HEADED BACK TO THE GRAND CANYON STATE

After Stanford's battle with No. 9 Arizona that went down to the final minute Wednesday in Tucson, the Cardinal returned home to The Farm for classes and exams. Friday, Stanford traveled back to the Grand Canyon state for its Saturday matchup with Arizona State in Tempe.

R2T2 IS ONE OF THE PAC-12'S BEST

Reid Travis "R2T2" is among the conference leaders in many categories. The Cardinal's scoring and rebounding leader, who missed four games in a six game span with a shoulder injury, returned four games ago. In those four games vs. Cal, Colorado, Utah and Arizona, he is averaging 19.5 ppg and 6.5 rpg. He posted his seventh double-double of the season Wednesday at Arizona with 26 points and 11 rebounds. Travis and UCLA's TJ Leaf are the only Pac-12 players to rank in the top-seven in the league in scoring, rebounding and field goal percentage.

HUMPHREY AND PICKENS RETURN TO THEIR ROOTS

In Saturday's contest, Stanford juniors Michael Humphrey and Dorian Pickens will play just minutes from where they grew up. Pickens is a product of Pinnacle High School, while Humphrey attended Sunnyslope High School. Humphrey was also the starting quarterback for the Vikings football team. Both Phoenix natives starred for the Cardinal at Wells Fargo Arena last season, with Pickens posting a game-high 19 points (four three-pointers) and Humphrey recording 15 points and six rebounds. As freshmen, both Humphrey and Pickens played limited minutes in the game in Tempe. Humphrey converted his lone field goal attempt in that March 6, 2015 contest, but was forced to leave the game with an ankle injury after just four minutes.

AGAINST ARIZONA STATE

Stanford leads the all-time series against Arizona State, 48-35. The Cardinal has captured 10 of the last 15 games against the Sun Devils. Stanford dropped a 98-93 decision to ASU in its Pac-12 season opener on Dec. 30. The Cardinal has lost its last three games against the Sun Devils at Wells Fargo Arena. Stanford last won in Tempe on Feb. 9, 2013. Senior Christian Sanders is the lone Cardinal to have played in a win over ASU in Tempe, scoring three points in nine minutes.

BATTLE FOR CONFERENCE POSITIONING

The Cardinal and Sun Devils are one of four teams (Colorado, Washington State) tied for seventh place in the Pac-12 with identical 4-8 conference marks. With ASU having earned a 98-93 in the first meeting in January at Maples Pavilion, Stanford will try and even the season series as the two schools look to advance in the league standings with six games left in the regular season.

TRAVIS, HUMPHREY ANCHORING POST

Juniors Reid Travis and Michael Humphrey have combined to average 38.6 percent (26.5 out of 68.7) of the team's scoring and 43.3 percent (14.8 out of 34.2) of the team's rebounding average. The duo leads the Cardinal in conference play, with Travis averaging 16.4 ppg and 6.4 rpg and Humphrey contributing 11.3 ppg (third on the team) and a team-best 8.3 ppg.

GETTING DEFENSIVE

Stanford has forced 53 turnovers over its last three games against Colorado (23), Utah (17) and Arizona (13). Led by senior Marcus Allen's eight steals, the Cardinal has recorded 28 steals in the three contests. The 40 combined forced turnovers against Colorado and Utah was the most in a two-game stretch in conference play in more than 12 years, since Stanford forced 41 combined miscues against USC (21 turnovers - Jan. 22, 2005) and UCLA (20 turnovers - Jan. 20, 2005). Stanford ranks second in the Pac-12 in steals (6.6 spg).

STRENGTH OF SCHEDULE

Stanford has played the third toughest schedule in the nation, according to ESPN's daily strength of schedule rankings as of Feb. 10. The Cardinal has played seven teams in the top-25 of the RPI as of Feb. 10. Stanford checks in at No. 66 in the latest edition of the NCAA's RPI. Look no further than a daunting nonconference slate that featured the likes of Miami, Seton Hall, No. 12/13 Saint Mary's, No. 4/5 Kansas and SMU. Earlier in conference play, Stanford also faced No. 18/18 Arizona, No. 25/RV USC and No. 4/5 UCLA in succession, representing its first three-game stretch against top-25 foes since 2002.

MARCUS ALLEN HEATING UP OVER LAST SEVEN GAMES

Marcus Allen has been one of the Cardinal's leaders on both ends of the floor over the last seven games. He is averaging 11.4 ppg (second on team), while leading the team in steals (15) and ranking second in assists (18) during this span. After averaging 4.4 ppg in his first 17 contests, Allen is averaging more than seven points better per game in his last seven contests.

HUMPHREY CONTROLLING THE GLASS

Michael Humphrey has totaled 81 rebounds (9.0 rpg) over the last nine games. He ranks seventh in the Pac-12 in rebounding overall at 8.3 rpg during league play. Humphrey has played more than 30 minutes in seven of the last 10 contests, after not reaching the 30-minute mark in any of the first 14 games. At UCLA on Jan. 8, Humphrey set a career-high with 27 points and finished one shy of his career-best with 14 rebounds for his first double-double of the year. He followed that with 18 points and a 10-rebound performance in 34 minutes against Washington Jan. 14, and was one rebound shy of a double-double at California. The junior also fell two points shy of a double-double last time out with 10 rebounds and eight points at Arizona.

PICKENS ON TARGET FROM BEYOND THE ARC

Junior Dorian Pickens has posted at least one three-pointer in 21 games, with multiple three-pointers in 13 contests. He has totaled nine three-pointers in his last three games. Pickens is shooting 37.5 percent from three-point range, with a team-best 45 three-pointers. He registered a career-high seven (7-of-10) vs. Idaho. Pickens connected on the game-winning trifecta against Indiana State with 2.0 seconds left.

THE JUNIOR CLASS

Stanford's four-member junior class - Reid Travis, Dorian Pickens, Michael Humphrey and Robert Cartwright - has accounted for 67.2 percent of the team's overall scoring. Travis (17.2 ppg), Pickens (12.3 ppg), Humphrey (9.3 ppg) and Cartwright (7.4 ppg) are Stanford's top four scoring leaders. Cartwright is listed as a sophomore after receiving a medical redshirt for the 2015-16 season. In Wednesday's game at Arizona, the group combined for 48 of Stanford's 67 points.

CARTWRIGHT ON POINT

Junior Robert Cartwright has taken over as the Cardinal's starting point guard, starting the last eight contests. He ranks eighth in Pac-12 in assists (4.1) during conference play, and seventh in the conference in assist-to-turnover ratio (2.1) overall.

FLOOR BURNS STAT COMES TO THE FARM

During his standout collegiate career at Kansas, Jerod Haase was known for his energy and passion on the court, diving for loose balls and taking charges, whatever he could do to help his team win. During his time with the Jayhawks, the "floor burns" stat was created in his honor and is still tracked by the program. Haase totaled 167 in the 1996-97 season. This season, Stanford is tracking floor burns as an official stat throughout the year.

TRAVIS TIMELINE

Junior Reid Travis returned to the lineup four games ago at California, leading the team with 17 points and five rebounds after having missed four of the previous six games with a right shoulder injury. After totaling nine points and five rebounds against Colorado last week, the forward posted 26 points, five rebounds and three steals in 26 minutes against Utah last Saturday. He followed that up with 26 points and 11 rebounds at Arizona on Wednesday. Travis sat out both games of Stanford's Southern California trip before returning to the lineup Jan. 12 against Washington State, totaling 17 points and six boards in 20 minutes. Two days later against Washington, Travis aggravated the injury after playing 12 minutes in the first half and did not return. Travis did not play in road games at Oregon State and Oregon.

TRAVIS FROM THE LINE

Despite missing four of the last 10 games with a right shoulder injury, Reid Travis still ranks among the nation's leaders in free throws attempted (93rd, 137) and free throws made (151st, 92) as of Feb. 10. At Kansas on Dec. 3, he set Stanford single-game records for free throws made (19) and attempted (22), while also breaking the same free throw marks by a Kansas opponent. While Travis is getting to the charity stripe much more, his free throw percentage has also improved from last year.

SHEFFIELD JOINS TOMSIC WITH PERFORMANCE LAST TIME AGAINST ASU

Sophomore Marcus Sheffield poured in a career-high 35 points on 11-of-15 shooting in Stanford's last matchup with Arizona State, on Dec. 30. Sheffield was just the second underclassman in the history of the program (Ron Tomsic, 39 vs. Bradley and 38 vs. USC in 1952-53) to score 35 or more points in a game. Sheffield was the first Cardinal to record a 30-point game since Chasson Randle collected 35 against Rhode Island on March 22, 2015.

PAC-12 HALL OF HONOR

Mike Montgomery will be honored as Stanford's representative for induction into this year's Pac-12 Men's Basketball Hall of Honor. A member of the 2016 National Collegiate Basketball Hall of Fame induction class, Montgomery retired in 2014 after 32 years as a collegiate head coach. Montgomery registered a school-record 393 wins in 18 seasons as head coach at Stanford from 1987-2004, directing the Cardinal to 11 NCAA Tournament appearances and a spot in the 1998 NCAA Final Four.

VERHOEVEN AN IMPACT IN THE PAINT

Senior Grant Verhoeven, averaging 4.2 points in 14.3 minutes per game this season, has played in every game with nine starts in 2016-17. His defensive presence has been key for the Cardinal, drawing several charges. In the win over Seton Hall, he drew five charges and caused six turnovers. Verhoeven averaged 7.0 points and 5.5 rebounds in two starts at Oregon State and Oregon.



CARDINAL IN THE NBA

Five former Stanford standouts – Brook Lopez (Brooklyn Nets), Robin Lopez (Chicago Bulls), Dwight Powell (Dallas Mavericks), Chasson Randle (Philadelphia 76ers) and Josh Huestis (Oklahoma City Thunder) – are on NBA rosters. Brook Lopez leads the Nets in scoring (20.3 ppg) and ranks second in rebounding (5.2 rpg). Robin Lopez is second on the Bulls in rebounding (6.9 rpg). Powell is averaging 7.2 ppg off the bench for the Mavericks. The Philadelphia 76ers recently signed Chasson Randle to a three-year contract on Monday.

HAASE TIES LEAD TO FUTURE GAMES WITH KANSAS AND NORTH CAROLINA

Stanford has agreed to play both Kansas and North Carolina over the next several years. The Cardinal began a four-game series with Kansas this season and will play North Carolina each of the next two seasons. Stanford and Kansas will play Dec. 21, 2017 at Golden 1 Center in Sacramento, before the Cardinal returns to Lawrence on Dec. 1, 2018, and hosts the Jayhawks at Maples Pavilion Dec. 29, 2019. Jerod Haase was a standout guard for Jayhawks from 1995-97. Stanford will host the Tar Heels on Monday, Nov. 20, 2017 at Maples Pavilion. The second game in the series will be played in Chapel Hill, North Carolina, on Monday, Nov. 12, 2018. After playing three seasons for head coach Roy Williams at Kansas, Haase spent 13 years on Williams' staff with the Jayhawks and Tar Heels.

STAR-STUDED 2017 PHIL KNIGHT INVITATIONAL

Stanford will compete in the prestigious 16-team PK80 – Phil Knight Invitational – over Thanksgiving week of 2017. The event, which will honor Nike co-founder and Stanford alumnus Phil Knight MBA '62 in advance of his 80th birthday, will be contested in Portland, Oregon over Thanksgiving week during the 2017-18 season. Stanford will be joined in the elite 16-team field by Arkansas, Butler, Connecticut, Duke, Florida, Georgetown, Gonzaga, Michigan State, North Carolina, Ohio State, Oklahoma, Oregon, Portland, Portland State and Texas. This highly-anticipated event will be one of the largest regular-season tournaments in college basketball history.

TRAVIS NAMED CAPTAIN

Junior Reid Travis was named the Cardinal's team captain at the beginning of the season. It was the first time in Jerod's Haase's five years as a head coach he has named a team captain.

PICKENS NAMED TO ALL-TOURNAMENT TEAM

After averaging 18.3 points, 5.0 rebounds, 2.0 assists and 1.3 steals in three games in the Advocare Invitational, Dorian Pickens was named to the five-member all-tournament team.

OKPALA AND DA SILVA SIGN WITH CARDINAL

Head Coach Jerod Haase unveiled his first recruiting class with the Cardinal, as standouts Kezie Okpala and Oscar da Silva signed with the program on Nov. 9. Okpala, a 6-8, 185-pound small forward from Esperanza High School in Anaheim, California, and da Silva, a 6-9, 210-pound forward from Ludwig Gymnasium in Munich, Germany, will begin competing for the Cardinal in the 2017-18 season.

HEAD COACHES IN THEIR STANFORD DEBUTS

With Stanford's win over Harvard in the season opener in Shanghai, China, Jerod Haase posted a victory in his first game as the head coach of the Cardinal. Head coaches are now 16-2 all-time in their Stanford debuts.

PICKENS THE WORLD TRAVELER

The 2016 Pac-12 China Game was Dorian Pickens' third international basketball trip in a 15-month span. He has traveled more than 20,000 miles around the globe and spent more than 80 hours on an airplane during his international basketball adventures. In addition to the game in Shanghai, Pickens was selected to play on the Pac-12 All-Star Team that competed in two games against the Australian Olympic Team in Melbourne this past July. He also competed in all six games during Stanford's 2015 tour of Italy. He visited Rome, Florence, Venice and Como during the exhibition tour.

INTERNATIONAL COMPETITION

Stanford's trip to China was the third international trip during the regular season in the 102-year history of the men's basketball program. The Cardinal now owns a 3-3 all-time record in regular-season games played outside of United States territories following last week's win over Harvard in Shanghai. Stanford also competed in Cancun, Mexico, in 2009 and Paradise Island, Bahamas in 2012.

THE 25,000-MILE SEASON-OPENING JOURNEY

The Cardinal completed a whirlwind 25,000-mile journey across the globe during its first 11 games. The 2016-17 campaign opened in Shanghai, China on Nov. 11. Following its trip to China, Stanford played games in Orlando, Florida, Lawrence, Kansas and Dallas, Texas. The four trips, which included six games, totaled 25,598 miles and more than 56 hours on an airplane.

Jerod Haase was named Stanford's Anne and Tony Joseph Director of Men's Basketball by Jaquish & Kenninger Director of Athletics Bernard Muir on March 25, 2016.

Haase, the 18th head coach in the history of the program, arrives on The Farm after four seasons as the head coach at UAB. He led the Blazers to a regular-season Conference USA championship in 2016 and the program's 15th all-time NCAA Tournament appearance in 2015. Haase improved the Blazers' win total every year.

Tabbed the 2016 Gene Bartow Conference USA Coach of the Year, Haase led the Blazers to a 26-7 overall record and a 16-2 conference mark while capturing their first regular-season title since 2011. Along the way, UAB established school records for overall victories (26), conference wins (16), road wins (10) and consecutive victories (14). Also named the 2016 National Association of Basketball Coaches (NABC) All-District Coach, Haase directed the Blazers to an NIT berth for the 12th time in school history. UAB also finished 16-0 at home in 2015-16, extending the nation's fifth-longest home winning streak to 25.

Under Haase's guidance, UAB returned to the NCAA Tournament in 2015, shocking No. 3 seed Iowa State, 60-59, in the second round for the Blazers' first NCAA victory since 2005. UAB reached the Big Dance after claiming the program's first Conference USA Tournament title despite being seeded No. 4. The triumph marked UAB's first league tournament title since 1987, when the Blazers won the Sun Belt Conference Tournament. Haase successfully developed a roster comprised of 10 underclassmen – all players recruited by Haase and his staff – and finished 20-16 overall while guiding the third-youngest team in NCAA Division I.

The Blazers made impressive strides under Haase's leadership during the 2013-14 campaign, finishing 18-13 overall. Of UAB's 18 victories, perhaps none were more impressive than the Blazers' 63-59 home win against No. 16 North Carolina. UAB was ranked in the top five nationally in rebounding throughout the season and finished the year ranked second in the country at 44.5 boards per game.

During Haase's first year with the Blazers in 2012-13, UAB won six of its final nine regular-season Conference USA games.

Prior to arriving at UAB, Haase played for Roy Williams at Kansas and spent 13 years on Williams' staff with the Jayhawks and Tar Heels. A 1997 graduate of Kansas with a degree in business administration, Haase got his start as Kansas' Director of Operations from 1999-2003. During that time, the Jayhawks reached the 2002 Final Four and the national championship game in 2003.

When Williams was named head coach at North Carolina prior to the 2003-04 season, he brought Haase with him as an assistant coach and director of operations, a title Haase held from 2003-09. Haase then served exclusively as an assistant coach during his final three seasons with the Tar Heels.

A native of South Lake Tahoe, Calif., Haase attended California in 1992-93 before transferring to Kansas. He helped lead the Jayhawks to three consecutive conference titles and finished his career ranked in the school's top 10 in assists, three-point field goals and steals. Haase started 99 of 101 games at Kansas and scored 1,264 points, averaging 12.5 per game and reaching double figures 74 times. While at Kansas, Haase was a candidate for the Naismith and Wooden Awards.

As a senior in 1996-97, Haase started alongside Jacque Vaughn, Scot Pollard, Paul Pierce and Raef LaFrentz as Kansas finished with a 34-2 record while averaging 12.0 points per game despite playing with a broken wrist. As a sophomore in 1994-95, Haase averaged 15.0 points and was named the Big Eight Conference Newcomer of the Year and also tabbed a second-team all-conference selection.

Haase was a first-team GTE Academic All-American as a senior, a second-team Academic All-American as a junior and a three-time academic all-conference pick. The Jayhawks' Male Scholar-Athlete of the Year in 1997, Haase later earned a master's degree in business at Kansas in 2000.

Haase started 23 games in 1992-93 as a freshman at California, teaming with Jason Kidd in the backcourt.

Haase, 42, and his wife, the former Mindy Meidinger, have three children: Gavin (10), Garrett (7) and Gabrielle (4).
