 - Other win was in 2014 semifinals, when USC was the #5 & Stanford was also the #1 seed
- 2nd win vs Stanford this season, 1st team since Oregon in 2019-20 to beat Stanford twice in the same season
 - 3-1 in their last 4 meetings vs Stanford
- +15 in PT off TO (21-6), 15-2 advantage in the 1st half
- +11 in 2nd chance PT (14-3), 9-2 advantage in the 1st half
 - +12 in offensive rebounds (18-6)
- McKenzie Forbes 26 PT, 11/21 FG, 4/8 3PT, 5 Reb
 - Named the Pac-12 Tournament's Most Outstanding Player
 - Most PT by a Trojan in Pac-12 Tournament title game
 - 3rd career conference tournament game with 20+ PT
 - Most in 3 games in this tournament
- Rayah Marshall 10 PT, 5/10 FG, 18 Reb, 5 O-Reb
 - 1st Trojan to record a double-double in Pac-12 Tourney title game.
 - 5th straight game with 10+ Reb
 - Most Reb in a Pac-12 Tournament game since 2017 quarterfinals (UW's Chantel Osahor had 27 vs UO)

#1 Stanford (28-5) - 61

- 1st loss in the championship game since 2020
 - 1st loss in title game as #1 seed against the #2 seed (previously 6-0)
- 0-2 all-time vs AP Top-5 ranked teams in the Pac-12 Tournament
 - Both losses were in the championship game
- 1st time losing to an opponent multiple times during the same season since 2020 (lost at Oregon and again vs Ducks in P12 Tournament)
- Fewest PT in a Pac-12 Tournament game since 2022 quarterfinals vs Oregon St (57). Fewest in title game since 2020 (56 vs Oregon)
- 3rd largest margin of defeat ever in a Pac-12 Tournament game
 - The two largest were their last two title game losses which came to Oregon in 2018 & 2020
- Trailed by at least 8 at halftime in all 3 games of the 2024 Pac-12 Tournament (trailed by 9 today)
 - Trailed by as many as 16 for the 2nd straight game, but closed 3rd guarter on 7-0 run to cut deficit back to 9
- Made each of their 1st 4 3PT shots, missed 12 of their final 15 attempts (Missed 1st 5 3PT shots in the 3rd quarter)
- Cameron Brink 19 PT, 7/16 FG, 3/5 3PT, 10 Reb
 - 1st double-double in 3 career Pac-12 Tournament title game
 - 5th straight double-double in a Pac-12 Tournament game
 - Career high in made 3PT
