NO. 11/10 OREGON UP NEXT

Stanford (11-8, 3-4 Pac-12) carries a three-game winning streak into Saturday's 3 p.m. matchup against No. 11/10 Oregon (17-2, 6-0 Pac-12) in Eugene. The Ducks are riding a program-best 15-game winning streak following Thursday's 86-63 victory over California.

ON VERGE OF RARE CONFERENCE ROAD SWEEP

With a victory on Saturday, Stanford will complete its first sweep of a two-game conference road trip since winning at the Oregon schools in February 2010. During that swing, Stanford began the trip by defeating Oregon 72-65 on Feb. 18 in its final visit to McArthur Court. Two days later, the Cardinal put away Oregon State 65-55 on Feb. 20 in Corvallis to complete the sweep.

STANFORD AGAINST RANKED OPPONENTS

Stanford is 0-5 against nationally-ranked opponents in the Associated Press poll this season and 48-58 against ranked foes since 2000. The Cardinal has come up short this season against No. 12/13 Saint Mary's (66-51), No. 4/5 Kansas (89-74), No. 18/18 Arizona (91-52), No. 25/RV USC (72-56) and No. 4/5 UCLA (89-75). Saturday will represent Stanford's fourth road game against a top-25 opponent. The Cardinal also faced Arizona, USC and UCLA in succession earlier this month, marking the first stretch against three straight top-25 foes since the 2001-02 campaign.

PICKING UP THE SLACK

With junior Reid Travis unavailable due to a right shoulder injury, Stanford has received timely contributions from several players. Junior Michael Humphrey has effectively anchored the frontcourt, averaging 15.2 points and 9.2 rebounds while shooting 46.8 percent (29-62) over the last five games. Over that same stretch, the backcourt has been led by senior Marcus Allen (9.2 points) and sophomore Robert Cartwright (11.0 points, 5.2 assists).

AGAINST OREGON

Stanford leads the all-time series, 92-50. The Ducks have won six of the last 10 meetings, but last year's series resulted in a split with each team defending its home court. Stanford's most recent victory in Eugene came on Jan. 12, 2014, when the Cardinal upset the No. 17/13 Ducks 82-80.

TRAVIS TIMELINE

Junior Reid Travis has missed three of the last five games with a right shoulder injury. After missing both games of Stanford's SoCal road trip, Travis returned to the lineup on Jan. 12 against Washington State, totaling 17 points (8-12 FG) and six boards in 20 minutes. Two days later against Washington, Travis aggravated the injury after playing 12 minutes in the first half and did not return. If Travis misses his second straight game on Saturday, he would have eight full days of rest before Stanford's next game at California on Jan. 29.

STRENGTH OF SCHEDULE

In 19 games, Stanford has played eight teams projected to be in the 2017 NCAA Tournament field, according to ESPN's Joe Lunardi. All eight teams - UCLA (3), Kansas (5), USC (20) Saint Mary's (22), Arizona (27), Miami (31), Seton Hall (35) and SMU (47) - also rank among ESPN's Jay Bilas' list of "Top 68 Teams In The Land." Meanwhile, Stanford's strength of schedule ranks fifth nationally.

PAC-12 HALL OF HONOR

Mike Montgomery will be honored as Stanford's representative for induction into this year's Pac-12 Men's Basketball Hall of Honor. A member of the 2016 National Collegiate Basketball Hall of Fame induction class, Montgomery retired in 2014 after 32 years as a collegiate head coach. Montgomery registered a school-record 393 wins in 18 seasons as head coach at Stanford from 1987-2004, directing the Cardinal to 11 NCAA Tournament appearances and a spot in the 1998 NCAA Final Four.

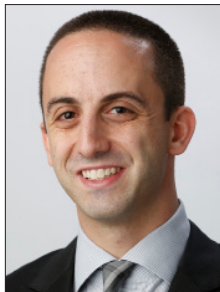

TRAVIS FROM THE LINE

Despite missing three of the last five games with a right shoulder injury, Reid Travis still ranks among the nation's leaders in free throws attempted (29th, 120) and free throws made (69th, 80) as of Jan. 19. The former leads the Pac-12. At Kansas on Dec. 3, he set Stanford single-game records for free throws made (19) and attempted (22), while also breaking the same free throw marks by a Kansas opponent. While Travis is getting to the charity stripe much more, his free throw percentage has also improved from last year.

HUMPHREY CONTROLLING THE GLASS

Michael Humphrey returned to the starting lineup on Jan. 5 against USC, and he has impacted the paint on both ends. Since his return, Humphrey has totaled 46 rebounds over the last five games. Humphrey has played more than 30 minutes in four of the last five contests, after not reaching the 30-minute mark in any of the first 14 games. At UCLA on Jan. 8, Humphrey set a career-high with 27 points and finished one shy of his career-high with 14 rebounds for his first double-double of the season. He followed that with 18 points and a 10-rebound performance in 34 minutes against Washington on Jan. 14.

SHEFFIELD JOINS TOMSIC WITH PERFORMANCE AGAINST ASU

Sophomore Marcus Sheffield poured in a career-high 35 points on 11-of-15 shooting against Arizona State on Dec. 30. Sheffield was just the second underclassman in the history of the program (Ron Tomsic, 39 vs. Bradley and 38 vs. USC in 1952-53) to score 35 or more points in a game. Sheffield was the first Cardinal to record a 30-point game since Chasson Randle collected 35 against Rhode Island on March 22, 2015.

FLOOR BURNS STAT COMES TO THE FARM

During his standout collegiate career at Kansas, Jerod Haase was known for his energy and passion on the court, diving for loose balls and taking charges, whatever he could do to help his team win. During his time with the Jayhawks, the "floor burns" stat was created in his honor and is still tracked by the program today. Haase totaled 167 in the 1996-97 season. This season, Stanford is tracking floor burns as an official stat throughout the year.

PICKENS ON TARGET FROM BEYOND THE ARC

Junior Dorian Pickens has posted at least one three-pointer in 17 games, with multiple three-pointers in nine contests. He is shooting 37.8 percent from three-point range, with a team-best 34 three-pointers (13th in the Pac-12). He registered a career-high seven (7-of-10) vs. Idaho. Pickens connected on the game-winning trifecta against Indiana State with 2.0 seconds left.

CARTWRIGHT'S CAREER NIGHT AT UCLA

Junior Robert Cartwright came off the bench at UCLA to set career-highs in points (18), assists (9), rebounds (5) and minutes (34). His scoring total was topped next time out with 21 against Washington State, while he logged a career-best 35 minutes versus Washington.

THREE-MAN ROTATION AT THE POINT

Stanford has started three different players at the point guard position this season. Senior Christian Sanders started the first 11 games, while redshirt sophomore Robert Cartwright has started six contests and sophomore Marcus Sheffield has started two games at the point. Cartwright is averaging 3.4 assists per game, which ranks ninth in the Pac-12, while Sanders is dishing out 3.2 (11th). Cartwright, who missed all of last season with an arm injury, is averaging 7.3 points in 24.9 minutes per contest. Sheffield is averaging 7.3 ppg in 19.8 minutes per contest.

MARCUS ALLEN WITH BEST OFFENSIVE PERFORMANCE IN RETURN TO LINEUP AT USC

Senior Marcus Allen made the most of his return to the starting lineup at USC on Jan. 5. The Cardinal poured in 13 points, matched his season-high with five rebounds and added two steals in a season-long 37 minutes of action against the Trojans. Allen is averaging 5.3 ppg while dishing out 29 assists.

THE JUNIOR CLASS

Stanford's four-member junior class - Reid Travis, Dorian Pickens, Michael Humphrey and Robert Cartwright - has accounted for 62.6 percent of the team's overall scoring. Travis (16.6 ppg), Pickens (13.1 ppg), Humphrey (9.6 ppg) and Cartwright (7.3 ppg) rank one, two, three and four, respectively, among Stanford's scoring leaders. Cartwright is listed as a sophomore after receiving a medical red-shirt for the 2015-16 season.

VETERAN GROUP

Boasting one of the most experienced rosters in the Pac-12, four starters - Reid Travis, Michael Humphrey, Marcus Allen, and Christian Sanders - and 10 of the top 11 scorers from last season are back. Including the 19 games this season, Stanford's roster has combined for 800 appearances.

VERHOEVEN AN IMPACT IN THE PAINT

Senior Grant Verhoeven, averaging 4.6 points in 14.5 minutes per game this season, has played in every game with eight starts on the season. His defensive presence has been key for the Cardinal, drawing several charges. In the win over Seton Hall, he drew five charges and caused six turnovers.

CARDINAL IN THE NBA

Five former Stanford standouts - Brook Lopez (Brooklyn Nets), Robin Lopez (Chicago Bulls), Dwight Powell (Dallas Mavericks), Chasson Randle (Philadelphia 76ers) and Josh Huestis (Oklahoma City Thunder) - are on NBA rosters. Brook Lopez leads the Nets in scoring (20.1 ppg) and ranks second in rebounding (5.0 rpg). Robin Lopez is second on the Bulls in rebounding (7.1 rpg). Powell is among the Mavericks' scoring leaders at 7.4 ppg. Huestis, currently on assignment from the Thunder, has played 18 games with OKC's NBADL affiliate, Oklahoma City Blue. He is averaging 15.1 ppg and 6.6 rpg with the Blue. The Philadelphia 76ers recently signed Chasson Randle to his second 10-day contract on Jan. 20.

HAASE TIES LEAD TO FUTURE GAMES WITH KANSAS AND NORTH CAROLINA

Stanford has agreed to play both Kansas and North Carolina over the next several years. The Cardinal began a four-game series with Kansas this season and will play North Carolina each of the next two seasons. Stanford and Kansas will play Dec. 21, 2017 at Golden 1 Center in Sacramento, before the Cardinal returns to Lawrence on Dec. 1, 2018, and hosts the Jayhawks at Maples Pavilion Dec. 29, 2019. Jerod Haase was a standout guard for Jayhawks from 1995-97. Stanford will host the Tar Heels on Monday, Nov. 20, 2017 at Maples Pavilion. The second game in the series will be played in Chapel Hill, North Carolina, on Monday, Nov. 12, 2018. After playing three seasons for head coach Roy Williams at Kansas, Haase spent 13 years on Williams' staff with the Jayhawks and Tar Heels.



STAR-STUDED 2017 PHIL KNIGHT INVITATIONAL

Stanford will compete in the prestigious 16-team PK80 – Phil Knight Invitational – over Thanksgiving week of 2017. The event, which will honor Nike co-founder and Stanford alumnus Phil Knight MBA '62 in advance of his 80th birthday, will be contested in Portland, Oregon over Thanksgiving week during the 2017-18 season. Stanford will be joined in the elite 16-team field by Arkansas, Butler, Connecticut, Duke, Florida, Georgetown, Gonzaga, Michigan State, North Carolina, Ohio State, Oklahoma, Oregon, Portland, Portland State and Texas. This highly-anticipated event will be one of the largest regular-season tournaments in college basketball history.

TRAVIS NAMED CAPTAIN

Junior Reid Travis was named the Cardinal's team captain at the beginning of the season. It was the first time in Jerod's Haase's five years as a head coach he has named a team captain.

PICKENS NAMED TO ALL-TOURNAMENT TEAM

After averaging 18.3 points, 5.0 rebounds, 2.0 assists and 1.3 steals in three games in the Advocare Invitational, Dorian Pickens was named to the five-member all-tournament team.

OKPALA AND DA SILVA SIGN WITH CARDINAL

Head Coach Jerod Haase unveiled his first recruiting class with the Cardinal, as standouts Kezie Okpala and Oscar da Silva signed with the program on Nov. 9. Okpala, a 6-8, 185-pound small forward from Esperanza High School in Anaheim, California, and da Silva, a 6-9, 210-pound forward from Ludwig Gymnasium in Munich, Germany, will begin competing for the Cardinal in the 2017-18 season.

HEAD COACHES IN THEIR STANFORD DEBUTS

With Stanford's win over Harvard in the season opener in Shanghai, China, Jerod Haase posted a victory in his first game as the head coach of the Cardinal. Head coaches are now 16-2 all-time in their Stanford debuts.

PICKENS THE WORLD TRAVELER

The 2016 Pac-12 China Game was Dorian Pickens' third international basketball trip in a 15-month span. He has traveled more than 20,000 miles around the globe and spent more than 80 hours on an airplane during his international basketball adventures. In addition to the game in Shanghai, Pickens was selected to play on the Pac-12 All-Star Team that competed in two games against the Australian Olympic Team in Melbourne this past July. He also competed in all six games during Stanford's 2015 tour of Italy. He visited Rome, Florence, Venice and Como during the exhibition tour.

INTERNATIONAL COMPETITION

Stanford's trip to China was the third international trip during the regular season in the 102-year history of the men's basketball program. The Cardinal now owns a 3-3 all-time record in regular-season games played outside of United States territories following last week's win over Harvard in Shanghai. Stanford also competed in Cancun, Mexico, in 2009 and Paradise Island, Bahamas in 2012.

THE 25,000-MILE SEASON-OPENING JOURNEY

The Cardinal completed a whirlwind 25,000-mile journey across the globe during its first 11 games. The 2016-17 campaign opened in Shanghai, China on Nov. 11. Following its trip to China, Stanford played games in Orlando, Florida, Lawrence, Kansas and Dallas, Texas. The four trips, which included six games, totaled 25,598 miles and more than 56 hours on an airplane.

Jerod Haase was named Stanford's Anne and Tony Joseph Director of Men's Basketball by Jaquish & Kenninger Director of Athletics Bernard Muir on March 25, 2016.

Haase, the 18th head coach in the history of the program, arrives on The Farm after four seasons as the head coach at UAB. He led the Blazers to a regular-season Conference USA championship in 2016 and the program's 15th all-time NCAA Tournament appearance in 2015. Haase improved the Blazers' win total every year.

Tabbed the 2016 Gene Bartow Conference USA Coach of the Year, Haase led the Blazers to a 26-7 overall record and a 16-2 conference mark while capturing their first regular-season title since 2011. Along the way, UAB established school records for overall victories (26), conference wins (16), road wins (10) and consecutive victories (14). Also named the 2016 National Association of Basketball Coaches (NABC) All-District Coach, Haase directed the Blazers to an NIT berth for the 12th time in school history. UAB also finished 16-0 at home in 2015-16, extending the nation's fifth-longest home winning streak to 25.

Under Haase's guidance, UAB returned to the NCAA Tournament in 2015, shocking No. 3 seed Iowa State, 60-59, in the second round for the Blazers' first NCAA victory since 2005. UAB reached the Big Dance after claiming the program's first Conference USA Tournament title despite being seeded No. 4. The triumph marked UAB's first league tournament title since 1987, when the Blazers won the Sun Belt Conference Tournament. Haase successfully developed a roster comprised of 10 underclassmen – all players recruited by Haase and his staff – and finished 20-16 overall while guiding the third-youngest team in NCAA Division I.

The Blazers made impressive strides under Haase's leadership during the 2013-14 campaign, finishing 18-13 overall. Of UAB's 18 victories, perhaps none were more impressive than the Blazers' 63-59 home win against No. 16 North Carolina. UAB was ranked in the top five nationally in rebounding throughout the season and finished the year ranked second in the country at 44.5 boards per game.

During Haase's first year with the Blazers in 2012-13, UAB won six of its final nine regular-season Conference USA games.

Prior to arriving at UAB, Haase played for Roy Williams at Kansas and spent 13 years on Williams' staff with the Jayhawks and Tar Heels. A 1997 graduate of Kansas with a degree in business administration, Haase got his start as Kansas' Director of Operations from 1999-2003. During that time, the Jayhawks reached the 2002 Final Four and the national championship game in 2003.

When Williams was named head coach at North Carolina prior to the 2003-04 season, he brought Haase with him as an assistant coach and director of operations, a title Haase held from 2003-09. Haase then served exclusively as an assistant coach during his final three seasons with the Tar Heels.

A native of South Lake Tahoe, Calif., Haase attended California in 1992-93 before transferring to Kansas. He helped lead the Jayhawks to three consecutive conference titles and finished his career ranked in the school's top 10 in assists, three-point field goals and steals. Haase started 99 of 101 games at Kansas and scored 1,264 points, averaging 12.5 per game and reaching double figures 74 times. While at Kansas, Haase was a candidate for the Naismith and Wooden Awards.

As a senior in 1996-97, Haase started alongside Jacque Vaughn, Scot Pollard, Paul Pierce and Raef LaFrentz as Kansas finished with a 34-2 record while averaging 12.0 points per game despite playing with a broken wrist. As a sophomore in 1994-95, Haase averaged 15.0 points and was named the Big Eight Conference Newcomer of the Year and also tabbed a second-team all-conference selection.

Haase was a first-team GTE Academic All-American as a senior, a second-team Academic All-American as a junior and a three-time academic all-conference pick. The Jayhawks' Male Scholar-Athlete of the Year in 1997, Haase later earned a master's degree in business at Kansas in 2000.

Haase started 23 games in 1992-93 as a freshman at California, teaming with Jason Kidd in the backcourt.

Haase, 42, and his wife, the former Mindy Meidinger, have three children: Gavin (10), Garrett (7) and Gabrielle (4).
