Two is Enough

• The Mountaineers have found a winning combination in scoring multiple goals in a match. The squad has won 68 of its last 70 contests when finding the back of the net twice or more.

• WVU is 1-0 so far this year and was 7-0-1 last season when scoring two goals or more

• West Virginia has lost just 11 times in program history when scoring multiple goals (304-11-4).

Twice as Nice

• In all, West Virginia has featured a two-goal scorer 128 times since the program began in 1996.

• Most recently, junior midfielder AJ Rodriguez earned the first brace of her career with a pair of goals in the Mountaineers' 3-2 win at Oklahoma on Oct. 23, 2022

• Rodriguez became WVU's second two-goal scorer last season, after fifthyear senior forward Lauren Segalla tallied the second brace of her career in WVU's 2-0 victory at Iowa State on Sept. 25, 2022.

 Segalla was the first two-goal scorer for WVU since Isabella Sibley against Texas Tech on Oct. 17, 2021.

Strength in (Returning) Numbers

• Eighteen of the 25 different Mountaineers who earned playing time last season return to the squad this fall.

• Seven players return to the team who logged 1,000 minutes or more in 2022, including team leader, goalkeeper Kayza Massey, who played 2,079 minutes of game action

• Sixteen different players found the back of the net last season, and of those, 11 return to the team in 2023.

• What's more, WVU's returning scorers accounted for 24 of the team's 31 goals last season.

• All but two of the eight different players who were credited with an assist last fall return to West Virginia's roster this year, including junior forward Dilary Heredia-Beltran who led the team with seven helpers in 2022.

 Additionally, 18 different players tallied at least one point in 2022. Senior midfielder AJ Rodriguez and Heredia-Beltran return as WVU's leading point earners, tallying 11 and 10, respectively, last season.

• A pair of Mountaineers have already recorded their first career start for WVU this season, as Olivia Shertzer and Taylor White earned the starting nod for the first time in WVU's season opener at Duke on Aug. 17.

• The WVU roster is led by a strong group of seniors once again in 2023.

WVU's roster consists of five seniors and five fifth-year seniors.

• Fifth-year seniors Mackenzie Aunkst, Kayza Massey, Maya McCutcheon, Maddie Moreau and Julianne Vallerand return to lead the team this year, taking advantage of their fifth season of eligibility due to COVID-19.

• A majority of the senior group consists of returning studs AJ Rodriguez, Isabel Loza, Lilly McCarthy and Chloe Adler.

• Additionally, transfer Jaydah Bedoya joins the WVU senior roster this fall, as she brings three years of Division I experience from her time at UConn.

Oh Captain, My Captain(s)

• The 2023 Mountaineers are led by a trio of co-captains, all of whom bring a wealth of talent and experience to the squad.

• Mackenzie Aunkst, Maya McCutcheon and Maddie Moreau were elected to lead the squad as co-captains this season.

• They were selected based on team voting and were required to submit a written essay to the coaching staff in order to be considered a candidate for captaincy.

• McCutcheon and Moreau return for their second season as co-captions, while Aunkst was selected for the first time.

• In the first matchup on Aug. 25, the Nittany Lions earned a 2-0 win, before securing a 4-0 win in the NCAA Tournament matchup to advance to the Sweet Sixteen

• WVU and PSU have met as ranked opponents in 10 of the last 12 matches, dating back to the 2012 meeting.

• WVU is 37-6-3 all-time in home, Big 12 matches.

• West Virginia's season-opening victory over Buffalo on Aug. 19, 2021, marked the Mountaineers' 150th win all-time at their home facility.


