STANFORD CONTINUES SOCIAL SWING IN WESTWOOD SUNDAY EVENING

Stanford will close its five-day trip to Los Angeles on Sunday with a 5 p.m. PT matchup against UCLA at Pauley Pavilion. After not traveling to LA last year due to Pac-12 Conference scheduling for the first time since the 1955-56 season, the Cardinal opened its Southern California trip this year with a setback to USC on Thursday.

The Cardinal, 8-7 overall and 0-3 in the Pac-12, will face a UCLA team that is 15-1 on the year and 2-1 in the Pac-12 following its 81-71 victory over California on Thursday. The Bruins, 9-0 at home this season, are ranked No. 4/5 nationally.

In its lone meeting with UCLA last season, Stanford earned a 79-70 win over the Bruins at Maples Pavilion. Michael Humphrey led the Cardinal with 24 points and nine rebounds and Dorian Pickens added 16 points in last season's win.

THREE CONSECUTIVE RANKED FOES FOR FIRST TIME IN 15 YEARS

Stanford's current stretch of games has the Cardinal facing three consecutive teams ranked in the Associated Press national poll. The Cardinal, which dropped decisions to No. 18 Arizona last Sunday and No. 25 USC on Thursday, will face No. 4 UCLA on Sunday in Los Angeles. It is the first time Stanford will play nationally-ranked teams in three consecutive games since the 2001-02 season, when ironically the Cardinal faced the same three teams. Stanford lost to No. 20 USC and No. 25 UCLA at home, before winning at No. 14 Arizona.

JEROD HAASE FAMILIAR WITH UCLA

While Stanford head coach Jerod Haase faced UCLA as the head coach of UAB twice during the 2014-15 season, it was his one game as a player against the Bruins that stands out the most.

As a freshman playing for California, Haase scored 16 points, five assists and a steal in 30 minutes to help guide the Golden Bears to a 104-82 victory over No. 23 UCLA on Jan. 24, 1993. The 22-point defeat was the Bruins' worst loss in Pauley Pavilion at the time. It was later eclipsed by Arizona (35-point win) during the 2002-03 season.

STRENGTH OF SCHEDULE

In its first 15 games, Stanford played seven teams projected to be in the 2017 NCAA Tournament field, according to ESPN's Joe Lunardi. All seven of those teams - Kansas (5), USC (20) Saint Mary's (22), Arizona (27), Miami (31), Seton Hall (35) and SMU (47) - also rank among ESPN analyst Jay Bilas' list of "Top 68 Teams In The Land." The Cardinal played only two of these teams (Arizona and Saint Mary's) at home. Stanford's strength of schedule as of Jan. 7 ranks sixth nationally.

STANFORD AGAINST RANKED OPPONENTS

Stanford is 0-4 against nationally-ranked opponents in the Associated Press poll this season and 48-57 against ranked foes since 2000. Sunday marks the Cardinal's third consecutive nationally-ranked opponent, following setbacks to No. 25 USC and No. 18 Arizona. Earlier in the season, Stanford played back-to-back ranked foes in a home loss to No. 12 Saint Mary's and a road defeat to No. 4 Kansas.

STANFORD AGAINST TOP-FIVE TEAMS

Stanford is 5-13 against Associated Press top-five teams since the 2000-01 season. The Cardinal last defeated an AP top-five team on Jan. 28, 2007, earning a 75-68 victory over No. 3 UCLA at home. Stanford's last road win vs. an AP top-five team was Jan. 10, 2004, when No. 4 Stanford defeated top-ranked Arizona, 82-76, in Tucson. The Cardinal's last neutral-site win vs. an AP top-five opponent was No. 21 Stanford's 64-58 win over top-ranked Kansas in Anaheim. Sunday marks the Cardinal's second top-five opponent this season. Stanford dropped an 89-74 decision to No. 4 Kansas in Lawrence on Dec. 3.

JEROD HAASE AGAINST RANKED OPPONENTS

Head Coach Jerod Haase owns a 2-12 all-time record against nationally-ranked teams. He played 10 ranked foes as the head coach at UAB, leading the Blazers to a win over No. 9/10 Iowa State (60-59) in the second round of the NCAA Tournament on March 19, 2015 in Louisville, and a victory over No. 16/16 North Carolina (63-59) in Birmingham, on Dec. 1, 2013.

AGAINST UCLA

UCLA owns a 142-93 advantage in the all-time series between the two teams. The Cardinal is coming off a 79-70 win over the Bruins at Maples Pavilion last season. UCLA has won three of the last four games in the all-time series. Stanford has dropped its last 10 games to UCLA in Los Angeles. The Cardinal's last win against the Bruins at Pauley Pavilion came on Jan. 20, 2005, when Dan Grunfeld led four Stanford players in double figures with 25 points in a 75-64 win over UCLA.

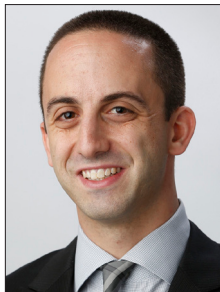

TRAVIS' INJURY IMPACT

Forward Reid Travis sustained a right shoulder injury during practice and is out of action indefinitely. The junior has been the Cardinal's leader and has been among the Pac-12 leaders in scoring and rebounding all season. Through 14 games, Travis accounted for 25.3 percent (245-of-967) of the Cardinal's scoring and 27.0 percent (134-of-497) of Stanford's rebounding total.

TRAVIS FROM THE LINE

Prior to his injury, Reid Travis ranked fourth in the nation in free throws attempted (116) and 20th in the country in free throws made (79) as of Jan. 3. At Kansas on Dec. 3, he set Stanford single-game records for free throws made (19) and attempted (22), while also breaking the same free throw marks by a Kansas opponent. While Travis is getting to the charity stripe much more, his free throw percentage has also improved from last year.

SHEFFIELD'S CAREER NIGHT AGAINST ARIZONA STATE

Sophomore Marcus Sheffield poured in a career-high 35 points on 11-of-15 shooting against Arizona State. He was just the second underclassman in the history of the program (Ron Tomsic, 39 vs. Bradley and 38 vs. USC in 1952-53) to score 35 or more points in a game. Sheffield was the first Cardinal to record a 30-point game since Chasson Randle collected 35 against Rhode Island in the 2014-15 season. Sheffield has started each of the last four games.

PICKENS ON TARGET FROM BEYOND THE ARC

Junior Dorian Pickens has posted at least one three-pointer in 13 games, with multiple three-pointers in eight contests. He is shooting 41.4 percent from three-point range, with a team-best 29 three-pointers (12th in the Pac-12). He registered a career-high seven (7-of-10) against Idaho. Pickens connected on the game-winning trifecta against Indiana State with 2.0 seconds left.

PICKENS NAMED TO ADVOCARE INVITE ALL-TOURNAMENT TEAM

After averaging 18.3 points, 5.0 rebounds, 2.0 assists and 1.3 steals in three games in the Advocare Invitational, Dorian Pickens was named to the five-member all-tournament team.

MARCUS ALLEN WITH BEST OFFENSIVE PERFORMANCE IN RETURN TO LINEUP AT USC

Senior guard Marcus Allen made the most of his return to the starting lineup in Stanford's last game at USC on Thursday. The Cardinal poured in a season-high 13 points, matched his season-high with five rebounds and added two steals in a season-long 37 minutes of action against the Trojans. Allen, averaging 4.5 ppg on the year, has totaled 19 points, seven rebounds and four steals in his last two games against USC and Arizona.

THE JUNIOR CLASS

Stanford's four-member junior class - Reid Travis, Dorian Pickens, Michael Humphrey and Robert Cartwright - has accounted for 61.8 percent (632-of-1023) of the scoring this season. Travis (17.5 ppg), Pickens (13.2 ppg), Humphrey (7.4 ppg) and Cartwright (5.7 ppg) rank one, two, four and five, respectively, among Stanford's scoring leaders. Cartwright is listed as a sophomore after receiving a medical redshirt for the 2015-16 season.

RUNNING POINT BY COMMITTEE

Stanford has started three different players at the point guard position this season. Senior Christian Sanders started the first 11 games, while redshirt sophomore Robert Cartwright started three contests and sophomore Marcus Sheffield started his first game at the point at USC on Thursday. Sanders ranks eighth in the Pac-12 with an average of 3.8 assists in 18.3 minutes per game. Cartwright, who missed all of last season with an arm injury, is averaging 5.7 points and 2.8 assists in 23.4 minutes per contest. Sheffield, who has started the last four games, opened the USC game as the starting point guard for the first time this season.

VETERAN GROUP

Boasting one of the most experienced rosters in the Pac-12, four starters - Reid Travis, Michael Humphrey, Marcus Allen, and Christian Sanders - and 10 of the top 11 scorers from last season are back. Including the first 15 games of this season, Stanford's roster has combined for 763 appearances.

VERHOEVEN AN IMPACT IN THE PAINT

Senior Grant Verhoeven, averaging 4.8 points in 14.1 minutes per game this season, was inserted into the starting lineup six games ago. His defensive presence has been key for the Cardinal, drawing several charges. In the win over Seton Hall, he drew five charges and caused six turnovers.

TRAVIS NAMED CAPTAIN

Junior Reid Travis was named the Cardinal's team captain at the beginning of the season. It was the first time in Jerod's Haase's five years as a head coach he has named a team captain.



CARDINAL IN THE NBA

Four former Stanford standouts – Brook Lopez (Brooklyn Nets), Robin Lopez (Chicago Bulls), Dwight Powell (Dallas Mavericks) and Josh Huestis (Oklahoma City Thunder) – are on NBA rosters. Brook Lopez leads the Nets in scoring (19.9 ppg) and ranks second in rebounding (5.2 rpg). Robin Lopez leads the Bulls in rebounding (7.2 rpg). Powell is among the Mavericks' scoring leaders at 7.7 ppg. Huestis, currently on assignment from the Thunder, has played 12 games with OKC's NBADL affiliate, Oklahoma City Blue. He is averaging 11.5 ppg and 5.7 rpg with the Blue.

HAASE TIES LEAD TO FUTURE GAMES WITH KANSAS AND NORTH CAROLINA

Stanford has agreed to play both Kansas and North Carolina over the next several years. The Cardinal began a four-game series with Kansas this season and will play North Carolina each of the next two seasons. Stanford and Kansas will play Dec. 21, 2017 at Golden 1 Center in Sacramento, before the Cardinal returns to Lawrence on Dec. 1, 2018, and hosts the Jayhawks at Maples Pavilion Dec. 29, 2019. Jerod Haase was a standout guard for Jayhawks from 1995-97. Stanford will host the Tar Heels on Monday, Nov. 20, 2017 at Maples Pavilion. The second game in the series will be played in Chapel Hill, North Carolina, on Monday, Nov. 12, 2018. After playing three seasons for head coach Roy Williams at Kansas, Haase spent 13 years on Williams' staff with the Jayhawks and Tar Heels.

STANFORD PART OF STAR-STUDED 2017 PHIL KNIGHT INVITATIONAL

Stanford will compete in the prestigious 16-team PK80 – Phil Knight Invitational – over Thanksgiving week of 2017. The event, which will honor Nike co-founder and Stanford alumnus Phil Knight MBA '62 in advance of his 80th birthday, will be contested in Portland, Oregon over Thanksgiving week during the 2017-18 season. Stanford will be joined in the elite 16-team field by Arkansas, Butler, Connecticut, Duke, Florida, Georgetown, Gonzaga, Michigan State, North Carolina, Ohio State, Oklahoma, Oregon, Portland, Portland State and Texas. This highly-anticipated event will be one of the largest regular-season tournaments in college basketball history.

OKPALA AND DA SILVA SIGN WITH CARDINAL

Head Coach Jerod Haase unveiled his first recruiting class with the Cardinal, as standouts Kezie Okpala and Oscar da Silva signed with the program on Nov. 9. Okpala, a 6-8, 185-pound small forward from Esperanza High School in Anaheim, California, and da Silva, a 6-9, 210-pound forward from Ludwig Gymnasium in Munich, Germany, will begin competing for the Cardinal in the 2017-18 season.

HEAD COACHES IN THEIR STANFORD DEBUTS

With Stanford's win over Harvard in the season opener in Shanghai, China, Jerod Haase posted a victory in his first game as the head coach of the Cardinal. Head Coaches are now 16-2 all-time in their Stanford debuts.

PICKENS THE WORLD TRAVELER

The 2016 Pac-12 China Game was Dorian Pickens' third international basketball trip in a 15-month span. He has traveled more than 20,000 miles around the globe and spent more than 80 hours on an airplane during his international basketball adventures. In addition to the game in Shanghai, Pickens was selected to play on the Pac-12 All-Star Team that competed in two games against the Australian Olympic Team in Melbourne this past July. He also competed in all six games during Stanford's 2015 tour of Italy. He visited Rome, Florence, Venice and Como during the exhibition tour.

INTERNATIONAL COMPETITION

Stanford's trip to China was the third international trip during the regular season in the 102-year history of the men's basketball program. The Cardinal now owns a 3-3 all-time record in regular-season games played outside of United States territories following last week's win over Harvard in Shanghai. Stanford also competed in Cancun, Mexico, in 2009 and Paradise Island, Bahamas in 2012.

THE 25,000-MILE SEASON-OPENING JOURNEY

The Cardinal completed a whirlwind 25,000-mile journey across the globe during its first 11 games. The 2016-17 campaign opened in Shanghai, China on Nov. 11. Following its trip to China, Stanford played games in Orlando, Florida, Lawrence, Kansas and Dallas Texas. The four trips, which included six games, totaled 25,598 miles and more than 56 hours on an airplane.

Jerod Haase was named Stanford's Anne and Tony Joseph Director of Men's Basketball by Jaquish & Kenninger Director of Athletics Bernard Muir on March 25, 2016.

Haase, the 18th head coach in the history of the program, arrives on The Farm after four seasons as the head coach at UAB. He led the Blazers to a regular-season Conference USA championship in 2016 and the program's 15th all-time NCAA Tournament appearance in 2015. Haase improved the Blazers' win total every year.

Tabbed the 2016 Gene Bartow Conference USA Coach of the Year, Haase led the Blazers to a 26-7 overall record and a 16-2 conference mark while capturing their first regular-season title since 2011. Along the way, UAB established school records for overall victories (26), conference wins (16), road wins (10) and consecutive victories (14). Also named the 2016 National Association of Basketball Coaches (NABC) All-District Coach, Haase directed the Blazers to an NIT berth for the 12th time in school history. UAB also finished 16-0 at home in 2015-16, extending the nation's fifth-longest home winning streak to 25.

Under Haase's guidance, UAB returned to the NCAA Tournament in 2015, shocking No. 3 seed Iowa State, 60-59, in the second round for the Blazers' first NCAA victory since 2005. UAB reached the Big Dance after claiming the program's first Conference USA Tournament title despite being seeded No. 4. The triumph marked UAB's first league tournament title since 1987, when the Blazers won the Sun Belt Conference Tournament. Haase successfully developed a roster comprised of 10 underclassmen – all players recruited by Haase and his staff – and finished 20-16 overall while guiding the third-youngest team in NCAA Division I.

The Blazers made impressive strides under Haase's leadership during the 2013-14 campaign, finishing 18-13 overall. Of UAB's 18 victories, perhaps none were more impressive than the Blazers' 63-59 home win against No. 16 North Carolina. UAB was ranked in the top five nationally in rebounding throughout the season and finished the year ranked second in the country at 44.5 boards per game.

During Haase's first year with the Blazers in 2012-13, UAB won six of its final nine regular-season Conference USA games.

Prior to arriving at UAB, Haase played for Roy Williams at Kansas and spent 13 years on Williams' staff with the Jayhawks and Tar Heels. A 1997 graduate of Kansas with a degree in business administration, Haase got his start as Kansas' Director of Operations from 1999-2003. During that time, the Jayhawks reached the 2002 Final Four and the national championship game in 2003.

When Williams was named head coach at North Carolina prior to the 2003-04 season, he brought Haase with him as an assistant coach and director of operations, a title Haase held from 2003-09. Haase then served exclusively as an assistant coach during his final three seasons with the Tar Heels.

A native of South Lake Tahoe, Calif., Haase attended California in 1992-93 before transferring to Kansas. He helped lead the Jayhawks to three consecutive conference titles and finished his career ranked in the school's top 10 in assists, three-point field goals and steals. Haase started 99 of 101 games at Kansas and scored 1,264 points, averaging 12.5 per game and reaching double figures 74 times. While at Kansas, Haase was a candidate for the Naismith and Wooden Awards.

As a senior in 1996-97, Haase started alongside Jacque Vaughn, Scot Pollard, Paul Pierce and Raef LaFrentz as Kansas finished with a 34-2 record while averaging 12.0 points per game despite playing with a broken wrist. As a sophomore in 1994-95, Haase averaged 15.0 points and was named the Big Eight Conference Newcomer of the Year and also tabbed a second-team all-conference selection.

Haase was a first-team GTE Academic All-American as a senior, a second-team Academic All-American as a junior and a three-time academic all-conference pick. The Jayhawks' Male Scholar-Athlete of the Year in 1997, Haase later earned a master's degree in business at Kansas in 2000.

Haase started 23 games in 1992-93 as a freshman at California, teaming with Jason Kidd in the backcourt.

Haase, 42, and his wife, the former Mindy Meidinger, have three children: Gavin (10), Garrett (7) and Gabrielle (4).
