INSIDE THE GAME

PENN STATE WELCOMES CENTRAL MICHIGAN
TO BEAVER STADIUM

- OPENING KICK:** No. 14/15 Penn State returns to Beaver Stadium to host Central Michigan on Saturday. Kickoff is set for noon on Big Ten Network. The 2022 Penn State football season is presented by PSECU.
- SERIES HISTORY:** Penn State meets Central Michigan for the second time in program history. The Nittany Lions earned a 40-3 win over the Chippewas on Sept. 17, 2005. Michael Robinson threw for three touchdowns and rushed for another, while Deon Butler had five catches for 108 yards and two touchdowns. The Nittany Lions held Central Michigan to 14 yards rushing.
- B1G WIN:** In its win over Auburn, Penn State became the first Big Ten school to sweep a home-and-home series against an SEC opponent since 2012, when Northwestern swept Vanderbilt in 2010 and 2012. The Nittany Lions' 29-point win is the Big Ten's second-largest margin of victory in a road game against an SEC opponent, trailing only Purdue's 35-3 win at Missouri in 2017, which was also the last Big Ten road win against an SEC team. The 29-point win marked the sixth time (third time in regular season) a Big Ten team has beaten an SEC team by 29 or more points and just the second time in a road game.
- RUSHING ATTACK:** The Nittany Lions rushed for five touchdowns at Auburn. Penn State's five rushing touchdowns were its most since the 2019 Cotton Bowl vs. Memphis. Entering the game, Auburn had only allowed one rushing touchdown in its last seven games. Freshmen Nicholas Singleton and Kaytron Allen each scored two touchdowns. Singleton had runs of 54 (TD) and 53 yards and Devyn Ford added a 30-yard rush.
- FORCING TAKEAWAYS:** Penn State forced four takeaways against Auburn. The Nittany Lions recovered two fumbles and had two interceptions. In the third quarter, Ji'Ayir Brown forced a fumble and recorded an interception. Zakee Wheatley recorded his first career pick, while Chop Robinson and Jonathan Sutherland each recovered a fumble. Robinson and Abdul Carter each forced a fumble.
- THE POSITION:** Central Michigan is 1-2 this season and coming off a 41-0 win over Bucknell. The Chippewas gained 529 total yards, including 287 on the ground, against the Bison. On defense, CMU recorded 13 tackles for loss. Lew Nichols rushed for 166 yards and two touchdowns on 30 carries, while Daniel Richardson threw for 198 yards and two scores.

RECENT SUCCESS

Since 2016, Penn State holds a .718 winning percentage, with a record of 56-22, the ninth-best winning percentage among Power Five programs. Penn State has won at least nine games in four of the last six seasons.

ACADEMIC EXCELLENCE

A total of 552 of Penn State football student-athletes have earned Academic All-Big Ten honors since 1993 for owning at least a 3.0 grade point average and being a letterwinner.

ONE OF NATION'S TOUGHEST HOME VENUES

Penn State owns a superlative 305-79 (.794) record inside Beaver Stadium, the nation's second-largest facility, which opened in 1960 and has a capacity of 106,572. The Nittany Lions are 34-7 in Beaver Stadium since 2016, an .829 winning percentage, the eighth-best home record among Power Five teams.

HEAD COACH JAMES FRANKLIN

CAREER AT A GLANCE

- Franklin was named the 16th head football coach in the storied history of the Nittany Lion program on January 11, 2014.
- Franklin is one of six current FBS head coaches to lead his teams to a bowl game in each of his first nine seasons as a head coach and one of nine to do so in 10 of their first 11 seasons.
- Franklin is one of four current Big Ten coaches (Ryan Day, Kirk Ferentz, Jim Harbaugh) to have won a Big Ten Championship and became the first African American head coach to win a Big Ten title after Penn State's 2016 victory.
- He owns a 94-49 career record with a winning record in nine of 11 seasons at the helm.
- Franklin has led his teams to three Top 10 finishes (3 at Penn State) and six Top 25 finishes (2 at Vanderbilt; 4 at Penn State).
- In the last six seasons under Franklin, Penn State is one of six teams to rank in the top 12 of the CFP final rankings at least four times, joining Ohio State, Alabama, Georgia, Clemson and Oklahoma.
- From 2016-19, Franklin led the Nittany Lions to three New Year's Six bowls - 2016 (Rose), 2017 (Fiesta) and 2019 (Cotton), making Penn State one of eight teams to accomplish the feat during the four-year span. Penn State last went to three New Year's Six bowls in four years in 1980-83 (1980 Fiesta, 1982 Fiesta, 1983 Sugar).
- Franklin guided Penn State to back-to-back New Year's Six bowls in 2016 (Rose) and 2017 (Fiesta) for the first time since 1985 (Orange) and 1986 (Fiesta).
- From 2016-19, Franklin led Penn State to 42 wins, the most in program history for the Big Ten era, and 28 league wins, a program record.
- Franklin has 27 years of coaching experience at the collegiate and NFL level.
- In his first 11 years as a head coach, Franklin mentored 90 players who have gone on to the NFL ranks.
- Franklin is second all-time in winning percentage by an FBS African American head coach (minimum 80 wins) and is third in total wins.

NITTANY LIONS ON THE FIELD

- The Nittany Lions earned a New Year's Day bowl berth against Arkansas in the Outback Bowl in **2021**. With wins over No. 12/15 Wisconsin and No. 22/20 Auburn, Penn State tallied two wins over ranked teams within the first three games of the season for the first time in program history. The Nittany Lion defense allowed just 17.3 points per game in 2021, good for sixth in the country.
- In **2020**, with the emergence of young skill players on offense, true freshmen accounted for 1,486 of Penn State's 3,873 total yards (38 percent), marking a school record for most combined scrimmage yards by true freshmen in a single season.
- Penn State earned its third 11-win season in four years with an 11-2 record in **2019**, including a win over No. 17 Memphis in the Goodyear Cotton Bowl Classic. The Nittany Lions posted their fourth-straight top 12 finish in the final CFP rankings, coming in 10th, and were ranked ninth in the final Associated Press and Amway Coaches polls to earn their 25th AP Top 10 finish. Franklin was a finalist for the Paul "Bear" Bryant National Coach of the Year award for the second time at Penn State (2016) and third time in his head coaching career.
- In **2018**, the Nittany Lions posted their third-straight season with at least nine wins with a 9-4 overall record, earning a berth in the VRBO Citrus Bowl. Penn State finished No. 12 in the final CFP rankings and No. 17 in the Associated Press and Amway Coaches polls.
- Penn State climbed as high as No. 2 in the rankings in **2017** and appeared in a second-straight New Year's Six bowl, earning a 35-28 win over No. 11 Washington in the PlayStation Fiesta Bowl. At 11-2, the Nittany Lions earned back-to-back 11-win seasons for the fifth time in program history and first time since 2008 and 2009. Penn State finished the season No. 8 in the Associated Press and Amway Coaches polls and No. 9 in the final CFP rankings.
- Penn State surged in **2016**, winning nine consecutive games en route to the Big Ten Championship, a Rose Bowl berth and an 11-3 overall record. Penn State finished the season ranked No. 5 in the College Football Playoff rankings and No. 7 in the Associated Press and Amway Coaches polls. It was Penn State's highest finish in the polls since 2005. The Lions claimed their fourth overall Big Ten Championship and first outright title since 1994 with a thrilling, 38-31 comeback win over Wisconsin in the Big Ten Championship Game. Franklin was honored as Sporting News National Coach of the Year and the Woody Hayes National Coach of the Year, as well as the Dave McLain Big Ten Coach of the Year and Associated Press Big Ten Coach of the Year.
- Franklin guided the Nittany Lions to a 7-6 record in **2015** and a berth in the TaxSlayer Bowl.
- Franklin's first season in **2014** was bookended with a pair of thrilling victories for the Nittany Lions. It began with a final-play 26-24 victory over UCF in Dublin, Ireland, in Penn State's first-ever international game and ended with a comeback, a 31-30 overtime win over Boston College in the New Era PinStripe Bowl in Yankee Stadium. Franklin became just the third Penn State coach to lead the team to at least seven wins in his first season, joining Dick Harlow (1915) and Bill O'Brien (2012), and he guided the Nittany Lions to a 4-0 start, joining Harlow as the only first-year Penn State coaches to win their initial four games.

NITTANY LIONS IN THE CLASSROOM

- The Nittany Lions posted their first 1,000 single-year APR in program history in 2018-19, topping the previous high of 993 in 2014-15.
- Sean Clifford (2021) and Trace McSorley (2018) were selected as a National Football Foundation (NFF) Scholar-Athletes and finalists for the Campbell Trophy, known as the "Academic Heisman." They are the 18th and 19th Nittany Lions to be selected as an NFF Scholar-Athlete.
- In 2019, punter Blake Gillikin took home CoSIDA Academic All-America® first-team honors for the second-straight year to become the 12th two-time first-team selection in Penn State history. He graduated with a perfect 4.0 grade-point average in May.
- Gillikin's two first-team CoSIDA Academic All-America honors increase Penn State football's total to 67 honorees, which ranks second in Division I football history (FBS and FCS).
- Tyler Yazujian collected a berth on the CoSIDA Academic All-America® first team in 2016 after an appearance on the second team in 2015.
- A program-record 10 Nittany Lions were named 2020-21 Big Ten Distinguished Scholars, besting the previous mark of nine set a year earlier.

NITTANY LIONS IN THE COMMUNITY

- The Nittany Lions are active in the community, participating in activities such as Uplifting Athletes, THON, Pennsylvania Special Olympics Summer Games, State College Area Food Bank and Penn State Hershey Children's Hospital visits.
- On June 15, 2020, Franklin was named to the Big Ten Anti-Hate and Anti-Racism Coalition.
- As part of the Cotton Bowl festivities in 2019, Franklin and his family made a \$10,000 financial commitment to the Dallas Children's Hospital.
- In August 2019, Franklin was named a Penn State University Renaissance Fund honoree, which awards outstanding community members for helping students in need.

LAST MEETING PENN STATE ROLLS, 40-3, OVER CHIPPEWAS

The formula remained the same for the third-consecutive game, as Penn State's stingy defense and big-play offense provided the fuel in an impressive 40-3 win over Central Michigan in Beaver Stadium.

Penn State recorded eight sacks and 14 minus-yardage plays to hold the Chippewas to 14 yards rushing on 39 attempts.

The Nittany Lions contained QB Kent Smith, who was held to 143 yards passing and minus-39 yards rushing for 104 yards of offense.

Michael Robinson turned in another strong performance, going 14-of-23 for 274 yards. He had three touchdown passes for the second straight game to lead Penn State to 381 passing yards. Robinson connected on 54- and 24-yard touchdown passes to Deon Butler, who had five catches for 108 yards. Robinson completed six passes of 20 yards or more en route to 287 yards of offense.

Anthony Morelli had 107 yards passing. Robinson and Morelli combined to go 22-of-36 with four TDs and one interception.

In addition to his two scoring strikes to Butler, Robinson connected on a 47-yard score with Terrell Golden for a 33-3 lead early in the third quarter. Morelli entered the game soon after, and in the fourth stanza, hit Ethan Kilmer on a slant that turned into a 55-yard score.

Linebacker Tim Shaw tallied 10 stops, recording three tackles for loss and two sacks.

AUBURN NOTES

- Penn State became the first Big Ten school to sweep a home-and-home series against an SEC opponent since 2012, when Northwestern swept Vanderbilt in 2010 and 2012.
- The Nittany Lions' 29-point win is the Big Ten's second-largest margin of victory in a road game against an SEC opponent, trailing only Purdue's 35-3 win at Missouri in 2017, which was also the last Big Ten road win against an SEC team.

- Singleton is the first Nittany Lion with three 40+ yard runs in a game since Johnson's performance against Indiana (runs of 41, 41, 43 and 69).
- The 179 rushing yards by Singleton is a Penn State record for a Beaver Stadium debut.
- Penn State caused a safety in the second quarter. A botched handoff by Ohio was recovered by the Bobcats in their own end zone.

PURDUE NOTES

- Penn State improved to 15-3-1 all-time against Purdue and 8-2 in road matchups.
- The Nittany Lions are now 112-22-2 all-time in season openers and 16-14 all-time in Big Ten openers.
- Penn State tallied 406 yards, including 308 through the air.
- QB **Sean Clifford** tied a career high with four passing touchdowns and added a rushing score, to earn Big Ten Co-Offensive Player of the Week honors.
- On the night, Clifford surpassed the 8,000-career passing yard mark and the 9,000-career total yards mark.
- The Nittany Lions forced and recovered a fumble in the second quarter to extend their takeaway streak to 20 games, tied with Oklahoma for the second-longest streak in the FBS.
- Penn State broke up 16 passes and held Aidan O'Connell to a 50.0 completion percentage after he completed 71 percent of his passes in 2021.
- CB **Joey Porter Jr.** recorded a team-high eight tackles, a career-high six pass breakups and recovered a fumble.

3-0 START

- Penn State is off to a 3-0 start for the 61st time in program history.
- The Nittany Lions are one of 31 FBS teams that hold a 3-0 record.
- Of the 31 teams, Penn State is one of only four with two wins over Power Five conference teams joining Florida State (at LSU, at Louisville), Georgia (vs. Oregon, at South Carolina) and Syracuse (vs. Louisville, vs. Purdue).
- Among 3-0 teams, Penn State and Florida State are the only teams with two road wins over Power Five teams.

LIONS UNDER THE LIGHTS

- The 2022 season marks the 22nd-straight with at least one regular-season night game on the schedule.
- Penn State opened the season with a 35-31 win at Purdue and will meet Minnesota for a 7:30 p.m. kickoff on Oct. 22.
- Penn State is 58-32 at night all-time. The figure breaks down to 18-11 at home, 28-14 on the road and 12-7 in neutral site games. Penn State is 1-1 at regular season neutral sites, 11-6 in bowl games and 1-0 in conference championship games.
- In 2019, Penn State played its most regular season night games in program history with four primetime tilts.
- On Oct. 12, 2013, the Lions claimed the longest game in Big Ten history when they edged Michigan under the lights, 43-40, in four overtimes in front of a sellout Beaver Stadium crowd of 107,844 on Homecoming.

- The Nittany Lions' roster includes six players with hometowns outside of the U.S.
- Redshirt freshman WR **Jan Mahlert** is from Fürstentfeldbruck, Germany.
- Redshirt freshman DT **Jordan van den Berg** is from Johannesburg, South Africa.
- Sophomore TE **Theo Johnson** (Windsor, Ont.), sophomore WR **Malick Meiga** (Saint Jerome, QC), redshirt senior S **Jonathan Sutherland** (Ottawa) and redshirt freshman QB **Christian Veilleux** (Ottawa) are all Canada natives.

STREAKING

- Penn State has won 15 consecutive games against teams that are not members of a Power Five conference.
- Penn State has won 15 consecutive games over non-conference opponents during the regular season, dating back to a win over Temple in 2016.
- Penn State has won 20-straight non-conference home games, dating back to a win over Kent State in 2013.

ON TV

- Penn State has had 337 of its last 339 games televised, including 235 consecutive games.
- Over the last 15 seasons, every Penn State game has aired on either ABC, BTN, NBC or an ESPN or FOX channel.
- Penn State has made 316 regular season TV appearances since 1995, which is tied for the national lead.
- The Penn State-Auburn game drew 4.054 million viewers, the most-watched FBS game of the week.
- The Penn State-Purdue matchup drew 3.512 million viewers.

- Penn State owns a winning record against 17 of the 22 teams that it has met 20 or more times.
- Seven of the 22 teams are on the 2022 schedule, including Purdue (20), Michigan (25), Ohio State (37), Indiana (25), Maryland (45), Rutgers (32) and Michigan State (36).
- Penn State and Purdue played their 20th meeting to open the 2022 season.
- Sixteen of the 21 programs are currently members of NCAA Division I FBS. Bucknell, Lehigh and Penn are in NCAA Division I FCS, while Gettysburg and Lebanon Valley are in Division III.

HOME SWEET HOME

- With a 305-79 all-time record in Beaver Stadium, Penn State owns the sixth-best winning percentage (.794) in its current home venue amongst current FBS schools and leads the Big Ten.
- Penn State averaged 106,799 fans in seven home games in 2021, the seventh-highest average in program history and best season average since 2009.
- Only Alabama (.838) and Oklahoma (.817) have higher winning percentages in facilities older than Beaver Stadium.

- Penn State football head coach **James Franklin** announced redshirt seniors QB **Sean Clifford**, S **Jonathan Sutherland** and LS **Chris Stoll**, seniors S **Ji'Ayir Brown** and DT **PJ Mustipher** and redshirt junior OL **Juice Scruggs** have been named team captains for the 2022 season.
- Clifford and Sutherland are captains for the fourth-straight season, the only four-time captains in program history.
- Mustipher is a captain for the second-consecutive season.

TEAM NOTES

OVERTIME OVER TIME

- College football introduced overtime during the bowl season in 1995 and adopted it for regular season games in 1996. Since then, Penn State has played 15 overtime games, including six over the 2012-14 seasons.
- Ten of the 15 overtime tilts have come at home, three in true road games, one in the 2006 Orange Bowl and one in the 2014 Pinstripe Bowl.
- Penn State is 8-7 all-time in overtime games, with a 5-5 record at Beaver Stadium, 1-2 mark in true road games and 2-0 in contests at a neutral site.
- Penn State's first two overtime contests came vs. Iowa in 2000 and 2002 at home. The Nittany Lions dropped their first three contests that went to the extra period, but won five straight overtime contests before falling to Nebraska on Nov. 23, 2013.

RETURNING LETTERWINNERS/STARTERS

- Penn State returns 33 lettermen from last year's squad - 14 on offense, 18 on defense and one on special teams.
- A total of 37 lettermen are returning for the Nittany Lions. In addition to the 33 lettermen returning from 2021, **Hakeem Beamon**, **Adisa Isaac**, **Jake Pinegar** and **Marquis Wilson** also have letterman status.
- The Nittany Lions lost the services of 22 lettermen - 12 on offense, nine on defense and one specialist.
- Penn State returns 12 starters - six on offense, five on defense and one on special teams.
- Twelve additional Penn Staters have starting experience - four on offense, seven on defense and one specialist.
- Among returners is 2021 All-Big Ten second team honoree **PJ Mustipher**, third team honorees **Ji'Ayir Brown** and **Joey Porter Jr.**, and honorable mention selections **Sean Clifford**, **Curtis Jacobs**, **Juice Scruggs** and **Brenton Strange**.

ARRINGTON A HALL OF FAMER

- Penn State national award winner and first-team All-America linebacker LaVar Arrington has been elected to the College Football Hall of Fame as part of the 2022 class.
- Arrington will be inducted to the Hall of Fame December 6, 2022 at the 64th National Football Foundation (NFF) Annual Awards Dinner.
- Arrington and the 21 inductees (18 players, 3 coaches) will also be recognized at their respective collegiate institutions with NFF Hall of Fame On-Campus Salutes, presented by Fidelity Investments, during the fall. Their accomplishments will be forever immortalized at the Chick-fil-A College Football Hall of Fame in Atlanta.
- Arrington is the 26th member (20 players, 6 coaches) of the Penn State football family to be elected to the College Hall of Fame. Quarterback Kerry Collins was the most recent player inductee in 2018.

FAMILY AFFAIR

- Penn Staters know that it is very common for generations of families to all attend Penn State. For a fortunate few, immediate family members are also able to follow in a brother, father or grandfather's footsteps on the Penn State football team.

OFFENSIVE NOTES

- Since the start of the 2016 season, Penn State's offense is second in the Big Ten in touchdown percentage (31.7; 20th nationally) and yards per play (6.06; 30th) and is third in points per possession (2.16; 21st), scoring percentage (40.46; 23rd), yards per pass attempt (7.94; 26th), scoring offense (33.6; 25th) and total offense (424.5; 38th).
- Penn State's offense has been explosive since the 2016 campaign, as it leads the Big Ten in 80-plus play percentage (0.20; T-2nd nationally) and 70-plus (0.40; 9th), ranks second in 40-plus (2.08; 13th) and 20-plus (7.88; 13th) and holds third in 30-plus (3.66; 18th), 50-plus (1.02; 28th) and 60-plus (0.57; 19th).
- The Nittany Lions have tallied at least 55 plays of 20 or more yards in six of the last seven seasons (57 in 2021; 63 in 2019; 73 in 2018; 85 in 2017; 91 in 2016; 67 in 2015). PSU had 52 plays of 20 or more yards in 2020 (nine-game schedule).
- Additionally, the Nittany Lions are third in the Big Ten and 15th nationally in 15-plus yard passing play percentage since 2016 (19.63 percent).
- Penn State posted 406 total yards, including 308 through the air, against Purdue.
- Against Ohio, Penn State tallied 572 yards of total offense, the ninth-most in a game in the **James Franklin** era. Nittany Lion freshmen (true and redshirt) combined for 423 of the 572 yards (74 percent).
- **Sean Clifford**, **Drew Allar** and **Christian Veilleux** combined for 31 completions and 338 passing yards. Penn State's 31 completions on the day were tied for the fifth-most in a game since 2014.
- The Nittany Lions gained 234 yards rushing against Ohio.
- In the first half, Clifford completed passes to 10 different receivers. Penn State last had 10 receivers catch a pass in a half at Maryland in 2019 (first half).
- The Nittany Lions finished the game with a program-record 17 receivers catching a pass. Only 15 Nittany Lions caught a pass during the entire 2021 season.
- Since 1960, Penn State has had 11 seasons with 17 players catching at least one pass. The Nittany Lions had 17 pass catchers in the Ohio game.
- Penn State had touchdown runs of 44 and 70 yards, both by **Nicholas Singleton**, and a 48-yard run by Singleton. The Nittany Lions had multiple 40+ yard touchdown runs in a game for the first time since 2018 at Illinois (Miles Sanders, 48 yards; Ricky Slade, 61 yards).
- Penn State scored 41 points at Auburn, the most by a non-conference opponent in a game at Auburn since 2001 (41 by Louisiana Tech).
- Penn State rushed for 245 yards at Auburn, the 35th time in the **James Franklin** era that Penn State has surpassed 200 yards rushing. PSU is 30-5 in those games.
- Penn State had five rushing touchdowns in a game for the first time since the 2019 Cotton Bowl vs. Memphis.
- Prior to the game against Penn State, Auburn had allowed just one rushing touchdown in its last seven games.
- The Nittany Lions had two freshmen running backs (**Kaytron Allen** and **Singleton**) each score two touchdowns. Since at least 2000, they are the only Penn State freshmen to both score two rushing touchdowns in a game.
- Allen and Singleton became the first PSU freshmen duo to score a rushing touchdown in the same game for the first time since Noah Cain (13 yards) and **Devyn Ford** (1 yard) against Pitt in 2019.
- WR **KeAndre Lambert-Smith** completed a 25-yard pass to QB Sean Clifford in the second quarter.
- It was Penn State's first pass by a non-quarterback since Jordan Stout's 18-yard completion to **Curtis Jacobs** against Michigan in 2021 and Penn State's first pass by a wide receiver since Jahan Dotson's 21-yard completion to **Parker Washington** against Indiana in 2021.
- The Lambert-Smith to Clifford connection was the first reception by a quarterback from a non-quarterback since Christian Hackenberg's 14-yard touchdown reception from Nick Scott against Illinois in 2015.
- Penn State did not allow a sack against Auburn for the second-consecutive season.
- **Mike Yurich** enters his second season as Penn State's offensive coordinator/quarterbacks coach.
- Yurich (California University (Pa.)) and Franklin (East Stroudsburg) both played in the Pennsylvania State Athletic Conference (PSAC).
- As an FBS offensive coordinator, offenses under Yurich have averaged 6.37 yards per play, ranking first among OC's since 2013 and 13.76 yards per completion, which is also first in that time frame.
- Since 2013, Yurich's offenses have scored 50 or more points 26 times and 40 or more points 54 times (45.8 percent of games coached), both of which are tops among FBS offensive coordinators since 2013.
- His teams have averaged 54.4 touchdowns per year.
- Penn State has scored 40 points 23 times since 2016. By comparison, from 2008 until 2015, the Nittany Lions had 18 40-point outings.

- The Nittany Lions had 38 players selected as Academic All-Big Ten in Fall 2021.
- Sean Clifford was a 2021 National Football Foundation (NFF) Scholar-Athlete and finalist for the Campbell Trophy, known as the "Academic Heisman". He is the 19th Nittany Lion to be selected as an NFF Scholar-Athlete.
- Penn State posted its first 1,000 single-year APR in program history in 2018-19, topping the previous high of 993 in 2014-15.
- In 2019, punter Blake Gillikin took home CoSIDA Academic All-America® first-team honors for the second-straight year to become the 12th two-time first-team selection in Penn State history. He graduated with a perfect 4.0 grade-point average in May 2020.
- Gillikin's two first-team CoSIDA Academic All-America honors increase Penn State football's total to 67 honorees, which ranks second in Division I football history (FBS and FCS).

DEGREES ON THE WALL

- Entering the 2022 season, 10 players have earned a combined 12 degrees.
- The Nittany Lion's nine Penn State graduates on the roster are: **Barney Amor** (master's in management & organizational leadership), **Sean Clifford** (advertising/public relations), **Charlie Katschir** (hospitality management), **Grayson Kline** (criminology), **PJ Mustipher** (journalism), **Jake Pinegar** (health policy & administration), **Chris Stoll** (kinesiology), **Jonathan Sutherland** (labor and employment relations) and **Nick Tarburton** (labor and human resources).
- Hunter Nourzad** earned his bachelor's degree in engineering from Cornell, while Amor earned bachelor's degrees in sociology and education at Colgate.

QUARTERBACK NOTES

- Offensive coordinator **Mike Yurich** also heads the Penn State quarterback room.
- Three quarterbacks Yurich coached in college are currently on NFL rosters (Sam Ehlinger – Texas, Justin Fields – Ohio State, Mason Rudolph – Oklahoma State).
- Yurich served as the passing game coordinator and quarterbacks coach at Ohio State in 2019, where quarterback Justin Fields was a finalist for the Heisman Trophy, Walter Camp Player of the Year Award and Davey O'Brien Award.
- Redshirt senior **Sean Clifford** is in his fourth season as Penn State's starting signal caller, having played in 41 career games, making 36 starts.
- Clifford joins **Jonathan Sutherland** as the only four-time team captains in program history.
- Against Purdue, Clifford joined Zack Mills (2001-04) and Tony Sacca (1988-92) as the only quarterbacks to start a game in four different seasons at Penn State.
- The Cincinnati native began the season on the Davey O'Brien Award, Manning Award, Maxwell Award, Johnny Unitas Golden Arm Award, Walter Camp Player of the Year Award and Wuerffel Trophy watch lists. Clifford is also on the Reese's Senior Bowl watch list.
- Clifford earned Big Ten Co-Offensive Player of the Week following his performance at Purdue, tallying 282 passing yards and tied a career high with four touchdown passes against Purdue. He also rushed for a 2-yard touchdown. The redshirt senior threw for two touchdowns in the second quarter and two in the fourth quarter.
- Clifford threw for 213 yards and a touchdown against Ohio, while adding a 1-yard rushing touchdown.
- Against Ohio, Clifford recorded his ninth career game with both a passing and rushing touchdown. Penn State is 8-1 in those games.
- Clifford threw for 178 yards and had a rushing touchdown at Auburn.
- Clifford has tossed multiple touchdowns in a half on 18 occasions and 11 different times has thrown multiple touchdowns in a quarter.
- The Ohio native tallied his 27th career game with multiple TD passes against Purdue, including 13 with three or more TDs, the most by a PSU quarterback since 2000, and four games with four touchdowns.
- At Purdue, Clifford became the third Penn State quarterback to surpass the 8,000-career passing yard mark, joining Trace McSorley (9,899; 2015-18) and Christian Hackenberg (8,457; 2013-15).
- At Auburn, Clifford moved into second all-time at Penn State with 8,512 passing yards, leaping Christian Hackenberg (8,457 yards; 2013-15).
- Against Purdue, Clifford also topped the 9,000-career total yards mark. He currently has 9,440 total yards.
- Clifford is just one of three Penn State players all-time to reach 9,000-plus yards of total offense and one of three quarterbacks to reach 8,000 career passing yards.
- Clifford is one of five current FBS quarterbacks and one of three Power Five conference quarterbacks with 8,500 passing yards and 900 rushing yards in his career.
- He ranks 10th among current FBS quarterbacks and sixth among Power Five conference quarterbacks with 8,512 career passing yards.
- The captain is one of seven current FBS quarterbacks with at least 8,500 passing yards and 65 passing touchdowns in his career.
- Clifford is one of 10 current FBS quarterbacks with at least 660 career completions and ranks ninth among current FBS quarterbacks with a 60.7 completion percentage (min. 1,000 attempts).
- The redshirt senior currently sits as the all-time leader at Penn State in completion percentage (.607), while ranking second at PSU in passing touchdowns (67) and passing yards (8,512), third in completions (660), passing efficiency (142.1) and attempts (1,088), tied seventh in yards per pass attempt (7.8) and ranks sixth in lowest interception % (2.30), seventh in wins as starting quarterback (24) and ninth touchdown pass % (6.27).
- He owns nine career games with at least 250 passing yards and three passing touchdowns and nine games with both a passing and rushing touchdown. He has tossed six career touchdowns of 70-plus yards and has completed 114 career passes of 20 or more yards.
- Clifford owns seven career 300-yard passing games and 21 career 200-yard games. He is tied with Christian Hackenberg (2013-15) for the second-most 200-yard passing games at PSU.
- Freshman **Drew Allar** made his collegiate debut at Purdue, completing two-of-four passes for 26 yards.
- Allar completed six-of-eight passes for 88 yards and two touchdowns against Ohio.
- Allar connected with **Omari Evans** on a 32-yard touchdown for his first career touchdown pass.
- Allar hit **Khalil Dinkins** for a 28-yard score in the fourth quarter.
- Redshirt freshman **Christian Veilleux** completed six-of-seven passes against Ohio, tallying 37 yards.

RUNNING BACKS NOTES

- Co-offensive coordinator/running backs coach **Ja'Juan Seider** has 14 years of college coaching experience, including 11 at the Power Five level.
- Seider helped a young running backs group to rank fifth in the Big Ten in rushing in 2020.
- In 2019, Seider mentored Journey Brown, who had 11 rushes of 20 or more yards and posted a Cotton Bowl and Penn State bowl-record 202 rushing yards.
- In 2018, Penn State posted its highest rushing average (204.9) since 2008 (205.8), led by second-team All-Big Ten selection Miles Sanders.
- As a player at Florida A&M, Seider won the Doug Williams Award for National Offensive Player of the Year, Jake Gaither Award (considered the Heisman Trophy of Historically Black Colleges) and earned All-America honors after throwing for 2,622 yards and 27 touchdowns and rushing for 740 yards and 14 touchdowns in 1999.
- Seider, who was the 1999 MEAC Offensive Player of the Year, was selected in the sixth round of the 2000 NFL Draft by the San Diego Chargers.
- Sophomore **Keyvone Lee** has collected 1,016 career rushing yards (4.8 yards per carry) and six touchdowns. He also has 30 catches for 219 yards and a touchdown.
- Lee surpassed the 1,000 career rushing yard mark against Auburn. He became the 46th Nittany Lion to reach 1,000 career rushing yards.
- The sophomore is a member of the Doak Walker Award watch list.
- Against Purdue, Lee caught the game-winning 10-yard touchdown reception with 57 seconds remaining. It was his first career touchdown reception.
- Junior **Devyn Ford** has rushed for 666 career yards and six touchdowns, while adding 19 receptions and 107 receiving yards.
- Ford had a 30-yard run against Auburn.
- Freshmen **Kaytron Allen** and **Nicholas Singleton** both made their collegiate debuts against Purdue.
- Singleton rushed for 179 yards and two touchdowns on 10 carries against Ohio. He scored on runs of 44 and 70 yards and added a 48-yard rush. Singleton earned Big Ten Freshman of the Week honors for his efforts against Ohio.
- Singleton became the first Nittany Lion with multiple 40+ yard touchdown runs in a game since Larry Johnson at Indiana on Nov. 16, 2002 (touchdown runs of 41, 43 and 69 yards).
- Singleton is the first Nittany Lion with three 40+ yard runs in a game since Johnson's performance against Indiana (runs of 41, 41, 43 and 69).
- The freshman's 70-yard run is Penn State's longest run since an 85-yard run by Journey Brown against Pittsburgh in 2019.
- Singleton repeated as Big Ten Freshman of the Week after rushing for 124 yards and two touchdowns on 10 carries against Auburn.
- Singleton scored on two touchdown runs, a 1-yard rush and a 54-yard rush. He added a 53-yard carry.
- He became the first Penn State true freshman with back-to-back 100-yard games since Noah Cain in 2019 (vs. Purdue and Iowa).
- Through three games, Singleton has 334 yards, averaging 111.3 per game and 11.1 per carry.
- Singleton paced the country in yards per carry, leading by 1.84 yards per carry.
- Singleton is one of nine FBS players and three Power Five players since 2000 to average at least 11.1 yards per carry (min. 30 rush attempts).
- The freshman leads the country with five 40+ yard run this season. Three of his five 40+ yard runs have gone for touchdowns.
- Singleton leads all FBS freshmen and ranks 16th in the FBS with 334 rushing yards. He also paces all FBS freshman and sits 12th in the nation averaging 111.3 rushing yards per game.
- He holds 18th in the country with four rushing touchdowns.
- Singleton is averaging 156.0 all-purpose yards per game, ranking 13th in the nation and leading FBS freshmen.
- Since 2000, only Larry Johnson 362; 2002) has more rushing yards through the first three games of a season.
- Since 2000, Singleton's 334 rushing yards are the most by a Penn State freshman, passing Saquon Barkley's mark of 311 in 2015.
- Allen had a 22-yard reception against Ohio. He rushed for 31 yards at Purdue and 23 yards vs. the Bobcats.
- Allen rushed for a career-high 52 yards and two touchdowns on nine carries at Auburn.
- Allen's first career rushing touchdown came on a 3-yard run in the second quarter. He added a 6-yard touchdown run in the third quarter.
- The Nittany Lions had two freshmen running backs (Allen and Singleton) each score two touchdowns against Auburn. Since at least 2000, they are the only Penn State freshmen to both score two rushing touchdowns in a game.
- Allen and Singleton became the first PSU freshmen duo to score a rushing touchdown in the same game for the first time since Noah Cain (13 yards) and Devyn Ford (1 yard) against Pitt in 2019.

TIGHT ENDS NOTES

- Tight ends coach **Ty Howle** enters his second season coaching the Penn State tight ends and his third season overall on the staff.
- Howle served as an offensive analyst in 2020, working closely with the offensive line and tight ends.
- Prior to returning to Happy Valley, Howle spent four seasons on the coaching staff at Western Illinois, serving as assistant head coach/co-offensive coordinator/offensive line coach in 2018-19.
- Howle was a four-year letterwinner on the Penn State offensive line from 2009-13. He started at center and left guard and was a four-time Academic All-Big Ten selection. He was a team captain in 2013.
- Howle played in 47 career games for the Nittany Lions, making 13 starts. He graduated in 2013 with a bachelor's degree in kinesiology.
- Since **James Franklin** took over the program in 2014, three PSU tight ends have been taken in the NFL Draft, tied for eighth in the nation during that span (Pat Freiermuth – 2021, 2nd round; Mike Gesicki – 2018, 2nd round; Jesse James – 2015, 5th round).
- Penn State had four tight ends on opening week NFL rosters in 2021 (Nick Bowers, Freiermuth, Gesicki and James), trailing only Stanford (5) among FBS programs.
- An experienced tight end group, which has combined for 66 career games and 28 starts, looks to continue a strong tight end tradition.
- Redshirt junior **Brenton Strange** leads the group and has appeared in 27 career games for the Nittany Lions, making 21 starts.
- Late in the second quarter at Purdue, Strange caught a pass along the sideline and fought off multiple Boilermakers for a 67-yard touchdown.
- It was Strange's longest career reception and seventh career touchdown grab.
- Strange led the Nittany Lions with six catches for 80 yards at Auburn, including 59 yards after the catch.
- Against the Tigers, Strange surpassed 500 receiving yards for his career.
- Strange (6), sophomore **Theo Johnson** (4) and sophomore **Tyler Warren** (2) have combined for 12 20-plus yard receptions in their careers.
- Johnson had a career-best 37-yard reception against Auburn in 2021.
- Johnson and Strange are both on the Mackey Award watch list.
- In his first career start, Warren had three catches for 23 yards at Purdue.
- The sophomore made a key 15-yard catch to setup the game-winning touchdown in the fourth quarter.
- Warren scored a 3-yard run against Villanova and a 2-yard rushing touchdown against Auburn in 2021.
- He made a key 2-yard touchdown reception on fourth and goal against Michigan, his first career receiving score.
- Redshirt freshman **Khalil Dinkins** caught a 28-yard touchdown pass in the fourth quarter vs. Ohio, his first career reception and touchdown reception.

WIDE RECEIVER NOTES

- Offensive recruiting coordinator/wide receivers coach **Taylor Stubblefield** is in his third season on the Penn State staff.
- As a player, Stubblefield caught 325 passes, which was an NCAA record at the completion of his career at Purdue.
- He still owns the Big Ten record for career receptions and ranks second in conference history with 3,629 yards.
- Stubblefield was a consensus All-American and a finalist for the Biletnikoff Award in 2004.
- Leading the wideout room is **Parker Washington**, who has caught a pass in all 25 games of his career.
- Washington had a 20-yard reception against Purdue, a 34-yard grab against Ohio and a 26-yard catch at Auburn, giving him 23 career receptions of 20+ yards.
- The sophomore owns 110 career receptions, tied 13th all-time at Penn State.
- Washington's 100 receptions in his first two seasons of his career are second-most ever at Penn State for a player in their first two years, trailing only DaeSean Hamilton (127 combined in 2014 and 2015).
- Washington and transfer **Mitchell Tinsley** (137) both have over 100 career receptions. Penn State entered the season as one of nine FBS schools and one of four Power Five programs with multiple players over 100 career receptions.
- Washington has recorded 1,457 career receiving yards, good for 20th in program history.
- With Tinsley (1,947) and Washington, Penn State began the year as one of 10 FBS teams, and one of five Power Five teams, with two players over 1,300 career receiving yards.
- Tinsley (20) and Washington (10) both have double-digit career receiving touchdowns. Penn State entered the season as one of seven FBS teams, and one of three Power Five teams, with multiple players collecting 10+ career receiving touchdowns.
- Tinsley and Washington were two of 30 FBS receivers entering the 2022 season with at least 100 receptions, 1,300 receiving yards and 10 receiving touchdowns in their career.
- Tinsley and Washington are both on the Biletnikoff Award watch list, while Washington is also on the Earl Campbell Tyler Rose Award watch list.
- **KeAndre Lambert-Smith** (521), Tinsley and Washington each recorded over 500 receiving yards last season. Penn State entered the season as one of nine FBS teams, and one of six Power Five teams, with three receivers on the roster who tallied 500+ receiving yards in 2021.
- Lambert-Smith returns for his third season in Happy Valley.
- Lambert-Smith, who has started 21 career games, made 34 receptions for 521 yards and five touchdowns with a long reception of 83 yards in 2021.
- The 83-yard reception resulted in a touchdown against Villanova (9/25), marking the seventh-longest pass play in program history.
- Eight of Lambert-Smith's 34 catches in 2021 were 20 or more yards and he finished sixth in the Big Ten in yards per reception (15.3).
- The sophomore had four catches for 58 yards at Purdue, including a 29-yard touchdown reception in the fourth quarter.
- Lambert-Smith completed a 25-yard pass to Sean Clifford against Auburn.
- It was Penn State's first pass completed by a receiver since Jahan Dotson's 21-yard completion to Washington against Indiana in 2021.
- Lambert-Smith has a reception in 19-straight games.
- Sophomore **Malick Meiga** reached the end zone for the first time in his career, on a 67-yard strike from **Christian Veilleux**, in the third quarter against Rutgers in 2021.
- Penn State welcomed Tinsley as a transfer this past offseason. Tinsley spent the previous two seasons at Western Kentucky.
- Tinsley had a team-high seven catches for 84 yards at Purdue.
- He had a 27-yard reception on PSU's game-winning drive in the fourth quarter at Purdue.
- The senior hauled in a 12-yard touchdown reception in the second quarter against Ohio, his first reception and first touchdown as a Nittany Lion.
- Tinsley made a 34-yard grab against Auburn.
- Tinsley, a senior, has a reception in 29-straight games, tied for the seventh-longest reception streak in the nation.
- Among current FBS receivers, Tinsley ranks seventh in career receiving touchdowns (20), 18th in career receiving yards (1,937) and 27th in career receptions (143).
- Tinsley is one of seven FBS receivers with 140 receptions, 1,900 receiving yards and 20 receiving touchdowns in his career.
- Tinsley has 28 career receptions of 20 or more yards and six receptions of 40 or more yards.
- A second-team All-Conference USA selection in 2021, Tinsley finished second in the league in receiving yards (1,402, 8th nationally), receptions (87, 16th) and touchdown receptions (14, 5th).
- He started all 14 games for the Hilltoppers and averaged 100.1 yards receiving per game and 16.1 yards per reception.
- During the 2020 season, he played in all 12 games, making nine starts, pacing the Hilltoppers in receptions (43), yards (377) and touchdowns (4).
- The Nittany Lions had a program-record 17 different pass-catchers against Ohio.
- Since 1960, Penn State has had 11 seasons with 17 players catching at least one pass. The Nittany Lions had 17 pass catchers in the Ohio game.
- Against Ohio, redshirt freshman **Liam Clifford**, redshirt freshman **Jaden Dottin**, freshman **Omari Evans**, freshman **Kaden Saunders** and redshirt freshman **Harrison Wallace III** all made their first career receptions.
- Evans hauled in a 32-yard touchdown pass in the third quarter, his first career reception and first career touchdown reception, against Ohio.
- Dottin made his first career start vs. Ohio.
- Wallace had four receptions for 35 yards against the Bobcats.

OFFENSIVE LINE NOTES

- Offensive line coach **Phil Trautwein** enters his third season at Penn State.
- He was named to the American Football Coaches Association (AFCA) Class of 2021 "35 Under 35" list, recognizing the top-35 football coaches under the age of 35. He was the only Big Ten coach and the only offensive line coach on the 2021 list.
- In his two seasons at Penn State, Trautwein has helped seven Penn State offensive linemen to earn All-Big Ten honors.
- He's coached 17 All-Conference selections over the last four seasons, which includes a stint at Boston College as the offensive line coach.
- Trautwein was a two-time All-SEC selection and two-time team captain as a left tackle at Florida, earning first-team honors in 2008 and second-team accolades in 2006.
- He was part of the Gators winning the BCS National Championship and SEC titles in the 2006 and 2008 seasons.
- Trautwein played four years in the NFL.
- Redshirt senior center **Juice Scruggs** leads the offensive line unit and began the season on the Rimington Trophy watch list.
- In 2021, he was named All-Big Ten honorable mention by the coaches and media, earned Pro Football Focus All-Big Ten third team honors, and was the team's Dick Maginnis Memorial Award, recognizing the most outstanding offensive lineman.
- Scruggs has made 16 career starts on the offensive line, including starting at center in all three games this season.
- Redshirt junior tackle **Caedan Wallace** has 23 starts at right tackle and owns 29 career appearances.
- Sophomore **Olumuyiwa Fashanu** has appeared in 12 games and made five starts at left tackle.
- In 49 pass protections against Purdue, Fashanu allowed zero pressures.
- Fashanu also allowed zero pressures against Ohio.
- Sophomore **Nick Dawkins**, redshirt senior **Bryce Effner** and redshirt freshman **Landon Tengwall** also saw playing time on the line in 2021.
- Redshirt junior **Sal Wormley** has appeared in four games and returns after missing the 2021 season due to injury.
- Tengwall and Wormley made their first career starts at Purdue.
- The Nittany Lions allowed no sacks against Auburn.
- Penn State didn't allow a sack against Auburn in 2021 or 2022.
- Against the Tigers, the Penn State offensive line paved the way for the Nittany Lions to rush for 245 yards and five touchdowns.
- It was Penn State's most rushing yards in a non-conference game since running for 258 against Miami in 2001.
- The Nittany Lion offensive line has aided Nicholas Singleton to lead the nation with five 40+ yard runs this season.

2023 HALL OF FAME BALLOT

- Penn State lettermen **Ki-Jana Carter**, **D.J. Dozier** and **Paul Posluszny** have been selected as a part of the national ballot for the National Football Foundation's College Hall of Fame's Class of 2023. A total of 80 players and nine coaches from FBS are on the 2023 ballot.
- The trio of standouts have an opportunity to join 20 former Nittany Lion players and five Penn State coaches who have been inducted into the Hall.
- Also on the Hall of Fame ballot is former Nittany Lion student-athlete **Glen Killinger**, who is among the candidates for the divisional coach Class of 2023. Killinger was inducted into the Hall of Fame as a player in 1966.
- Carter, a running back for the Nittany Lions, was a first-team All-American during the 1994 campaign. Carter staked a claim to being one of the most decorated Penn State running backs of all-time with a junior season in which he was fourth nationally in rushing (139.9), second in scoring (10.8 ppg) and fifth in all-purpose yardage (158.4). The Westerville, Ohio native led the Big Ten in all three categories. His 7.8 yards per carry was easily the best among the nation's Top 25 rushers. His 1994 statistics included 1,539 yards rushing, the then-No. 2 season total in Penn State history, and 23 touchdowns. Carter was runner-up for the Heisman Trophy and a finalist for the Maxwell Award. He was named co-MVP of the Rose Bowl with 156 rushing yards on 21 carries, including an 83-yard touchdown run on the Nittany Lions' first offensive play. When the Cincinnati Bengals selected Carter as the first overall player picked in the 1995 NFL Draft, he became the first Nittany Lion to be chosen No. 1.
- Dozier, a tailback for the Nittany Lions, matriculated to Happy Valley from Virginia Beach, Va. He earned first team All-America honors from the Walter Camp Football Foundation in 1986. Dozier is the only Nittany Lion to lead the team in rushing four consecutive seasons, doing so from 1983-86. He ranks No. 5 on the school career rushing yardage list with 3,227 yards, scoring 25 touchdowns and averaging 5.2 yards per attempt. Dozier gained 1,002 yards as a freshman and tallied 811 yards and 10 touchdowns as a senior and one of the instrumental players on the Nittany Lions' 12-0 squad. Dozier was the Most Valuable Offensive Player of the Game after rushing for 99 yards and scoring the game-winning touchdown in the fourth quarter against Miami in the 1987 Fiesta Bowl to secure Penn State's second national championship.
- Posluszny, an outside linebacker for the Nittany Lions, was a first-team All-American in 2005 and 2006. Posluszny became just the second two-time winner of the Chuck Bednarik Award, presented to the nation's top defensive player, in 2006. In 2005, he also won the Butkus Award, presented to the nation's top linebacker and was a finalist for the 2006 honor. The 13th Nittany Lion to be named a two-time first-team All-American, Posluszny also was a two-time finalist for the Rotary Lombardi Award. The Nittany Lions' first two-time team captain since 1968-69, he became Penn State's career tackle leader with 372. A starter in the last 37 games of his career, Posluszny became the first Nittany Lion to lead the team in tackles three times and to post three 100-tackle seasons, recording 116 in 2006. Posluszny also was a two-time first-team ESPN the Magazine Academic All-American and was selected the 2006 Academic All-American of the Year among Division I football players.
- From Harrisburg, Killinger was a Walter Camp All-American at quarterback for the Nittany Lions in 1921. He coached at Dickinson (1922), Rensselaer (1927-32), Moravian (1933) and West Chester (1934-41, 45-59). Killinger is the winningest coach in West Chester history and is a member of the Pennsylvania Sports Hall of Fame. He died in 1988.
- Penn State has 26 players and coaches who are members of the College Football Hall of Fame. Six coaches and 20 players have earned their way into the hall of fame.
- **LaVar Arrington** will be inducted into the College Football Hall of Fame on December 6, 2022 at the 64th National Football Foundation (NFF) Annual Awards Dinner.

DEFENSIVE NOTES

- **Manny Diaz** was hired as Penn State's defensive coordinator and linebackers coach on Dec. 11, 2021.
- Diaz, who has 24 years of collegiate coaching experience, including three as a head coach and 13 as a defensive coordinator, joined the Nittany Lions after spending six seasons (2016-21) at the University of Miami, including three seasons as head coach (2019-21), where he coached the Hurricanes to three bowl appearances.
- Defenses under Diaz have been a force behind the line of scrimmage. From 2018-20, Miami's defense featured at least one player with 15 tackles for loss: Jaelan Phillips (15.5) in 2020, Gregory Rousseau (19.5) in 2019 and Jonathan Garvin (18.0) in 2018.
- During Diaz's tenure in Miami, the Hurricanes ranked in the top 10 nationally in tackles for loss each year. Miami was No. 9 in 2021 (7.75 per game), No. 4 in 2020 (8.6), No. 4 in 2019 (8.3), No. 1 in 2018 (10.5), No. 4 in 2017 (8.5) and No. 5 in 2016 (8.3).
- Penn State tallied a school-record 16 pass breakups at Purdue, including six by CB **Joey Porter Jr.** and four by S **Keaton Ellis**.
- Penn State's school-record 16 pass breakups at Purdue are the most by an FBS team in a game since Tulane had 20 vs. East Carolina in 2018.
- Porter's six pass breakups are a school record and tied a Big Ten single-game record, matching Michigan's Jourdan Lewis (vs. Michigan State, 2015) and Minnesota's Michael Carter (vs. Purdue, 2012).
- His six pass breakups are the most by an FBS player since Houston's William Jackson III had seven against Temple in 2015.
- The Nittany Lions held Purdue's Aidan O'Connell to 30-of-60 passing (50 percent) after he completed 71 percent of his passes in 2021.
- PSU limited Ohio to 264 total yards, the 46th time its held an opponent under 300 total yards since 2014, the seventh-most games among FBS teams.
- Penn State caused a safety in the second quarter vs. Ohio, its first safety since 2018 at Pitt (holding in the end zone).
- Against Ohio, the Nittany Lions snapped a streak of 20-straight games forcing a turnover. In those 20 games, Penn State forced 29 total turnovers (19 interceptions, 10 fumbles).
- At Auburn, Penn State recorded 11 tackles for loss and six sacks.
- Penn State forced four takeaways (two fumbles, two interceptions). It was the Nittany Lions' first time with four takeaways since the Michigan State game in 2019.
- Against the Tigers, 28 Penn State players played double-digit snaps on defense.
- Over the last eight seasons, PSU sits second nationally in sacks per game (3.0; trailing only Clemson), third in QB hurries (919), fourth in total pressures generated (1,375), seventh in fewest passing TDs allowed per game (1.05), eighth in fewest passing yards per attempt (6.28), seventh in tackles for loss percentage (10.55) and 11th in fewest rushing yards per attempt (3.60).
- Penn State's 274 sacks over the last eight years (2015-22) are fourth behind Clemson (336), Alabama (320) and Pitt (293).
- Over the last eight years, Penn State has accumulated a 8.44 percent sack percentage (274 sacks on 3,624 plays), which ranks sixth in the FBS.
- Since 2014, Penn State has held opponents to seven or less points 23 times, seventh-most among FBS teams. Seventeen of those 23 games have been against Big Ten opponents.
- In the **James Franklin** era, Penn State has recorded seven shutouts, fifth-most among FBS teams.
- Penn State also has the fifth-most shutouts (12) in the FBS since 2007.
- Since 2014, the Nittany Lions have allowed less than 200 passing yards in 59 games, tied for the sixth-most among FBS teams.
- Penn State has held opponents under 100 passing yards in 16 games since 2014, tied ninth-most among FBS teams.
- Since 2014, Penn State has held opponents under 100 rushing yards on 41 occasions, tied 13th-most among FBS teams.
- Penn State has registered 10 or more tackles for loss 26 times since 2014, tied second-most among FBS teams.

DEFENSIVE LINE NOTES

- **John Scott Jr.** is in his third season heading the Nittany Lion defensive line corps. Scott brings 18 years of collegiate coaching experience to the Penn State defensive line room with two additional years of coaching experience in the NFL.
- In Scott's first two seasons at Penn State, the Nittany Lions had three first-team All-Big Ten selections in Odafe (Jayson) Oweh and Shaka Toney in 2020 and Arnold Ebiketie in 2021.
- Six Nittany Lions earned All-Big Ten accolades in the last two seasons.
- The Nittany Lions defensive line room features 2021 All-Big Ten honoree DT **PJ Mustipher**.
- Mustipher, a senior and team captain, anchors the Nittany Lion defensive line room, having appeared in 43 career games and making 19 starts. In his Penn State career, Mustipher owns 109 tackles, 10 tackles for loss and three sacks.
- Mustipher is a team captain for the second-straight season.
- Despite suffering a season-ending injury at Iowa on Oct. 9, Mustipher was named a 2021 All-Big Ten second team selection by the coaches.
- Mustipher began the season on watch lists for the Rotary Lombardi Award, Bronko Nagurski Trophy and Outland Trophy.
- Mustipher was a 2021 semifinalist for the Rotary Lombardi Award, a quarterfinalist for the Lott IMPACT Trophy and was on the Reese's Senior Bowl watch list in 2021.
- The senior had a defensive line-high seven tackles at Wisconsin, recorded a sack against Villanova and tallied six tackles and a tackle for loss against Indiana in 2021.
- Redshirt senior DE **Nick Tarburton** has appeared in 25 career games, making 11 starts.
- He recovered a fumble in the red zone, the first of his career, in the second quarter against Wisconsin in 2021.
- Tarburton made an assist on a sack against Illinois in 2021 that resulted in a forced fumble and recovery for Penn State.
- Sophomore DE **Adisa Isaac** earned his first career start against Purdue.
- Isaac tallied two stops and a tackle for loss vs. Ohio.
- Isaac recorded a career-high three tackles for loss, including a solo sack, at Auburn. He added two QB hurries.
- Penn State welcomed sophomore DE **Chop Robinson** to the program this summer. Robinson transferred from the University of Maryland.
- Robinson was a 2021 ESPN Midseason True Freshman All-American, appearing in all 13 games with one start, totaling 19 tackles (12 solo), 2.5 tackles for loss for 18 yards and two sacks for 16 yards.
- Robinson collected two tackles, a tackle for loss and a pass breakup against Ohio.
- In his Penn State debut, Robinson had a key QB hurry to force an incomplection on Purdue's final play of the game.
- At Auburn, Robinson recorded his first sack as a Nittany Lion with a strip-sack in the second quarter.
- Robinson also recovered a fumble in the third quarter.
- Freshman DE **Dani Dennis-Sutton** collected his first career tackle for loss and sack in the fourth quarter at Auburn.
- Sophomore DE **Amin Vanover** registered two tackles vs. the Boilermakers.
- Redshirt junior DT **Dvon Ellies** has also seen valuable time at defensive tackle, playing in all 13 games in 2021.
- Ellies recovered a fumble in the second quarter against Illinois, his first career recovery.
- Redshirt junior DE **Smith Vilbert** recorded three sacks in the Outback Bowl vs. Arkansas, the most sacks by a Penn State player in a single game since Shaka Toney had three against Purdue in 2019.
- The three sacks also set a Penn State bowl record.
- Freshman DT **Zane Durant** made his collegiate debut against Purdue, registering a tackle.

COACHING STAFF CHANGES

- Penn State added defensive coordinator/linebackers coach **Manny Diaz**, special teams coordinator/outside linebacker/nickels coach **Stacy Collins** and assistant athletic director for football performance enhancement **Chuck Losey**.
- Diaz, who has 24 years of collegiate coaching experience, including three as a head coach and 13 as a defensive coordinator, joins the Nittany Lions after spending six seasons (2016-21) at the University of Miami, including three seasons as head coach (2019-21).
- Collins, who has 24 years of collegiate coaching experience, joins the Nittany Lions after spending the 2021 season as Boise State's special teams coordinator and edge coach.
- During the 2021 campaign, Collins' special teams unit blocked three punts (7th nationally) and four kicks overall to rank ninth in FBS. Of the three blocked punts, two were returned for touchdowns.
- Losey, who was previously associate director of performance enhancement for football, will lead the performance enhancement staff for football. He replaces Dwight Galt III, who retired.

LETTERMEN MAKING THEIR RETURN

- Nine members of the coaching and support staff played at PSU.
- Associate head coach/cornerbacks coach **Terry M. Smith** was a three-year starter at wide receiver from 1989-91. He ranks tied for 10th in career receiving touchdowns (15), 13th in career receiving yardage (1,825) and 14th in career receptions (108).
- Tight ends coach **Ty Howle** was a four-year letterwinner on the Penn State offensive line from 2009-13. He played in 47 career games, making 13 starts. The 2013 team captain made starts at center and left guard and was a four-time Academic All-Big Ten selection.
- Defensive graduate assistant **Deion Barnes** made 31 starts as a Nittany Lion from 2012-14. In 2014, Barnes tallied 12.5 tackles for loss and six sacks. He led PSU with 10 tackles for loss and six sacks in 2012 to earn consensus freshman All-American honors.
- Analyst and analytics coordinator **Dan Connor** was a two-time first team All-America linebacker for Penn State in 2006 and 2007, the 14th Nittany Lion to be named a two-time first-team All-American. He finished his career as Penn State's all-time leader with 419 tackles.
- Analyst and analytics coordinator **Danny Rocco** lettered as a linebacker for the Nittany Lions in 1979 and 1980, playing for the Liberty and Fiesta Bowl teams.
- Assistant director of performance enhancement **Tyrone Smith** was a defensive tackle for PSU and lettered during the 2014 season.
- Assistant recruiting coordinator **Alan Zemaitis** was a four-year letterman and three-time All-Big Ten selection for the blue and white from 2002-05. Zemaitis sits tied fifth all-time at Penn State with 12 career interceptions. He also holds fifth all-time at Penn State with 46 passes defended. Zemaitis helped the Nittany Lions to a Big Ten Championship in 2005.
- Director of football academic services **Todd Kulka** lettered as a linebacker and graduated in 1995. He helped Penn State to a 9-3 record and an Outback Bowl victory in 1995.
- Director of the football letterman's club **Wally Richardson** was a four-year letterman as a quarterback in 1992 and 1994-96. Richardson ranks 12th all-time at Penn State with 4,419 career passing yards. He also sits eighth all-time with 378 completions and 12th all-time with 27 touchdown passes.

LINEBACKERS NOTES

- In addition to leading the defense, **Manny Diaz** also coaches the linebacker unit.
- Penn State's linebacker corps is led by 2021 All-Big Ten honoree **Curtis Jacobs**.
- Jacobs, who earned All-Big Ten honorable mention recognition in 2021, has played in 23 career games and made 14 starts.
- Jacobs tallied six tackles, including three solo, at Purdue.
- The sophomore made five stops, a half-tackle for loss and a pass breakup against Ohio.
- Jacobs collected three tackles, including a solo sack, at Auburn.
- Redshirt senior **Jonathan Sutherland** brings a wealth of experience to the linebackers room, having played in 48 career games.
- Sutherland, who played both safety and linebacker in 2021, made the switch to a full-time linebacker for the 2022 season.
- Sutherland notched three tackles, including his first career full sack, and his 100th career tackle at Purdue.
- The senior tallied his first career fumble recovery at Auburn.
- He joins Sean Clifford as the only four-time team captains in program history.
- Sutherland is on the preseason Paul Hornung Award watch list.
- Sophomore **Tyler Elsdon** led the Nittany Lions with six tackles (three solo) against Ohio.
- Elsdon made his first career start against Purdue.
- Elsdon recorded four tackles and a tackle for loss at Auburn.
- Freshman **Abdul Carter** and redshirt freshman **Dominic DeLuca** each notched five tackles against Ohio.
- Carter made a career-high six stops at Auburn, tying for the team lead. All six tackles were solo.
- Carter added his first career sack, and tackle for loss, and forced a fumble in the second quarter, his first career forced fumble.
- Redshirt freshman Kobe King collected a career-best five tackles, including four solo, against the Tigers.
- Linebacker Micah Parsons was selected 12th overall by the Dallas Cowboys in the 2021 NFL Draft.
- Parsons was the highest drafted Penn State defensive player since Aaron Maybin went 11th overall to the Buffalo Bills in 2009.
- He was the first Nittany Lion defensive player drafted in the first round since Jared Odrick (2010; 28th overall to the Miami Dolphins) and the first PSU linebacker selected in the first round since LaVar Arrington (2000; second overall to the Washington Redskins).
- Penn State has 71 linebackers drafted all-time, the most for any school.

CORNERBACKS NOTES

- **Terry M. Smith** is in his ninth season as Penn State's cornerbacks coach. He is also the program's associate head coach and defensive recruiting coordinator.
- Over the last seven seasons, Smith has tutored a secondary which has seen eight defensive backs taken in the NFL Draft, including two in 2022, tied for the ninth-most nationally.
- Smith was a four-year letterwinner (1988-91) and three-year starter at wide receiver at Penn State. He ranks tied for 10th in career receiving touchdowns (15), 13th in career receiving yardage (1,825) and 14th in career receptions (108).
- Penn State forced 14 interceptions and held opposing offenses to a 111.04 passing efficiency in 2021.
- Penn State's cornerbacks room is led by All-Big Ten returnee **Joey Porter Jr.**
- Porter tallied a career-high six pass breakups against Purdue, earning Bednarik Award National Player of the Week honors.
- Porter's six pass breakups vs. the Boilermakers set a school record and tied a Big Ten single-game record. He matched Michigan's Jourdan Lewis (vs. Michigan State, 2015) and Minnesota's Michael Carter (vs. Purdue, 2012).
- Porter's six pass breakups are tied for the most in a single game for an FBS player since Houston's William Jackson III had seven against Temple in 2015.
- According to Pro Football Focus, Porter's six forced incompletions tied for the most in a game by a Power Five cornerback since 2014.
- The junior added a team-high eight tackles and made his first career fumble recovery.
- Porter began the 2022 campaign on watch lists for the Bednarik Award, Bronko Nagurski Trophy, Jim Thorpe Award and Lott IMPACT Trophy. Porter was also named Preseason All-America second team by Sports Illustrated.
- Porter, who has played in 28 career games with the Nittany Lions and has made 24 starts, recorded his first career interception against Indiana in 2021.
- Redshirt junior **Daequan Hardy**, who owned nine passes defended in 2021, recorded his first career interception against Ball State.
- Hardy accounted for two tackles and two pass breakups, including a key breakup to force a Purdue punt late in the fourth quarter.
- Sophomore **Kalen King** recorded one pass breakup at Purdue and had another pass breakup at Auburn.
- Junior **Johnny Dixon** registered his first career sack and broke up two passes against the Boilermakers.
- Dixon recorded a career-high 1.5 tackles for loss and a solo sack against Ohio.
- Dixon ranks fourth in the Big Ten averaging 1.0 sacks per contest.
- Junior **Marquis Wilson** made the switch back to cornerback after being listed as an athlete for the 2021 season. He's played in 30 games, including two starts, with 45 tackles, five pass breakups and two interceptions.
- Wilson had two pass breakups vs. Ohio.
- Wilson tied for a team high with six tackles (four solo) and a half-tackle for loss at Auburn.

- Poindexter was inducted into the College Football Hall of Fame in 2020.
- Senior **Ji'ayir Brown** leads the Penn State safeties.
- Brown accounted for five solo tackles at Purdue and tallied five tackles (four solo), a half-tackle for loss and a pass breakup vs. Ohio.
- Brown earned Big Ten Defensive Player of the Week honors after collecting five tackles (four solo), a solo sack, a forced fumble and an interception at Auburn.
- Brown was also named Bronko Nagurski National Defensive Player of the Week following his performance at Auburn.
- The strip-sack, in the third quarter, was his first career sack and second career forced fumble.
- The captain added his seventh career interception, returning it 27 yards.
- Brown has had a hand in 10 takeaways as a Nittany Lion (seven interceptions, two forced fumbles, one fumble recovery).
- Brown is on the preseason watch lists for the Bednarik Award and Jim Thorpe Award.
- Brown, a third-team All-Big Ten honoree in 2021, tied for the nation's lead with six interceptions.
- Junior **Keaton Ellis** brings a wealth of experience to the Penn State secondary, having appeared in 33 career games, making 10 starts.
- In his career, Ellis owns three forced fumbles, one fumble recovery, an interception and nine pass breakups.
- He tallied a career-best four pass breakups at Purdue.
- During their true freshmen campaigns in 2021, sophomore **Jaylen Reed** (8 games) and redshirt freshman **Zakee Wheatley** (4 games) each gained playing experience in the secondary.
- Wheatley forced a fumble at Purdue, which led to a touchdown drive at the end of the second quarter.
- Wheatley recorded his first career interception in the first quarter at Auburn.
- Reed made a career-high three tackles against the Boilermakers and matched it with three stops at Auburn.
- Freshman **Kevin Winston Jr.** made his debut against Ohio, recording three tackles.

SPECIAL TEAMS NOTES

- **Stacy Collins** is in his first season as Penn State's special teams coordinator/outside linebacker/nickles coach.
- Collins, who has 24 years of collegiate coaching experience, joined the Nittany Lions after spending the 2021 season as Boise State's special teams coordinator and edge coach.
- During the 2021 campaign, Collins' special teams unit blocked three punts, which tied for seventh in the nation, and four kicks overall to rank ninth in FBS. Of the three blocked punts, two were returned for touchdowns.
- Since 2019, Penn State's kick return defense ranks second in the nation in touchback percentage (78.1; 1st in B1G) and percentage of kickoffs returned (14.3; 1st), third in average kick return yards allowed (16.9; 1st) and percentage of kickoffs returned inside the 25 (81.3; 1st), and tied eighth in average opponent field position (25.1; 3rd).
- Also since 2019, Penn State's punt return defense is ranked fourth in net punting (41.7; 2nd in B1G), sixth in punts inside the 20 (46.3 percent; 2nd) and fourth in punts inside the 10 (19.8 percent; 2nd).
- Senior **K Jake Pinegar** ranks second all-time at Penn State with 153 career extra points and sits ninth in career extra point percentage (96.2).
- Pinegar is seventh all-time at Penn State with a 72.7 field goal percentage. He's also 10th in field goal attempts (55) and tied sixth in field goals made (40). The Iowa native is also fifth on the all-time scoring list with 273 career points.
- Pinegar's 40 career field goals rank 20th among current FBS kickers.
- Pinegar converted all five extra points at Purdue and hit five extra points, and a 25-yard field goal, vs. Ohio.
- Pinegar hit field goals of 48 and 22 yards against Auburn as well as all five extra point attempts.
- Senior SN **Chris Stoll** is in his fourth season as Penn State's primary long snapper. He's appeared in 37 career games.
- The captain is a member of the Patrick Mannelly Award watch list. He is on the Allstate AFCA Good Works Team watch list.
- Redshirt senior **P Barney Amor** ranks 11th in the FBS and second in the Big Ten with a 46.5 punt average.
- Amor has landed seven punts inside the 20 and six punts of 50+ yards.
- Amor set a career high with eight punt attempts at Purdue, including a 52-yard punt and landed three punts inside the 20, including two inside the 10.
- Against Ohio, Amor landed two punts inside the 20 and hit two punts of 50+ yards to earn Ray Guy Great 8 honors.
- At Auburn, Amor placed two punts inside the 20.
- The redshirt senior is a member of the Ray Guy Award watch list.
- Amor was awarded a scholarship during preseason camp.
- **S Jonathan Sutherland** is wearing No. 0 for the third-straight season as the team's special teams leader as part of a new tradition that began in 2020.
- KR **Nicholas Singleton** averaged 21.3 yards per return at Purdue, including a 25-yard return in the third quarter.
- Singleton had two 20-yard kick returns vs. Ohio and a 30-yard return at Auburn.
- Singleton ranks third in the Big Ten with a 22.3 kick return average.

GAME RECAP

WEST LAFAYETTE, Ind. - Sean Clifford connected with Keyvone Lee for a 10-yard touchdown to give the Penn State football team the lead with 57 seconds remaining as the Nittany Lions earned a 35-31 win over Purdue at Ross-Ade Stadium to begin the 2022 season.

Clifford completed 20-of-37 passes for 282 yards and a career-high-tying four passing touchdowns, while adding a 2-yard rushing score. Mitchell Tinsley caught seven passes for 84 yards and a touchdown in his Penn State debut, while KeAndre Lambert-Smith had four receptions for 58 yards and a touchdown. Brenton Strange added a 67-yard touchdown reception.

Joey Porter Jr. led the Nittany Lions with eight tackles to go with six pass breakups and a fumble recovery. Johnny Dixon and Jonathan Sutherland each had a sack, while Dixon broke up two passes. Keaton Ellis broke up four passes and Zakee Wheatley forced a fumble.

HOW IT HAPPENED

The Boilermakers got on the board first, finishing a 73-yard drive with a 36-yard field goal by Mitchell Fineran with 3:38 left in the first quarter.

Penn State answered with a 12-yard touchdown pass from Clifford to Tinsley with 13:09 left in the second quarter. The Nittany Lions finished a 12-play, 79-yard drive as Clifford found a wide-open Tinsley on a crossing route. The drive was sparked by a 20-yard reception by Parker Washington and a 12-yard catch by Devyn Ford. Penn State took a 7-3 lead.

Purdue responded with a touchdown drive, concluding with a 3-yard run by King Doerue. The Boilermakers' 75-yard drive was aided by a pair of penalties. Purdue led 10-7 with 9:43 left in the second quarter.

Penn State re-took the lead on a 2-yard touchdown rush by Clifford with 1:44 left in the first half. The eight-play, 43-yard drive including four runs by Nicholas Singleton and a 10-yard catch by Strange.

The Nittany Lions forced a turnover in Purdue territory with 30 seconds left in the half. On a reverse play, Wheatley knocked the ball loose and Porter Jr. recovered the ball at the Penn State 18.

Penn State took advantage of the turnover with a 67-yard touchdown reception by Strange. The redshirt junior caught the ball along the sideline and fought off multiple Boilermakers to break loose for the score and his longest career reception. Penn State held a 21-10 lead at the break.

Purdue scored on a 2-yard run by Doerue on the opening drive of the second half. A 75-yard drive included a 22-yard pass from Aidan O'Connell to Charlie Jones.

The Boilermakers took the lead on a 7-yard touchdown pass from O'Connell to Jones late in the third quarter. Purdue engineered a 10-play, 81-yard drive, which included a 26-yard reception by Mershawn Rice and a 23-yard catch by Payne Durham. Purdue led 24-21 with 1:11 left in the third quarter.

The Nittany Lions answered with a 29-yard touchdown reception by Lambert-Smith in the fourth quarter. After forcing a three-and-out, Penn State started the drive at their own 45 yard-line. Clifford hit Mitchell Tinsley for a 17-yard reception and Kaytron Allen for a nine-yard pass. Clifford connected with Lambert-Smith on a slant and the sophomore spun out of a tackle and took it to the end zone. Penn State held a 28-24 lead with 10:44 remaining.

Purdue re-took the lead on a 72-yard pick-six by Chris Jefferson to hold a 31-28 advantage with 8:29 to go.

After a key third-down pass breakup by Hardy to force a Purdue punt, the Nittany Lions took over on their own 20 yard-line with 2:22 remaining.

The drive began with an 8-yard completion to Tinsley and a 7-yard reception by Lambert-Smith. Two plays later, Clifford connected with Tinsley towards the sideline for a 27-yard catch-and-run to the Purdue 30. On second-and-five at the Purdue 25, Clifford hit Tyler Warren for a 15-yard gain to the Purdue 10. On the next play, Clifford rolled out to his right and lofted a pass to Lee, who took it into the end-zone for the go-ahead score. Penn State took a 35-31 lead with 57 seconds remaining.

- The Nittany Lions are now 112-22-2 all-time in season openers.
- The Blue and White has won 18 of its last 21 season openers and six of its last seven.

GAME RECAP

UNIVERSITY PARK, Pa. – The Penn State Football team defeated Ohio, 46-10, in its 2022 home opener at Beaver Stadium.

Freshman Nicholas Singleton had a breakout-performance with 10 carries for 179 yards, including 70 and 44-yard touchdowns and a 48-yard run. Singleton's first career touchdown was Penn State's longest run since Journey Brown's 85-yard run versus Pitt in 2019. His 179 yards are a school record for a Beaver Stadium debut.

Singleton became the first Nittany Lion with multiple 40+ yard touchdown runs in a game since Larry Johnson at Indiana on Nov. 16, 2002 (touchdown runs of 41, 43 and 69 yards). He is the first Nittany Lion with three 40+ yard runs in a game since Johnson's performance against Indiana (runs of 41, 41, 43 and 69).

Penn State produced 572 total yards, with 234 on the ground and 338 in the air. Sean Clifford was 19-for-27 passing for 213 yards and a touchdown along with a 1-yard touchdown run. Seventeen Nittany Lions registered at least one catch, led by Parker Washington with four for 60 yards.

The Nittany Lions limited the Bobcats to just 264 yards, 16 first downs and just two plays over 20 yards. Tyler Elson had a team-high six tackles and Dominic DeLuca collected a team-high five solo tackles.

HOW IT HAPPENED

The Nittany Lions got on the board first as a 12-play, 77-yard drive finished with a 1-yard touchdown rush by Clifford. The redshirt senior completed all six passes attempted on the drive, tallying 62 yards. The drive included a 38-yard reception by Washington and a 15-yard grab by Tyler Warren. Clifford had a 15-yard run to setup his touchdown rush. Penn State led 7-0 with 6:45 remaining in the first quarter.

Penn State needed just one play to score on its next drive as Singleton ran 70 yards for his first career touchdown, which doubled the Nittany Lions' lead with 2:28 left in the opening quarter.

Unable to score on a third-straight possession, Penn State responded with a safety on Ohio's first play of its drive. Pinned at the 1-yard line after a 45-yard punt by Barney Amor, the Bobcats botched a handoff in the endzone and were able to jump on the ball before a Nittany Lion defender could.

Penn State added a field goal with 5:14 remaining in the second quarter on Jake Pinegar's 25-yard kick.

Ohio got on the board in its final possession of the first half. The Bobcats turned in an eight-play, 75-yard drive capitalized by a one-yard rushing touchdown by Sieh Bangura.

Starting at its own 22-yard line with 1:29 left in the first half, Penn State effectively ran its two-minute offense for a 7-yard touchdown throw from Clifford to Mitchell Tinsley with 15 seconds left. Clifford made eight completions for all 78 yards gained on the drive, including a 34-yard catch by Washington that preceded Tinsley's touchdown.

The Nittany Lions recorded the first score of the second half with a 32-yard pass from Drew Allar to Omari Evans for both of their first collegiate touchdowns with 9:25 left in the third quarter. Starting from their 30-yard line, the five-play drive took only two minutes and eight seconds, which was aided by a 7-yard catch by Washington and 15-yard roughing the passer penalty added to it.

Singleton's second touchdown, of 44 yards, made it 40-7 with 4:33 left in the third quarter. All three plays in the 52-yard drive were Singleton rushes.

Penn State's final touchdown was Allar's second touchdown, a 28-yard pass to Khalil Dinkins for his first career touchdown, a minute and 16 seconds into the fourth quarter. The Nittany Lions orchestrated a 55-yard drive on nine plays, and the freshman quarterback accounted for all but one yard with four rushes for 17 yards and three completions for 37 yards.

Ohio notched a 21-yard field goal to complete a 15-play, 76-yard drive with 6:50 left in the game.

- Penn State is now 6-1 all-time against Ohio, with all six meetings at home.
- The Nittany Lions are now 121-13-1 all-time in home openers.
- Penn State has won 19 of its last 21 home openers.
- Nittany Lion freshmen (true and redshirt) combined for 423 of the team's 572 yards (74 percent).
- In the first half, Sean Clifford completed passes to 10 different receivers. Penn State last had 10 receivers catch a pass in a half at Maryland in 2019 (first half).

- With his 1-yard touchdown rush in the first quarter, Clifford moved into sole possession of fifth all-time at Penn State for rushing touchdowns by a quarterback with 12, passing Zack Mills (2001-04).
- Allar found Omari Evans on a 32-yard touchdown strike in the third quarter, his first career touchdown pass.
- Singleton's first Nittany Lion with multiple 40+ yard touchdowns in a game since Larry Johnson at Indiana on Nov. 16, 2002 (touchdown runs of 41, 43 and 69 yards).
- Singleton is the first Nittany Lion with three 40+ yard runs in a game since Johnson's performance against Indiana (runs of 41, 41, 43 and 69).

GAME RECAP

AUBURN, Ala. — The No. 22/23 Penn State football team exploded in the second half to earn a 41-12 win over Auburn on Saturday in Jordan-Hare Stadium. The Nittany Lions scored 17 unanswered points in the third quarter and outscored the Tigers, 27-6, in the second half.

A balanced Penn State offense earned 477 total yards, including 245 on the ground and 232 through the air. Freshman Nicholas Singleton went over the 100-yard rushing mark for the second-straight game, tallying 124 yards and two touchdowns on 10 carries. Singleton had a 54-yard touchdown run and another 53-yard run. Fellow freshman Kaytron Allen added 52 yards and two touchdowns on the ground. Sean Clifford completed 14-of-19 passes for 178 yards and had a 7-yard touchdown run to go with a 25-yard reception.

The Penn State defense forced four takeaways, including two fumbles and two interceptions. The Nittany Lions recorded 11 tackles for loss and six sacks. Abdul Carter led Penn State with six tackles, including a sack, and a forced fumble. Ji'Ayir Brown added five tackles, a sack, a forced fumble and an interception. Adisa Isaac tallied three tackles for loss and a sack, while Chop Robinson registered a sack, a forced fumble and a fumble recovery. Zakee Wheatley made his first career interception.

Auburn threw for 296 yards. TJ Finley passed for 152 yards, while Robby Ashford had 144 yards and a touchdown. Jarquez Hunter had a 22-yard touchdown reception. Owen Pappoe led the Tigers with six tackles and a forced fumble.

HOW IT HAPPENED

Auburn got on the board with a 31-yard field goal by Anders Carlson. The Tigers led 3-0 with 8:20 to go in the opening quarter.

The Nittany Lions responded with a 9-play, 75-yard drive that ended with a 7-yard touchdown rush by Clifford. Allen had a 16-yard carry, while Mitchell Tinsley came up with two key catches on the drive, including a 34-yard reception, to setup the Nittany Lions at the 7-yard line. Penn State led 7-3 with 4:21 remaining in the first quarter.

Wheatley came up with a key interception to end a potential Auburn scoring drive in the first quarter. On 3rd-and-6 at the Penn State 28-yard line, Finley was flushed out of the pocket and fired a throw that was caught by a diving Wheatley.

Auburn cut its deficit to one with a field goal in the second quarter. A 12-play, 67-yard drive ended with a 22-yard kick by Carlson. The Nittany Lions held a 7-6 advantage with 6:59 left in the second quarter.

The Nittany Lions extended their lead on a 3-yard touchdown rush by Allen in the second quarter. The drive was highlighted by a 25-yard pass from KeAndre Lambert-Smith to Clifford to setup Penn State inside the Auburn 10. Penn State led 14-6 with 1:46 remaining in the first half.

Another key takeaway led to a Penn State field goal in the third quarter. After a strip-sack by Brown, and a fumble recovery by Robinson, Penn State took over at the Auburn 30-yard line. Jake Pinegar converted a 48-yard kick.

Penn State took advantage of an interception by Brown to add another score late in the third quarter. A 27-yard return by Brown, and an Auburn penalty, set up Penn State at the Auburn 48-yard line. Parker Washington hauled in 26- and 17-yard passes from Clifford to setup a 6-yard touchdown run by Allen.

Auburn responded with a 22-yard touchdown reception by Hunter, from Ashford, to finish a 6-play, 65-yard drive. Auburn's two-point conversion attempt was no good.

Penn State answered with a 54-yard touchdown run by Singleton. The Nittany Lions tallied the final score of the day, a 22-yard field goal by Pinegar.

Notes

- The Nittany Lions are 25-24 all-time against current members of the SEC.
- Penn State earned the Big Ten's first sweep of a home-and-home series against an SEC opponent since Northwestern in 2010 and 2012 against Vanderbilt.
- The Nittany Lions earned the Big Ten's first road win against an SEC opponent since Purdue's 35-3 win at Missouri in 2017.
- The Nittany Lions' 29-point win is the second-largest margin of victory for a Big Ten team in a road game against an SEC opponent, behind only Purdue's win over Missouri.
- Penn State's 29-point margin was the Big Ten's sixth win over an SEC team by 29 or more points and the third in a regular season game. Penn State also had a 29-point win (43-14) over Auburn in the 1996 Outback Bowl.
- It marked Auburn's largest margin of defeat in a non-conference home game since 1982 (41-7 loss to Nebraska).
- Penn State finished with 245 yards rushing. Since 2014, the Nittany Lions have gone over 200 rushing yards 35 times (30-5 in those games).
- Penn State had five rushing touchdowns in a game for the first time since the 2019 Cotton Bowl vs. Memphis.
- The Nittany Lions had two freshmen running backs (Kaytron Allen and Nicholas Singleton) each score two touchdowns. Since at least 2000, they are the only Penn State freshmen to both score two rushing touchdowns in a game.
- WR KeAndre Lambert-Smith completed a 25-yard pass to QB Sean Clifford in the second quarter.
- With runs of 54 and 53 yards, RB Nicholas Singleton now has five runs of 40+ yards this season and three over 50 yards. He leads the country in 40+ yard runs this season.
- Through three games this season, Singleton has 334 rushing yards. Since 2000, only Larry Johnson (362, 2002) has more rushing yards through the first three games of a season.
- Since 2000, Singleton has the most rushing yards by a Penn State freshman through the first three games of a season.

- DE Adisa Isaac recorded a career-high three tackles for loss, including a sack early in the third quarter.
- S Zakee Wheatley recorded his first career interception in the first quarter.
- Pinegar accounted for 11 points on the day. He now has 273 career points, moving into fifth all-time at Penn State. He moved past Sam Ficken (271; 2011-14).
