Illinois Starts 2023 Season 1-1

- Illinois is off to a 1-1 start after a 30-28 win over reigning MAC champion Toledo, followed by a 34-23 loss at Kansas last Friday night.
- Against Toledo, new Illinois QB Luke Altmyer led Illinois on a 12-play, 64-yard drive in the final minutes to get the Illini within field goal range for the 29-yard game-winner from K Caleb Griffin. It was Illinois' first game-winning drive in the final two minutes of a season opener in program history.
- Altmyer went 18-26 with 211 passing yards, 69 rushing yards, and two passing touchdowns - both to Pat Bryant - in his debut vs. Toledo. Altmyer's QBR of 79.2 in Week 1 was 25th in the nation and fourth among Big Ten QBs, behind only J.J. McCarthy (MICH), Taulia Tagovailoa (MD), and Drew Allar (PSU).
- DB Miles Scott was named the Big Ten co-Defensive Player of the Week following the win over Toledo. Making his debut on defense, Scott took his first career interception to the house for a 48-yard pick-6 in the third quarter to change the game. Scott was the #1 graded defensive back in the nation by PFF and the #3 overall defender in the nation (#1 in the Big Ten) during Week 1.
- DB Miles Scott's 48-yard pick-6 is the longest in the Big Ten so far this season and was the fifth-longest in college football during Week 1.
- Illinois trailed by as many as 12 points against Toledo (19-7 in the third quarter), marking its largest comeback win since the school-record 25-point comeback win at Michigan State on Nov. 9, 2019.
- Luke Altmyer was the first QB to throw for 200+ yards in an Illini debut since Wes Lunt had 285 yards passing against Youngstown State, 8/30/14.
- Illinois dropped a 34-23 matchup at Kansas last week, after falling behind 28-7 in the first half. The Illini clawed back by outscoring Kansas 16-6 in the second half, but could not get the game within two possessions.

Altmyer Takes Over at Quarterback

- Illinois turned to new starting quarterback Luke Altmyer after 2022's starting QB Tommy DeVito ran out of eligibility and is now on the New York Giants' practice squad. Altmyer transferred to Illinois in January from Ole Miss.
- Altmyer has made an instant impact on the Illinois offense, as he leads the Big Ten in points responsible for (32) through the first two weeks of the season. Altmyer ranks fourth in the Big Ten in completion percentage (68.5%), fourth in yards per carry (6.8), fifth in total offense (273.5), and seventh in yards per pass attempt (7.56).
- Altmyer broke a 72-yard touchdown run at Kansas. It was the second-longest run in Illinois history by a quarterback and the longest in 91 years. The longest run by an Illini quarterback was a 75-yard touchdown run by Gil Berry at Chicago, 10/29/1932.
- Altmyer already has a team-best 139 rushing yards. He is only 164 rushing yards away from cracking Illinois' all-time top-10 list for rushing yards by a quarterback.
- Altmyer's favorite target has been WR Isaiah Williams, who ranks third in the Big Ten in receptions per game (5.5) and sixth in receiving yards (150). Williams has at least one catch in all 27 games since he switched from QB prior to the start of the 2021 season, which is the second-longest active streak in the Big Ten behind Penn State's Dante Cephas (29) and the 12th-longest active streak in the nation.
- Altmyer has found Williams for eight first-down receptions, tied for the third-most in the Big Ten and only one back of the most in the league.

Fans are encouraged to wear orange for the Hail to the Orange Out at Memorial Stadium on Saturday. Illinois will hand out orange rally towels sponsored by Central Illinois Toyota Dealers to the first 10,000 fans in Memorial Stadium.

ILLINI NOTES

Illini on the Rise - 2022 Recap

- Last year, Illinois had its first 8-win season since the Rose Bowl team in 2007 went 9-4.
- Illinois played in the ReliaQuest Bowl, the Illini's first January bowl game since the 2008 Rose Bowl.
- Illinois finished 5-4 in the Big Ten, the Illini's first finish above .500 in the Big Ten since the 2007 team went 6-2.
- Illinois' SP+ rating by ESPN was 43 spots better than 2021 (21st from 64th). According to SP+, the Fighting Illini were the most improved team in the Big Ten and Illinois' 14.8 rating was its best since the 2001 Big Ten championship team had a 14.9 rating.
- Bielema's five Big Ten road wins in his first two seasons are the most since Lou Tepper also won five Big Ten road games in his first two seasons from 1992-93.
- Illinois was 4-0 in October 2022, completing its first undefeated October since going 3-0 in 2001. The Illini won four games in October for the first time since 1990.
- After winning at Wisconsin for the first time since 2002, Illinois beat Iowa for the first time since 2008. The win over Iowa snapped an eight-game losing streak against the Hawkeyes.
- Illinois beat Iowa, Wisconsin, and Minnesota in the same season for the first time since 1983.
- Illinois returned 10 All-Big Ten players from a year ago, the most returning All-Big Ten players in the Big Ten West and the fourth-most in the conference behind only Michigan, Ohio State, and Penn State.
- Illinois led the nation in scoring defense (12.8) for the first time in program history in 2022.
- Illinois ranked in the top 10 in 15 other major defensive categories during the regular season: 1st in interceptions (24), 1st in takeaways (32), 1st in fewest touchdowns allowed (16), 1st in passing efficiency defense (92.6), 1st in red zone touchdown percentage (35.5%), 2nd in passing touchdowns allowed (9), 2nd in rushing touchdowns allowed (6), 2nd in yards per pass attempt (5.4), 3rd in total defense (273.5), 3rd in passes defended (90), 5th in fewest first downs allowed per game (15.2), 7th in fewest red zone attempts allowed (31), 8th in passing defense (173.8), 9th in third down defense (30.1%), 10th in rushing defense (99.8)
- Illinois and Air Force were the only teams in the nation that ranked in the top 10 of both passing defense and rushing defense.
- Illinois set a program record and led the nation with 24 interceptions.
- Illinois' defense was ranked second in the nation by ESPN's SP+ metric and fourth by PFF.
- Illinois allowed 13.8 points per game in road/neutral site games, the fewest in the country.
- Illinois held six opponents to single digit points, the most of any team in the country.
- Illinois returned six starters and 23 letterwinners from last year's record-setting defense, including Preseason All-American defensive tackles Jer'Zhan Newton and Keith Randolph.

The Law Firm of Newton and Randolph

- Defensive tackles Jer'Zhan "Johnny" Newton and Keith Randolph Jr., who go by the nickname "The Law Firm," were one of the top defensive tackle duos in the nation in 2022 and both were named Preseason All-Americans by multiple outlets entering 2023.
- Newton sacked Kansas dual-threat QB Jalon Daniels twice last Friday. Newton is one of only four Big Ten players with 2.0 sacks in a game this season.
- Newton ranks second in the Big Ten in sacks (2.0), behind only Nebraska LB Luke Reimer (2.5).
- Johnny Newton was the No. 9 graded defender in the nation by PFF (91.5) in 2022.
- Newton led the nation in QB hits (19) and ranked sixth in the nation in pressures (54) in 2022.
- Newton and Randolph led the nation in TFLs (27.0) and QB pressures (81) among defensive line partners (81) in 2022.
- Newton and Randolph were second and third in the Big Ten in TFLs (14.0, 13.0) and ranked first and second among interior defensive linemen in 2022.
- Newton tied Pitt's Calijah Kancey (14.0) for the most TFLs by any Power-5 interior defensive linemen in 2022, and Randolph was third (13.0). Kancey was the ACC Def. Player of the Year.

ILLINI NOTES

Bielema's New Six-Year Deal

- Illinois head coach Bret Bielema signed a new six-year contract, Illinois AD Josh Whitman announced Dec. 20, 2022, after Bielema engineered one of the most impressive turnarounds in college football since his hiring on Dec. 19, 2020. Bielema will be under contract through the 2028 season.
- As part of the contract, Bielema has a non-compete against any program in the Big Ten.
- Bielema: "Even though I've had a lot of success as a coach, I can't really say that Wisconsin is my legacy or Arkansas I definitely don't want that to be my legacy. But I could see Illinois as when my girls are at the age to go to college, this is something I would like to see them do, grow up in a community like this."
- Whitman: "It's exciting for me. I think when you have that long-term commitment from him and from me, it puts us in a position to make long-term decisions. That can be different. Occasionally, you have to make decisions about what's in the best long-term interest of Illinois football and what might be in the best interest of the next month and the next season. It aligns us in terms of our vision for the future of the program. It gives us both a sense of security and stability. We're able to lock arms and really be able to walk down this path together. It's exciting."

Illini, Penn State Offensive Improvement in 2022

- Illinois improved 48.2 yards per game from 2021 to 2022, the second-best improvement in the Big Ten behind only Penn State's 57.2 yards per game improvement.
- Illinois ranked third in the nation in team completion percentage (69.6%) in 2022, an 18.4% improvement of the 2021 team's completion percentage (51.2%) and a jump of 119 spots in the national rankings.

2023 Illini in the NFL

- Illinois has 21 players in the NFL, including seven players from last year's team:
 - » DB Devon Witherspoon, Seattle (1st round, 5th overall) -- 53-man roster (inactive Week 1)
 - » DB Jartavius Martin, Washington (2nd round, 47th overall) -- 53-man roster
 - » DB Sydney Brown, Philadelphia (3rd round, 66th overall) -- 53-man roster
 - » RB Chase Brown, Cincinnati (5th round, 163rd overall) -- 53-man roster (inactive Week 1)
 - » OL Alex Palczewski, Denver (free agent signing) -- 53-man roster (IR)
 - » LB Isaac Darkangelo, Las Vegas (free agent signing) -- practice squad
 - » QB Tommy DeVito, New York Giants (free agent signing) -- practice squad

2023 NFL Draft Notes

- Illinois was the only team in the nation to have three defensive backs off the board in the first three rounds, as Devon Witherspoon, Quan Martin, and Sydney Brown went in the first two days.
- Illinois had three DBs drafted for the first time in history dating back to the NFL-AFL merger.
- Illinois had two defensive backs drafted in the top 50 for the first time since the NFL-AFL merger.
- Illinois had two top-50 picks for the first time since A.J. Jenkins and Whitney Mercilus went in the first round of the 2012 NFL Draft.
- Illinois' four picks in the first five rounds tied the program record set in 2003 and 2012.
- Devon Witherspoon was the highest drafted defensive back in Illinois history.
- Devon Witherspoon was the sixth Fighting Illini in history to be drafted in the top-5, joining Jeff George (No. 1, 1990), Kevin Hardy (No. 2, 1996), Simeon Rice (No. 3, 1996), Dick Butkus (No. 3, 1965), and Joe Rutgens (No. 3, 1961).
- Chase and Sydney became the ninth twins to be selected in the same NFL Draft and only the third set to be picked within the first five rounds. The Browns joined Ronde and Tiki Barber (1997) and Mike and Mark Bell (1979) as the only twins to be selected within the first five rounds of the same NFL Draft.
- Illinois head coach Bret Bielema has 51 NFL Draft picks during his head coaching career, which is among the top 10 in the nation for active head coaches.
- Witherspoon was Bielema's seventh first-rounder and the second-highest pick of Bielema's head coaching career.
- Chase Brown was the 11th running back to have played under Bielema to make it to the NFL.

GAME NOTES

- The nine-overtime game was the longest in college football history.
- Brown's 223 rushing yards were the most ever by an opponent at Beaver Stadium and the fourth-most ever against Penn State. Brown is the first rusher to eclipse the 200-yard mark against the Penn State defense since Benjarvus Green-Ellis recorded 203 yards in 2003 for Indiana.
- Brown's 223-yard game marks his second game of the season with 200+ yards. He joins Howard Griffith (1990) and Rashard Mendenhall (2007) as the only players in program history with multiple 200-yard rushing games in a single season.
- DBs Devon Witherspoon and Kerby Joseph each recorded the first sacks of their Illini careers.



The Illinois-Penn State Series

- Illinois and Penn State meet for the first time since the Illini took down #7 Penn State at Beaver Stadium in nine overtimes — the longest game in college football history — on Oct. 23, 2021. In the ninth overtime period, QB Brandon Peters connected with WR Casey Washington in the end zone to lift the Fighting Illini to an upset win on the Nittany Lions' Homecoming weekend. The historic win also marked the 100th of head coach Bret Bielema's career. Illinois' run game fueled the offense through regulation as Chase Brown and Josh McCray rushed for 223 and 142 yards, respectively. Brown's 223 rushing yards were the most ever by an opponent at Beaver Stadium.
- Illinois visited Penn State in back-to-back seasons in 2020 and 2021. In the final game of the 2020 season, which was scheduled one week prior, Penn State defeated the Illini, 56-21. Then-QB Isaiah Williams threw for two touchdowns and rushed for 102 yards with Rod Smith serving as interim head coach in the first game following Lovie Smith's dismissal. Current Illinois head coach Bret Bielema was officially hired that morning and attended the game in State College after flying in from New Jersey, where he was living while coaching with the New York Giants.
- Illinois has won four of the last 12 meetings (2007, 2010, 2014, 2021). Prior to 2007, Penn State had won 11 of 13 meetings, including seven in a row from 1972-2000.
- Illinois' last win over Penn State in Champaign was in 2014, when David Reisner's 36-yard field goal with eight seconds left secured a 16-14 victory.
- Illinois is 2-12 all-time against Penn State teams ranked in the AP top 25, including a 1-6 record against Penn State teams ranked in the top 10. Other than 2021, the Illini's lone win against a ranked Penn State team was a 27-20 victory vs. No. 21 Penn State 9/29/2007.

Bret Bielema was named as the 26th Fighting Illini Head Football Coach in the history of the program in December 2020. A native of Prophetstown, Illinois, Bielema has 25 years of collegiate coaching experience and compiled a 15-year record of 111-71 (through Week 2) as head coach at Wisconsin, Arkansas, and Illinois.

From 2006-12 Bielema was the head coach at Wisconsin, where he led the Badgers to three Big Ten championships (2010-12), six consecutive bowl games and a 68-24 record (.739). Bielema then spent five seasons as head coach at Arkansas from 2013-17. After inheriting a depleted roster and enduring a difficult first season, he led the Razorbacks to three consecutive bowl games, including victories against Texas in 2014 and Kansas State in 2015.

Bielema, who signed a six-year agreement in 2022 that will keep him at Illinois through 2028, guided the Fighting Illini to an 8-5 record in 2022 and led Illinois back to a bowl game in just his second season in Champaign. In 14 years as a Power 5 head coach, Bielema has led 11 of his teams - including last year's Illinois squad - to bowls.

Bielema's coaching pedigree and list of football mentors matches that of any coach in the nation. He played for and coached under Hall-of-Famer Hayden Fry at Iowa, spent two years as Co-Defensive Coordinator at Kansas State under Hall-of-Famer

Bill Snyder, served as defensive coordinator at Wisconsin under Hall-of-Famer Barry Alvarez before taking over as head coach when Alvarez retired, and helped six-time Super Bowl champion head coach Bill Belichick to the Super Bowl LIII title with New England.

Bielema was a defensive lineman at Iowa from 1989-92, when he was a four-time letterman under Fry. After joining the team as a walk-on, Bielema earned a scholarship after his first year, started as a junior and was named a team captain for his senior season. Bielema graduated from Iowa in 1992 with a bachelor's degree in marketing.

Following his graduation, Bielema signed a free-agent contract with the Seattle Seahawks and ended his playing career in 1994 as a member of the Milwaukee Mustangs of the Arena Football League.

He and his wife, Jen, have two daughters, Briella Nicole and Brexli Nichole.

BARRY LUNNEY JR. OFFENSIVE COORDINATOR/QUARTERBACKS

GAME DAY LOCATION: BOOTH

Barry Lunney Jr. is in his second season as Illinois' offensive coordinator. Lunney and Illinois head coach Bret Bielema were reunited after Lunney spent five years as the tight ends coach at Arkansas under Bielema from 2013-17. Lunney's position group - the quarterbacks - was the most improved position for the Illini year-over-year, as the Illini ranked third in the nation in completion percentage (69.6%), a rise of 122 spots in the national rankings. Starting quarterback Tommy DeVito ranked third in the nation individually in completion percentage, and his 141.22 pass efficiency rating ranked second in Illinois history and sixth in the Big Ten. DeVito, a former starter at Syracuse, posted career highs in completions (257), passing yards (2,650), completion percentage (69.6%), passing efficiency (141.22), and rushing touchdowns (6) under Lunney's offense. Lunney came to Champaign from UTSA, where he served as associate head coach/offensive coordinator/quarterbacks coach in 2020 and 2021. Lunney helped bring UTSA to new heights during his time in San Antonio, reaching No. 15 in the national rankings in 2021. UTSA opened the 2021 season with 11 straight wins, won its first Conference USA championship with a 49-41 win over Western Kentucky in the C-USA title game, and appeared in the Frisco Bowl. Lunney and his wife, Janelle, have two sons, Luke and Levi.



ROBBY DISCHER SPECIAL TEAMS COORDINATOR/TIGHT ENDS

GAME DAY LOCATION: FIELD

Robby Discher is in his first season as Illinois' special teams coordinator/tight ends coach in 2023. Discher came to Illinois from Tulane, where he helped the Green Wave to AAC and Cotton Bowl championships as special teams coordinator last season. Discher spent one season at Tulane, one of the best in program history, as Green Wave finished 12-2 and ranked No. 9 in the final AP Poll. Tulane's special teams ranked in the top 30 in six major categories, including punt return defense (3rd, 1.1), blocked kicks (19th, 3), yards per kick return (20th, 22.9), kickoff touchbacks (23rd, 47), yards per punt return (28th, 9.9), and kick return defense (29th, 17.6). Discher had individuals rank in the top 10 in the nation in both kickoff and punt returns, as Lawrence Keys III averaged 27.1 yards per kickoff return to rank eighth in the nation and Jha'Quan Jackson averaged 10.1 yards per punt return to rank 10th in the nation. Tulane's return units combined to outgain their opponents by 478 yards in 2022, with the kick units going +260 yards (754-494) and the punt units posting a margin of +218 yards (227-9) on the season. Discher arrived at Tulane following a season as the special teams quality control coach for the 14-1 National Champion Georgia Bulldogs in 2021. Discher and the former Erin Wilson were married in July 2017. He has two stepchildren, Connor and Sydney. The couple has a baby girl, Quinn, who was born in February 2018.



GEORGE MCDONALD ASSISTANT HEAD COACH/WIDE RECEIVERS

GAME DAY LOCATION: FIELD

George McDonald is in his third season as assistant head coach/wide receivers coach at the University of Illinois in 2023. McDonald returned to his alma mater following six seasons at North Carolina State and with experience in three Power-5 conferences and the NFL. In 2022, McDonald's wide receivers group was led by All-Big Ten wide receiver Isaiah Williams, who ranked in the top 10 in the Big Ten in receptions per game (2nd, 6.3), receiving yards (7th, 715), receiving touchdowns (10th, 5), and receiving yards per game (10th, 55). Williams was second in the nation in yards after catch (683), according to PFF, and ranked 15th in the nation in receiving yards (6.3). Illinois was the only team in the Big Ten that featured four wide receivers with 30+ receptions. McDonald was a four-year letterwinner at receiver for the Fighting Illini and completed his Illinois football career with 57 receptions for 589 yards and four touchdowns. He led the Big Ten in kickoff return yardage in 1996 (736) while returning 57 kickoffs for 1,276 yards (22.4 avg.) during his career. McDonald also ran track his freshman and senior years. He and his wife, the former Heather Anderson, have two sons, Roman and Maverick.



BART MILLER OFFENSIVE LINE

GAME DAY LOCATION: FIELD

Bart Miller is in his third season as offensive line coach at the University of Illinois in 2023. Miller joined Bret Bielema's coaching staff for the second time and came to Champaign-Urbana after two successful seasons as offensive line coach and offensive run-game coordinator at Wyoming. Miller's offensive line group was one of the most dominant for the Illini in 2022, as Illinois' offensive line was named a Joe Moore Award semifinalist for the first time in program history. All five starters on the offensive line earned All-Big Ten honors and RT Alex Palczewski was the first tackle in Illinois history to earn a first-team All-American selection. The offensive line also paved the way for running back Chase Brown, who ranked fourth in the nation in rushing and was Illinois' first ever Doak Walker Award finalist. As a player at the University of New Mexico from 2003-07 under head coach Rocky Long, Miller was a starter and two-year letterman on the offensive line. He played football and graduated from Elk Grove High School in the Chicago area prior to completing his bachelor's degree in organizational communication from New Mexico in 2007. Originally from Omaha, Nebraska, Miller and his wife, Amy, have two sons, Barrett and Gunner.



THAD WARD RUNNING BACKS

GAME DAY LOCATION: FIELD

Thad Ward is in his fourth season and second stint as running backs coach at Illinois in 2023. Ward brought over 20 years of college football coaching experience back to Champaign, including three years as running backs coach at Illinois from 2016-18, when he was rehired in January 2023. Ward rejoins the Fighting Illini from Kansas State, where he was the wide receivers coach in 2022 for K-State's Big XII championship team. Kansas State went 10-4, including a 31-28 win over eventual national runner-up TCU in the Big XII title game, and earned a spot in the New Year's Six (Sugar Bowl) before finishing the season ranked No. 14 in the final AP Top 25. Ward's wideouts were the top three receivers for the Wildcats, combining for 139 receptions for 1,768 and 11 receiving touchdowns, and two were signed to NFL clubs following the season - Malik Knowles (Minnesota) and Kade Warner (Tampa Bay). Ward has deep roots in the state of Illinois with over a decade of coaching experience in the state. He first spent time in the state of Illinois for six seasons at Western Illinois (2005-10), then for three seasons at both Northern Illinois (2013-15) and Illinois (2016-18). He and his wife, Jocelyn, have two daughters, Jayda and Journie, and one son, Thaddaeus, Jr.

DEFENSIVE ASSISTANTS



AARON HENRY DEFENSIVE COORDINATOR

GAME DAY LOCATION: FIELD

Aaron Henry was promoted to Illinois' defensive coordinator in December 2022 after spending two seasons as the Illini's defensive backs coach. Henry led one of the nation's best defensive backs units in his first two seasons in Champaign and was the 2022 FootballScoop Defensive Backs Coach of the Year. He was the youngest coordinator in the Big Ten when he took over for Illinois at the 2023 ReliaQuest Bowl. Henry's unit was the best in the nation against the pass in 2022, as Illinois led the nation in scoring defense (12.8), interceptions (24), takeaways (32), and passing efficiency defense (92.64). The Illini's pass efficiency defense of 92.64 was more than 10 points better than the next-best defense (Penn State, 103.24), nearly 40 points better than the median pass defense, and trailed only 2013 Michigan State (92.28) for the best in the last decade. Illinois also ranked second in the nation in fewest passing touchdowns allowed (9), second in fewest yards per passing attempt (5.4), eighth in fewest passing yards allowed per game (173.8), as well as seventh in fewest first downs allowed (199), ninth in third down defense (30.1%), and 10th in rushing defense (99.8). Henry and his wife, Camille, married in January 2022 and welcomed twins, Harlow Madison and Dakota Savoy, in 2023.



TERRANCE JAMISON CO-DEFENSIVE COORDINATOR/DEFENSIVE LINE

GAME DAY LOCATION: FIELD

Terrance Jamison was promoted to co-defensive coordinator/defensive line coach in 2023 following two seasons as defensive line coach for the Fighting Illini. Jamison led one of the best defensive line units in the nation in 2022, helping Illinois to its best season in 15 years. Illinois led the nation in scoring defense (12.8), takeaways (32), and passing efficiency defense (92.6) with the defensive line playing a major role in the unit's success. Illinois also ranked in the top 10 in the nation in total defense (3rd, 273.5), rushing defense (10th, 99.8), fewest first downs allowed (7th, 199), and third down defense (9th, 30.1%). In Jamison's defensive line room, All-American DT Jer'Zhan Newton tied for the national lead in QB hits (19), ranked seventh in the nation in pressures (59), and together with All-Big Ten DT Keith Randolph the duo led the nation in quarterback pressures among defensive line partners with 81. Newton tied for the nation lead in TFLs among interior defensive linemen with 14.0, while Randolph ranked third in the country among interior d-line players with 13.0 TFLs. A native of Harvey, Illinois, who graduated from Thornton Township High School. He and his wife, Ashley, have two daughters, Ava and Mackenzie, and one son, Jayce.



ANDY BUH LINEBACKERS

GAME DAY LOCATION: FIELD

Andy Buh enters his third season at Illinois in 2022. Buh enters 2023 with 25 years of collegiate coaching experience, including four different stops as defensive coordinator in three Power-5 conferences. Last year, Buh's linebacker group was led by All-Big Ten honorable mention performers Isaac Darkangelo and Tarique Barnes. Darkangelo led the Illini in tackles with 71, and Illinois' rotation of three main linebackers combined for 139 tackles and 17.5 tackles for loss. Bielema and Buh spent the 2012 season together at Wisconsin, helping the Badgers win the Big Ten Championship. Buh also spent time in the Big Ten as defensive coordinator and linebackers coach at Rutgers in 2019 and three years as defensive coordinator at Maryland from 2016-18. He also served as a coordinator earlier in his career at California, Nevada, and Stanford. Buh had a successful three-year run at Maryland, guiding a Terrapins defense that collected 37 sacks in 2016. Buh's defense allowed just one 300-yard passer in his first season at Maryland and allowed just 212.3 passing yards per game on the season. The following year, Buh's defense collected 10 interceptions and saw four players earn All-Big Ten honors. A native of Escondido, California, Buh and his wife, Kelly, have two sons, Luke and Logan. He earned his bachelor's degree in physical education at Nevada in 1995.



CHARLIE BULLEN PASS RUSH COORDINATOR/OUTSIDE LINEBACKERS

GAME DAY LOCATION: BOOTH

Charlie Bullen is in his first season as the Illinois football program's outside linebackers coach/pass rush coordinator after being hired by head coach Bret Bielema in January 2023. Bullen joined the Fighting Illini with 11 years of NFL coaching experience, including the last four years with the Arizona Cardinals. Bullen spent the last three seasons as the Cardinal's outside linebackers coach after originally joining the Cardinals staff as assistant linebackers coach for the 2019 season. He also has seven years of NFL experience with the Miami Dolphins from 2012-18 working with the linebackers and defensive line. With the help of Bullen's outside linebacker group, the Cardinals ranked fifth in the NFL with 89 total sacks during the two-year span from 2020-21. Of those, 50 came via the outside linebackers position. During that span, three Cardinals outside linebackers posted 10+ sacks: Markus Golden, Chandler Jones, and Haason Reddick. Bullen is a native of Palatine, Illinois, and a graduate of Fremd High School. Bullen and his wife, Megan, have three daughters, Elle, Berkley and Nellie, and are expecting their fourth child and first son.



ANTONIO FENELUS DEFENSIVE BACKS

GAME DAY LOCATION: FIELD

Antonio Fenelus was named Illinois' new defensive backs coach on Dec. 30, 2022. A former All-Big Ten first-team selection at Wisconsin, Fenelus has spent the 2021 and 2022 seasons as a defensive analyst at LSU. Fenelus is with Bielema, his college head coach, and defensive coordinator Aaron Henry, his college teammate. A four-year letterwinner at Wisconsin, Fenelus helped Wisconsin to Big Ten titles in 2010 and 2011, including a win in the inaugural Big Ten Football Championship Game in 2011. He was a two-time All-Big Ten first-team selection, earning the honor after 56 tackles, four interceptions, and seven pass breakups as a junior, then again as a senior when he had 51 tackles, 3.0 TFLs, four interceptions, and nine pass breakups. In his career, Fenelus recorded 155 tackles, 22 passes defended, nine interceptions, and three forced fumbles in 52 games (32 starts). As a senior, he earned UW's Jimmy Demetral Team MVP award for defense. Following his collegiate career, Fenelus signed as an undrafted free agent with the Indianapolis Colts before stints with the Saskatchewan Roughriders of the Canadian Football League and the Arizona Rattlers of the Arena Football League. Fenelus and his wife, Jordan, have four children, Alani, Arrow, Ace, and A.J.
