NO. 7/6 NITTANY LIONS MEET NO. 3 OHIO STATE FOR BIG NOON MATCHUP

Rankings: AP/Coaches/CFP

- OPENING KICK: No. 7/6 Penn State visits No. 3 Ohio State on Saturday. The game will be featured on FOX's Big Noon Kickoff.
- **BIG NOON KICKOFF:** Penn State will appear on FOX's Big Noon Kickoff for the second time this season after its 30-13 win at Illinois was the feature broadcast. In 2022, the Nittany Lions were featured on Big Noon Kickoff against Michigan and Ohio State.
- SERIES HISTORY: The Nittany Lions meet Ohio State for the 39th time in program history and the 22nd time where both teams are ranked in the AP Top 25. Last year, Penn State fell 44-31 against the Buckeyes. Sean Clifford threw for 371 yards and three touchdowns, while Parker Washington hauled in 11 receptions for 179 yards and a 58-yard score.
- **TOP DEFENSES:** The Penn State-Ohio State matchup will feature two of the nation's top defenses. The Nittany Lions enter the game leading the country in total defense (193.7), pass defense (121.2), pass efficiency defense (80.73), completion percentage (49.1), first downs allowed (67), sacks per game (4.5) and red zone attempts (7), while ranking second in the country in scoring defense (8.0) and rushing defense (72.5). Ohio State owns the nation's third-best scoring defense (9.7), while holding seventh in total defense (263.5), fourth in pass defense (154.3) and seventh in first downs allowed (94).
- SCORING STREAK: After posting 63 points against UMass on Saturday, Penn State has scored at least 30 points in 13-straight games, the longest active streak in the nation. It marks the third time in Big Ten history a team has strung together 13 or more games of 30+ points, joining Penn State (15; 1993-94) and Ohio State (15; 2014-15). The Nittany Lions lead the Big Ten and rank fifth in the country averaging 44.3 points per game.
- **THE OPPOSITION:** Ohio State improved to 6-0 overall and 3-0 in the Big Ten with a 41-7 win at Purdue last Saturday. The Buckeyes tallied 486 yards, including Kyle McCord throwing for 276 yards and three touchdowns. Marvin Harrison Jr. caught six passes for 105 yards and a touchdown, while Cade Stover hauled in two touchdown receptions.

HEAD COACH JAMES FRANKLIN

CAREER AT A GLANCE

- Franklin was named the 16th head football coach in the storied history of the Nittany Lion program on January 11, 2014.
- He is one of six current FBS head coaches to lead his teams to a bowl game in each of his first nine seasons as a head coach and one of six to do so in 11 of their first 12 seasons.
- Franklin is one of four current Big Ten coaches (Ryan Day, Kirk Ferentz, Jim Harbaugh) to have won a Big Ten Championship and became the first African American head coach to win a Big Ten title after Penn State's 2016 victory.
- He joins Mack Brown (UNC), Jimbo Fisher (Texas A&M), Nick Saban (Alabama), Kirby Smart (Georgia) and Dabo Swinney (Clemson) as the
 only active coaches in college football to have won at least three New Year's Six or College Football Playoff games in their career.
- Franklin has led his teams to four Top 10 finishes (4 at Penn State) and seven Top 25 finishes (2 at Vanderbilt; 5 at Penn State).
- In the last seven seasons under Franklin, Penn State is one of six teams to rank in the top 12 of the CFP final rankings at least five times, joining Alabama, Clemson, Georgia, Ohio State and Oklahoma.
- From 2016-19, Franklin led the Nittany Lions to three New Year's Six bowls 2016 (Rose), 2017 (Fiesta) and 2019 (Cotton), making Penn State one of eight teams to accomplish the feat during the four-year span. Penn State last went to three New Year's Six bowls in four years in 1980-83 (1980 Fiesta, 1982 Fiesta, 1983 Sugar).
- Franklin guided Penn State to back-to-back New Year's Six bowls in 2016 (Rose) and 2017 (Fiesta) for the first time since 1985 (Orange) and 1986 (Fiesta).
- From 2016-19, Franklin led Penn State to 42 wins, the most in program history for the Big Ten era, and 28 league wins, a program record.
- Franklin has 28 years of coaching experience at the collegiate and NFL level.
- In his first 12 years as a head coach, Franklin mentored 90 players who have gone on to the NFL ranks.
- · Franklin is first all-time in total wins and winning percentage by an FBS African American head coach (minimum 80 wins).

NITTANY LIONS ON THE FIELD

- Penn State defeated No. 8/7/10 Utah, 35-21, in the 109th Rose Bowl Game to cap off the 2022 season. The Nittany Lions reached the 11-win plateau for the 19th time in program history.
- Penn State earned a New Year's Day bowl berth against Arkansas in the Outback Bowl in 2021. With wins over No. 12/15 Wisconsin and No.
 22/20 Auburn, Penn State tallied two wins over ranked teams within the first three games of the season for the first time in program history.
- In 2020, with the emergence of young skill players on offense, true freshmen accounted for 1,486 of Penn State's 3,873 total yards (38 percent), marking a school record for most combined scrimmage yards by true freshmen in a single season.
- Penn State earned its third 11-win season in four years with an 11-2 record in 2019, including a win over No. 17 Memphis in the Goodyear
 Cotton Bowl Classic. The Nittany Lions posted their fourth-straight top 12 finish in the final CFP rankings, coming in 10th, and were ranked
 ninth in the final Associated Press and Amway Coaches polls to earn their 25th AP Top 10 finish. Franklin was a finalist for the Paul "Bear"
 Bryant National Coach of the Year award for the second time at Penn State (2016) and third time in his head coaching career.
- In 2018, the Nittany Lions posted their third-straight season with at least nine wins with a 9-4 overall record, earning a berth in the VRBO
 Citrus Bowl. Penn State finished No. 12 in the final CFP rankings and No. 17 in the Associated Press and Amway Coaches polls.
- Penn State climbed as high as No. 2 in the rankings in 2017 and appeared in a second-straight New Year's Six bowl, earning a 35-28 win
 over No. 11 Washington in the PlayStation Fiesta Bowl. At 11-2, the Nittany Lions earned back-to-back 11-win seasons for the fifth time in
 program history and first time since 2008 and 2009. Penn State finished the season No. 8 in the Associated Press and Amway Coaches polls
 and No. 9 in the final CFP rankings.
- Penn State surged in 2016, winning nine consecutive games en route to the Big Ten Championship, a Rose Bowl berth and an 11-3 overall record. Penn State finished the season ranked No. 5 in the College Football Playoff rankings and No. 7 in the Associated Press and Amway Coaches polls. It was Penn State's highest finish in the polls since 2005. The Lions claimed their fourth overall Big Ten Championship and first outright title since 1994 with a thrilling, 38-31 comeback win over Wisconsin in the Big Ten Championship Game. Franklin was honored as Sporting News National Coach of the Year and the Woody Hayes National Coach of the Year, as well as the Dave McLain Big Ten Coach of the Year and Associated Press Big Ten Coach of the Year.
- Franklin guided the Nittany Lions to a 7-6 record in 2015 and a berth in the TaxSlayer Bowl.
- Franklin's first season in **2014** was bookended with a pair of thrilling victories for the Nittany Lions. It began with a final-play 26-24 victory over UCF in Dublin, Ireland, in Penn State's first-ever international game and ended with a comeback, a 31-30 overtime win over Boston College in the New Era Pinstripe Bowl in Yankee Stadium. Franklin became just the third Penn State coach to lead the team to at least seven wins in his first season, joining Dick Harlow (1915) and Bill O'Brien (2012), and he guided the Nittany Lions to a 4-0 start, joining Harlow as the only first-year Penn State coaches to win their initial four games.

NITTANY LIONS IN THE CLASSROOM

- The Nittany Lions posted their first 1,000 single-year APR in program history in 2018-19, topping the previous high of 993 in 2014-15.
- Sean Clifford (2021) and Trace McSorley (2018) were selected as a National Football Foundation (NFF) Scholar-Athletes and finalists for the Campbell Trophy, known as the "Academic Heisman." They are the 18th and 19th Nittany Lions to be selected as an NFF Scholar-Athlete.
- In 2019, punter Blake Gillikin took home CoSIDA Academic All-America® first-team honors for the second-straight year to become the 12th two-time first-team selection in Penn State history. He graduated with a perfect 4.0 grade-point average in May.
- Gillikin's two first-team CoSIDA Academic All-America honors increase Penn State football's total to 67 honorees, which ranks second in Division I football history (FBS and FCS).
- Tyler Yazujian collected a berth on the CoSIDA Academic All-America® first team in 2016 after an appearance on the second team in 2015.
- A program-record 10 Nittany Lions were named 2020-21 Big Ten Distinguished Scholars, besting the previous mark of nine set a year earlier.

NITTANY LIONS IN THE COMMUNITY

- The Nittany Lions are active in the community, participating in activities such as Uplifting Athletes, THON, Pennsylvania Special Olympics Summer Games, State College Area Food Bank and Penn State Hershey Children's Hospital visits.
- On June 15, 2020, Franklin was named to the Big Ten Anti-Hate and Anti-Racism Coalition.
- As part of the Cotton Bowl festivities in 2019, Franklin and his family made a \$10,000 financial commitment to the Dallas Children's Hospital.
- In August 2019, Franklin was named a Penn State University Renaissance Fund honoree, which awards outstanding community members for helping students in need.

- Day is in his fifth full season with a career record of 51-6, a 34-2 mark in Big Ten Conference games, and two Big Ten Championships and two College Football Playoff appearances.
- A QB coach for the San Francisco 49ers in 2016 under Chip Kelly and in 2015 for the Philadelphia Eagles under Kelly, Day is in his fourth season overall at Ohio State and his 19th season as a coach in the NFL or collegiate ranks. He was Ohio State's offensive coordinator and quarterbacks coach from 2017-18.
- · Day was a three-year starting quarterback at New Hampshire when Chip Kelly was offensive coordinator and quarterbacks coach, graduating in 2002.

LAST MEETING NO. 13/13 FOOTBALL DROPS DECISION TO NO. 2/2 OHIO STATE

UNIVERSITY PARK, Pa. - The No. 13/13 Penn State football team dropped a back-and-forth decision to No. 2/2 Ohio State, 44-31, in front of a lively crowd of 108,433 fans.

Quarterback Sean Clifford threw for 371 yards and three touchdowns, finding Washington for 11 catches, a career-high 179 yards and a score. KeAndre Lambert-Smith and Kaytron Allen were also on the receiving end of Clifford touchdown

The Buckeyes got on the board first with a 38-yard field goal on the game's opening drive.

Following an interception, Ohio State scored on a 4-yard touchdown run by Miyan Williams to put the Buckeyes up 10-0 with 2:48 to go in the first quarter.

Penn State got on the board early in the second quarter on a 58-yard catch-andrun from Clifford to Washington to cut the Buckeyes lead to 10-7. On their next possession, the Nittany Lions found the end zone again with a 23-

yard pass by Clifford to Lambert-Smith to put Penn State up, 14-10.

The Buckeyes answered with a 37-yard field goal to close within one point at 14-13 with 3:14 left in the first half.

Ohio State connected on a 40-yard field goal with 0:10 remaining in the third guarter to retake the lead at 16-14

The Nittany Lions converted a 4th-and-1 play inside their own 10-yard line and Kaytron Allen followed with another fourth-down conversion, this time for a touchdown to increase the Penn State lead to 21-16 with 9:26 left in the fourth quarter

The Buckeyes responded quickly as a 41-yard touchdown run by TreVeyon Henderson put Ohio State in front again, 23-21. On the ensuing Penn State drive, Ohio State forced a fumble and recovered the ball at the Penn State 24-yard line. A 24-yard pass from C.J. Stroud to Cade Stover added another touchdown for the Buckeyes, bringing the score to 30-21 with 8:17 to play.

Despite a 27-yard run from Allen on first down, Ohio State's defense held the

Nittany Lions to a 44-yard field goal from Jake Pinegar to cut the score to 30-24.

Another set of back-to-back touchdowns for Ohio State in the final three minutes of the game gave them a 20-point lead. After a 7-yard rushing touchdown for the Buckeye offense, Sean Clifford's first down pass was intercepted by Ohio State and returned for a touchdown. Ohio State's lead increased to 44-24 with 2:42 left in the game.

The Nittany Lions scored the game's final touchdown as Clifford connected with Allen for a 5-yard score to make it 44-31 with 1:12 left.

- · Penn State has won 11-straight games, each by a 14-point margin of victory. Over the last two seasons, no other FBS team has won by a 14-point margin in more than seven-straight
- Penn State's 11-straight wins by 14+ points are a school record and tied for 22nd all-time in FBS. It marks the most for a Big Ten team since 1904 (Michigan - 13).

- Ohio State assistant head coach/defensive line coach Larry Johnson Sr. coached at Penn State from 1996-2013, serving as defensive ends coach/special teams coordinator from 1996-99 and defensive line coach from 2000-13.

UMASS POSTGAME NOTES

- The Nittany Lions are 74-24-5 in homecoming games, including wins in 14 of the last 17 contests.
- The 63-0 final score marked the largest shutout by Penn State since joining the Big Ten and the largest shutout win since an 81-0 win vs. Cincinnati in 1991.
- Penn State recorded 63 points for the second time this season, the first time the Nittany Lions have scored at least 63 in two games in a season since 2018 (63 vs. Kent State; 63 vs. Illinois).
- · The Nittany Lions recorded their second consecutive home shutout, marking the first time that Penn State has shut out its opponent in consecutive home games since 1981, when they shut out Cincinnati (52-0) and Temple (30-0).
- The seven points allowed in the past three home games are the fewest allowed by Penn State in three-straight home games since holding Cincinnati (0), Temple (0), and Boston College (7) to a total of seven points in three-straight home games in 1981.
- In the first half, Penn State recorded more sack yards (32) than UMass had total yards (26).

- · Penn State registered 10 tackles for loss and five sacks in the first half
- PR Daequan Hardy returned a punt 56 yards for a touchdown in the first quarter and added a 68-yard punt return touchdown in the third quarter, becoming the first player in school history to record multiple punt returns for a touchdown in a single game.
- Since 2000, Hardy is the 25th FBS player to return two punt returns for touchdowns in a game. He is one of two Big Ten players joining Iowa's Kevonte Martin-Manley (vs. Western Michigan, 2013).

NORTHWESTERN POSTGAME NOTES

- Penn State extended its win streak to six games against Big Ten West teams.
- · The Nittany Lions have won nine of the last 11 matchups in the series against Northwestern.
- The Nittany Lions limited Northwestern to -10 rushing yards on 16 carries in the first half and 45 rushing yards in the game.
- · Penn State tallied 12 tackles for loss and seven sacks.

IOWA POSTGAME NOTES

- · The Nittany Lions improved to 9-6 in full-stadium Penn State White Out games.
- · Penn State recorded a shutout against an AP Top 25 team for the first time since the 1999 Alamo Bowl against No. 18 Texas A&M (24-0).
- Penn State held the ball for 45:27 to lowa's time of possession of 14:33. In the second half, Penn State held the ball for 24:14 to lowa's 5:46 (13:26 to 1:34 in the third guarter).
- Penn State had 97 offensive plays to 33 for lowa. According to TruMediaSports, in the past five seasons, no other FBS team has out-snapped its opponent by 60+ plays.
- · Penn State scored on drives of 17, 10 15 and 12 plays. The last time Penn State had four scoring drives of 10+ plays was against Ohio State in 2021.
- Penn State held Iowa to four first downs, the fewest allowed by the Nittany Lions since giving up just two to Eastern Illinois in 2009 and the fewest ever allowed by Penn State in a Big Ten game.
- · The Nittany Lions limited the Hawkeyes to just five plays in Penn
- · After allowing lowa to get one first down on each of its first two possessions in the first quarter, Penn State held lowa without a first down for the next seven drives.
- · Penn State held lowa to 76 yards of offense, the fewest ever allowed by Penn State in a Big Ten game.
- · Penn State held lowa to 20 yards rushing, the fourth-lowest since 2014, and 56 passing yards, the seventh-lowest total allowed under James Franklin.
- · LB Curtis Jacobs recovered a fumble in the first guarter and recovered a muffed punt in the second quarter, becoming the first Penn State player to recover two fumbles in a game since Mark D'Onofrio against Temple on October 5, 1991.
- After lowa's first fumble of the game (9:09 first guarter), Penn State held the ball for 80 of the next 96 plays. lowa had -5 yards over its 16 plays.

- Penn State owns a winning record against 18 of the 23 teams that it has met 20 or more times.
- Ten of the 23 teams are on the 2023 schedule, including West Virginia (60), Illinois (27), Iowa (32), Northwestern (21), Ohio State (38), Indiana (26), Maryland (46), Michigan (26), Rutgers (33) and Michigan State (37).
- Eighteen of the 23 programs are currently members of NCAA Division I FBS. Bucknell, Lehigh and Penn are in NCAA Division I FCS, while Gettysburg and Lebanon Valley are in Division III.

HOME SWEET HOME

- With a 314-80 all-time record in Beaver Stadium, Penn State owns the sixth-best record in its venue amongst current FBS schools and leads the Big Ten.
- Penn State averaged 107,379 fans in seven games at Beaver Stadium in 2022, marking the fifth-highest average attendance in program history and the highest mark since 2008 (108,254).
- The Nittany Lions welcomed 110,747 fans to Beaver Stadium against West Virginia, marking the fourth-highest crowd in its history and the most since Sept. 29, 2018 against Ohio State (110.889).
- The 2023 Penn State White Out attendance was 110,830, which is the second-largest crowd in Beaver Stadium history behind only the 110,889 from the 2018 Penn State White Out game against Ohio State
- Only Alabama (.840) and Oklahoma (.816) have higher winning percentages in facilities older than Beaver Stadium.

ILLINOIS POSTGAME NOTES

- The Nittany Lions improved to 17-14 all-time in Big Ten openers and 19-12 in Big Ten road openers.
- Penn State scored 20 points off turnovers, including its first 13 points of the game.
- In the third quarter, RB Trey Potts threw an 11-yard touchdown pass to TE Tyler Warren.
- Potts became Penn State's 11th non-quarterback (12 occasions) to throw for a touchdown.
- The Nittany Lions forced turnovers on three-straight possessions (two fumbles, one interception) in the first quarter.
- Penn State forced takeaways on three-straight possessions for the first time since 2016 at Indiana (three fumbles).
- Penn State recorded takeaways in the first quarter on a fumble forced by LB Dominic DeLuca and recovered by LB Kobe King, an interception by LB Abdul Carter and an interception by CB Daequan Hardy.
- The Nittany Lions forced two takeaways in the third quarter on an interception by CB Johnny Dixon and an interception by CB Cam Miller

DELAWARE POSTGAME NOTES

- Penn State scored on its first four drives. Adding to scoring on the final four possessions of the WVU game, the Nittany Lions scored on eight-straight drives, including the final four drives of the West Virginia game.
- The Nittany Lions scored on eight-straight drives for the first time since posting points on eight-straight drives against UMass on September 20, 2014.
- The Nittany Lions scored 35 points in the first half, it's the most points scored by a Penn State team in the opening half since scoring 42 points against Illinois in 2020.
- Penn State held Delaware to just 41 offensive plays and just five first downs.

WEST VIRGINIA POSTGAME NOTES

- The Nittany Lions have won five-straight matchups in the series and 33 of the last 35 contests.
- Penn State is now 122-13-1 all-time in home openers, including wins in 20 of the last 22, and 113-22-2 all-time in season openers.
- PSU welcomed 110,747 fans to Beaver Stadium, marking the fourth-highest crowd in its history and its largest crowd for a home opener.
- QB Drew Allar became the first Penn State quarterback to throw for at least 300 yards in a season opener since Christian Hackenberg's 454 passing yards against UCF in 2014 and the first Penn State quarterback to throw for at least 300 yards in his first career start since Michael Robinson threw for 379 yards ys. Wisconsin in 2003.
- Allar's 300 passing yards and three passing touchdowns marked the 25th time a PSU quarterback has done that in a game.

The Nittany Lions stopped West Virginia on three fourth-down conversion attempts.

LIONS UNDER THE LIGHTS

- The 2023 season marks the 23rd-straight with at least one regular-season night game on the schedule.
- Penn State will play at least three night games in 2023.
- The Nittany Lions opened the 2023 season against West Virginia with a 7:30 p.m. kickoff on NBC. Penn State earned a 38-15 win.
- Penn State tallied a 31-0 win against lowa in the annual Penn State White Out Game. It was broadcast at 7:30 p.m. on CBS.
- The Nittany Lions will close out the regular season on Friday, Nov. 24 against Michigan State with a 7:30 p.m. kickoff on NBC.
- Penn State is 61-32 at night all-time. The figure breaks down to 21-11 at home, 28-14 on the road and 12-7 in neutral site games. Penn State is 1-1 at regular season neutral sites, 11-6 in bowl games and 1-0 in conference championship games.
- In 2019, Penn State played its most regular season night games in program history with four primetime tilts.
- On Oct. 12, 2013, the Lions claimed the longest game in Big Ten history when they edged Michigan under the lights, 43-40, in four overtimes in front of a sellout Beaver Stadium crowd of 107,844 on Homecoming.

ON TV

- Penn State has had 353 of its last 355 games televised, including 249 consecutive games.
- Over the last 15 seasons, every Penn State game has aired on either ABC, BTN, CBS, NBC, Peacock or an ESPN or FOX channel.
- Penn State has made 332 regular season TV appearances since 1995, which is tied for the national lead.
- Penn State's game against Delaware was streamed on Peacock, the Nittany Lions' first ever exclusively on a streaming platform.
- Penn State's matchup in the 2023 Rose Bowl Game against Utah drew 10.19 million viewers as the most-watched bowl game outside of the College Football Playoff.
- The 2022 Penn State-Ohio State matchup drew 8.27 million viewers. It was the second most-watched game between two Big Ten schools last season and the seventh-highest viewed regular season game of 2022.

OVERTIME OVER TIME

- College football introduced overtime during the bowl season in 1995 and adopted it for regular season games in 1996. Since then, Penn State has played 15 overtime games, including six over the 2012-14 seasons.
- Ten of the 15 overtime tilts have come at home, three in true road games, one in the 2006 Orange Bowl and one in the 2014 Pinstripe Bowl.
- Penn State is 8-7 all-time in overtime games, with a 5-5 record at Beaver Stadium, 1-2 mark in true road games and 2-0 in contests at a neutral site.

THREE ON HALL OF FAME BALLOT

- Penn State lettermen Ki-Jana Carter, D.J. Dozier and Paul Posluszny have been selected as a part of the national ballot for the National Football Foundation's College Hall of Fame's Class of 2024.
- Carter, a running back for the Nittany Lions, was a first-team All-American during the 1994 campaign. Carter staked a claim to being one of the most decorated Penn State running backs of all-time with a junior season in which he was fourth nationally in rushing (139.9), second in scoring (10.8 ppg) and fifth in all-purpose vardage (158.4).
- · Dozier, a tailback for the Nittany Lions, matriculated to Happy Valley from Virginia Beach, Va. He earned first team All-America honors from the Walter Camp Football Foundation in 1986. Dozier is the only Nittany Lion to the lead the team in rushing four consecutive seasons, doing so from 1983-86.
- Posluszny, an outside linebacker for the Nittany Lions, was a first-team All-American in 2005 and 2006. Posluszny became just the second two-time winner of the Chuck Bednarik Award, presented to the nation's top defensive player, in 2006. In 2005, he also won the Butkus Award.

- Since the start of the 2016 season, Penn State's offense is second in the Big Ten in scoring offense (35.38; 10th nationally) and total offense (424.37; 32nd), and is third in touchdown percentage (32.09; 16th), points per possession (2.19; 16th), scoring percentage (40.90; 21st), yards per pass attempt (7.83; 31st) and yards per play (6.01; 39th).
- Penn State's offense has been explosive since the 2016 campaign, as it leads the Big Ten in 80-plus yard play percentage (0.20; T-1st nationally) and 70-plus (0.38; 4th) and holds third in 20-plus (7.48; 29th), 30-plus (3.47; 29th), 40-plus (1.90; 21st), 50-plus (0.94; 43rd) and 60-plus (0.53; 29th).
- The Nittany Lions have tallied at least 55 plays of 20 or more yards in seven of the last eight seasons (86 in 2022; 57 in 2021; 63 in 2019; 73 in 2018; 85 in 2017; 91 in 2016; 67 in 2015). PSU had 52 plays of 20 or more yards in 2020 (9-game schedule).
- Additionally, the Nittany Lions are third in the Big Ten and 21st nationally in 15-plus yard passing play percentage since 2016 (19.12 percent).
- Since 2000, Penn State (40.6 ppg scored; 9.6 ppg allowed) and Miami's 2001 team (42.7 ppg scored; 9.8 ppg allowed) have averaged 40+ ppg and allowed fewer than 10 ppg in a season.
- With 63 points against UMass, the Nittany Lions extended its streak of 30+ points to 13-straight games, the nation's longest
- It marks the third time in Big Ten history a team has strung together 13 or more games of 30+ points, joining Penn State (15; 1993-94) and Ohio State (15; 2014-15). The only other time Penn State went 13-straight games with 30+ points in program history was 1993-94, when it scored 30+ points in a schoolrecord 15-straight games.
- Dating back to the Rutgers game in 2022, Penn State has scored in 36-straight quarters, the longest active streak in the nation.
- Since 2014, Penn State is 43-1 when leading by 10+ points at
- QB Drew Allar (181) is the only FBS quarterback with 150+ pass attempts and no interceptions in 2023.
- Since 2000, Allar is one of 20 FBS quarterbacks (21 occasions) to start a season with 180+ pass attempts an no interceptions.
- Allar is the only Big Ten guarterback, since 2000, to start a season with 180+ pass attempts and no interceptions.
- Dating back to the Maryland game in 2022, Penn State has not thrown an interception in 10-straight games, the longest active
- · Penn State has surpassed 200 yards rushing 41 times in the James Franklin era. PSU is 36-5 in those games.
- · Since 2014, Penn State has recorded 200 passing yards on 78 occasions. Penn State is 58-20 in those games.
- Since 2014, Penn State has tallied 400 total yards on 66 occasions. Penn State is 54-12 in those games.
- Since the start of the 2022 season, Penn State is second in the nation in turnover margin, averaging a +1.16 margin (2.05 gained per game; 0.89 lost per game), best in the Big Ten.
- Over the last two seasons, Penn State is averaging a nationbest 9.42 points per game off turnovers and has 65 points off turnovers in 2023.

- In 2023, Penn State ranks fifth in the country and leads the Big Ten averaging 44.3 points per game.
- Penn State leads the country in fourth down conversion
- The Nittany Lions ranks second in the nation in average time of possession (34:36) and fifth in sacks allowed per game (0.7).
- Penn State is 15th in the country in red zone offense (93.9%).
- PSU ranks 15th in the nation in rushing offense (203.3) and 42nd in total offense (426.7), sitting first and second in the Big Ten, respectively.
- The Nittany Lions have tallied 156 first downs through the first six games, holding 21st nationally and second in the conference, and sits 19th in the country in third down conversion percentage
- Penn State scored on each of its final four possessions of the WVU game, including three touchdowns, and on the first four drives of the Delaware game, posting points on eight-straight drives for the first time since September 20, 2014 against
- Against Iowa, Penn State held the ball for 45:27 to the Hawkeyes' 14:33 time of possession. In the second half, Penn State held the ball for 24:14 to lowa's 5:46.
- Penn State had 97 offensive plays to 33 for lowa. According to TruMediaSports, in the past five seasons, no other FBS team has out-snapped its opponent by 60+ plays.
- The 97 plays by the Nittany Lions were the most since Penn State ran 99 offensive plays at lowa in 2017.
- Penn State scored on drives of 17, 10 15 and 12 plays against the Hawkeves. The last time Penn State had four scoring drives of 10+ plays was against Ohio State in 2021.
- Mike Yurcich is in his third season as Penn State's offensive coordinator/quarterbacks coach.
- Yurcich (California University (Pa.)) and Franklin (East Stroudsburg) both played in the Pennsylvania State Athletic Conference (PSAC).
- · As an FBS offensive coordinator, offenses under Yurcich have averaged 6.31 yards per play, ranking first among OC's since 2013 and 13.51 yards per completion, which is also first in that time frame.
- Since 2013, Yurcich's offenses have scored 50 or more points 29 times and 40 or more points 60 times (44.8 percent of games coached), both of which are tops among FBS offensive coordinators since 2013.
- · His teams have averaged an FBS-best 56.1 touchdowns per year and 29.8 passing touchdowns per season.
- Penn State has scored 40 points 30 times since 2016. By comparison, from 2008 until 2015, the Nittany Lions had 18 40-point outings.

- Offensive coordinator Mike Yurcich also heads the Penn State quarterback room.
- Four quarterbacks Yurcich coached in college are currently on NFL rosters (Sean Clifford - Penn State, Sam Ehlinger - Texas, Justin Fields - Ohio State, Mason Rudolph - Oklahoma State).
- Yurcich served as the passing game coordinator and quarterbacks coach at Ohio State in 2019, where quarterback Justin Fields was a finalist for the Heisman Trophy, Walter Camp Player of the Year Award and Davey O'Brien Award.
- Sophomore quarterback **Drew Allar** is on the Davey O'Brien Award watch list.
- Through six games in 2023, Allar has completed 65.2 percent of his passes for 1,254 yards and 12 touchdowns, while rushing for three scores
- Since 2000, Allar is the only Big Ten quarterback who has thrown 10+ touchdowns and no interceptions through the first six games of a season.
- Allar is the first quarterback in Penn State history to throw for 10 or more touchdowns before throwing an interception in a season.
- In his career, Allar's 63.5 completion percentage (153-of-241) is the all-time best at Penn State (minimum 200 pass attempts).
- Allar's 65.2 completion percentage in 2023 ranks third in a season at Penn State (minimum 100 pass attempts).
- The sophomore has started his career with 241 pass attempts without an interception.
- Allar (181) is the only FBS quarterback with 150+ pass attempts and no interceptions in 2023.
- Since 2000, Allar is one of 20 FBS quarterbacks (21 occasions) to start a season with 180+ pass attempts an no interceptions.
- Allar is the only Big Ten quarterback, since 2000, to start a season with 180+ pass attempts and no interceptions.
- Allar ranks second in the Big Ten in completion percentage (65.2), third in passing touchdowns (12), fourth in completions per game (19.67) and passing efficiency (145.3), sixth in total passing yards (1,254) and seventh in passing yards per game (209.0) and total offense per game (222.2).
- Allar has five career games with multiple touchdown passes, three games with three or more touchdown passes and one game with four touchdown passes.
- He has three career 200-yard passing games and one 300-yard passing game.

- The Ohio native owns three career games with both a passing and rushing touchdown.
- In his first career start, against West Virginia, Allar completed 21-of-29 passes for 325 yards and three touchdowns.
- Allar became the first Penn State quarterback to throw for at least 300 yards in a season opener since Christian Hackenberg's 454 passing yards against UCF in 2014 and the first Penn State quarterback to throw for at least 300 yards in his first career start since Michael Robinson threw for 379 yards vs. Wisconsin in 2003
- Allar's 300 passing yards and three passing touchdowns marked the 25th time a PSU quarterback has done so in a game.
- The sophomore earned Big Ten Offensive Player of the Week honors following the West Virginia game.
- The Ohio native set a career high with four passing touchdowns against lowa, while completing 25 passes for 166 yards.
- At Northwestern, Allar completed 18-of-33 passes for 189 yards and a touchdown, while adding a 1-yard rushing score.
- He completed 16-of-23 passes for 162 yards and three touchdowns, while adding a rushing score, against UMass.
- Quarterback Beau Pribula also enters his second season with the Nittany Lions after redshirting his rookie season.
- In 2023, Pribula has completed six passes for 75 yards and two touchdowns, while rushing for 225 yards and three scores.
- Pribula ranks second among Big Ten quarterbacks with 225 rushing yards
- Against WVU, Pribula completed his first career pass attempt for seven yards. He also scored on a 5-yard touchdown run.
- In the Delaware game, Pribula completed 3-of-5 passes for 22 yards and a touchdown. He added 46 yards and a touchdown on eight carries.
- The redshirt freshman tallied nine carries for 47 yards at Illinois and rushed for 55 yards against lowa.
- At Northwestern, Pribula completed his only pass attempt to RB Trey Potts for a 30-yard touchdown.
- Pribula had a career-high 59 yards rushing against UMass, including a 31-yard touchdown run. The 31-yard run was the longest rush of his career.
- Freshman Jaxon Smolik made his collegiate debut in the Delaware contest.

ACADEMIC SUCCESS

- The Nittany Lions had 32 players selected as Academic All-Big Ten in Fall 2022.
- Sean Clifford was a 2021 National Football Foundation (NFF)
 Scholar-Athlete and finalist for the Campbell Trophy, known as the "Academic Heisman". He is the 19th Nittany Lion to be selected as an NFF Scholar-Athlete.
- Penn State posted its first 1,000 single-year APR in program history in 2018-19, topping the previous high of 993 in 2014-15
- In 2019, punter Blake Gillikin took home CoSIDA Academic All-America® first-team honors for the second-straight year to become the 12th two-time first-team selection in Penn State history. He graduated with a perfect 4.0 grade-point average in May 2020.
- Gillikin's two first-team CoSIDA Academic All-America honors increase Penn State football's total to 67 honorees, which ranks second in Division I football history (FBS and FCS).

RUNNING BACKS NOTES

- Co-offensive coordinator/running backs coach Ja'Juan Seider has 15 years of college coaching experience, including 12 at the Power Five level.
- As a player at Florida A&M, Seider won the Doug Williams Award for National Offensive Player of the Year, Jake Gaither Award (considered the Heisman Trophy of Historically Black Colleges) and earned All-America honors after throwing for 2,622 yards and 27 touchdowns and rushing for 740 yards and 14 touchdowns in 1999.
- A loaded running back room is led by dynamic sophomores Kaytron Allen and Nicholas Singleton and redshirt senior Trey Potts.
- Allen (1,242), Singleton (1,423) and Potts (1,302) each have over 1,200 career rushing yards.
- Penn State is one of seven FBS teams, and the only Big Ten team, with three career 1,200 yard rushers on its roster.
- In 2022, Singleton (1,061 rushing yards) and Allen (867 rushing yards) became the first freshmen teammates in Big Ten history to both rush for 700+ rushing yards in a season.
- Since 2000, Allen and Singleton are one of two FBS freshman duos to each rush for 850+ yards in a season, joining West Virginia's Steve Slaton (1,128) and Pat White (952) in 2005.
- Allen and Singleton are both on the Doak Walker Award watch list, while Singleton is also on watch lists for the Maxwell Award, Paul Hornung Award and Walter Camp Player of the York Award
- Singleton was also named a second-team preseason All-American by Sporting News and a Pro Football Focus Preseason All-America honorable mention.
- He was selected as a True Freshman All-American by On3, 247Sports and College Football News in 2022.
- Singleton was named the Big Ten Thompson-Randle El Freshman of the Year and was selected third-team All-Big Ten by the coaches and media and was also tabbed the AP Big Ten Newcomer of the Year.
- Allen was an honorable mention All-Big Ten selection in 2022 by the media and was a True Freshman All-American by College Football News.
- Singleton owns 1,423 career rushing yards, ranking 31st alltime at Penn State, and 18 career rushing touchdowns.
- He ranks fourth in the Big Ten in rushing touchdowns (6), third in total touchdowns (7), fourth in all-purpose yards per game (100.5), eighth in rushing yards per game (60.3) and 10th in total rushing yards (362).
- The sophomore started the 2023 season with 70 rushing yards and a 2-yard touchdown rush against West Virginia.
- Against Delaware, Singleton scored a career-high three rushing touchdowns.
- He found the end zone on a 2-yard rushing touchdown on Penn State's opening drive of the game, and a pair of 5-yard scores in the second quarter, marking his sixth career game with multiple rushing touchdowns.
- At Illinois, Singleton scored on a 16-yard rush in the fourth quarter, while adding a career-high 49 receiving yards on three catches and 54 kick return yards for a total of 140 allpurpose yards.
- Against lowa, Singleton gained 49 yards on the ground and added a pair of catches.
- Singleton tallied a team-high 21 carries and 80 rushing yards at Northwestern, tying a career high for carries.
- Against the Wildcats, the sophomore scored on a 1-yard run in the fourth quarter and a 2-yard reception in the third quarter, giving him his first career game with both a rushing and receiving touchdown.
- He had a career-high six receptions for 39 yards in the contest.
- Singleton gained a team-high 79 rushing yards against UMass.
- In the UMass game, Singleton surpassed 2,000 career allpurpose yards. He has 2,098 all-purpose yards.
- Singleton rushed for 1,061 yards as a freshman, trailing only Saquon Barkley (1,076; 2015) for the most by a Penn State freshman.
- Singleton's 12 rushing touchdowns in 2022 are a Penn State

freshman record.

- Allen has 1,242 career rushing yards and 13 career rushing touchdowns.
- In 2023, Allen ranks seventh in the Big Ten in rushing yards per game (62.5) and yards per carry (4.81) and ninth in total rushing yards (375).
- Against West Virginia, he rushed for 51 yards on 10 carries.
- In the Delaware game, Allen rushed for 103 yards on 19 carries, marking his third career 100-yard rushing game.
- Allen scored on a 4-yard rushing touchdown in the first quarter against the Blue Hens.
- During the opening drive of the third quarter, he went over the 1,000 career rushing yards mark. He became the 49th Penn State player to reach 1,000 career rushing yards.
- Allen rushed for a team-high 54 yards at Illinois and scored on a 4-yard rushing touchdown in the second quarter.
- Allen led PSU with 72 rushing yards against lowa. He added three receptions.
- · At Northwestern, Allen averaged 4.5 yards per carry.
- Against UMass, Allen tallied 68 rushing yards and a 9-yard touchdown, while averaging 7.6 yards per carry.
- Potts joined the Nittany Lions in Summer 2023 after transferring from Minnesota.
- In his collegiate career, Potts owns 1,302 rushing yards and 13 touchdowns on 259 carries in 30 games (five starts).
- In 2023, he has rushed for 107 yards (5.4 yards per carry) and two touchdowns, while adding two receptions for 46 yards and a score.
- Potts is one of five FBS players in 2023 with a passing, rushing and receiving touchdown joining Kansas State's Will Howard, Kansas State's Treshaun Ward, MTSU's Nicholas Vattiato and UCF's Timmy McClain.
- · Potts had five carries against West Virginia in the 2023 opener.
- He rushed for 59 yards on seven carries, including a 20-yard rush, in the Delaware game.
- In the win at Illinois, Potts threw an 11-yard touchdown pass to Tyler Warren. Potts is Penn State's 11th non-quarterback (12 occasions) to throw for a touchdown.
- At Northwestern, Potts scored on a 13-yard run and a 30-yard reception. The rushing score was his first as a Nittany Lion and the receiving touchdown was the first of his collegiate career.
- It also marked his first career game with both a rushing and receiving touchdown.
- Scored on a 2-yard run against UMass.
- Redshirt senior Tank Smith has 38 career carries, including 23 in 2022.
- Smith tied a career high with six carries, gaining 29 rushing yards, against Delaware.
- Had a career-long 39-yard run against UMass, while totaling a career-high 41 yards.
- Redshirt sophomore Tyler Holworth tallied six carries last season and earned three carries in the Delaware contest.

- He was a four-year letterwinner on the Penn State offensive line from 2009-13. He started at center and left guard and was a four-time Academic All-Big Ten selection. He was a team captain in 2013.
- In 2023, Penn State tight ends have combined for 33 receptions, 305 receiving yards and eight touchdowns.
- Juniors Theo Johnson (11) and Tyler Warren (3), and redshirt sophomore Khalil Dinkins (1) have combined for 15, 20-plus yard receptions in their careers.
- Johnson, who is on the Mackey Award watch list, has 59 receptions for 764 yards and seven touchdowns in his Penn State career.
- He made two grabs for 32 yards at Illinois, including a 19-yard reception in the first quarter and a 13-yard reception to setup a Penn State touchdown in the third quarter.
- The junior had a career-high six receptions for 42 yards in the win over lowa.
- Johnson hauled in four catches for 66 yards and two touchdowns against UMass.
- He had a 30-yard touchdown grab and an 18-yard touchdown catch in the third quarter.
- Warren has 31 career receptions for 313 yards and nine touchdowns, while adding two rushing scores.
- In 2023, Warren sits third among FBS tight ends with five touchdown receptions.
- According to Coaches By The Numbers, Warren is tied first among tight ends in red zone catches (7) and ranks second in red zone targets (12).
- His five touchdown receptions are second in the Big Ten.
- The junior had a career-high six receptions against Delaware, doubling his previous career high.
- Warren hauled in a 2-yard touchdown in the second quarter in the win over the Blue Hens.
- The Virginia native caught three passes for 35 yards and a touchdown at Illinois.
- In the third quarter, Warren recorded an 11-yard touchdown catch on a throw from RB Trey Potts.
- Warren hauled in a pair of touchdowns against lowa.
- He caught a 2-yard touchdown midway through the third quarter and a 7-yard touchdown grab late in the third quarter.
- Against UMass, Warren had a 7-yard touchdown catch.
- Dinkins made a 9-yard touchdown catch in the second quarter against lowa. It was his second career touchdown catch.
- Brenton Strange was selected by the Jacksonville Jaguars in the second round of the 2023 NFL Draft, Penn State's fourth tight end drafted since 2015, tied for the third-most in the FBS.
- In 2022, Penn State led the Big Ten and ranked second among Power Five teams with 13 tight end receiving touchdowns.



WINNINGEST PROGRAMS

In its 137th season of varsity football, Penn State has posted 926 victories to rank No. 7 in the nation. The Lions' success is not solely due to longevity though, as Penn State also ranks in the top 10 in all-time winning

WIDE RECEIVER NOTES

- Offensive recruiting coordinator/wide receivers coach Marques
 Hagans is in his first season on the Penn State staff.
- Hagans joined the Penn State staff after serving as the associate head coach/wide receivers coach at Virginia for the previous 11 years. He was promoted to Associate Head Coach for the Cavaliers prior to the 2022 season.
- During his time at Virginia, Hagans coached 10 of the top 15 career receptions leaders in program history.
- Hagans was a four-year letterman at Virginia from 2002-05 and currently sits No. 10 all-time in passing yards with 4,877. He also ranks seventh in total offense with 5,779 yards.
- He was selected, as a receiver, in the fifth round (144th overall)
 of the 2006 NFL Draft by the St. Louis Rams. He spent three
 seasons with the Rams before being picked up by the Kansas
 City Chiefs and Indianapolis Colts in 2008. Hagans spent the
 2009 and 2010 campaigns with Washington.
- With redshirt senior Dante Cephas and junior KeAndre Lambert-Smith, Penn State was one of 28 FBS teams, and one of 18 Power Five teams, entering 2023 with at least two players with 1,000 career receiving yards on its roster.
- · Cephas is a member of the Biletnikoff Award watch list.
- Lambert-Smith has started 32 career games and owns 104 receptions for 1,450 yards and 10 touchdowns in his career.
- His 1,450 receiving yards rank 21st in program history and his 100 career receptions rank 18th at Penn State.
- He is averaging 13.9 yards per catch in his career and has 19 career receptions of 20+ yards.
- Lambert-Smith's 13.9 yards per catch ranks 34th among current FBS receivers with at least 100 career receptions.
- Against West Virginia, Lambert-Smith caught four passes for 123 yards and a career-best two touchdowns. He averaged 30.75 yards per reception.
- He hauled in a 72-yard touchdown reception on the opening drive. He added a 12-yard touchdown grab and a 30-yard reception.
- The Virginia native owns three career touchdown receptions of 70+ yards, with his 72-yard grab joining his 83-yard touchdown against Villanova in 2021 and his 88-yard touchdown reception against Utah in the 2023 Rose Bowl.
- Lambert-Smith is the only receiver in Penn State history with multiple 80-yard receptions.
- In the WVU game, Lambert-Smith recorded his second career 100-yard receiving game.
- He tied for a team high with six receptions and led the squad with 74 receiving yards against Delaware.
- Lambert-Smith made a career-high eight receptions against lowa, tallying 66 receiving yards and hauling in a 3-yard touchdown in the fourth quarter.
- The junior made grabs of 25 and 35 yards, while totaling four catches for 86 yards, at Northwestern.
- · Lambert-Smith notched six catches against UMass.
- In the Rose Bowl Game against Utah, he caught three passes for 124 yards, including an 88-yard touchdown grab.
- Lambert-Smith averaged a Penn State bowl-record 41.3 yards on three receptions in the Rose Bowl.

- The 88-yard touchdown reception is the longest pass play in Rose Bowl history and the fourth-longest passing play in Penn State history.
- Cephas joined the Nittany Lions as a transfer this past offseason, after spending the previous four years at Kent State.
- A two-time first-team All-MAC selection, Cephas has collected 152 receptions, 2,242 receiving yards and 12 touchdowns in his collegiate career.
- He ranks 17th among active FBS receivers with 2,242 career receiving yards and his 14.8 yards per catch sit fourth among current FBS receivers with at least 150 career receptions.
- The redshirt senior is one of 15 current FBS receivers with 150+ receptions, 2,240+ receiving yards and 12+ receiving touchdowns.
- Cephas has 10 career 100-yard receiving games and had a reception in 32-straight games before the streak was snapped against UMass.
- In his Penn State debut, against West Virginia, Cephas made a 22-yard grab, followed by two catches for 36 yards, including a 26-yard grab, against Delaware.
- The Pittsburgh native had a 13-yard catch at Illinois, an 11-yard reception vs. lowa and two catches for 21 yards at Northwestern.
- Cephas set a Kent State single-game record with 246 receiving yards, on 13 catches, at Ohio (10/1/22).
- Junior Malik McClain arrives in Happy Valley after transferring from Florida State.
- Against WVU, McClain had a career-best 58 yards, including 25-yard touchdown reception in the fourth quarter, and tied a career high with four receptions.
- McClain has 38 receptions for 460 yards and six touchdowns in his career
- Redshirt sophomore Harrison Wallace III earned his first career start in the West Virginia game.
- He has 32 catches for 415 yards and a touchdown in his career.
- Wallace recorded a career-high seven receptions and 72 receiving yards against the Mountaineers.
- He added three catches for 26 yards against Delaware and three receptions for 44 yards against UMass.
- Wallace made catches of 27 and 20 yards in the 2023 Rose Bowl Game against Utah.
- Redshirt sophomore Liam Clifford made two grabs for 25 yards against WVU and made his first career start against Delaware.
- Clifford had a career-long 33-yard reception late in the second quarter at Illinois.
- He had two grabs for 17 yards in the lowa contest and a 6-yard reception at Northwestern.
- Sophomore Omari Evans, junior Malick Meiga and redshirt freshman Kaden Saunders have each experienced significant playing time at Penn State.
- Evans had a 4-yard touchdown reception against Delaware.
- · Saunders had two catches for 19 yards in the Illinois game.
- Meiga has seven receptions for 104 yards and a touchdown in his PSU career and is a team captain in 2023.
- Redshirt freshman Cristian Driver made his first career reception against Delaware.

- Offensive line coach **Phil Trautwein** enters his fourth season at Penn State
- He was named to the American Football Coaches Association (AFCA) Class of 2021 "35 Under 35" list, recognizing the top-35 football coaches under the age of 35. He was the only Big Ten coach and the only offensive line coach on the 2021 list.
- In his four seasons at Penn State, Trautwein has helped 12 offensive linemen earn All-Big Ten honors, including five in 2022.
- He's coached 22 All-Conference selections over the last six seasons, which includes a stint at Boston College as the offensive line coach.
- Trautwein was a two-time All-SEC selection and two-time team captain as a left tackle at Florida, earning first-team honors in 2008 and second-team accolades in 2006.
- He was part of the Gators winning the BCS National Championship and SEC titles in the 2006 and 2008 seasons.
- Six Nittany Lion offensive linemen own at least five career starts.
- Junior Olumuyiwa Fashanu has appeared in 23 games and made 16 starts at left tackle.
- According to Pro Football Focus (PFF), Fashanu is the nation's highest-graded offensive lineman in pass protection, grading out at 93.4.
- He has allowed no sacks and just one pressure in 175 pass blocking snaps this season.
- Fashanu, a semifinalist for the William V. Campbell Trophy, owns an impressive 3.45 GPA in the supply chain and information systems major through Penn State's Smeal College of Business.
- He is also a member of the Lombardi Award, Outland Trophy and Walter Camp Player of the Year Award watch lists and was also selected Preseason All-America first team by the Associated Press and Pro Football Focus.
- Following the lowa game, Fashanu was named the Outland Trophy National Player of the Week.
- Redshirt senior Hunter Nourzad was an honorable mention All-Big Ten selection by the coaches and media in his first season in Happy Valley.
- Nourzad owns 34 collegiate starts and 37 career appearances.
- According to PFF, Nourzad has not given up a sack on 180 pass plays in 2023.
- Redshirt senior tackle Caedan Wallace has 33 starts and owns 40 career appearances.
- Redshirt senior Sal Wormley has started 19 games in 23 appearances.
- Through six games, according to PFF, Wormley has not allowed a sack in 171 pass plays.
- Wormley (coaches, media) was an honorable mention All-Big Ten selection in 2022.
- Redshirt junior JB Nelson made his first career start against West Virginia.
- Redshirt freshman **Olaivavega loane** earned his first career start against Delaware.
- According to PFF, loane has allowed only one sack on 130 pass plays this season.
- Sophomore **Drew Shelton** has appeared in 12 games and made five starts.
- Through six games in 2023, the Nittany Lions' offensive line has allowed just 34 pressures and three sacks.
- In 2023, Penn State ranks fifth in the nation in sacks allowed per game (0.67), seventh in tackles for loss allowed per game (3.67) and 15th in rushing offense (203.3).
- Penn State also ranks fifth in the country and leads the Big Ten averaging 44.3 points per game.
- Penn State tallied 478 total yards and threw for 332 yards against WVU.
- Between the final four drives of the West Virginia game and the first four drives of the Delaware game, Penn State scored on eight-straight possessions.

NITTANY LIONS IN THE NFL

- A total of 42 Penn State football alumni are populating the rosters of 27 National Football League teams.
- The Nittany Lions annually are among the top 20 programs nationally in producing players in the NFL. In addition, three former Nittany Lions are members of NFL coaching staffs.
- Nine players from PSU's 2022 squad are on NFL teams.

DEFENSIVE NOTES

- Manny Diaz is in his second season as Penn State's defensive coordinator and linebackers coach and was a Broyles Award semifinalist in 2022
- Diaz, who has 25 years of collegiate coaching experience, including three as a head coach and 14 as a defensive coordinator, joined PSU after spending six seasons (2016-21) at Miami, including three seasons as head coach (2019-21), where he coached the Hurricanes to three bowl appearances.
- The Nittany Lions placed three on the preseason Bronko Nagurski Trophy watch list with sophomore LB Abdul Carter, King and junior DE Chop Robinson all landing on the list.
- Since 2000, Penn State (40.6 ppg scored; 9.6 ppg allowed) and Miami's 2001 team (42.7 ppg scored; 9.8 ppg allowed) have averaged 40+ ppg and allowed fewer than 10 ppg in a season.
- Through six games in 2023, Penn State leads the country in total defense (193.7), passing defense (121.2), passing efficiency defense (80.73), first downs allowed (67) and sacks per game (4.5).
- The Nittany Lions rank second in the country in scoring defense (8.0) and rushing defense (72.5), fourth in third down conversion defense (26.5), fifth in tackles for loss per game (8.5), eighth in fumble recoveries (6), 14th in takeaways (13) and 29th in interceptions (7).
- Penn State has allowed a nation-best seven red zone chances this season
- Through six games, 19 Nittany Lions have recorded at least one tackle for loss and 15 have recorded at least one sack.
- Among FBS teams, Penn State has the most players (15) with at least 1.0 sacks this season, while being one of 15 teams with 19+ players with at least 1.0 tackles for loss this year.
- Penn State is allowing a nation-best 49.1 percent completion percentage (78-of-159) and just 4.57 yards per pass attempt.
- After the UMass game, Penn State has held five-straight opponents under 100 rushing yards (Delaware, 82; Illinois, 78; Iowa, 20; Northwestern, 45; UMass, 64).
- Penn State has a streak of 15-straight games with at least five tackles for loss. It is the second-longest streak in FBS behind James Madison's 17-game string.
- The Nittany Lions have recorded at least three sacks in 11-straight games, dating back to the Indiana game in 2022.
 The streak is tied with James Madison for the longest in the FBS.
- Penn State and JMU are the only FBS teams with 3+ sacks in every game this season.
- Over the last two seasons, Penn State has held opponents to under a 50 completion percentage in nine games, the nation's second-most in that span.
- Over the last two seasons, the Nittany Lions have allowed under 10 completions in four games, tied third-most in the nation.
- Since the start of the 2022 season, Penn State has forced 39 turnovers (21 interceptions, 18 fumbles), tied-fifth in the nation
- Penn State's 18 fumbles recovered over the last two seasons are ninth in the nation and most in the Big Ten, while the 21 interceptions are tied 19th.
- Penn State has recorded three or more takeaways in eight games over the last two seasons, tied third-most among FBS teams.
- Over the last two seasons, Penn State is 10-0 when forcing multiple takeaways in a game.
- Since the start of the 2022 season, Penn State is second in the nation in turnover margin, averaging a +1.16 margin (2.05 gained per game; 0.89 lost per game), best in the Big Ten.
- At Illinois, Penn State forced five takeaways, including four interceptions and a fumble recovery.
- The Nittany Lions forced turnovers on three-straight possessions (two fumbles, one interception) in the first quarter.
- Penn State forced takeaways on three-straight possessions for the first time since 2016 at Indiana (three fumbles).
- Penn State held lowa to four first downs, the fewest ever allowed by Penn State in a Big Ten game.

- After allowing lowa to get one first down on each of its first two
 possessions in the first quarter, Penn State held lowa without a

- Penn State's 334 sacks over the last nine years (2015-23) are fourth behind Clemson (390), Alabama (377) and Pitt (353).

 percent sack percentage (334 sacks on 3,433 pass plays), which
 ranks sixth in the FBS.
- Since 2014, Penn State has held opponents to seven or less points 28 times, tied fifth-most among FBS teams. Twenty of those 28 games have been against Big Ten opponents.
- Since 2015, Penn State has recorded 10 shutouts, tied secondmost among FBS teams. PSU also has the third-most shutouts (15) in the FBS since 2007.
- Penn State leads the FBS with seven shutouts against conference opponents since 2015.

- Since 2014, Penn State has held opponents under 100 rushing yards on 53 occasions, 10th-most among FBS teams, and have held opponents under 50 rushing yards in 20 games, tied ninthmost among FBS teams.
- Penn State has registered 10 or more tackles for loss 31 times since 2014, tied second-most among FBS teams.
- Since 2014, Penn State has collected six or more sacks in a game 17 times, most among FBS teams.

- Following a professional playing career in the NFL and the AAF, Barnes joined the Penn State coaching staff in 2020.
- During his three seasons working with the defensive line, Barnes helped coach 11 All-Big Ten defensive linemen, including three first-team selections and a second-team All-American.
- Barnes tutored defensive tackle PJ Mustipher, who was a two-time captain for the Nittany Lions and a three-time All-Big Ten honoree.
- During the 2022 season, Penn State led the Big Ten with 104 tackles for loss (T-4th nationally) and 42 sacks (T-6th).

- Senior Johnny Dixon has recorded 78 tackles, six tackles for loss, three sacks, four interceptions, 19 pass breakups, one forced fumble and one fumble recovery in his collegiate career.
- Dixon began the 2023 season with three solo tackles and two pass breakups against West Virginia.
- At Illinois, Dixon picked off a pass in the third quarter and returned it 21 yards, his longest career return.

- Assistant director of performance enhancement Tyrone Smith was a defensive tackle for Penn State and lettered during the 2014 season.
- Recruiting coordinator Alan Zemaitis letterman and three-time All-Big Ten selection for the blue and white from 2002-05. Zemaitis sits tied fifth all-time at Penn State with 12 career interceptions. He also holds fifth all-time at Penn State with 46 passes defended. Zemaitis helped the Nittany Lions to a Big Ten Championship in 2005.
- Director of Football Academic Services Todd Kulka lettered as a linebacker and graduated in 1995. He helped Penn State to a 9-3 record and an Outback Bowl victory in 1995.
- Director of the Football Letterman's Club Wally Richardson
 was a four-year letterman as a quarterback in 1992 and
 1994-96. Richardson ranks 12th all-time at Penn State with
 4,419 career passing yards. He also sits eighth all-time with
 378 completions and 12th all-time with 27 touchdown
 passes.

- Stacy Collins is in his second season as Penn State's special teams coordinator/outside linebacker/nickels coach. Collins has 25 years of collegiate coaching experience.
- Last season, Collins helped Chris Stoll to win the Patrick Mannelly Award, honoring the nation's top long snapper.
- According to Coaches By The Numbers, since 2019, Penn State's kick return defense ranks fifth in the nation in touchback percentage (72.2; 1st in B1G), fifth in percentage of kickoffs returned inside the 25 (74.6; 2nd), sixth in the nation in percentage of kickoffs returned (18.8; 1st) and 11th in average opponent field position (25.2; 4th).
- Since 2019, Penn State's punt return defense is second in the country in punts inside the 10 (18.6 percent; 2nd in B1G), ranked fifth in punts inside the 20 (43.4; 3rd) and eighth in net punting (41.2; 3rd).
- Since 2017, Penn State has scored nine special teams touchdowns (four kick return, five punt return), ranking second in the Big Ten.

- Senior P Riley Thompson is a member of the Ray Guy Award watch list.
- The senior landed a 47-yard punt at the Delaware 7 and, against UMass, booted a 47-yard punt to the UMass 10.
- He averaged 43.8 yards on six punts at Illinois, landing two punts inside the 20.
- In the Illinois game, Thompson went over 3,000 career punt yards.
- At Northwestern, Thompson averaged 46.8 yards on four punts, including a 50-yard boot and two punts inside the 20.
- Thompson has placed 32 career punts inside the 20 and eight punts inside the 10.
- Thompson has blasted 16 punts of 50+ yards in his career.
- All-Big Ten second team KR Nicholas Singleton scored on a 100-yard kickoff return at Rutgers in 2022, tied for the secondlongest kick return touchdown in program history.
- For his career, Singleton is averaging 22.8 yards per kick return, tied 19th all-time at Penn State.

- Hardy was named Big Ten Co-Special Teams Player of the Week.
- Redshirt sophomore SN Tyler Duzansky has appeared in 13 career games.
- LB Dominic DeLuca has been voted as a captain and was awarded No. 0 as the team's special teams leader.
- DeLuca deflected a punt against UMass for his second career punt block. His first came against Minnesota in 2022.

GAME RECAP

UNIVERSITY PARK, Pa. - No. 7 Penn State defeated West Virginia, 38-15, in front of 110,747 fans, the fourth-largest crowd in Beaver Stadium history and the largest in a home opener. The Nittany Lions outscored the Mountaineers, 24-8, in the second half to pull away for the season-opening

Drew Allar shined in his first game as Penn State's starting quarterback, completing 21 of his 29 pass attempts and finishing with 325 passing yards, three touchdowns and no interceptions. Allar and wide receiver KeAndre Lambert-Smith proved to be a strong connection all night, including a 72-yard touchdown on Penn State's opening possession of the game, the longest pass of Allar's career. Lambert-Smith tallied 123 receiving yards and a career-best two touchdown grabs on four catches.

The Nittany Lions totaled 478 yards of offense (332 passing, 146 rushing) in the well-balanced attack. The dynamic running back duo of Nicholas Singleton and Kaytron Allen combined for 121 yards (70 for Singleton, 51 for Allen). Singleton scored a rushing touchdown in the second quarter, highlighting his solid day on the ground. Malik McClain gained 58 yards and caught a touchdown and Harrison Wallace III added 72 yards on a team-high seven receptions to round out the receiving corps. Quarterback Beau Pribula scored his first collegiate touchdown with a five-yard run in the final seconds of the fourth quarter.

The Penn State defense held West Virginia's offense to just 15 points and 310 total yards, allowing the Mountaineers to convert only four of their 14 third-down attempts. The Nittany Lions made three fourth-down stops during the game and held West Virginia's passing attack to just 167 yards through

Linebackers Dominic DeLuca, Curtis Jacobs and Abdul Carter each recorded one sack apiece. Jacobs accumulated a team-best 10 tackles, while linebacker Kobe King notched five. Zakee Wheatley, Jaylen Reed and Cam Miller made four stops each.

HOW IT HAPPENED

Penn State forced a West Virginia punt on the opening drive of the ball game. The Penn State offense stepped up right away, capping off its first drive of the season with a 72-yard catch-and-run from Allar to Lambert-Smith.

West Virginia got on the board at the 14:14 mark of the second quarter, tying the game, 7-7. The Mountaineers scored on a 1-yard touchdown run by CJ Donaldson. The scoring drive went 69 yards on nine plays.

The Nittany Lions responded immediately, constructing a 10-play, 81-yard touchdown drive to retake a 14-7 advantage. Singleton put the Nittany Lions up on a 2-yard run. The Nittany Lions went into the break up 14-7.

Lambert-Smith hauled in his second touchdown of the ballgame for the first score of the second half. The 12-yard score put Penn State $\bar{\rm up}$ 21-7 with 8:36 left in the third quarter. The Nittany Lions' scoring drive lasted 3:26 as the offense used seven plays to march 56 yards into the end zone.

The Nittany Lion defense forced a turnover on downs on the next drive and the offense capitalized with a 25-yard field goal by Alex Felkins to extend the lead to 24-7.

Penn State's offense scored two more touchdowns in the final frame to put the game out of reach for the Mountaineers.

The first came on a 25-yard touchdown pass to McClain from Allar.

West Virginia cuts its deficit to 31-15 with 3:34 left in the game as Garrett Greene scored on a 1-yard run and then connected with Donaldson on a successful two-point conversion.

The final score was on Pribula's first career touchdown, a 5-yard quarterback keeper.

- Penn State improved to 49-9-2 all-time against West Virginia, including wins in five-straight matchups and 33 of the last 35
- Penn State is now 122-13-1 all-time in home openers and 113-22-2 all-time in season openers.

- RB Nicholas Singleton scored on a 2-yard run in the second quarter. It was his 13th career rushing touchdown.
- · Lambert-Smith earned his second career 100-yard receiving game. He finished the night with 123 yards and two touchdowns
- The junior upped his career touchdown receptions of 70+ yards to three, joining his 83-yard touchdown against Villanova in 2021 and his 88-yard touchdown reception against Utah in the 2023 Rose Bowl.
- WR Malik McClain hauled in a 25-yard touchdown reception in the fourth quarter for his sixth career touchdown catch.
- The Nittany Lions stopped West Virginia on three fourth-down conversion attempts
- LB Curtis Jacobs finished the game with 10 tackles. He recorded double-digit tackles in a game for the third time in his career.
- K Alex Felkins converted a 25-yard field goal in the fourth quarter and also hit two extra-points for his first points as a Nittany Lion.

GAME RECAP

UNIVERSITY PARK, Pa. - No. 7 Penn State football defeated Delaware, 63-7, on Saturday afternoon in Beaver Stadium. The Nittany Lions racked up 541 total yards and scored eight offensive touchdowns, while holding the Blue Hens to only 140 total yards and one touchdown.

Sophomore quarterback Drew Allar continued his outstanding start to the season, completing 22-of-26 passes for 204 yards and one touchdown. Redshirt freshman quarterback bear Pribula entered the game in the middle of the 3rd quarter and scored one rushing touchdown and one passing touchdown, his first career throwing score.

Nicholas Singleton and Kaytron Allen combined for 155 rushing yards and four touchdowns leading the Nittany Lion rushing attack that posted 315 yards on the afternoon. Through the air, Tyler Warren and Omari Evans hauled in touchdowns while KeAndre Lambert-Smith led the team with 74 receiving yards.

The Nittany Lions totaled an impressive 541 yards of offense (226 passing, 315 rushing). Penn State scored on its first four drives of the afternoon, putting the pressure on the Blue Hens early and often.

Defensively, the Nittany Lions had an impressive performance, holding the Blue Hens to just seven points and 140 total yards of offense, 66 of which came on one usuhing play. The defensive unit held Delaware to just five first downs in the game, tied for the fewest by an opposing offense since 2014.

Linebacker Dominic DeLuca recorded Penn State's first defensive touchdown of the season on the first career interception of his career in the late third quarter. DeLuca returned it all the way to the end zone for a pick-six. The defense also recovered one fumble, forced by Keaton Ellis and recovered by Kevin Winston Jr. Jaylen Reed, Zane Durant, and Zuriah Fisher each chipped in a sack

HOW IT HAPPENED

Penn State stopped the Blue Hens on the opening possession of the game and scored on the ensuing drive, going up 7-0 with 8:19 remaining in the first quarter. Singleton punched in the first Nittany Lion touchdown of the day on a 2-vard run.

Reed posted a third-down sack on Delaware's next trip down the field, forcing a punt and giving the Nittany Lion offense excellent field position. Allen found the end zone on a 4-yard rushing touchdown, giving the Nittany Lions a 14-0 lead.

Delaware answered with a 66-yard rushing touchdown by Marcus Yarns, cutting the Penn State lead back to seven.

Singleton scored two more rushing touchdowns in the first half, reaching a career-best three rushing scores in the game. The sophomore's third touchdown put the Nittany Lions up 28-7 with 4:36 remaining in the opening half

Penn State scored once more before the end of the half when Allar found Warren in the end zone for a 2-yard score with 22 seconds left to play in the second quarter.

The Penn State offense marched down the field and scored on the initial possession of the second half, going up 42-7 with just under 10 minutes remaining in the third quarter. Allar scored his first rushing touchdown of the season on a 1-yard sneak.

On the very next drive, Ellis forced a fumble that was picked up by Winston Jr. for the Nittany Lions' first takeaway of the season. Pribula entered the game and drove the Lions down the field and scored on a 6-yard rushing touchdown.

The Penn State defense followed with its first touchdown of the 2023 campaign on a DeLuca pick-six.

The Nittany Lions scored one more touchdown in the fourth quarter, a 4-yard pass from Pribula to Evans, to go up 63-7.

Note

- · In the first all-time meeting, Penn State defeated Delaware.
- Penn State scored on its first four drives: a 2-yard run by RB Nicholas Singleton, a 4-yard run by RB Kaytron Allen, a 5-yard run by Singleton and another 5-yard run by Singleton. The Nittany Lions scored on eight-straight drives, including the final four drives of the West Virginia game.
- The Nittany Lions scored on eight-straight drives for the first time since posting points on eight-straight drives against UMass on September 20, 2014.
- Penn State has recorded at least 30 points in nine-straight games, which is the longest streak in the nation.
- The Nittany Lions scored 35 points in the first half, it's the most points scored by a Penn State team in the opening half since scoring 42 points against Illinois in 2020.
- Penn State tallied 541 total yards, the most since notching 572 against Ohio in 2022. The Nittany Lions have posted 400+ total yards in nine-straight games.
- The Nittany Lions rushed for 315 yards, the most since rushing for 396 vs. Memphis in the 2019 Cotton Bowl.
- The Nittany Lions held the ball for a time of possession of 42:22.
 Since at least 2007, 42:22 is the longest time of possession Penn State has had in a game. It marked the first time Penn State had over 40 minutes of possession since 2020 at Indiana (40:22).
- During the opening drive of the third quarter, Allen went over the 1,000 career rushing yards mark. He became the 49th Penn State player to reach 1,000 career rushing yards. He now has 1,021 yards
- The Nittany Lions held Delaware to just 140 total yards, the fewest allowed by Penn State since giving up 134 to Maryland in 2022
- Penn State held Delaware to just 41 offensive plays, the fewest allowed by the Nittany Lions since holding Minnesota to 40 in a 20-0 win in 2009.

GAME RECAP

CHAMPAIGN, III. - No. 7 Penn State football took down Illinois, 30-13, on Saturday afternoon at Memorial Stadium. The Nittany Lions played complimentary football on both sides of the ball, fueled by five defensive takeaways.

The defense led the way for the Nittany Lions, recording its first fivetakeaway game in seven years. Penn State racked up four interceptions- by four different players- and a fumble recovery. Offensively, the Nittany Lions scored 20 points off of the five turnovers. Stout defense held the Illini in check all day, as the opposing rushing attack gained just 62 yards. Dominic DeLuca also forced the first fumble of his career, the first of

Dominic DeLuca also forced the first fumble of his career, the first of the Nittany Lions' five takeaways. Linebacker Abdul Carter, and cornerbacks Johnny Dixon, Daequan Hardy, and Cam Miller each secured interceptions.

Johnny Dixon, Daequan Hardy, and Cam Miller each secured interceptions.

On offense, quarterback Drew Allar posted yet another turnover-free outing, going 16-of-33 for 208 yards. Penn State's running backs were involved in all three offensive touchdowns on the afternoon. Kaytron Allen and Nicholas Singleton each recorded rushing scores, while Trey Potts tossed a touchdown pass to tight end Tyler Warren.

Singleton led the Nittany Lion receiving corps with three grabs and a career-best 49 yards through the air, with tight end Warren (3-35-1) and wide receiver Liam Clifford (1-33-0) complimenting his effort.

HOW IT HAPPENED

The Nittany Lions made their first splash play of the day on their second defensive drive as DeLuca forced a fumble that was picked up by Kobe King to give the ball back to the offense at the Illinois 43.

The Nittany Lions took the ball 40 yards on nine plays for a 20-yard field goal for the first score of the game, going up 3-0 with 5:27 to play in the opening quarter.

Penn State's defense forced its second turnover in two possessions with an interception by Carter, the first of his career, and he returned the ball to the Illinois 37. Alex Felkins knocked through a 45-yard field goal to increase the Nittany Lion lead to 6-0 with under two minutes remaining in the opening quarter.

The Nittany Lion defense recorded its third turnover in the first quarter on the Illini's next drive. Hardy picked off an Altmyer pass at the Penn State 43 and the offense proceeded to use 12 plays to march 57 yards for its first touchdown. Allen punched in the 4-yard score at the 11:04 mark of the second quarter.

Reggie Love III put the Illini on the board with a 5-yard touchdown run with 2:08 left to play in the half. Illinois constructed an 8-play, 68-yard drive for the score to cut the Nittany Lions' advantage to 13-7.

The Nittany Lions tacked on an additional field goal before halftime to go up 16-7 at the break. Allar found Clifford on a 33-yard strike to the Illinois 11 to set up the Felkins 28-yard field goal.

Penn State's defense made its presence felt right away in the second half. On Illinois' first possession, Dixon intercepted Altmyer at the Penn State 7 and returning his first interception of the season 21 yards to the Nittany Lions' 28.

The Nittany Lions broke through for their second touchdown of the afternoon to go up 23-7 at the 2:14 mark of the third frame. Potts caught a lateral from Allar and tossed an 11-yard touchdown pass to the tight end, Waren caping off 3-7-July (8-yard scoring drive)

Warren, capping off a 7-play, 68-yard scoring drive.

On the ensuing Illinois possession, the Nittany Lions intercepted Altmyer for the fourth time, this time by Miller. His pick at the Illinois 30 preceded the Nittany Lion offense's third touchdown of the game. Penn State wasted no time, scoring in just over a minute on a Nicholas Singleton 16-yard rushing touchdown. The back-to-back scoring drives saw the Nittany Lions go up 30-7 with 14:24 left to play in the game.

Illinois found the end zone one more time, scoring on a 19-yard reception by Malik Elzy from quarterback John Paddock late in the fourth quarter. A failed two-point conversion left the score at 30-13.

- The Nittany Lions are 17-14 all-time in Big Ten openers and 19-12 in Big Ten road openers.

GAME RECAP

UNIVERSITY PARK, Pa. - No. 7 Penn State Football dominated on both sides of the ball and registered a 31-0 victory against the No. 24/22 lowa Hawkeyes on Saturday evening in front of the second-largest crowd in Beaver Stadium history.

Penn State's defense stole the show, shutting out an AP Top 25 opponent for the first time since it did so in the 1999 Alamo Bowl against No. 18 Texas A&M. The Blue & White held lowa to just 76 total yards of offense, split between 50 passing yards and 26 on the ground. Linebackers Abdul Carter and Curtis Jacobs led the way with a trio of tackles apiece, while linebacker Dominic DeLuca, and defensive ends Chop Robinson, Amin Vanover and Dani Dennis-Sutton each forced fumbles on the night. Jacobs became the first Nittany Lion to recover a pair of fumbles in a single game since Mark D'Onofrio did so against Temple on Oct. 5, 1991.

The complementary outing saw PSU out-gain lowa by a 397-76 yardage tally in addition to a striking 97-33 differential in total plays. The Blue & White did an exemplary job of keeping lowa's offense off the field, winning the time of possession battle by over 30 minutes. Penn State finished the night 9-for-20 on third down, while lowa was held to a 1-for-9 conversion rate. Additionally, PSU was able to cash in on all four of their red zone opportunities, while the Nittany Lion defense held lowa without a red zone chance.

A balanced Penn State rushing attack, led by running back Kaytron Allen, gained 215 yards on the evening, with the Norfolk, Virginia, native responsible for 72 on his own. Quarterback Beau Pribula entered the game in the fourth quarter and finished with 55 yards on the ground while running back Nicholas Singleton tallied 49 yards highlighted by a game-high 19-yard scamper in the third quarter.

The Nittany Lions totaled 182 yards through the air, with quarterback Drew Allar responsible for 166 of those after completing 25 of his 37 passing attempts. Allar finished the night with four touchdown passes and zero interceptions. Wide receiver KeAndre Lambert-Smith hauled in eight receptions for 66 yards and a touchdown, while tight end Theo Johnson snagged six passes for 42 yards. Tight end Tyler Warren recorded a career-high two touchdown grabs and fellow tight end Khalil Dinkins recorded his first receiving touchdown of the 2023 campaign.

The Blue & White welcomed a sellout crowd of 110,830, the secondlargest attendance figure in Beaver Stadium history.

HOW IT HAPPENED

On lowa's second drive, Dennis-Sutton forced a fumble that was picked up by Jacobs at the Nittany Lion 18-yard line.

The Nittany Lion offense got on the board first, thanks to a 46-yard field goal by Alex Felkins. Felkins capped off a 17-play 53-yard scoring drive. Penn State took the 3-0 advantage with 1:35 remaining in the opening frame.

On the Nittany Lions' next drive, the Hawkeyes forced a punt, however Thompson's boot hit an lowa player on the fly and was recovered by Curtis Jacobs at the Hawkeye 39-yard line, sending the Penn State offense back on the field. Allar tossed a 9-yard touchdown pass to Dinkins, extending the lead to 10-0

On Penn State's opening drive of the second half, Allar led the Nittany Lions on a 15-play, 75-yard scoring drive. A 2-yard touchdown from Allar to Warren capped off the drive.

The Nittany Lions scored once again on Warren's second touchdown of the game, a 7-yard grab, with 1:01 left in the third quarter.

GAME RECAP

EVANSTON, III. – No. 6/7 Penn State breezed past Northwestern behind a dominant second half, winning 41-13 at Ryan Field on Saturday.

An outstanding defensive performance once again fueled the complimentary win for the Nittany Lions. Penn State limited Northwestern to just 175 total yards, including just 45 on the ground, compared to its own 353 total yards and 134 rushing yards.

The Nittany Lions posted seven sacks, an interception, and forced two turnovers on downs in the game on defense, putting pressure on Northwestern all afternoon. The unit yielded just three points in the second half and provided outstanding field position for many of the Nittany Lions' scoring opportunities.

Twenty-three Nittany Lions recorded tackles in the game, with Kevin Winston Jr. picking up a team-high five. Zane Durant led the squad with three tackles for loss. Daequan Hardy filled up the stat sheet with two tackles, an interception, a tackle for loss, and a pass breakup.

Offensively, Allar posted yet another turnover-free performance, completing 18-of-33 passes for 189 yards and a touchdown. Beau Pribula stepped in late in the game and completed his only pass for a 30-yard touchdown to Trey Potts. KeAndre Lambert-Smith led the team with 86 receiving yards on four catches while Nicholas Singleton caught a career-high six passes for 39 yards and a touchdown. Singleton led the way on the ground for Penn State, carrying the ball 21 times for 80 yards and another score.

HOW IT HAPPENED

Northwestern scored first on its opening possession of the game, the result of Penn State's first turnover of the season. After the Wildcats gained possession of the ball on Penn State's 15-yard line on a fumbled kickoff return, the Nittany Lion defense pushed them back four yards and forced a 33-yard field goal.

The Nittany Lions bounced back and evened it up at 3-3 with under three minutes to play in the first quarter on a 20-yard field goal by Alex Felkins.

With 5:16 remaining in the first half, the Wildcats were able to tack on a touchdown to take the lead back. Northwestern took 5:16 off the clock on its 10-play scoring drive that culminated in a 1-yard touchdown run by quarterback Ben Bryant.

The Nittany Lions responded immediately, creating their own six-play, 63-yard drive that was capped off by a 13-yard run by Potts. The teams entered the break tied 10-10.

Following a defensive stop on Northwestern's first possession of the second half, Penn State found the end zone once again. On fourth-and-goal from the 1-yard line, Allar was able to push his way into the end zone.

Penn State made it 17 unanswered points with a 47-yard field goal from Felkins, his second of the game, after the Nittany Lion defense forced a turnover on downs.

Another fourth-down stop in Northwestern territory led to Penn State's next score. The Wildcats attempted a fake punt, but fell short of the first down marker, giving the Nittany Lion offense possession of the ball at the 34. Allar tossed a 2-yard touchdown pass to Singleton to complete the scoring drive.

Northwestern was able to chip in a field goal early in the fourth quarter, cutting Penn State's lead down to two scores, at 27-13.

Singleton punched in another Penn State touchdown, this one with just over four minutes left to play in the game. A 13-play, 54-yard drive resulted in Singleton's 1-yard score, giving Penn State a 34-13 lead.

On the ensuing Northwestern drive, Hardy's interception gave the Nittany Lions possession at the Northwestern 30-yard line. It took just one play for Penn State to find the end zone, with Pribula finding Potts on a 30-yard catchand-run for the tally.

Notes

- Penn State is now 16-5 all-time against Northwestern, including 8-3 in road matchups.
- The Nittany Lions have won nine of the last 11 matchups in the series
- The Nittany Lions registered 12 tackles for loss. Penn State has a streak of 14-straight games with at least five tackles for loss. It is the second-longest streak in the FBS behind James Madison's 15-qame string.
- The Nittany Lions scored seven points off turnovers against Northwestern. Penn State has tallied 58 points off turnovers this season.
- With his ninth touchdown pass of the season, QB Drew Allar became the first PSU quarterback to throw for nine or more touchdown passes, before throwing an interception, in a season since Mike McQueary in 1997.
- The Ohio native has thrown 158 pass attempts this season without throwing an interception.
- RB Nicholas Singleton earned his first career game with both a rushing and receiving touchdown.
- RB Trey Potts found the endzone on a 13-yard run in the second quarter. It marked his 12th career rushing touchdown and his first in a Penn State uniform.
- Potts hauled in a 30-yard touchdown catch in the fourth quarter. It was his first career receiving touchdown.
- The Nittany Lions limited Northwestern to -10 rushing yards on 16 carries in the first half
- In the third quarter, Penn State stopped Northwestern on fourth down conversions on back-to-back drives.
- With 12 tackles for loss, Penn State has tallied 10 or more tackles for loss on 30 occasions since 2014.
- Penn State recorded seven sacks. Since 2014, Penn State has collected six or more sacks in a game 16 times.
- DT Zane Durant secured a career-high three tackles for loss.
- Durant is Penn State's first defensive tackle to record three or more tackles for loss against a Big Ten opponent since Curtis Cothran against Wisconsin in 2016.
- Durant is PSU's first defensive tackle to register three or more tackles for loss in a game since Tyrell Chavis against Akron in 2017
- CB Daequan Hardy picked off a pass in the fourth quarter and returned it 34 yards.
- P Riley Thompson averaged 46.8 yards on four punts, including two punts inside the 20.

GAME RECAP

UNIVERSITY PARK, Pa. – No. 6/5 Penn State dominated on both sides of the ball and secured a shutout victory over the UMass, 63-0, Saturday afternoon at Beaver Stadium.

Penn State's defensive unit put on a formidable performance, registering seven sacks to secure PSU's 11th-straight game with at least three, the nation's longest streak. Their relentless pressure kept UMass on its back foot throughout the game. In the second half, the Nittany Lion defense limited the Minutemen to zero points and dominated the field position battle, clinching the shutout victory and providing multiple scoring opportunities for the other side of the ball.

Twenty-eight Nittany Lions recorded tackles in the game. Adisa Isaac led the squad with 3.5 tackles for loss, including 2.5 of Penn State's seven sacks. Cam Miller, Chop Robinson, and Dani Dennis-Sutton all contributed to Penn State's sack total.

The offensive highlights included Drew Allar delivering another impressive performance, connecting on 16-of-23 passes, gaining 162 yards and throwing three touchdowns. Beau Pribula made an impact on the rushing front, recording 59 rushing yards and a touchdown.

Theo Johnson emerged as a key player with 66 receiving yards on four receptions for two touchdowns. Daequan Hardy made a significant impact becoming the first player in Penn State history to score two punt return touchdowns in a single game.

Penn State held UMass to just 26 yards in the first half and 109 total yards.

HOW IT HAPPENED

On UMass' second possession, the Nittany Lions only allowed the Minutemen to advance three yards before forcing a punt. On the punt, Hardy fielded the ball at the Penn State 44-yard line and scampered 56 yards for the touchdown.

Penn State's next offensive possession resulted in a 1-yard touchdown run by Allar, giving the Nittany Lions a 14-0 lead with 12:35 remaining in the half. The Nittany Lions scored their second rushing touchdown as Allen crossed

the goal line on a 9-yard score at the end of a seven-play, 80-yard drive.

Penn State scored on its third consecutive offensive possession, this time

n a 7-yard touchdown reception by Warren, going up 28-0 with just over a minute left to play in the first half.

In the third quarter, the Nittany Lions tacked on their fourth-straight

offensive touchdown of the day, a 30-yard dart from Allar to Johnson. Penn State scored once again on the Allar-Johnson connection. With 5:12 remaining in the third quarter, Allar tossed an 18-yard touchdown to Johnson to cap off an eight-play, 54-yard scoring drive. It marked Penn State's fifth-consecutive offensive touchdown and gave the Nittany Lions a 42-0 lead.

Following the ensuing UMass drive, Hardy set a Penn State record by scoring his second punt return touchdown of the game. Hardy broke multiple tackles on his way to the 68-yard score, giving Penn State a 49-0 advantage at the 3:57 mark of the third quarter.

A Keaton Ellis interception led to Penn State's sixth-straight offensive touchdown to put them up 56-0 with 13:37 left in the game. Pribula entered the game at quarterback and led a four-play, 49-yard scoring drive that was highlighted by a 2-yard rushing score by Potts.

Penn State tacked on one last touchdown in the fourth quarter, a 31-yard dash into the end zone by Pribula that put the Nittany Lions up 63-0. The squad held the lead through the final buzzer, securing its second shutout of

- Penn State is now 2-0 all-time against UMass.
- The Nittany Lions are 74-24-5 in homecoming games, including wins in 14 of the last 17 contests.
- Penn State has 11-straight wins, each by a 14-point margin of victory. Over the last two seasons, no other FBS team has won by a 14-point margin in more than six-straight games.
- The 11-straight wins by 14+ points are a school record and tied for 22nd all-time in FBS. It marks the most for a Big Ten team since 1904 (Michigan - 13).
- The 63-0 final score marked the largest shutout by Penn State since joining the Big Ten, and the largest shutout win since an 81-0 win vs. Cincinnati in 1991.
- The Nittany Lions recorded their second consecutive home shutout, marking the first time that Penn State has shut out its opponent in consecutive home games since 1981, when they shut out Cincinnati (52-0) and Temple (30-0) sandwiched around a 30-24 win at Nebraska.
- The seven points allowed in the past three home games are the fewest allowed by Penn State in three-straight home games since holding Cincinnati (0), Temple (0), and Boston College (7) to a total of seven points in three-straight home games in 1981.
- Penn State has not given up any points in 11 consecutive quarters at home since allowing a first quarter touchdown to Delaware in the second home game of the season.
- In the first half, Penn State recorded more sack yards (32) than UMass had total yards (26).
- Penn State registered 10 tackles for loss and five sacks in the first half. The Nittany Lions had 10 tackles for loss in the first half for the first time since Indiana in 2022 (13 tackles for loss).
- DE Adisa Isaac recorded a career high with 2.5 sacks and a career-best 3.5 tackles for loss.
- CB Cam Miller registered his first two career sacks, becoming Penn State's first defensive back to record multiple sacks in a game since Derek Bochna had two for the Nittany Lions at West Virginia in 1997
- PR Daequan Hardy returned a punt 56 yards for a touchdown in the first quarter and added a 68-yard punt return touchdown in the third quarter.
- Since 2000, Hardy is the 25th FBS player to return two punt returns for touchdowns in a game. He is one of two Big Ten players joining lowa's Kevonte Martin-Manley (vs. Western Michigan, 2013).
