QUICK HITS

Penn State softball kicks off its 33rd season as a member of the Big Ten Conference this weekend, as the Nittany Lions play host to the Indiana Hoosiers in a three-game set running Friday through Sunday, March 22 through 24. All three games from Nittany Lion Softball Park and Beard Field will stream live to a worldwide audience of authenticated subscribers via B1G+. The Nittany Lions return to action following an impressive 5-0 weekend of performances at the Penn State Softball Invitational, registering a pair of wins against Lehigh in addition to single-game victories against Cornell, Canisius and Binghamton. The weekend finale against the Bearcats saw the Blue & White register a 15-5 win in five innings, the first instance of 15-or-more runs scored in a Penn State softball game since 2016. Penn State has established itself as one of the premier extra-base hitting teams across all Division I institutions, ranking second in the Big Ten Conference and seventh nationally in doubles with 51, in addition to placing sixth nationally in doubles per game with 1.96. PSU also ranks prominently in triples per game, leading the B1G and ranking second nationally behind Tulsa with a 0.54 mark in the stat. Juniors Haylie Brunson and Maddie Gordon lead the team in multiple statistics, highlighted by a tie for the team lead in home runs hit this year with four apiece. Brunson paces the squad in RBI with 26, while senior Kaitlyn Morrison leads the Nittany Lions in batting average with a .366 mark. Freshman right-hander Bridget Nemeth paces PSU in ERA with a 1.03 tally and is the only pitcher in the Big Ten to log 10 wins without suffering a loss.

HOSTING THE HOOSIERS

- Led by veteran head coach Shonda Stanton, Indiana prepares for its conference debut in Happy Valley with a league-leading 22-6 overall record heading into the weekend series against the Nittany Lions.
- Indiana's record includes a bevy of impressive results against nationally-ranked opposition, highlighted by an early-season upset over No. 15 Oregon at the NFCA leadoff classic. The Hoosiers have played six different nationally ranked opponents this season in addition to booking wins over common PSU opponents Kansas, FAU and Marshall.
- The Hoosiers boast a wide array of solid individual performers, highlighted by freshman Aly VanBrandt's .424 average in the box and redshirt senior Cora Basset's seven home runs. Returning All-B1G First Team selection Taylor Minnick paces the team with 32 RBI while two-way star Brianna Copeland leads IU in ERA with a 1.62 mark.

STORY OF THE SERIES

- In one of the oldest rivalry series in the Penn State softball record book, the Nittany Lions prepare for their 86th, 87th and 88th matchups with Indiana this weekend in a series that dates to the 1977 campaign.
- Penn State's series against the Hoosiers is the second-oldest in PSU history against a current B1G opponent, with the Nittany Lions' rivalry with Ohio State predating the IU series by two years.
- The Blue & White have won three of the last five meetings and are 3-1 in the last four contests played at Nittany Lion Softball Park and Beard Field. Each of the last two meetings came in the 2022 and 2023 Big Ten Tournaments, respectively, with the squads splitting those meetings.
- Last year's meeting came at Eichelberger Field in Champaign, Illinois, during the 2023 B1G Softball Tournament. The Hoosiers logged a 5-4 walk-off win in extra innings to close out PSU's season in the tournament quarterfinals a season ago.

B1G THINGS COMING

- Entering Big Ten Conference play, Penn State stands as one of just two teams in the league to have already surpassed the 20-win threshold this early in the 2024 campaign. PSU's 20-6 overall record sits just behind first-place Indiana's 22-6 overall mark, with both teams set to face off in the league's opening weekend in Happy Valley.
- As a team, Penn State ranks prominently in the B1G in multiple statistical categories heading into the first league series of 2024, with PSU leading the Big Ten in triples per game (0.54) while ranking second in doubles (51), doubles per game (1.96) and winning percentage (.769). PSU ranks third in the conference in slugging percentage (.484) while placing fourth in batting average (.300), stolen bases per game (1.42) and total stolen bases (37).
- On an individual basis, junior outfielder Haylie Brunson leads the Big Ten Conference with 11 doubles and 0.42 doubles per game, while senior Emily Maddock stands as the toughest player to strike out in the conference, striking out once in 82 at-bats this year.

BY INVITATION ONLY

- The Blue & White return to action following one of the most dominant offensive weekends in recent memory at PSU, with the Nittany Lions going 5-0 at the Penn State Softball Invitational. Penn State downed Lehigh in consecutive games to open the tournament and closed things out with three more wins against Cornell, Canisius and Binghamton.
- Junior Maddie Gordon turned in one of the most astonishing weeks in her collegiate career during the tournament, as the Shenandoah, Virginia, native finished the weekend batting .500 with eight runs scored. Gordon led PSU with an eye-popping 1.754 OPS over the four-day tournament, while freshman pitcher Bridget Nemeth closed the weekend out with her 10th consecutive victory in the circle this year against Binghamton.

SOUTH BY SOUTHWEST

- Penn State returned home to Happy Valley after a nine-game, eight-day road trip through the Lone Star State of Texas earlier in March. PSU published a 4-1 record at the Longhorn Invitational, dropping its lone contest to No. 2 Texas, following that performance up with four consecutive quad-one RPI contests against Baylor and Texas State.
- During PSU's Lone Star road trip, senior shortstop Kaitlyn Morrison picked up Big Ten Player of the Week accolades on Monday, March 4. Morrison logged a .417 average over the nine-game trip, totaling four doubles and 14 total bases for an OPS of 1.146.
- Junior left fielder Maddie Gordon was a force to be reckoned with in the box during the Texas trip, hitting for a .414 average with three doubles and a home run on her way to a 1.106 OPS.

HAYLIE'S HOUSE

- Junior outfielder and Pittsburgh transfer Haylie Brunson has been an offensive revelation for the Nittany Lions, hitting .321 while leading the Blue & White in home runs (four) and RBI (26). Brunson stands alone atop the Big Ten Conference and ranks 11th nationally in doubles with 11 while simultaneously leading the league in doubles per game and ranking 22nd nationally with 0.42.
- The Mount Pleasant, Pennsylvania, native is the only Nittany Lion on the 2024 roster to record more than three hits in a single game, doing so on two separate occasions. Brunson's pair of four-hit outings are tied for third all-time in the PSU record book for hits in a single game. She registered four hits and six RBI, tied for third all-time in a single game at Penn State, in a 12-5 win over Penn and followed that performance with a four-hit, four-RBI outing against Binghamton last week.

KNOW THE NEMETH

- Freshman pitcher Bridget Nemeth is off to one of the most decorated starts by a Nittany Lion pitcher in program history, picking up a pair of Big Ten Conference weekly accolades, as well as recognition as the NCAA Digital Pitcher of the Week earlier this season. Nemeth most recently picked up recognition as the No. 8-ranked pitcher in the nation according to D1Softball's first in-season ranking update.
- Already one of the most dominant pitching performers in the Big Ten Conference, Nemeth appeared in 10 of Penn State's first 12 contests, recording either a win or save in all 10 appearances. She has since improved to 10-0 individually in the circle this year, making her the only pitcher in the B1G and one of just three nationally to boast double-digit wins and zero losses.
- The Glendora, California, native ranks third in the Big Ten Conference and 19th nationally with a 1.03 ERA, additionally boasting the second-most saves in the Big Ten with two this year. Nemeth boasts the best WHIP on the PSU roster, turning in a 0.95 mark in the category measuring walks and hits per innings pitched.
- Nemeth ranks second in the league with a 5.75 strikeout-to-walk ratio, third in the conference in walks allowed per seven innings with 1.38 and fourth in the league with 7.9 strikeouts per seven innings. Nemeth is tied with junior Mady Volpe for the team lead in strikeouts with 69, with both tied for eighth in the B1G in that category.

BACK AT BEARD

- Penn State kicked off its 14th season of competition in the Big Ten's premier softball venue, Nittany Lion Softball Park and Beard Field, last weekend. The Blue & White have played and practiced in the facility in every season since the 2011 campaign. PSU has not lost a non-conference home opener since March 20, 2019, going 3-0 in non-B1G home-opening matchups under head coach Clarisa Crowell. PSU improved to 36-21 in home-opening matchups all-time following the team's win over Lehigh on March 14.
- The Nittany Lions picked up their 100th win in facility history on Friday, March 15, as Penn State registered an exhilarating 4-3 come-from-behind victory against the Lehigh Mountain Hawks. Senior catcher Gaby Garcia booked the walk-off single in the bottom of the seventh to cement the historic milestone.
- Last season, the Blue & White recorded a 10-5 finish on Beard Field highlighted by a pair of Big Ten Conference series victories in addition to a midweek rivalry win over Pittsburgh.

ROAD WARRIORS

- The Nittany Lions returned to Pennsylvania for the first time in the 2024 calendar year last weekend, with the Blue & White contesting their first 21 games of the season in either true road or neutral site environments in three different states. PSU faced off against eight quad-one or quad-two RPI opponents in its season-opening travels.
- Penn State picked up its signature win of the 2024 season to date with an astonishing 3-2, extra-inning upset win over then-No. 16 Arkansas from Joan Joyce Field in Boca Raton, Florida. Returning First Team All-Big Ten honoree Emily Maddock chopped the game-winning RBI toward the first baseman to bring Lydia Spalding in for the winning score.

- Senior infielder Emily Maddock returns to PSU for her final season after becoming the first Nittany Lion position player to land First Team All-B1G accolades since 2017. Maddock was an NFCA First Team All-Region choice as well, booking the second-best single-season batting average in Penn State history with a .439 mark.
- Graduate infielder Kaitlyn Morrison returns to the field after her most productive collegiate season in 2023, shattering career highs in practically every statistical category. Morrison booked a .338 average with 145 at-bats, 49 hits, 14 doubles and seven homers.
- Senior outfielder Liana Jones continues her career in the Blue & White in 2024 after a 2023 season which saw her crank six homers and a career-best 16 RBI. Junior outfielder Maddie Gordon rounds out the four PSU starters returning from last season. The Shenandoah, Virginia, native hit the only Nittany Lion grand slam in 2023 in the series finale against Rutgers, powering an 8-3 win in the process.

POWER TO THE PORTAL

- PSU welcomed a trio of transfers last summer, including Pitt transfer outfielder Haylie Brunson, SFA transfer catcher Gaby Garcia and Coastal Carolina transfer pitcher Mady Volpe.
- Brunson spent two years with the Panthers, clocking a .294 average last season with a .871 OPS, establishing herself as the team's starting right fielder.
- Garcia, a native of Southlake, Texas, hit .315 last year while ranking second in the WAC and 14th nationally with 18 home runs. Garcia's reputation as an All-Conference performer is built on 37 career home runs and 34 doubles while booking a .992 fielding percentage.
- Volpe arrives in Happy Valley after a two-year career at Coastal Carolina. The Lansdale, Pennsylvania, native booked a 2.66 ERA last year with an impressive 9-1 individual record.

FRESH FACES

- PSU boasts six new freshmen on the 2024 roster, including pitcher Bridget Nemeth, infielder Brooke Klosowicz, outfielder Michela Barbanente, infielder Jiselle Hernandez, infielder Gianna Poletti and catcher Audree Mendoza. Poletti is not currently eligible to participate following a mid-year transfer from Auburn, but the remaining five Nittany Lions are expected to make an immediate impact on the diamond.
- Penn State hauled in the nation's 24th-ranked recruiting class in the 2025 signee cycle according to Extra Inning Softball, comprised of right-handed pitcher Abigail Britton, catcher Macy Chamberlin and outfielder Natalie Lieto. The Nittany Lion class ranked third in the Big Ten Conference behind Northwestern (#21) and Michigan State (#23).

UP NEXT

- Penn State softball kicks off its 33rd season as a member of the Big Ten Conference this weekend, with the Nittany Lions set to square off against the Indiana Hoosiers in their league-opening series Friday through Sunday, March 22 through 24 at Nittany Lion Softball Park and Beard Field. All three games will stream live to a worldwide audience of authenticated subscribers via B1G+.

Then-Penn State University Vice President for Athletics Sandy Barbour named Clarisa Crowell as the eighth head coach of the Nittany Lion softball program on August 3, 2020. Crowell enters her fourth season at the helm of the Blue & White in the 2024 campaign.

Crowell returns to Happy Valley following her second consecutive 30-win season with the Nittany Lions, the first instance of back-to-back 30-win campaigns at PSU since the 2005 and 2006 teams accomplished that feat. Penn State published a 31-16 overall record at season's end and mustered an 11-11 record in Big Ten Conference play, ensuring that the Nittany Lions would finish at or above .500 in the league in consecutive seasons, also for the first time since 2005-06.

Under Crowell's direction, the Nittany Lions saw continued success on the Big Ten's biggest stage in 2023, winning a conference tournament game in consecutive seasons for the first time since the 2016 and 2017 squads did so. PSU also recorded consecutive postseason appearances for the first time in five seasons, reaching back-to-back Big Ten Tournaments for the first time since the Nittany Lions appeared in five-straight from 2013 to 2017.

As the program's pitching coach, Crowell directed the most effective pitching staff in the Big Ten Conference. The Nittany Lions finished as the conference's leader in overall earned run average, rounding out the year with a 2.18 mark. The Blue & White also recorded the third-best strikeout-to-walk ratio in the league and 15th-best nationally, striking out 3.59 batters for every walk surrendered. Crowell's pitching direction also culminated in multiple program records being shattered by fifth-year left-hander Bailey Parshall, who set PSU records in career strikeouts (783) and shutouts (21).

In the classroom, PSU published a perfect Academic Progress Rate of 1,000 and saw 18 Nittany Lion student-athletes land Academic All-Big Ten honors. Penn State also mustered 12 Easton/NFCA Scholar Athletes, seven Big Ten Distinguished Scholar honors and five College Sports Communicators (CSC) Academic All-District accolades, reflecting Crowell's commitment to comprehensive excellence on and off the field.

In recognition of her exemplary record in the classroom and on the diamond, senior first baseman Lexie Black secured two of the highest honors bestowed by the Big Ten Conference in 2023. Black, a native of Omaha, Nebraska, landed the Big Ten Postgraduate Scholarship in preparation for her continuing education in veterinary medicine at the University of Nebraska. Additionally, Black garnered the Big Ten Medal of Honor, bestowed upon one male and female graduating student-athlete from each B1G member institution.

Penn State finished the 2022 campaign with a 25-win improvement from the previous season, marking the largest single-season turnaround for a team in

NCAA Division I. The Nittany Lions also reached the 30-win mark and finished above .500 in Big Ten Conference play for the first time since 2016. Penn State completed the campaign with 32 wins, which at the time marked the most wins for PSU in a season since 2008. As a result of the program's meteoric rise to prominence, Crowell was honored as the 2022 ECAC Coach of the Year.

On the defensive side, the Blue and White registered 12 shutouts on the year, the most by any Nittany Lion squad since the 2008 team accomplished that feat. At the dish, the Nittany Lions' 75 doubles ranked tied for second in program history, while their 43 home runs and 207 RBI ranked third in program history.

Parshall led the way on an individual basis, earning NFCA All-America Third Team honors to go along with NFCA First-Team All-Region and First-Team All-Big Ten accolades. Parshall was selected as the Female Penn State Athlete of the Year for the 2021-22 academic year as a result. Parshall became just the fifth NFCA All-American in program history and the first Penn State pitcher to earn All-American recognition since Ashley Esparza did so in 2005. Parshall was dominant in the circle in 2022, posting a 22-9 individual record with a 1.68 ERA and nine shutouts in 212.1 innings pitched.

In addition to Parshall's nationally-acclaimed statistical season, junior catcher Cassie Lindmark collected NFCA All-Region Third Team and All-Big Ten Second Team laurels. Lindmark provided and immediate offensive pop for the Nittany Lion lineup, hitting .400 in the leadoff spot in addition to building a striking .508 on-base percentage. She became just the sixth Nittany Lion to hit .400 in a season and ranked tied for sixth on the program's single-season batting average leaderboard.

The Nittany Lions maintained consistent success in the classroom, tying a then-program record by placing 16 student-athletes on the Academic All-Big Ten team for the second consecutive year. Six student-athletes were designated as Big Ten Distinguished Scholars. Fourteen student-athletes made the Dean's list during spring semester and the squad compiled a 3.45 GPA, posting the highest cumulative GPA for the program in at least a decade. Under Crowell's leadership, Claire Swedberg was selected as the 2022 Big Ten Postgraduate Award winner, a recipient of the Fulbright grant and was also selected to be the Grand Marshal for the Penn State Health and Human Development Department.

In her first season at the helm in Happy Valley in 2021, Crowell led the Nittany Lions to a win over No. 23 Minnesota, the program's first victory over a ranked opponent since 2017. Penn State also had wins over four other Big Ten programs in a COVID-maligned conference-only calendar during the 2021 spring semester, including three-straight wins and a series victory over Rutgers. The consecutive victories against the Scarlet Knights marked the first time

Penn State won three consecutive Big Ten contests since 2017.

Crowell also mentored Parshall in her ongoing success in the circle, as the then-junior pitcher recorded two double-digit strikeout games and moved into sixth all-time in the Penn State record books with 396 career strikeouts and third all-time with seven career saves. In the classroom, a program-record 16 student-athletes earned Academic All-Big Ten honors in Crowell's first season of leadership, immediately setting the tone for multiple seasons of academic excellence that followed.

Prior to her arrival at Penn State, Crowell spent eight years as head coach at Miami (Ohio). Crowell and the RedHawks made a MAC Tournament appearance every season in which a tournament was held, winning the league tournament title and making an NCAA Regional appearance in 2016.

Crowell coached 12 student-athletes to first team All-MAC honors, 10 to second-team honors, nine All-MAC Freshman Team recipients and six National Fastpitch Coaches Association (NFCA) All-Region honorees. RedHawk student-athletes also excelled in the classroom with 40 Easton/NFCA Scholar-Athletes and 32 Academic All-MAC honorees during Crowell's tenure in Oxford.

In the COVID-19 shortened 2020 season, Crowell's RedHawks were selected as the MAC preseason favorites. Junior pitcher Courtney Vierstra ranked fifth nationally and first in the conference in strikeouts with 140 over 18 appearances. Crowell's tutelage of Vierstra saw the junior star finish fifth nationally in strikeouts per seven innings with 12.5 at the season's suspension mark.

In the spring of 2019, Crowell led Miami to a 35-16 overall record and a 16-4 ledger in conference play, as the RedHawks captured their first MAC regular-season title in program history. Miami posted 10-straight wins against MAC opponents, the longest win streak in conference play in the history of the RedHawk program. The team also ranked first in the MAC for pitching and team defense with an overall ERA of 2.55 coupled with a .972 fielding percentage. Crowell was named the 2019 MAC Coach of the Year while seven student-athletes earned All-MAC selections and two more were named NFCA All-Region honorees. Vierstra headlined the list of All-Region recipients after boasting the third-best strikeouts-per-seven innings ratio in the country (10.3).

Crowell's 2017 team excelled offensively, ranking second all-time in Miami history for runs scored (265), runs per game (5.00), RBI (235), doubles (74) and home runs (47). Crowell led Michaela Schlattman to NFCA All-Region recognition, marking the third-straight season a RedHawk player garnered regional accolades. The RedHawks went 29-24 in 2017, highlighted by a dominant 16-2 record at home.

In 2016, Crowell led Miami to a 35-23 overall record and 15-7 record in MAC competition, finishing just half a game short of the MAC regular-season title. The RedHawks made up for that with a perfect 4-0 record in the MAC Tournament to earn the program's fourth conference tournament crown and a spot in the NCAA Tournament for the first time since 2012. Miami went on to beat No. 23 Notre Dame, 3-2, in the opening game of the Ann Arbor Regional.

The 2016 RedHawks broke six offensive school records, including runs (302), runs per game (5.21), RBI (274), doubles (83), home runs (56) and walks (200). Miami also held a .977 fielding percentage, a school record, and the seventh-best fielding percentage in the nation. Crowell coached senior outfielder Taylor Shuey to become the first softball player in school history to be named MAC Player of the Year after breaking Miami's career RBI record with 114. Senior pitcher Amber Logemann was also named the MAC Tournament MVP after going 4-0 individually with a domineering 0.65 ERA in 32.1 innings pitched.

Crowell's third season in 2015 saw senior outfielder Tiyona Marshall garner NFCA All-Mideast Region First-Team honors after Marshall set school records in hits (86), runs scored (50) and batting average (.446).

Prior to Miami, Crowell spent six seasons as an assistant coach at Oklahoma State where she primarily worked with the pitchers and catchers. In 2010, both of her pitchers earned spots on the All-Big 12 and NFCA All-Midwest Region teams. In 2011, Crowell coached catcher Courtney Totte to an All-Big 12 first-team appearance and recognition as a Third Team All-American. Crowell helped lead the Cowgirls back to national prominence, as Oklahoma State returned to the Women's College World Series for the first time since 1998 in the 2011 campaign. The coaching staff also hauled in NFCA Midwest Region Coaching Staff of the Year accolades at season's end.

Crowell's previous stop at Syracuse as an assistant coach in 2006 saw the Orange land four players as NFCA All-Region designees and five players secure All-Conference honors. All-American and Big East Player of the Year Alexis Switenko led the way, while Tonye McCorkle, the Big East Co-Rookie of the Year, published a dominant season of her own. Crowell began her collegiate coaching career at Ohio University, where she served as an assistant for two years.

Crowell was a decorated student-athlete at Virginia Tech as a four-year letterwinner and a three-time All-Conference performer for the Hokies. In 2013, Crowell was inducted into the Virginia Tech All-Sports Hall of Fame.

Crowell graduated from Virginia Tech in 2002 with a Bachelor of Science degree in psychology. She earned a Master of Science in recreation and sports sciences from Ohio University in 2005.

NITTANY LION SOFTBALL PARK & BEARD FIELD

A facility years in the making, state-of-the-art and second to none – that is what Nittany Lion Softball Park and Beard Field provides to the Penn State athletic community. With numerous donations and the Penn State Board of Trustees' approval, construction of the \$10.2 million complex was completed in time for the 2011 season. The facility houses the Nittany Lion softball team and allows the program to compete with the best in the country.

The complex features 1,084 permanent seats with fantastic sight lines, accessible seating, concession stands, permanent bathrooms and merchandise areas for fans. On the softball side of things, the field with irrigation, dugouts, batting cages and tunnels, bullpens, scoreboard and a state-of-the-art lighting system make Nittany Lion Softball Park a collegiate softball gem.

The complex consolidates the team's resources into one area with new training rooms, media center, video room, study space, locker rooms and coaches' offices all housed at the softball park. A new press area behind home plate was constructed, which further enhanced the amenities of the stadium.

Key benefactors of the project allowed Nittany Lion Softball Park to take shape and get off the ground. The playing field was named Beard Field in recognition of a generous donation from Lee and William Beard in October 2009. The Penn State locker room was named the Fran Vanden Locker Room, recognizing a gift from George and Frances Vanden. Another major donation came from the James M. and Margaret V. Stine Foundation to name both the Softball Office Complex and Media Center in honor of the Stine Family. Art and Paige Nagle also contributed to the project and one of the assistant coaches' offices dons their names.

Penn State's first game in its new home was March 26, 2011, a thrilling 8-5 victory over Wisconsin. Plenty of firsts were delivered that afternoon and none more memorable than Lisa Akamine's inside-the-park home run as Penn State overcame a three-run deficit to win the inaugural game. For the season, Penn State boasted an 11-8-1 record on Beard Field in its first campaign. It was the first winning season at home since 2007 for the Nittany Lions, which coincided with PSU's last trip to the NCAA Tournament before 2011.

The stadium paid dividends immediately for the Nittany Lion program as Penn State hosted the 2011 NCAA University Park Regional.

The event marked the first time PSU hosted NCAA Softball in 28 years as Oregon, Fordham and Albany competed with Penn State for the right to go to the NCAA Super Regionals. In the three-day event, nearly 1,900 fans streamed through the turnstiles. Oregon would eventually advance, but not before an exciting 16-inning midnight thriller between Penn State and Fordham. The Nittany Lions prevailed, 5-2, in the second-longest game in PSU history.

As if the NCAA event wasn't exciting enough, Penn State then hosted the PIAA Softball Championships. Four games in one day on a sparkling afternoon in mid-June had nearly 3,000 fans attend. The first game of the day featured local powerhouse Philipsburg-Osceola and Brandywine Heights with a standing room-only crowd of 1,800 spectators. The PIAA is still a committed partner of Penn State Athletics, as Nittany Lion Softball Park and Happy Valley Hospitality earned rave reviews. Penn State's University Park campus has played host to the PIAA Championships in every season since Beard Field opened in 2011.

Nittany Lion Softball Park is located on the corner of Park Avenue and University Drive, facing the Bryce Jordan Center, Mount Nittany and Beaver Stadium to the southeast, providing spectacular views and a gorgeous setting for all who attend softball games.

"Bill and I are both very pleased to be a small part of this very impressive facility. For us, the decision to give to this facility, to this program, was easy because one of our big passions is certainly the students of this university, but in particular the softball program. Our passion to help the softball program is because we've watched this program grow. There are some common links to this group [of donors]: Fran and George [Vanden], the Stine Family, Peter and Ann Nagle, Bill and I all have in common a link in believing that this is a program that deserves the typical Penn State, first-class facility to be successful."
