## Post-Game Notes

## Iowa Hawkeyes (20-14)

Iowa is now 17-19 all-time in the NCAA Tournament and 5-10 in second round games.
Junior guard Kachine Alexander scored a career-high 27 points tonight, marking the 22 game of 27 games played that she has scored in double figures. It is also her eighth 20-plus point performance of the season.

Alexander tied her career best three point output of two tonight, going 2-for-6 from behind the line.
Stanford shot 61.1 percent from behind the three-point line, the first time a team has shot over 60 percent from behind the arc since Northwestern shot 60.0 percent on Feb. 21, 2010.

The Hawkeyes will return their entire roster for the 2010-11 season.
Stanford's 97 points scored in tonight's game marks the mot points the Hawkeyes have given up this season.

## Stanford Cardinal (33-1)

Senior guard Rosalyn Gold-Onwude had a career-high 26 points and netted a career-high seven three-pointers tonight in her last game at Maples Pavilion. Six of her seven three-pointers came in the first half.

Stanford is 24-4 in NCAA Tournament games on their home floor and holds a 46 game winning streak at Maples Pavilion.

The Cardinal had five players in double-figures tonight, with junior forward Kayla Pedersen with 11 points, sophomore forward Nnemkadi Ogwumike with 23 points, senior center Jayne Appel with 16 points, junior guard Jeanette Pohlen with 11 points and Gold-Onwude with 26.

The Cardinal won the rebounding margin 41-27, but not one Stanford player had double-figure rebounding numbers.
Pedersen had her team leading $14^{\text {th }}$-straight double-figure scoring game after coming away with 11 points. Appel had her $11^{\text {th }}$-straight with 16 points, Ogwumike had her $11^{\text {th }}$-straight with 23 points, Pohlen had her seventh-straight with 11 points and Gold-Onwude had her fourth-straight with 26 points.

Stanford's 61 points in the first half marks the most points the Cardinal have scored in a half all season. The previous record stood at 59 , which the Cardinal hit twice this season, once in the first half against Gonzaga on Nov. 29 and against Oregon on Feb. 18.
