Nebraska opens Big Ten Conference play on Saturday night with the Huskers traveling to Champaign to take on the Illinois Fighting Illini. The prime-time tilt at Illinois' Memorial Stadium is set to kick off shortly after 7 p.m. CT, with national television coverage on BTN and radio coverage available on the Husker Sports Network from Learfield-IMG.

Nebraska heads into Big Ten action with a 2-1 record, following an impressive 44-8 victory over Northern Illinois last Saturday in Lincoln. Nebraska opened a 16-0 lead early in the second quarter and never looked back as the Blackshirt defense held NIU out of the end zone. The Huskers rolled up 525 yards of total offense, including better than 235 yards both rushing and passing.

Illinois will enter Saturday's contest with a 2-1 record, following a 34-31 loss to Eastern Michigan on Saturday in Champaign. Illinois had opened the year with victories over Akron and at Connecticut before the setback this past weekend. Coach Lovie Smith's team has been strong on defense this season, allowing less than 320 yards per game, including just 79.3 rushing yards per game.

Nebraska and Illinois have a history of opening league play against each other. Since their first meeting as Big Ten opponents in 2013, the Huskers have opened conference play against Illinois four times in seven seasons. Nebraska is 5-1 against the Illini since joining the Big Ten Conference.

THIS WEEK'S NUMBERS

Nebraska will be looking to become the sixth college football program to win 900 games on Saturday night. Nebraska owns an all-time record of 899-389-40. The Huskers will look to join Michigan, Ohio State, Texas, Alabama and Notre Dame in the exclusive club.

Nebraska has topped 30 points in each of its first three games. A fourth 30-point outing to open the season would mark the first time the Huskers have scored better than 30 points in the first four games since 2014.

Nebraska opponents have totaled just nine rushes of 10 yards or more through three games. The Blackshirt defense is allowing just 2.2 yards per rush and 82.0 rushing yards per game.

SERIES HISTORY: NEBRASKA VS. ILLINOIS

Nebraska holds a 12-3-1 all-time edge in the series, including a 3-2-1 record in games played at Illinois.

- Nebraska is 5-1 against the Fighting Illini since joining the Big Ten, with the lone setback a 14-13 loss in 2015. Nebraska's five wins have come by an average of 21.4 points.
- One of Nebraska's memorable victories in the series occurred on Oct. 3, 1925, a 14-0 Nebraska win in Champaign. It was the only time in Red Grange's Illinois career that he was held scoreless in a home game.

HUSKERS SET TO OPEN BIG TEN CONFERENCE ACTION

Nebraska begins its ninth season of Big Ten Conference action on Saturday night in Champaign. The game marks the fourth time Nebraska has opened Big Ten play against Illinois.

- The Huskers are 5-3 in Big Ten openers since joining the league in 2011.
- Nebraska has won 39 of its past 44 conference openers overall, with four of those losses against top-20 teams.
- Overall, Nebraska is 91-22-2 all-time in conference openers (.800 winning percentage).
- Saturday's game is the first of four Big Ten road games for Nebraska in 2019. The Huskers are 3-5 in their first conference road game since joining the Big Ten.

NEBRASKA LOOKS FOR WIN NO. 900

Nebraska will be looking to reach a major milestone on Saturday night at Illinois. A victory over the Fighting Illini would be win No. 900 in program history.

- The Huskers would join just four other programs in the 900-win club. The other current members of that club include Michigan (955), Ohio State (914), Texas (911), Alabama (908). Notre Dame and Oklahoma also sit at 899 victories. Notre Dame plays at Georgia this Saturday, while Oklahoma does not play this week.
- Nebraska has reached its last two milestone victories on the road with win No. 800 coming at Kansas State in 2006 (21-3) and win No. 700 also in Manhattan in 1996 (39-3).

NOTING GAME 3

- Nebraska won for the 21st time in its past 23 night games at Memorial Stadium.
- Nebraska junior running back Dedrick Mills carried 11 times for 116 yards and a touchdown. His 61-yard run in the first quarter was a career long for Mills in his FBS playing career.
- Sophomore Maurice Washington had a career-long 60-yard run for a touchdown in the second quarter, bettering a 49-yard run last year against Illinois.
- Nebraska had a pair of 60-yard runs for the second time in its past six games. NU also had two rushes of better than 60 yards last season against Illinois.
- Quarterback Adrian Martinez threw for 257 yards and two touchdowns. In the process, Martinez moved into ninth place on the Nebraska career passing list. He also became the 13th Nebraska quarterback with 20 career touchdown passes.
- Senior receiver Kanawai Noa caught three passes for 51 yards, including a 27-yard touchdown near the end of the first half. His receptions were his first three catches as a Husker.
- Nebraska held Northern Illinois to 74 rushing yards, marking the third straight opponent Nebraska has limited to less than 100 yards rushing. That marks the first time the Huskers have held three straight opponents to 100 or less rushing yards since early in the 2017 season.
- Senior defensive back Lamar Jackson recorded a career-high four PBU, bettering his previous high of two in two games.

FROST IN SECOND SEASON WITH HUSKERS

Scott Frost is in his second season at Nebraska in 2019. The 2017 consensus national coach of the year, Frost boasts a 25-16 career record as a collegiate head coach.

- Although Nebraska finished with a 4-8 record in 2018, five of the eight losses came by a combined 21 points. NU lost five games by five or fewer points, including a trio of three-point defeats. Nebraska won four of its final six games, and the two losses were a five-point loss at an Ohio State team that ended the year ranked No. 3 in the nation and a three-point loss at lowa, when the Hawkeyes kicked a game-winning field goal as time expired. lowa finished with a No. 25 ranking.
- As the head coach at UCF, Frost improved from 6-7 in his first season to 13-0 in year two. A similar turnaround at Nebraska could be historic. A nine-win season by Nebraska in 2019 would tie for the second-largest win improvement from one season to the next in school history (five games), while a 10-win campaign would tie the largest win improvement (six games).
- In 12 seasons as a full-time assistant or head coach, Frost's teams have posted a 128-33 record, averaging nearly 11 wins per season. Frost has been a part of seven conference championship teams and coached in two national championship games in his 12 seasons.
- Frost's teams have been ranked in the top 15 in 10 of his 12 seasons, including eight final top-10 rankings and six final top-five rankings.
- Each of NU's last five head coaches won at least eight games in their second season, and the four head coaches prior to Frost all produced their best winning percentage at Nebraska in year two.

NINE OF 10 ASSISTANTS RETURN FOR SECOND SEASON

Nine of Nebraska's 10 assistant coaches returned for their second season in 2019, with all nine having coached with **Scott Frost** in each of his four seasons as a head coach.

- Nebraska's nine returning assistant coaches mark its highest number of returning assistants since 2013, when a Husker coaching staff last had zero turnover during the offseason. Nebraska has had at least one coaching change each of the last six seasons.
- The lone new addition to the staff is **Tony Tuioti**, who coaches the Husker defensive line. Tuioti comes to Nebraska after spending the past two seasons at Cal, including the 2018 campaign as the Bears' defensive line coach. Tuioti was also an assistant defensive line coach for two seasons in the NFL with the Cleveland Browns in 2014 and 2015.
- Four of the Huskers' 11 full-time coaches played at Nebraska, including Frost, offensive line coach **Greg Austin**, running backs coach **Ryan Held** and inside linebackers coach **Barrett Ruud**.
- Nebraska's coaching staff has been lauded the past three seasons. In addition to Scott Frost being
 recognized as the 2017 national coach of the year while at UCF, the Husker staff features a Broyles
 Award finalist in offensive coordinator Troy Walters (2017) and two Broyles Award nominees in
 defensive coordinator Erik Chinander (2016) and quarterbacks coach Mario Verduzco (2018).
 The Broyles Award is presented annually to the nation's top assistant coach.

NEBRASKA AIMS TO BUILD OFF STRONG FINISH TO 2018

Nebraska won four of its final six games last season after an 0-6 start. The Huskers were nearly two touchdowns per game better both offensively and defensively over the second half of the 2018 season while facing four bowl teams in their final six games, including a pair of teams who were ranked in the final 2018 Associated Press top-25 poll.

 As part of its 4-2 finish, Nebraska won three games by at least 19 points. The Huskers' two losses were a five-point loss at Ohio State and a last-second three-point loss at lowa. Overall, including a three-point overtime loss at Colorado, the Huskers' past four losses are by a total of 14 points including two OT setbacks.

- Offensively, Nebraska averaged 36.7 points per game in the final six games of 2018, after averaging 23.3 points per game in its first six contests. Through three games this season, Nebraska is averaging 36.7 points per game.
- Defensively, the Huskers held two of their final five opponents to single digits last fall. Nebraska allowed 24.2 points per game in its final six contests after allowing 38.3 points per game in its first six games. In three games in 2019, Nebraska is allowing 21.0 points per game.

FROST OFFENSES IMPRESSIVE ON OPENING DRIVES

One common theme of a **Scott Frost**-led offense has been a fast start, and that has held true for Frost's tenure in Lincoln. Nebraska has scored on its opening drive in each of the first three games in 2019.

NU received the opening kickoff against South Alabama and drove nine plays and 81 yards for a touchdown to a take a 7-0 lead. At Colorado, Nebraska drove 96 yards in five plays on its first possession to take a 7-0 lead. The Huskers opened with a field goal on the game's first drive against Northern Illinois, covering 58 yards in eight plays. The opening-drive score continued a theme from 2018.

- Nebraska scored on its first possession seven times in 12 games last season, including six of the final seven games. All seven of NU's opening scoring drives resulted in touchdowns. In Frost's two seasons, Nebraska has scored on its opening possession 10 times in 15 games.
- NU received the opening kickoff nine times in 2018 and scored touchdowns on six of those drives while punting only once. The Huskers had a game-opening touchdown drive to take a 7-0 lead in five straight games during the Big Ten Conference season.
- The Huskers scored on nearly 60 percent of their opening possessions in 2018, even with a pair of drive-ending turnovers in opponent territory. Nebraska's average touchdown drive covered more than 74 yards, including one 80-yard touchdown march and five 75-yard scoring drives.
- Over the last three seasons 2018-19 at Nebraska and 2017 at UCF Frost's offenses have scored a touchdown on their opening possession 18 times in 28 games (64 percent). The average length of the touchdown drive in that span is 74 yards.
- In three-plus years as a head coach, Frost's offenses have scored on their opening drive 23 times in 41 games, with 21 touchdowns and two field goals. In 81 games over six-plus seasons as a play-caller, Frost's offenses have scored on their first possession of the game 44 times, putting points on the board in more than half of their opening possessions.

BLACKSHIRT DEFENSE MAKING NOISE EARLY IN 2019 SEASON

The Nebraska defense has focused on taking a step forward in 2019, specifically causing more turnovers and big impact plays. Through three games, Nebraska has done an outstanding job of checking that box, particularly in home wins over South Alabama and Northern Illinois.

- Nebraska has nine takeaways through three games to rank first in the Big Ten and fifth nationally in that category.
- Nebraska had five takeaways against South Alabama including four in the second half. The five takeaways matched the most in two seasons under Scott Frost (Illinois, 2018) and was only the fourth time since 2010 that a Nebraska defense recorded five or more takeaways.
- Nebraska scored a pair of defensive touchdowns against the Jaguars—a 38-yard interception return by Eric Lee Jr. in the third quarter and a fumble recovery in the end zone by Alex Davis in the fourth quarter to cap the scoring. The two defensive touchdowns marked the first time Nebraska scored a pair of defensive touchdowns since having two interception returns for touchdowns against Southern Miss in 2013. Nebraska is tied for the national lead in defensive touchdowns.
- Lee's interception return for a touchdown was the first by a Husker since Marcus Newby had an interception for a touchdown against Northwestern in 2017.
- Davis' fumble recovery for a touchdown was the first by the Huskers since Josh Mitchell returned a fumble 57 yards for a touchdown against Miami in 2014.
- Nebraska also scored on a 76-yard punt return for a touchdown by JD Spielman in the third quarter. The three non-offensive touchdowns were a first for Nebraska since the Huskers had three defensive touchdowns in a 31-3 win over Wake Forest in 2005.

- Nebraska's effort against South Alabama marked the 16th time in school history the Huskers have scored on offense, defense and special teams in the same game. It was the first time since 2012 NU had accomplished that feat, and the first instance against an FBS opponent since 2009 at Colorado.
- Nebraska has added two takeaways each of the past two weeks. NU is +2 in tunover margin through three games.
- Nebraska has averaged 2.8 takeaways in its past eight games. Prior to that, Nebraska averaged 1.0 takeaway in its 30 previous games spanning three seasons.
- The Huskers have forced three or more turnovers in four of their last eight games. Before the current streak, NU had not forced three turnovers in 30 games dating back to game two in 2016.
- Nebraska has forced 15 fumbles in its past eight games. Prior to that, Nebraska had forced just 14 fumbles in its previous 34 games.
- Defensive coordinator Erik Chinander has a history of producing disruptive defenses. In 41 games as a defensive coordinator (UCF, Nebraska) Chinander's defenses have scored 11 touchdowns.

LOCKING DOWN THE RUN GAME

Nebraska has also made big strides in defending the run early in the 2019 season. The Huskers have held all three opponents to fewer than 100 yards rushing, and allowed 82.0 yards per game on the ground to rank 20th nationally.

- Nebraska has held three straight opponents to fewer than 100 yards rushing for the first time since early in the 2017 season.
- The Huskers are allowing just 2.2 yards per rush through three games to rank 12th nationally in that category. Last year Nebraska surrendered 5.0 yards per rush.
- Opponents have only one run that has covered better than 20 yards and just nine runs of 10 yards or more through three games.

BARRY IS THE BIG TEN'S TOP RETURNING TACKLER

Senior inside linebacker **Mohamed Barry** is back after a breakthrough junior season in 2018, when he totaled 112 tackles after recording only 44 tackles in his first two seasons combined.

- Barry led Nebraska with 112 tackles in 2018, the most by a Husker since Lavonte David made 133 stops in 2011. Barry was second in the Big Ten and 38th nationally with an average of 9.3 tackles per game, and he was the Big Ten's leading returner in that category.
- Barry leads the Nebraska defense with 28 tackles in 2019. He opened the season with a teamhigh 12 tackles against South Alabama, tying his career high. He added a team-high 10 tackles against Northern Illinois for his ninth career double-figure tackle game. He has led Nebraska in tackles in 11 of 15 games since the start of the 2018 season.
- Barry is looking to become the sixth Husker to have back-to-back 100-tackle seasons, joining David (2010-11), his position coach Barrett Ruud (2003-04), Lee Kunz (1977-78), Clete Pillen (1975-76) and Jerry Murtaugh (1969-70).
- Barry was tabbed as a third-team All-Big Ten selection by the conference media in 2018 and was an honorable-mention selection by the league's coaches. He is on the 2019 preseason watch lists for the Butkus Award and the Lott IMPACT Trophy.

BOOTLE AND JACKSON BREAK UP OPPONENT'S PASSING GAME

Junior **Dicaprio Bootle** wreaked havoc on opponent passing games in 2018. Bootle broke up 15 passes and had a career-high 39 tackles in his first season as a starter in 2018, helping Nebraska rank 34th nationally in pass efficiency defense, a 61-spot improvement from the 2017 season.

- Bootle broke up 15 passes in 2018, ranking ninth nationally in breakups and 16th nationally in passes defended per game (1.3). Bootle's 15 pass breakups ranked second on Nebraska's season chart and were the most by a Husker since DeJuan Groce broke up a school-record 17 passes in 2000. Bootle opened the 2019 season with a team-high two PBU against South Alabama, and added one PBU at Colorado.
- Bootle earned third-team All-Big Ten honors last year, becoming the first Husker cornerback to be honored by the conference in four seasons.
- Senior Lamar Jackson lines up opposite Bootle at corner, giving Nebraska one of the conference's best cornerback tandems. Jackson has an interception and a team-high five PBU in 2019. Jackson had a career-high four breakups against Northern Illinois, bettering his previous career high of two breakups in a single game. Jackson is tied for the national lead in passes defended per game at 2.0 per contest.

HUSKER OFFENSE SHOWING VERSATILITY

In non-conference play, the Nebraska offense has shown the versatility to both strike quickly and drive the length of the field.

- Against Colorado, Nebraska had two touchdown drives of 95 yards or longer (95 and 96). That
 marked the first time the Huskers have had two 95-yard scoring drives in the same game since the
 2000 Fiesta Bowl against Tennessee (97- and 99-yard touchdown drives).
- Through three games, Nebraska has seven scoring drives that have covered 75 yards or more.
- Nebraska also had two long scoring plays at Colorado witih touchdown passes of 65 (Martinez-Speilman) and 75 yards (Martinez-Washington). That marked the first time the Huskers had multiple 65-yard pass plays in the same game since 2006 against Kansas.
- Nebraska flashed its quick-strike ability and explosiveness against Northern Illinois. Nebraska produced nine plays of 20 yards or more against the Huskies, including eight before halftime. The eight first-half chunk plays matched Nebraska's combined total in its first two games.
- Nebraska had a pair of 60-yard runs against Northern Illinois. **Dedrick Mills** had a career-long 61-yard run in the first quarter, and **Maurice Washington** had a personal-best 60-yard touchdown run in the second quarter. That marked the second time in the past six games Nebraska has produced a pair of 60-yard runs in the same game.

SPIELMAN CONTINUES TO CLIMB HUSKER CHARTS

Junior wide receiver **JD Spielman** has already made Husker history as the only player in program history to have a 200-yard receiving game. In only two-plus seasons and just 24 games, Spielman is also leaving his mark on Nebraska's career record book. He has 132 career catches for 1,872 yards, ranking sixth all-time at Nebraska in receiving yards and eighth in receptions.

- Spielman needs 58 receptions and 876 yards to become Nebraska's all-time leader in both categories. He averaged 61 catches and 842 receiving yards per season in his first two years. On a per-game basis in his 24-game career, Spielman averages 5.5 receptions and 78.0 receiving yards.
- Spielman reached 1,000 career receiving yards in only 15 games. He reached the mark faster than any other Husker, eclipsing Heisman Trophy winner Johnny Rodgers (16 games).
- Spielman is the only player in school history to record 100 catches prior to his junior season.
- Spielman owns the only two 200-yard receiving games in Husker history (200 yards vs. Ohio State in 2017 and 209 yards at Wisconsin in 2018).
- Spielman is the only wide receiver in school history to have two career games with double-digit receptions (11 vs. Ohio State in 2017 and 10 vs. Purdue in 2018). Running back Marlon Lucky is the only other Husker to have two career games with double-digit catches.
- Spielman had more than 800 receiving yards in each of his first two seasons, joining Johnny Rodgers and Stanley Morgan Jr. as the only Huskers with two 800-yard receiving seasons. No Husker has ever had three 800-yard receiving seasons.
- Spielman had more than 50 catches in each of his first two seasons, joining Johnny Rodgers, Kenny Bell and Stanley Morgan Jr. as the only players in program history with multiple 50-catch seasons. No Husker has ever had three 50-catch seasons.
- Spielman opened the 2019 season with a 76-yard punt return for a touchdown against South Alabama, marking his second career punt return score. He had a 77-yard punt return touchdown last season against Bethune-Cookman. He also had a 99-yard kickoff return for a touchdown in his first career touch against Arkansas State in the 2017 season opener. Spielman is one of only eight players in program history to return both a punt and kickoff for a touchdown.
- Spielman recorded his fifth career 100-yard receiving game at Colorado with five catches for 112 yards. He had a 65-yard touchdown reception, his sixth career touchdown of at least 65 yards.

SPIELMAN RANKS AMONG NATION'S TOP WIDE RECEIVERS

JD Spielman was one of the top returning receivers in the country in 2019. The two-time All-Big Ten selection has earned a spot on the preseason Biletnikoff Award watch list each of the last two seasons, and he was a freshman All-American in 2017.

- Spielman averages 78.0 receiving yards per game in his 24 career games. That total ranks fourth nationally among all active FBS players with a minimum of 1,000 career receiving yards. Among Power Five teams, Spielman is one of only three active players to average 70 receiving yards per game along with Purdue's Rondale Moore and Oklahoma's CeeDee Lamb.
- Spielman owns 1,872 career receiving yards, which ranks fourth nationally among non-seniors.
- Spielman is also one of the top wideouts in the Big Ten Conference. His career totals of 132
 receptions and 1,872 receiving yards rank third and second, respectively, among all 2019 Big Ten
 receivers and are the highest totals among non-seniors.
- In Big Ten play, Spielman has posted 1,339 career receiving yards. He owns more receiving yards in conference play than any other active Big Ten player, an impressive accomplishment considering Spielman has only played in 15 career Big Ten games, missing the final conference game of the 2017 season and the final two Big Ten contests last season.

MARTINEZ DRIVES HUSKER OFFENSE

Quarterback **Adrian Martinez** put together an impressive rookie campaign as a true freshman in 2018. A freshman All-American a season ago, Martinez played a major role in Nebraska ranking 25th nationally in total offense and setting a school record by gaining at least 450 yards in seven consecutive games.

- Martinez ranked 12th nationally and first among freshmen with an average of 295.1 yards of total offense per game in 2018, a school record. In addition to the school record, it smashed the Huskers' previous freshman record of 199.7 yards per game set by Taylor Martinez in 2010.
- Martinez's average of 295.1 yards of total offense per game marked the 10th-best total offense average by a freshman in FBS history, including the fifth-highest mark by a true freshman and the highest mark ever by a true freshman quarterback for a Power Five team.
- Martinez was the top returner from 2018 in total offensive yards among Power Five quarterbacks.
 Overall, Martinez (295.1 ypg) ranked third in returning total offensive yards per game behind Houston's D'Eriq King (332.4 ypg) and Hawaii's Cole McDonald (325.7 ypg). UCF's McKenzie Milton (297.0 ypg) also has a higher average than Martinez, but Milton will miss the 2019 season.

MARTINEZ BUILDING ON RECORD-BREAKING FRESHMAN SEASON

Adrian Martinez was one of the most productive freshman quarterbacks in NCAA history last season, when he earned freshman All-America honors after setting several school records. Martinez started 11 of 12 games, more than all other true freshmen quarterbacks in Nebraska history combined. He led an offense that ranked 25th nationally with an average of 456.2 yards per game. Martinez completed nearly 65 percent of his passes, threw for 2,617 yards and 17 touchdowns and rushed for 629 yards and eight scores.

- Martinez averaged a school-record 295.1 yards of total offense per game in 2018, an average that ranked 12th nationally and was the top mark among freshmen.
- Martinez set Husker season records for 300-yard total offense games (7) and 400-yard total offense games (3), while tying the Nebraska career record with three 400-yard total offense games.
- Martinez set Nebraska freshman records in completions (224), completion percentage (64.6), passing yards (2,617), passing touchdowns (17), total offensive yards (3,246) and total touchdowns (25). His 629 rushing yards were the most ever by a Husker true freshman quarterback and the most by any Nebraska true freshman since 2002.

David Neill, Timmy Chang, Brett Rypien and Adrian Martinez are the only true freshmen on this list; the other six were redshirt freshmen.

- In addition to his school records, Martinez ranked in the top five on Nebraska's season chart in completion percentage (2nd, 64.6), completions (4th, 224) and total offensive yards (5th, 3,246).
- Martinez posted an 86.2 completion percentage against Minnesota last October, setting a Nebraska record for the highest completion percentage with a minimum of 20 attempts. Martinez broke the record held by Dave Humm that stood for 44 years.

MARTINEZ BRINGS DUAL THREAT TO NEBRASKA OFFENSE

Adrian Martinez is one of the nation's top dual-threat quarterbacks. In 11 games as a true freshman in 2018, Martinez threw for more than 2,500 yards and rushed for more than 600 yards. In 2019, he is off to a similar start averaging 280.3 yards of total offense per game.

- Martinez posted 356 yards of total offense at Colorado and 301 yards of offense against Northern Illinois. Martinez now has nine career games of 300 yards or more in total offense, tied for the second-most in school history.
- With his 356 yards at Colorado, Martinez continued an impressive stretch of play away from Lincoln. In his last five road games, Martinez is averaging 351.8 yards of total offense. In those five games, he has rushed 82 times for 308 yards (61.6 ypg) with six touchdowns. He has completed 113-of-174 passes for 1,451 yards (290.2 ypg) and eight touchdowns.
- Martinez averaged 237.9 passing yards per game and 57.2 rushing yards per game in 2018. He was one of only four FBS quarterbacks who averaged 225 passing yards and 50 rushing yards per game in 2018. Through two games in 2019, Martinez is averaging 241.7 passing yards and 38.7 rushing yards per game.
- Martinez became the sixth freshman in NCAA history to average 200 passing yards and 50 rushing yards per game. He was just the second true freshman to hit those marks in FBS history and the first true freshman at a Power Five school to average 200 passing yards and 50 rushing yards.
- With his dual-threat ability, Martinez is on the preseason watch list for the Maxwell and Walter Camp Player-of-the-Year Awards, along with the Manning and Davey O'Brien Awards.

FROST AS A HEAD COACH

WASHINGTON PROVIDES RUNNING AND RECEIVING THREAT

Sophomore running back **Maurice Washington** is second for Nebraska in rushing through three games with 179 yards on 25 carries, an average of 7.2 yards per rush. Washington has also shown his ability to be one of Nebraska's top receiving options in his young career at Nebraska. This season, he has caught eight passes for 149 yards and two touchdowns. As a freshman, Washington finished with 24 catches for 221 yards.

- In Nebraska's game at Colorado, Washington caught four passes for 118 yards, including a 75-yard touchdown. The 118-yard effort was the fifth-best single-game receiving effort in school history by a Nebraska running back.
- The 75-yard touchdown catch against the Buffs marked the longest reception by a Husker running back since 1978.
- In addition to his 100-yard receiving day at Colorado, Washington also topped the century mark
 in receiving at lowa last season. His two 100-yard receiving efforts ties him with Cory Ross and
 Marlon Lucky for the school record for 100-yard receiving games by a running back.

HUSKER OFFENSE LOOKS TO BE ONE OF NATION'S TOP UNITS

Despite a new system and a true freshman starting quarterback, Nebraska featured one of the nation's top offenses in 2018, and the Huskers were also one of the nation's most improved units. Nebraska has the tools to once again be one of the nation's best units.

The Huskers churned out 469 yards at Colorado and had a season-high 525 yards of offense against Northern Illinois. The Huskers are averaging 423.3 yards per game through three games in 2019.

- Nebraska ranked 25th nationally in total offense in 2018, averaging 456.2 yards per game. The Huskers finished in the top 25 in total offense for the first time since 2008.
- The Huskers gained at least 450 yards of offense in seven consecutive games during the 2018 season, the longest such streak in school history. Nebraska also eclipsed 500 yards of total offense five times last fall, the program's most games with 500 yards of offense since 2000.
- Nebraska gained more than 2,500 yards rushing and 2,500 yards passing in 2018, marking just the fourth time the Huskers had reached both of those marks in the same season.
- The Huskers ranked 87th in the country in total offense in 2017 before improving to 25th in 2018. Nebraska's 62-spot improvement ranked seventh nationally. The Huskers also ranked 14th nationally by averaging 71.2 more yards per game in 2018 than they did in 2017.
- Nebraska improved its rushing offense ranking by 91 spots from 2017 to 2018, the No. 2 improvement nationally after going from 119th in 2017 to 28th in 2018. NU was also third with a rushing improvement of 101.5 yards per game from 2017 (107.5 ypg) to 2018 (209.0 ypg).

HUSKER STREAKS CONTINUE IN 2019 SEASON

Nebraska continues a pair of long team streaks in the 2019 season, while a pair of Huskers are also riding impressive individual streaks.

- The game against Northern Illinois marked Nebraska's 370th consecutive sellout. The sellout streak began in 1962 and is in its 57th year in 2019.
- Nebraska has scored in 298 consecutive games. The streak is the longest in school history, the eighth-longest in FBS history and the fifth-longest active streak.
- Junior wide receiver JD Spielman has made at least two catches in each of his 24 career games.
 His streak of 24 straight games with a reception is the sixth-longest streak in school history.
- Sophomore place-kicker **Barret Pickering** has made 10 consecutive field goals, 26 consecutive extra points and 36 straight kicks overall. His streak of 10 straight made field goals is the seventh-longest streak in program history. Pickering has not played in 2019 because of injury.

ROSTER FULL OF YOUTH FOR 2019 HUSKERS

Nebraska features a youthful roster again in 2019, one year after the Huskers' 2018 freshman class made a significant impact.

- Among the 153 players on the Husker roster, 105 are underclassmen, including 78 freshmen and 27 sophomores. Overall, 69 percent of Nebraska's roster is comprised of underclassmen. Additionally, 101 of the 153 players on the roster have been added in Scott Frost's two seasons.
- Nebraska's two leading returning rushers from 2018, its leading passer, its leading scorer, its leading kickoff returner and two of its top four returning receivers were all freshmen in 2018.

FRESHMEN MAKE IMPACT ON OFFENSIVE LINE

Nebraska, which has no seniors on its offensive line depth chart, has had two freshmen earn playing time on the line in the first three games.

- Redshirt freshman **Cameron Jurgens** has started at center in all three games. Jurgens is the first freshman (true or redshirt) to start a game at center for Nebraska since the NCAA restored freshmen eligibility in 1972.
- Jurgens, who spent the majority of his redshirt season working at tight end, also became only the sixth freshman offensive lineman (true or redshirt) to start a season opener for Nebraska against South Alabama.
- Redshirt freshman **Will Farniok** also saw playing time at center against South Alabama and Northern Illinois.
- True freshman **Bryce Benhart** is Nebraska's No. 2 right tackle and saw his first action against Northern Illinois.

HUSKERS NAME 2019 CAPTAINS

Senior linebacker Mohamed Barry, senior defensive lineman Darrion Daniels, junior offensive lineman Matt Farniok and sophomore quarterback Adrian Martinez will serve as captains in 2019.

- Farniok's selection marks the seventh straight year an offensive lineman has served as captain.
- Martinez becomes just the second sophomore captain at Nebraska since at least 1930. The only other sophomore to serve as captain since 1930 was quarterback Joe Dailey in 2004.

NEBRASKA RANKS AMONG NATION'S ATTENDANCE LEADERS

Nebraska averaged 89,034 fans over seven home games in 2018 to rank 10th nationally in average attendance. The Huskers were ninth with a total season attendance of 623,240. This season Nebraska is averaging 89,548 fans through two home games.

• The Huskers have ranked in the top 15 nationally in average attendance every season since 2006. Nebraska has ranked in the top 20 nationally in average attendance every year this century.

HUSKER HIGHLIGHTS

Nebraska football is the only team in any sport in NCAA history to boast 100 athletic All-Americans and 100 academic All-Americans.

Three Huskers have won the Heisman Trophy, all since 1972. Johnny Rodgers won in 1972, Mike Rozier in 1983 and Eric Crouch in 2001.

Nebraska has won five national titles: 1970, 1971, 1994, 1995 and 1997. The Huskers rank second with five national titles since 1970.

Nebraska ranks sixth in NCAA history with 899 all-time victories. The Huskers are one of only 12 teams with 800 all-time wins.

NU ranks ninth nationally with a total of 24 former players and coaches (18 players, six coaches) enshrined in the College Football Hall of Fame.

Nebraska leads the nation with a former Husker on a Super Bowl roster for 26 consecutive years.

NU ranks second in NCAA history with 46 conference titles, including 33 unbeaten conference seasons.

Nebraska has won at least nine games in a season 50 times in its 129-year history, an NCAA record for most nine-win seasons.

Nebraska ranks third in NCAA history with 53 all-time bowl appearances.

Nebraska football has totaled 108 Academic All-Americans, the most of any team in any sport in NCAA history.

NU has totaled an NCAA-record 338 Academic All-Americans in all sports.

Memorial Stadium has been sold out for an NCAA-record 370 consecutive games dating back to Nov. 3, 1962.

HOME OF THE HUSKERS



Memorial Stadium's history dates back more than 90 years. In the fall of 1922, a drive for \$430,000 in stadium construction funds was undertaken by faculty, students, alumni and friends of the University.

The stadium was named Memorial Stadium to honor all Nebraskans who served in the Civil and Spanish-American Wars; the 751 Nebraskans who died in World War I; the 3,839 in World War II; the 225 in Korea; the 422 in Vietnam; and those in Iraq.

Construction was completed in a few more than 90 working days and Memorial Stadium was dedicated on Oct. 20, 1923, at the Homecoming game in which Nebraska was held to a scoreless tie by Kansas.

The field at Memorial Stadium was named Tom Osborne Field - after the Huskers' legendary Hall-of-Fame coach - in 1998, one year after Osborne's retirement following 25 years and 255 victories as head coach.

RECORD SELLOUT STREAK CONTINUES

Nebraska has sold out every game at Memorial Stadium since Nov. 3, 1962, an NCAA-record streak of 370 consecutive sellouts, 101 more than second-place Notre Dame. Nebraska is 311-59 (.841) during the streak and overall attendance during the streak is more than 28 million fans.

HUSKERS OWN BIG HOME-FIELD ADVANTAGE

Nebraska has won at least six home games in 24 of the past 32 seasons. Nebraska is 177-36 (.831) at home over the last 30 seasons.

- Since 1970, Nebraska has posted 41 perfect home seasons.
- The Huskers are 546-155-20 all-time in Lincoln (.771 in 130 years).
- Nebraska is 421-132-13 in Memorial Stadium (.755 in 96 years dating back to 1923).

NEBRASKA AMONG TOP ALL-TIME PROGRAMS

Nebraska is playing its 130th season of football in 2019, and the Huskers boast an 899-389-40 all-time record (.692) in 1,328 games. The Huskers are one of 12 programs with 800 all-time victories, ranking sixth all-time with 899 wins.

- Nebraska will look to join the 900-win club this week. Michigan (955), Ohio State (914), Texas (911) and Alabama (908) and Notre Dame (900) are the only teams with 900 all-time wins.
- Since 1970, Nebraska owns a 465-147-5 record (.758), and the Huskers are the nation's wins leader over the last 50 years.
- NU boasts 27 10-win seasons in school history, including 24 since 1970. The Huskers also have 12 seasons with 11 or more wins, seven seasons with 12 or more wins and three 13-win seasons.
- The Huskers own 50 nine-win seasons, an NCAA record. Forty-two of those nine-win seasons have come since 1970 and 48 since 1962, 13 more than any other school.
- Nebraska was the first team in NCAA history to win 100 games in consecutive decades, leading the nation with 103 wins in the 1980s and ranking second with 108 wins in the 1990s.

NEBRASKA NO. 2 IN CONFERENCE TITLES

Nebraska is one of only five schools in NCAA history that has won at least 40 conference championships, ranking second all-time with 46 conference titles. In 36 seasons (1962-97) under Hall-of-Fame coaches Bob Devaney (8) and Tom Osborne (13), the Huskers won 21 conference titles.

HUSKERS RANK HIGHLY IN NATIONAL CHAMPIONSHIPS

Nebraska has won five national championships, including three outright titles (1971, 1994, 1995) and two shared championships (1970, 1997). In 1970, Nebraska was awarded the Associated Press national title, but was No. 3 in the coaches poll behind No. 1 Texas and No. 2 Ohio State, both of whom lost their bowl games (the coaches' poll was voted on before bowl games). In 1997, undefeated Nebraska was voted No. 1 in the coaches' poll, while undefeated Michigan was No. 1 in the AP poll.

- Nebraska's four AP national championships rank seventh all-time.
- The Huskers' four coaches' poll national championships rank fourth all-time.

NEBRASKA ALSO EXCELS IN THE CLASSROOM

Nebraska's rich tradition is not limited to the field, as the Huskers have been outstanding in the classroom as well.

- Nebraska owns the NCAA record with 338 CoSIDA Academic All-Americans across all sports.
- Husker football has produced 108 CoSIDA Academic All-Americans, the most of any single sport in NCAA history.
- Nebraska owns the NCAA record with 17 NCAA Top 10 Award Winners, which is considered the "Heisman Trophy" of academics.
- Nebraska football has produced nine NCAA Top 10 Award winners, the most of any single team in NCAA history.

- Nebraska plays five teams that appeared in the Associated Press top-25 poll at least once last season: Colorado (as high as No.19), Ohio State (as high as No. 2), Northwestern (as high as No. 20), Wisconsin (as high as No. 4) and lowa (as high as No. 18).
- NU faces four teams with a new head coach in 2019: Colorado (Mel Tucker); Northern Illinois (Thomas Hammock); Ohio State (Ryan Day); and Maryland (Michael Locksley).
- After playing 12 consecutive weeks during the 2018 season, Nebraska will have a pair of byes (Oct. 19 and Nov. 9) in 2019. The last time Nebraska had two byes in the same season was in 2014.

COACHING STAFF NOTES

- Scott Frost is in his fourth season as a head coach in 2019. Frost is one of four former Husker players to return to the Nebraska sideline as head coach, and he is one of 19 FBS head coaches leading their coach alma maters in 2019.
- Nebraska's staff also includes former Huskers Greg Austin (2003-06), Ryan Held (1993-96) and Barrett Ruud (2001-04).
- Frost is one of only four FBS head coaches who won a national title as a player. Both Frost (1995 & 1997) and Ryan Held (1994 & 1995) were two-time national champions at Nebraska.
- Frost and nine of his 10 assistant coaches are in their fourth consecutive season working together, including two seasons at UCF.
- The lone new addition to the staff is defensive line coach Tony Tuioti, who came to Nebraska after spending the past two seasons at Cal.
- Frost was the consensus choice as the 2017 national coach of the year, while offensive coordinator Troy Walters was a finalist for the 2017 Broyles Award. Defensive coordinator Erik Chinander was a nominee for the 2016 Broyles Award and quarterbacks coach Mario Verduzco was a Broyles Award nominee in 2018.

 Walters, the all-time leading receiver in Pac-12 history, was the 1999 Biletnikoff Award winner as the nation's top receiver. He is the only Biletnikoff Award winner currently coaching in college football.

ROSTER NOTES

- Nebraska's roster features 153 players. NU is believed to have the largest roster of any non-service academy in the country.
- The roster features players from 29 states, including 69 homegrown Huskers.
- Behind Nebraska, the most common states are: Georgia (8), Colorado (7), Florida (7), Texas (6), Arizona (5), California (5), Iowa (5), Missouri (5).
- The roster features 57 newcomers, including 46 true freshmen and 11 transfers, including five FBS transfers, four from Power Five programs.
- More than two-thirds of the Husker roster is underclassmen, as 105 of the 153 players are either freshmen or sophomores (69 percent).
- Nebraska has 78 freshmen on its roster, more than the sophomore, junior and senior classes combined. Fifty-one percent of NU's roster is freshmen, the fifth-highest total of any FBS team behind UCLA, Oklahoma State, Coastal Carolina and Virginia Tech, respectively.
- NU's 78 freshmen are the most of any nonservice academy team and are 12 more than the next closest team (Coastal Carolina, 66).
- Of the 153 players on the roster, 101 have joined the program since Scott Frost was hired as head coach in December of 2017 (66 percent).
- Nebraska has five sets of brothers on its 2019 roster (Brant & Brig Banks; Damion & Darrion Daniels; Carlos & Khalil Davis; Matt & Will Farniok; and Connor & Corbin Ruth). The five sets of brothers ties Clemson for the most brothers on any FBS roster.

HEAD COACH SCOTT FROST



HISTORIC TURNAROUND AT UCF

At UCF, Frost produced the greatest two-year turnaround in college football history, inheriting an 0-12 team and leading the Knights to a 13-0 record just two years later.

- In his first season in 2016, Frost made history as the only first-time head coach in FBS history to make a bowl game with a team that was winless the previous season.
- UCF tied for the national lead with a six-win improvement from the 2015 to 2016 season.
 The Knights then ranked third nationally after improving by seven wins from the 2016 to 2017 season.
- The Knights' seven-win improvement from 2016 to 2017 ranked 11th in NCAA history and marked just the second time ever a bowl team improved by more than six wins the next season.
- UCF was the American Athletic Conference and Peach Bowl champions and was the only FBS team to go undefeated in 2017.
- Frost called UCF's plays, orchestrating the greatest two-year offensive turnaround in NCAA history. The Knights went from last to fifth in total offense, improving their output by more than 260 yards per game. UCF also went from third-to-last to first in scoring offense, improving by nearly 35 points per game.

13-0 AS A PLAYER & COACH

In his second year as a head coach, Scott Frost guided UCF to a 13-0 record in 2017, when the Knights were the nation's only undefeated team.

- Frost became the fourth coach in FBS history to post a 13-0 record or better in either his first or second season as a head coach. Among that quartet, Frost is the only coach who inherited a team that won fewer than five games, as UCF went 0-12 the year before Frost's arrival.
- Frost is one of only seven active FBS head coaches who has posted a 13-0 season or better, joining Jimbo Fisher, Gary Patterson, Chris Petersen, Nick Saban, Dabo Swinney and Kyle Whittingham.
- Frost also led Nebraska to a 13-0 record and a national title as the Huskers' starting quarterback in 1997. Frost was the first person in NCAA history to be part of a 13-0 season as both a player and a head coach.

NATIONAL COACH OF THE YEAR

Frost was the consensus choice as the 2017 national coach of the year, earning the honor from at least eight different organizations.

- Frost won the 2017 Paul "Bear" Bryant Award as the national coach of the year. He joined Chris Petersen (2006 & 2009, Boise State) as the only coaches in the 32-year history of the award to win the honor while coaching a team outside of a Power Five Conference.
- Frost was also the AP Coach of the Year, becoming the sixth coach to win the award in his first or second season as a head coach.

FROST A TOP OFFENSIVE COACH

For each of the last 10 years, Scott Frost has either been an offensive assistant, offensive coordinator or head coach who calls the offensive plays. During that time, he has consistently proven to be one of the nation's finest offensive coaches.

- In 10 seasons coaching offense, Frost has worked with eight units that finished in the top 10 nationally in scoring, including seven that ranked in the top five.
- Frost has also been a part of seven teams that ranked in the top 10 nationally in total offense the past 10 seasons.

FROST A PROVEN WINNER

Frost is a proven winner. In his 12-year full-time coaching career, Frost's teams have combined for a 128-34 record.

- Frost has averaged nearly 11 wins per season and has been a part of seven 12-win teams.
- He has won seven conference titles in 12 years.
- Frost has coached in two national title games and his teams have finished with a top-10 ranking eight times in the past 12 years.
- In two seasons as UCF's head coach, the Knights were the nation's most improved team in 2016 and were the only FBS team to go undefeated in 2017.
- As a Husker quarterback, Frost was a two-time national champion who helped NU to a 36-2 record, including a 24-2 mark as a starter.
- Frost is one of four active head coaches who won a national title as a player and is the only coach who won multiple national titles.

Walters has coordinated a top-25 offense each of the past two seasons. As a player, Walters is the Pac-12's all-time leading receiver, 1999 Biletnikoff Award winner and eight-year NFL wideout, Walters has produced seven 1,000-yard receivers in his nine years coaching wide receivers.

Illinois suffered its first loss of the season last week, falling to Eastern Michigan, 34-31.

The Fighting Illini got off to a fast start with 17 first-quarter points but with under two minutes left, the game was tied at 31 and

Eastern Michigan pulled off the win with a last-second field goal.

This season, Brandon Peters is 60-for-95 with two interceptions and nine passing touchdowns. Reggie Corbin is Illinois' leading rusher with 180 yards and two touchdowns. Ricky Smalling leads the receivers with 159 yards and one touchdown. As a team, Illinois is outscoring its opponents 104-60 through three games this season.

On defense, Dele Harding leads the team with 30 total tackles. He also has one interception on the season. Oluwole Betiku Jr. leads the team with 7.5 tackles for loss and half of the team's 12.0 total sacks this season.

Nebraska and Illinois have played 16 games and Nebraska leads the series 12-3-1. The Huskers have won eight of the last 10 meetings, including the last three (2016, 2017 and 2018).

Last season, NU defeated the Illini at home 54-35, as the Huskers set their Big Ten Conference scoring record. Nebraska had 606 total yards, while the Blackshirts and special teams forced a total of five turnovers.

SERIES HISTORY

ILLINOIS FOOTBALL

Illinois has fielded a football team since 1890 and owns an overall record of 608-594-51. A member of the Big Ten Conference since the 1896 season, the Fighting Illini have a Big Ten record of 343-433-32 and have made five Rose Bowl appearances, most recently in 2008. The program claims five national titles, the most recent one came in 1951. Illinois has won 15 Big Ten titles. The most recent conference title came in 2001. The Illini hold an 8-10 record in Bowl Games and their last bowl appearance was in 2014.

Lincoln (Aug. 31) - No. 24 Nebraska forced five South Alabama turnovers, and the Cornhuskers scored three non-offensive touchdowns in the second half to post a 35-21 victory.

Leading 14-7 at halftime, the Husker defense and special teams accounted for all three second-half scores, marking the first time since 2005 that NU had scored at least three non-offensive touchdowns in a game.

On the first drive of the second half, Eric Lee Jr. intercepted a Cephus Johnson pass and returned it 38 yards for a score to push the margin to 14. The interception was the first of the Lee's career and the first defensive touchdown by the Blackshirts since 2017. After a three-and-out, JD Spielman fielded a punt, made a pair of Jaguar defenders miss and went 76 yards for his second career punt return touchdown to make it 28-7 less than four minutes into the second half.

South Alabama pulled to with 28-21 and had the ball to start the fourth quarter, but another defensive play gave NU some breathing room. Cam Taylor-Britt sacked Johnson, who coughed up the ball. Alex Davis recovered it in the end zone for a touchdown to make it 35-21.

In the game, Nebraska managed just 276 total yards, including just 66 in the second half. South Alabama produced 314 total yards on 79 plays, including 222 yards on 47 plays after halftime.

The Huskers looked sharp early on, going 81 yards on nine plays, as Jack Stoll's 42-yard reception to the USA 5-yard line set up Dedrick Mills' first TD three plays later. Stoll finished with three catches for 66 yards, as Adrian Martinez completed 13-of-22 passes for 178 yards in the win.

The teams traded touchdowns, as Johnson led the Jaguars 41 yards in nine plays, scoring from three yards out midway through the first quarter. The Huskers regained a 14-7 advantage midway through the second quarter as Mills scored from one yard out.

Senior linebacker Mohamed Barry led the Blackshirts with 12 tackles, while Taylor-Britt added five tackles, including two tackles for 16 yards lost. He also hauled in his first career interception and returned it 48 yards in the second half. Lee pitched in four tackles and the first two interceptions of his career while adding a breakup. As a team, NU produced 10 tackles for 49 yards lost, including four sacks for 32 yards.

Boulder, Colo. (Sept. 7) - Colorado scored 31 second-half points to overcome a 17-0 deficit, while James Stefanou's 34-yard field goal on the first possession of overtime gave the Buffaloes a 34-31 win over Nebraska.

Nebraska had a chance to tie in the extra session, but NU could not muster a first down before punter Isaac Armstrong's 48-yard field goal fell short.

NU controlled the first half, building a 17-point lead while out-gaining Colorado 266-84, but could not sustain the momentum.

Colorado broke into the scoring column late in the third quarter with an 11-yard touchdown run from Jaren Mangham to make it 17-7. After an Armstrong punt pinned CU at its 4-yard line, Steven Montez connected with K.D. Nixon on a 96-yard flea-flicker touchdown to pull the Buffs within 17-14.

Nebraska quickly answered, as Adrian Martinez connected with Maurice Washington on a 75-yard touchdown pass to make it 24-14.

Colorado kept coming, producing an answer of its own with a five-play, 75-yard drive that was capped by Mangham's second touchdown run - this time from seven yards out to make it 24-21. CU then came up with a big defensive play, forcing a Martinez fumble, but the Blackshirts held CU out of the end zone before Stefanou's 20-yard field goal tied the score at 24 with 8:30 left.

Martinez and the Husker offense then found an answer of their own, covering 75 yards in eight plays and 2:55, capped by Martinez's six-yard touchdown run to move back in front at 31-24 with 5:49 left.

Colorado had one final chance, going 75 yards for the driving touchdown as Montez found Tony Brown for a 26-yard scoring strike to tie the game with 46 seconds left.

Early on, Nebraska was in control, as NU went 96 yards on the first drive to take a 7-0 lead after Martinez found Spielman for a 65-yard touchdown. Spielman finished with five catches for 112 yards. Nebraska went on another long march midway through the second quarter, going 95 yards in 13 plays capped by a Martinez five-yard TD run.

The Blackshirts forced a turnover on Lamar Jackson's interception on CU's next series which Nebraska turned into a 26-yard Armstrong field goal to make it 17-0.

Lincoln (Sept. 14) - Adrian Martinez accounted for more than 300 yards of total offense and had a hand in three touchdowns, while Dedrick Mills rushed for 116 yards, as Nebraska rolled to a 44-8 win over Northern Illinois.

Martinez completed 16-of-27 passes for 257 yards and two touchdowns, and added 44 more and a score on the ground, as NU racked up 525 yards of total offense. Mills posted his first 100-yard day as a Husker, as NU tallied 238 yards on the ground.

Northern Illinois managed 350 total yards, but just 74 on the ground, as the Blackshirts surrendered just a pair of field goals on the night.

In an action-packed first half that featured big plays and blocked kicks, Nebraska powered its way to a 30-5 halftime lead.

After a 36-yard field goal by Isaac Armstrong on the first drive, NU made it 10-0 later in the first quarter, capitalizing on a Huskies' special team miscue. NIU fumbled a punt, and Austin Allen recovered at the 21-yard line. On the next play, Maurice Washington scored on a 21-yard reception. Washington's second score, a 60-yard run, made it 16-0 with 12:20 left in the half.

After NIU cut the deficit to 16-3, the Huskies failed onside kick attempt gave NU great field position. The Huskers capitalized, going 50 yards in four plays, capped by Mills' 24-yard touchdown run. The Huskers tacked on a final score in the waning seconds of the half, going 87 yards in five plays as Martinez found Kanawai Noa in the corner of the end zone for a touchdown.

The Huskies open the second half by going 66 yards before John Richardson's 27-yard field trimmed the lead to 30-8, but the Blackshirts would pitch a shutout the rest of the game. NU extended the lead in the third quarter on Martinez's 10-yard run before capitalizing on Braxton Clark's first career interception to set up the final score, a three-yard scamper by backup quarterback Noah Vedral with 4:04 remaining.

Mohamed Barry led the Blackshirts with 10 tackles. Carlos Davis notched six tackles, including 1.5 sacks, while adding a pair of breakups with deflections at the line of scrimmage. Isaiah Stalbird starred for the Husker special teams, finishing the game with three tackles, including two for loss, a forced fumble and a blocked punt.
