BILLIKENS, NITTANY LIONS CLASH IN SWEET 16 BATTLE

- •Sixth-seeded Saint Louis and second-seeded Penn State meet today for the first time with a spot in the NCAA Championship quarterfinals at stake.
- •SLU, making a sixth straight tournament appearance, brings a 12-game winning streak the nation's second-longest current streak behind Memphis (17) and an 18-game unbeaten streak (16-0-2) into today's game. The Billikens earned the Atlantic 10 Conference's automatic bid by winning the A-10 Championship and advanced to their first Sweet 16 by defeating Indiana 2-0 in the opening round and Georgetown 2-1 in the second round.
- •Penn State finished fourth in the Big Ten Conference regularseason standings and was awarded an at-large NCAA bid after falling to Iowa in the Big Ten tournament semifinals. The Nittany Lions blanked Central Connecticut State 7-0 and Santa Clara 2-0 in the first and second rounds, respectively, of the NCAA tourney.
- •Penn State is the third Big Ten team Saint Louis has faced this season. The Billikens won 3-2 at Nebraska in the regular season and beat Indiana 2-0 in the NCAA Championship first round.

BILLIKENS IN THE NCAA CHAMPIONSHIP

- •Saint Louis is competing in its eighth NCAA Championship overall and sixth in succession.
- •SLU is 5-6-1 in NCAA competition with wins over Georgetown (2-1, 2023), Indiana (2-0, 2023), Ole Miss (2-1, 2021), Drake (2-0, 2006) and Stanford (2-0, 2005, SLU's first NCAA tourney game).

SLU RECORDS SECOND-HIGHEST FIRST-ROUND ATTENDANCE

- •Saint Louis drew the second-largest attendance for a first-round game in the 2023 NCAA Championship.
- •The crowd of 2,789 fans who watched the Billikens defeat Indiana was SLU's largest at Hermann Stadium this season.

SAINT LOUIS IN THE NATIONAL PICTURE

- •The Billikens were No. 15 in the final NCAA Division I RPI. They were No. 29 in the first RPI Sept. 18.
- •Nine SLU opponents were in the final RPI top 75 BYU (2), Penn State (4), Brown (tie-8), Georgetown (tie-8), Xavier (19), Nebraska (23), Indiana (38), Utah State (44) and Dayton (72).
- •SLU is No. 21 in the final regular-season United Soccer Coaches Top 25. The Bills are No. 5 in this week's Top Drawer Soccer Top 25 their highest ranking in any poll this season and No. 16 in the College Soccer News Top 30.

KELLY NAMED A-10 CHAMPIONSHIP MOST OUTSTANDING

- Caroline Kelly was voted Most Outstanding Player of the 2023 Atlantic 10 Championship. Kelly tallied three goals and an assist in three tournament games, including two goals and a helper in the Billikens' 3-0 win over La Salle in the final.
- •Emily Puricelli, Emily Gaebe, Hannah Larson, Lyndsey Heckel and Hannah Sawyer joined Kelly on the All-Tournament team.

NINE BILLIKENS EARN ATLANTIC 10 POSTSEASON HONORS

- •Three major-award winners are among nine Saint Louis players who earned A-10 postseason recognition.
- •Lyndsey Heckel was selected Defensive Player of the Year, Emily Puricelli was tabbed Goalkeeper of the Year, and Emily Gaebe was named Offensive Player of the Year.
- Abbie Miller and Caroline Kelly joined that trio on the All-Conference first team. Sophia Stram, Katie Houck and Hannah Larson landed on the All-Conference second team, while Alyssa Bockius garnered All-Rookie plaudits.
 - Houck and Larson were voted to the All-Academic team.

GAEBE SETS SLU SINGLE-SEASON GOALS, POINTS RECORDS

- •Emily Gaebe has set Saint Louis single-season records for goals (15) and points (39) this year.
- •Teammate Caroline Kelly set the previous points record of 32 last season. Kelly, Maddie Pokorny (2018) and Jamie Perry (2002) shared the previous goals mark of 13.
- •It is believed that SLU is the only Division I team this season with two current players who have held both records.

TOP THREE GOAL SCORERS IN A-10 MAKE BILLIKEN HISTORY

- •Saint Louis players occupy the top three spots on the Atlantic 10 Conference's goals list. **Emily Gaebe** leads with 15, followed by **Caroline Kelly** with 12 and **Hannah Sawyer** with 10.
- •Additionally, it is the first time in Saint Louis women's soccer history that three Billikens have scored at least 10 goals in a season.

GAEBE, KELLY MOST PROLIFIC TANDEM IN PROGRAM HISTORY

- •With 27 goals and 68 points between them, **Emily Gaebe** (15 goals, 39 points) and **Caroline Kelly** (12 goals, 29 points) have combined for more goals and points this season than any duo in Saint Louis women's soccer history.
- •Gaebe and Kelly began the NCAA Championship tied for the fourth-highest goals total in Division I behind combos from Texas (41), Nebraska (37), and Grand Canyon and Utah Valley (28).
- •Also, the forwards are only the second pair of players in program history to tally 25 or more points apiece in a season, joining **Hannah Friedrich** (30) and **Maddie Pokorny** (28) in 2018.

FOR THE RECORD

- •Saint Louis has set or tied nine school records this season and is approaching another.
- •The outright school marks are for goals (71), assists (68), points (210), consecutive shutouts (11) and consecutive shutout minutes (1099:09). The Billikens have equaled program records for shutouts (15), unbeaten streak (18), total shots (444) and games (23).
- •With a goal differential of +60, the Billikens almost assuredly will break the school mark of +55.

WHO'S HOT FOR THE BILLIKENS

- •Emily Gaebe has 33 points (13G, 7A) over the last 14 games. Gaebe leads the A-10 with SLU season marks of 15 goals (sixth nationally) and 39 points (fifth), and her five game-winning goals rank 13th nationally.
- •Caroline Kelly (12) and Hannah Sawyer (career-high 10) rank second and third in goals, respectively, on the team. Kelly has netted a goal in six of the last 10 games, while Sawyer has eight goals over the last 14 matches.
- •Emily Puricelli has an .892 save percentage (fourth nationally) and a 0.50 goals against average (ninth). Puricelli has conceded just two goals over the last 15 games.
 - •Izzy Luebbert has six assists over the last 10 matches.

FACING TOP TEAMS BECOMING ROUTINE FOR BILLIKENS

- •Over the past two seasons, Saint Louis has played nine opponents who are among the top 25 in the 2023 final NCAA RPI.
- •This year, SLU has faced BYU, Brown, Nebraska, Xavier, Georgetown and now Penn State. The Bills played Notre Dame and Arkansas in the 2022 regular season and Memphis in the NCAA Championship.

OFFENSIVE BALANCE ON DISPLAY AGAIN

- •As they have for the past several years, the Billikens are spreading the wealth in their attack.
- •Through 23 games, 18 different players (75 percent of SLU's 24 field players who have played) have at least one goal. The 18 goal-scorers are the most in program history.
- •Twenty-three different field players (95.8 percent) have at least one point, the highest percentage in the nation.

•Hannah Larson (Emily Gaebe assist) is the only combination scoring three times. Combos scoring twice are Hannah Sawyer (Larson), Lyndsey Heckel (Larson), Caroline Kelly (Gaebe), Larson (Gaebe), Gaebe (Emily Groark), Gaebe (Julia Simon) and Gaebe (Kelly, Anna Lawler).

BALANCE ALSO SHOWS UP IN POSTSEASON PLAY

- •Evidence of Saint Louis' offensive sharing can be found in the Billikens' postseason statistics as well.
- •In five postseason games three in the A-10 Championship, two in the NCAA Championship eight players have at least one goal, and 11 players have at least one point.

CORNERING THE OPPOSITION

Corner kicks/game

- •SLU earned a remarkable 158-54 edge in corner kicks last season and has achieved a similar result this year, owning a 155-60 edge in corners.
- •The Billikens scored on a corner kick in 10 of their 13 games vs. A-10 opponents this season.

BILLIKENS AMONG THE ATLANTIC 10 STATISTICAL LEADERS

- •Emily Gaebe leads the A-10 in goals (15), points (39), shots per game (3.78) and shots on goal per game (1.96); is tied for first in assists (nine); and is second in game-winning goals (five).
- Emily Puricelli leads the league in goals against average (0.50) and save percentage (.892).
- •Hannah Larson is tied for first in assists (nine) and tied for fourth in points (19).
- Caroline Kelly is second in goals (12) and points (29), sixth in shots on goal per game (1.30) and tied for ninth in assists (five).
- •Hannah Sawyer stands second in shots per game (3.17), third in goals (10), third in points (21) and fifth in shots on goal per game (1.39).
 - •Izzy Luebbert is fifth in assists (eight).
 - Lyndsey Heckel is tied for fifth in game-winning goals (three).
 - Emily Groark is tied for ninth in assists (five).

FOUR BILLIKENS RANK HIGH AMONG ACTIVE NCAA LEADERS

- •Emily Puricelli, Abbie Miller, Emily Gaebe and Caroline Kelly are among NCAA Division I active career leaders in various categories.
- •Puricelli leads all active goalkeepers in shutout percentage (.471) and is third in goals against average (0.61) and sixth in goalkeeper minutes (7,562). Miller stands second in games played (107), and Gaebe and Kelly are tied for 29th in goals (31).

SLU DEFENSE A BRICK WALL IN CONFERENCE PLAY

- •A year ago, Saint Louis allowed just four goals in 13 games vs. A-10 opponents.
- •The Billikens were even more impressive this season, conceding only one goal in 13 matches vs. A-10 teams.

PURICELLI ASSAULTING SAINT LOUIS RECORD BOOK

- •Emily Puricelli has established herself as one of the most prolific goalkeepers in Billiken history.
- •Puricelli owns school career records of 67 victories and 40 shutouts. She is second in saves (261), minutes (7,562) and goals against average (0.61), tied for third in games started (85) and ninth in games played (85).
- •In SLU's 2021 NCAA Championship second-round game vs. Rutgers, Puricelli tied the Billiken single-game record of 14 saves.

BILLIKENS MOVING UP ON SLU CAREER LISTS

- •Several Billikens find themselves among the top 10 on various Saint Louis career statistical lists.
- •Emily Gaebe is tied for second in goals (31), fourth in points (80), fifth in shots (208), tied for seventh in game-winning assists (seven) and tied for ninth in assists (18).
- Caroline Kelly is tied for second in goals (31), seventh in points (75), eighth in shots (182) and tied for 10th in game-winning assists (six).
- Abbie Miller is first in games played (107), tied for second in game-winning goals (11), tied for sixth in games started (83), tied for ninth in goals (24) and 10th in points (65).
- •Emily Groark is tied for seventh in game-winning assists (seven) and tied for ninth in assists (18).
- •Lyndsey Heckel is fifth in games started (84), tied for seventh in game-winning goals (nine) and 10th in games played (84).
- •Sophia Stram and Emily Groark are tied for eighth in games started (81).

FOUR BILLIKENS LAND ON HERMANN TROPHY WATCH LIST

- •Lyndsey Heckel, Abbie Miller, Emily Puricelli and Caroline Kelly were named to the 2023 Hermann Trophy Watch List.
 - •SLU tied Stanford for the most players on the Watch List.
 - •Heckel was one of 15 semifinalists for last year's award.

SEVERAL BILLIKENS EARN WEEKLY HONORS

- Caroline Kelly made the College Soccer News (CSN) National Team of the Week and was honorable mention on the Top Drawer Soccer (TDS) National Team of the Week, and Sophia Stram was named to the Top Drawer Soccer National Team of the Week for Oct. 30-Nov. 5.
- •Emily Gaebe garnered A-10 Offensive Player of the Week honors and was selected to the CSN and TDS national teams of the week for Oct. 16-22.
- •Emily Gaebe was named CSN National Player of the Week and A-10 Offensive Player of the Week, and earned a spot on the TDS National Team of the Week, for Oct. 9-15.
- •Lyndsey Heckel was named to the CSN National Team of the Week for Sept. 11-17 and was honorable mention on the TDS National Team of the Week for Oct. 2-8.
- •Abbie Miller and Emily Puricelli were recognized for Sept. 4-10. Miller was the A-10 Offensive Player of the Week and was named to the TDS National Team of the Week, while Puricelli was the A-10 Defensive Player of the Week.

•Caroline Kelly and Hannah Larson collected A-10 and TDS honors, respectively, for Aug. 21-27. Kelly was selected A-10 Offensive Player of the Week, and Larson was named to the TDS National Team of the Week.

BILLIKENS POSTING CAREER HIGHS FOR A SEASON

- •Emily Gaebe 15 goals and 39 points (both school records), as well as five game-winning goals, nine assists and four game-winning assists.
 - Hannah Sawyer 10 goals and 21 points.
 - Emily Puricelli .892 save percentage.
 - Hannah Larson nine assists and 19 points.
 - Lyndsey Heckel, Julia Simon, Sophia Stram four assists.
 - •Anna Lawler three goals and nine points.
 - Katie Houck two goals and six points.

REGULAR-SEASON CROWN FIFTH IN SIX SEASONS FOR SLU

- •The 2023 A-10 regular-season championship is the fifth in six seasons for Saint Louis and sixth overall (2005).
- •This season, the Billikens posted a fifth undefeated league slate (9-0-1) in that six-year stretch. Their regular-season A-10 record during those six years is 53-3-2; including tournament games, the record is 70-3-2 vs. the league.
- •Saint Louis has captured eight regular-season conference titles in all (six A-10, two Conference USA).

BILLIKENS LEAD THE NATION IN RETURNING ALL-AMERICANS

- •Saint Louis is the only NCAA Division I women's soccer team this season that features three returning United Soccer Coaches All-Americans.
- •Defender **Lyndsey Heckel** led the way in 2022, becoming the first Billiken women's soccer player to earn a place on the All-America first team.
- •Midfielder **Abbie Miller** made the second team, while goalkeeper **Emily Puricelli** was a third-team selection.

MORE FIREPOWER BACK IN 2023

- •Saint Louis produced a program-record 10 Atlantic 10 All-Conference performers last season, including a program-record-tying seven first-team choices. Seven of the 10 are back this year.
- Abbie Miller was tabbed A-10 Midfielder of the Year for a second time, and forward Caroline Kelly garnered A-10 Offensive Player of the Year accolades. Also returning from the 2022 first team are defender Lyndsey Heckel, forward/midfielder Emily Groark, defender Sophia Stram and forward Emily Gaebe.
 - •Goalkeeper Emily Puricelli was a second-team selection.
 - Katie Shields won a third A-10 Coach of the Year award.

FOUR NAMED UNITED SOCCER COACHES "PLAYERS TO WATCH"

- •The Billikens placed four players one at each position on the United Soccer Coaches "Players to Watch" lists.
- •Goalkeeper Emily Puricelli, defender Lyndsey Heckel, midfielder Abbie Miller and forward Caroline Kelly comprise the Saint Louis quartet.

TOP DRAWER SOCCER RECOGNIZES FOUR BILLIKENS

- •Lyndsey Heckel and Emily Puricelli were included on Top Drawer Soccer's Preseason Best XI teams.
- Heckel was named to the second team, while Puricelli landed on the third team.
- •Heckel (No. 18), Puricelli (No. 33), Caroline Kelly (No. 43) and Abbie Miller (No. 46) made the TDS Preseason Top 100.

17 RETURN FROM RECORD-SETTING 2022 TEAM

- •Saint Louis returned nine starters and eight additional players from its 2022 team that:
- Made a fifth consecutive NCAA Tournament appearance and earned a No. 2 national seed;
 - •Was No. 10 in the final NCAA Division I RPI;
- •Earned a top-10 ranking in all three national polls, with a high of No. 4 by College Soccer News;
 - Captured a fifth straight Atlantic 10 tournament title;
 - Won the A-10 regular season for a fourth time in five years;
 - Went 20-2 overall and 10-0 in conference play;
- •Led the nation in winning percentage (.909), goals per game (2.95), assists per game (2.77) and points per game (8.68);
- •Finished third in the nation in shutout percentage (.682) and tied for third in goals against average (0.46);
 - Had a plus-55 goal differential;
- •Set school records for wins (20), winning streak (18), unbeaten streak (18), shutouts (15), regular-season winning percentage (17-1, .944), goals (65), assists (61) and points (191);
 - Tied the A-10 women's soccer record of 20 wins;
 - •Tied school records of 11 home wins and nine road wins.

BIG PUNCH RETURNS FROM 2022 OFFENSIVE JUGGERNAUT

- •The Billikens look to continue the prolific offensive attack they enjoyed in 2022 arguably the most explosive in program history and it appears they have the personnel to do so.
- •SLU's top seven point-scorers from a year ago are back, part of a returning group who combined to register 60 of the 2022 team's 65 goals (92 percent) and 41 of its 61 assists (67 percent).
- •Caroline Kelly (school-record 32 points on a school-recordtying 13 goals and six assists), Emily Gaebe (9-6-24) and Emily Groark (8-6-22) gave Saint Louis three 20-point scorers for the first time since 2006. Rounding out the returning top seven are Abbie Miller (6-4-16), Hannah Larson (5-4-14), Lyndsey Heckel (6-1-13) and Hannah Sawyer (5-3-13).
- •The 2022 Billikens broke school records for points, goals and assists before playing their 20th game. The teams that held the previous marks set them in either 21 or 23 games.
- •Saint Louis scored its 65 goals on 190 shots on goal. It took the previous record-holding team, the 2018 Billikens, 222 shots on frame to register 52 goals.
- •Nine Billikens collected 10 or more points, the most double-digit totals in program history.

... AND DON'T FORGET THE DEFENSE

- •Saint Louis traditionally has played smothering defense, and last year was no exception.
- •SLU concluded the 2022 season by shutting out nine of its last 11 opponents, part of a school-record 15 clean sheets.
- •The Billikens allowed just 10 goals overall. In 13 games vs. conference opponents (10 in the regular season, three in the A-10 Championship), Saint Louis yielded only four goals.
- •The Billikens' plus-55 goal differential set a school record 17 goals better than the previous mark of plus-38 (2018).

HOME-GROWN TALENT DOMINATES BILLIKEN ROSTER

- •Six different states are represented on the 2023 Saint Louis roster, but the Billikens' team is composed largely of local and state-of-Missouri players.
- •Of SLU's 28 players, 14 are from the St. Louis area (including two from just across the Mississippi River in Illinois), and 17 are from Missouri.

HEAD COACH KATIE SHIELDS

- •Now in her 11th season leading the Billikens, 2018, 2019 and 2022 Atlantic 10 Conference Coach of the Year **Katie Shields** owns a 153-58-16 (.709) career record (all at Saint Louis).
- •In addition to the 2022 A-10 coaching honor, Shields and her staff were selected East Region Coaching Staff of the Year by United Soccer Coaches, the second such honor for SLU in three seasons.
- •Shields, who spent one year as a SLU assistant before becoming head coach, has guided the Bills to a league-best 131-29-11 (.798) mark since the start of the 2016 season. That record includes an 84-8-5 (.892) ledger vs. A-10 opponents (including conference tournament games).
- •Shields' Billikens are playing in a sixth straight NCAA Championship this year after extending the A-10 women's soccer record for consecutive league tournament championships to six.
- •The Billikens also made history three seasons ago when they became the first A-10 women's soccer team to capture both regular-season and tournament titles in three consecutive years.
- •Shields' players have earned All-America honors five times, All-Region plaudits 25 times and Atlantic 10 accolades (first team, second team, All-Rookie) 72 times. In addition, Billikens have been selected A-10 Defensive Player of the Year seven times (seven of the past eight seasons), Midfielder of the Year three times, Offensive Player of the Year three times (including each of the past two seasons), and Rookie of the Year twice.

SAINT LOUIS IN 28TH SEASON OF WOMEN'S SOCCER

- •The 2023 season is the 28th in SLU women's soccer history.
- •The Billikens are 334-174-59 for a .641 winning percentage.
- •In conference play (Conference USA 1996-2004, Atlantic 10 since 2005), SLU is 174-71-27 (.689).
- •Saint Louis has captured 16 conference championships (eight regular-season, eight tournament) and has made eight NCAA Championship appearances (2005, 2006, 2018, 2019, 2020, 2021, 2022, 2023). The 2023 team became the first in program history to reach the round of 16. The 2005, 2006 and 2021 teams reached the second round with first-round wins; the 2020 Billikens (season played in spring 2021) were seeded into the second round in an abbreviated 48-team tournament field.
- •This year's team has produced a 19th winning season for the program and is the 10th team in program history to have a .750 or higher winning percentage. It also is the ninth Billiken women's soccer team to win 15 or more games.

BILLIKENS' VETERAN PLAYERS HEAVILY DECORATED

- •Postseason accolades have been plentiful for Saint Louis in recent seasons, and players on this year's team have collected their fair share.
- •The 2023 Billiken squad includes 12 players who have combined to capture 74 postseason awards (A-10 conference and United Soccer Coaches All-America and All-Region recognition, plus Hermann Trophy consideration).
 - •Here is a breakdown by player:

Three Major-Award Winners Headline Billikens' 2023 All-Conference Group

Nine Saint Louis University women's soccer student-athletes, including three major-award winners and five first-team selections, earned 2023 Atlantic 10 All-Conference honors, the league announced Nov. 2.

Senior defender **Lyndsey Heckel** was tabbed Defensive Player of the Year, senior goalkeeper **Emily Puricelli** was named Goalkeeper of the Year, and junior forward **Emily Gaebe** claimed Offensive Player of the Year accolades.

Since 2016, Saint Louis women's soccer student-athletes have earned 16 A-10 postseason major awards, including three in three of the past four seasons.

Joining Heckel, Puricelli and Gaebe on the top unit are graduate midfielder **Abbie Miller** and senior forward **Caroline Kelly**.

Senior defenders **Sophia Stram** and **Katie Houck** and redshirt-junior midfielder/forward **Hannah Larson** were selected to the All-Conference second team. Freshman midfielder **Alyssa Bockius** earned a spot on the All-Rookie team.

Heckel's selection as Defensive Player of the Year marks the seventh time in the past eight seasons that a Billiken has captured the award. Gaebe is the third Billiken, and second in succession, to claim Offensive Player of the Year laurels.

Heckel and Miller became the first student-athletes in Saint Louis women's soccer history to collect first-team All-Conference honors four times. They, along with Puricelli (first team three times, second team once) and Stram (twice each on the first and second teams), give the Billiken program nine players all-time with four All-Conference selections in their careers.

Gaebe and Kelly garnered first-team plaudits for a second time; with a prior second-team nod, Gaebe is a three-time All-Conference honoree. Larson is a two-time All-Conference choice, while Houck secured a place on the list for the first time.

Saint Louis has produced 55 All-Conference selections over the past eight seasons, including 37 first-team choices.

WHAT'S A BILLIKEN?

The Billiken was born Oct. 8, 1908, when Kansas City art teacher and illustrator Florence Pretz patented a design for an elflike creature with pixie ears, a mischievous smile and a tuft of hair on his pointed head. Reportedly, the image came to her in a dream.

Although it didn't appear on the actual patent, some believe Pretz found the Billiken name in a fanciful work entitled, "Mr. Moon: A Song of the Little People," by Canadian poets Bliss Carman and Richard Hovey.

Within a short time, Pretz sold her patented image to the Billiken Company of Chicago. Initially manufactured as a bank and statuette, and later as a doll, this good luck charm soon became a national craze. By 1911, the Billiken's likeness adorned everything from marshmallow candies to hood ornaments.

In his heyday, the Billiken enjoyed worldwide fame. Artisans in Alaska began carving his image into ivory, and in Japan, he appeared in shrines, amusement parks and even a movie.

Like many other fads, the Billiken might have faded into obscurity if it were not for Saint Louis University law student John Bender, who also happened to be the coach of SLU's football team during the height of Billikenmania.

One story claims that nearby drugstore owner Billy Gunn called Bender a Billiken when the coach walked into his establishment one day. Supposedly, legendary sportswriter William O'Connor

was within earshot of the remark and took up the moniker not only for Bender but also for SLU's sports teams.

Another tale claims O'Connor himself dubbed the coach a Billiken after a particularly good practice left Bender beaming with a big smile. After practice, Bender's fellow law student Charles Z. McNamara, a local cartoonist, sketched Bender as a Billiken, posted it in Gunn's drugstore window and tabbed the football team "Bender's Billikens."

Yet another yarn reports that the druggist asked McNamara to decorate his store window the night before a homecoming game. Supposedly, McNamara drew a Billiken, a popular good luck charm, causing one of his fellow students to exclaim, "That looks like coach Bender!"

Whatever the case, O'Connor is generally credited for popularizing the name throughout the city, but one fact flies in the face of this legend and lore. O'Connor did not join the St. Louis Post-Dispatch until Nov. 26, 1911, one full month after the newspaper first mentioned "Bender's Billikens."

Regardless of how the story is told or whether his mysterious origins are ever finally resolved, the Billiken remains a good luck charm for Saint Louis University's sports teams and always brings smiles to the faces of SLU fans.

Legend has it that the Billiken has three kinds of luck – good, better and best. Buying a Billiken gives the buyer good luck. To have one given to you is better luck. The best luck comes if the Billiken is stolen.

#24 SAINT LOUIS 1, LOYOLA CHICAGO 0 Thursday, Sept. 14 – Chicago, Ill.

No. 24 Saint Louis captured a dramatic road win with a late goal for a second consecutive game, scoring in the 85th minute to edge Loyola Chicago 1-0 in the Atlantic 10 Conference opener for both teams.

The Billikens tallied the game-winner on the seventh of their eight corner kicks. Lyndsey Heckel directed a header past Ramblers goalkeeper Naya Lipkens for her second goal of the season, and Hannah Larson's perfect serve netted her a team-leading sixth assist of the year.

Emily Puricelli stopped all five Loyola shots on goal to record her second shutout of the season and the 31st of her career, breaking a tie with **Mary Niehaus** for second place all-time at Saint Louis.

SAINT LOUIS 3, #24 NEBRASKA 2

Sunday, Sept. 10 – Lincoln, Neb.

Abbie Miller scored her 10th career game-winning goal in the 88th minute to lift Saint Louis to a 3-2 victory over 24th-ranked and previously unbeaten Nebraska. Miller was assisted by **Emily Groark** and **Sophia Stram**.

Nebraska struck first on Eleanor Dale's penalty kick in the 56th minute before Saint Louis grabbed the lead with goals just 3:46 apart. **Jess Preusser (Caroline Kelly** assist) netted the equalizer in the 64th minute, and **Katie Houck (Hannah Larson)** put the Bills in front in the 67th minute.

Dale evened the score with her 12th goal of the season in the 76th minute, setting the stage for Miller's dramatic game-winner.
