# **INSIDE** THE GAME

## NO. 6/5 NITTANY LIONS WELCOME UMASS FOR HOMECOMING MATCHUP

- OPENING KICK: No. 6/5 Penn State hosts UMass for its 103rd homecoming game. Kickoff is set for 3:30 p.m. on Big Ten Network.
- SERIES HISTORY: Penn State meets UMass for the second time in program history. The first matchup came in 2014, a 48-7 Penn State win. The Nittany Lions tallied 464 total yards, including 228 on the ground. Penn State had five rushing touchdowns, including two each by Bill Belton and Zach Zwinak. Penn State held UMass to three rushing yards while collecting 10 tackles for loss and three sacks.
- HOMECOMING: The Nittany Lions are set to host their 103rd homecoming game. Penn State holds a 73-24-5 record in front of the alumni crowd, including wins in 14 of the last 17 games. PSU earned a 45-17 win over Minnesota in last year's homecoming contest.
- CREATING HAVOC: The Penn State defense is making its impact known in opposing backfields. Through
  five games, Penn State already has 18 different players who have recorded at least a full tackle for loss
  and 14 different players who have recorded at least a full sack. The Nittany Lions are the only FBS team
  with at least 14 players registering at least one sack this season. Penn State secured seven sacks at
  Northwestern, marking 10-straight games with at least three sacks, tied for the nation's longest streak.
  Since 2014, Penn State has posted six or more sacks in 16 games, tied for most in the FBS.
- PROTECTING THE BALL: Through the first five starts of his career, and his first 15 career games, Drew Allar has shown an ability to avoid interceptions. In his PSU career, Allar has thrown 218 pass attempts without an interception. In 2023, Allar, with 158 attempts, is the only FBS quarterback with 150+ pass attempts and no interceptions. Since 2000, he is one of 14 FBS quarterbacks, and the only Big Ten quarterback, with 150+ pass attempts and no interceptions through the first five games of a season.
- THE OPPOSITION: UMass is 1-6 this season after falling 41-24 against Toledo last Saturday. The Minutemen tallied 439 total yards, including 272 passing yards. Kay'Ron Lynch-Adams rushed for 157 yards and a touchdown, while Anthony Simpson caught seven passes for 140 yards and a score.

# HEAD COACH JAMES FRANKLIN

# CAREER AT A GLANCE

- Franklin was named the 16th head football coach in the storied history of the Nittany Lion program on January 11, 2014.
- He is one of six current FBS head coaches to lead his teams to a bowl game in each of his first nine seasons as a head coach and one of six to do so in 11 of their first 12 seasons.
- Franklin is one of four current Big Ten coaches (Ryan Day, Kirk Ferentz, Jim Harbaugh) to have won a Big Ten Championship and became the first African American head coach to win a Big Ten title after Penn State's 2016 victory.
- He joins Mack Brown (UNC), Jimbo Fisher (Texas A&M), Nick Saban (Alabama), Kirby Smart (Georgia) and Dabo Swinney (Clemson) as the only active coaches in college football to have won at least three New Year's Six or College Football Playoff games in their career.
- Franklin has led his teams to four Top 10 finishes (4 at Penn State) and seven Top 25 finishes (2 at Vanderbilt; 5 at Penn State).
- In the last seven seasons under Franklin, Penn State is one of six teams to rank in the top 12 of the CFP final rankings at least five times, joining Alabama, Clemson, Georgia, Ohio State and Oklahoma.
- From 2016-19, Franklin led the Nittany Lions to three New Year's Six bowls 2016 (Rose), 2017 (Fiesta) and 2019 (Cotton), making Penn State one of eight teams to accomplish the feat during the four-year span. Penn State last went to three New Year's Six bowls in four years in 1980-83 (1980 Fiesta, 1982 Fiesta, 1983 Sugar).
- Franklin guided Penn State to back-to-back New Year's Six bowls in 2016 (Rose) and 2017 (Fiesta) for the first time since 1985 (Orange) and 1986 (Fiesta).
- From 2016-19, Franklin led Penn State to 42 wins, the most in program history for the Big Ten era, and 28 league wins, a program record.
- Franklin has 28 years of coaching experience at the collegiate and NFL level.
- In his first 12 years as a head coach, Franklin mentored 90 players who have gone on to the NFL ranks.
- Franklin is first all-time in total wins and winning percentage by an FBS African American head coach (minimum 80 wins).

#### NITTANY LIONS ON THE FIELD

- Penn State defeated No. 8/7/10 Utah, 35-21, in the 109th Rose Bowl Game to cap off the 2022 season. The Nittany Lions reached the 11-win plateau for the 19th time in program history.
- Penn State earned a New Year's Day bowl berth against Arkansas in the Outback Bowl in 2021. With wins over No. 12/15 Wisconsin and No. 22/20 Auburn, Penn State tallied two wins over ranked teams within the first three games of the season for the first time in program history.
- In **2020**, with the emergence of young skill players on offense, true freshmen accounted for 1,486 of Penn State's 3,873 total yards (38 percent), marking a school record for most combined scrimmage yards by true freshmen in a single season.
- Penn State earned its third 11-win season in four years with an 11-2 record in 2019, including a win over No. 17 Memphis in the Goodyear
  Cotton Bowl Classic. The Nittany Lions posted their fourth-straight top 12 finish in the final CFP rankings, coming in 10th, and were ranked
  ninth in the final Associated Press and Amway Coaches polls to earn their 25th AP Top 10 finish. Franklin was a finalist for the Paul "Bear"
  Bryant National Coach of the Year award for the second time at Penn State (2016) and third time in his head coaching career.
- In 2018, the Nittany Lions posted their third-straight season with at least nine wins with a 9-4 overall record, earning a berth in the VRBO Citrus Bowl. Penn State finished No. 12 in the final CFP rankings and No. 17 in the Associated Press and Amway Coaches polls.
- Penn State climbed as high as No. 2 in the rankings in 2017 and appeared in a second-straight New Year's Six bowl, earning a 35-28 win
  over No. 11 Washington in the PlayStation Fiesta Bowl. At 11-2, the Nittany Lions earned back-to-back 11-win seasons for the fifth time in
  program history and first time since 2008 and 2009. Penn State finished the season No. 8 in the Associated Press and Amway Coaches polls
  and No. 9 in the final CFP rankings.
- Penn State surged in 2016, winning nine consecutive games en route to the Big Ten Championship, a Rose Bowl berth and an 11-3 overall record. Penn State finished the season ranked No. 5 in the College Football Playoff rankings and No. 7 in the Associated Press and Amway Coaches polls. It was Penn State's highest finish in the polls since 2005. The Lions claimed their fourth overall Big Ten Championship and first outright title since 1994 with a thrilling, 38-31 comeback win over Wisconsin in the Big Ten Championship Game. Franklin was honored as Sporting News National Coach of the Year and the Woody Hayes National Coach of the Year, as well as the Dave McLain Big Ten Coach of the Year and Associated Press Big Ten Coach of the Year.
- Franklin guided the Nittany Lions to a 7-6 record in 2015 and a berth in the TaxSlayer Bowl.
- Franklin's first season in 2014 was bookended with a pair of thrilling victories for the Nittany Lions. It began with a final-play 26-24 victory
  over UCF in Dublin, Ireland, in Penn State's first-ever international game and ended with a comeback, a 31-30 overtime win over Boston
  College in the New Era Pinstripe Bowl in Yankee Stadium. Franklin became just the third Penn State coach to lead the team to at least seven
  wins in his first season, joining Dick Harlow (1915) and Bill O'Brien (2012), and he guided the Nittany Lions to a 4-0 start, joining Harlow as
  the only first-year Penn State coaches to win their initial four games.

#### NITTANY LIONS IN THE CLASSROOM

- The Nittany Lions posted their first 1,000 single-year APR in program history in 2018-19, topping the previous high of 993 in 2014-15.
- Sean Clifford (2021) and Trace McSorley (2018) were selected as a National Football Foundation (NFF) Scholar-Athletes and finalists for the Campbell Trophy, known as the "Academic Heisman." They are the 18th and 19th Nittany Lions to be selected as an NFF Scholar-Athlete.
- In 2019, punter Blake Gillikin took home CoSIDA Academic All-America® first-team honors for the second-straight year to become the 12th two-time first-team selection in Penn State history. He graduated with a perfect 4.0 grade-point average in May.
- Gillikin's two first-team CoSIDA Academic All-America honors increase Penn State football's total to 67 honorees, which ranks second in Division I football history (FBS and FCS).
- Tyler Yazujian collected a berth on the CoSIDA Academic All-America® first team in 2016 after an appearance on the second team in 2015.
- A program-record 10 Nittany Lions were named 2020-21 Big Ten Distinguished Scholars, besting the previous mark of nine set a year earlier.

## NITTANY LIONS IN THE COMMUNITY

- The Nittany Lions are active in the community, participating in activities such as Uplifting Athletes, THON, Pennsylvania Special Olympics Summer Games, State College Area Food Bank and Penn State Hershey Children's Hospital visits.
- On June 15, 2020, Franklin was named to the Big Ten Anti-Hate and Anti-Racism Coalition.
- As part of the Cotton Bowl festivities in 2019, Franklin and his family made a \$10,000 financial commitment to the Dallas Children's Hospital.
- In August 2019, Franklin was named a Penn State University Renaissance Fund honoree, which awards outstanding community members for helping students in need.

- In 2006, UMass went 13-2, won the Atlantic-10 championship and made an appearance in the FCS National Championship game.
- · In 2007, the Minutemen won the Colonial Athletic Association (CAA) and reached the FCS Quarterfinals.
- Before returning to UMass, Brown served as defensive coordinator at Arizona (2021), Michigan (2016-20), Boston College (2013-15), UConn (2011-12) and Maryland (2009-10).

#### SCOUTING THE MINUTEMEN

- UMass is 1-6 this season, including a 41-30 win over New Mexico in its 2023 opener.
- · The Minutemen dropped a 41-24 decision against Toledo last Saturday
- UMass tallied 439 yards, including 272 through the air.
- QB Taisun Phommachanh completed 20-of-31 passes for 272 yards and two touchdowns, while Kay'Ron Lynch-Adams rushed for 157 yards and a score.
- On the season, the UMass offense ranks 84th in the FBS in scoring (26.1 ppg), 65th in total offense (396.4 ypg), 53rd in passing offense (253.7) and 85th in rushing offense (142.7).
- Phommachanh (788 yards, 3 TD) has started four games at quarterback this season.

#### LAST MEETING NITTANY LIONS RUSH PAST UMASS, 48-7

UNIVERSITY PARK, Pa. - The Nittany Lions used a balanced offensive attack and relentless defense on the way to a 48-7 win over UMass. The Nittany Lions rushed for 228 yards, led by Bill Belton, who scored twice and

had 76 yards on seven carries. Zach Zwinak also scored twice, while Akeel Lynch added a team-best 81 yards and one touchdown.

Christian Hackenberg threw for 179 yards to lead the air attack. Redshirt freshman D.J. Crook saw his first collegiate action, going 6-for-9 for 57 yards and a touchdown. Geno Lewis continued his strong start with five catches for 82 yards, while DaeSean Hamilton added four catches for 65 yards.

The Nittany Lion defense was stellar, holding UMass to three yards rushing thanks in part to 10 tackles for a loss, including three sacks. Mike Hull led the unit again with six tackles and forced fumble.

After the Minutemen missed a 39-yard field goal, Penn State put together a 53-yard drive over 15 plays that led to a 42-yard field goal by Ficken

The Penn State defense forced a three-and-out on the next UMass drive and Lynch reeled off a 46-yard run to kick-start the PSU drive. The Lions advanced the ball four more yards before yielding to Ficken for his second field goal of the game, this time from 40 yards out, to take a 6-0 lead.

Following a three-and-out for UMass, the Nittany Lions capped the first-half scoring with Zwinak's second touchdown of the half on a 1-yard run to make it 34-0

Penn State with 1:24 on the clock. Penn State picked up in the second half where it left off in the first with a

defensive three-and-out to open the frame. Lynch's number was called again as he broke free for a 15-yard touchdown run to give the Lions the 41-0 lead with 8:10 left in the third.

The Lions added to their lead as Crook connected with Brent Wilkerson for an 11-yard touchdown catch to increase the lead to 48-0.

The Minutemen got on the board to open the fourth quarter with a 77-yard touchdown to cut the Penn State lead to 48-7.

- PSU won 13 consecutive games against Big Ten opponents from 2016-17, breaking its record of 12 from 1993-94.
- Penn State owns a 240-117-3 mark against Big Ten Conference teams since the Nittany Lions first opposed Ohio State in 1912.
- The Nittany Lions began play as a member of the Big Ten Conference in 1993 and have a 156-93 mark.
- Penn State played 109 games vs. the current Big Ten alignment when either or both Penn State itself (prior to 1993) or the opponent (Nebraska prior to 2011; Maryland and Rutgers prior to 2014) was not yet a member of the Big Ten. The Nittany Lions went 80-26-3 in those games.

# TEAM NOTES

## **GENERATIONS OF GREATNESS**

- Penn State is turning back the clock for its "Generations of Greatness" game, as the Nittany Lions will don uniforms with design elements from uniforms past.
- Penn State is wearing its "Generations of Greatness" uniforms for the sixth time in the last seven seasons. The threads debuted in 2017 against Indiana (W, 45-14) and Penn State donned them again against Purdue in 2019 (W, 35-7), lowa in 2020 (L, 21-42), Illinois in 2021 (L, 18-20, 90T) and Minnesota in 2022 (W, 45-17).

# **Uniform Elements**

- Numbers on Helmets The Nittany Lions had the number on the side of their helmet from 1959-61 and then again from 1967-74. A No. 42 also appeared on the side of every Penn State helmet in the season finale against Wisconsin in 2012 to honor injured senior Michael Mauti.
- Block Uniform Numbers The block uniform numbers are similar to those uniform numbers that donned the Blue & White from mid-1950s-66.
- White Stripe on Sleeve Penn State's uniform had a white stripe on the sleeve several times, including 1957-66, 1982-89 and 1992-2011.
- Stripe on the Pants The Nittany Lions had a blue stripe on their pants from 1952-68.
- Gray Facemask The gray facemask was donned by the Nittany Lions from 1959-86.
- White Cleats The white cleats were worn by the Nittany Lions in the 1979 Sugar Bowl.
- Gloves The gloves will feature the Lion Shrine on the palm of the hands.
- Lion Shrine The image of Lion Shrine appears on the "home plate" of the front of the jersey. It is an original element of the "Generations of Greatness" uniform to pay homage to the Lion Shrine that was a gift from the Class of 1940.
- Back Inside Collar The back inside collar of the jersey reads "Penn State 1959" in recognition of the first Liberty Bowl game, played in Philadelphia. Penn State defeated Alabama, 7-0.

## SUCCESS ON HOMECOMING

- The Nittany Lions own a 73-24-5 record in 102 games in front of the alumni crowd since their 14-7 victory over Dartmouth in the first Homecoming game on Oct. 9, 1920.
- In 2022, Penn State won 45-17 against Minnesota, which also served as last year's Penn State White Out game.
- Penn State has won eight out of its last 11 Homecoming tilts, defeating Minnesota (2022), Purdue (2019), Rutgers (2017), Maryland (2016), Indiana (2015), Michigan (2013), Northwestern (2012) and Purdue (2011).
- The Nittany Lions have claimed 14 of their last 17 contests in front of the alumni crowd.

#### STREAKING

- Penn State has won 10-straight games, each by a 14-point margin of victory. Over the last two seasons, no other FBS team has won by a 14-point margin in more than six-straight games.
- The 10-straight wins are tied with Air Force for the fourthlongest active streak in the FBS.
- Penn State has recorded at least 30 points in 12-straight games, which is the longest active streak in the nation.
- Dating back to the Rutgers game in 2022, Penn State has scored in 32-straight quarters, the longest active streak in the nation.
- Penn State has not allowed a first-drive touchdown in the last 19 games, dating back to the Michigan State game in 2021.
- Penn State has a streak of 14-straight games with at least five tackles for loss. It is the second-longest streak in FBS behind James Madison's 15-game string.
- The Nittany Lions have recorded at least three sacks in 10-straight games, dating back to the Indiana game in 2022. The streak is tied with James Madison for the longest in the FBS.
- Penn State has not allowed a special teams touchdown in 53-straight games, dating back to the start of the 2019 season.

- Penn State has won 17 consecutive games against teams that are not members of a Power Five conference.
- Penn State has won 18 consecutive games over non-conference opponents during the regular season, dating back to a win over Temple in 2016.
- Penn State has won 23-straight non-conference home games, dating back to a win over Kent State in 2013.

- Leonard, Trautwein and UMass defensive backs Michael Livingston also coached together at Boston College from 2013-14. Livingston was a graduate assistant.
- Leonard, Trautwein and UMass assistant head coach/special teams coordinator/defensive line coach Ben Albert also coached together at Boston College from 2013-15. Albert was the defensive line coach.
- Penn State associate head coach/defensive recruiting coordinator/cornerbacks coach Terry Smith and Albert coached together at Temple in 2013. Smith was the wide receivers coach, while Albert was the outside linebackers coach.
- Leonard and Albert coached together at Temple in 2012.
   Leonard was the tight ends coach and Albert was the outside linebackers coach.
- Penn State co-defensive coordinator/safeties Anthony Poindexter and UMass analyst Jim Reid coached together at Virginia from 2010-12. Poindexter was the safeties coach/ special teams coordinator and Reid was the assistant head coach/defensive coordinator.
- Trautwein and Reid coached together at Boston College from 2018-19. Trautwein was the offensive line coach, while Reid was the defensive coordinator/defensive ends coach.
- UMass wide receivers coach Matt Zanellato played at Penn State from 2011-15. He played in 39 games at Penn State and was an Academic All-Big Ten selection, while earning the team's public service award in 2015.
- Penn State defensive line coach **Deion Barnes** (2012-14) and co-offensive coordinator/tight ends coach **Ty Howle** (2009-13) both played with Zanellato at Penn State.

## NORTHWESTERN POSTGAME NOTES

- Penn State extended its win streak to six games against Big Ten West teams.
- The Nittany Lions have won nine of the last 11 matchups in the series against Northwestern.



# TEAM NOTES

- With his ninth touchdown pass of the season, Allar became the first PSU quarterback to throw for nine or more touchdown passes, before throwing an interception, in a season since Mike McQueary in 1997.
- The Nittany Lions limited Northwestern to -10 rushing yards on 16 carries in the first half.
- In the third quarter, Penn State stopped Northwestern on fourth down conversions on back-to-back drives.
- Penn State limited Northwestern to 175 total yards and 45 rushing yards.
- Penn State tallied 12 tackles for loss and seven sacks.
- With the seven sacks, since 2014, Penn State has collected six or more sacks in a game 16 times.

## **IOWA POSTGAME NOTES**

- The Nittany Lions improved to 9-6 in full-stadium Penn State White Out games.
- Since 2014, Penn State is 42-1 when leading by 10+ points at halftime.
- Penn State recorded a shutout against an AP Top 25 team for the first time since the 1999 Alamo Bowl against No. 18 Texas A&M (24-0).
- Penn State held the ball for 45:27 to lowa's time of possession of 14:33. In the second half, Penn State held the ball for 24:14 to lowa's 5:46 (13:26 to 1:34 in the third quarter).
- Penn State had 97 offensive plays to 33 for lowa. According to TruMediaSports, in the past five seasons, no other FBS team has out-snapped its opponent by 60+ plays.
- Penn State scored on drives of 17, 10 15 and 12 plays. The last time Penn State had four scoring drives of 10+ plays was against Ohio State in 2021.
- Penn State held lowa to four first downs, the fewest allowed by the Nittany Lions since giving up just two to Eastern Illinois in 2009 and the fewest ever allowed by Penn State in a Big Ten game.
- The Nittany Lions limited the Hawkeyes to just five plays in Penn State territory.
- After allowing lowa to get one first down on each of its first two possessions in the first quarter, Penn State held lowa without a first down for the next seven drives.
- Penn State held lowa to 76 yards of offense, the fewest ever allowed by Penn State in a Big Ten game.
- Penn State held lowa to 20 yards rushing, the fourth-lowest since 2014, and 56 passing yards, the seventh-lowest total allowed under James Franklin.
- Penn State held lowa to just one third-down conversion on nine attempts, the fewest third-down conversions allowed by the Nittany Lions since holding Idaho to a 1-15 mark in 2019.
- LB **Curtis Jacobs** recovered a fumble in the first quarter and recovered a muffed punt in the second quarter.
- Jacobs became the first Penn State player to recover two fumbles in a game since Mark D'Onofrio against Temple on October 5, 1991.
- After lowa's first fumble of the game (9:09 first quarter), Penn State held the ball for 80 of the next 96 plays. Iowa had -5 yards over its 16 plays.

#### ILLINOIS POSTGAME NOTES

- The Nittany Lions improved to 17-14 all-time in Big Ten openers and 19-12 in Big Ten road openers.
- Penn State scored 20 points off turnovers, including its first 13 points of the game.
- In the third quarter, RB Trey Potts threw an 11-yard touchdown pass to TE Tyler Warren.
- Potts became Penn State's 11th non-quarterback (12 occasions) to throw for a touchdown.
- The Nittany Lions forced turnovers on three-straight possessions (two fumbles, one interception) in the first quarter.
- Penn State forced takeaways on three-straight possessions for the first time since 2016 at Indiana (three fumbles).
- Penn State recorded takeaways in the first quarter on a fumble forced by LB Dominic DeLuca and recovered by LB Kobe King, an interception by LB Abdul Carter and an interception by CB Daequan Hardy.
- The Nittany Lions forced two takeaways in the third quarter on an interception by CB Johnny Dixon and an interception by CB Cam Miller.
- Penn State recorded four interceptions in a game for the first time since November 15, 2014 against Temple.
- The Nittany Lions forced five takeaways in a game for the first time since September 16, 2017 against Georgia State (two fumbles, three interceptions).

#### **DELAWARE POSTGAME NOTES**

- Penn State scored on its first four drives. Adding to scoring on the final four possessions of the WVU game, the Nittany Lions scored on eight-straight drives, including the final four drives of the West Virginia game.
- The Nittany Lions scored on eight-straight drives for the first time since posting points on eight-straight drives against UMass on September 20, 2014.
- The Nittany Lions scored 35 points in the first half, it's the most points scored by a Penn State team in the opening half since scoring 42 points against Illinois in 2020.
- Penn State ran 91 offensive plays and held the ball for a time of possession of 42:22, marking the longest time of possession Penn State had in a game since at least 2007.
- RB Nicholas Singleton scored a career-high three rushing touchdowns.
- LB Dominic DeLuca recorded a 26-yard pick-six in the third quarter.
- Penn State held Delaware to just 41 offensive plays, the fewest allowed by the Nittany Lions since holding Minnesota to 40 in a 20-0 win in 2009.
- The Nittany Lions held Delaware to just 140 total yards, 58 passing yards and 82 rushing yards.
- Penn State held Delaware to just five first downs and just six completions.

#### HOME SWEET HOME

- With a 313-80 all-time record in Beaver Stadium, Penn State owns the sixth-best record in its venue amongst current FBS schools and leads the Big Ten.
- Penn State averaged 107,379 fans in seven games at Beaver Stadium in 2022, marking the fifth-highest average attendance in program history and the highest mark since 2008 (108,254).
- The Nittany Lions welcomed 110,747 fans to Beaver Stadium against West Virginia, marking the fourth-highest crowd in its history and the most since Sept. 29, 2018 against Ohio State (110,889).
- The 2023 Penn State White Out attendance was 110,830, which is the second-largest crowd in Beaver Stadium history behind only the 110,889 from the 2018 Penn State White Out game against Ohio State.
- Only Alabama (.839) and Oklahoma (.816) have higher winning percentages in facilities older than Beaver Stadium.

# WEST VIRGINIA POSTGAME NOTES

- The Nittany Lions have won five-straight matchups in the series and 33 of the last 35 contests.
- Penn State is now 122-13-1 all-time in home openers, including wins in 20 of the last 22, and 113-22-2 all-time in season openers.
- PSU welcomed 110,747 fans to Beaver Stadium, marking the fourth-highest crowd in its history and its largest crowd for a home opener.
- The Nittany Lions scored on their opening drive of the season for the first time since 2020 at Indiana. QB Drew Allar tossed a 72-yard touchdown pass to WR KeAndre Lambert-Smith.
- Allar became the first Penn State quarterback to throw for at least 300 yards in a season opener since Christian Hackenberg's 454 passing yards against UCF in 2014.
- The sophomore was the first Penn State quarterback to throw for at least 300 yards in his first career start since Michael Robinson threw for 379 yards vs. Wisconsin in 2003.
- Allar's 300 passing yards and three passing touchdowns marked the 25th time a PSU quarterback has done that in a game.
- The Nittany Lions stopped West Virginia on three fourth-down conversion attempts.
- LB Curtis Jacobs finished the game with 10 tackles. He recorded 10+ tackles in a game for the third time in his career.

#### LIONS UNDER THE LIGHTS

- The 2023 season marks the 23rd-straight with at least one regular-season night game on the schedule.
- · Penn State will play at least three night games in 2023.
- The Nittany Lions opened the 2023 season against West Virginia with a 7:30 p.m. kickoff on NBC. Penn State earned a 38-15 win.
- Penn State tallied a 31-0 win against Iowa in the annual Penn State White Out Game. It was broadcast at 7:30 p.m. on CBS.
- The Nittany Lions will close out the regular season on Friday, Nov. 24 against Michigan State with a 7:30 p.m. kickoff on NBC.
- Penn State is 61-32 at night all-time. The figure breaks down to 21-11 at home, 28-14 on the road and 12-7 in neutral site games. Penn State is 1-1 at regular season neutral sites, 11-6 in bowl games and 1-0 in conference championship games.
- In 2019, Penn State played its most regular season night games in program history with four primetime tilts.
- On Oct. 12, 2013, the Lions claimed the longest game in Big Ten history when they edged Michigan under the lights, 43-40, in four overtimes in front of a sellout Beaver Stadium crowd of 107,844 on Homecoming.

#### OVERTIME OVER TIME

- College football introduced overtime during the bowl season in 1995 and adopted it for regular season games in 1996. Since then, Penn State has played 15 overtime games, including six over the 2012-14 seasons.
- Ten of the 15 overtime tilts have come at home, three in true road games, one in the 2006 Orange Bowl and one in the 2014 Pinstripe Bowl.
- Penn State is 8-7 all-time in overtime games, with a 5-5 record at Beaver Stadium, 1-2 mark in true road games and 2-0 in contests at a neutral site.
- Penn State's first two overtime contests came vs. Iowa in 2000 and 2002 at home. The Nittany Lions dropped their first three contests that went to the extra period, but won five straight overtime contests before falling to Nebraska on Nov. 23, 2013.

#### ON TV

- Penn State has had 352 of its last 354 games televised, including 248 consecutive games.
- Over the last 15 seasons, every Penn State game has aired on either ABC, BTN, CBS, NBC, Peacock or an ESPN or FOX channel.
- Penn State has made 331 regular season TV appearances since 1995, which is tied for the national lead.
- Penn State's game against Delaware was streamed on Peacock, the Nittany Lions' first ever exclusively on a streaming platform.
- Penn State's matchup in the 2023 Rose Bowl Game against Utah drew 10.19 million viewers as the most-watched bowl game outside of the College Football Playoff.
- The 2022 Penn State-Ohio State matchup drew 8.27 million viewers. It was the second most-watched game between two Big Ten schools last season and the seventh-highest viewed regular season game of 2022.

# **OFFENSIVE** NOTES

- Since the start of the 2016 season, Penn State's offense is second in the Big Ten in scoring offense (34.92;13th nationally) and total offense (425.45; 32nd), and is third in touchdown percentage (31.77; 18th), points per possession (2.17; 20th), scoring percentage (40.65; 22nd), yards per pass attempt (7.84; 32nd) and yards per play (6.00; 41st).
- Penn State's offense has been explosive since the 2016 campaign, as it leads the Big Ten in 80-plus yard play percentage (0.20; T-1st nationally) and 70-plus (0.38; 4th) and holds third in 20-plus (7.49; 28th), 30-plus (3.45; 30th), 40-plus (1.92; 19th), 50-plus (0.94; 44th) and 60-plus (0.53; 27th).
- The Nittany Lions have tallied at least 55 plays of 20 or more yards in seven of the last eight seasons (86 in 2022; 57 in 2021; 63 in 2019; 73 in 2018; 85 in 2017; 91 in 2016; 67 in 2015). PSU had 52 plays of 20 or more yards in 2020 (9-game schedule).
- Additionally, the Nittany Lions are third in the Big Ten and 19th nationally in 15-plus yard passing play percentage since 2016 (19.17 percent).
- With 41 points against Northwestern, the Nittany Lions extended its streak of 30+ points to 12-straight games, the nation's longest streak.
- It marks the fifth time in Big Ten history a team has strung together 12 or more games of 30+ points. The only other time Penn State went 12-straight games with 30+ points in program history was 1993-94, when it scored 30+ points in a schoolrecord 15-straight games.
- Dating back to the Rutgers game in 2022, Penn State has scored in 32-straight quarters, the longest active streak in the nation.
- The Nittany Lions posted 400+ total yards in nine-straight games, before snapping the streak against Illinois.
- Penn State has not committed an offensive turnover this season, the only team in the FBS to have not done so.
- QB Drew Allar (158) is the only FBS quarterback with 150+ pass attempts and no interceptions in 2023.
- Since 2000, Allar is one of 46 FBS quarterbacks (48 occasions) to start a season with 158+ pass attempts an no interceptions.
- Allar joins Michigan's Drew Henson (175; 2000) and Purdue's Kyle Orton (174; 2004) as the only Big Ten quarterbacks, since 2000, to start a season with 158+ pass attempts and no interceptions.
- Penn State has surpassed 200 yards rushing 40 times in the James Franklin era. PSU is 35-5 in those games.
- Since 2014, Penn State has recorded 200 passing yards on 78 occasions. Penn State is 58-20 in those games.
- Since 2014, Penn State has tallied 400 total yards on 65 occasions. Penn State is 53-12 in those games.
- Since the start of the 2022 season, Penn State is second in the nation in turnover margin, averaging a +1.28 margin (2.11 gained per game; 0.83 lost per game), best in the Big Ten.
- Over the last two seasons, Penn State is averaging a nationbest 9.56 points per game off turnovers and has 58 points off turnovers in 2023.
- In 2023, Penn State ranks 11th in the country and leads the Big Ten averaging 40.6 points per game.

- The Nittany Lions lead the nation in average time of possession (36:07) and rank sixth in sacks allowed per game (0.6).
- Penn State is 19th in the country in red zone offense (92.9%).
- PSU ranks 44th in the nation in total offense (430.4) and 26th in rushing offense (194.8), sitting second and third in the Big Ten, respectively.
- The Nittany Lions have tallied 128 first downs through the first five games, holding 40th nationally and third in the conference.
- Penn State scored on each of its final four possessions of the WVU game, including three touchdowns, and on the first four drives of the Delaware game, posting points on eight-straight drives for the first time since September 20, 2014 against UMass.
- Against Iowa, Penn State held the ball for 45:27 to the Hawkeyes' 14:33 time of possession. In the second half, Penn State held the ball for 24:14 to Iowa's 5:46.
- Penn State had 97 offensive plays to 33 for lowa. According to TruMediaSports, in the past five seasons, no other FBS team has out-snapped its opponent by 60+ plays.
- The 97 plays by the Nittany Lions were the most since Penn State ran 99 offensive plays at Iowa in 2017.
- Penn State scored on drives of 17, 10 15 and 12 plays against the Hawkeyes. The last time Penn State had four scoring drives of 10+ plays was against Ohio State in 2021.
- Against Northwestern, Allar became the first PSU quarterback to throw for nine or more touchdown passes, before throwing an interception, in a season since Mike McQueary in 1997.
- Mike Yurcich is in his third season as Penn State's offensive coordinator/quarterbacks coach.
- Yurcich (California University (Pa.)) and Franklin (East Stroudsburg) both played in the Pennsylvania State Athletic Conference (PSAC).
- As an FBS offensive coordinator, offenses under Yurcich have averaged 6.30 yards per play, ranking first among OC's since 2013 and 13.53 yards per completion, which is also first in that time frame.
- Since 2013, Yurcich's offenses have scored 50 or more points 28 times and 40 or more points 59 times (44.4 percent of games coached), both of which are tops among FBS offensive coordinators since 2013.
- His teams have averaged an FBS-best 55.5 touchdowns per year and 29.55 passing touchdowns per season.
- Penn State has scored 40 points 29 times since 2016. By comparison, from 2008 until 2015, the Nittany Lions had 18 40-point outings.

# **QUARTERBACK NOTES**

- Offensive coordinator Mike Yurcich also heads the Penn State quarterback room.
- Four quarterbacks Yurcich coached in college are currently on NFL rosters (Sean Clifford - Penn State, Sam Ehlinger – Texas, Justin Fields – Ohio State, Mason Rudolph – Oklahoma State).
- Yurcich served as the passing game coordinator and quarterbacks coach at Ohio State in 2019, where quarterback Justin Fields was a finalist for the Heisman Trophy, Walter Camp Player of the Year Award and Davey O'Brien Award.
- Sophomore quarterback Drew Allar is on the Davey O'Brien Award watch list.
- Through five games in 2023, Allar has completed 64.6 percent of his passes for 1,092 yards and nine touchdowns, while rushing for two scores.
- In his career, Allar's 62.8 completion percentage (137-of-218) is the all-time best at Penn State (minimum 200 pass attempts).
- Allar's 64.6 completion percentage in 2023 ranks third in a season at Penn State (minimum 100 pass attempts).
- Allar has started his career with 218 pass attempts without an interception.
- In 2023, Allar (158) is the only FBS quarterback with 150+ pass attempts and no interceptions this season.
- Since 2000, Allar is one of 46 FBS quarterbacks (48 occasions) to start a season with 158+ pass attempts an no interceptions.
- He joins Michigan's Drew Henson (175; 2000) and Purdue's Kyle Orton (174; 2004) as the only Big Ten quarterbacks, since 2000, to start a season with 158+ pass attempts and no interceptions.
- Allar ranks third in the Big Ten in passing touchdowns (9), completions per game (20.4) and completion percentage (64.6), fourth in passing efficiency (141.4), fifth in passing yards per game (218.4), sixth in the Big Ten in passing yards (1,092) and seventh in total offense per game (234.0).
- In his first career start, against West Virginia, Allar completed 21-of-29 passes for 325 yards and three touchdowns.
- Allar became the first Penn State quarterback to throw for at least 300 yards in a season opener since Christian Hackenberg's 454 passing yards against UCF in 2014 and the first Penn State quarterback to throw for at least 300 yards in his first career start since Michael Robinson threw for 379 yards vs. Wisconsin in 2003.
- Allar's 300 passing yards and three passing touchdowns marked the 25th time a PSU quarterback has done so in a game.

- The sophomore earned Big Ten Offensive Player of the Week honors following the West Virginia game.
- Against Delaware, Allar completed 22-of-26 passes for 204 yards and a touchdown, while adding a 1-yard rushing score.
- At Illinois, he threw for 208 yards for his third career 200-yard passing game and went over 1,000 career passing yards. He has 1,436 career yards.
- The Ohio native set a career high with four passing touchdowns against lowa, while completing 25 passes for 166 yards.
- At Northwestern, Allar completed 18-of-33 passes for 189 yards and a touchdown, while adding a 1-yard rushing score.
- He notched his second career game with both a passing and rushing touchdown.
- With his ninth touchdown pass of the season, Allar became the first PSU quarterback to throw for nine or more touchdown passes, before throwing an interception, in a season since Mike McQueary in 1997.
- Quarterback Beau Pribula also enters his second season with the Nittany Lions after redshirting his rookie season.
- In 2023, Pribula has completed six passes for 75 yards and two touchdowns, while rushing for 166 yards and two scores.
- Against WVU, Pribula completed his first career pass attempt for seven yards. He also scored on a 5-yard touchdown run.
- In the Delaware game, Pribula completed 3-of-5 passes for 22 yards and a touchdown. He added 46 yards and a touchdown on eight carries.
- The redshirt freshman tallied nine carries for 47 yards at Illinois and rushed for a career-best 55 yards against lowa.
- At Northwestern, Pribula completed his only pass attempt to RB Trey Potts for a 30-yard touchdown.
- Freshman Jaxon Smolik made his collegiate debut in the Delaware contest.
- The youthful quarterback room replaces Sean Clifford, who finished his career as Penn State's all-time leader in wins as a starting quarterback (32), completion percentage (.614), completions (833), passing yards (10,661), total yards (11,734), passing touchdowns (86) and pass attempts (1,356).
- Additionally, Clifford closed his career finishing third in passing efficiency (143.8), tied for sixth in yards per passing attempt (7.9) and eighth in touchdown percentage (6.34).

# **ACADEMIC** SUCCESS

- The Nittany Lions had 32 players selected as Academic All-Big Ten in Fall 2022.
- Sean Clifford was a 2021 National Football Foundation (NFF) Scholar-Athlete and finalist for the Campbell Trophy, known as the "Academic Heisman". He is the 19th Nittany Lion to be selected as an NFF Scholar-Athlete.
- Penn State posted its first 1,000 single-year APR in program history in 2018-19, topping the previous high of 993 in 2014-15.
- In 2019, punter Blake Gillikin took home CoSIDA Academic All-America® first-team honors for the second-straight year to become the 12th two-time first-team selection in Penn State history. He graduated with a perfect 4.0 grade-point average in May 2020.
- Gillikin's two first-team CoSIDA Academic All-America honors increase Penn State football's total to 67 honorees, which ranks second in Division I football history (FBS and FCS).

#### DEGREES ON THE WALL

- Entering the 2023 season, five Nittany Lions have earned a collegiate degree.
- Smith Vilbert graduated in August 2023 with his bachelor's degree in telecommunications and media studies.
- **Dvon Ellies** earned his bachelor's degree in telecommunications in Spring 2023. He is pursuing a second degree in journalism.
- Hunter Nourzad earned his bachelor's degree in engineering from Cornell and is working on his master's of business administration.
- Dante Cephas graduated from Kent State with his bachelor's degree in educational studies. He is pursuing a second degree in telecommunications.
- Alex Felkins earned his bachelor's degree from Columbia in psychology. He is pursuing a graduate certificate in business management foundations.

# **RUNNING BACKS NOTES**

- Co-offensive coordinator/running backs coach Ja'Juan Seider has 15 years of college coaching experience, including 12 at the Power Five level.
- As a player at Florida A&M, Seider won the Doug Williams Award for National Offensive Player of the Year, Jake Gaither Award (considered the Heisman Trophy of Historically Black Colleges) and earned All-America honors after throwing for 2,622 yards and 27 touchdowns and rushing for 740 yards and 14 touchdowns in 1999.
- A loaded running back room is led by dynamic sophomores Kaytron Allen and Nicholas Singleton and redshirt senior Trey Potts.
- Allen (1,174), Singleton (1,344) and Potts (1,300) each have over 1,100 career rushing yards.
- Penn State is one of seven FBS teams, and the only Big Ten team, with three career 1,100 yard rushers on its roster.
- In 2022, Singleton (1,061 rushing yards) and Allen (867 rushing yards) became the first freshmen teammates in Big Ten history to both rush for 700+ rushing yards in a season.
- Allen and Singleton are the only Penn State duo to each rush for 850+ yards in a season and one of three 800+ rushing yard duos.
- Since 2000, Allen and Singleton are one of two FBS freshman duos to each rush for 850+ yards in a season, joining West Virginia's Steve Slaton (1,128) and Pat White (952) in 2005.
- Allen and Singleton are both on the Doak Walker Award watch list, while Singleton is also on watch lists for the Maxwell Award, Paul Hornung Award and Walter Camp Player of the Year Award.
- Singleton was also named a second-team preseason All-American by Sporting News and a Pro Football Focus Preseason All-America honorable mention.
- He was selected as a True Freshman All-American by On3, 247Sports and College Football News in 2022.
- Singleton was named the Big Ten Thompson-Randle El Freshman of the Year and was selected third-team All-Big Ten by the coaches and media and was also tabbed the AP Big Ten Newcomer of the Year.
- Allen was an honorable mention All-Big Ten selection in 2022 by the media and was a True Freshman All-American by College Football News.
- Singleton owns 1,344 career rushing yards, ranking 34th alltime at Penn State, and 18 career rushing touchdowns.
- He ranks third in the Big Ten in rushing touchdowns (6; 24th nationally), third in total touchdowns (7; 19th) and fifth in allpurpose yards (100.0; 64th).
- The sophomore started the 2023 season with 70 rushing yards and a 2-yard touchdown rush against West Virginia.
- On a 10-yard run in the first quarter, Singleton surpassed 1,500 career all-purpose yards. He has 1,995 all-purpose yards.
- Against Delaware, Singleton scored a career-high three rushing touchdowns.
- He found the end zone on a 2-yard rushing touchdown on Penn State's opening drive of the game, and a pair of 5-yard scores in the second quarter, marking his sixth career game with multiple rushing touchdowns.
- At Illinois, Singleton scored on a 16-yard rush in the fourth quarter, while adding a career-high 49 receiving yards on three catches and 54 kick return yards for a total of 140 allpurpose yards.
- Against lowa, Singleton gained 49 yards on the ground and added a pair of catches.
- Singleton tallied a team-high 21 carries and 80 rushing yards at Northwestern, tying a career high for carries.
- Against the Wildcats, the sophomore scored on a 1-yard run in the fourth quarter and a 2-yard reception in the third quarter, giving him his first career game with both a rushing and receiving touchdown.
- He had a career-high six receptions for 39 yards in the contest.
- Singleton rushed for 1,061 yards as a freshman, trailing only Saquon Barkley (1,076; 2015) for the most by a Penn State freshman.

- In 2022, he became the 16th Nittany Lion to rush for 1,000 yards in a season and the third PSU freshman running back to reach 1,000 yards.
- Singleton's 12 rushing touchdowns in 2022 are a Penn State freshman record.
- Allen has 1,174 career rushing yards and 12 career rushing touchdowns.
- In 2023, Allen ranks eighth in rushing yards per game (61.4) and 10th in yards per carry (4.45).
- Against West Virginia, he rushed for 51 vards on 10 carries.
- In the Delaware game, Allen rushed for 103 yards on 19 carries, marking his third career 100-yard rushing game.
- Allen scored on a 4-yard rushing touchdown in the first quarter against the Blue Hens.
- During the opening drive of the third quarter, he went over the 1,000 career rushing yards mark. He became the 49th Penn State player to reach 1,000 career rushing yards.
- Allen rushed for a team-high 54 yards at Illinois and scored on a 4-yard rushing touchdown in the second quarter.
- Allen led PSU with 72 rushing yards against lowa. He added three receptions.
- At Northwestern, Allen averaged 4.5 yards per carry.
- He rushed for 867 yards and 10 touchdowns on 167 carries in 2022, while adding 20 receptions for 188 yards and a touchdown.
- His 867 rushing yards are the fourth-most by a Penn State freshman in a season.
- Potts joined the Nittany Lions in Summer 2023 after transferring from Minnesota.
- In his collegiate career, Potts owns 1,300 rushing yards and 12 touchdowns on 258 carries in 29 games (five starts).
- In 2023, he has rushed for 105 yards (5.5 yards per carry) and a touchdown, while adding two receptions for 46 yards and a score.
- Potts is one of four FBS players in 2023 with a passing, rushing and receiving touchdown joining Kansas State's Will Howard, Kansas State's Treshaun Ward and UCF's Timmy McClain.
- Potts had five carries against West Virginia in the 2023 opener.
- He rushed for 59 yards on seven carries, including a 20-yard rush, in the Delaware game.
- In the win at Illinois, Potts threw an 11-yard touchdown pass to Tyler Warren. Potts is Penn State's 11th non-quarterback (12 occasions) to throw for a touchdown.
- At Northwestern, Potts scored on a 13-yard run and a 30-yard reception. The rushing score was his first as a Nittany Lion and the receiving touchdown was the first of his collegiate career.
- It also marked his first career game with both a rushing and receiving touchdown.
- Redshirt senior Tank Smith has 38 career carries, including 23 in 2022.
- Smith tied a career high with six carries and set a career high with 29 rushing yards against Delaware.
- Redshirt sophomore Tyler Holworth tallied six carries last season and earned three carries in the Delaware contest.

# TIGHT ENDS NOTES

- Co-offensive coordinator and tight ends coach **Ty Howle** is in his third season coaching the Penn State tight ends and his fourth season overall on the staff.
- Howle served as an offensive analyst in 2020, working closely with the offensive line and tight ends.
- He was a four-year letterwinner on the Penn State offensive line from 2009-13. He started at center and left guard and was a four-time Academic All-Big Ten selection. He was a team captain in 2013.
- In 2023, Penn State tight ends have combined for 27 receptions, 225 receiving yards and five touchdowns.
- Juniors Theo Johnson (10) and Tyler Warren (3), and redshirt sophomore Khalil Dinkins (1) have combined for 14, 20-plus yard receptions in their careers.
- Johnson, who is on the Mackey Award watch list, has 55 receptions for 698 yards and five touchdowns in his Penn State career.
- He made two grabs for 32 yards at Illinois, including a 19-yard reception in the first quarter and a 13-yard reception to setup a Penn State touchdown in the third quarter.
- The junior had a career-high six receptions for 42 yards in the win over lowa.
- Warren has 29 career receptions for 299 yards and eight touchdowns, while adding two rushing scores.
- In 2023, Warren is tied for third among FBS tight ends with four touchdown receptions.
- According to Coaches By The Numbers, Warren is tied first among tight ends in red zone catches (6) and ranks second in red zone targets (9).
- His four touchdown receptions are third in the Big Ten.
- The junior had a career-high six receptions against Delaware, doubling his previous career high.
- Warren hauled in a 2-yard touchdown in the second quarter in the win over the Blue Hens.
- The Virginia native caught three passes for 35 yards and a touchdown at Illinois.
- In the third quarter, Warren recorded an 11-yard touchdown catch on a throw from RB Trey Potts.
- Warren hauled in a pair of touchdowns against lowa.
- He caught a 2-yard touchdown midway through the third quarter and a 7-yard touchdown grab late in the third quarter.
- Dinkins made a 9-yard touchdown catch in the second guarter against Iowa. It was his second career touchdown catch.
- Brenton Strange was selected by the Jacksonville Jaguars in the second round of the 2023 NFL Draft. Penn State's fourth tight end drafted since 2015, tied for the third-most in the FBS.
- In 2022, Penn State led the Big Ten and ranked second among Power Five teams with 13 tight end receiving touchdowns.
- PSU was one of three schools, joining Oregon and San Jose State, with four different tight ends catching a touchdown pass this season.
- Among Power Five schools, Penn State ranked seventh in receiving yards (866), eighth in tight end receiving yards per game (66.6) and 10th in receptions (66).



# WINNINGEST PROGRAMS

In its 137th season of varsity football, Penn State has posted 925 victories to rank No. 7 in the nation. The Lions' success is not solely due to longevity though, as Penn State also ranks in the top 10 in all-time winning percentage.

# WIDE RECEIVER NOTES

- Offensive recruiting coordinator/wide receivers coach Marques Hagans is in his first season on the Penn State staff.
- Hagans joined the Penn State staff after serving as the associate head coach/wide receivers coach at Virginia for the previous 11 years. He was promoted to Associate Head Coach for the Cavaliers prior to the 2022 season.
- During his time at Virginia, Hagans coached 10 of the top 15 career receptions leaders in program history.
- Hagans was a four-year letterman at Virginia from 2002-05 and currently sits No. 10 all-time in passing yards with 4,877. He also ranks seventh in total offense with 5,779 yards.
- He was selected, as a receiver, in the fifth round (144th overall) of the 2006 NFL Draft by the St. Louis Rams. He spent three seasons with the Rams before being picked up by the Kansas City Chiefs and Indianapolis Colts in 2008. Hagans spent the 2009 and 2010 campaigns with Washington.
- With redshirt senior Dante Cephas and junior KeAndre Lambert-Smith, Penn State was one of 28 FBS teams, and one of 18 Power Five teams, entering 2023 with at least two players with 1,000 career receiving yards on its roster.
- Cephas is a member of the Biletnikoff Award watch list.
- Lambert-Smith has started 31 career games and owns 98 receptions for 1,420 yards and 10 touchdowns in his career.
- His 1,420 receiving yards are rank 22nd in program history.
- He is averaging 14.5 yards per catch in his career and has 19 career receptions of 20+ yards.
- · Lambert-Smith's 14.5 yards per catch ranks 27th among FBS receivers with at least 95 career receptions.
- Against West Virginia, Lambert-Smith caught four passes for 123 yards and a career-best two touchdowns. He averaged 30.75 yards per reception.
- He hauled in a 72-yard touchdown reception on the opening drive. He added a 12-yard touchdown grab and a 30-yard reception.
- The Virginia native owns three career touchdown receptions of 70+ yards, with his 72-yard grab joining his 83-yard touchdown against Villanova in 2021 and his 88-yard touchdown reception against Utah in the 2023 Rose Bowl.
- Lambert-Smith is the only receiver in Penn State history with multiple 80-yard receptions.
- In the WVU game, Lambert-Smith recorded his second career 100-yard receiving game.
- He tied for a team high with six receptions and led the squad with 74 receiving yards against Delaware.
- Lambert-Smith made a career-high eight receptions against lowa, tallying 66 receiving yards and hauling in a 3-yard touchdown in the fourth quarter.
- The junior made grabs of 25 and 35 yards, while totaling four catches for 86 yards, at Northwestern.
- In the Rose Bowl Game against Utah, he caught three passes for 124 yards, including an 88-yard touchdown grab.
- Lambert-Smith averaged a Penn State bowl-record 41.3 yards on three receptions in the Rose Bowl.
- The 88-yard touchdown reception is the longest pass play in Rose Bowl history and the fourth-longest passing play in Penn State history.

- Cephas joined the Nittany Lions as a transfer this past offseason, after spending the previous four years at Kent State.
- A two-time first-team All-MAC selection, Cephas has collected 152 receptions, 2,242 receiving yards and 12 touchdowns in his collegiate career.
- He ranks 14th among active FBS receivers with 2,242 career receiving yards and his 14.8 yards per catch sit third among current FBS receivers with at least 150 career receptions.
- The redshirt senior is one of 13 current FBS receivers with 150+ receptions, 2,240+ receiving yards and 12+ receiving touchdowns.
- Cephas has 10 career 100-yard receiving games and has a reception in 32-straight games.
- In his Penn State debut, against West Virginia, Cephas made a 22-yard grab, followed by two catches for 36 yards, including a 26-yard grab, against Delaware.
- The Pittsburgh native had a 13-yard catch at Illinois, an 11-yard reception vs. Iowa and two catches for 21 yards at Northwestern.
- Cephas set a Kent State single-game record with 246 receiving yards, on 13 catches, at Ohio (10/1/22).
- Junior Malik McClain arrives in Happy Valley after transferring from Florida State.
- Against WVU, McClain had a career-best 58 yards, including 25-yard touchdown reception in the fourth quarter, and tied a career high with four receptions.
- McClain has 38 receptions for 460 yards and six touchdowns in his career.
- Redshirt sophomore Harrison Wallace III earned his first career start in the West Virginia game.
- Wallace recorded a career-high seven receptions and 72 receiving yards against the Mountaineers.
- He added three catches for 26 yards against Delaware, giving him 29 catches for 371 yards and a touchdown in his career.
- Wallace made catches of 27 and 20 yards in the 2023 Rose Bowl Game against Utah
- Redshirt sophomore Liam Clifford made two grabs for 25 yards against WVU and made his first career start against Delaware.
- Clifford had a career-long 33-yard reception late in the second quarter at Illinois.
- He had two grabs for 17 yards in the lowa contest and a 6-yard reception at Northwestern.
- Sophomore Omari Evans, junior Malick Meiga and redshirt freshman Kaden Saunders have each experienced significant plaving time at Penn State.
- Evans had a 4-yard touchdown reception against Delaware.
- · Saunders had two catches for 19 yards in the Illinois game.
- Meiga has seven receptions for 104 yards and a touchdown in his PSU career and is a team captain in 2023.
- Redshirt freshman Cristian Driver made his first career reception against Delaware.

# **OFFENSIVE LINE** NOTES

- Offensive line coach **Phil Trautwein** enters his fourth season at Penn State.
- He was named to the American Football Coaches Association (AFCA) Class of 2021 "35 Under 35" list, recognizing the top-35 football coaches under the age of 35. He was the only Big Ten coach and the only offensive line coach on the 2021 list.
- In his four seasons at Penn State, Trautwein has helped 12 offensive linemen earn All-Big Ten honors, including five in 2022.
- He's coached 22 All-Conference selections over the last six seasons, which includes a stint at Boston College as the offensive line coach.
- Trautwein was a two-time All-SEC selection and two-time team captain as a left tackle at Florida, earning first-team honors in 2008 and second-team accolades in 2006.
- He was part of the Gators winning the BCS National Championship and SEC titles in the 2006 and 2008 seasons.
- Six Nittany Lion offensive linemen own at least five career starts.
- Junior Olumuyiwa Fashanu has appeared in 22 games and made 15 starts at left tackle.
- According to Pro Football Focus (PFF), Fashanu is the nation's highest-graded offensive lineman in pass protection, grading out at 92.9.
- He has allowed no sacks and just one pressure in 155 pass blocking snaps this season.
- Fashanu, a semifinalist for the William V. Campbell Trophy, owns an impressive 3.45 GPA in the supply chain and information systems major through Penn State's Smeal College of Business.
- He is also a member of the Lombardi Award, Outland Trophy and Walter Camp Player of the Year Award watch lists and was also selected Preseason All-America first team by the Associated Press and Pro Football Focus.
- Following the Iowa game, Fashanu was named the Outland Trophy National Player of the Week.
- Redshirt senior Hunter Nourzad was an honorable mention All-Big Ten selection by the coaches and media in his first season in Happy Valley.
- Nourzad owns 33 collegiate starts and 36 career appearances.
- According to PFF, Nourzad has not given up a sack on 130 pass plays in 2023.
- Redshirt senior tackle Caedan Wallace has 32 starts and owns 39 career appearances.
- Redshirt senior **Sal Wormley** has started 18 games in 22 appearances.
- Through five games, according to PFF, Wormley has not allowed a sack in 152 pass plays.
- Wormley (coaches, media) was an honorable mention All-Big Ten selection in 2022.
- Redshirt junior JB Nelson made his first career start against West Virginia.
- Redshirt freshman Olaivavega loane earned his first career start against Delaware.
- According to PFF, loane has not allowed a sack on 104 pass plays this season.
- Sophomore Drew Shelton has appeared in 11 games and made five starts.
- Through five games in 2023, the Nittany Lions' offensive line has allowed just 33 pressures and two sacks.
- In 2023, Penn State ranks sixth in the nation in sacks allowed per game (0.6), 11th in tackles for loss allowed per game (3.8) and 26th in rushing offense (194.8).
- Penn State also ranks 11th in the country and leads the Big Ten averaging 40.6 points per game.
- Penn State tallied 478 total yards and threw for 332 yards against WVU.

# **DEFENSIVE** NOTES

- Manny Diaz is in his second season as Penn State's defensive coordinator and linebackers coach and was a Broyles Award semifinalist in 2022.
- Diaz, who has 25 years of collegiate coaching experience, including three as a head coach and 14 as a defensive coordinator, joined PSU after spending six seasons (2016-21) at Miami, including three seasons as head coach (2019-21), where he coached the Hurricanes to three bowl appearances.
- CB Joey Porter Jr. and CB Kalen King were tabbed secondteam All-America by the Walter Camp Football Foundation, while Porter added second-team All-America honors from the AFCA, AP & FWAA.
- The Nittany Lions placed three on the preseason Bronko Nagurski Trophy watch list with sophomore LB Abdul Carter, King and junior DE Chop Robinson all landing on the list.
- Through five games in 2023, Penn State leads the country in total defense (210.6), passing defense (136.4), passing efficiency defense (86.5) and first downs allowed (58).
- The Nittany Lions rank second in scoring defense (9.6), third in the country in sacks (4.0), sixth in rushing defense (74.2), eighth in fumble recoveries (6), eighth in third down conversion defense (26.2), 10th in takeaways (12), 15th in tackles for loss (7.4) and 34th in interceptions (6).
- Through five games, 18 Nittany Lions have recorded at least one tackle for loss and 14 have recorded at least one sack.
- Among FBS teams, Penn State has the most players (14) with at least 1.0 sacks this season, while being one of 15 teams with 18+ players with at least 1.0 tackles for loss this year.
- Penn State is allowing a 50.7 percent completion percentage (69-of-136) and just 5.01 yards per pass attempt.
- After the Northwestern game, Penn State has held four-straight opponents under 100 rushing yards (Delaware, 82; Illinois, 78; lowa, 20; Northwestern 45).
- Penn State has a streak of 14-straight games with at least five tackles for loss. It is the second-longest streak in FBS behind James Madison's 16-game string.
- The Nittany Lions have recorded at least three sacks in 10-straight games, dating back to the Indiana game in 2022. The streak is tied with James Madison for the longest in the FBS.
- Penn State and JMU are the only FBS teams with 3+ sacks in every game this season.
- Over the last two seasons, Penn State has held opponents to under a 50 completion percentage in eight games, the nation's third-most in that span.
- Since the start of the 2022 season, Penn State has forced 38 turnovers (20 interceptions, 18 fumbles), good for fourth in the nation.
- Penn State's 18 fumbles recovered over the last two seasons are fifth in the nation and most in the Big Ten, while the 20 interceptions are tied 21st.
- Penn State has recorded three or more takeaways in eight games over the last two seasons, tied third-most among FBS teams.
- Over the last two seasons, Penn State is 10-0 when forcing multiple takeaways in a game.
- Since the start of the 2022 season, Penn State is second in the nation in turnover margin, averaging a +1.28 margin (2.11 gained per game; 0.83 lost per game), best in the Big Ten.
- In the Delaware game, LB Dominic DeLuca recorded a 26-yard pick-six in the third quarter.
- At Illinois, Penn State forced five takeaways, including four interceptions and a fumble recovery.
- Penn State gained five takeaways in a game for the first time since 2017 against Georgia State and recorded four interceptions in a game for the first time since 2014 against Temple.
- The Nittany Lions forced turnovers on three-straight possessions (two fumbles, one interception) in the first quarter.
- Penn State forced takeaways on three-straight possessions for the first time since 2016 at Indiana (three fumbles).
- Penn State limited Illinois to 62 rushing yards.

- Including four fumble recoveries against lowa and an interception at Northwestern, Penn State has forced 10 takeaways in the last three games.
- Penn State held lowa to four first downs, the fewest ever allowed by Penn State in a Big Ten game.

- Penn State held lowa to just one third-down conversion on nine attempts.
- Jacobs recovered a fumble in the first quarter and a muffed punt in the second quarter, becoming first Penn State player to recover two fumbles in a game since Mark D'Onofrio against Temple on October 5, 1991.
- The Nittany Lions limited Northwestern to -10 rushing yards on 16 carries in the first half.
- In the third quarter, Penn State stopped Northwestern on fourth down conversions on back-to-back drives.
- Penn State recorded 12 tackles for loss and three sacks against the Wildcats.
- DT Zane Durant secured a career-high three tackles for loss and became Penn State's first defensive tackle to record three or more tackles for loss against a Big Ten opponent since Curtis Cothran against Wisconsin in 2016.
- Over the last nine seasons, PSU sits first nationally in fewest passing TDs allowed per game (0.98), second in sacks per game (3.09; trailing only Clemson) and QB hurries (977), fourth in total pressures generated (1,485), fourth in tackles for loss percentage (10.81), fifth in fewest passing yards per attempt (6.18) and 10th in fewest rushing yards per attempt (3.54).
- Penn State's 327 sacks over the last nine years (2015-23) are fourth behind Clemson (390), Alabama (373) and Pitt (349).
- Over the last nine years, Penn State has accumulated a 8.66 percent sack percentage (327 sacks on 4,592 plays), which ranks fifth in the FBS.
- Since 2014, Penn State has held opponents to seven or less points 27 times, tied fifth-most among FBS teams. Twenty of those 27 games have been against Big Ten opponents.
- Since 2015, Penn State has recorded nine shutouts, tied thirdmost among FBS teams. PSU also has the third-most shutouts (14) in the FBS since 2007.
- Penn State leads the FBS with seven shutouts against conference opponents since 2015.
- Since 2014, PSU has held an opponent under 300 total yards 54 times, seventh-most among FBS teams.
- Since 2014, the Nittany Lions have allowed less than 200
  passing yards in 68 games, tied seventh-most among FBS
  teams, and have held opponents under 100 passing yards in 19
  games in that span, tied eighth-most among FBS teams.
- Since 2014, Penn State has held opponents under 100 rushing yards on 52 occasions, 10th-most among FBS teams, and have held opponents under 50 rushing yards in 20 games, tied ninthmost among FBS teams.
- Penn State has registered 10 or more tackles for loss 30 times since 2014, second-most among FBS teams.
- Since 2014, Penn State has collected six or more sacks in a game 16 times, tied-most among FBS teams.
- The Nittany Lions have forced multiple takeaways in a game on 52 occasions since 2014, including three times in 2023.

- Through five games in 2023, Penn State leads the country in total defense (210.6), passing defense (136.4), passing efficiency defense (86.5) and first downs allowed (58).
- Penn State holds third in the country in sacks per game (4.0), ninth in total sacks (20) and 15th in tackles for loss per game (7.4)
- · Through five games, 18 Nittany Lions have recorded at least one tackle for loss and 14 have recorded at least one sack.
- The Penn State defensive line recorded three sacks, three forced fumbles and two fumble recoveries against lowa.

- Isaac secured a solo sack in the second guarter at Northwestern.
- DE Chop Robinson is a member of the Bednarik Award, Bronko Nagurski Trophy and Lombardi Award watch lists.
- Robinson has collected 52 tackles, 15.5 tackles for loss, 8.5 sacks, two forced fumbles, one fumble recovery and three pass breakups in his collegiate career.
- He is also a preseason second team All-American by Sporting News and Pro Football Focus in 2023.
- In the Iowa game, Robinson made two tackles, including a strip-sack in the third quarter. He added two quarterback hurries

- The forced fumble was the second of Robinson's career.
- He posted a 94.1 pass rush grade from PFF for his performance in the win over the Hawkeyes.

- Junior DT Coziah Izzard, junior DE Amin Vanover and sophomore DT Jordan van den Berg all gained playing time in 2022
- Vanover had a strip-sack against lowa, his first career forced fumble.

# COACHING STAFF CHANGES

- · The Nittany Lion coaching staff has two new faces for the 2023 season with the addition of wide receivers coach/ offensive recruiting coordinator Margues Hagans and defensive line coach Deion Barnes.
- Hagans joined Penn State staff after serving as the Associate Head Coach/Wide Receivers Coach at Virginia for the previous 11 years.
- During his time at Virginia, Hagans coached 10 of the top 15 career receptions leaders in program history.
- Hagans was a four-year letterman at Virginia from 2002-05 and currently sits No. 10 all-time in passing yards with 4,877. He also ranks seventh in total offense with 5,779 vards.
- He was selected, as a receiver, in the fifth round (144th overall) of the 2006 NFL Draft by the St. Louis Rams.
- Barnes spent the previous three years on the Penn State staff as a graduate assistant working with the defensive line.
- Following a professional playing career in the NFL and the AAF, Barnes joined the Penn State coaching staff in 2020.
- During his three seasons working with the defensive line, Barnes helped coach 11 All-Big Ten defensive linemen, including three first-team selections and a second-team All-American.
- Barnes tutored defensive tackle PJ Mustipher, who was a two-time captain for the Nittany Lions and a three-time All-Big Ten honoree.
- During the 2022 season, Penn State led the Big Ten with 104 tackles for loss (T-4th nationally) and 42 sacks (T-6th).

- Through the first five games, according to Coaches By The Numbers, King has allowed a 33.3 completion percentage (3-of-9) when targeted.
- Senior Johnny Dixon has recorded 78 tackles, six tackles for loss, three sacks, four interceptions, 19 pass breakups, one forced fumble and one fumble recovery in his collegiate career.
- Dixon began the 2023 season with three solo tackles and two pass breakups against West Virginia.
- At Illinois, Dixon picked off a pass in the third quarter and returned it 21 yards, his longest career return.
- Through the first five games, according to Coaches By The Numbers, Dixon is allowing a 50.0 completion percentage (4-of-8) when targeted.
- Redshirt senior Daequan Hardy has accounted for 42 tackles, 5.5 tackles for loss, 2.5 sacks, five interceptions, 14 pass breakups, and a forced fumble in his Penn State career.
- At Illinois, Hardy notched an interception in the first quarter.
- Hardy picked off a pass in the fourth quarter at Northwestern and returned it 34 yards for the longest return of his career.
- In three games this season, according to Coaches By The Numbers, Hardy is allowing a 22.2 completion percentage (2-of-9) when targeted.
- Sophomore Cam Miller has played in 16 games at Penn State, while totaling 15 tackles, one tackle for loss and an interception.
- Miller recorded four tackles, all solo, including his first career tackle for loss against West Virginia.
- The Florida native picked off a pass in the third quarter at Illinois for his first career interception.

- In addition to leading the defense, Manny Diaz also coaches the linebacker unit.
- Penn State's linebacker corps returns a four-year veteran in Curtis Jacobs, an honorable mention All-Big Ten selection in 2022, who has played in 37 career games and made 28 starts.
- Jacobs owns 140 career tackles, 17 tackles for loss, eight sacks, a forced fumble, four fumble recoveries and two interceptions.
- He is on the Butkus Award watch list.
- Against West Virginia, Jacobs finished with a team-high 10 tackles, including seven solo, and a solo sack.
- It marked Jacobs' third career game with double-digit tackles.
- In the lowa game, Jacobs recorded a solo tackle for loss and two fumble recoveries.
- He recovered a fumble in the first quarter and a muffed punt in the second quarter.
- Jacobs is the first Penn State player to recover two fumbles in a game since Mark D'Onofrio against Temple on October 5, 1991.
- Sophomore Abdul Carter owns 67 tackles (43 solo), 11.5 tackles for loss, 7.5 sacks, two forced fumbles, an interception and five pass breakups in his first two seasons in Happy Valley.
- Carter started his 2023 campaign with a solo sack in the fourth quarter against West Virginia.
- He tied for the team high with four tackles against Delaware.
- Carter recorded his first career interception in the first quarter at Illinois, adding two tackles.
- The Philadelphia native tied for a team high with three tackles against lowa and had a pass breakup at Northwestern.
- Carter is on watch lists for the Bednarik Award, Bronko Nagurski Trophy, Butkus Award, Lombardi Award and Lott IMPACT Trophy.
- The sophomore was named Pro Football Focus Preseason All-America honorable mention.
- Redshirt sophomore Kobe King made his first career start in the WVU game and collected five tackles.
- He secured four tackles, a tackle for loss and his second career fumble recovery at Illinois.
- King tallied four tackles at Northwestern, including two tackles for loss and a solo sack in the first quarter.
- Redshirt sophomore **Dominic DeLuca** registered a solo sack in the second quarter against West Virginia.
- DeLuca picked off a pass and returned it 26 yards for a touchdown against Delaware.
- It was his first career interception and PSU's first pick-six since Jacobs' interception return against Michigan.
- DeLuca tied for the team-lead with a career-high six tackles at Illinois and recorded four tackles at Northwestern.
- On a tackle for loss in the first quarter, DeLuca notched his first career forced fumble.
- Against Iowa, DeLuca forced a fumble in the fourth quarter, his second forced fumble in two weeks.
- Redshirt freshman Keon Wylie recorded a solo sack at Northwestern, giving him 1.5 for his career.
- Tony Rojas posted two tackles against West Virginia.
- He followed with two tackles, including his first career tackle for loss, against Delaware.
- Penn State has 71 linebackers drafted all-time, the most for any school.

# **SAFETIES** NOTES

- Co-Defensive coordinator/safeties coach **Anthony Poindexter** is in his third season on the Nittany Lion coaching staff.
- Poindexter has 19 years of collegiate coaching experience, including seven as a defensive or co-defensive coordinator.
- As a player, Poindexter, a two-time consensus All-American at Virginia and was chosen as the 1998 ACC Defensive Player of the Year.
- Poindexter was inducted into the College Football Hall of Fame in 2020.
- The Nittany Lions held lowa to 56 passing yards and just six completions, the lowest number in a Big Ten game since giving up five completions at Rutgers in 2018.
- Through five games in 2023, Penn State leads the country in total defense (210.6), passing defense (136.4), passing efficiency defense (86.5) and first downs allowed (58).
- Penn State is allowing a 50.7 percent completion percentage (69-of-136) and just 5.01 yards per pass attempt.
- Over the last two seasons, Penn State has held opponents to under a 50 completion percentage in eight games, the nation's third-most in that span.
- Senior Keaton Ellis, a team captain, brings a wealth of experience to the Penn State secondary, having appeared in 48 career games, making 22 starts.
- In his career, Ellis owns 81 tackles (54 solo), three tackles for loss, four forced fumbles, one fumble recovery, an interception and 12 pass breakups.
- Ellis made three stops, all solo, against West Virginia and three tackles at Northwestern.
- The senior forced a fumble in the third quarter against Delaware.
- Junior Jaylen Reed has played in 26 contests and started five games.
- He has tallied 52 tackles (37 solo), 3.5 tackles for loss, one sack and four pass breakups at Penn State.
- Reed made his first career start against WVU and finished the game with four tackles (three solo).
- The Michigan native recorded his first career sack against Delaware. It was his third career tackle for loss.
- He registered four tackles at Illinois.
- Reed had two tackles and a pass breakup vs. Iowa and three tackles, including a half-tackle for loss, at Northwestern.
- Sophomore Kevin Winston Jr. has seen playing time in 16 games in his first two years in Happy Valley.
- Winston has 29 tackles, one tackle for loss, one fumble recovery and two pass breakups as a Nittany Lion.
- Winston recovered a fumble in the third quarter against Delaware for his first career fumble recovery.
- He had three tackles and a pass breakup at Illinois and followed with a pass breakup against lowa.
- Winston posted a career-high and team-leading five tackles at Northwestern.
- Redshirt sophomore Zakee Wheatley has played in 22 career games, collecting 42 tackles (31 solo), two interceptions, one forced fumble and one pass breakup.
- Wheatley tallied four tackles, all solo, against WVU.
- He tied for a team high with six tackles at Illinois and made two stops against lowa.
- Freshman King Mack is one of 15 Penn State true freshman who played this season.

# LETTERMEN MAKING THEIR RETURN

- Ten members of the Penn State coaching and support staffs played at Penn State.
- Associate head coach/cornerbacks coach Terry M. Smith was a three-year starter at wide receiver from 1989-91.
- Co-offensive coordinator and tight Ends Coach **Ty Howle** was a four-year letterwinner on the Penn State offensive line from 2009-13. He played in 47 career games, making 13 starts.
- Defensive line coach **Deion Barnes** made 31 starts as a Nittany Lion from 2012-14. In 2014, Barnes tallied 12.5 tackles for loss and six sacks. He led PSU with 10 tackles for loss and six sacks in 2012 to earn consensus freshman All-American honors.
- Defensive graduate assistant **Torrence Brown** was a threeyear letterman on the defensive line for the Nittany Lions (2015-17). He appeared in 30 career games, making seven starts.
- Defensive analyst **Dan Connor** was a two-time first-team All-America linebacker for Penn State in 2006 and 2007, the 14th Nittany Lion to be named a two-time first-team All-American. He finished his career as Penn State's all-time leader with 419 tackles.
- Offensive analyst Calvin Lowry was a first-team All-Big Ten safety for the Nittany Lions. He totaled nine career interceptions and was PSU's leading punt returner for three seasons.
- Assistant director of performance enhancement Tyrone Smith was a defensive tackle for Penn State and lettered during the 2014 season.
- Recruiting coordinator Alan Zemaitis letterman and three-time All-Big Ten selection for the blue and white from 2002-05. Zemaitis sits tied fifth all-time at Penn State with 12 career interceptions. He also holds fifth all-time at Penn State with 46 passes defended. Zemaitis helped the Nittany Lions to a Big Ten Championship in 2005.
- Director of Football Academic Services Todd Kulka lettered as a linebacker and graduated in 1995. He helped Penn State to a 9-3 record and an Outback Bowl victory in 1995.
- Director of the Football Letterman's Club **Wally Richardson** was a four-year letterman as a quarterback in 1992 and 1994-96. Richardson ranks 12th all-time at Penn State with 4,419 career passing yards. He also sits eighth all-time with 378 completions and 12th all-time with 27 touchdown passes.

# SPECIAL TEAMS NOTES

- Stacy Collins is in his second season as Penn State's special teams coordinator/outside linebacker/nickels coach. Collins has 25 years of collegiate coaching experience.
- Last season, Collins helped Chris Stoll to win the Patrick Mannelly Award, honoring the nation's top long snapper.
- According to Coaches By The Numbers, since 2019, Penn State's kick return defense ranks fifth in the nation in touchback percentage (73.8; 1st in B1G), fifth in percentage of kickoffs returned inside the 25 (72.9; T-2nd), sixth in the nation in percentage of kickoffs returned (18.2; 1st) and 11th in average opponent field position (25.2; 4th).
- Since 2019, Penn State's punt return defense is second in the country in punts inside the 10 (18.7 percent; 2nd in B1G), ranked fourth in punts inside the 20 (43.0; T-2nd) and ninth in net punting (41.1; 3rd).
- Since 2017, Penn State has scored seven special teams touchdowns (four kick return, three punt return), ranking fourth in the Big Ten.
- Penn State is one of eight FBS schools that has not allowed a special teams touchdown since the start of the 2019 season (53-straight games).
- Senior K Alex Felkins transferred to Penn State from Columbia, where he earned his degree in psychology.
- Felkins owns five career games with three field goal makes.
- He has hit three career field goals of 50+ yards, 14 of 40+ yards and is 98-of-102 on extra points.
- In the Illinois game, Felkins hit the 200-career point mark. He has 227 career points.
- Against West Virginia, Felkins hit a 25-yard field goal and converted all three extra-point attempts.
- Felkins converted all eight extra-point attempts vs. Delaware and hit four kickoffs, all for touchbacks.
- At Illinois, Felkins tallied 12 points with three field goals (20, 45 and 28 yards) and three extra-points.
- Felkins converted a 46-yard field goal in the first quarter and all four extra-point attempts against lowa.
- At Northwestern, the senior converted 20- and 47-yard field goals as well as all five extra-point attempts. The 47-yard kick is his longest make as a Nittany Lion.
- Senior P Riley Thompson transferred from Florida Atlantic.
- Thompson is a member of the Ray Guy Award watch list.
- Thompson booted two punts against West Virginia, including
- a long of 46 yards.The senior landed a 47-yard punt at the Delaware 7.
- He averaged 43.8 yards on six punts at Illinois, landing two punts inside the 20.
- Thompson has placed 31 career punts inside the 20 and seven punts inside the 10.
- Thompson has blasted 16 punts of 50+ yards in his career.
- In the Illinois game, Thompson went over 3,000 career punt yards.
- At Northwestern, Thompson averaged 46.8 yards on four punts, including a 50-yard boot and two punts inside the 20.
- All-Big Ten second team KR Nicholas Singleton scored on a 100-yard kickoff return at Rutgers in 2022, tied for the secondlongest kick return touchdown in program history.
- Singleton averaged 24.9 yards per kick return last season and tallied seven returns of 20 or more yards.
- For his career, Singleton is averaging 22.8 yards per kick return, tied 19th all-time at Penn State.
- Singleton had a 26-yard kick return against Delaware.
- He had returns of 31 and 23 yards at Illinois.
- Redshirt sophomore SN **Tyler Duzansky** has appeared in 12 career games and has served as the primary long snapper in the first five games of 2023.
- LB **Dominic DeLuca** has been voted as a captain and was awarded No. 0 as the team's special teams leader.
- DeLuca blocked a punt against Minnesota in 2022, PSU's first since Journey Brown against Buffalo in 2019.

# **GAME** RECAP

UNIVERSITY PARK, Pa. - No. 7 Penn State defeated West Virginia, 38-15, in front of 110,747 fans, the fourth-largest crowd in Beaver Stadium history and the largest in a home opener. The Nittany Lions outscored the Mountaineers, 24-8, in the second half to pull away for the season-opening victory.

Drew Allar shined in his first game as Penn State's starting quarterback, completing 21 of his 29 pass attempts and finishing with 325 passing yards, three touchdowns and no interceptions. Allar and wide receiver KeAndre Lambert-Smith proved to be a strong connection all night, including a 72-yard touchdown on Penn State's opening possession of the game, the longest pass of Allar's career. Lambert-Smith tallied 123 receiving yards and a career-best two touchdown grabs on four catches.

The Nittany Lions totaled 478 yards of offense (332 passing, 146 rushing) in the well-balanced attack. The dynamic running back duo of Nicholas Singleton and Kaytron Allen combined for 121 yards (70 for Singleton, S1 for Allen). Singleton scored a rushing touchdown in the second quarter, highlighting his solid day on the ground. Malik McClain gained 58 yards and caught a touchdown and Harrison Wallace III added 72 yards on a team-high seven receptions to round out the receiving corps. Quarterback Beau Pribula scored his first collegiate touchdown with a five-yard run in the final seconds of the fourth quarter.

The Penn State defense held West Virginia's offense to just 15 points and 310 total yards, allowing the Mountaineers to convert only four of their 14 third-down attempts. The Nittany Lions made three fourth-down stops during the game and held West Virginia's passing attack to just 167 yards through the air.

Linebackers Dominic DeLuca, Curtis Jacobs and Abdul Carter each recorded one sack apiece. Jacobs accumulated a team-best 10 tackles, while linebacker Kobe King notched five. Zakee Wheatley, Jaylen Reed and Cam Miller made four stops each.

#### **HOW IT HAPPENED**

Penn State forced a West Virginia punt on the opening drive of the ball game. The Penn State offense stepped up right away, capping off its first drive of the season with a 72-yard catch-and-run from Allar to Lambert-Smith.

West Virginia got on the board at the 14:14 mark of the second quarter, tying the game, 7-7. The Mountaineers scored on a 1-yard touchdown run by CJ Donaldson. The scoring drive went 69 yards on nine plays.

The Nittany Lions responded immediately, constructing a 10-play, 81-yard touchdown drive to retake a 14-7 advantage. Singleton put the Nittany Lions up on a 2-yard run. The Nittany Lions went into the break up 14-7.

Lambert-Smith hauled in his second touchdown of the ballgame for the first score of the second half. The 12-yard score put Penn State up 21-7 with 8:36 left in the third quarter. The Nittany Lions' scoring drive lasted 3:26 as the offense used seven plays to march 56 yards into the end zone.

The Nittany Lion defense forced a turnover on downs on the next drive and the offense capitalized with a 25-yard field goal by Alex Felkins to extend the lead to 24-7.

Penn State's offense scored two more touchdowns in the final frame to put the game out of reach for the Mountaineers.

The first came on a 25-yard touchdown pass to McClain from Allar.

West Virginia cuts its deficit to 31-15 with 3:34 left in the game as Garrett Greene scored on a 1-yard run and then connected with Donaldson on a successful two-point conversion.

The final score was on Pribula's first career touchdown, a 5-yard quarterback keeper.

UNIVERSITY PARK, Pa. - No. 7 Penn State football defeated Delaware, 63-7, on Saturday afternoon in Beaver Stadium. The Nittany Lions racked up 541 total yards and scored eight offensive touchdowns, while holding the Blue Hens to only 140 total yards and one touchdown

GAME 2 PENN STATE VS. DELAWARE

Sophomore quarterback Drew Allar continued his outstanding start to the season, completing 22-of-26 passes for 204 yards and one touchdown. Redshirt freshman guarterback Beau Pribula entered the game in the middle of the 3rd quarter and scored one rushing touchdown and one passing touchdown, his first career throwing score.

Nicholas Singleton and Kaytron Allen combined for 155 rushing yards and four touchdowns leading the Nittany Lion rushing attack that posted 315 yards on the afternoon. Through the air, Tyler Warren and Omari Evans hauled in touchdowns while KeAndre Lambert-Smith led the team with 74 receiving yards.

The Nittany Lions totaled an impressive 541 yards of offense (226 passing, 315 rushing). Penn State scored on its first four drives of the afternoon, putting the pressure on the Blue Hens early and often.

Defensively, the Nittany Lions had an impressive performance, holding the Blue Hens to just seven points and 140 total yards of offense, 66 of which came on one rushing play. The defensive unit held Delaware to just five first downs in the game, tied for the fewest by an opposing offense since 2014.

Linebacker Dominic DeLuca recorded Penn State's first defensive touchdown of the season on the first career interception of his career in the late third quarter. DeLuca returned it all the way to the end zone for a pick-six. The defense also recovered one fumble, forced by Keaton Ellis and recovered by Kevin Winston Jr. Jaylen Reed, Zane Durant, and Zuriah Fisher each chipped in a sack

#### **HOW IT HAPPENED**

Penn State stopped the Blue Hens on the opening possession of the game and scored on the ensuing drive, going up 7-0 with 8:19 remaining in the first guarter. Singleton punched in the first Nittany Lion touchdown of the day on a 2-vard run.

Reed posted a third-down sack on Delaware's next trip down the field, forcing a punt and giving the Nittany Lion offense excellent field position. Allen found the end zone on a 4-vard rushing touchdown, giving the Nittany Lions a 14-0 lead

Delaware answered with a 66-yard rushing touchdown by Marcus Yarns, cutting the Penn State lead back to seven.

Singleton scored two more rushing touchdowns in the first half, reaching a career-best three rushing scores in the game. The sophomore's third touchdown put the Nittany Lions up 28-7 with 4:36 remaining in the opening half.

Penn State scored once more before the end of the half when Allar found Warren in the end zone for a 2-yard score with 22 seconds left to play in the second quarter.

The Penn State offense marched down the field and scored on the initial possession of the second half, going up 42-7 with just under 10 minutes remaining in the third quarter. Allar scored his first rushing touchdown of the season on a 1-vard sneak

On the very next drive, Ellis forced a fumble that was picked up by Winston Jr. for the Nittany Lions' first takeaway of the season. Pribula entered the game and drove the Lions down the field and scored on a 6-yard rushing touchdown. The Penn State defense followed with its first touchdown of the 2023

campaign on a DeLuca pick-six. The Nittany Lions scored one more touchdown in the fourth quarter, a

4-yard pass from Pribula to Evans, to go up 63-7.

# **GAME** RECAP

CHAMPAIGN, III. - No. 7 Penn State football took down Illinois, 30-13, on Saturday afternoon at Memorial Stadium. The Nittany Lions played complimentary football on both sides of the ball, fueled by five defensive takeaways.

The defense led the way for the Nittany Lions, recording its first fivetakeaway game in seven years. Penn State racked up four interceptions- by four different players- and a fumble recovery. Offensively, the Nittany Lions scored 20 points off of the five turnovers. Stout defense held the Illini in check all day, as the opposing rushing attack gained just 62 yards.

Dominic DeLuca also forced the first fumble of his career, the first of the Nittany Lions' five takeaways. Linebacker Abdul Carter, and cornerbacks Johnny Dixon. Daequan Hardy. and Cam Miller each secured interceptions.

Johnny Dixon, Daequan Hardy, and Cam Miller each secured interceptions. On offense, quarterback Drew Allar posted yet another turnover-free outing, going 16-of-33 for 208 yards. Penn State's running backs were involved in all three offensive touchdowns on the afternoon. Kaytron Allen and Nicholas Singleton each recorded rushing scores, while Trey Potts tossed a touchdown pass to tight end Tyler Warren.

Singleton led the Nittany Lion receiving corps with three grabs and a career-best 49 yards through the air, with tight end Warren (3-35-1) and wide receiver Liam Clifford (1-33-0) complimenting his effort.

#### **HOW IT HAPPENED**

The Nittany Lions made their first splash play of the day on their second defensive drive as DeLuca forced a fumble that was picked up by Kobe King to give the ball back to the offense at the Illinois 43.

The Nittany Lions took the ball 40 yards on nine plays for a 20-yard field goal for the first score of the game, going up 3-0 with 5:27 to play in the opening quarter.

Penn State's defense forced its second turnover in two possessions with an interception by Carter, the first of his career, and he returned the ball to the Illinois 37. Alex Felkins knocked through a 45-yard field goal to increase the Nittany Lion lead to 6-0 with under two minutes remaining in the opening quarter.

The Nittany Lion defense recorded its third turnover in the first quarter on the Illini's next drive. Hardy picked off an Altmyer pass at the Penn State 43 and the offense proceeded to use 12 plays to march 57 yards for its first touchdown. Allen punched in the 4-yard score at the 11:04 mark of the second quarter.

Reggie Love III put the Illini on the board with a 5-yard touchdown run with 2:08 left to play in the half. Illinois constructed an 8-play, 68-yard drive for the score to cut the Nittany Lions' advantage to 13-7.

The Nittany Lions tacked on an additional field goal before halftime to go up 16-7 at the break. Allar found Clifford on a 33-yard strike to the Illinois 11 to set up the Felkins 28-yard field goal.

Penn State's defense made its presence felt right away in the second half. On Illinois' first possession, Dixon intercepted Altmyer at the Penn State 7 and returning his first interception of the season 21 yards to the Nittany Lions' 28.

The Nittany Lions broke through for their second touchdown of the afternoon to go up 23-7 at the 2:14 mark of the third frame. Potts caught a lateral from Allar and tossed an 11-yard touchdown pass to the tight end, Warren, capping off a 7-play, 68-yard scoring drive. On the ensuing Illinois possession, the Nittany Lions intercepted Altmyer

On the ensuing Illinois possession, the Nittany Lions intercepted Altmyer for the fourth time, this time by Miller. His pick at the Illinois 30 preceded the Nittany Lion offense's third touchdown of the game. Penn State wasted no time, scoring in just over a minute on a Nicholas Singleton 16-yard rushing touchdown. The back-to-back scoring drives saw the Nittany Lions go up 30-7 with 14:24 left to play in the game. Illinois found the end zone one more time, scoring on a 19-yard reception

Illinois found the end zone one more time, scoring on a 19-yard reception by Malik Elzy from quarterback John Paddock late in the fourth quarter. A failed two-point conversion left the score at 30-13.

# **GAME** RECAP

UNIVERSITY PARK, Pa. - No. 7 Penn State Football dominated on both sides of the ball and registered a 31-0 victory against the No. 24/22 Iowa Hawkeyes on Saturday evening in front of the second-largest crowd in Beaver Stadium history

GAME 4 **PENN STATE VS. IOWA** 

Penn State's defense stole the show, shutting out an AP Top 25 opponent for the first time since it did so in the 1999 Alamo Bowl against No. 18 Texas A&M. The Blue & White held lowa to just 76 total yards of offense, split between 50 passing yards and 26 on the ground. Linebackers Abdul Carter and Curtis Jacobs led the way with a trio of tackles apiece, while linebacker Dominic DeLuca, and defensive ends Chop Robinson, Amin Vanover and Dani Dennis-Sutton each forced fumbles on the night. Jacobs became the first Nittany Lion to recover a pair of fumbles in a single game since Mark D'Onofrio did so against Temple on Oct. 5, 1991.

The complementary outing saw PSU out-gain lowa by a 397-76 yardage tally in addition to a striking 97-33 differential in total plays. The Blue & White did an exemplary job of keeping lowa's offense off the field, winning the time of possession battle by over 30 minutes. Penn State finished the night 9-for-20 on third down, while lowa was held to a 1-for-9 conversion rate. Additionally, PSU was able to cash in on all four of their red zone opportunities, while the Nittany Lion defense held lowa without a red zone chance

A balanced Penn State rushing attack, led by running back Kaytron Allen, gained 215 yards on the evening, with the Norfolk, Virginia, native responsible for 72 on his own. Quarterback Beau Pribula entered the game in the fourth quarter and finished with 55 yards on the ground while running back Nicholas Singleton tallied 49 yards highlighted by a game-high 19-yard scamper in the third quarter.

The Nittany Lions totaled 182 yards through the air, with quarterback Drew Allar responsible for 166 of those after completing 25 of his 37 passing attempts. Allar finished the night with four touchdown passes and zero interceptions. Wide receiver KeAndre Lambert-Smith hauled in eight receptions for 66 yards and a touchdown, while tight end Theo Johnson snagged six passes for 42 yards. Tight end Tyler Warren recorded a career-high two touchdown grabs and fellow tight end Khalil Dinkins recorded his first receiving touchdown of the 2023 campaign.

The Blue & White welcomed a sellout crowd of 110,830, the second-largest attendance figure in Beaver Stadium history.

#### **HOW IT HAPPENED**

On lowa's second drive, Dennis-Sutton forced a fumble that was picked up by Jacobs at the Nittany Lion 18-yard line.

The Nittany Lion offense got on the board first, thanks to a 46-yard field goal by Alex Felkins. Felkins capped off a 17-play 53-yard scoring drive. Penn State took the 3-0 advantage with 1:35 remaining in the opening frame.

On the Nittany Lions' next drive, the Hawkeyes forced a punt, however Thompson's boot hit an lowa player on the fly and was recovered by Curtis Jacobs at the Hawkeye 39-yard line, sending the Penn State offense back on the field. Allar tossed a 9-yard touchdown pass to Dinkins, extending the lead to 10-0.

On Penn State's opening drive of the second half, Allar led the Nittany Lions on a 15-play, 75-yard scoring drive. A 2-yard touchdown from Allar to Warren capped off the drive.

The Nittany Lions scored once again on Warren's second touchdown of the game, a 7-yard grab, with 1:01 left in the third quarter. Penn State's defense went back to work, forcing a fumble on the first play

of lowa's next drive. Robinson got to quarterback Cade McNamara for a strip

sack that was picked up by Isaac. The Nittany Lions took possession at the Iowa 19 yard-line. Allar took the Penn State offense down the field and threw his fourth touchdown pass of the night to increase the Nittany Lion lead to 31-0 on a 4-yard touchdown to Lambert-Smith in the corner of the end zone

## **GAME** RECAP

EVANSTON, III. – No. 6/7 Penn State breezed past Northwestern behind a dominant second half, winning 41-13 at Ryan Field on Saturday.

An outstanding defensive performance once again fueled the complimentary win for the Nittany Lions. Penn State limited Northwestern to just 175 total yards, including just 45 on the ground, compared to its own 353 total yards and 134 rushing yards.

The Nittany Lions posted seven sacks, an interception, and forced two turnovers on downs in the game on defense, putting pressure on Northwestern all afternoon. The unit yielded just three points in the second half and provided outstanding field position for many of the Nittany Lions' scoring opportunities.

Twenty-three Nittany Lions recorded tackles in the game, with Kevin Winston Jr. picking up a team-high five. Zane Durant led the squad with three tackles for loss. Daequan Hardy filled up the stat sheet with two tackles, an interception, a tackle for loss, and a pass breakup.

Offensively, Allar posted yet another turnover-free performance, completing 18-of-33 passes for 189 yards and a touchdown. Beau Pribula stepped in late in the game and completed his only pass for a 30-yard touchdown to Trey Potts. KeAndre Lambert-Smith led the team with 86 receiving yards on four catches while Nicholas Singleton caught a career-high six passes for 39 yards and a touchdown. Singleton led the way on the ground for Penn State, carrying the ball 21 times for 80 yards and another score.

Northwestern scored first on its opening possession of the game, the result of Penn State's first turnover of the season. After the Wildcats gained possession of the ball on Penn State's 15-yard line on a fumbled kickoff return, the Nittany Lion defense pushed them back four yards and forced a 33-yard field goal.

The Nittany Lions bounced back and evened it up at 3-3 with under three minutes to play in the first quarter on a 20-yard field goal by Alex Felkins. With 5:16 remaining in the first half, the Wildcats were able to tack on

a touchdown to take the lead back. Northwestern took 5:16 off the clock on its 10-play scoring drive that culminated in a 1-yard touchdown run by quarterback Ben Bryant.

The Nittany Lions responded immediately, creating their own six-play, 63yard drive that was capped off by a 13-yard run by Potts. The teams entered the break tied 10-10.

Following a defensive stop on Northwestern's first possession of the second half, Penn State found the end zone once again. On fourth-and-goal from the 1-yard line, Allar was able to push his way into the end zone.

Penn State made it 17 unanswered points with a 47-yard field goal from Felkins, his second of the game, after the Nittany Lion defense forced a turnover on downs.

Another fourth-down stop in Northwestern territory led to Penn State's next score. The Wildcats attempted a fake punt, but fell short of the first down marker, giving the Nittany Lion offense possession of the ball at the 34. Allar tossed a 2-yard touchdown pass to Singleton to complete the scoring drive. Northwestern was able to chip in a field goal early in the fourth quarter,

cutting Penn State's lead down to two scores, at 27-13.

Singleton punched in another Penn State touchdown, this one with just over four minutes left to play in the game. A 13-play, 54-yard drive resulted in Singleton's 1-yard score, giving Penn State a 34-13 lead.

On the ensuing Northwestern drive, Hardy's interception gave the Nittany Lions possession at the Northwestern 30-yard line. It took just one play for Penn State to find the end zone, with Pribula finding Potts on a 30-yard catchand-run for the tally.


