NO. 6/7 NITTANY LIONS TAKE ON NORTHWESTERN IN BIG ROAD MATCHUP

- OPENING KICK: No. 6/7 Penn State travels to Northwestern on Saturday for a Big Ten contest. Kickoff is set for noon on Big Ten Network.
- SERIES HISTORY: Penn State meets Northwestern for the 21st time in program history. The Nittany Lions hold a 15-5 advantage and have won eight of the last 10 matchups. In 2022, Penn State earned a 17-7 win in rainy conditions. Kaytron Allen and Nicholas Singleton combined for 173 rushing yards and Singleton scored on a 2-yard run, while Brenton Strange caught a 20-yard touchdown. Penn State limited the Wildcats to 241 total yards and 31 rushing yards.
- NATION'S BEST: Through four games, including three against Power Five opponents, Penn State paces
 the country in total defense (219.5 ypg), pass defense (138.0), first downs allowed (46), turnover margin
 (+11) and time of possession (37:06). The Nittany Lions also sit Top-Five in the country in takeaways (11;
 2nd), fumble recoveries (6; 3rd), scoring defense (8.8 ppg; 4th), sacks allowed per game (0.5; 4th), third
 down defense (24.5%; 5th) and first downs gained (109; 5th).
- SUFFOCATING DEFENSE: Against lowa, the Penn State defense not only recorded a shutout but
 completely shut down the Hawkeyes' offense. Penn State limited lowa to 76 total yards, its fewest ever
 allowed in a Big Ten game and nation's fewest allowed against a Power Five opponent this season. Penn
 State held lowa to just four first downs, including just two after the opening possession. The Hawkeyes
 ran just five plays in Penn State territory. The Nittany Lions held lowa to just one third down conversion
 (1-of-9) and just 2.3 yards per play. Penn State forced four takeaways, all fumbles, to tally nine takeaways
 over the last two weeks.
- THE OPPOSITION: Northwestern improved to 2-2 on the season with a 37-34 overtime win against
 Minnesota on Saturday. The Wildcats trailed 31-10 entering the fourth quarter, but rallied back and
 tied the game on an 11-yard touchdown grab by A.J. Henning with two seconds left in regulation. In
 overtime, Northwestern forced a field goal and then won on a 25-yard touchdown pass from Ben Bryant
 to Charlie Mangieri.

HEAD COACH JAMES FRANKLIN

CAREER AT A GLANCE

- Franklin was named the 16th head football coach in the storied history of the Nittany Lion program on January 11, 2014.
- He is one of six current FBS head coaches to lead his teams to a bowl game in each of his first nine seasons as a head coach and one of six to do so in 11 of their first 12 seasons.
- Franklin is one of four current Big Ten coaches (Ryan Day, Kirk Ferentz, Jim Harbaugh) to have won a Big Ten Championship and became the first African American head coach to win a Big Ten title after Penn State's 2016 victory.
- He joins Mack Brown (UNC), Jimbo Fisher (Texas A&M), Nick Saban (Alabama), Kirby Smart (Georgia) and Dabo Swinney (Clemson) as the
 only active coaches in college football to have won at least three New Year's Six or College Football Playoff games in their career.
- Franklin has led his teams to four Top 10 finishes (4 at Penn State) and seven Top 25 finishes (2 at Vanderbilt; 5 at Penn State).
- In the last seven seasons under Franklin, Penn State is one of six teams to rank in the top 12 of the CFP final rankings at least five times, joining Alabama, Clemson, Georgia, Ohio State and Oklahoma.
- From 2016-19, Franklin led the Nittany Lions to three New Year's Six bowls 2016 (Rose), 2017 (Fiesta) and 2019 (Cotton), making Penn State one of eight teams to accomplish the feat during the four-year span. Penn State last went to three New Year's Six bowls in four years in 1980-83 (1980 Fiesta, 1982 Fiesta, 1983 Sugar).
- Franklin guided Penn State to back-to-back New Year's Six bowls in 2016 (Rose) and 2017 (Fiesta) for the first time since 1985 (Orange) and 1986 (Fiesta).
- From 2016-19, Franklin led Penn State to 42 wins, the most in program history for the Big Ten era, and 28 league wins, a program record.
- Franklin has 28 years of coaching experience at the collegiate and NFL level.
- In his first 12 years as a head coach, Franklin mentored 90 players who have gone on to the NFL ranks.
- Franklin is first all-time in total wins and winning percentage by an FBS African American head coach (minimum 80 wins).

NITTANY LIONS ON THE FIELD

- Penn State defeated No. 8/7/10 Utah, 35-21, in the 109th Rose Bowl Game to cap off the 2022 season. The Nittany Lions reached the 11-win plateau for the 19th time in program history.
- Penn State earned a New Year's Day bowl berth against Arkansas in the Outback Bowl in 2021. With wins over No. 12/15 Wisconsin and No.
 22/20 Auburn, Penn State tallied two wins over ranked teams within the first three games of the season for the first time in program history.
- In 2020, with the emergence of young skill players on offense, true freshmen accounted for 1,486 of Penn State's 3,873 total yards (38 percent), marking a school record for most combined scrimmage yards by true freshmen in a single season.
- Penn State earned its third 11-win season in four years with an 11-2 record in 2019, including a win over No. 17 Memphis in the Goodyear
 Cotton Bowl Classic. The Nittany Lions posted their fourth-straight top 12 finish in the final CFP rankings, coming in 10th, and were ranked
 ninth in the final Associated Press and Amway Coaches polls to earn their 25th AP Top 10 finish. Franklin was a finalist for the Paul "Bear"
 Bryant National Coach of the Year award for the second time at Penn State (2016) and third time in his head coaching career.
- In 2018, the Nittany Lions posted their third-straight season with at least nine wins with a 9-4 overall record, earning a berth in the VRBO Citrus Bowl. Penn State finished No. 12 in the final CFP rankings and No. 17 in the Associated Press and Amway Coaches polls.
- Penn State climbed as high as No. 2 in the rankings in 2017 and appeared in a second-straight New Year's Six bowl, earning a 35-28 win
 over No. 11 Washington in the PlayStation Fiesta Bowl. At 11-2, the Nittany Lions earned back-to-back 11-win seasons for the fifth time in
 program history and first time since 2008 and 2009. Penn State finished the season No. 8 in the Associated Press and Amway Coaches polls
 and No. 9 in the final CFP rankings.
- Penn State surged in 2016, winning nine consecutive games en route to the Big Ten Championship, a Rose Bowl berth and an 11-3 overall record. Penn State finished the season ranked No. 5 in the College Football Playoff rankings and No. 7 in the Associated Press and Amway Coaches polls. It was Penn State's highest finish in the polls since 2005. The Lions claimed their fourth overall Big Ten Championship and first outright title since 1994 with a thrilling, 38-31 comeback win over Wisconsin in the Big Ten Championship Game. Franklin was honored as Sporting News National Coach of the Year and the Woody Hayes National Coach of the Year, as well as the Dave McLain Big Ten Coach of the Year and Associated Press Big Ten Coach of the Year.
- Franklin guided the Nittany Lions to a 7-6 record in 2015 and a berth in the TaxSlayer Bowl.
- Franklin's first season in **2014** was bookended with a pair of thrilling victories for the Nittany Lions. It began with a final-play 26-24 victory over UCF in Dublin, Ireland, in Penn State's first-ever international game and ended with a comeback, a 31-30 overtime win over Boston College in the New Era Pinstripe Bowl in Yankee Stadium. Franklin became just the third Penn State coach to lead the team to at least seven wins in his first season, joining Dick Harlow (1915) and Bill O'Brien (2012), and he guided the Nittany Lions to a 4-0 start, joining Harlow as the only first-year Penn State coaches to win their initial four games.

NITTANY LIONS IN THE CLASSROOM

- The Nittany Lions posted their first 1,000 single-year APR in program history in 2018-19, topping the previous high of 993 in 2014-15.
- Sean Clifford (2021) and Trace McSorley (2018) were selected as a National Football Foundation (NFF) Scholar-Athletes and finalists for the Campbell Trophy, known as the "Academic Heisman." They are the 18th and 19th Nittany Lions to be selected as an NFF Scholar-Athlete.
- In 2019, punter Blake Gillikin took home CoSIDA Academic All-America® first-team honors for the second-straight year to become the 12th two-time first-team selection in Penn State history. He graduated with a perfect 4.0 grade-point average in May.
- Gillikin's two first-team CoSIDA Academic All-America honors increase Penn State football's total to 67 honorees, which ranks second in Division I football history (FBS and FCS).
- Tyler Yazujian collected a berth on the CoSIDA Academic All-America® first team in 2016 after an appearance on the second team in 2015.
- A program-record 10 Nittany Lions were named 2020-21 Big Ten Distinguished Scholars, besting the previous mark of nine set a year earlier.

NITTANY LIONS IN THE COMMUNITY

- The Nittany Lions are active in the community, participating in activities such as Uplifting Athletes, THON, Pennsylvania Special Olympics Summer Games, State College Area Food Bank and Penn State Hershey Children's Hospital visits.
- On June 15, 2020, Franklin was named to the Big Ten Anti-Hate and Anti-Racism Coalition.
- As part of the Cotton Bowl festivities in 2019, Franklin and his family made a \$10,000 financial commitment to the Dallas Children's Hospital.
- In August 2019, Franklin was named a Penn State University Renaissance Fund honoree, which awards outstanding community members for helping students in need.

INTERIM HEAD COACH DAVID BRAUN

- Northwestern is led by interim head coach David Braun.
- Braun was named interim head coach on July 14, 2023.
- Braun is the 10th-youngest head coach in the FBS and the secondyoungest in the Big Ten.
- He arrived in Evanston in January 2023 as defensive coordinator after serving as defensive coordinator at North Dakota State, helping the Bison to two FCS National Championships (2019, 2021) and earning Football Scoop FCS Coordinator of the Year honors in 2021.
- Braun is maintaining his defensive coordinator duties in 2023.
- Prior to North Dakota State, Braun served two seasons on staff at Northern Iowa (2017-18) and two seasons at UC Davis (2015-16).
- Braun played at Winona State in Minnesota and graduated in 2008.

SCOUTING THE WILDCATS

- Northwestern is 2-2 this season with wins over UTEP (38-7) and Minnesota (37-34, 0T).
- In the win over Minnesota last Saturday, the Wildcats rallied from two different 21-point deficits, including down 31-10 entering the fourth quarter. Northwestern tied the game with two seconds left in regulation and won with a touchdown in overtime.
- Against Minnesota, the Wildcats totaled 492 yards, including 400 passing as Ben Bryant threw for 396 yards and four touchdowns.
- · WR Bryce Kirtz hauled in 10 receptions for 215 yards and two
- On offense, Northwestern ranks seventh in the Big Ten in scoring (24.0 ppg), 11th in total offense (337.8 ypg), sixth in passing offense (239.8) and 14th in rushing offense (98.0).
- Bryant has completed 59.6 percent of his passes for 804 yards, six touchdowns and three interceptions.
- Kirtz leads the Big Ten and ranks 25th in the nation averaging 91.3 receiving yards per game, while tallying 17 receptions, 274 yards and two touchdowns.
- On defense, the Wildcats sit 12th in the Big Ten in scoring (25.8 ppg), 11th in total defense (372.0), sixth in passing defense (187.5) and 14th in rushing defense (184.5).
- LB Bryce Gallagher ranks seventh in the country, and second in the Big Ten, averaging 11.0 tackles per game. He has 44 total stops.
- LB Xander Mueller leads Northwestern with four tackles for loss to go with 1.5 sacks and an interception.

LAST MEETING NO. 11/12 PENN STATE OUTLASTS NORTHWESTERN IN THE RAIN, 17-7

UNIVERSITY PARK, Pa. - No. 11/12 Penn State defeated Northwestern, 17-7,

in its 2022 Big Ten home-opener on a soggy day in Beaver Stadium.

The Nittany Lions' defense set the tone in the victory with five three-and-outs on Northwestern's first five possessions, a feat which has not occurred against a Big Ten opponent since 2011. The unit recovered two fumbles, grabbed an interception and forced three fourth quarter turnover-on-downs, including a fourth-and goal stand at the 1-vard line with 11:51 left in regulation. Penn State was extremely successful in stopping the run, limiting the Wildcats to 31 yards on 28 carries. Penn State held Northwestern to zero or negative yards on 14 of 28 carries.

PJ Mustipher had a team-high eight tackles, with four solo, including the one on Northwestern quarterback Ryan Hilinski on fourth down for the goal-line stand. Ji'Ayir Brown notched the interception and a team-high five solo tackles, including

Nicholas Singleton rushed for 87 yards and a touchdown on 21 carries, while Kaytron Allen had 86 yards on 21 attempts. Sean Clifford was 10-of-20 for 140 passing yards and a touchdown. Wide receiver Parker Washington recorded team highs of four catches and 73 receiving yards. Tight end Brenton Strange had a 20yard touchdown reception.

Hilinski went 15-of-37 for 210 passing yards and a touchdown to pace the

Wildcats. Jacob Gill had a 47-yard touchdown grab.
The Nittany Lions got on the board first with a 20-yard Brenton Strange touchdown reception with 15 seconds left in the first quarter. Penn State needed just four plays to cover 60 yards for the score. Keyvone Lee had two carries for 15 ýards, and Washington notched a 13-yard reception. The drive began at the Penn State 40-yard line after Brown's interception.

Penn State doubled its lead on a 2-yard rushing touchdown from Singleton with 5:02 remaining in the first half. Singleton led a grinding seven-play, 45-yard drive in 3:47. He had five carries for 22 yards and an 11-yard reception. Lee converted a fourth-and-one with a 7-yard carry.

Northwestern got on the board with 2:10 left in the third quarter, as Gill caught

a 47-yard touchdown reception. Starting from its own 18-yard line, the Wildcats used nine plays to score in 3:13.

Penn State responded with a 38-yard field goal from Jake Pinegar 31 seconds into the fourth quarter on a seven-play, 54-yard drive in 2:41. Clifford hit Washington on a 43-yard pass on the second play, the longest play of the game for the Nittany Lions. Allen followed with a 13-yard rush to put the team in field goal position.

THREE ON HALL OF FAME BALLOT

- Penn State lettermen Ki-Jana Carter, D.J. Dozier and Paul Posluszny have been selected as a part of the national ballot for the National Football Foundation's College Hall of Fame's Class of 2024.
- Carter, a running back for the Nittany Lions, was a first-team All-American during the 1994 campaign. Carter staked a claim to being one of the most decorated Penn State running backs of all-time with a junior season in which he was fourth nationally in rushing (139.9), second in scoring (10.8 ppg) and fifth in all-purpose yardage (158.4).
- Dozier, a tailback for the Nittany Lions, matriculated to Happy Valley from Virginia Beach, Va. He earned first team All-America honors from the Walter Camp Football Foundation in 1986. Dozier is the only Nittany Lion to the lead the team in rushing four consecutive seasons, doing so from 1983-86.
- Posluszny, an outside linebacker for the Nittany Lions, was a first-team All-American in 2005 and 2006. Posluszny became just the second two-time winner of the Chuck Bednarik Award, presented to the nation's top defensive player, in 2006. In 2005, he also won the Butkus Award.

OFFENSIVE NOTES

- Since the start of the 2016 season, Penn State's offense is second in the Big Ten in total offense (427.6; 30th) and scoring offense (34.33; 18th) and is third in touchdown percentage (31.67; 19th), points per possession (2.16; 21st), scoring percentage (40.47; 23rd), yards per play (6.02; 38th) and yards per pass attempt (7.85; 30th).
- Penn State's offense has been explosive since the 2016 campaign, as it leads the Big Ten in 80-plus yard play percentage (0.20; 2nd nationally) and 70-plus (0.38; 5th) and holds third in 20-plus (7.53; 28th), 30-plus (3.46; 30th), 40-plus (1.94; 18th), 50-plus (0.95; 43rd) and 60-plus (0.54; 27th).
- The Nittany Lions have tallied at least 55 plays of 20 or more yards in seven of the last eight seasons (86 in 2022; 57 in 2021; 63 in 2019; 73 in 2018; 85 in 2017; 91 in 2016; 67 in 2015). PSU had 52 plays of 20 or more yards in 2020 (9-game schedule).
- Additionally, the Nittany Lions are third in the Big Ten and 19th nationally in 15-plus yard passing play percentage since 2016 (19.19 percent).
- With 31 points against Iowa, the Nittany Lions extended its streak of 30+ points to 11-straight games, the nation's longest
- · It marks the fifth time in Big Ten history a team has strung together 11 or more games of 30+ points. The only other time Penn State went 11-straight games with 30+ points in program history was 1993-94, when it scored 30+ points in a schoolrecord 15-straight games.
- Dating back to the Rutgers game in 2022, Penn State has scored in 28-straight quarters, the longest active streak in the nation.
- The Nittany Lions posted 400+ total vards in nine-straight games, before snapping the streak against Illinois. It was tied with Florida State for the nation's third-longest active streak.
- · Penn State has not committed a turnover this season. Penn State is the only team in the FBS who has not turned the ball over this year.
- QB Drew Allar (125) and Washington State's Cameron Ward (141) are the only FBS quarterbacks with 125+ pass attempts and no interceptions this season.
- · Penn State has surpassed 200 yards rushing 40 times in the James Franklin era. PSU is 35-5 in those games.
- Since 2022, Penn State is third in the nation in turnover margin, averaging a +1.35 margin (2.18 gained per game; 0.82 lost per game), best in the Big Ten.
- Over the last two seasons, Penn State is averaging a nation-best 10.12 points per game off turnovers.
- In 2023, Penn State ranks 15th in the country and leads the Big Ten averaging 40.5 points per game.
- The Nittany Lions lead the nation in average time of possession (37:06) and rank fourth in sacks allowed per game (0.5)
- Penn State is 28th in the country in red zone offense (91.3%).
- Penn State ranks 33rd in the nation in total offense (449.8) and 17th in rushing offense (210.0), sitting second in the Big Ten in
- Penn State has tallied 109 first downs through the first four games, holding fifth in the country and first in the conference.
- Against WVU, Penn State tallied 478 total yards.

- Penn State scored on its opening drive with a 72-yard pass from Allar to WR KeAndre Lambert-Smith
- · Allar (325 yards) became the first Penn State quarterback to throw for at least 300 yards in his first career start since Michael Robinson threw for 379 yards vs. Wisconsin in 2003.
- Allar's 300 passing yards and three passing touchdowns marked the 25th time a PSU guarterback has done that in a game.
- With his 72-yard touchdown reception, Lambert-Smith now owns three career touchdown receptions of 70+ yards, joining his 83-yard touchdown against Villanova in 2021 and his 88yard touchdown reception against Utah in the 2023 Rose Bowl.
- Penn State scored on each of its final four possessions of the WVU game, including three touchdowns, and on the first four drives of the Delaware game, posting points on eight-straight drives for the first time since September 20, 2014 against
- Against Illinois, Penn State scored 20 points off turnovers, including its first 13 points of the game.
- In the third quarter, RB **Trey Potts** threw an 11-yard touchdown pass to Tyler Warren. Potts is Penn State's 11th nonquarterback (12 occasions) to throw for a touchdown.
- Against Iowa, Penn State held the ball for 45:27 to the Hawkeyes' 14:33 time of possession. In the second half, Penn State held the ball for 24:14 to lowa's 5:46.
- Penn State had 97 offensive plays to 33 for lowa. According to TruMediaSports, in the past five seasons, no other FBS team has out-snapped its opponent by 60+ plays.
- The 97 plays by the Nittany Lions are the most since Penn State ran 99 offensive plays at lowa in 2017.
- Penn State scored on drives of 17, 10 15 and 12 plays. The last time Penn State had four scoring drives of 10+ plays was against Ohio State in 2021.
- Mike Yurcich is in his third season as Penn State's offensive coordinator/quarterbacks coach.
- Yurcich (California University (Pa.)) and Franklin (East Stroudsburg) both played in the Pennsylvania State Athletic Conference (PSAC).
- As an FBS offensive coordinator, offenses under Yurcich have averaged 6.31 yards per play, ranking first among OC's since 2013 and 13.54 yards per completion, which is also first in that time frame.
- Since 2013, Yurcich's offenses have scored 50 or more points 28 times and 40 or more points 58 times (43.9 percent of games coached), both of which are tops among FBS offensive coordinators since 2013.
- · His teams have averaged an FBS-best 55.0 touchdowns per year and 29.36 passing touchdowns per season.
- Penn State has scored 40 points 28 times since 2016. By comparison, from 2008 until 2015, the Nittany Lions had 18 40-point outings.

- Four quarterbacks Yurcich coached in college are currently on NFL rosters (Sean Clifford - Penn State, Sam Ehlinger — Texas, Justin Fields — Ohio State, Mason Rudolph — Oklahoma State).
- Yurcich served as the passing game coordinator and quarterbacks coach at Ohio State in 2019, where quarterback Justin Fields was a finalist for the Heisman Trophy. Walter Camp Player of the Year Award and Davey O'Brien Award.
- Sophomore quarterback Drew Allar is on the Davey O'Brien Award watch list.
- Through four games in 2023, Allar has completed 67 percent of his passes for 903 yards and eight touchdowns, while rushing
- Allar is tied for the Big Ten lead in passing touchdowns (8), while ranking second in completion percentage (67.2), third in passing efficiency (149.0), fourth in completions per game (21.0) and fifth in passing yards (903) and passing yards per
- Allar (125) and Washington State's Cameron Ward (141) are the only FBS quarterbacks with 125+ pass attempts and no interceptions this season.
- In his first career start, against West Virginia, Allar completed 21-of-29 passes for 325 yards and three touchdowns.

- The sophomore earned Big Ten Offensive Player of the Week
- Against Delaware, Allar completed 22-of-26 passes for 204 yards and a touchdown, while adding a 1-yard rushing score.
- Allar notched his first career game with both a passing and rushing touchdown.
- At Illinois, Allar threw for 208 yards for his third career 200yard passing game and went over 1,000 career passing yards. He has 1,247 career yards.
- Allar set a career high with four passing touchdowns against lowa, while completing 25 passes for 166 yards.
- Ouarterback Beau Pribula also enters his second season with the Nittany Lions after redshirting his rookie season.
- Against WVU, Pribula completed his first career pass attempt for seven yards. He also scored on a 5-yard touchdown run.
- In the Delaware game, Pribula completed 3-of-5 passes for 22 yards and a touchdown. He added 46 yards and a touchdown on eight carries.
- At Illinois, Pribula tallied nine carries for 47 yards and a careerlong 21-yard run.
- He rushed for a career-best 55 yards against lowa.
- Freshman Jaxon Smolik made his collegiate debut in the Delaware contest.

ACADEMIC SUCCESS

- The Nittany Lions had 32 players selected as Academic All-Big Ten in Fall 2022.
- Sean Clifford was a 2021 National Football Foundation (NFF) Scholar-Athlete and finalist for the Campbell Trophy, known as the "Academic Heisman". He is the 19th Nittany Lion to be selected as an NFF Scholar-Athlete.
- Penn State posted its first 1,000 single-year APR in program history in 2018-19, topping the previous high of 993 in 2014-
- In 2019, punter Blake Gillikin took home CoSIDA Academic All-America® first-team honors for the second-straight year to become the 12th two-time first-team selection in Penn State history. He graduated with a perfect 4.0 grade-point average in May 2020.
- Gillikin's two first-team CoSIDA Academic All-America honors increase Penn State football's total to 67 honorees, which ranks second in Division I football history (FBS and FCS).

RUNNING BACKS NOTES

- Co-offensive coordinator/running backs coach Ja'Juan Seider has 15 years of college coaching experience, including 12 at the Power Five level.
- As a player at Florida A&M, Seider won the Doug Williams Award for National Offensive Player of the Year, Jake Gaither Award (considered the Heisman Trophy of Historically Black Colleges) and earned All-America honors after throwing for 2,622 yards and 27 touchdowns and rushing for 740 yards and 14 touchdowns in 1999.
- A loaded running back room is led by dynamic sophomores Kaytron Allen and Nicholas Singleton and redshirt senior Trey Potts.
- Allen (1,147), Singleton (1,264) and Potts (1,279) each have over 1,100 career rushing yards.
- Penn State is one of five FBS teams, and the only Big Ten team, with three career 1,100 yard rushers on its roster.
- Penn State was one of 17 FBS teams, and one of nine Power Five teams and the only Big Ten team, entering 2023 with three career 800-yard rushers on its roster.
- With Potts and Singleton, Penn State was one of 28 FBS teams and one of 18 Power Five teams entering 2023 with two career 1,000-yard rushers on its squad.
- Singleton (1,061 rushing yards) and Allen (867 rushing yards) became the first freshmen teammates in Big Ten history to both rush for 700+ rushing yards in a season.
- Allen and Singleton are the only Penn State duo to each rush for 850+ yards in a season and one of three 800+ rushing yard dups
- Since 2000, Allen and Singleton are one of two FBS freshman duos to each rush for 850+ yards in a season, joining West Virginia's Steve Slaton (1,128) and Pat White (952) in 2005.
- Allen and Singleton are both on the Doak Walker Award watch list.
- Singleton is also on watch lists for the Maxwell Award, Paul Hornung Award and Walter Camp Player of the Year Award.
- The sophomore was also named a second-team preseason All-American by Sporting News and a Pro Football Focus Preseason All-America honorable mention.
- Singleton was selected as a True Freshman All-American by On3, 247Sports and College Football News in 2022.
- He was named the Big Ten Thompson-Randle El Freshman
 of the Year and was selected third-team All-Big Ten by the
 coaches and media and was also tabbed the AP Big Ten
 Newcomer of the Year.
- Allen was an honorable mention All-Big Ten selection by the media and was a True Freshman All-American by College Football News.
- Singleton owns 1,264 career rushing yards, ranking 37th alltime at Penn State, and 17 career rushing touchdowns.
- Singleton's five rushing touchdowns in 2023 rank 17th in the nation and third in the Big Ten.
- Singleton holds fourth in the Big Ten in total touchdowns and 10th in the Big Ten in all-purpose yards per game (93.5).
- He started the 2023 season with 70 rushing yards and a 2-yard touchdown rush against West Virginia.
- On a 10-yard run in the first quarter, Singleton surpassed 1,500 career all-purpose yards. He has 1,869 all-purpose yards.
- Against Delaware, Singleton scored a career-high three rushing touchdowns.
- Singleton found the end zone on a 2-yard rushing touchdown on Penn State's opening drive of the game.
- He scored on a pair of 5-yard in the second quarter.
- Singleton recorded his sixth career game with multiple rushing touchdowns.
- At Illinois, Singleton scored on a 16-yard rush in the fourth quarter.
- He added a career-high 49 receiving yards on three catches and 54 kick return yards for a total of 140 all-purpose yards.
- Against lowa, Singleton gained 49 yards on the ground and added a pair of catches.

- Singleton rushed for 1,061 yards as a freshman, trailing only Saquon Barkley (1,076; 2015) for the most by a Penn State freshman
- In 2022, he became the 16th Nittany Lion to rush for 1,000 yards in a season and the third PSU freshman running back to reach 1,000 yards.
- Singleton's 12 rushing touchdowns in 2022 are a Penn State freshman record.
- Among FBS freshmen, Singleton led the country in yards per carry (6.8), while ranking second in all-purpose yardage (1,495), third in rushing yards (1,061), fourth in rushing touchdowns (12) and total touchdowns (14).
- Singleton led the Big Ten in 30+ yard runs (9; 3rd nationally) and 40+ yard runs (7; 3rd) and tied for second in 50+ yard runs (4; T-4th), 60+ yards (2; T-9th) and 20+ yard runs (12; T-18th).
- Allen has 1,147 career rushing yards and 12 career rushing touchdowns.
- In 2023, Allen ranks eighth in the Big Ten in rushing yards (280) and rushing yards per game (70.0).
- Against West Virginia, Allen rushed for 51 yards on 10 carries.
- In the Delaware game, Allen rushed for 103 yards on 19 carries.
 It was his third career 100-yard rushing game.

- Six Nittany Lion offensive linemen own at least five career starts.
- Junior Olumuyiwa Fashanu has appeared in 21 games and made 14 starts at left tackle.
- Fashanu is a member of the Lombardi Award, Outland Trophy and Walter Camp Player of the Year Award watch lists.
- He was also selected Preseason All-America first team by the Associated Press and Pro Football Focus.
- According to Coaches By The Numbers, Fashanu has not allowed a sack on 70 pass plays in 2023.
- Following the lowa game, Fashanu was named the Outland Trophy National Player of the Week.
- According to Coaches By The Numbers, Fashanu did not allow a sack and allowed only 10 pressures in 281 pass blocking snaps in 2022.

- Offensive analyst Calvin Lowry was a first-team All-Big Ten safety for the Nittany Lions. He totaled nine career interceptions and was PSU's leading punt returner for three seasons.
- Assistant director of performance enhancement Tyrone Smith was a defensive tackle for Penn State and lettered during the 2014 season.
- Recruiting coordinator Alan Zemaitis letterman and three-time All-Big Ten selection for the blue and white from 2002-05. Zemaitis sits tied fifth all-time at Penn State with 12 career interceptions. He also holds fifth all-time at Penn State with 46 passes defended. Zemaitis helped the Nittany Lions to a Big Ten Championship in 2005.
- Director of Football Academic Services Todd Kulka lettered as a linebacker and graduated in 1995. He helped Penn State to a 9-3 record and an Outback Bowl victory in 1995.
- Director of the Football Letterman's Club Wally Richardson
 was a four-year letterman as a quarterback in 1992 and
 1994-96. Richardson ranks 12th all-time at Penn State with
 4,419 career passing yards. He also sits eighth all-time with
 378 completions and 12th all-time with 27 touchdown
 passes.

SPECIAL TEAMS NOTES

- Stacy Collins is in his second season as Penn State's special teams coordinator/outside linebacker/nickels coach. Collins has 25 years of collegiate coaching experience.
- Last season, Collins helped Chris Stoll to win the Patrick Mannelly Award, honoring the nation's top long snapper.
- According to Coaches By The Numbers, since 2019, Penn State's kick return defense ranks fourth in the nation in touchback percentage (74.1; 1st in B1G), fifth in the nation in percentage of kickoffs returned (17.7; 1st) and percentage of kickoffs returned inside the 25 (73.2; 2nd) and 11th in average opponent field position (25.2; 4th).
- Since 2019, Penn State's punt return defense is second in the country in punts inside the 10 (18.9 percent; 2nd in B1G), ranked eighth in punts inside the 20 (42.9; t-3rd) and 10th in net punting (43.3; 3rd).
- Since 2017, Penn State has scored seven special teams touchdowns (four kick return, three punt return), ranking fourth in the Big Ten.
- Penn State is one of 10 FBS schools that has not allowed a special teams touchdown since the start of the 2019 season (52-straight games).
- Senior K Alex Felkins transferred to Penn State from Columbia, where he earned his degree in psychology.
- Felkins owns five career games with three field goal makes.
- He has hit three career field goals of 50+ yards, 13 of 40+yards and is 93-of-97 on extra points.
- In the Illinois game, Felkins hit the 200-career point mark. He has 216 career points.
- Against West Virginia, Felkins hit a 25-yard field goal and converted all three extra-point attempts.
- Felkins converted all eight extra-point attempts vs. Delaware and hit four kickoffs, all for touchbacks.
- At Illinois, Felkins tallied 12 points with three field goals (20, 45 and 28 yards) and three extra-points.
- Felkins converted a 46-yard field goal in the first quarter and all four extra-point attempts.
- Senior P Riley Thompson transferred from Florida Atlantic.
- · Thompson is a member of the Ray Guy Award watch list.
- Thompson booted two punts against West Virginia, including a long of 46 yards.
- The senior landed a 47-yard punt at the Delaware 7.
- He averaged 43.8 yards on six punts at Illinois, landing two punts inside the 20.
- Thompson has placed 29 career punts inside the 20 and seven punts inside the 10.
- Thompson has blasted 15 punts of 50+ yards in his career.
- In the Illinois game, Thompson went over 3,000 career punt vards.
- In 2022, Thompson totaled 61 punts for 2,770 yards (45.4 average) with a long of 71.
- Redshirt freshman P Alex Bacchetta made his collegiate debut against Maryland in 2022 and landed both of his punts inside the 20 and one inside the 10.
- All-Big Ten second team KR Nicholas Singleton scored on a 100-yard kickoff return at Rutgers in 2022, tied for the secondlongest kick return touchdown in program history.
- Singleton averaged 24.9 yards per kick return last season and tallied seven returns of 20 or more yards.
- For his career, Singleton is averaging 23.6 yards per kick return, sitting 10th all-time at Penn State.
- · Singleton had a 26-yard kick return against Delaware.
- He had returns of 31 and 23 yards at Illinois.
- Redshirt sophomore SN Tyler Duzansky has appeared in 11 career games and has served as the primary long snapper in the first four games of 2023.
- LB Dominic DeLuca has been voted as a captain and was awarded No. 0 as the team's special teams leader.
- DeLuca blocked a punt against Minnesota in 2022, PSU's first since Journey Brown against Buffalo in 2019.

GAME RECAP

UNIVERSITY PARK, Pa. - No. 7 Penn State defeated West Virginia, 38-15, in front of 110,747 fans, the fourth-largest crowd in Beaver Stadium history and the largest in a home opener. The Nittany Lions outscored the Mountaineers, 24-8, in the second half to pull away for the season-opening victory.

Drew Allar shined in his first game as Penn State's starting quarterback, completing 21 of his 29 pass attempts and finishing with 325 passing yards, three touchdowns and no interceptions. Allar and wide receiver KeAndre Lambert-Smith proved to be a strong connection all night, including a 72-yard touchdown on Penn State's opening possession of the game, the longest pass of Allar's career. Lambert-Smith tallied 123 receiving yards and a career-best two touchdown grabs on four catches.

The Nittany Lions totaled 478 yards of offense (332 passing, 146 rushing) in the well-balanced attack. The dynamic running back duo of Nicholas Singleton and Kaytron Allen combined for 121 yards (70 for Singleton, 51 for Allen). Singleton scored a rushing touchdown in the second quarter, highlighting his solid day on the ground. Malik McClain gained 58 yards and caught a touchdown and Harrison Wallace III added 72 yards on a team-high seven receptions to round out the receiving corps. Quarterback Beau Pribula scored his first collegiate touchdown with a five-yard run in the final seconds of the fourth quarter.

The Penn State defense held West Virginia's offense to just 15 points and 310 total yards, allowing the Mountaineers to convert only four of their 14 third-down attempts. The Nittany Lions made three fourth-down stops during the game and held West Virginia's passing attack to just 167 yards through the air.

Linebackers Dominic DeLuca, Curtis Jacobs and Abdul Carter each recorded one sack apiece. Jacobs accumulated a team-best 10 tackles, while linebacker Kobe King notched five. Zakee Wheatley, Jaylen Reed and Cam Miller made four stops each.

HOW IT HAPPENED

Penn State forced a West Virginia punt on the opening drive of the ball game. The Penn State offense stepped up right away, capping off its first drive of the season with a 72-yard catch-and-run from Allar to Lambert-Smith.

West Virginia got on the board at the 14:14 mark of the second quarter, tying the game, 7-7. The Mountaineers scored on a 1-yard touchdown run by CJ Donaldson. The scoring drive went 69 yards on nine plays.

The Nittany Lions responded immediately, constructing a 10-play, 81-yard touchdown drive to retake a 14-7 advantage. Singleton put the Nittany Lions up on a 2-yard run. The Nittany Lions went into the break up 14-7.

Lambert-Smith hauled in his second touchdown of the ballgame for the first score of the second half. The 12-yard score put Penn State up 21-7 with 8.36 left in the third quarter. The Nittany Lions' scoring drive lasted 3:26 as the offense used seven plays to march 56 yards into the end zone.

The Nittany Lion defense forced a turnover on downs on the next drive and the offense capitalized with a 25-yard field goal by Alex Felkins to extend the lead to 24-7.

Penn State's offense scored two more touchdowns in the final frame to put the game out of reach for the Mountaineers.

ut the game out or reach for the Mountaineers.

The first came on a 25-yard touchdown pass to McClain from Allar.

West Virginia cuts its déficit to 31-15 with 3:34 left in the game as Garrett Greene scored on a 1-yard run and then connected with Donaldson on a successful two-point conversion.

The final score was on Pribula's first career touchdown, a 5-yard quarterback keeper.

- WR Malik McClain hauled in a 25-yard touchdown reception in the fourth quarter for his sixth career touchdown catch.
- The Nittany Lions stopped West Virginia on three fourth-down conversion attempts.
- LB Curtis Jacobs finished the game with 10 tackles. He recorded double-digit tackles in a game for the third time in his career.
- K Alex Felkins converted a 25-yard field goal in the fourth quarter and also hit two extra-points for his first points as a Nittany Lion.

GAME RECAP

UNIVERSITY PARK, Pa. - No. 7 Penn State football defeated Delaware, 63-7, on Saturday afternoon in Beaver Stadium. The Nittany Lions racked up 541 total yards and scored eight offensive touchdowns, while holding the Blue Hens to only 140 total yards and one touchdown.

Sophomore quarterback Drew Allar continued his outstanding start to the season, completing 22-of-26 passes for 204 yards and one touchdown. Redshirt freshman quarterback bear Pribula entered the game in the middle of the 3rd quarter and scored one rushing touchdown and one passing touchdown, his first career throwing score.

Nicholas Singleton and Kaytron Allen combined for 155 rushing yards and four touchdowns leading the Nittany Lion rushing attack that posted 315 yards on the afternoon. Through the air, Tyler Warren and Omari Evans hauled in touchdowns while KeAndre Lambert-Smith led the team with 74 receiving yards.

The Nittany Lions totaled an impressive 541 yards of offense (226 passing, 315 rushing). Penn State scored on its first four drives of the afternoon, putting the pressure on the Blue Hens early and often.

Defensively, the Nittany Lions had an impressive performance, holding the Blue Hens to just seven points and 140 total yards of offense, 66 of which came on one rushing play. The defensive unit held Delaware to just five first downs in the game, tied for the fewest by an opposing offense since 2014.

Linebacker Dominic DeLuca recorded Penn State's first defensive touchdown of the season on the first career interception of his career in the late third quarter. DeLuca returned it all the way to the end zone for a pick-six. The defense also recovered one fumble, forced by Keaton Ellis and recovered by Kevin Winston Jr. Jaylen Reed, Zane Durant, and Zuriah Fisher each chipped in a sack

HOW IT HAPPENED

Penn State stopped the Blue Hens on the opening possession of the game and scored on the ensuing drive, going up 7-0 with 8:19 remaining in the first quarter. Singleton punched in the first Nittany Lion touchdown of the day on a 2-yard run.

Reed posted a third-down sack on Delaware's next trip down the field, forcing a punt and giving the Nittany Lion offense excellent field position. Allen found the end zone on a 4-yard rushing touchdown, giving the Nittany Lions a 14-0 lead.

Delaware answered with a 66-yard rushing touchdown by Marcus Yarns, cutting the Penn State lead back to seven.

Singleton scored two more rushing touchdowns in the first half, reaching a career-best three rushing scores in the game. The sophomore's third touchdown put the Nittany Lions up 28-7 with 4:36 remaining in the opening half.

Penn State scored once more before the end of the half when Allar found Warren in the end zone for a 2-yard score with 22 seconds left to play in the second quarter.

The Penn State offense marched down the field and scored on the initial possession of the second half, going up 42-7 with just under 10 minutes remaining in the third quarter. Allar scored his first rushing touchdown of the season on a 1-yard sneak.

On the very next drive, Ellis forced a fumble that was picked up by Winston Jr. for the Nittany Lions' first takeaway of the season. Pribula entered the game and drove the Lions down the field and scored on a 6-yard rushing touchdown.

The Penn State defense followed with its first touchdown of the 2023 campaign on a DeLuca pick-six.

The Nittany Lions scored one more touchdown in the fourth quarter, a 4-yard pass from Pribula to Evans, to go up 63-7.

- Penn State held Delaware to just 41 offensive plays, the fewest allowed by the Nittany Lions since holding Minnesota to 40 in a 20-0 win in 2009.

CHAMPAIGN, III. - No. 7 Penn State football took down Illinois, 30-13, on Saturday afternoon at Memorial Stadium. The Nittany Lions played complimentary football on both sides of the ball, fueled by five defensive takeaways.

The defense led the way for the Nittany Lions, recording its first fivetakeaway game in seven years. Penn State racked up four interceptions- by four different players- and a fumble recovery. Offensively, the Nittany Lions scored 20 points off of the five turnovers. Stout defense held the Illini in check all day, as the opposing rushing attack gained just 62 yards. Dominic DeLuca also forced the first fumble of his career, the first of

Dominic DeLuca also forced the first fumble of his career, the first of the Nittany Lions' five takeaways. Linebacker Abdul Carter, and cornerbacks Johnny Dixon, Daequan Hardy, and Cam Miller each secured interceptions.

Johnny Dixon, Daequan Hardy, and Cam Miller each secured interceptions.

On offense, quarterback Drew Allar posted yet another turnover-free outing, going 16-of-33 for 208 yards. Penn State's running backs were involved in all three offensive touchdowns on the afternoon. Kaytron Allen and Nicholas Singleton each recorded rushing scores, while Trey Potts tossed a touchdown pass to tight end Tyler Warren.

Singleton led the Nittany Lion receiving corps with three grabs and a career-best 49 yards through the air, with tight end Warren (3-35-1) and wide receiver Liam Clifford (1-33-0) complimenting his effort.

HOW IT HAPPENED

The Nittany Lions made their first splash play of the day on their second defensive drive as DeLuca forced a fumble that was picked up by Kobe King to give the ball back to the offense at the Illinois 43.

The Nittany Lions took the ball 40 yards on nine plays for a 20-yard field goal for the first score of the game, going up 3-0 with 5:27 to play in the opening quarter.

Penn State's defense forced its second turnover in two possessions with an interception by Carter, the first of his career, and he returned the ball to the Illinois 37. Alex Felkins knocked through a 45-yard field goal to increase the Nittany Lion lead to 6-0 with under two minutes remaining in the opening quarter.

The Nittany Lion defense recorded its third turnover in the first quarter on the Illini's next drive. Hardy picked off an Altmyer pass at the Penn State 43 and the offense proceeded to use 12 plays to march 57 yards for its first touchdown. Allen punched in the 4-yard score at the 11:04 mark of the second

Reggie Love III put the Illini on the board with a 5-yard touchdown run with 2:08 left to play in the half. Illinois constructed an 8-play, 68-yard drive for the score to cut the Nittany Lions' advantage to 13-7.

The Nittany Lions tacked on an additional field goal before halftime to go up 16-7 at the break. Allar found Clifford on a 33-yard strike to the Illinois 11 to set up the Felkins 28-yard field goal.

Penn State's defense made its presence felt right away in the second half. On Illinois' first possession, Dixon intercepted Altmyer at the Penn State 7 and returning his first interception of the season 21 yards to the Nittany Lions' 28.

The Nittany Lions broke through for their second touchdown of the afternoon to go up 23-7 at the 2:14 mark of the third frame. Potts caught a lateral from Allar and tossed an 11-yard touchdown pass to the tight end, Waren caping off 3-7-July (8-yard scoring drive)

Warren, capping off a 7-play, 68-yard scoring drive.

On the ensuing Illinois possession, the Nittany Lions intercepted Altmyer for the fourth time, this time by Miller. His pick at the Illinois 30 preceded the Nittany Lion offense's third touchdown of the game. Penn State wasted no time, scoring in just over a minute on a Nicholas Singleton 16-yard rushing touchdown. The back-to-back scoring drives saw the Nittany Lions go up 30-7 with 14724 fet to lake in the game.

Illinois found the end zone one more time, scoring on a 19-yard reception by Malik Elzy from quarterback John Paddock late in the fourth quarter. A failed two-point conversion left the score at 30-13.

GAME RECAP

UNIVERSITY PARK, Pa. - No. 7 Penn State Football dominated on both sides of the ball and registered a 31-0 victory against the No. 24/22 lowa Hawkeyes on Saturday evening in front of the second-largest crowd in Beaver Stadium history.

Penn State's defense stole the show, shutting out an AP Top 25 opponent for the first time since it did so in the 1999 Alamo Bowl against No. 18 Texas A&M. The Blue & White held lowa to just 76 total yards of offense, split between 50 passing yards and 26 on the ground. Linebackers Abdul Carter and Curtis Jacobs led the way with a trio of tackles apiece, while linebacker Dominic DeLuca, and defensive ends Chop Robinson, Amin Vanover and Dani Dennis-Sutton each forced fumbles on the night. Jacobs became the first Nittany Lion to recover a pair of fumbles in a single game since Mark D'Onofrio did so against Temple on Oct. 5, 1991.

The complementary outing saw PSU out-gain lowa by a 397-76 yardage tally in addition to a striking 97-33 differential in total plays. The Blue & White did an exemplary job of keeping lowa's offense off the field, winning the time of possession battle by over 30 minutes. Penn State finished the night 9-for-20 on third down, while lowa was held to a 1-for-9 conversion rate. Additionally, PSU was able to cash in on all four of their red zone opportunities, while the Nittany Lion defense held lowa without a red zone chance.

A balanced Penn State rushing attack, led by running back Kaytron Allen, gained 215 yards on the evening, with the Norfolk, Virginia, native responsible for 72 on his own. Quarterback Beau Pribula entered the game in the fourth quarter and finished with 55 yards on the ground while running back Nicholas Singleton tallied 49 yards highlighted by a game-high 19-yard scamper in the third quarter.

The Nittany Lions totaled 182 yards through the air, with quarterback Drew Allar responsible for 166 of those after completing 25 of his 37 passing attempts. Allar finished the night with four touchdown passes and zero interceptions. Wide receiver KeAndre Lambert-Smith hauled in eight receptions for 66 yards and a touchdown, while tight end Theo Johnson snagged six passes for 42 yards. Tight end Tyler Warren recorded a career-high two touchdown grabs and fellow tight end Khalil Dinkins recorded his first receiving touchdown of the 2023 campaign.

The Blue & White welcomed a sellout crowd of 110,830, the secondlargest attendance figure in Beaver Stadium history.

HOW IT HAPPENED

On lowa's second drive, Dennis-Sutton forced a fumble that was picked up by Jacobs at the Nittany Lion 18-yard line.

The Nittany Lion offense got on the board first, thanks to a 46-yard field goal by Alex Felkins. Felkins capped off a 17-play 53-yard scoring drive. Penn State took the 3-0 advantage with 1:35 remaining in the opening frame.

On the Nittany Lions' next drive, the Hawkeyes forced a punt, however Thompson's boot hit an lowa player on the fly and was recovered by Curtis Jacobs at the Hawkeye 39-yard line, sending the Penn State offense back on the field. Allar tossed a 9-yard touchdown pass to Dinkins, extending the lead to 10-0

On Penn State's opening drive of the second half, Allar led the Nittany Lions on a 15-play, 75-yard scoring drive. A 2-yard touchdown from Allar to Warren capped off the drive.

The Nittany Lions scored once again on Warren's second touchdown of the game, a 7-yard grab, with 1:01 left in the third quarter.

- Penn State held lowa to four first downs, the fewest allowed by the Nittany Lions since giving up just two to Eastern Illinois in 2009 and the fewest ever allowed by Penn State in a Big Ten game.
- After allowing lowa to get one first down on each of its first two
 possessions in the first quarter, Penn State held lowa without a
 first down for the next seven drives.
- Penn State held lowa to 76 yards of offense, the fewest ever allowed by Penn State in a Big Ten game, and the least since holding Temple to 74 yards in 2006.
- Penn State held lowa to 20 yards rushing, the fourth-lowest since 2014 and the least rushing yards allowed since holding Purdue to minus-19 in 2019.
