STANFORD AND KANSAS CLASH IN SATURDAY SHOWDOWN AT ALLEN FIELDHOUSE

Stanford travels to Lawrence, Kansas to face No. 4/5 Kansas on Saturday at Allen Fieldhouse for its fifth game away from Maples Pavilion in nine contests this season. The Cardinal and Jayhawks meet at 12:30 p.m. PT in the first of a four-game series between the two schools to be played through the 2019-20 season.

JAYHAWK GREAT LEADS THE CARDINAL INTO LAWRENCE

Stanford head coach Jerod Haase returns to Allen Fieldhouse, where he starred as a player for Kansas from 1995-97. Haase earned his Bachelor of Science in business administration in 1997 and his Masters in business in 2000. After playing his freshman season at California, Haase transferred to Kansas where he helped lead the Jayhawks to three consecutive conference titles and still ranks 11th in school history in three-point field goals (156) and steals (174). Haase started 99 of 101 games at Kansas and scored 1,264 points (which now ranks 33rd all-time). While at Kansas, Haase was a candidate for the Naismith and Wooden Awards.

As a senior in 1996-97, Haase started alongside Paul Pierce, Jacque Vaughn, Scot Pollard and Raef LaFrentz as Kansas finished 34-2. He averaged 12.0 points per game despite playing with a broken wrist. As a sophomore, Haase averaged 15.0 points and was named the Big Eight Conference Newcomer of the Year and also tabbed a second-team all-conference selection.

STANFORD AGAINST TOP-FIVE TEAMS

Stanford is 5-12 against Associated Press top-five teams since the 2000-01 season. The Cardinal last defeated an AP top-five team on Jan. 28, 2007, earning a 75-68 victory over No. 3 UCLA at home. Stanford's last road win vs. an AP top-five team was Jan. 10, 2004, when No. 4 Stanford defeated top-ranked Arizona, 82-76, in Tucson. The Cardinal's last neutral-site win vs. an AP top-five opponent was No. 21 Stanford's 64-58 win over top-ranked Kansas in Anaheim. Stanford has played a top-five Kansas team twice during that span, also facing off in the NCAA Tournament during the 2001-02 season. No. 2 Kansas defeated No. 24 Stanford, 86-63, in St. Louis.

BACK-TO-BACK RANKED FOES

Saturday's game at No. 4/5 Kansas following its most recent contest against No. 12/13 Saint Mary's marks Stanford's second consecutive game against a nationally-ranked opponent. The last time the Cardinal faced consecutive nationally-ranked foes came during its 2014 NCAA Tournament run. Stanford defeated No. 17/17 New Mexico (58-53) in the second round on March 21, and No. 10/10 Kansas (60-57) in the third round on March 23. Both games took place in St. Louis.

JEROD HAASE AGAINST RANKED OPPONENTS

Head Coach Jerod Haase owns a 2-9 all-time record against nationally-ranked teams. He played 10 ranked foes as the head coach at UAB, leading the Blazers to a win over No. 9/10 Iowa State (60-59) in the second round of the NCAA Tournament on March 19, 2015 in Louisville, and a victory over No. 16/16 North Carolina (63-59) in Birmingham, on Dec. 1, 2013. Wednesday's game against No. 12/13 Saint Mary's was his first nationally-ranked opponent as head coach at Stanford.

THE CARDINAL'S 22,000-MILE SEASON-OPENING JOURNEY

Saturday's game at Kansas will complete a 22,000-mile journey from campus and back for Stanford during its first nine games. The 2016-17 campaign opened in Shanghai, China, more than 6,000 miles from campus. Last week, Stanford traveled nearly 3,000 miles to Orlando, Florida. The trip to Lawrence is nearly 2,000 miles from Stanford's campus. The three trips will total almost 50 hours in an airplane for the Cardinal.

STRONG START

Stanford has started the season with six wins in its first eight games in three of the past four seasons. The Cardinal has started 6-2 or better seven times in the last decade, highlighted by an 8-0 start in the 2008-09 season. That 2008-09 squad opened the season 10-0.

AGAINST KANSAS

Saturday's Stanford-Kansas game marks the 12th all-time meeting between the two schools. The Jayhawks lead the all-time series, 8-3, however, the Cardinal has won the last two meetings. In the most recent meeting, Stanford defeated Kansas, 60-57, on March 23, 2014, in St. Louis to advance to the NCAA Tournament Sweet 16. Saturday will mark Stanford's sixth trip to Lawrence, Kansas, and first since Dec. 18, 1967. The Cardinal is 0-5 in games played in Lawrence.

AGAINST THE BIG XII

Stanford owns a 14-17 all-time record against current members of the Big 12 Conference. The Cardinal has played Kansas (11) the most of any current team in the league. Stanford's last meeting with a Big 12 opponent was Dec. 19, 2015, as the Cardinal dropped a 75-73 decision to Texas at home.

TRAVIS DOMINANT IN RETURN TO THE COURT

After missing the final 22 games last season, Reid Travis has made a strong impact in his return. He leads the team in scoring (16.3 ppg) and rebounding (9.5 rpg), ranks second in the Pac-12 in offensive rebounding (3.5), fifth in overall rebounding and 11th in scoring. He ranks 40th nationally in rebounding and is 13th in the nation in free throw attempts (62). Travis has posted four of his five career double-doubles in the first eight games of this season.

PICKENS ON TARGET FROM BEYOND THE ARC

Junior Dorian Pickens has posted at least one three-pointer in six of Stanford's seven games, with multiple three-pointers in five contests. After going 0-of-2 from three-point range in the first game of the season vs. Harvard, Pickens posted multiple trifectas in five straight games. He is shooting 43.8 percent from three-point range (12th in Pac-12), with a team-best 14 three-pointers on the year. He registered a season-high four (4-of-6) vs. Colorado State. Pickens connected on three trifectas in the win over Indiana State, including the game-winner with 2.0 seconds left.

PICKENS NAMED TO ADVOCARE INVITE ALL-TOURNAMENT TEAM

After averaging 18.3 points, 5.0 rebounds, 2.0 assists and 1.3 steals in three games in the Advocare Invitational, Dorian Pickens was named to the five-member all-tournament team at the conclusion of the event.

BIGS PROVIDE BOOST

Stanford's group of Reid Travis, Michael Humphrey and Grant Verhoeven have provided a strong presence in the paint for the Cardinal through the season's first eight games. The trio has combined to score 239 points (29.9 ppg) and collect 143 rebounds (17.9 rpg) this season.

The Harvard game was the first time all three recorded double digits in the scoring column in the same game.

FLOOR BURNS STAT COMES TO THE FARM

During his standout collegiate career at Kansas, Jerod Haase was known for his energy and passion on the court, diving for loose balls and taking charges, whatever he could do to help his team win. During his time with the Jayhawks, the "floor burns" stat was created in his honor and is still tracked by the program today. One year, Haase totaled 167. Beginning with the 2016-17 season, Stanford will track floor burns as an official stat throughout the year.

VETERAN GROUP

Boasting one of the most experienced rosters in the Pac-12, four starters - Reid Travis, Michael Humphrey, Marcus Allen, and Christian Sanders - and 10 of the top 11 scorers from last season are back. Including the first eight games of this season, Stanford's roster has combined for 680 appearances.

PICKENS THE WORLD TRAVELER

The 2016 Pac-12 China Game was Dorian Pickens' third international basketball trip in a 15-month span. He has traveled more than 20,000 miles around the globe and spent more than 80 hours on an airplane during his international basketball adventures. In addition to the game in Shanghai, Pickens was selected to play on the Pac-12 All-Star Team that competed in two games against the Australian Olympic Team in Melbourne this past July. He also competed in all six games during Stanford's 2015 tour of Italy. He visited Rome, Florence, Venice and Como during the exhibition tour.

VERHOEVEN AN IMPACT IN THE PAINT

Senior Grant Verhoeven is averaging 6.3 points and 4.0 rebounds in 13.5 minutes per game this season. Along with his stats, Verhoeven has become a force in the paint for each of Stanford's opponents, drawing several charges throughout the year. In the Cardinal's win over Seton Hall last Sunday, he drew five charges and caused six turnovers by the Pirates overall. While his minutes average is relatively the same, he is averaging 3.0 more points and 2.0 more rebounds this season.

CARTWRIGHT, SANDERS RUNNING POINT

The duo of sophomore Robert Cartwright and senior Christian Sanders run the point for the Cardinal. Sanders, who has started all eight games, is averaging 3.6 assists in 19.9 minutes per game. Cartwright, who is back on the court after missing all of last season with an arm injury, is averaging 3.0 assists in 24.3 minutes per contest.

SCHEDULE BREAKDOWN

Stanford's 2016-17 schedule features 15 home games, 17 contests against 2016 NCAA Tournament teams, along with the Pac-12 China game, the Advocare Invitational and trips to Kansas and SMU.

TRAVIS NAMED CAPTAIN

Junior Reid Travis was named the Cardinal's team captain at the beginning of the season. It was the first time in Jerod's Haase's five years as a head coach he has named a team captain.

STANFORD AND KANSAS AGREE ON FOUR-GAME SERIES

Stanford and Kansas have announced an agreement on a four-game series. The Cardinal and Jayhawks will meet each of the next four seasons, beginning with Saturday's trip to Lawrence, Kansas. The two teams will meet Dec. 21, 2017 at Golden 1 Center in Sacramento, before Stanford returns to Lawrence on Dec. 1, 2018, and hosts the Jayhawks at Maples Pavilion Dec. 29, 2019. Stanford Head Coach Jerod Haase was a standout guard for Jayhawks from 1995-97.

HEAD COACHES IN THEIR STANFORD DEBUTS

Stanford's season-opening win at Harvard gave Jerod Haase the win in his coaching debut at Stanford. Head coaches are now 16-2 all-time in their Cardinal debuts.

CARDINAL IN THE NBA

Five former Stanford standouts - Brook Lopez (Brooklyn Nets), Robin Lopez (Chicago Bulls), Dwight Powell (Dallas Mavericks), Josh Huestis (Oklahoma City Thunder) and Anthony Brown (New Orleans Pelicans) - are on NBA rosters. Brook Lopez was the Nets' scoring leader last season, averaging more than 20 points per contest. Powell and Huestis are both in their third year in the NBA. Powell signed a new contract with Dallas prior to the year. Brown signed with New Orleans in November.

STANFORD PART OF STAR-STUDED 2017 PHIL KNIGHT INVITATIONAL

Stanford will compete in the 16-team PK80 - Phil Knight Invitational - over Thanksgiving week of 2017. The event, which will honor Nike co-founder and Stanford alumnus Phil Knight MBA '62 in advance of his 80th birthday, will be contested in Portland, Oregon. Stanford will be joined in the elite 16-team field by Arkansas, Butler, Connecticut, Duke, Florida, Georgetown, Gonzaga, Michigan State, North Carolina, Ohio State, Oklahoma, Oregon, Portland, Portland State and Texas. This highly-anticipated event will be one of the largest regular-season tournaments in college basketball history.

Jerod Haase was named Stanford's Anne and Tony Joseph Director of Men's Basketball by Jaquish & Kenninger Director of Athletics Bernard Muir on March 25, 2016.

Haase, the 18th head coach in the history of the program, arrives on The Farm after four seasons as the head coach at UAB. He led the Blazers to a regular-season Conference USA championship in 2016 and the program's 15th all-time NCAA Tournament appearance in 2015. Haase improved the Blazers' win total every year.

Tabbed the 2016 Gene Bartow Conference USA Coach of the Year, Haase led the Blazers to a 26-5 overall record and a 16-2 conference mark while capturing their first regular-season title since 2011. Along the way, UAB established school records for overall victories (26), conference wins (16), road wins (10) and consecutive victories (14). Also named the 2016 National Association of Basketball Coaches (NABC) All-District Coach, Haase directed the Blazers to an NIT berth for the 12th time in school history. UAB also finished 16-0 at home in 2015-16, extending the nation's fifth-longest home winning streak to 25.

Under Haase's guidance, UAB returned to the NCAA Tournament in 2015, shocking No. 3 seed Iowa State, 60-59, in the second round for the Blazers' first NCAA victory since 2005. UAB reached the Big Dance after claiming the program's first Conference USA Tournament title despite being seeded No. 4. The triumph marked UAB's first league tournament title since 1987, when the Blazers won the Sun Belt Conference Tournament. Haase successfully developed a roster comprised of 10 underclassmen – all players recruited by Haase and his staff – and finished 20-16 overall while guiding the third-youngest team in NCAA Division I.

The Blazers made impressive strides under Haase's leadership during the 2013-14 campaign, finishing 18-13 overall. Of UAB's 18 victories, perhaps none were more impressive than the Blazers' 63-59 home win against No. 16 North Carolina. UAB was ranked in the top five nationally in rebounding throughout the season and finished the year ranked second in the country at 44.5 boards per game.

During Haase's first year with the Blazers in 2012-13, UAB won six of its final nine regular-season Conference USA games.

Prior to arriving at UAB, Haase played for Roy Williams at Kansas and spent 13 years on Williams' staff with the Jayhawks and Tar Heels. A 1997 graduate of Kansas with a degree in business administration, Haase got his start as Kansas' Director of Operations from 1999-2003. During that time, the Jayhawks reached the 2002 Final Four and the national championship game in 2003.

When Williams was named head coach at North Carolina prior to the 2003-04 season, he brought Haase with him as an assistant coach and director of operations, a title Haase held from 2003-09. Haase then served exclusively as an assistant coach during his final three seasons with the Tar Heels.

A native of South Lake Tahoe, Calif., Haase attended California in 1992-93 before transferring to Kansas. He helped lead the Jayhawks to three consecutive conference titles and finished his career ranked in the school's top 10 in assists, three-point field goals and steals. Haase started 99 of 101 games at Kansas and scored 1,264 points, averaging 12.5 per game and reaching double figures 74 times. While at Kansas, Haase was a candidate for the Naismith and Wooden Awards.

As a senior in 1996-97, Haase started alongside Jacque Vaughn, Scot Pollard, Paul Pierce and Raef LaFrentz as Kansas finished with a 34-2 record while averaging 12.0 points per game despite playing with a broken wrist. As a sophomore in 1994-95, Haase averaged 15.0 points and was named the Big Eight Conference Newcomer of the Year and also tabbed a second-team all-conference selection.

Haase was a first-team GTE Academic All-American as a senior, a second-team Academic All-American as a junior and a three-time academic all-conference pick. The Jayhawks' Male Scholar-Athlete of the Year in 1997, Haase later earned a master's degree in business at Kansas in 2000.

Haase started 23 games in 1992-93 as a freshman at California, teaming with Jason Kidd in the backcourt.

Haase, 42, and his wife, the former Mindy Meidinger, have three children: Gavin (10), Garrett (7) and Gabrielle (4).
