POSTGAME NOTES

Stanford Notes:

- The Cardinal has racked up a 27-4 record competing at Maples Pavilion when hosting NCAA Tournament action.
- Stanford enters the NCAA Tournament draw as the No. 1 seed for the fourth consecutive year and has earned a top seed 10 times in program history.
- Stanford and head coach Tara VanDeveer extend their current win streak to 18 games, which began Jan. 18.
- The Cardinal faced a deficit early on against the Golden Hurricane, down as many as six mid-way through the 1st half. The game experienced five lead changes during the half.
- The Cardinal broke the game open with a 16-5 run in the 2nd half. They shot 65.5 percent in the second half and 52.7 for the entire game.
- Junior F Chiney Ogwumike led the Cardinal in the 1st half recording 14 points along with three rebounds and an assist.
- Ogwumike finished as the Cardinal's top scorer with 29 points, all while going 13 of 18 shooting from the field. This point total marks her 26th 20-point game and her 33rd game that she has led the team in scoring. Additionally, she posted eight rebounds and three assists.
- Sophomore G Amber Orrange also recorded 14 points, six rebounds and three assists.
- Sophomore F Taylor Greenfield and Senior F Joslyn Tinkle each finished with nine points. Tinkle also had three blocks in the game.
- Senior F Mikaela Ruef and Ogwumike led the team in rebounds (8).

Tulsa Notes:

- This game marks the program's second appearance in the NCAA Tournament, with its first coming in 2006 when the 12-seeded Golden Hurricane advanced to the second round (falling to Depaul).
- Tulsa women's basketball faced its 26th game against a Top-25 opponent (AP/USA Today) in school history and remains winless in top-25 opponent games.
- Senior G Taleya Mayberry has started all of her 114 career contests, which is the most by any player in Tulsa women's basketball history.
- Mayberry led the team with 18 points for the game. She also brought in four assists, three rebounds, and three steals playing 38 minutes.
- Mayberry moves into second all-time in Tulsa's program history with career field goals made (596).

- Junior F Loren McDaniel moved into fifth all-time in program history in rebounds (540), recording three in the game.
- Freshman G Ashley Clark moved into fifth all-time in school freshmen single season steals (45). She tied Jillian Robbins' record for most steals in an NCAA Tournament game with four on the day, which was set in 2006 (v. Depaul, 2nd round).
- Freshman G Kelsee Grovey led the Golden Hurricane in points in the 1st half (8). Grovey also finished with 12 points, second to Mayberry.
- Senior F Tiffani Couisnard led the team with nine rebounds while also posting six points and two steals.
