INSIDE THE GAME

PENN STATE HOSTS OHIO FOR HOME OPENER

- OPENING KICK: Penn State hosts Ohio in Beaver Stadium on Saturday for its home opener. Kickoff is set for noon on ABC. The 2022 Penn State football season is presented by PSECU.
- **RETURN OF THE MAC:** The Nittany Lions will open non-conference play with the Bobcats, the sixth matchup between the schools. Penn State is very familiar with Mid-American Conference teams, having played a MAC team in 19 of the last 20 seasons with the only exception being a Big Ten-only schedule in 2020. Penn State is 28-3 all-time against current members of the MAC and hosts Central Michigan on September 24.
- HOME SWEET HOME: Penn State begins its 63rd season in Beaver Stadium. The Nittany Lions are 120-13-1 all-time in home openers. The Blue and White owns a 52-10 record in Beaver Stadium home openers. Penn State has won 18 of its last 20 home openers.
- **SERIES HISTORY:** The Nittany Lions hold a 5-1 series lead against Ohio. This is the first meeting between the teams since 2012, when Penn State fell 24-14. All six games in the series have been played in Happy Valley. Ohio is tied with Akron as Penn State's most-played MAC opponents.
- FIVE-TOUCHDOWN DAY: Sean Clifford tied a career high with four passing touchdowns against Purdue, connecting with Mitchell Tinsley (12 yards) and Brenton Strange (67 yards) in the second quarter and KeAndre Lambert-Smith (29 yards) and Keyvone Lee (10 yards) in the fourth quarter. Clifford added a 2-yard rushing touchdown in the second quarter.
- SWATTED AWAY: Penn State recorded a school-record 16 pass breakups at Purdue. The 16 breakups are tied for the most in the FBS in a game since Tulane had 20 against East Carolina in 2018. Joey Porter Jr. notched six pass breakups, setting a school record and tying a Big Ten record.
- **THE OPPOSITION:** Ohio started the 2022 campaign with a 41-38 win over Florida Atlantic on Saturday. The Bobcats held off a late rally by the Owls. Kurtis Rourke completed 27-of-34 passes for 345 yards and four touchdowns, while rushing for another score. James Bostic hauled in six receptions for 136 yards and a touchdown. Sieh Bangura rushed for 114 yards on 23 carries. Safety Ben Johnson led Ohio with 15 tackles. Rodney Mathews had a strip to force a fumble in the fourth quarter.

HEAD COACH JAMES FRANKLIN

CAREER AT A GLANCE

- Franklin was named the 16th head football coach in the storied history of the Nittany Lion program on January 11, 2014.
- Franklin is one of six current FBS head coaches to lead his teams to a bowl game in each of his first nine seasons as a head coach and one of nine to do so in 10 of their first 11 seasons.
- Franklin is one of four current Big Ten coaches (Ryan Day, Kirk Ferentz, Jim Harbaugh) to have won a Big Ten Championship and became the first African American head coach to win a Big Ten title after Penn State's 2016 victory.
- He owns a 92-49 career record with a winning record in nine of 11 seasons at the helm.
- Franklin has led his teams to three Top 10 finishes (3 at Penn State) and six Top 25 finishes (2 at Vanderbilt; 4 at Penn State).
- In the last six seasons under Franklin, Penn State is one of six teams to rank in the top 12 of the CFP final rankings at least four times, joining Ohio State, Alabama, Georgia, Clemson and Oklahoma.
- From 2016-19, Franklin led the Nittany Lions to three New Year's Six bowls 2016 (Rose), 2017 (Fiesta) and 2019 (Cotton), making Penn State one of eight teams to accomplish the feat during the four-year span. Penn State last went to three New Year's Six bowls in four years in 1980-83 (1980 Fiesta, 1982 Fiesta, 1983 Sugar).
- Franklin guided Penn State to back-to-back New Year's Six bowls in 2016 (Rose) and 2017 (Fiesta) for the first time since 1985 (Orange) and 1986 (Fiesta).
- From 2016-19, Franklin led Penn State to 42 wins, the most in program history for the Big Ten era, and 28 league wins, a program record.
- Franklin has 27 years of coaching experience at the collegiate and NFL level.
- In his first 11 years as a head coach, Franklin mentored 90 players who have gone on to the NFL ranks.
- · Franklin is second all-time in winning percentage by an FBS African American head coach (minimum 80 wins) and is third in total wins.

NITTANY LIONS ON THE FIELD

- The Nittany Lions earned a New Year's Day bowl berth against Arkansas in the Outback Bowl in **2021**. With wins over No. 12/15 Wisconsin and No. 22/20 Auburn, Penn State tallied two wins over ranked teams within the first three games of the season for the first time in program history. The Nittany Lion defense allowed just 17.3 points per game in 2021, good for sixth in the country.
- In 2020, with the emergence of young skill players on offense, true freshmen accounted for 1,486 of Penn State's 3,873 total yards (38 percent), marking a school record for most combined scrimmage yards by true freshmen in a single season.
- Penn State earned its third 11-win season in four years with an 11-2 record in 2019, including a win over No. 17 Memphis in the Goodyear
 Cotton Bowl Classic. The Nittany Lions posted their fourth-straight top 12 finish in the final CFP rankings, coming in 10th, and were ranked
 ninth in the final Associated Press and Amway Coaches polls to earn their 25th AP Top 10 finish. Franklin was a finalist for the Paul "Bear"
 Bryant National Coach of the Year award for the second time at Penn State (2016) and third time in his head coaching career.
- In 2018, the Nittany Lions posted their third-straight season with at least nine wins with a 9-4 overall record, earning a berth in the VRBO
 Citrus Bowl. Penn State finished No. 12 in the final CFP rankings and No. 17 in the Associated Press and Amway Coaches polls.
- Penn State climbed as high as No. 2 in the rankings in 2017 and appeared in a second-straight New Year's Six bowl, earning a 35-28 win
 over No. 11 Washington in the PlayStation Fiesta Bowl. At 11-2, the Nittany Lions earned back-to-back 11-win seasons for the fifth time in
 program history and first time since 2008 and 2009. Penn State finished the season No. 8 in the Associated Press and Amway Coaches polls
 and No. 9 in the final CFP rankings.
- Penn State surged in 2016, winning nine consecutive games en route to the Big Ten Championship, a Rose Bowl berth and an 11-3 overall record. Penn State finished the season ranked No. 5 in the College Football Playoff rankings and No. 7 in the Associated Press and Amway Coaches polls. It was Penn State's highest finish in the polls since 2005. The Lions claimed their fourth overall Big Ten Championship and first outright title since 1994 with a thrilling, 38-31 comeback win over Wisconsin in the Big Ten Championship Game. Franklin was honored as Sporting News National Coach of the Year and the Woody Hayes National Coach of the Year, as well as the Dave McLain Big Ten Coach of the Year and Associated Press Big Ten Coach of the Year.
- Franklin guided the Nittany Lions to a 7-6 record in 2015 and a berth in the TaxSlayer Bowl.
- Franklin's first season in **2014** was bookended with a pair of thrilling victories for the Nittany Lions. It began with a final-play 26-24 victory over UCF in Dublin, Ireland, in Penn State's first-ever international game and ended with a comeback, a 31-30 overtime win over Boston College in the New Era Pinstripe Bowl in Yankee Stadium. Franklin became just the third Penn State coach to lead the team to at least seven wins in his first season, joining Dick Harlow (1915) and Bill O'Brien (2012), and he guided the Nittany Lions to a 4-0 start, joining Harlow as the only first-year Penn State coaches to win their initial four games.

NITTANY LIONS IN THE CLASSROOM

- The Nittany Lions posted their first 1,000 single-year APR in program history in 2018-19, topping the previous high of 993 in 2014-15.
- Sean Clifford (2021) and Trace McSorley (2018) were selected as a National Football Foundation (NFF) Scholar-Athletes and finalists for the Campbell Trophy, known as the "Academic Heisman." They are the 18th and 19th Nittany Lions to be selected as an NFF Scholar-Athlete.
- In 2019, punter Blake Gillikin took home CoSIDA Academic All-America® first-team honors for the second-straight year to become the 12th two-time first-team selection in Penn State history. He graduated with a perfect 4.0 grade-point average in May.
- Gillikin's two first-team CoSIDA Academic All-America honors increase Penn State football's total to 67 honorees, which ranks second in Division I football history (FBS and FCS).
- Tyler Yazujian collected a berth on the CoSIDA Academic All-America® first team in 2016 after an appearance on the second team in 2015.
- A program-record 10 Nittany Lions were named 2020-21 Big Ten Distinguished Scholars, besting the previous mark of nine set a year earlier.

NITTANY LIONS IN THE COMMUNITY

- The Nittany Lions are active in the community, participating in activities such as Uplifting Athletes, THON, Pennsylvania Special Olympics Summer Games, State College Area Food Bank and Penn State Hershey Children's Hospital visits.
- On June 15, 2020, Franklin was named to the Big Ten Anti-Hate and Anti-Racism Coalition.
- As part of the Cotton Bowl festivities in 2019, Franklin and his family made a \$10,000 financial commitment to the Dallas Children's Hospital.
- In August 2019, Franklin was named a Penn State University Renaissance Fund honoree, which awards outstanding community members for helping students in need.

LAST MEETING PENN STATE FALLS TO OHIO, 24-14, IN SEASON OPENER

The Penn State football team fell to Ohio, 24-14, in the season opener for both teams in front of 97,186 fans at Beaver Stadium. The Nittany Lions controlled the game early, taking a 14-3 halftime lead, but the Bobcats scored 21 unanswered points with touchdowns on three of their five second-half possessions.

Quarterback Matt McGloin recorded his eighth career 200-yard passing game, completing 27-of-48 passes for 260 yards and a pair of touchdowns.

Allen Robinson, one of seven Nittany Lions with at least one catch, recorded nine receptions for 97 yards. Bill Belton, who rushed for 53 yards on 13 carries, and Matt Lehman each collected one touchdown reception.

On defense, Adrian Amos collected a career-best 10 tackles. Gerald Hodges recorded 11 stops for his fifth career game with at least 10 tackles, while Michael Mauti led all players with 12 tackles for his fourth career game registering doubledigit stops.

Ohio quarterback Tyler Tettleton completed 31-of-41 passes for 324 yards and two touchdowns

With three seconds left in the first quarter, Belton recorded his first career touchdown. McGloin orchestrated the 10-play, 80-yard drive, marching the Nittany Lions down the field before connecting with the running back for the 6-yard catch

In the second quarter, after recovering a muffed punt at Penn State's 13-yard line, the Bobcats' Matt Weller connected on a 22-yard field goal.

The Nittany Lions extended their lead to 14-3 with 1:29 left in the half. After Nyeem Wartman blocked Ohio's punt deep in its own territory, Penn State started its drive at the opposition's 18-yard line. Three plays later, McGloin threw a 14-yard touchdown pass to Lehman.

With 10:40 left in the third quarter, the Bobcats made it 14-10 after Landon Smith's 43-yard touchdown reception. Ohio took its first lead of the game at 17-14 on a 1-yard run by Tettleton.

The Bobcats extended their lead to 24-14 with 2:55 left in the game. Tettleton capped off a 14-play, 93-yard drive with a 5-yard touchdown completion to Donte

OVERTIME OVER TIME

- College football introduced overtime during the bowl season in 1995 and adopted it for regular season games in 1996. Since then, Penn State has played 15 overtime games, including six over the 2012-14 seasons.
- Ten of the 15 overtime tilts have come at home, three in true road games, one in the 2006 Orange Bowl and one in the 2014 Pinstripe Bowl.
- Penn State is 8-7 all-time in overtime games, with a 5-5 record at Beaver Stadium, 1-2 mark in true road games and 2-0 in contests at a neutral site.

 Penn State's first two overtime contests came vs. lowa in 2000 and 2002 at home. The Nittany Lions dropped their first three contests that went to the extra period, but won five straight overtime contests before falling to Nebraska on Nov. 23, 2013.

ON TV

- Penn State has had 335 of its last 337 games televised, including 235 consecutive games.
- Over the last 15 seasons, every Penn State game has aired on either ABC, BTN, NBC or an ESPN or FOX channel.
- Penn State has made 314 regular season TV appearances since 1995, which is tied for the national lead.
- The Penn State-Purdue matchup drew 3.512 million viewers on Thursday, the day's most-watched sports event.

RETURNING LETTERWINNERS/ STARTERS

- · Penn State returns 33 lettermen from last year's squad 14 on offense, 18 on defense and one on special teams.
- A total of 37 lettermen are returning for the Nittany Lions. In addition to the 33 lettermen returning from 2021, Hakeem Beamon, Adisa Isaac, Jake Pinegar and Marquis Wilson also have letterman status.
- · The Nittany Lions lost the services of 22 lettermen 12 on offense, nine on defense and one specialist.
- Penn State returns 12 starters six on offense, five on defense and one on special teams.
- Twelve additional Penn Staters have starting experience four on offense, seven on defense and one specialist.
- Among returners is 2021 All-Big Ten second team honoree PJ Mustipher, third team honorees Ji'Ayir Brown and Joey Porter Jr., and honorable mention selections Sean Clifford, Curtis Jacobs, Juice Scruggs and Brenton Strange.

DEGREES ON THE WALL

- Entering the 2022 season, 10 players have earned a combined 12 degrees
- The Nittany Lion's nine Penn State graduates on the roster are: Barney Amor (master's in management & organizational leadership), Sean Clifford (advertising/public relations), Charlie Katshir (hospitality management), Grayson Kline (criminology), PJ Mustipher (journalism), Jake Pinegar (health policy & administration), Chris Stoll (kinesiology), Jonathan Sutherland (labor and employment relations) and Nick Tarburton (labor and human resources).
- Hunter Nourzad earned his bachelor's degree in engineering from Cornell, while Amor earned bachelor's degrees in sociology and education at Colgate.
- Clifford (journalism), Mustipher (telecommunications), Pinegar (media studies) and Stoll (health policy & administration) are pursuing second undergraduate degrees.
- · Amor (supply chain management; second master's), Nourzad (management & organizational leadership), Sutherland (educational leadership) and Tarburton (organizational development) are pursuing master's degrees.

ACADEMIC SUCCESS

- The Nittany Lions had 38 players selected as Academic All-Big Ten in Fall 2021.
- Sean Clifford was a 2021 National Football Foundation (NFF) Scholar-Athlete and finalist for the Campbell Trophy, known as the "Academic Heisman". He is the 19th Nittany Lion to be selected as an NFF Scholar-Athlete.
- Penn State posted its first 1,000 single-year APR in program history in 2018-19, topping the previous high of 993 in 2014-15.
- In 2019, punter Blake Gillikin took home CoSIDA Academic All-America® first-team honors for the second-straight year to become the 12th two-time first-team selection in Penn State history. He graduated with a perfect 4.0 grade-point average
- Gillikin's two first-team CoSIDA Academic All-America honors increase Penn State football's total to 67 honorees, which ranks second in Division I football history (FBS and FCS).

2022 CAPTAINS

- · Penn State football head coach James Franklin announced redshirt seniors QB Sean Clifford, S Jonathan Sutherland and LS Chris Stoll, seniors S Ji'Ayir Brown and DT PJ Mustipher and redshirt junior OL Juice Scruggs have been named team captains for the 2022 season.
- Clifford and Sutherland are captains for the fourth-straight season, the only four-time captains in program history.
- Mustipher is a captain for the second-consecutive season.

ARRINGTON A HALL OF FAMER

- · Penn State national award winner and first-team All-America linebacker LaVar Arrington has been elected to the College Football Hall of Fame as part of the 2022 class.
- Arrington will be inducted to the Hall of Fame December 6, 2022 at the 64th National Football Foundation (NFF) Annual Awards
- Arrington and the 21 inductees (18 players, 3 coaches) will also be recognized at their respective collegiate institutions with NFF Hall of Fame On-Campus Salutes, presented by Fidelity Investments, during the fall. Their accomplishments will be forever immortalized at the Chick-fil-A College Football Hall of Fame in Atlanta
- Arrington is the 26th member (20 players, 6 coaches) of the Penn State football family to be elected to the College Hall of Fame. Quarterback Kerry Collins was the most recent player inductee in 2018.

OFFENSIVE NOTES

- Since the start of the 2016 season, Penn State's offense is second in the Big Ten in touchdown percentage (31.4; 22nd nationally) and yards per play (6.02; 34th) and is third in points per possession (2.14; 24th), scoring percentage (40.06; 24th), yards per pass attempt (7.91; 29th), scoring offense (32.9; 32nd) and total offense (414.7; 53rd).
- Penn State's offense has been explosive since the 2016 campaign, as it leads the Big Ten in 80-plus play percentage (0.21; 2nd nationally) and 70-plus (0.39; 10th), ranks second in 20-plus (7.80; 15th) and 40-plus (2.05; 15th), and holds third in 30-plus (3.58; 22nd), 50-plus (0.99; 34th) and 60-plus (0.56; 26th).
- The Nittany Lions have tallied at least 55 plays of 20 or more yards in six of the last seven seasons (57 in 2021; 63 in 2019; 73 in 2018; 85 in 2017; 91 in 2016; 67 in 2015).
- Penn State had 52 plays of 20 or more yards in 2020 (nine-game schedule)
- Additionally, the Nittany Lions are third in the Big Ten and 14th nationally in 15-plus yard passing play percentage since 2016 (19.62 percent).
- Penn State has gained 200 or more rushing yards 33 times in the **James Franklin** era. Penn State is 28-5 in those games.
- Penn State posted 406 total yards, including 308 through the air, against Purdue.
- Mike Yurcich enters his second season as Penn State's offensive coordinator/quarterbacks coach.
- Yurcich (California University (Pa.)) and Franklin (East Stroudsburg) both played in the Pennsylvania State Athletic Conference (PSAC).
- As an FBS offensive coordinator, offenses under Yurcich have averaged 6.35 yards per play, ranking first among OC's since 2013 and 13.79 yards per completion, which is also first in that time frame.
- Since 2013, Yurcich's offenses have scored 50 or more points 26 times and 40 or more points 52 times (44.8 percent of games coached), both of which are tops among FBS offensive coordinators since 2013.
- His teams have averaged 53.3 touchdowns per year.
- Penn State has scored 40 points 21 times since 2016. By comparison, from 2008 until 2015, the Nittany Lions had 18 40-point outings.

QUARTERBACK NOTES

- Offensive coordinator Mike Yurcich also heads the Penn State quarterback room.
- Three quarterbacks Yurcich coached in college are currently on NFL rosters (Sam Ehlinger – Texas, Justin Fields – Ohio State, Mason Rudolph – Oklahoma State).
- Yurcich served as the passing game coordinator and quarterbacks coach at Ohio State in 2019, where quarterback Justin Fields was a finalist for the Heisman Trophy, Walter Camp Player of the Year Award and Davey O'Brien Award.
- Redshirt senior Sean Clifford is in his fourth season as Penn State's starting signal caller, having played in 39 career games, making 34 starts.
- Clifford joins Jonathan Sutherland as the only four-time team captains in program history.
- Against Purdue, Clifford joined Zack Mills (2001-04) and Tony Sacca (1988-92) as the only quarterbacks to start a game in four different seasons at Penn State.
- The Cincinnati native began the season on the Davey O'Brien Award, Manning Award, Maxwell Award, Johnny Unitas Golden Arm Award, Walter Camp Player of the Year Award and Wuerffel Trophy watch lists. Clifford is also on the Reese's Senior Bowl watch list.
- Clifford earned Big Ten Co-Offensive Player of the Week following his performance at Purdue.
- Clifford tallied 282 passing yards and tied a career high with four touchdown passes against Purdue. He also rushed for a 2-yard touchdown. The redshirt senior threw for two touchdowns in the second guarter and two in the fourth quarter.
- Clifford has tossed multiple touchdowns in a half on 18 occasions and 11 different times has thrown multiple touchdowns in a quarter.
- The Ohio native tallied his 27th career game with multiple TD passes, including 13 with three or more TDs, the most by a PSU quarterback since 2000, and four games with four touchdowns.
- At Purdue, Clifford became the third Penn State quarterback to surpass the 8,000-career passing yard mark, joining Trace McSorley (9,899; 2015-18) and Christian Hackenberg (8,457; 2013-15). Clifford now has 8,121 career passing yards.
- Against Purdue, Clifford also topped the 9,000-career total yards mark. He now has 9,020 total yards.
- Clifford is just one of three Penn State players all-time to reach 9,000-plus yards of total offense and one of three quarterbacks to reach 8,000 career passing yards.
- Clifford is one of five current FBS quarterbacks and one of three Power Five conference quarterbacks with 8,100 passing yards and 890 rushing yards in his career.
- He ranks ninth among current FBS quarterbacks and fifth among Power Five conference quarterbacks with 8,121 career passing yards.
- The captain is one of seven current FBS quarterbacks with at least 8,100 passing yards and 60 passing touchdowns in his caper.
- Clifford is one of 10 current FBS quarterbacks with 625 career completions and ranks seventh among current FBS quarterbacks with a 60.2 completion percentage (min. 1,000 attempts).
- The redshirt senior currently sits as the all-time leader at Penn State in completion percentage (.602), while ranking second at PSU in passing touchdowns (66), third in passing yards (8,121), completions (627) and passing efficiency (141.7), fourth in attempts (1,042), tied seventh in yards per pass attempt (7.8) and wins as starting quarterback (22), eighth in lowest interception % (2.40) and touchdown pass % (6.33).
- He owns nine career games with at least 250 passing yards and three passing touchdowns and eight games with both a passing and rushing touchdown. He has tossed six career touchdowns of 70-plus yards and has completed 109 career passes of 20 or more yards.
- Clifford owns seven career 300-yard passing games and 20 career 200-yard games.
- Freshman Drew Allar made his collegiate debut at Purdue, completing two-of-four passes for 26 yards.
- Redshirt freshman **Christian Veilleux** made his collegiate debut against Rutgers in 2021.

Clifford is responsible for 77 touchdowns at Penn State (66 passing, 11 rushing). He sits second all-time.

RUNNING BACKS NOTES

- Co-offensive coordinator/running backs coach Ja'Juan Seider has 14 years of college coaching experience, including 11 at the Power Five level.
- Seider helped a young running backs group to rank fifth in the Big Ten in rushing in 2020.
- In 2019, Seider mentored Journey Brown, who had 11 rushes of 20 or more yards and posted a Cotton Bowl and Penn State bowl-record 202 rushing yards.
- In 2018, Penn State posted its highest rushing average (204.9) since 2008 (205.8), led by second-team All-Big Ten selection Miles Sanders
- As a player at Florida A&M, Seider won the Doug Williams Award for National Offensive Player of the Year, Jake Gaither Award (considered the Heisman Trophy of Historically Black Colleges) and earned All-America honors after throwing for 2,622 yards and 27 touchdowns and rushing for 740 yards and 14 touchdowns in 1999.
- Seider, who was the 1999 MEAC Offensive Player of the Year, was selected in the sixth round of the 2000 NFL Draft by the San Diego Chargers.
- Sophomore Keyvone Lee leads the group after rushing for 530 yards on 108 carries (4.9 average) a year ago.
- Lee has collected 998 career rushing yards (4.8 yards per carry) and six touchdowns. He also has 29 catches for 211 yards and a touchdown.
- Against Purdue, Lee caught the game-winning 10-yard touchdown reception with 57 seconds remaining.
- · It was his first career touchdown reception.
- Lee rushed for 30 yards and averaged 3.3 yards per carry.
- The sophomore is a member of the Doak Walker Award watch list
- Lee had a career-long 44-yard run against Indiana in 2021.
 He added a 21-yard run to lead Penn State with 74 yards on eight carries.
- Lee averaged 6.2 yards per carry against Maryland, rushing for 50 yards on eight carries, in 2021. He added two catches for 17 yards.
- Lee rushed for a season-high 88 yards on 20 carries vs. Michigan and 79 yards on 15 carries at Michigan State last season.
- Junior Devyn Ford has rushed for 629 career yards and six touchdowns, while adding 16 receptions and 88 receiving wards
- Ford rushed for 107 yards, including an 81-yard touchdown, in his Penn State debut vs. Idaho in 2019.
- Freshmen Kaytron Allen and Nicholas Singleton both made their collegiate debuts against Purdue, each rushing for 31 yards. Allen averaged 3.9 yards per carry, while Singleton had a 3.1 yards per carry average.
- Allen also had a 9-yard reception.

TIGHT ENDS NOTES

- Tight ends coach Ty Howle enters his second season coaching the Penn State tight ends and his third season overall on the staff
- Howle served as an offensive analyst in 2020, working closely with the offensive line and tight ends.
- Prior to returning to Happy Valley, Howle spent four seasons on the coaching staff at Western Illinois, serving as assistant head coach/co-offensive coordinator/offensive line coach in 2018-19.
- Howle was a four-year letterwinner on the Penn State offensive line from 2009-13. He started at center and left guard and was a four-time Academic All-Big Ten selection. He was a team captain in 2013.
- Howle played in 47 career games for the NIttany Lions, making 13 starts. He graduated in 2013 with a bachelor's degree in kinesiology.
- Since James Franklin took over the program in 2014, three PSU tight ends have been taken in the NFL Draft, tied for eighth in the nation during that span (Pat Freiermuth – 2021, 2nd round; Mike Gesicki – 2018, 2nd round; Jesse James – 2015, 5th round).
- Penn State had four tight ends on opening week NFL rosters in 2021 (Nick Bowers, Freiermuth, Gesicki and James), trailing only Stanford (5) among FBS programs.
- An experienced tight end group, which has combined for 61 career games and 27 starts, looks to continue a strong tight end tradition.
- Redshirt junior Brenton Strange leads the group and has appeared in 25 career games for the Nittany Lions, making 19 starts
- Late in the second quarter, Strange caught a pass along the sideline and fought off multiple Boilermakers for a 67-yard touchdown.
- It was Strange's longest career reception and seventh career touchdown grab.
- Strange (5), sophomore Theo Johnson (4) and sophomore Tyler Warren (2) combined for 11 20-plus yard receptions during the 2021 season.
- Johnson had a career-best 37-yard reception against Auburn in 2021.
- · Johnson and Strange are both on the Mackey Award watch list.
- In his first career start, Warren had three catches fore 23 yards at Purdue.
- The sophomore made a key 15-yard catch to setup the gamewinning touchdown in the fourth quarter.
- Warren scored a 3-yard run against Villanova and a 2-yard rushing touchdown against Auburn in 2021.
- He made a key 2-yard touchdown reception on fourth and goal against Michigan, his first career receiving score.

WINNINGEST PROGRAMS

In its 136th season of varsity football, Penn State has posted 910 victories to rank No. 7 in the nation. The Lions' success is not solely due to longevity though, as Penn State also ranks in the top 10 in all-time winning percentage.

WIDE RECEIVER NOTES

- Offensive recruiting coordinator/wide receivers coach Taylor Stubblefield is in his third season on the Penn State staff.
- As a player, Stubblefield caught 325 passes, which was an NCAA record at the completion of his career at Purdue.
- He still owns the Big Ten record for career receptions and ranks second in conference history with 3,629 yards.
- Stubblefield was a consensus All-American and a finalist for the Biletnikoff Award in 2004.
- Leading the wideout room is **Parker Washington**, who has caught a pass in all 23 games of his career.
- Washington had a 20-yard reception against Purdue, his 21st career reception of 20+ yards.
- The sophomore owns 102 career receptions, tied for 17th alltime at Penn State.
- The 100 receptions for Washington in the first two seasons of his career are second-most ever at Penn State for a player in their first two years, trailing only DaeSean Hamilton (127 combined in 2014 and 2015).
- Washington and transfer **Mitchell Tinsley** (137) both have over 100 career receptions. Penn State entered the season as one of nine FBS schools and one of four Power Five programs with multiple players over 100 career receptions.
- Washington has recorded 1,339 career receiving yards, good for 22nd in program history.
- With Tinsley (1,779) and Washington, Penn State began the year as one of 10 FBS teams, and one of five Power Five teams, with two players over 1,300 career receiving yards.
- Tinsley (19) and Washington (10) both have double-digit career receiving touchdowns. Penn State entered the season as one of seven FBS teams, and one of three Power Five teams, with multiple players collecting 10+ career receiving touchdowns.
- Tinsley and Washington are two of 30 FBS receivers entering the 2022 season with at least 100 receptions, 1,300 receiving yards and 10 receiving touchdowns in their career.
- Tinsley and Washington are both on the Biletnikoff Award watch list, while Washington is also on the Earl Campbell Tyler Rose Award watch list.
- KeAndre Lambert-Smith (521), Tinsley and Washington each recorded over 500 receiving yards last season. Penn State entered the season as one of nine FBS teams, and one of six Power Five teams, with three receivers on the roster who tallied 500+ receiving yards in 2021.
- During the 2021 campaign, Washington's 64 receptions on the year were good for sixth in a single season at Penn State, while his 820 receiving yards are good for 20th in a single season in school history.
- A third-team All-Big Ten honoree by Pro Football Focus and an Academic All-Big Ten honoree in 2021, Washington finished sixth in the Big Ten with the 64 catches and ninth with the 820 receiving yards.

- Washington's seven receptions in the 2022 Outback Bowl were tied for the third-most by a Penn State player in a bowl game.
- · Lambert-Smith returns for his third season in Happy Valley.
- Lambert-Smith, who has started 19 career games, made 34 receptions for 521 yards and five touchdowns with a long reception of 83 yards in 2021.
- The sophomore had four catches for 58 yards at Purdue, including a 29-yard touchdown reception in the fourth quarter.
- · Lambert-Smith has a reception in 17-straight games.
- The 83-yard reception resulted in a touchdown against Villanova (9/25), marking the seventh-longest pass play in program history.
- Eight of Lambert-Smith's 34 catches in 2021 were 20 or more yards and he finished sixth in the Big Ten in yards per reception (15.3).
- Sophomore Malick Meiga reached the end zone for the first time in his career, on a 67-yard strike from Christian Veilleux, in the third quarter against Rutgers in 2021.
- Penn State welcomed Tinsley as a transfer this past offseason.
 Tinsley spent the previous two seasons at Western Kentucky.
- Tinsley had a team-high seven catches for 84 yards at Purdue.
- The senior hauled in a 12-yard touchdown reception in the second quarter, his first reception and first touchdown as a Nittany Lion.
- He had a 27-yard reception on PSU's game-winning drive in the fourth quarter.
- Tinsley, a senior, has a reception in 27-straight games and at least seven receptions in each of his last six games.
- Among current FBS receivers, Tinsley ranks seventh in career receiving touchdowns (19), 15th in career receiving yards (1,863) and 25th in career receptions (137).
- Tinsley has 27 career receptions of 20 or more yards and six receptions of 40 or more yards.
- A second-team All-Conference USA selection in 2021, Tinsley finished second in the league in receiving yards (1,402, 8th nationally), receptions (87, 16th) and touchdown receptions (14,5th).
- He started all 14 games for the Hilltoppers and averaged 100.1 yards receiving per game and 16.1 yards per reception.
- During the 2020 season, he played in all 12 games, making nine starts, pacing the Hilltoppers in receptions (43), yards (377) and touchdowns (4).

- He was named to the American Football Coaches Association (AFCA) Class of 2021 "35 Under 35" list, recognizing the top-35 football coaches under the age of 35. He was the only Big Ten coach and the only offensive line coach on the 2021 list.
- In his two seasons at Penn State, Trautwein has helped seven Penn State offensive linemen to earn All-Big Ten honors.
- He's coached 17 All-Conference selections over the last four seasons, which includes a stint at Boston College as the offensive line coach.
- Trautwein was a two-time All-SEC selection and two-time team captain as a left tackle at Florida, earning first-team honors in 2008 and second-team accolades in 2006.
- He was part of the Gators winning the BCS National Championship and SEC titles in the 2006 and 2008 seasons.
- · Trautwein played four years in the NFL.
- Redshirt senior center Juice Scruggs leads the offensive line unit and began the season on the Rimington Trophy watch list.
- In 2021, he was named All-Big Ten honorable mention by the coaches and media, earned Pro Football Focus All-Big Ten third team honors, and was the team's Dick Maginnis Memorial Award, recognizing the most outstanding offensive lineman.
- Scruggs has made 14 career starts on the offensive line, including starting at center against Purdue.
- Redshirt junior tackle **Caedan Wallace** returns and has 21 starts at right tackle and owns 27 career appearances.
- Sophomore **Olumuyiwa Fashanu** has appeared in 10 games and made two starts at left tackle.
- In 49 pass protections against Purdue, Fashanu allowed zero pressures.
- Sophomore Nick Dawkins, redshirt senior Bryce Effner and redshirt freshman Landon Tengwall also saw playing time on the line in 2021.
- Redshirt junior **Sal Wormley** has appeared in four games and returns after missing the 2021 season due to injury.

2023 HALL OF FAME BALLOT

- Penn State lettermen Ki-Jana Carter, D.J. Dozier and Paul Posluszny have been selected as a part of the national ballot for the National Football Foundation's College Hall of Fame's Class of 2023. A total of 80 players and nine coaches from FBS are on the 2023 ballot.
- The trio of standouts have an opportunity to join 20 former Nittany Lion players and five Penn State coaches who have been inducted into the Hall.
- Also on the Hall of Fame ballot is former Nittany Lion studentathlete Glenn Killinger, who is among the candidates for the divisional coach Class of 2023. Killinger was inducted into the Hall of Fame as a player in 1966.
- Carter, a running back for the Nittany Lions, was a first-team All-American during the 1994 campaign. Carter staked a claim to being one of the most decorated Penn State running backs of all-time with a junior season in which he was fourth nationally in rushing (139.9), second in scoring (10.8 ppg) and fifth in allpurpose yardage (158.4). The Westerville, Ohio native led the Big Ten in all three categories. His 7.8 yards per carry was easily the best among the nation's Top 25 rushers. His 1994 statistics included 1,539 yards rushing, the then-No. 2 season total in Penn State history, and 23 touchdowns. Carter was runner-up for the Heisman Trophy and a finalist for the Maxwell Award. He was named co-MVP of the Rose Bowl with 156 rushing yards on 21 carries, including an 83-yard touchdown run on the Nittany Lions' first offensive play. When the Cincinnati Bengals selected Carter as the first overall player picked in the 1995 NFL Draft, he became the first Nittany Lion to be chosen No. 1.
- Dozier, a tailback for the Nittany Lions, matriculated to Happy Valley from Virginia Beach, Va. He earned first team All-America honors from the Walter Camp Football Foundation in 1986. Dozier is the only Nittany Lion to the lead the team in rushing four consecutive seasons, doing so from 1983-86. He ranks No. 5 on the school career rushing yardage list with 3,2227 yards, scoring 25 touchdowns and averaging 5.2 yards per attempt. Dozier gained 1,002 yards as a freshman and tallied 811 yards and 10 touchdowns as a senior and noe of the instrumental players on the Nittany Lions' 12-0 squad. Dozier was the Most Valuable Offensive Player of the Game after rushing for 99 yards and scoring the game-winning touchdown in the fourth quarter against Miami in the 1987 Fiesta Bowl to secure Penn State's second national championship.
- Posluszny, an outside linebacker for the Nittany Lions, was a first-team All-American in 2005 and 2006. Posluszny became just the second two-time winner of the Chuck Bednarik Award, presented to the nation's top defensive player, in 2006. In 2005, he also won the Butkus Award, presented to the nation's top linebacker and was a finalist for the 2006 honor. The 13th Nittany Lion to be named a two-time first-team All-American, Posluszny also was a two-time finalist for the Rotary Lombardi Award. The Nittany Lions' first two-time team captain since 1968-69, he became Penn State's career tackle leader with 372. A starter in the last 37 games of his career, Posluszny became the first Nittany Lion to lead the team in tackles three times and to post three 100-tackle seasons, recording 116 in 2006. Posluszny also was a two-time first-team ESPN the Magazine Academic All-American and was selected the 2006 Academic All-American of the Year among Division I football players.
- From Harrisburg, Killinger was a Walter Camp All-American at quarterback for the Nittany Lions in 1921. He coached at Dickinson (1922), Rensselaer (1927-32), Moravian (1933) and West Chester (1934-41, 45-59). Killinger is the winningest coach in West Chester history and is a member of the Pennsylvania Sports Hall of Fame. He died in 1988.
- Penn State has 26 players and coaches who are members of the College Football Hall of Fame. Six coaches and 20 players have earned their way into the hall of fame.
- LaVar Arrington will be inducted into the College Football Hall of Fame on December 6, 2022 at the 64th National Football Foundation (NFF) Annual Awards Dinner.

DEFENSIVE NOTES

- Manny Diaz was hired as Penn State's defensive coordinator and linebackers coach on Dec. 11, 2021.
- Diaz, who has 24 years of collegiate coaching experience, including three as a head coach and 13 as a defensive coordinator, joined the Nittany Lions after spending six seasons (2016-21) at the University of Miami, including three seasons as head coach (2019-21).
- Diaz coached the Hurricanes to three bowl appearances in his
 three seasons at the helm, which included an 8-3 record and
 7-2 mark in ACC play during the 2020 season. It marked the
 second time with Diaz on staff as well as the second time in
 program history Miami won seven ACC games.
- Defenses under Diaz have been a force behind the line of scrimmage. From 2018-20, Miami's defense featured at least one player with 15 tackles for loss: Jaelan Phillips (15.5) in 2020, Gregory Rousseau (19.5) in 2019 and Jonathan Garvin (18.0) in 2018.
- During Diaz's tenure in Miami, the Hurricanes ranked in the top 10 nationally in tackles for loss each year. Miami was No. 9 in 2021 (7.75 per game), No. 4 in 2020 (8.6), No. 4 in 2019 (8.3), No. 1 in 2018 (10.5), No. 4 in 2017 (8.5) and No. 5 in 2016 (8.3).
- The Nittany Lions allowed just 17.3 points per game in 2021, good for second in the Big Ten and sixth in the country.
- Penn State allowed opponents only a 66.7 conversion rate in the red zone, ranking third in the country and leading the Big Ten. The Nittany Lions' 16 red zone stops were the most in the FBS.
- Penn State tallied a school-record 16 pass breakups at Purdue, including six by CB Joey Porter Jr. and four by S Keaton Ellis.
- Penn State's school-record 16 pass breakups at Purdue are the most by an FBS team in a game since Tulane had 20 vs. East Carolina in 2018.
- Porter's six pass breakups are a school record and tied a Big Ten single-game record, matching Michigan's Jourdan Lewis (vs. Michigan State, 2015) and Minnesota's Michael Carter (vs. Purdue, 2012).
- His six pass breakups are the most by an FBS player since Houston's William Jackson III had seven against Temple in 2015.
- The Nittany Lions held Purdue's Aidan O'Connell to 30-of-60 passing (50 percent) after he completed 71 percent of his passes in 2021.
- Dating back to the Nebraska game in 2020, Penn State has forced a turnover in 20-straight games, tied for the secondlongest streak among FBS teams (Baylor, 22; Oklahoma, 20).
- In those 20 games, Penn State has forced 29 total turnovers (19 interceptions, 10 fumbles).
- Over the last seven seasons, PSU sits second nationally in sacks per game (3.0; trailing only Clemson), third in QB hurries (905), fourth in total pressures generated (1354), fifth in fewest passing TDs allowed per game (1.09), fifth in tackles for loss percentage (10.53), sixth in fewest passing yards per attempt (6.29) and ninth in fewest rushing yards per attempt (3.60).
- Penn State's 267 sacks over the last eight years (2015-22) are fourth behind Clemson (331), Alabama (313) and Pitt (288).
- Over the last eight years, Penn State has accumulated a 8.45 percent sack percentage (267 sacks on 3,484 plays), which ranks sixh in the FBS.
- Since 2014, Penn State has held opponents to seven or less points 23 times, seventh-most among FBS teams. Seventeen of those 23 games have been against Big Ten opponents.
- In the James Franklin era, Penn State has recorded seven shutouts, fifth-most among FBS teams.
- Penn State also has the fifth-most shutouts (12) in the FBS since 2007.
- Since 2014, Penn State has kept opponents under 300 total yards 45 times, the seventh-most games among FBS teams.
- Penn State has held opponents under 100 passing yards in 16 games since 2014, tied eighth-most among FBS teams.
- Since 2014, Penn State has held opponents under 100 rushing yards on 40 occasions, 13th-most among FBS teams.
- Penn State has registered 10 or more tackles for loss 25 times since 2014, the third-most among FBS teams.

- Diaz, who has 24 years of collegiate coaching experience, including three as a head coach and 13 as a defensive coordinator, joins the Nittany Lions after spending six seasons (2016-21) at the University of Miami, including three seasons as head coach (2019-21).
- · Collins, who has 24 years of collegiate coaching experience, joins the Nittany Lions after spending the 2021 season as Boise State's special teams coordinator and edge coach.
- During the 2021 campaign, Collins' special teams unit blocked three punts (T-7th nationally) and four kicks overall to rank ninth in FBS. Of the three blocked punts, two were returned for touchdowns.
- · Losey, who was previously associate director of performance enhancement for football, will lead the performance enhancement staff for football. He replaces Dwight Galt III, who retired.

Richardson ranks 12th all-time at Penn State with 4,419 career passing yards. He also sits eighth all-time with 378 completions and 12th all-time with 27 touchdown passes.

- The senior had a hand in eight takeaways in 2021 (six interceptions, two fumble recoveries).
- He is the first Nittany Lion with six interceptions and two fumble recoveries in a season since Alan Zemaitis in 2005 (six interceptions, two fumble recoveries).
- The Trenton, N.J. native tallied two interceptions vs. Arkansas in the Outback Bowl, tying a Penn State bowl record.
- Junior Keaton Ellis brings a wealth of experience to the Penn State secondary, having appeared in 31 career games, making eight starts.
- In his career, Ellis owns three forced fumbles, one fumble recovery, an interception and nine pass breakups.

- · Pinegar converted all five extra points at Purdue.
- Pinegar is sixth all-time at Penn State with a 72.5 field goal percentage. He's also tied for 10th in field goal attempts (51) and tied for 11th in field goals made (37).
- The lowa native is also ninth on the all-time scoring list with 249 career points.
- Pinegar's 36 career field goals ranks 21st among current FBS kickers.
- Senior SN Chris Stoll is in his fourth season as Penn State's primary long snapper. He's appeared in 35 career games.
- The captain is a member of the Patrick Mannelly Award watch list. He is on the Allstate AFCA Good Works Team watch list.
- Redshirt senior P Barney Amor averaged 46.9 yards per punt on eight punts in his Penn State debut.

GAME RECAP

WEST LAFAYETTE, Ind. - Sean Clifford connected with Keyvone Lee for a 10-yard touchdown to give the Penn State football team the lead with 57 seconds remaining as the Nittany Lions earned a 35-31 win over Purdue at Ross-Ade Stadium to begin the 2022 season.

Clifford completed 20-of-37 passes for 282 yards and a career-high-tying four passing touchdowns, while adding a 2-yard rushing score. Mitchell Tinsley caught seven passes for 84 yards and a touchdown in his Penn State debut, while KeAndre Lambert-Smith had four receptions for 58 yards and a touchdown. Brenton Strange added a 67-yard touchdown reception.

Joey Porter Jr. led the Nittany Lions with eight tackles to go with six pass breakups and a fumble recovery. Johnny Dixon and Jonathan Sutherland each had a sack, while Dixon broke up two passes. Keaton Ellis broke up four passes and Zakee Wheatley forced a fumble.

HOW IT HAPPENED

The Boilermakers got on the board first, finishing a 73-yard drive with a 36-yard field goal by Mitchell Fineran with 3:38 left in the first quarter.

Penn State answered with a 12-yard touchdown pass from Clifford to Tinsley with 13:09 left in the second quarter. The Nittany Lions finished a 12-play, 79-yard drive as Clifford found a wide-open Tinsley on a crossing route. The drive was sparked by a 20-yard reception by Parker Washington and a 12-yard catch by Devyn Ford. Penn State took a 7-3 lead.

Purdue responded with a touchdown drive, concluding with a 3-yard run by King Doerue. The Boilermakers' 75-yard drive was aided by a pair of penalties. Purdue led 10-7 with 9:43 left in the second quarter.

Penn State re-took the lead on a 2-yard touchdown rush by Clifford with 1:44 left in the first half. The eight-play, 43-yard drive including four runs by Nicholas Singleton and a 10-yard catch by Strange.

The Nittany Lions forced a turnover in Purdue territory with 30 seconds left in the half. On a reverse play, Wheatley knocked the ball loose and Porter Jr. recovered the ball at the Penn State 18.

The Nittany Lions answered with a 29-yard touchdown reception by Lambert-Smith in the fourth quarter. After forcing a three-and-out, Penn State started the drive at their own 45 yard-line. Clifford hit Mitchell Tinsley for a 17-yard reception and Kaytron Allen for a nine-yard pass. Clifford connected with Lambert-Smith on a slant and the sophomore spun out of a tackle and took it to the end zone. Penn State held a 28-24 lead with 10:44 remaining.

Two plays later, Clifford connected with Tinsley towards the sideline for a 27-yard catch-and-run to the Purdue 30. On second-and-five at the Purdue 25, Clifford hit Tyler Warren for a 15-yard gain to the Purdue 10. On the next play, Clifford rolled out to his right and lofted a pass to Lee, who took it into the end-zone for the go-ahead score. Penn State took a 35-31 lead with 57 seconds remaining.
