STANFORD NOTES

- Stanford has their season end in the national semifinal and finish the year with an overall record of 32-6. The Cardinal drop to 4-9 overall in national semifinal appearances and 84-29 overall in the NCAA tourament in 31 appearances.
- The Cardinal's 84 wins in the NCAA tournament are third all-time behind Tennessee (124) and UConn (113).
- Senior Erika McCall scored 14 points and moves into 23rd on the Cardinal all-time list for career scoring. She finishes her career with 1,367 points.
- The double-double (14 points, 14 rebounds) for McCall is her 15th of the season and 35th of her career.
- McCall has had double-digit rebounds in nine of her last 11 NCAA tournament games and double-doubles in six of her last 10.
- McCall finishes her career seventh in school history in career rebounds with 976 and fourth in school history in career blocks with 200.
- Karlie Samuelson finishes the season tied for the school record for single-season 3-pointers with 96. She currently shares the record with Jeanette Pohlen (2011).
- Samuelson finishes her career with third in school history for career 3-pointers made with 249. Her .443 career 3-point percentage ranks second in program history.
- Samuelson finishes her career with 1,164 points, which ranks 31th on the Stanford all-time career scoring list.
- Down 14-10 at the 1:56 mark of the first quarter, the Cardinal used an 11-0 run to go up 21-14 at the 6:22 mark of the second quarter. Stanford scored the first nine points of the second quarter and held South Carolina without a field goal for seven minutes and 47 seconds from 1:56 in the first quarter to 4:07 in the second quarter.
- Stanford outscored South Carolina 17-6 in the second quarter. The six points for South Carolina tied a season-low for points in a quarter. Stanford held South Carolina to 2-of-14 from the field in the quarter and 20 points in the first half, a season-low for the Gamecocks.
- In their last five national semifinal appearances Stanford has held opponents to an average of 23.4 points per game in the first half (21 vs. Oklahoma 2010, 23 vs. Texas A&M 2011, 25 vs. Baylor 2012, 28 vs. UConn 2014 and 20 vs. South Carolina 2017).
- The 49 combined points in the first half (29-20 Stanford) are tied for sixth fewest in a half in a national semifinal game.
- Stanford outscored South Carolina 24-8 in bench points and 11-4 in fast break points.
- With five blocks in the game, Stanford set a school record for single-season blocks with 212. The previous record was 211 in the 2015-16 season.
- The Stanford senior class finishes with an overall record of 118-27 and reached two Women's Final Four's.
- The three free-throws made for Stanford is tied for the fourth fewest in a National Semifinal game.
