HEN TRACKS

The University of Delaware football team will make its first-ever trip to Happy Valley on Saturday to take on Penn State. It will be just the second game in UD history against a ranked FBS opponent, with the first coming in 2017 against No. 18 Virginia Tech.

The Blue Hens are coming off a 37-13 season-opening win in a CAA matchup at Stony Brook last Thursday. Ryan O'Connor finished 24-of-38 passing for 346 yards and a touchdown in his first career start, connecting with nine different receivers. Zach Marker also completed four passes for 68 yards. Marcus Yarns led the rushing attack with 107 yards, his first career 100-yard game, on 11 carries with two scores while Chandler Harvin caught five passes for 100 yards. UD outgained Stony Brook 559-327.

The defense held Stony Brook to 45 total yards in the first half and recorded three second-half interceptions. Tyron Herring led the defense with eight tackles and an interception, while Jackson Taylor added seven. Christian Pierce and Ty Davis all had interceptions with Davis returning his 50 yards for a touchdown. It was Delaware's first pick-six since 2019.

Saturday will be Delaware's 35th game against an FBS opponent since Division I split to FBS and FCS in 1978. The Blue Hens are 16-18 all-time in those games, which is the third-most wins behind only Youngstown State (20) and Northwestern State (17). Their .471 winning percentage is also second among current FCS programs that have played at least 10 games against FBS opponents.

Last year, in Ryan Carty's first game as a head coach, the Blue Hens opened the season with a 14-7 win at Navy. The defense forced three turnovers and Nolan Henderson threw touchdown passes to Bryce de Maille and Chandler Harvin.

Saturday will be the second time in three years that the Blue Hens travel to take on a Big Ten opponent. They fell at Rutgers, 45-13, during the 2021 season. Overall, Delaware has played 30 games against current members of the Big Ten, with 29 of them coming against the Scarlet Knights. UD is 13-16 against Rutgers, with the most recent win coming in 1971. The lone other game was against Indiana in 1968, a 31-24 Blue Hen victory.

There are plenty of new faces to learn this year as the Blue Hens have welcomed 45 newcomers to the roster. The coaching staff brought in 24 members of the UD Class of 2027 as well as 21 transfers from other institutions. The list of transfers includes eight coming from other FCS programs, five out of FBS programs, a Division II All-American and a Division III All-American.

The Blue Hens were picked to finish fourth in the CAA Coaches' Preseason Poll, receiving 149 points overall and one first-place vote. Three Blue Hens earned spots on the Preseason All-CAA Team led by Jourdan Townsend (WR) who has earned all-conference nods each of the past two seasons. Additionally, newcomers Alex Schmoke (PK) and Ryan Kost (P) earned both preseason All-CAA and All-America honors after decorated 2022 seasons. Kost was an All-CAA First Team selection last year while at Monmouth.

PSU CONNECTIONS

There are a couple of family connections between Delaware and Penn State. Safety Keeno Arrington is the son of Penn State alum and College Football Hall of Fame member LaVar Arrington. Additionally, placekicker Alex Schmoke is the son of Mike Schmoke, who wrestled at Penn State from 1980-85. Additionally, his mother, brother and sister were all Nittany Lions.

PICK YOUR POISON

The Blue Hens had nine different receivers catch a pass in their season-opening win at Stony Brook on August 31. The quartet of Chandler Harvin (5 catches, 100 yards), Kym Wimberly (5, 81), Braden Brose (4, 75) and Jourdan Townsend (3, 46) combined for 17 catches and 302 yards.

WHAT A DEBUT!

Quarterback Ryan O'Connor made his first career start against Stony Brook and looked like a crafty veteran. The junior set career highs in pass attempts (38), completions (24) and passing yards (346) while completing passes to nine different receivers. He became the first Blue Hen to throw for more than 300 yards in a season opener since Trent Hurley in 2012.

OH CAPTAIN, MY CAPTAIN

The Blue & Gold will be led by a veteran group of defensive linemen Chase McGowan and Ethan Saunders, linebacker Dillon Trainer and offensive lineman Brock Gingrich. All are first-time captains but are no strangers to the field as they have combined to appear in 99 games during their UD careers. The four captains were chosen by a vote of their teammates and coaches.

PRESEASON ALL-AMERICANS

Punter Ryan Kost earned a trio of preseason All-America honors, with recognition coming from The BlueBloods, Stats Perform and Phil Steele. Placekicker Alex Schmoke also joined him on the Phil Steel Preseason All-American Team.

NEW SIDE OF THE BALL, NO PROBLEM

Senior Fintan Brose was a defensive lineman when he began his career at Delaware and appeared in 13 games along the defensive front over his first two years. A two-way player in high school, the coaching staff switched him to the offensive line during 2022 spring practices. He quickly climbed the depth chart and started all 13 games in 2022, both at right guard and right tackle. He was rewarded with an All-CAA Third Team selection.

KEEPING IT IN THE FAMILY

Delaware has two sets of brothers on its roster in 2023. Braden and Fintan Brose as well as twins Christian and Christopher Pierce.

There are also four members of the team whose fathers also suited up for the Blue Hens. Quincy Watson (Rowan Watson), Sean Quick (Paul Quick), Jack Fileppo (John Fileppo) and Donovan Lewis (Marcus Lewis) are all continuing their family legacies at Delaware.

FAMILIAR FACES ON THE COACHING STAFF

12 members of the coaching staff came to Newark within the past two years. Despite so many new faces, two names are very recognizable to Blue Hen fans.

Head Coach Ryan Carty donned the Blue & Gold from 2002-06 as a quarterback and was a part of the 2003 national championship team.

Assistant Coach Andrew Pierce was one of the best running backs in program history, compiling 4,459 rushing yards from 2010-13 which still ranks second in program history.

AFCA GOODWORKS

Delaware offensive lineman Brock Gingrich has been named one of the nominees for the 2023 Allstate AFCA Good Works Team. Gingrich is one of 136 nominees across all divisions of college football. Established in 1992, the Allstate AFCA Good Works Team is one of the most coveted community service awards in college football. To be considered for a spot on the Allstate AFCA Good Works Team, each player must be actively involved with a charitable organization or service group while maintaining strong academic standing.

FLOODING THE TUB

The Blue Hens went 6-1 in the friendly confines of Delaware Stadium in 2022. During its six regular season home games, UD was one of four FCS schools to surpass 100,000 fans, achieving its highest total (101,410) since 2014. Delaware averaged 16,902 fans at home games, its highest average since 2013. The home contest against Towson on Oct. 1 had a sellout crowd of 18,905.

PRESEASON POLLS

After returning to the postseason and advancing the second round of the 2022 FCS Championship, the Blue Hens have received plenty of preseason recognition. Delaware received one first-place votes and 149 points overall to finish fourth in the CAA preseason poll.

In the national polls, the Blue & Gold were ranked No. 22 in the Stats Perform FCS Preseason Top 25 Poll and No. 21 in the AFCA Coaches FCS Preseason Poll. The Blue Hens also came in at No. 25 in the Athlon Sports' FCS Preseason Top 25 and are receiving votes in the HERO Sports Preseason Top 25 poll.

With phase one of the Delaware Stadium renovation project complete, the Blue Hens hold one of the finest facilities in all of Division I football, FBS included. The new Whitney Athletic Center holds a state-of-the-art weight room, nutrition center, academic center, athletic training center and much more. The building provides next-level resources for all Delaware student-athletes.

ROYAL COMPANY

The University of Delaware is one of just three institutions with an alumnus elected President (Biden), a Super Bowl MVP (Flacco), and an NFL MVP (Gannon), along with Stanford and Michigan.

LIFTING THE LOMBARDI

A Blue Hen has lifted the Lombardi Trophy each of the last two years as members of the Super Bowl-winning team. UD alums Brett Veach (general manager), Matt Nagy (quarterbacks coach) and Joe Bleymaier (wide receivers coach) all helped lead the Kansas City Chiefs to Super Bowl LVII. It was Veach's second title as general manager of the Chiefs.

For Super Bowl LVI, Delaware was the only FCS program with two alums playing as Troy Reeder started at linebacker for the Los Angeles Rams and Zach Kerr suited up for the Cincinnati Bengals. Reeder became the fourth Blue Hen ever to win the Super Bowl as a player, joining Jamin Elliott (Patriots), Joe Flacco (Ravens) and Gino Gradkowski (Ravens).

Overall, 11 Blue Hens have played in a Super Bowl.

NFL BLOODLINES

There are two members of this year's Delaware roster that are sons of former NFL players. Junior safety Keeno Arrington is the son of Penn State alum and College Football Hall of Famer LaVar Arrington. After a decorated college career, Arrington was selected second overall in the 2000 NFL Draft by Washington and he played for both the Redskins and New York Giants.

Graduate cornerback Jared Duncan is the son of Jamie Duncan, a Delawarean who was a two-time All-American at Vanderbilt and the 1997 SEC Defensive Player of the Year. He was a third-round draft pick in the 1998 NFL Draft by the Tampa Bay Buccaneers, playing seven years for the Bucs, St. Louis and Atlanta.

- ✦ Penn State enters Saturday ranked No. 7 in both the Associated Press and USA Today Coaches' Poll. They are 1-0 after a 38-15 victory over West Virginia to open the season last Saturday.
- ✦ The Nittany Lions finished with 478 yards of total offense, including 332 passing yards. The defense allowed just 308 total yards.
- ✦ Drew Allar passed for 325 yards and three touchdowns while completing 72-percent (21-29) of his passes.
- ✦ KeAndre Lambert-Smith caught four passes for 123 yards and two scores.
- ✦ The defense got to the quarterback for three sacks against West Virginia, while Curtis Jacobs led the Nittany Lions with 10.0 tackles and a sack.

HEAD COACH RYAN CARTY

A Delaware alum and member of the 2003 national championship team, Ryan Carty was named the head football coach in December 2021 by Director of Intercollegiate Athletics & Recreation Services, Chrissi Rawak. Carty spent the previous four seasons as the offensive coordinator and quarterbacks coach at Sam Houston.

In his first season as head coach, Carty's explosive offense brought Delaware to the FCS playoffs with an 8-5 overall record and a 4-4 record in CAA play. Carty was the first Delaware head football coach to lead the team to the FCS playoffs in his inaugural season. The Blue Hens opened the season strong with a 14-7 win at Navy making the program's first win over a FBS school since 2007. UD had a total of 1,864 rushing yards in 2022 to rank fourth in the CAA and was second with 3,450 passing yards. Ten Blue Hens earned All-CAA awards, including Johnny Buchanan, Noah Plack and Kendrick Whitehead who were named to the All-CAA First Team. Quarterback Nolan Henderson was also named to the All-CAA Second Team. Delaware also had a pair of All-Americans in Johnny Buchanan (7x) and Kendrick Whitehead. Three Blue Hens signed UDFA contracts after the 2023 NFL Draft in Nolan Henderson (Ravens), Thyrick Pitts (Bears) and Kendrick Whitehead (Buccaneers).

Prior to being named the head coach at his alma mater, Carty spent four seasons as the offensive coordinator at Sam Houston State. Known for his explosive plays and high-energy offense, Carty was recognized for his offensive success in the spring 2021 season. Named the FCS Coordinator of the Year by FootballScoop.com and to Dave Campbell's Texas Football's "Top 40 Coaches Under 40" list, Carty played an instrumental part in Sam Houston winning the 2020 FCS National Championship as well as advancing to the 2021 FCS quarterfinals.

Carty's offense helped lead Sam Houston to a 34-10 record from 2018-21 and a 21-1 mark in his final two seasons the past two seasons in Huntsville.

The Bearkats had an undefeated regular season in 2021 and advanced to the FCS Quarterfinals. Sam Houston finished the season ranked third in the nation in scoring offense (41.0 ppg), fifth in total offense (490.9 ypg), and sixth in rushing offense (228.2 ypg).

During the Bearkats' undefeated 10-0 spring season, SHSU ranked first nationally in total yards (4,403), first in touchdowns (45), third in first downs (204), seventh in passing yards per attempt (8.6 ypa), eighth in passing yards per completion (14.3 ypc), ninth in scoring offense (38 ppg), 13th in total offense (440 ypg), and 13th in passing offense (282 ypg).

With a proven record as one of the top offensive coordinators and quarterbacks coaches in the nation, Carty coached SHSU quarterback and Walter Payton Award finalist Eric Schmid to Southland Conference Player of the Year honors on his way to leading the FCS in total passing yards in the spring.

During his four-year stint with Sam Houston, the Bearkats advanced to the playoffs in back-to-back years and won two conference titles. Prior to his stop in Huntsville, Carty was very familiar with the Colonial Athletic Association after an 11-year run on the New Hampshire coaching staff, including six years as the offensive coordinator and quarterbacks coach.

During Carty's stint at New Hampshire, the Wildcats qualified for the FCS playoffs in each of Carty's six seasons as offensive coordinator, compiling an 8-6 postseason record and reaching the semifinals in 2013 and 2014. The Wildcats garnered seven or more wins every season Carty was on staff. As the offensive coordinator, UNH quarterbacks combined for 18,656 Yards and 171 TDs in 80 contests with Carty leading the offense.

Carty, a team captain during his 2006 senior campaign, earned his bachelor's degree in management from Delaware in 2006.

A native of Branchburg, N.J., Carty and his wife, Katie, are happy to join the Blue Hen family
