threw two TD passes in the first quarter and another just minutes into the second in staking the Jaguars to a 28-7 lead. It was 31-10 at halftime.

Down 38-10, CMU got a 12-yard TD run from Marion Lukes and a 21-yard Daniel Richardson-to-Joel Wilson TD pass in the fourth quarter to cut it to 38-24 with under five minutes to play. The Chippewas attempted inside kicks after both scores but neither was successful.

"You kind of get hit in the mouth like that -- it just sucks we didn't play the entire game like we did the fourth quarter, with that intensity," said Wilson, who made a career-high seven catches for 73 yards. "We should have had our foot on the gas the entire game. Something we'll look back on (with) regret, but can't change it so our mindset is just moving forward, go get a win next week. It's essential for us."

Richardson completed 23 of his 47 pass attempts for 257 yards, but was sacked three times. The Chippewas were held to 81 yards on the ground, struggling to gain a footing in that phase of the game for the second straight week.

"I am concerned because we've got a great running back and as you've seen, we've got a couple other (good) ones too," McElwain said. "They were loading the box and quite honestly, we had the opportunity to hit passes and missed some wide-open guys. There again, it's something I've got to get corrected."

South Alabama collected 148 yards rushing and finished with a near 2-to-1 edge in possession time.

It marked the second straight week that CMU found itself in a deep early deficit. Last week at Oklahoma State, CMU trailed 37-7 and then 51-15 before coming alive to make a game of it, much like they did against South Alabama.

MOUNT PLEASANT, Mich. - Lew Nichols III busted out and the defense was dominant.

Felt good, really good, for the Central Michigan football team on Saturday before 21,554 on Kramer/Deromedi Field at Kelly/Shorts Stadium.

Nichols ran for 166 yards and two touchdowns and the Chippewas turned on the jets in the second half in downing Bucknell, 41-0, for their first victory of the season.

"I told them afterwards, 'Man enjoy the feeling,'" CMU coach Jim McElwain said after his team improved to 1-2 and posted its first shutout since Sept. 11, 2021. "I don't care who it is, getting a win is hard.

"When you get it, enjoy it, reflect on it. Make sure you really know what that feeling is and hopefully it becomes contagious moving forward."

The Chippewas rolled up 529 yards in total offense and held the Football Championship Subdivision Bison (0-3) to 174.

Yet for as overwhelming as CMU's performance looks based on the final score, the Chippewas led just 7-0 at halftime after they missed two field goals and threw an interception in the first 30 minutes.

The Chippewas got a 10-yard touchdown pass from Daniel Richardson to Joel Wilson with under 5 minutes to play in the half to take a 7-0 lead.

They then scored on their final five possessions of the game to win going away.

Nichols, the nation's leading rusher a year ago, entered the game with 92 total rushing yards in CMU's first two games this season. He had nearly that by halftime on Saturday, and in the third quarter he scored on a 3-yard run and then a 15-yarder to extend the Chippewas' lead to 20-0.

Nichols carried 30 times - about his average in the 2021 season - and averaged 5.5 yards per carry. He, and the entire CMU team, appeared to get stronger as the game wore on.

Richardson connected with Langston Lewis on a 45-yard TD pass-play early in the fourth quarter and then backup quarterback Jase Bauer scored on runs of 10 and 8 yards.
