

Regional Semifinal - Stanford vs. Georgia Spokane Arena – Spokane, Washington Saturday, March 30 POSTGAME NOTES

## **Game Notes**

- Georgia advances to the Elite Eight for the 11th time in school history.
- Stanford leads the all-time series with Georgia 7-4.
- Saturday's matchup marks the seventh NCAA Tournament showdown between the Cardinal and Lady Bulldogs, with Stanford owning a 4-3 advantage.
- Of Georgia's 20 Sweet 16 appearances, the Lady Bulldogs had only previously met Stanford once in the regional semifinal. Stanford defeated Georgia, 73-36, in the 2010 Sacramento Regional Semifinal.
- Pac-12 teams have met SEC foes 39 times in the NCAA Tournament, with the SEC holding a 22-17 advantage.
- The largest margin of victory ever posted when an SEC and Pac-12 school have met in the Tournament is 37 points, posted by the Cardinal over Georgia in their last meeting.
- This is the first time an SEC school has defeated a Pac-12 school in the Sweet 16. SEC and Pac-12 schools have previously met five times in the Sweet 16. All five matchups featured Stanford and were won by Stanford.
- Chiney Ogwumike led her team in points (26), rebounds (12), and assists (two).
  This is the fifth time this season Ogwumike has led the Cardinal in all three categories, but Stanford is 3-2 when she leads in all three categories.
- The Cardinal's loss to Georgia is the team's first in Spokane, Wash. Since the Cardinal first played in Spokane in 2008, the team has gone 6-1 in the city.
- Georgia's two-point victory ties for its smallest margin of victory of the season.
  They also beat South Carolina, 42-40, Jan. 13.
- Shacobia Barbee (12) and Anne Marie Armstrong (10) combined for 22 of Georgia's 39 rebounds. This marks the second time this season multiple Lady Bulldogs have pulled in double-digits rebounds.
- Stanford is 3-3 when being held to less than 60 points.
