INSIDE THE GAME

NO. 7 NITTANY LIONS MEET NO. 24/22 IOWA FOR ANNUAL PENN STATE WHITE OUT

- OPENING KICK:** No. 7 Penn State welcomes No. 24/22 Iowa to Beaver Stadium on Saturday for the annual Penn State White Out. Kickoff is set for 7:30 p.m. on CBS.
- PENN STATE WHITE OUT:** The Nittany Lions are set to hold their 15th full-stadium Penn State White Out on Saturday. The tradition stretches back to a student section White Out in 2004. Penn State's first full-stadium White Out was against Notre Dame in 2007.
- SERIES HISTORY:** Penn State meets Iowa for the 32nd time in the series. Penn State holds a 17-14 advantage in the series. However, the teams are tied 11-11 as Big Ten foes. Fourteen of the previous 31 matchups have been decided by one-possession, including the last matchup as Penn State fell 23-20 in Iowa City. Penn State jumped out to a 17-3 lead but Iowa held PSU to three points in the second half and got a go-ahead 44-yard touchdown reception by Nico Ragaini with 6:26 left in the fourth quarter.
- NITTANY LIONS ON CBS:** Penn State will play its 27th game on CBS on Saturday. The Nittany Lions are 16-10 all-time on CBS, including last season's 41-12 win at Auburn. CBS returns to broadcast from Beaver Stadium for the first time since November 24, 1990, a 22-17 Penn State win over Pitt.
- FORCING TAKEAWAYS:** The Nittany Lions forced five takeaways at Illinois, including four interceptions and a fumble recovery. LB Abdul Carter, CB Johnny Dixon, CB Daequan Hardy and CB Cam Miller each recorded an interception, while LB Dominic DeLuca forced a fumble, recovered by LB Kobe King. Penn State secured takeaways on three-straight possessions in the first quarter, turning those into 13 points. The Nittany Lions have recorded three or more takeaways in seven games over the last two seasons, tied-most among FBS teams.
- THE OPPOSITION:** Iowa finished non-conference play with a 3-0 mark after a 41-10 win over Western Michigan last Saturday. The Hawkeyes tallied 387 yards, while holding the Broncos to 239 yards. Leshon Williams rushed for 145 yards on 12 carries, while Gade McNamara threw a pair of touchdown passes. Nick Jackson led the defense with nine tackles, including a sack.

RECENT SUCCESS

Since 2016, Penn State holds a .736 winning percentage, with a record of 67-24, the seventh-best winning percentage among Power Five programs. Penn State has won at least nine games in five of the last seven seasons.

ACADEMIC EXCELLENCE

A total of 584 of Penn State football student-athletes have earned Academic All-Big Ten honors since 1993 for owning at least a 3.0 grade point average and being a letterwinner.

ONE OF NATION'S TOUGHEST HOME VENUES

Penn State owns a superlative 312-80 (.796) record inside Beaver Stadium, the nation's second-largest facility, which opened in 1960 and has a capacity of 106,572. The Nittany Lions are 41-8 in Beaver Stadium since 2016, an .837 winning percentage, the eighth-best home record among Power Five teams.

HEAD COACH JAMES FRANKLIN

CAREER AT A GLANCE

- Franklin was named the 16th head football coach in the storied history of the Nittany Lion program on January 11, 2014.
- He is one of six current FBS head coaches to lead his teams to a bowl game in each of his first nine seasons as a head coach and one of six to do so in 11 of their first 12 seasons.
- Franklin is one of four current Big Ten coaches (Ryan Day, Kirk Ferentz, Jim Harbaugh) to have won a Big Ten Championship and became the first African American head coach to win a Big Ten title after Penn State's 2016 victory.
- He joins Mack Brown (UNC), Jimbo Fisher (Texas A&M), Nick Saban (Alabama), Kirby Smart (Georgia) and Dabo Swinney (Clemson) as the only active coaches in college football to have won at least three New Year's Six or College Football Playoff games in their career.
- Franklin has led his teams to four Top 10 finishes (4 at Penn State) and seven Top 25 finishes (2 at Vanderbilt; 5 at Penn State).
- In the last seven seasons under Franklin, Penn State is one of six teams to rank in the top 12 of the CFP final rankings at least five times, joining Alabama, Clemson, Georgia, Ohio State and Oklahoma.
- From 2016-19, Franklin led the Nittany Lions to three New Year's Six bowls - 2016 (Rose), 2017 (Fiesta) and 2019 (Cotton), making Penn State one of eight teams to accomplish the feat during the four-year span. Penn State last went to three New Year's Six bowls in four years in 1980-83 (1980 Fiesta, 1982 Fiesta, 1983 Sugar).
- Franklin guided Penn State to back-to-back New Year's Six bowls in 2016 (Rose) and 2017 (Fiesta) for the first time since 1985 (Orange) and 1986 (Fiesta).
- From 2016-19, Franklin led Penn State to 42 wins, the most in program history for the Big Ten era, and 28 league wins, a program record.
- Franklin has 28 years of coaching experience at the collegiate and NFL level.
- In his first 12 years as a head coach, Franklin mentored 90 players who have gone on to the NFL ranks.
- Franklin is first all-time in total wins and winning percentage by an FBS African American head coach (minimum 80 wins).

NISSANY LIONS ON THE FIELD

- Penn State defeated No. 8/7/10 Utah, 35-21, in the 109th Rose Bowl Game to cap off the **2022** season. The Nittany Lions reached the 11-win plateau for the 19th time in program history.
- Penn State earned a New Year's Day bowl berth against Arkansas in the Outback Bowl in **2021**. With wins over No. 12/15 Wisconsin and No. 22/20 Auburn, Penn State tallied two wins over ranked teams within the first three games of the season for the first time in program history.
- In **2020**, with the emergence of young skill players on offense, true freshmen accounted for 1,486 of Penn State's 3,873 total yards (38 percent), marking a school record for most combined scrimmage yards by true freshmen in a single season.
- Penn State earned its third 11-win season in four years with an 11-2 record in **2019**, including a win over No. 17 Memphis in the Goodyear Cotton Bowl Classic. The Nittany Lions posted their fourth-straight top 12 finish in the final CFP rankings, coming in 10th, and were ranked ninth in the final Associated Press and Amway Coaches polls to earn their 25th AP Top 10 finish. Franklin was a finalist for the Paul "Bear" Bryant National Coach of the Year award for the second time at Penn State (2016) and third time in his head coaching career.
- In **2018**, the Nittany Lions posted their third-straight season with at least nine wins with a 9-4 overall record, earning a berth in the VRBO Citrus Bowl. Penn State finished No. 12 in the final CFP rankings and No. 17 in the Associated Press and Amway Coaches polls.
- Penn State climbed as high as No. 2 in the rankings in **2017** and appeared in a second-straight New Year's Six bowl, earning a 35-28 win over No. 11 Washington in the PlayStation Fiesta Bowl. At 11-2, the Nittany Lions earned back-to-back 11-win seasons for the fifth time in program history and first time since 2008 and 2009. Penn State finished the season No. 8 in the Associated Press and Amway Coaches polls and No. 9 in the final CFP rankings.
- Penn State surged in **2016**, winning nine consecutive games en route to the Big Ten Championship, a Rose Bowl berth and an 11-3 overall record. Penn State finished the season ranked No. 5 in the College Football Playoff rankings and No. 7 in the Associated Press and Amway Coaches polls. It was Penn State's highest finish in the polls since 2005. The Lions claimed their fourth overall Big Ten Championship and first outright title since 1994 with a thrilling, 38-31 comeback win over Wisconsin in the Big Ten Championship Game. Franklin was honored as Sporting News National Coach of the Year and the Woody Hayes National Coach of the Year, as well as the Dave McLain Big Ten Coach of the Year and Associated Press Big Ten Coach of the Year.
- Franklin guided the Nittany Lions to a 7-6 record in **2015** and a berth in the TaxSlayer Bowl.
- Franklin's first season in **2014** was bookended with a pair of thrilling victories for the Nittany Lions. It began with a final-play 26-24 victory over UCF in Dublin, Ireland, in Penn State's first-ever international game and ended with a comeback, a 31-30 overtime win over Boston College in the New Era PinStripe Bowl in Yankee Stadium. Franklin became just the third Penn State coach to lead the team to at least seven wins in his first season, joining Dick Harlow (1915) and Bill O'Brien (2012), and he guided the Nittany Lions to a 4-0 start, joining Harlow as the only first-year Penn State coaches to win their initial four games.

NISSANY LIONS IN THE CLASSROOM

- The Nittany Lions posted their first 1,000 single-year APR in program history in 2018-19, topping the previous high of 993 in 2014-15.
- Sean Clifford (2021) and Trace McSorley (2018) were selected as a National Football Foundation (NFF) Scholar-Athletes and finalists for the Campbell Trophy, known as the "Academic Heisman." They are the 18th and 19th Nittany Lions to be selected as an NFF Scholar-Athlete.
- In 2019, punter Blake Gillikin took home CoSIDA Academic All-America® first-team honors for the second-straight year to become the 12th two-time first-team selection in Penn State history. He graduated with a perfect 4.0 grade-point average in May.
- Gillikin's two first-team CoSIDA Academic All-America honors increase Penn State football's total to 67 honorees, which ranks second in Division I football history (FBS and FCS).
- Tyler Yazujuan collected a berth on the CoSIDA Academic All-America® first team in 2016 after an appearance on the second team in 2015.
- A program-record 10 Nittany Lions were named 2020-21 Big Ten Distinguished Scholars, besting the previous mark of nine set a year earlier.

NISSANY LIONS IN THE COMMUNITY

- The Nittany Lions are active in the community, participating in activities such as Uplifting Athletes, THON, Pennsylvania Special Olympics Summer Games, State College Area Food Bank and Penn State Hershey Children's Hospital visits.
- On June 15, 2020, Franklin was named to the Big Ten Anti-Hate and Anti-Racism Coalition.
- As part of the Cotton Bowl festivities in 2019, Franklin and his family made a \$10,000 financial commitment to the Dallas Children's Hospital.
- In August 2019, Franklin was named a Penn State University Renaissance Fund honoree, which awards outstanding community members for helping students in need.

- Kirk Ferentz is in his 25th season as head football coach and 34th season overall at Iowa.
- Ferentz is the longest-tenured head football coach in the nation and the winningest coach in Iowa history.

LAST MEETING NO. 4 PENN STATE FALLS TO NO. 3 IOWA

IOWA CITY, Iowa - The No. 4 Penn State football team fell to No. 3 Iowa, 23-20, in a Big Ten showdown in Iowa City.

The Nittany Lions got off to a quick start in the game, jumping out to a 17-3 lead in the first half, but the Iowa defense held Penn State to just three second half points as the Hawkeyes came from behind for the victory.

In a defensive affair, the Penn State held Iowa to 305 yards of total offense. Linebacker Ellis Brooks led the unit with a career-high 14 tackles. Jaquan Brisker tied a career-high with nine tackles while adding an interception and a pass breakup. Arnold Ebiketie was a force off the edge for Penn State, recording 3.5 tackles for loss and a sack to go along with his season-high nine tackles.

Sean Clifford completed 15-of-25 passes for 145 yards and scored on a rushing touchdown before leaving the game late in the second quarter.

Iowa capitalized off a turnover to get on the board first. After a Justin Jacobs interception set the Hawkeyes up inside the 5 yard-line, the Penn State defense stood strong to hold Iowa to a field goal.

The Nittany Lions quickly moved down the field on their ensuing drive, moving 75 yards in just 2:31 to set up a 2-yard touchdown run by Cain.

Brisker gave the Nittany Lions their first takeaway, intercepting a tipped pass to give Penn State the ball in Iowa territory. After Clifford connected with KeAndre Lambert-Smith for a 30-yard gain deep into the red zone, the quarterback scored on a 4-yard touchdown run.

Penn State extended its lead in the opening minutes of the second quarter on a Jordan Stout 32-yard field goal to make it 17-3 Nittany Lions.

Iowa cut into the lead on its next possession as Spencer Petras found Charlie Jones for a 9-yard score.

Stout pushed the Nittany Lion lead back to double-digits midway through the third with a 44-yard field goal.

Iowa's Caleb Shudak cut Penn State's advantage back to single digits in the closing minutes of the third quarter with a 48-yard field goal. Iowa add another three points minutes later on a 36-yarder from Shudak.

The Hawkeyes would jump ahead with a quick-strike late in the fourth quarter when Petras hit Nico Ragaini for a 44-yard touchdown to give Iowa a 23-20 lead that would hold as the final score.

ILLINOIS NOTES

- The Nittany Lions are 17-14 all-time in Big Ten openers and 19-12 in Big Ten road openers.
- Over the last two seasons, Penn State is 9-0 when recording multiple takeaways in a game.
- Since 2022, Penn State has six games with two or more turnovers gained and no turnovers lost. Penn State is 6-0 in those games.
- Penn State has recorded at least 30 points in 10-straight games, which is the longest active streak in the nation.
- It marks the seventh time in Big Ten history a team has strung together 10 or more games of 30+ points.

- The last time Penn State went 10-straight games with 30+ points was 2016-17 (10 games). The school record is 15 games (1993-94).
- Penn State scored 20 points off turnovers, including its first 13 points of the game.
- In the third quarter, RB **Trey Potts** threw an 11-yard touchdown pass to TE **Tyler Warren**. Potts is Penn State's 11th non-quarterback (12 occasions) to throw for a touchdown.
- The Nittany Lions forced turnovers on three-straight possessions (two fumbles, one interception) in the first quarter.
- Penn State forced takeaways on three-straight possession for the first time since 2016 at Indiana (three fumbles).
- Penn State recorded takeaways in the first quarter on a fumble forced by LB **Dominic DeLuca** and recovered by LB **Kobe King**, an interception by LB **Abdul Carter** and an interception by CB **Daequan Hardy**.
- The Nittany Lions forced two takeaways in the third quarter on an interception by CB **Johnny Dixon** and an interception by CB **Cam Miller**.
- Penn State recorded four interceptions in a game for the first time since November 15, 2014 against Temple.
- The Nittany Lions forced five takeaways in a game for the first time since September 16, 2017 against Georgia State (two fumbles, three interceptions).

DELAWARE NOTES

- Penn State scored on its first four drives. Adding to scoring on the final four possessions of the WVU game, the Nittany Lions scored on eight-straight drives, including the final four drives of the West Virginia game.
- The Nittany Lions scored on eight-straight drives for the first time since posting points on eight-straight drives against UMass on September 20, 2014.
- Penn State has recorded at least 30 points in nine-straight games, which is the longest streak in the nation.
- The Nittany Lions scored 35 points in the first half, it's the most points scored by a Penn State team in the opening half since scoring 42 points against Illinois in 2020.
- Penn State ran 91 offensive plays and held the ball for a time of possession of 42:22. Since at least 2007, 42:22 is the longest time of possession Penn State has had in a game.
- RB **Nicholas Singleton** scored a career-high three rushing touchdowns.
- Penn State forced its first takeaway of the season in the third quarter on a fumble forced by **Keaton Ellis** and recovered by **Kevin Winston Jr.**
- LB **Dominic DeLuca** recorded a 26-yard pick-six in the third quarter.
- Penn State held Delaware to just 41 offensive plays, the fewest allowed by the Nittany Lions since holding Minnesota to 40 in a 20-0 win in 2009.
- The Nittany Lions held Delaware to just 140 total yards, 58 passing yards and 82 rushing yards.
- Penn State held Delaware to just five first downs, tying the lowest mark since 2014 and the fewest since Idaho had five in 2019.
- Penn State held Delaware to just six completions the lowest number in a game since giving up five completions at Rutgers in 2018.

WEST VIRGINIA NOTES

- The Nittany Lions have won five-straight matchups in the series and 33 of the last 35 contests.
- Penn State is now 122-13-1 all-time in home openers, including wins in 20 of the last 22, and 113-22-2 all-time in season openers.
- Penn State welcomed 110,747 fans to Beaver Stadium, marking the fourth-highest crowd in its history and its largest crowd for a home opener.
- The Nittany Lions scored on their opening drive of the season for the first time since 2020 at Indiana. QB **Drew Allar** tossed a 72-yard touchdown pass to WR **KeAndre Lambert-Smith**.

TEAM NOTES

- Allar became the first Penn State quarterback to throw for at least 300 yards in a season opener since Christian Hackenberg's 454 passing yards against UCF in 2014.
- Allar is the first Penn State quarterback to throw for at least 300 yards in his first career start since Michael Robinson threw for 379 yards vs. Wisconsin in 2003.
- Allar's 300 passing yards and three passing touchdowns marked the 25th time a PSU quarterback has done that in a game.
- The Nittany Lions stopped West Virginia on three fourth-down conversion attempts.
- LB **Curtis Jacobs** finished the game with 10 tackles. He recorded 10+ tackles in a game for the third time in his career.

STREAKING

- Penn State has won 17 consecutive games against teams that are not members of a Power Five conference.
- Penn State has won 18 consecutive games over non-conference opponents during the regular season, dating back to a win over Temple in 2016.
- Penn State has won 23-straight non-conference home games, dating back to a win over Kent State in 2013.

OVERTIME OVER TIME

- College football introduced overtime during the bowl season in 1995 and adopted it for regular season games in 1996. Since then, Penn State has played 15 overtime games, including six over the 2012-14 seasons.
- Ten of the 15 overtime tilts have come at home, three in true road games, one in the 2006 Orange Bowl and one in the 2014 Pinstripe Bowl.
- Penn State is 8-7 all-time in overtime games, with a 5-5 record at Beaver Stadium, 1-2 mark in true road games and 2-0 in contests at a neutral site.
- Penn State's first two overtime contests came vs. Iowa in 2000 and 2002 at home. The Nittany Lions dropped their first three contests that went to the extra period, but won five straight overtime contests before falling to Nebraska on Nov. 23, 2013.

- Penn State has had 350 of its last 352 games televised, including 246 consecutive games.
- Over the last 15 seasons, every Penn State game has aired on either ABC, BTN, CBS, NBC, Peacock or an ESPN or FOX channel.
- Penn State has made 329 regular season TV appearances since 1995, which is tied for the national lead.
- Penn State's game against Delaware was streamed on Peacock, the Nittany Lions' first ever on a streaming platform.
- Penn State's matchup in the 2023 Rose Bowl Game against Utah drew 10.19 million viewers as the most-watched bowl game outside of the College Football Playoff.
- The 2022 Penn State-Ohio State matchup drew 8.27 million viewers. It was the second most-watched game between two Big Ten schools last season and the seventh-highest viewed regular season game of 2022.

LIONS UNDER THE LIGHTS

- The 2023 season marks the 23rd-straight with at least one regular-season night game on the schedule.
- Penn State will play at least three night games in 2023.
- The Nittany Lions opened the 2023 season against West Virginia with a 7:30 p.m. kickoff on NBC. Penn State earned a 38-15 win.
- Penn State is set for a 7:30 p.m. kickoff on CBS against Iowa for the annual Penn State White Out Game.
- The Nittany Lions will close out the regular season on Friday, Nov. 24 against Michigan State with a 7:30 p.m. kickoff on NBC.
- Penn State is 59-32 at night all-time. The figure breaks down to 19-11 at home, 28-14 on the road and 12-7 in neutral site games. Penn State is 1-1 at regular season neutral sites, 11-6 in bowl games and 1-0 in conference championship games.
- In 2019, Penn State played its most regular season night games in program history with four primetime tilts.
- On Oct. 12, 2013, the Lions claimed the longest game in Big Ten history when they edged Michigan under the lights, 43-40, in four overtimes in front of a sellout Beaver Stadium crowd of 107,844 on Homecoming.

THREE ON HALL OF FAME BALLOT

- Penn State lettermen **Ki-Jana Carter**, **D.J. Dozier** and **Paul Posluszny** have been selected as a part of the national ballot for the National Football Foundation's College Hall of Fame's Class of 2024.
- Carter, a running back for the Nittany Lions, was a first-team All-American during the 1994 campaign. Carter staked a claim to being one of the most decorated Penn State running backs of all-time with a junior season in which he was fourth nationally in rushing (139.9), second in scoring (10.8 ppg) and fifth in all-purpose yardage (158.4).
- Dozier, a tailback for the Nittany Lions, matriculated to Happy Valley from Virginia Beach, Va. He earned first team All-America honors from the Walter Camp Football Foundation in 1986. Dozier is the only Nittany Lion to lead the team in rushing four consecutive seasons, doing so from 1983-86.
- Posluszny, an outside linebacker for the Nittany Lions, was a first-team All-American in 2005 and 2006. Posluszny became just the second two-time winner of the Chuck Bednarik Award, presented to the nation's top defensive player, in 2006. In 2005, he also won the Butkus Award.

OFFENSIVE NOTES

- Since the start of the 2016 season, Penn State's offense is second in the Big Ten in yards per play (6.05; 30th), total offense (429.55; 29th) and scoring offense (34.69; 18th) and is third in touchdown percentage (31.65; 19th), points per possession (2.16; 20th), scoring percentage (40.45; 24th) and yards per pass attempt (7.90; 28th).
- Penn State's offense has been explosive since the 2016 campaign, as it leads the Big Ten in 80-plus yard play percentage (0.20; 2nd nationally) and 70-plus (0.39; 5th), ranks second in 40-plus (1.97; 16th), 30-plus (3.52; 28th) and 20-plus (7.64; 21st), and holds third in 50-plus (0.97; 38th) and 60-plus (0.55; 24th).
- The Nittany Lions have tallied at least 55 plays of 20 or more yards in seven of the last eight seasons (86 in 2022; 57 in 2021; 63 in 2019; 73 in 2018; 85 in 2017; 91 in 2016; 67 in 2015). PSU had 52 plays of 20 or more yards in 2020 (9-game schedule).
- Additionally, the Nittany Lions are third in the Big Ten and 17th nationally in 15-plus yard passing play percentage since 2016 (19.42 percent).
- With 30 points at Illinois, the Nittany Lions extended its streak of 30+ points to 10-straight games, the nation's longest streak.
- It marks the seventh time in Big Ten history a team has strung together 10 or more games of 30+ points. The last time Penn State went 10-straight games with 30+ points was 2016-17 (10 games). The school record is 15 games (1993-94).
- The Nittany Lions posted 400+ total yards in nine-straight games, before snapping the streak against Illinois. It was tied with Florida State for the nation's third-longest active streak.
- Penn State has surpassed 200 yards rushing 39 times in the **James Franklin** era. PSU is 34-5 in those games.
- Since 2022, Penn State is tied second in the nation in turnover margin, averaging a +1.19 margin (2.06 gained per game; 0.88 lost per game), best in the Big Ten.
- Over the last two seasons, Penn State is averaging a nation-best 9.69 points per game off turnovers.
- In 2023, Penn State ranks 14th in the country and leads the Big Ten averaging 43.7 points per game.
- Penn State ranks 26th in the nation in total offense (467.3) and 22nd in rushing offense (208.3), sitting third in the Big Ten in both categories.
- Penn State has tallied 81 first downs through the first three games, holding 14th in the country and first in the conference.
- The Nittany Lions are also fourth in the nation in average time of possession (34:19) and 12th in sacks allowed per game (0.67)
- Penn State is 20th in the country in red zone offense (94.4%).
- Against WVU, Penn State tallied 478 total yards.
- Penn State scored on its opening drive with a 72-yard touchdown pass by QB **Drew Allar** to WR **KeAndre Lambert-Smith**.
- Allar (325 yards) became the first Penn State quarterback to throw for at least 300 yards in a season opener since Christian Hackenberg's 454 passing yards against UCF in 2014 and the first Penn State quarterback to throw for at least 300 yards in his first career start since Michael Robinson threw for 379 yards vs. Wisconsin in 2003.
- Allar's 300 passing yards and three passing touchdowns marked the 25th time a PSU quarterback has done that in a game.
- With his 72-yard touchdown reception, Lambert-Smith now owns three career touchdown receptions of 70+ yards, joining his 83-yard touchdown against Villanova in 2021 and his 88-yard touchdown reception against Utah in the 2023 Rose Bowl.
- Penn State scored on each of its final four possessions of the WVU game, including three touchdowns, and on the first four drives of the Delaware game.
- The Nittany Lions scored on eight-straight drives for the first time since posting points on eight-straight drives against UMass on September 20, 2014.
- The Nittany Lions scored 35 points in the first half, it's the most points scored by a Penn State team in the opening half since scoring 42 points against Illinois in 2020.
- Penn State tallied 541 total yards, the most since notching 572 against Ohio in 2022.
- The Nittany Lions rushed for 315 yards, the most since rushing for 396 vs. Memphis in the 2019 Cotton Bowl.
- Penn State ran 91 offensive plays, the most since running 91 at Nebraska in 2020.
- The Nittany Lions held the ball for a time of possession of 42:22. Since at least 2007, 42:22 is the longest time of possession Penn State has had in a game.
- Against Illinois, Penn State scored 20 points off turnovers, including its first 13 points of the game.
- In the third quarter, RB Trey Potts threw an 11-yard touchdown pass to Tyler Warren. Potts is Penn State's 11th non-quarterback (12 occasions) to throw for a touchdown.
- Mike Yurcich** enters his third season as Penn State's offensive coordinator/quarterbacks coach.
- Yurcich (California University (Pa.)) and Franklin (East Stroudsburg) both played in the Pennsylvania State Athletic Conference (PSAC).
- As an FBS offensive coordinator, offenses under Yurcich have averaged 6.34 yards per play, ranking first among OC's since 2013 and 13.60 yards per completion, which is also first in that time frame.
- Since 2013, Yurcich's offenses have scored 50 or more points 28 times and 40 or more points 58 times (44.3 percent of games coached), both of which are tops among FBS offensive coordinators since 2013.
- His teams have averaged an FBS-best 54.6 touchdowns per year and 29 passing touchdowns per season.
- Penn State has scored 40 points 28 times since 2016. By comparison, from 2008 until 2015, the Nittany Lions had 18 40-point outings.



QUARTERBACK NOTES

- Offensive coordinator **Mike Yurcich** also heads the Penn State quarterback room.
- Four quarterbacks Yurcich coached in college are currently on NFL rosters (Sean Clifford - Penn State, Sam Ehlinger - Texas, Justin Fields - Ohio State, Mason Rudolph - Oklahoma State).
- Yurcich served as the passing game coordinator and quarterbacks coach at Ohio State in 2019, where quarterback Justin Fields was a finalist for the Heisman Trophy, Walter Camp Player of the Year Award and Davey O'Brien Award.
- Sophomore quarterback **Drew Allar** enters his second season with the Nittany Lions after appearing in 10 games his freshman year.
- Through three games in 2023, Allar has completed 67 percent of his passes for 737 yards and four touchdowns, while rushing for one score.
- Allar ranks fourth in the Big Ten in passing yards (737), passing yards per game (245.7) and total offense per game (263.0) and fifth in completion percentage (67.0) and passing touchdowns (4).
- In his first career start, against West Virginia, Allar completed 21-of-29 passes for 325 yards and three touchdowns.
- Allar became the first Penn State quarterback to throw for at least 300 yards in a season opener since Christian Hackenberg's 454 passing yards against UCF in 2014 and the first Penn State quarterback to throw for at least 300 yards in his first career start since Michael Robinson threw for 379 yards vs. Wisconsin in 2003.
- Allar's 300 passing yards and three passing touchdowns marked the 25th time a PSU quarterback has done so in a game.
- The sophomore earned Big Ten Offensive Player of the Week honors.
- On the opening drive of the game, Allar connected with **KeAndre Lambert-Smith** for a 72-yard touchdown.
- Against Delaware, Allar completed 22-of-26 passes for 204 yards and a touchdown, while rushing for 27 yards and a 1-yard score.
- Allar notched his first career game with both a passing and rushing touchdown.
- At Illinois, Allar threw for 208 yards for his third career 200-yard passing game and went over 1,000 career passing yards. He has 1,081 career yards.
- Quarterback **Beau Pribula** also enters his second season with the Nittany Lions after redshirting his rookie season.
- Against WVU, Pribula completed his first career pass attempt for seven yards. He also rushed for 18 yards, including a 5-yard touchdown, on three carries.
- In the Delaware game, Pribula completed 3-of-5 passes for 22 yards and a touchdown. He added 46 yards and a touchdown on eight carries.
- Pribula connected with **Omari Evans** on a 4-yard touchdown pass in the fourth quarter. It was his first career touchdown pass.
- At Illinois, Pribula set career highs with nine carries for 47 yards and a career-long 21-yard run.
- Freshman **Jaxon Smolik** made his collegiate debut in the Delaware contest.

ACADEMIC SUCCESS

- The Nittany Lions had 32 players selected as Academic All-Big Ten in Fall 2022.
- **Sean Clifford** was a 2021 National Football Foundation (NFF) Scholar-Athlete and finalist for the Campbell Trophy, known as the "Academic Heisman". He is the 19th Nittany Lion to be selected as an NFF Scholar-Athlete.
- Penn State posted its first 1,000 single-year APR in program history in 2018-19, topping the previous high of 993 in 2014-15.
- In 2019, punter Blake Gillikin took home CoSIDA Academic All-America® first-team honors for the second-straight year to become the 12th two-time first-team selection in Penn State history. He graduated with a perfect 4.0 grade-point average in May 2020.
- Gillikin's two first-team CoSIDA Academic All-America honors increase Penn State football's total to 67 honorees, which ranks second in Division I football history (FBS and FCS).

RUNNING BACKS NOTES

- Co-offensive coordinator/running backs coach **Ja Juan Seider** has 15 years of college coaching experience, including 12 at the Power Five level.
- As a player at Florida A&M, Seider won the Doug Williams Award for National Offensive Player of the Year, Jake Gaither Award (considered the Heisman Trophy of Historically Black Colleges) and earned All-America honors after throwing for 2,622 yards and 27 touchdowns and rushing for 740 yards and 14 touchdowns in 1999.
- A loaded running back room is led by dynamic sophomores **Kaytron Allen** and **Nicholas Singleton** and redshirt senior **Trey Potts**.
- Allen (1,075), Singleton (1,215) and Potts (1,262) each have over 1,000 career rushing yards.
- Penn State is one of eight FBS teams, and the only Big Ten team, with three career 1,000 yard rushers on its roster.
- Penn State was one of 17 FBS teams, and one of nine Power Five teams and the only Big Ten team, entering 2023 with three career 800-yard rushers on its roster.
- With Potts and Singleton, Penn State was one of 28 FBS teams and one of 18 Power Five teams entering 2023 with two career 1,000-yard rushers on its squad.
- Singleton (1,061 rushing yards) and Allen (867 rushing yards) became the first freshmen teammates in Big Ten history to both rush for 700+ rushing yards in a season.
- Allen and Singleton are the only Penn State duo to each rush for 850+ yards in a season and one of three 800+ rushing yard duos.
- Since 2000, Allen and Singleton are one of two FBS freshman duos to each rush for 850+ yards in a season, joining West Virginia's Steve Slaton (1,128) and Pat White (952) in 2005.
- Allen and Singleton are both on the Doak Walker Award watch list.
- Singleton is also on watch lists for the Maxwell Award, Paul Hornung Award and Walter Camp Player of the Year Award.
- The sophomore was also named a second-team preseason All-American by Sporting News and a Pro Football Focus Preseason All-America honorable mention.
- Singleton was selected as a True Freshman All-American by On3, 247Sports and College Football News in 2022.
- He was named the Big Ten Thompson-Randle El Freshman of the Year and was selected third-team All-Big Ten by the coaches and media and was also tabbed the AP Big Ten Newcomer of the Year.
- Allen was an honorable mention All-Big Ten selection by the media and was a True Freshman All-American by College Football News.
- Singleton owns 1,215 career rushing yards, ranking 37th all-time at Penn State, and 17 career rushing touchdowns.
- Singleton's five rushing touchdowns in 2023 rank fourth in the nation and hold second in the Big Ten.
- Singleton holds eighth in the nation in total touchdowns and fifth in the Big Ten in all-purpose yards per game (107.0).
- He started the 2023 season with 70 rushing yards and a 2-yard touchdown rush against West Virginia.
- On a 10-yard run in the first quarter, Singleton surpassed 1,500 career all-purpose yards. He has 1,676 all-purpose yards.
- Against Delaware, Singleton scored a career-high three rushing touchdowns.
- Singleton found the end zone on a 2-yard rushing touchdown on Penn State's opening drive of the game.
- He scored on a pair of 5-yard in the second quarter.
- Singleton recorded his sixth career game with multiple rushing touchdowns.
- At Illinois, Singleton scored on a 16-yard rush in the fourth quarter.
- He added a career-high 49 receiving yards on three catches and 54 kick return yards for a total of 140 all-purpose yards.
- Singleton rushed for 1,061 yards as a freshman, trailing only Saquon Barkley (1,076; 2015) for the most by a Penn State freshman.
- In 2022, he became the 16th Nittany Lion to rush for 1,000 yards in a season and the third PSU freshman running back to reach 1,000 yards.
- Singleton's 12 rushing touchdowns in 2022 are a Penn State freshman record.
- Among FBS freshmen, Singleton led the country in yards per carry (6.8), while ranking second in all-purpose yardage (1,495), third in rushing yards (1,061), fourth in rushing touchdowns (12) and total touchdowns (14).
- He finished second in the Big Ten in yards per carry, ranking seventh nationally, tied for third in total touchdowns, fourth in rushing touchdowns, fifth in rushing yards and sixth in all-purpose yards per game.
- Singleton led the Big Ten in 30+ yard runs (9; 3rd nationally) and 40+ yard runs (7; 3rd) and tied for second in 50+ yard runs (4; T-4th), 60+ yards (2; T-9th) and 20+ yard runs (12; T-18th).
- Allen has 1,075 career rushing yards and 12 career rushing touchdowns.
- In 2023, Allen ranks eighth in the Big Ten in rushing yards (208) and rushing yards per game (69.3).
- Against West Virginia, Allen rushed for 51 yards on 10 carries.
- In the Delaware game, Allen rushed for 103 yards on 19 carries. It was his third career 100-yard rushing game.
- Allen scored on a 4-yard rushing touchdown in the first quarter. It was his 11th career rushing touchdown.
- During the opening drive of the third quarter, Allen went over the 1,000 career rushing yards mark. He became the 49th Penn State player to reach 1,000 career rushing yards.
- Allen rushed for a team-high 54 yards at Illinois.
- He scored on a 4-yard rushing touchdown in the second quarter.
- He rushed for 867 yards and 10 touchdowns on 167 carries in 2022. He added 20 receptions for 188 yards and a touchdown.
- His 867 rushing yards are the fourth-most by a Penn State freshman in a season.
- Against Central Michigan, he rushed for 111 yards, on 13 carries, and two touchdowns.
- The sophomore totaled 158 scrimmage yards at Indiana. He rushed for 86 yards and three touchdowns on 18 carries, while adding catches of 27 and 45 yards.
- Allen rushed for 117 yards and a touchdown on 11 carries at Rutgers for his second 100-yard game of the 2022 season.
- The Norfolk, Va. native ranked tied sixth among FBS freshmen in rushing touchdowns (10), eighth in yards per carry (5.19) and 10th in total rushing yards.
- He finished sixth in the Big Ten in rushing touchdowns, eighth in yards per carry, ninth in total touchdowns and 11th in rushing yards.
- Potts joined the Nittany Lions in Summer 2023 after transferring from Minnesota.
- In his collegiate career, Potts owns 1,262 rushing yards and 11 touchdowns on 252 carries in 27 games (five starts).
- Potts had five carries against West Virginia in the 2023 opener.
- He rushed for 59 yards on seven carries, including a 20-yard rush, in the Delaware game.
- Potts threw an 11-yard touchdown pass to Tyler Warren. Potts is Penn State's 11th non-quarterback (12 occasions) to throw for a touchdown.
- In 2022 at Minnesota, he totaled 471 yards and three scores on 101 carries.
- Redshirt senior **Tank Smith** has 38 career carries, including 23 in 2022.
- Smith tied a career high with six carries and set a career high with 29 rushing yards against Delaware.

- Co-offensive coordinator and ends coach **Ty Howle** is in his third season coaching the Penn State tight ends and his fourth season overall on the staff.
- Howle served as an offensive analyst in 2020, working closely with the offensive line and tight ends.
- He was a four-year letterwinner on the Penn State offensive line from 2009-13. He started at center and left guard and was a four-time Academic All-Big Ten selection. He was a team captain in 2013.
- Brenton Strange was selected by the Jacksonville Jaguars in the second round of the 2023 NFL Draft, Penn State's fourth tight end drafted since 2015, tied for the third-most in the FBS.
- In 2022, Penn State led the Big Ten and ranked second among Power Five teams with 13 tight end receiving touchdowns.
- PSU was one of three schools, joining Oregon and San Jose State, with four different tight ends catching a touchdown pass this season.
- Among Power Five schools, Penn State ranked seventh in receiving yards (866), eighth in tight end receiving yards per game (66.6) and 10th in receptions (66).
- Juniors **Theo Johnson** (10) and **Tyler Warren** (3) and redshirt sophomore **Khalil Dinkins** (1) have combined for 14, 20-plus yard receptions in their careers.
- Johnson, who is on the Mackey Award watch list, has 47 receptions for 643 yards and five touchdowns in his Penn State career.
- He caught two passes for 14 yards against Delaware.
- Johnson made two grabs for 32 yards at Illinois, including a 19-yard reception in the first quarter and a 13-yard reception to setup a Penn State touchdown in the third quarter.
- In 2022, Johnson hauled in 20 receptions for 328 yards and four scores.
- He had a career-high 75 yards on five receptions against Minnesota. The 75 yards included an 18-yard touchdown reception and a 25-yard grab.
- Johnson earned his first career multi-touchdown reception game against Michigan State, hauling in 11 and 48-yard touchdowns.
- Warren has 25 career receptions for 265 yards and six touchdowns, while adding two rushing scores.
- The junior had a career-high six receptions against Delaware, doubling his previous career high.
- Warren hauled in a 2-yard touchdown in the second quarter.
- The Virginia native caught three passes for 35 yards and a touchdown at Illinois.
- In the third quarter, Warren recorded an 11-yard touchdown catch on a throw from RB **Trey Potts**.
- Last season, Warren made 10 grabs for 123 yards and three touchdowns.
- He made a 38-yard touchdown grab against the Gophers, the longest catch of his career.
- Warren had a 10-yard touchdown catch at Rutgers and a 14-yard touchdown against Michigan State.
- Dinkins caught a 28-yard touchdown pass in the fourth quarter vs. Ohio, his first career reception and touchdown reception.
- He made four receptions for 53 yards in 2022.

WIDE RECEIVER NOTES

- Offensive recruiting coordinator/wide receivers coach **Marques Hagans** is in his first season on the Penn State staff.
- Hagans joined the Penn State staff after serving as the associate head coach/wide receivers coach at Virginia for the previous 11 years. He was promoted to Associate Head Coach for the Cavaliers prior to the 2022 season.
- During his time at Virginia, Hagans coached 10 of the top 15 career receptions leaders in program history.
- Hagans was a four-year letterman at Virginia from 2002-05 and currently sits No. 10 all-time in passing yards with 4,877. He also ranks seventh in total offense with 5,779 yards.
- He was selected, as a receiver, in the fifth round (144th overall) of the 2006 NFL Draft by the St. Louis Rams. He spent three seasons with the Rams before being picked up by the Kansas City Chiefs and Indianapolis Colts in 2008. Hagans spent the 2009 and 2010 campaigns with Washington.
- With redshirt senior **Dante Cephas** and junior **KeAndre Lambert-Smith**, Penn State was one of 28 FBS teams, and one of 18 Power Five teams, entering 2023 with at least two players with 1,000 career receiving yards on its roster.
- Cephas is a member of the Biletnikoff Award watch list.
- Lambert-Smith has started 29 career games and owns 86 receptions for 1,268 yards and nine touchdowns in his career.
- His 1,268 receiving yards are rank 23rd in program history.
- He is averaging 14.7 yards per catch in his career and has 17 career receptions of 20+ yards.
- Lambert-Smith's 14.7 yards per catch ranks 28th among FBS receivers with at least 85 career receptions.
- Against West Virginia, Lambert-Smith caught four passes for 123 yards and a career-best two touchdowns. He averaged 30.75 yards per reception.
- He hauled in a 72-yard touchdown reception on the opening drive. He added a 12-yard touchdown grab and a 30-yard reception.
- The Virginia native owns three career touchdown receptions of 70+ yards, with his 72-yard grab joining his 83-yard touchdown against Villanova in 2021 and his 88-yard touchdown reception against Utah in the 2023 Rose Bowl.
- In the WVU game, Lambert-Smith recorded his second career 100-yard receiving game.
- Lambert-Smith tied for a team high with six receptions and led the squad with 74 receiving yards against Delaware.
- He added three catches for 23 yards at Illinois.
- Lambert-Smith hauled in 24 receptions for 389 yards and four touchdowns in 2022.
- In the Rose Bowl Game against Utah, he caught three passes for 124 yards, including an 88-yard touchdown grab.
- Lambert-Smith averaged a Penn State bowl-record 41.3 yards on three receptions in the Rose Bowl.
- The 88-yard touchdown reception is the longest pass play in Rose Bowl history and the fourth-longest passing play in Penn State history.

- Cephas joined the Nittany Lions as a transfer this past offseason. Cephas spent the previous four years at Kent State.
- A two-time first-team All-MAC selection, Cephas has collected 149 receptions, 2,210 receiving yards and 12 touchdowns in his collegiate career.
- Cephas ranks 11th among active FBS receivers with 2,210 career receiving yards.
- He is one of 11 current FBS receivers with 145+ receptions, 2,210+ receiving yards and 12+ receiving touchdowns.
- Cephas has 10 career 100-yard receiving games and has a reception in 30-straight games.
- In his Penn State debut, against West Virginia, Cephas made a 22-yard grab.
- Cephas hauled in two catches for 36 yards, including a 26-yard grab, against Delaware.
- The Pittsburgh native had a 13-yard catch at Illinois.
- He posted 48 catches for 744 yards and three touchdowns in nine games last season, leading the MAC and ranking 30th nationally averaging 82.7 receiving yards per game.
- He posted six receptions and 105 yards at Washington in 2022.
- Cephas set a Kent State single-game record with 246 receiving yards, on 13 catches, at Ohio (10/1/22).
- In 2021, Cephas tallied 82 catches for 1,240 yards and 13 touchdowns.
- Junior **Malik McClain** arrives in Happy Valley after transferring from Florida State.
- Against WVU, McClain had a career-best 58 yards, including 25-yard touchdown reception in the fourth quarter, and tied a career high with four receptions.
- McClain has 38 receptions for 460 yards and six touchdowns in his career.
- Redshirt sophomore **Harrison Wallace III** earned his first career start in the West Virginia game.
- Wallace recorded a career-high seven receptions against the Mountaineers. He tallied a career-best 72 receiving yards.
- Wallace had three catches for 26 yards against Delaware.
- He has hauled in 29 catches for 371 yards and a touchdown in his career.
- Redshirt sophomore **Liam Clifford** made two grabs for 25 yards against WVU and made his first career start against Delaware.
- Clifford had a career-long 33-yard reception late in the second quarter at Illinois.
- Clifford caught eight passes for 89 yards in 2022, including a 20-yard reception against Central Michigan.
- Sophomore **Omari Evans**, junior **Malick Meiga** and redshirt freshman **Kaden Saunders** have each experienced significant playing time at Penn State.
- Evans had a 4-yard touchdown reception against Delaware.

- He was named to the American Football Coaches Association (AFCA) Class of 2021 "35 Under 35" list, recognizing the top-35 football coaches under the age of 35. He was the only Big Ten coach and the only offensive line coach on the 2021 list.
- In his four seasons at Penn State, Trautwein has helped 12 offensive linemen to earn All-Big Ten honors, including five in 2022.
- He's coached 22 All-Conference selections over the last six seasons, which includes a stint at Boston College as the offensive line coach.
- Trautwein was a two-time All-SEC selection and two-time team captain as a left tackle at Florida, earning first-team honors in 2008 and second-team accolades in 2006.
- He was part of the Gators winning the BCS National Championship and SEC titles in the 2006 and 2008 seasons.
- Six Nittany Lion offensive linemen own at least five career starts.
- Junior **Olumuyiwa Fashanu** has appeared in 20 games and made 13 starts at left tackle.
- Fashanu is a member of the Lombardi Award, Outland Trophy and Walter Camp Player of the Year Award watch lists.
- He was also selected Preseason All-America first team by the Associated Press and Pro Football Focus.
- Fashanu was named a second-team All-American by the Walter Camp Football Foundation in 2022.
- He was tabbed second-team All-Big Ten by the coaches and third-team All-Big Ten by the media.
- According to Coaches By The Numbers, Fashanu did not allow a sack and allowed only 10 pressures in 281 pass blocking snaps in 2022.
- Redshirt senior **Hunter Nourzad** was an honorable mention All-Big Ten selection by the coaches and media in his first season in Happy Valley.
- Nourzad owns 31 collegiate starts and 34 career appearances.
- Redshirt senior tackle **Caedan Wallace** has 30 starts and owns 37 career appearances.
- Redshirt senior **Sal Wormley** has started 16 games in 20 appearances.
- Wormley (coaches, media) was an honorable mention All-Big Ten selection.
- Redshirt junior **JB Nelson** made his first career start against West Virginia.
- Redshirt freshman **Olaivavega Ioane** earned his first career start against Delaware.
- Sophomore **Drew Shelton** has appeared in nine games and made five starts.
- He did not allow a sack in 180 pass plays last season, according to Coaches By The Numbers.
- Through two games in 2023, the Nittany Lions' offensive line has allowed just six pressures and one sack.
- Fashanu (31 pass plays) and Wormley (27) did not allow a pressure through the first two games.
- Penn State tallied 478 total yards and threw for 332 yards against WVU.
- Between the final four drives of the West Virginia game and the first four drives of the Delaware game, Penn State scored on eight-straight possessions.
- Penn State tallied 541 total yards against the Blue Hens, the most since notching 572 against Ohio in 2022. The Nittany Lions posted 400+ total yards in nine-straight games before snapping their streak at Illinois.
- Against Delaware, The Nittany Lions rushed for 315 yards, the most since rushing for 396 vs. Memphis in the 2019 Cotton Bowl.
- At Illinois, Penn State notched . 383 total yards
- The Nittany Lions reached 200 rushing yards in five games last season (Ohio, 234; Auburn, 245; Northwestern, 220; Maryland, 249; Rutgers, 237).

DEFENSIVE NOTES

- **Manny Diaz** is in his second season as Penn State's defensive coordinator and linebackers coach and was a Broyles Award semifinalist.
- Diaz, who has 25 years of collegiate coaching experience, including three as a head coach and 14 as a defensive coordinator, joined PSU after spending six seasons (2016-21) at Miami, including three seasons as head coach (2019-21), where he coached the Hurricanes to three bowl appearances.
- Penn State had 10 All-Big Ten selections on defense in 2022, led by first-team selection CB **Joey Porter Jr.**
- Porter and CB **Kalen King** were tabbed second-team All-America by the Walter Camp Football Foundation, while Porter added second-team All-America honors from the AFCA, AP & FWAA.
- In 2022, Penn State ranked 10th in the country in scoring defense (18.2).
- Penn State led the country with 85 pass breakups.
- The Nittany Lions placed three on the preseason Bronko Nagurski Trophy watch list with sophomore LB **Abdul Carter**, King and junior DE **Chop Robinson** all landing on the list.
- Penn State is tied for the most representatives on the Nagurski Trophy watch list.
- Senior DE **Adisa Isaac (11)**, Carter (10.5) and Robinson (10) return after recording double-digit tackles for loss in 2022.
- Penn State was one of two FBS teams who returned three players who recorded 10+ tackles for loss last season.
- Through three games in 2023, Penn State is 13th in scoring defense, allowing 11.7 points per game.
- Penn State ranks 16th in the country in total defense (267.3), 18th in third down conversion defense (30.0%) and 11th in the nation allowing just 62 first downs this season.
- The Nittany Lions hold 11th in the country allowing an 94.7 opponent passing efficiency.
- The blue and white are limiting opponents to 170.7 passing yards per game, good for 21st in the nation.
- The Nittany Lions are 11th in the nation with five interceptions and seven turnovers forced.
- Penn State holds 16th in the country in sacks per game (3.3).
- Through three games, 15 Nittany Lions have recorded at least one tackle for loss and eight have recorded at least one sack.
- Penn State is allowing a 53.4 percent completion percentage (47-of-88) and just 5.82 yards per pass attempt.
- Penn State has recorded at least six tackles for loss in each of the last 11 games, including six against West Virginia and seven against Delaware and Illinois.
- The 11-straight games with at least six tackles for loss is the longest streak in the nation.
- Over the last two seasons, Penn State has held opponents to under a 50 completion percentage in seven games, tied for the nation's third-most.
- Since 2022, Penn State has forced 33 turnovers (19 interceptions, 14 fumbles), tied fifth in the nation.
- Penn State's 14 fumbles recovered over the last two seasons are tied 10th in the nation and are the most in the Big Ten, while the 19 interceptions are tied 13th.
- Penn State has recorded three or more takeaways in seven games over the last two seasons, tied-most among FBS teams.
- Over the last two seasons, Penn State is 9-0 when forcing multiple takeaways in a game.
- Since 2022, Penn State is tied second in the nation in turnover margin, averaging a +1.19 margin (2.06 gained per game; 0.88 lost per game), best in the Big Ten.
- Against the Mountaineers, Penn State stopped West Virginia on three fourth-down conversion attempts.
- The Nittany Lions recorded six tackles for loss and three sacks against the Mountaineers.
- Penn State limited West Virginia to 162 passing yards.
- LB **Curtis Jacobs** led PSU with 10 tackles, his third career game with double-digit tackles, and added a solo sack.
- Carter and redshirt sophomore LB **Dominic DeLuca** each recorded a solo sack.
- Against West Virginia, sophomore DT **Zane Durant**, LB **Kobe King** and junior S **Jaylen Reed** all made their first career starts, while Robinson made his first start at Penn State.

- The Nittany Lions held Delaware to just 140 total yards, the fewest allowed by Penn State since giving up 134 to Maryland in 2022.
- Penn State held Delaware to 58 yards passing, the fewest allowed by the Nittany Lions since giving up 38 vs. Rutgers in 2021.
- Penn State held Delaware to 82 yards rushing, the fewest since allowing 25 vs. Michigan State in 2022.
- Penn State held Delaware to just six completions, the lowest number in a game since giving up five completions at Rutgers in 2018. It is the third lowest pass completion mark by an opponent since 2014.
- At Illinois, Penn State forced five takeaways, including four interceptions and a fumble recovery.
- Penn State gained five takeaways in a game for the first time since 2017 against Georgia State and recorded four interceptions in a game for the first time since 2014 against Temple.
- The Nittany Lions forced turnovers on three-straight possessions (two fumbles, one interception) in the first quarter.
- Penn State forced takeaways on three-straight possession for the first time since 2016 at Indiana (three fumbles).
- Penn State limited Illinois to 62 rushing yards.
- Over the last nine seasons, PSU sits second nationally in sacks per game (3.05; trailing only Clemson) and third in fewest passing TDs allowed per game (1.00) and QB hurries (965), fourth in total pressures generated (1,463), fourth in tackles for loss percentage (10.73), fifth in fewest passing yards per attempt (6.21) and 10th in fewest rushing yards per attempt (3.56).
- Penn State's 317 sacks over the last nine years (2015-23) are fourth behind Clemson (379), Alabama (359) and Pitt (342).
- Over the last nine years, Penn State has accumulated a 8.53 percent sack percentage (317 sacks on 4,496 plays), which ranks sixth in the FBS.
- Since 2014, Penn State has held opponents to seven or less points 26 times, tied seventh-most among FBS teams. Nineteen of those 26 games have been against Big Ten opponents.
- In the **James Franklin** era, Penn State has recorded eight shutouts, tied fourth-most among FBS teams. PSU also has the fifth-most shutouts (13) in the FBS since 2007.
- Since 2014, PSU has held an opponent under 300 total yards 52 times, eighth-most among FBS teams.
- Since 2014, the Nittany Lions have allowed less than 200 passing yards in 66 games, eighth-most among FBS teams, and have held opponents under 100 passing yards in 18 games in that span, tied ninth-most among FBS teams.
- Since 2014, Penn State has held opponents under 100 rushing yards on 50 occasions, tied 11th-most among FBS teams, and have held opponents under 50 rushing yards in 18 games, tied 11th-most among FBS teams.
- Penn State has registered 10 or more tackles for loss 29 times since 2014, third-most among FBS teams.
- The Nittany Lions have forced multiple takeaways in a game on 51 occasions since 2014, including twice in 2023.

- Barnes was a three-year letterwinner at defensive end for Penn State from 2012-14 and was named Big Ten Freshman of the Year in 2012.
- He helped coach 11 All-Big Ten defensive linemen, including three first-team selections and a second-team All-American in his first three seasons working with the Penn State defensive line.
- The defensive line helped Penn State to post a Big Ten-best 104 tackles for loss and 42 sacks in 2022. PSU tied fourth nationally in tackles for loss and sixth in sacks.
- Through three games in 2023, Penn State is 13th in scoring defense, allowing 11.7 points per game.
- Penn State ranks 16th in the country in total defense (267.3), 18th in third down conversion defense (30.0%) and 11th in the nation allowing just 62 first downs this season.
- Penn State holds 16th in the country in sacks per game (3.3).
- Through three games, 15 Nittany Lions have recorded at least one tackle for loss and eight have recorded at least one sack.
- Penn State started the 2023 campaign with six tackles for loss and three sacks against West Virginia.
- The Nittany Lions tallied seven tackles for loss and four sacks in the Delaware game.
- Penn State has recorded six or more tackles for loss in each of its last 11 games.
- Redshirt senior DE **Adisa Isaac** has played in 36 games as a Nittany Lion, making 16 starts.
- He owns 61 tackles, 17.5 tackles for loss, 7.5 sacks and a forced fumble in his career.
- Isaac collected four tackles, including a tackle for loss and a half-sack at Illinois.
- In the season opener against West Virginia, Isaac posted two tackles, including a tackle for loss, and a QB hurry.
- In 2022, Isaac garnered All-Big Ten third team honors from the coaches and shared the team's Reid Robinson Outstanding Offensive Lineman Award with DE **Chop Robinson**.
- Robinson has collected 50 tackles, 14.5 tackles for loss, 7.5 sacks, one forced fumble, one fumble recovery and three pass breakups in his collegiate career.
- He is a member of the Bednarik Award, Bronko Nagurski Trophy and Lombardi Award watch lists.
- He is also a preseason second team All-American by Sporting News and Pro Football Focus in 2023.
- Robinson made his first start as a Nittany Lion against West Virginia and tallied two tackles, including a solo tackle for loss.
- He notched two stops, including a tackle for loss, and a pass breakup at Illinois.
- According to Pro Football Focus, Robinson led Power Five edge rushers with a 90.6 pass rush grade last season.
- Sophomore DE **Dani Dennis-Sutton** has tallied 20 tackles, 4.5 tackles for loss, three sacks and an interception as a Nittany Lion.
- He assisted on a tackle for loss in the Delaware game.
- Redshirt senior DT **Hakeem Beamon** owns 15 career starts and 27 career appearances.
- Beamon has totaled 28 tackles, 7.5 tackles for loss and four sacks at Penn State.
- Redshirt senior DT **Dvon Ellies** has seen valuable time at defensive tackle, making three career starts in 33 appearances.
- Ellies is on watch lists for the Allstate AFCA Good Works Team and the Wuerffel Trophy.
- Sophomore DT **Zane Durant** made his first career start against WVU, posting two tackles.
- Against Delaware, Durant tied for the team high with four tackles, while setting a career high.
- He posted a career-best 1.5 tackles for loss, including a solo sack.
- Redshirt junior DE **Zuriah Fisher** recorded his first career sack in the fourth quarter against Delaware.

- During his time at Virginia, Hagans coached 10 of the top 15 career receptions leaders in program history.
- Hagans was a four-year letterman at Virginia from 2002-05 and currently sits No. 10 all-time in passing yards with 4,877. He also ranks seventh in total offense with 5,779 yards.
- He was selected, as a receiver, in the fifth round (144th overall) of the 2006 NFL Draft by the St. Louis Rams.
- Barnes spent the previous three years on the Penn State staff as a graduate assistant working with the defensive line.
- Following a professional playing career in the NFL and the AAF, Barnes joined the Penn State coaching staff in 2020.
- During his three seasons working with the defensive line, Barnes helped coach 11 All-Big Ten defensive linemen, including three first-team selections and a second-team All-American.
- Barnes tutored defensive tackle PJ Mustipher, who was a two-time captain for the Nittany Lions and a three-time All-Big Ten honoree.
- During the 2022 season, Penn State led the Big Ten with 104 tackles for loss (T-4th nationally) and 42 sacks (T-6th).

CORNERBACKS NOTES

- **Terry M. Smith** is in his 10th season as Penn State's cornerbacks coach. He is also the program's associate head coach and defensive recruiting coordinator.
- Smith has tutored a secondary which has seen 11 defensive backs taken in the NFL Draft since 2016, including two in 2023, tied for the fourth-most nationally.
- **Joey Porter Jr.** was selected 32nd overall by the Pittsburgh Steelers in the 2023 NFL Draft.
- Smith was a four-year letterwinner (1988-91) and three-year starter at wide receiver at Penn State. He ranks tied for 10th in career receiving touchdowns (15), 13th in career receiving yardage (1,825) and 14th in career receptions (108).
- Penn State led the country with 85 pass breakups in 2022.
- The Nittany Lions held Delaware to 58 passing yards and just six completions, the lowest number in a game since giving up five completions at Rutgers in 2018.
- Through three games, Penn State is allowing a 54.3 percent completion percentage (47-of-88) and just 5.82 yards per pass attempt.
- The Nittany Lions hold 11th in the country allowing an 94.7 opponent passing efficiency.
- The blue and white are limiting opponents to 170.7 passing yards per game, good for 21st in the nation.
- The Nittany Lions are 11th in the nation with five interceptions and seven turnovers forced.
- Penn State has recorded three or more takeaways in seven games over the last two seasons, tied-most among FBS teams.
- Over the last two seasons, Penn State has held opponents to under a 50 completion percentage in seven games, tied for the nation's third-most.
- Junior **Kalen King** begins the 2023 season on watch lists for the Bednarik Award, Bronko Nagurski Trophy, Butkus Award, Lott IMPACT Trophy and Jim Thorpe Award.
- In his career, King has 61 tackles, four tackles for loss, three interceptions, 24 pass breakups, two forced fumbles and a fumble recovery.
- He was named Preseason All-America first team by the Associated Press and Pro Football Focus.
- King recorded four tackles in the season opener vs. West Virginia.
- He added four tackles and a pass breakup at Illinois.
- Through the first two games, according to Coaches By The Numbers, King allowed a 33.3 completion percentage (1-of-3) when targeted.

- In 2022, King held opponents to a 40% completion percentage (23-of-57) and a 26.2 passer rating when targeted.
- King's 18 pass breakups in 2022 led the Big Ten and ranked third in the country.
- Senior **Johnny Dixon** has recorded 75 tackles, six tackles for loss, three sacks, four interceptions, 19 pass breakups, one forced fumble and one fumble recovery in his collegiate career.
- Dixon began the 2023 season with three solo tackles and two pass breakups against West Virginia.
- At Illinois, Dixon picked off a pass in the third quarter and returned it 21 yards, his longest career return.
- Through the first two games, according to Coaches By The Numbers, Dixon is also allowing a 33.3 completion percentage (1-of-3) when targeted.
- In 2022, Dixon allowed a 31.4 completion percentage (11-of-35) and an 18.4 passer rating when targeted.
- The 31.4 completion percentage was the second-best in the country among anyone targeted at least 35 times and was the best of returning FBS players.
- Redshirt senior **Daequan Hardy** has accounted for 39 tackles, 4.5 tackles for loss, 2.5 sacks, four interceptions, 13 pass breakups, and a forced fumble in his Penn State career.
- At Illinois, Hardy notched an interception in the first quarter, his fourth career interception.
- According to Coaches By The Numbers, Hardy allowed a 39 completion percentage (9-of-23) when targeted last season.
- Sophomore **Cam Miller** has played in 14 games at Penn State, while totaling 13 tackles, one tackle for loss and an interception.
- Miller recorded four tackles, all solo, including his first career tackle for loss against West Virginia.
- The Florida native picked off a pass in the third quarter at Illinois for his first career interception.
- **Zion Tracy** and **Elliot Washington II** were among five Penn State true freshmen who played in the West Virginia game.

- Through three games, Penn State is allowing a 54.3 percent completion percentage (47-of-88) and just 5.82 yards per pass attempt.
- The Nittany Lions hold 11th in the country allowing an 94.7 opponent passing efficiency.
- The blue and white are limiting opponents to 170.7 passing yards per game, good for 21st in the nation.
- Ellis, a team captain, brings a wealth of experience to the Penn State secondary, having appeared in 46 career games, making 22 starts.

- Co-offensive coordinator and tight Ends Coach **Ty Howle** was a four-year letterwinner on the Penn State offensive line from 2009-13. He played in 47 career games, making 13 starts.
- Defensive line coach **Deion Barnes** made 31 starts as a Nittany Lion from 2012-14. In 2014, Barnes tallied 12.5 tackles for loss and six sacks. He led PSU with 10 tackles for loss and six sacks in 2012 to earn consensus freshman All-American honors.
- Defensive graduate assistant **Torrence Brown** was a three-year letterman on the defensive line for the Nittany Lions (2015-17). He appeared in 30 career games, making seven starts.
- Defensive analyst **Dan Connor** was a two-time first-team All-America linebacker for Penn State in 2006 and 2007, the 14th Nittany Lion to be named a two-time first-team All-American. He finished his career as Penn State's all-time leader with 419 tackles.
- Offensive analyst **Calvin Lowry** was a first-team All-Big Ten safety for the Nittany Lions. He totaled nine career interceptions and was PSU's leading punt returner for three seasons.
- Assistant director of performance enhancement **Tyrone Smith** was a defensive tackle for Penn State and lettered during the 2014 season.
- Recruiting coordinator **Alan Zemaitis** letterman and three-time All-Big Ten selection for the blue and white from 2002-05. Zemaitis sits tied fifth all-time at Penn State with 12 career interceptions. He also holds fifth all-time at Penn State with 46 passes defended. Zemaitis helped the Nittany Lions to a Big Ten Championship in 2005.
- Director of Football Academic Services **Todd Kulka** lettered as a linebacker and graduated in 1995. He helped Penn State to a 9-3 record and an Outback Bowl victory in 1995.
- Director of the Football Letterman's Club **Wally Richardson** was a four-year letterman as a quarterback in 1992 and 1994-96. Richardson ranks 12th all-time at Penn State with 4,419 career passing yards. He also sits eighth all-time with 378 completions and 12th all-time with 27 touchdown passes.

SPECIAL TEAMS NOTES

- **Stacy Collins** is in his second season as Penn State's special teams coordinator/outside linebacker/nickels coach. Collins has 25 years of collegiate coaching experience.
- Last season, Collins helped Chris Stoll to win the Patrick Mannely Award, honoring the nation's top long snapper.
- According to Coaches By The Numbers, since 2019, Penn State's kick return defense ranks first in average opponent field position (23.7; 1st in B1G), third in touchback percentage (74.6; 1st), fifth in the nation in percentage of kickoffs returned (18.0; 1st) and 10th in percentage of kickoffs returned inside the 25 (71.0; 3rd).
- Since 2019, Penn State's punt return defense is first in the country in punts inside the 10 (19.8 percent; 1st in B1G), ranked third in punts inside the 20 (44.1; 2nd) and seventh in net punting (41.3; 2nd).
- Since 2017, Penn State ranks fifth in the Big Ten averaging 8.7 yards per punt return (55th nationally).
- Since 2017, Penn State has scored seven special teams touchdowns (four kick return, three punt return), ranking fourth in the Big Ten.
- Penn State is one of 10 FBS schools that has not allowed a special teams touchdown since the start of the 2019 season (51-straight games).
- Senior K **Alex Felkins** transferred to Penn State from Columbia, where he earned his degree in psychology.
- Felkins owns five career games with three field goal makes.
- He has hit three career field goals of 50+ yards, 12 of 40+ yards and is 89-of-93 on extra points.

GAME RECAP

UNIVERSITY PARK, Pa. - No. 7 Penn State defeated West Virginia, 38-15, in front of 110,747 fans, the fourth-largest crowd in Beaver Stadium history and the largest in a home opener. The Nittany Lions outscored the Mountaineers, 24-8, in the second half to pull away for the season-opening victory.

Drew Allar shined in his first game as Penn State's starting quarterback, completing 21 of his 29 pass attempts and finishing with 325 passing yards, three touchdowns and no interceptions. Allar and wide receiver KeAndre Lambert-Smith proved to be a strong connection all night, including a 72-yard touchdown on Penn State's opening possession of the game, the longest pass of Allar's career. Lambert-Smith tallied 123 receiving yards and a career-best two touchdown grabs on four catches.

The Nittany Lions totaled 478 yards of offense (332 passing, 146 rushing) in the well-balanced attack. The dynamic running back duo of Nicholas Singleton and Kaytron Allen combined for 121 yards (70 for Singleton, 51 for Allen). Singleton scored a rushing touchdown in the second quarter, highlighting his solid day on the ground. Malik McClain gained 58 yards and caught a touchdown and Harrison Wallace III added 72 yards on a team-high seven receptions to round out the receiving corps. Quarterback Beau Pribula scored his first collegiate touchdown with a five-yard run in the final seconds of the fourth quarter.

The Penn State defense held West Virginia's offense to just 15 points and 310 total yards, allowing the Mountaineers to convert only four of their 14 third-down attempts. The Nittany Lions made three fourth-down stops during the game and held West Virginia's passing attack to just 167 yards through the air.

Linebackers Dominic DeLuca, Curtis Jacobs and Abdul Carter each recorded one sack apiece. Jacobs accumulated a team-best 10 tackles, while linebacker Kobe King notched five. Zakee Wheatley, Jaylen Reed and Cam Miller made four stops each.

HOW IT HAPPENED

Penn State forced a West Virginia punt on the opening drive of the ball game. The Penn State offense stepped up right away, capping off its first drive of the season with a 72-yard catch-and-run from Allar to Lambert-Smith.

West Virginia got on the board at the 14:14 mark of the second quarter, tying the game, 7-7. The Mountaineers scored on a 1-yard touchdown run by CJ Donaldson. The scoring drive went 69 yards on nine plays.

The Nittany Lions responded immediately, constructing a 10-play, 81-yard touchdown drive to retake a 14-7 advantage. Singleton put the Nittany Lions up on a 2-yard run. The Nittany Lions went into the break up 14-7.

Lambert-Smith hauled in his second touchdown of the ballgame for the first score of the second half. The 12-yard score put Penn State up 21-7 with 8:36 left in the third quarter. The Nittany Lions' scoring drive lasted 3:26 as the offense used seven plays to march 56 yards into the end zone.

The Nittany Lion defense forced a turnover on downs on the next drive and the offense capitalized with a 25-yard field goal by Alex Felkins to extend the lead to 24-7.

Penn State's offense scored two more touchdowns in the final frame to put the game out of reach for the Mountaineers.

The first came on a 25-yard touchdown pass to McClain from Allar.

West Virginia cuts its deficit to 31-15 with 3:34 left in the game as Garrett Greene scored on a 1-yard run and then connected with Donaldson on a successful two-point conversion.

The final score was from Pribula's first career touchdown, a 5-yard quarterback keeper.

Notes

- Penn State improved to 49-9-2 all-time against West Virginia, including wins in five-straight matchups and 33 of the last 35 contests.
- Penn State is now 122-13-1 all-time in home openers and 113-22-2 all-time in season openers.
- Penn State improved to 75-18-2 all-time against the current members of the Big 12.
- Penn State welcomed 110,747 fans to Beaver Stadium, marking the fourth-highest crowd in its history and largest in a home opener.
- Penn State scored on its opening drive on a 72-yard touchdown pass by Drew Allar to KeAndre Lambert-Smith.
- The Nittany Lions scored on their opening drive of the season for the first time since 2020 at Indiana.
- Allar became the first Penn State quarterback to throw for at least 300 yards in a season opener since Christian Hackenberg's 454 passing yards against UCF in 2014.
- Allar was the first Penn State quarterback to throw for at least 300 yards in his first career start since Michael Robinson threw for 379 yards vs. Wisconsin in 2003.
- Allar set career highs for completions (21), attempts (29), passing yards (325) and passing touchdowns (3).
- Allar's 300 passing yards and three passing touchdowns marked the 25th time at Penn State quarterback has done that in a game.
- RB Nicholas Singleton scored on a 2-yard run in the second quarter. It was his 13th career rushing touchdown.
- Lambert-Smith earned his second career 100-yard receiving game. He finished the night with 123 yards and two touchdowns.
- The junior upped his career touchdown receptions of 70+ yards to three, joining his 83-yard touchdown against Villanova in 2021 and his 88-yard touchdown reception against Utah in the 2023 Rose Bowl.
- WR Malik McClain hauled in a 25-yard touchdown reception in the fourth quarter for his sixth career touchdown catch.
- The Nittany Lions stopped West Virginia on three fourth-down conversion attempts.
- LB Curtis Jacobs finished the game with 10 tackles. He recorded double-digit tackles in a game for the third time in his career.
- K Alex Felkins converted a 25-yard field goal in the fourth quarter and also hit two extra-points for his first points as a Nittany Lion.

GAME RECAP

UNIVERSITY PARK, Pa. - No. 7 Penn State football defeated Delaware, 63-7, on Saturday afternoon in Beaver Stadium. The Nittany Lions racked up 541 total yards and scored eight offensive touchdowns, while holding the Blue Hens to only 140 total yards and one touchdown.

Sophomore quarterback Drew Allar continued his outstanding start to the season, completing 22-of-26 passes for 204 yards and one touchdown. Redshirt freshman quarterback Beau Pribula entered the game in the middle of the 3rd quarter and scored one rushing touchdown and one passing touchdown, his first career throwing score.

Nicholas Singleton and Kaytron Allen combined for 155 rushing yards and four touchdowns leading the Nittany Lion rushing attack that posted 315 yards on the afternoon. Through the air, Tyler Warren and Omari Evans hauled in touchdowns while KeAndre Lambert-Smith led the team with 74 receiving yards.

The Nittany Lions totaled an impressive 541 yards of offense (226 passing, 315 rushing). Penn State scored on its first four drives of the afternoon, putting the pressure on the Blue Hens early and often.

Defensively, the Nittany Lions had an impressive performance, holding the Blue Hens to just seven points and 140 total yards of offense, 66 of which came on one rushing play. The defensive unit held Delaware to just five first downs in the game, tied for the fewest by an opposing offense since 2014.

Linebacker Dominic DeLuca recorded Penn State's first defensive touchdown of the season on the first career interception of his career in the late third quarter. DeLuca returned it all the way to the end zone for a pick-six. The defense also recovered one fumble, forced by Keaton Ellis and recovered by Kevin Winston Jr. Jaylen Reed, Zane Durant, and Zuriyah Fisher each chipped in a sack.

HOW IT HAPPENED

Penn State stopped the Blue Hens on the opening possession of the game and scored on the ensuing drive, going up 7-0 with 8:19 remaining in the first quarter. Singleton punched in the first Nittany Lion touchdown of the day on a 2-yard run.

Reed posted a third-down sack on Delaware's next trip down the field, forcing a punt and giving the Nittany Lion offense excellent field position. Allen found the end zone on a 4-yard rushing touchdown, giving the Nittany Lions a 14-0 lead.

Delaware answered with a 66-yard rushing touchdown by Marcus Yarns, cutting the Penn State lead back to seven.

Singleton scored two more rushing touchdowns in the first half, reaching a career-best three rushing scores in the game. The sophomore's third touchdown put the Nittany Lions up 28-7 with 4:36 remaining in the opening half.

Penn State scored once more before the end of the half when Allar found Warren in the end zone for a 2-yard score with 22 seconds left to play in the second quarter.

The Penn State offense marched down the field and scored on the initial possession of the second half, going up 42-7 with just under 10 minutes remaining in the third quarter. Allar scored his first rushing touchdown of the season on a 1-yard sneak.

On the very next drive, Ellis forced a fumble that was picked up by Winston Jr. for the Nittany Lions' first takeaway of the season. Pribula entered the game and drove the Lions down the field and scored on a 6-yard rushing touchdown.

The Penn State defense followed with its first touchdown of the 2023 campaign on a DeLuca pick-six.

The Nittany Lions scored one more touchdown in the fourth quarter, a 4-yard pass from Pribula to Evans, to go up 63-7.

Notes

- In the first all-time meeting, Penn State defeated Delaware.
- Penn State scored on its first four drives: a 2-yard run by RB Nicholas Singleton, a 4-yard run by RB Kaytron Allen, a 5-yard run by Singleton and another 5-yard run by Singleton. The Nittany Lions scored on eight-straight drives, including the final four drives of the West Virginia game.
- The Nittany Lions scored on eight-straight drives for the first time since posting points on eight-straight drives against UMass on September 20, 2014.
- Penn State has recorded at least 30 points in nine-straight games, which is the longest streak in the nation.
- The Nittany Lions scored 35 points in the first half, it's the most points scored by a Penn State team in the opening half since scoring 42 points against Illinois in 2020.
- Penn State tallied 541 total yards, the most since notching 572 against Ohio in 2022. The Nittany Lions have posted 400+ total yards in nine-straight games.
- The Nittany Lions rushed for 315 yards, the most since rushing for 396 vs. Memphis in the 2019 Cotton Bowl.
- The Nittany Lions held the ball for a time of possession of 42:22. Since at least 2007, 42:22 is the longest time of possession Penn State has had in a game. It marked the first time Penn State had over 40 minutes of possession since 2020 at Indiana (40:22).
- During the opening drive of the third quarter, Allen went over the 1,000 career rushing yards mark. He became the 49th Penn State player to reach 1,000 career rushing yards. He now has 1,021 yards.
- The Nittany Lions held Delaware to just 140 total yards, the fewest allowed by Penn State since giving up 134 to Maryland in 2022.
- Penn State held Delaware to just 41 offensive plays, the fewest allowed by the Nittany Lions since holding Minnesota to 40 in a 20-0 win in 2009.
- Penn State held Delaware to 58 yards passing, the fewest allowed by the Nittany Lions since giving up 38 vs. Rutgers in 2021.
- Penn State held Delaware to 82 yards rushing, the fewest since allowing 25 vs. Michigan State in 2022.
- Penn State held Delaware to just five first downs, tying the lowest mark since 2014 and the fewest since Idaho had five in 2019.
- Penn State held Delaware to just six completions the lowest number in a game since giving up five completions at Rutgers in 2018.

GAME RECAP

CHAMPAIGN, Ill. - No. 7 Penn State football took down Illinois, 30-13, on Saturday afternoon at Memorial Stadium. The Nittany Lions played complimentary football on both sides of the ball, fueled by five defensive takeaways.

The defense led the way for the Nittany Lions, recording its first five-takeaway game in seven years. Penn State racked up four interceptions- by four different players- and a fumble recovery. Offensively, the Nittany Lions scored 20 points off of the five turnovers. Stout defense held the Illini in check all day, as the opposing rushing attack gained just 62 yards.

Dominic DeLuca also forced the first fumble of his career, the first of the Nittany Lions' five takeaways. Linebacker Abdul Carter, and cornerbacks Johnny Dixon, Daequan Hardy, and Cam Miller each secured interceptions.

On offense, quarterback Drew Allar posted yet another turnover-free outing, going 16-of-33 for 208 yards. Penn State's running backs were involved in all three offensive touchdowns on the afternoon. Kaytron Allen and Nicholas Singleton each recorded rushing scores, while Trey Potts tossed a touchdown pass to tight end Tyler Warren.

Singleton led the Nittany Lion receiving corps with three grabs and a career-best 49 yards through the air, with tight end Warren (3-35-1) and wide receiver Liam Clifford (1-33-0) complimenting his effort.

HOW IT HAPPENED

The Nittany Lions made their first splash play of the day on their second defensive drive as DeLuca forced a fumble that was picked up by Kobe King to give the ball back to the offense at the Illinois 43.

The Nittany Lions took the ball 40 yards on nine plays for a 20-yard field goal for the first score of the game, going up 3-0 with 5:27 to play in the opening quarter.

Penn State's defense forced its second turnover in two possessions with an interception by Carter, the first of his career, and he returned the ball to the Illinois 37. Alex Felkins knocked through a 45-yard field goal to increase the Nittany Lion lead to 6-0 with under two minutes remaining in the opening quarter.

The Nittany Lion defense recorded its third turnover in the first quarter on the Illini's next drive. Hardy picked off an Altmeyer pass at the Penn State 43 and the offense proceeded to use 12 plays to march 57 yards for its first touchdown. Allen punched in the 4-yard score at the 11:04 mark of the second quarter.

Reggie Love III put the Illini on the board with a 5-yard touchdown run with 2:08 left to play in the half. Illinois constructed an 8-play, 68-yard drive for the score to cut the Nittany Lions' advantage to 13-7.

The Nittany Lions tacked on an additional field goal before halftime to go up 16-7 at the break. Allar found Clifford on a 33-yard strike to the Illinois 11 to set up the Felkins 28-yard field goal.

Penn State's defense made its presence felt right away in the second half. On Illinois' first possession, Dixon intercepted Altmeyer at the Penn State 7 and returning his first interception of the season 21 yards to the Nittany Lions' 28.

The Nittany Lions broke through for their second touchdown of the afternoon to go up 23-7 at the 2:14 mark of the third frame. Potts caught a lateral from Allar and tossed an 11-yard touchdown pass to the tight end, Warren, capping off a 7-play, 68-yard scoring drive.

On the ensuing Illinois possession, the Nittany Lions intercepted Altmeyer for the fourth time, this time by Miller. His pick at the Illinois 30 preceded the Nittany Lion offense's third touchdown of the game. Penn State wasted no time, scoring in just over a minute on a Nicholas Singleton 16-yard rushing touchdown. The back-to-back scoring drives saw the Nittany Lions go up 30-7 with 14:24 left to play in the game.

Illinois found the end zone one more time, scoring on a 19-yard reception by Malik Elzy from quarterback John Paddock late in the fourth quarter. A failed two-point conversion left the score at 30-13.




