Nebraska plays its traditional Black Friday game at Iowa City, taking on the Hawkeyes in a Big Ten West Division battle. The matchup of border rivals will kick off at Noon central time, with television coverage on Fox.

Nebraska has played on Black Friday each year since 1990, spanning three conferences and three opponents. The Huskers were originally scheduled to host Minnesota on Black Friday in 2020, but the revised schedule released in September returned the Huskers to their regular Friday after Thanksgiving appointment with the Hawkeyes.

Nebraska comes into the game at 1-3 on the season, following a home setback against Illinois. The Huskers turned the ball over on their opening play from scrimmage and committed five turnovers in the loss. Nebraska continued to show a strong running attack against the Illini, rushing for 215 yards in the contest.

Iowa comes into Friday's game with a 3-2 record and riding a three-game winning streak. The Hawkeyes opened the season with close losses to Purdue and Northwestern, but have been dominant over the past three weeks, defeating Michigan State, Minnesota and Penn State, with two of those wins on the road.

The Hawkeyes again feature one of the Big Ten's stingiest defenses, allowing just 319.8 yards and 16.0 points per game. In its three-game winning streak, lowa has limited the opposition to just 11.7 points per game. The Hawkeyes rank in the top 20 nationally in rushing defense, pass efficiency defense, total defense and scoring defense. Iowa Head Coach Kirk Ferentz is in his 22nd season with the Hawkeyes, making him the longest-tenured head coach in the FBS ranks.

THIS WEEK'S NUMBERS

Nebraska will be playing on the Friday after Thanksgiving for the 31st consecutive season. Friday's game will mark the 10th straight season the Huskers and Hawkeyes have squared off on Black Friday.

Each of the past two Nebraska-Iowa meetings have been decided by three points with the Hawkeyes winning both contests on field goals in the final five seconds.

Senior linebacker Will Honas led Nebraska with 10 tackles against Illinois. It marked the second consecutive double-figure tackle game for Honas. This is the first time in his Nebraska career he has posted back-to-back games with 10 or more tackles.

SERIES HISTORY: NEBRASKA VS. IOWA

Nebraska leads the all-time series with Iowa 29-18-3, but the Hawkeyes have won six of the nine meetings as Big Ten Conference foes, including five straight.

- Before Nebraska joined the Big Ten in 2011, the teams met 41 times as non-conference opponents, including 14 games between 1930 and 1946. Nebraska and Iowa also met four straight years from 1979 to 1982, and the final matchups as non-conference opponents were in 1999 and 2000.
- This year's meeting will mark the 10th straight year that Nebraska and Iowa will meet on the day after Thanksgiving. The teams were originally not scheduled to play on Black Friday this season, but were paired together on their traditional day when the Big Ten announced its eight-game conference-only schedule. The programs will take a break from the Black Friday matchup in 2021, before resuming their post-Thanksgiving matchup in 2022.
- Nebraska had an eight-game win streak in the series and a pair of five-game win streaks. lowa's current five-game win streak is its longest in the series.
- Each of the past two meetings have been decided by a game-winning kick in the final seconds. In the last meeting at Kinnick Stadium in 2018, the Huskers erased a 15-point fourth-quarter deficit and tied the game with 3:22 remaining before lowa drove into position for a Miguel Recinos gamewinning, walk-off 41-yard field goal. Last year, Nebraska rallied from a 14-point third-quarter deficit to tie the game before Keith Duncan made a 48-yard field goal with one second remaining to lift lowa to a 27-24 victory.

NEBRASKA-IOWA TO COMPETE FOR HEROES TROPHY

Nebraska and Iowa will battle for the Heroes Trophy when they hit the field Friday at Kinnick Stadium. The Heroes Game is the annual trophy game between Nebraska and Iowa.

• While both teams aim to win the trophy on the field, both Nebraska and Iowa wished to make their annual meeting about more than just winning a football game. With that in mind, the schools partnered together to not only create a trophy, but to use a national stage to honor a citizen hero from each state. In addition to the trophy that will be claimed by the winner of the game, both an Iowa and Nebraska native will be honored for extraordinary acts. Those individuals will be announced later this week.

NEBRASKA CONTINUES THANKSGIVING FRIDAY TRADITION

Nebraska will continue its long-standing tradition of playing on the day after Thanksgiving. This Friday's game with lowa will mark the 31st consecutive season the Huskers have played on Thanksgiving Friday.

- Nebraska met Oklahoma in the final six seasons of the Big Eight Conference (1990 to 1995), then played Colorado in all 15 of the Huskers' Big 12 Conference years (1996 to 2010), before taking on lowa each of the 10 seasons it has been a Big Ten member, including this year.
- Nebraska is 9-5 on the road in Black Friday games since 1990, including 2-2 against the Hawkeyes.
- In addition to the past nine years, Nebraska and Iowa also closed the regular season against each other nine times from 1892 to 1916.

NOTING GAME 4

- The Illinois win ended a four-game Husker win streak in the series. Nebraska now leads the all-time series with Illinois 13-4-1.
- Quarterback Luke McCaffrey rushed 26 times for 122 yards and two touchdowns. McCaffrey had 20 carries for 93 yards in the first half. It marked McCaffrey's first career 100-yard rushing game, and he is the 100th Husker player in school history to record a 100-yard rushing game.
- McCaffrey's 26 rushing attempts were just four shy of the Nebraska record for rushing attempts by a quarterback (Jammal Lord, 30 carries at Texas A&M, 2002). The 26 attempts were the most by a Husker quarterback since that game.
- Tight end Austin Allen caught a career-high five passes for a career-best 43 yards. It marked the fourth straight game Allen has had 25 receiving yards or more. He is the first Husker tight end with 25 receiving yards or more in four straight games since Kyler Reed, who had at least 25 receiving yards in six straight games in the 2010 season.
- True freshman running back Marvin Scott made his first career start. Scott carried the ball eight times for 22 yards in the first half.
- Senior linebacker Will Honas had an 8-yard sack in the second quarter for his teamleading third sack of the 2020 season. Honas finished with a team-high 10 tackles, his second consecutive double-figure tackle game.
- Nebraska's -5 turnover margin was its worst since also having a -5 turnover margin at Purdue in 2015.

FROST IN THIRD SEASON LEADING HUSKERS

Scott Frost is in his third season at Nebraska in 2020. The consensus 2017 national coach of the year, Frost owns a 29-25 career record in five seasons as a collegiate head coach.

- Frost is 10-18 at Nebraska, with 10 losses by eight or fewer points, including eight by five or fewer points.
- Nebraska went 5-7 in 2019, a one-game improvement over the previous two seasons. NU's 12-game schedule in 2019 featured six teams that were ranked in the top 25 at least once during the season, including four that finished the year in the top 15.
- Frost has improved upon his team's previous season record every year he has been a head coach. At UCF, Frost who inherited a winless team went from 6-7 in his first season to 13-0 in year two. He improved by one game at Nebraska from 2018 to 2019.
- At UCF, Frost became the first coach in FBS history to turn a winless team into an undefeated team in just two years.
- Of Frost's 10 assistant coaches, seven have been with him in each of his five seasons as a collegiate head coach, while Mike Dawson has been on four of Frost's five staffs.
- In 14 years as a full-time assistant or head coach, Frost's teams have posted a 131-42 record, averaging more than 10 wins per season. Frost has been a part of seven conference championship teams in his 13 seasons and has twice coached in the national championship game.
- Frost's teams have been ranked in the top 15 in 10 of his 13 seasons, including eight final top-10 rankings and six final top-five rankings.

NEW FACES, NEW ROLES ON HUSKER COACHING STAFF

Seven of Nebraska's 10 full-time assistant coaches returned for their third season in 2020, and all seven have been a member of Scott Frost's staff for his entire five-year head coaching career. The Huskers also welcome two new assistant coaches this season, but both are familiar with Frost.

- Matt Lubick joined the staff as Nebraska's offensive coordinator and wide receivers coach. Lubick previously was the offensive coordinator at Pac-12 powers Oregon and Washington. He succeeded Frost as the Ducks' offensive coordinator, as Lubick was the passing game coordinator and wide receivers coach in each of Frost's three seasons as Oregon's offensive coordinator.
- The other new face on the Husker sideline is a familiar one. **Mike Dawson**, who was on Frost's staff for both seasons at UCF, coached the Husker defensive line in 2018 before moving on to the NFL in 2019, coaching outside linebackers for the New York Giants. In his return to Nebraska, Dawson coaches the outside linebackers.
- In addition to the two new full-time assistant coaches, two other staff members added responsibilities in 2020. Greg Austin added the title of run game coordinator to his duties as offensive line coach, while Ryan Held serves as recruiting coordinator in addition to continuing his role as running backs coach.
- The Husker staff features three Broyles Award nominees in defensive coordinator Erik Chinander (2016 at UCF), offensive coordinator Matt Lubick (2012 at Duke) and quarterbacks coach Mario Verduzco (2018 at Nebraska). The Broyles Award is presented annually to the nation's top assistant coach. Lubick was also named the national wide receivers coach of the year and an AFCA Assistant Coach of the Year finalist in 2012.

FROST OFFENSES TRADITIONALLY IMPRESSIVE ON OPENING DRIVES

One common theme of a **Scott Frost**-led offense has been a fast start. That trend has continued in 2020. The Huskers have scored on the opening drive of the game twice in four games. At No. 5 Ohio State, Nebraska opened the game with a four-play, 75-yard touchdown drive in just 1:51. The Huskers opened the Penn State game with an 11-play, 75-yard touchdown drive to take a 7-0 lead.

- In Frost's three seasons, Nebraska has scored on its opening possession 13 times in 28 games (12 TD, 1 FG).
- Nebraska scored on its first possession seven times in 12 games in 2018, including six of the final seven games. All seven of NU's opening scoring drives resulted in touchdowns. In 2019, the Huskers scored points on their opening drive four times in 12 games, including three touchdowns.
- Over the last four seasons 2018-20 at Nebraska and 2017 at UCF Frost's offenses have scored a touchdown on their opening possession 21 times in 41 games (51 percent). The average length of the touchdown drive in that span is 74 yards.
- In five years as a head coach, Frost's offenses have scored on their opening drive 26 times in 54 games, with 24 touchdowns and two field goals. In 94 games over eight seasons as a play-caller, Frost's offenses have scored on their first possession of the game 47 times, putting points on the board in half of their opening possessions.
- Nebraska has received the opening kickoff and scored a touchdown 10 times in 28 games under Frost. In 2018, the Huskers had a game-opening TD drive to take a 7-0 lead in five straight Big Ten games..
- Frost's Opening Drive Scoring Percentage: 50% (47 of 94 drives)
- Frost's Opening Drive Touchdown Percentage: 44% (41 of 94 drives)

QUARTERBACK DUO PROVIDING RUNNING THREAT

Nebraska quarterbacks **Adrian Martinez** and **Luke McCaffrey** have each guided the Husker offense to success in 2020. A big part of that success has been the running ability of the quarterback tandem.

- Nebraska ranks fourth in the Big Ten and 36th nationally in rushing offense, averaging 198.8 yards per game. McCaffrey (318 yards) and Martinez (195 yards) have combined for 513 of Nebraska's 795 rushing yards this season (128.3 ypg).
- Either McCaffrey (Ohio State, Penn State, Illinois) or Martinez (Northwestern) has led Nebraska in rushing in every game this season.
- In his first career start against Penn State, McCaffrey rushed 13 times for a team-high 67 yards and a touchdown. He rushed 26 times for 122 yards and two touchdowns against Illinois, posting his first career 100-yard rushing game.
- Against Northwestern, Martinez posted his fourth career 100-yard rushing game with 13 carries for 102 yards.
- Excluding sacks, the two Husker quarterbacks have combined for 537 rushing yards on 76 attempts, an average of 7.1 yards per carry.
- According to CFBstats.com, both of the quarterbacks rank among the nation's leaders in yards per rush by a quarterback. Among quarterbacks with a minimum of 15 carries in 2020, Martinez is second nationally at 6.96 yards per carry (23rd among all players), while McCaffrey ranks sixth among quarterbacks at 5.88 yards per attempt (69th among all players).

MCCAFFREY AMONG NATION'S TOP FRESHMEN

McCaffrey has shown the ability to lead the Husker offense as a redshirt freshman, after seeing just limited action at the position in 2019. McCaffrey made his first two career starts against Penn State and Illinois. In his two starts, McCaffrey has accounted for an average of 237.5 yards of total offense.

- McCaffrey ranks as Nebraska's leading rusher (317 yards) and passer (434 yards) through four games. McCaffrey is one of only 10 quarterbacks in the country to lead his team in rushing.
- McCaffrey averages 79.5 rushing yards per game. That total ranks fourth nationally among all quarterbacks and fourth among all freshmen, regardless of position.
- McCaffrey is the only freshman quarterback in the country currently leading his team in rushing.
- In the win over Penn State, McCaffrey became the first Husker quarterback to win his first career start since Tommy Armstrong Jr. won his first start as a redshirt freshman against South Dakota State in 2013. McCaffrey was the first Nebraska quarterback to defeat a conference opponent in his first career start since true freshman Cody Green led Nebraska to a 20-10 win at Baylor in 2009.

HUSKERS' YOUTH SHOWING POTENTIAL IN 2020

McCaffrey is far from the only young player making a significant impact in 2020. The Huskers have had several young players, particularly on offense, showing the ability to form a nucleus of the Husker roster for the next several seasons.

- Against both Penn State and Illinois, six of Nebraska's 11 offensive starters were either freshmen or sophomores, including four freshmen.
- Nebraska freshmen have produced 43 percent of the team's all-purpose yards in 2020.
- Several young receivers have made a big impact in 2020. True freshman Marcus Fleming led the Huskers with 75 receiving yards on five catches at Northwestern. Fellow true freshman Zavier Betts led the Huskers with 54 receiving yards against Penn State, including a 45-yard touchdown catch. True freshman Alante Brown made his first career start at receiver against Penn State and is one of Nebraska's top kickoff returners.
- Sophomore **Wan'Dale Robinson** is in his second season in the program and leads the Huskers with 21 receptions and 152 receiving yards, while adding 120 rushing yards.
- Robinson has 61 career receptions in just 14 games as a Husker. He reached 50 career receptions
 at Northwestern, hitting that milestone in just 12 games, the second-fastest of any Husker. Only
 JD Spielman reached 50 career catches (11 games) quicker than Robinson, while Nate Swift also
 caught his 50th pass in his 12th career game as a Husker.
- Senior Dedrick Mills is Nebraska's top running back, but has missed most of the past two games with an injury. He is backed up by a trio of freshmen, including true freshman **Marvin Scott III** and redshirt freshmen **Ronald Thompkins** and **Rahmir Johnson**.
- Redshirt freshmen Bryce Benhart (RT) and Ethan Piper (LG) are key members of the Husker offensive line. Benhart has started all four games at right tackle, while Piper has been in the starting lineup each of the past three games at left guard. Those three games mark just the thrid, fourth and fifth times in school history Nebraska has started a pair of freshmen offensive linemen. Current seniors Brenden Jaimes and Matt Farniok started on the same offensive line against Northwestern and Minnesota in 2017.

FROST AS A HEAD COACH

- Sophomore linebacker Luke Reimer led Nebraska in tackles at Northwestern with 10 stops, including a sack and 1.5 tackles for loss, while adding a fumble caused. Reimer added four tackles and a key sack on Penn State's final scoring threat, and has 21 tackles and 3.5 tackles for loss in 2020. Redshirt freshman Nick Henrich and true sophomore Garrett Nelson are part of the Huskers' regular rotation at outside linebacker.
- Sophomore cornerback Quinton Newsome and redshirt freshman safety Myles Farmer earned
 their first career starts at Northwestern. Farmer made the most of his first start, with a pair of
 second-quarter interceptions that led to 10 Nebraska points.

MARTINEZ NUMBERS RANKING AMONG NATION'S BEST QBS

Adrian Martinez has put up statistics in his three season that have him ranked among the Nebraska all-time leaders in several categories. Martinez has thrown for 4,846 career yards, rushed for 1,450 yards and totaled 6,296 yards of offense. He owns three NU career records, four season records and one game record. Last season, Martinez was just the second Husker sophomore to be a team captain since 1930 and he again holds that distinction this year, becoming one of just 13 two-time captains in Nebraska history.

- Martinez is Nebraska's all-time leader in total offensive yards per game (262.3) and 400-yard total offense games (4). He has produced four of Nebraska's 16 individual 400-yard total offense performances, and Martinez's career average of 262.3 yards of total offense per game is nearly 25 higher than any other Husker quarterback who played in at least 15 career games.
- Martinez averaged a school-record 295.1 yards of total offense per game as a true freshman in 2018. That average that ranked 12th nationally, led all freshmen and was the ninth-highest average by a freshman in NCAA history, including the third-best mark by a true freshman.
- Martinez also set NU season records for 300-yard total offense games (7) and 400-yard total offense games (3) in 2018.
- Martinez set an NU record with an 86.2 completion percentage against Minnesota in 2018, connecting on 25-of-29 passes for 276 yards and three touchdowns.
- At Illinois in 2019, Martinez produced the second 300-yard passing and 100-yard rushing performance in Nebraska history (328 passing, 118 rushing). His career-high 446 yards of total offense was the third-highest total in program history.
- Martinez has been one of the nation's top dual-threat quarterbacks. He is one of only 11 active FBS quarterbacks with 4,000 career passing yards and 1,000 career rushing yards. Martinez is only the fourth Husker with 4,000 career passing yards and 1,000 career rushing yards.
- In 2018, Martinez became just the sixth freshman in NCAA history to average 200 passing yards and 50 rushing yards per game and just the second true freshman to hit those marks. Martinez was also one of only four FBS quarterbacks regardless of class who averaged 225 passing yards and 50 rushing yards per game in 2018.

A TALE OF TWO LINES

Nebraska returned every offensive line starter from 2019, while the Huskers had to replace every defensive line starter. Three Huskers returned to their same spot on the offensive line this season, while senior **Matt Farniok** moved from right tackle to right guard, with redshirt freshman **Bryce Benhart** taking over at right tackle. Farniok continued to show his versatility, making a start at center against Northwestern when Cam Jurgens was sidelined. Farniok also manned the center spot in the second half against Illinois.

- Based on available records, 2020 is believed to be the first time Nebraska returned its entire starting offensive line since two-platoon systems were first allowed under NCAA rules in 1964.
- Nebraska is the only team in the country that had the same starting offensive line (by player and position) for every game during the 2019 season and returned all five of those starters.
- Nebraska had the same starting offensive line for all 12 games in 2019, one of eight teams
 nationally to start the same five linemen every game. It marked the first time since 2010 that NU
 had the same starting line for an entire season. In 2020, the Nebraska offensive line has had three
 different starting offensive lines in four games.
- Nebraska's five returning starting offensive linemen combined for 106 career starts entering the season, including three players who have made at least 20 consecutive starts at their position.
- The returning starters were led by Brenden Jaimes (28 straight starts at left tackle; 37 straight starts overall) and Matt Farniok (28 straight starts).
- Jaimes is a two-time honorable-mention All-Big Ten pick, while guard Boe Wilson was honorable
 mention in 2018 and Jurgens is the only Husker freshman (true or redshirt) to ever start at center.
- On defense, the Huskers replaced all three defensive line starters, all of whom are now on NFL rosters. The last time Nebraska had to replace its entire defensive line was in 2016.
- Ben Stille is Nebraska's most experienced defensive lineman. The senior has started 18 games
 at defensive end in his career and is the Huskers' active leader with 23 tackles for loss and 11.5
 sacks. Damion Daniels was the only other defensive lineman with a start entering 2020. Redshirt
 freshman Ty Robinson and sophomore Casey Rogers have also earned starts at defensive end.

NEBRASKA LINEBACKING CORPS A MIX OF VETERANS, YOUTH

Nebraska replaced one starting inside and outside linebacker, but the Huskers have ample experience at the second level of the defense. Overall, NU has a youth movement at linebacker, as 22 of the 29 linebackers on the Husker roster are either freshmen or sophomores.

- Outside linebackers JoJo Domann and Caleb Tannor split time as starters in 2019, and Domann had nine TFLs, the most of any returning Husker. Domann and Tannor are two of only four upperclassmen among NU's 14 outside linebackers, while sophomore Garrett Nelson has made his first three career starts this season. Domann leads the Huskers in 2020 with 31 tackles and a team-high five tackles for loss.
- Seniors **Will Honas** and **Collin Miller** split time at inside linebacker in 2019, and are the veterans in a three-man linebacker rotation. Despite missing a game, Honas ranks second on the team in 2020 with 30 tackles, including a team-high three sacks. Miller is fourth on the team with 27 tackles.
- Honas and Miller are two of the three upperclassmen among Nebraska's inside linebacker group, along with first-year junior college transfer **Eteva Mauga-Clements**. All other inside linebackers are either freshmen or sophomores.
- The linebackers have been arguably Nebraska's most improved group in 2020. The Huskers' regular group of outside and inside linebacker have combined for six sacks and 15 tackles for loss.

VETERAN SECONDARY A STRENGTH FOR 2020 BLACKSHIRTS

Nebraska's secondary was stout in 2019, as the Huskers allowed only 200.8 passing yards per game, the program's fewest yards allowed since 2012. Nebraska returned the majority of its secondary for 2020 with the exception of cornerback Lamar Jackson, now a member of the New York Jets.

- Dicaprio Bootle, a two-time All-Big Ten honoree, has started 28 consecutive games. The senior corner's 23 career pass breakups are 10th in Nebraska history.
- Cam Taylor-Britt starts at the other cornerback spot. In 2019, Taylor-Britt ranked third nationally in forced fumbles and also intercepted three passes. He added his fourth career interception against Penn State, returning it 55 yards to set up a first-quarter field goal.
- Marquel Dismuke has started all 16 games at safety the past two seasons. He led the secondary with 67 tackles last season and is third with 29 tackles this season. Dismuke had a career-high 15 tackles against Penn State, the first Husker to record 15 tackles since Antonio Reed had 15 tackles against Minnesota in 2017.
- Senior safety Deontai Williams suffered a season-ending injury in the first game of 2019. He has
 returned this season and has 18 tackles, two TFL, a sack and a 26-yard fumble return for a score
 against Penn State. Williams was a ballhawk in 2018 with two interceptions, two forced fumbles
 and a fumble recovery.

HUSKERS SHOWING SPECIAL TEAMS IMPROVEMENT

Nebraska fields an entirely new special teams unit this season - including a new special teams coach - as it aims to improve in that aspect of the game in 2020. Frost hired **Jonathan Rutledge** as Nebraska's Senior Special Teams Analyst during the offseason. With Auburn the previous two seasons, Rutledge led a Tigers' special teams unit that was ranked 13th nationally in 2019 and 14th in 2018 by Football Outsiders.

- Nebraska features a new punter (William Przystup), new place-kicker (Connor Culp), new long snappers (Cade Mueller, Cameron Pieper) and a new holder (Przystup).
- Przystup is averaging 42.8 yards per punt on the season, with five punts of better than 50 yards and five downed inside the 20-yard line. The sophomore previously punted at Michigan State in 2018 before transferring to Nebraska.
- Nebraska used six place-kickers last season and only one returned for 2020 in Lane McCallum, a
 defensive player who filled in as an emergency kicker last season and is focusing on defense this
 fall. NU added five place-kickers to its roster during the offseason, including a pair of transfers.
- Culp joined Nebraska as a graduate transfer from LSU, and he was the Tigers' starting place-kicker as a sophomore in 2017, connecting on 11-of-16 field goals. Culp has connected on 7-of-8 field goals and all seven PATs to open the season. He is the first Nebraska kicker since 2018 to have multiple field goals in consecutive games (2 at Northwestern, 3 vs. Penn State).

HUSKER STREAKS CONTINUE INTO 2020 SEASON

A pair of impressive team streaks and several individual streaks will continue this season, while a legendary streak takes a one-year hiatus in 2020.

- Nebraska has sold out 375 consecutive games at Memorial Stadium, dating from the next-to-last home game of the 1962 season through all seven home games last season. With the Big Ten Conference decision to prohibit the sale of tickets this year, the Huskers' legendary sellout streak an NCAA record will pause during the 2020 season. Nebraska's streak will remain at 375 consecutive home sellouts until next year's home opener with Buffalo on Sept. 11, 2021.
- The Huskers have scored in 311 consecutive games. The streak is the longest in school history, the seventh-longest in FBS history and the fifth-longest active streak. The last time Nebraska was shut out was a 19-0 loss at No. 17 Arizona State on Sept. 21, 1996.
- Nebraska has also scored in 343 consecutive home games, a school record. The last time the Huskers were shut out at home came on Nov. 9, 1968 against Kansas State (12-0 loss).

- Nebraska is 251-0 all-time when scoring 35 or more points at home. **Scott Frost** is also 21-0 in his head coaching career when his team scores at least 35 points.
- Several individual Huskers have double-digit streaks of consecutive starts. **Brenden Jaimes** has started 36 consecutive games overall and 27 straight at left tackle, **Dicaprio Bootle** (cornerback/safety) and **Matt Farniok** (center/right tackle/guard) have each started 27 consecutive games.

HUSKERS OWN BIG HOME-FIELD ADVANTAGE

Nebraska has enjoyed much success in its history when playing at home in front of the greatest fans in college football.

- Since 1970, NU is 281-56 (.834) at Memorial Stadium and has posted 41 perfect home seasons.
- The Huskers are 550-160-20 all-time in Lincoln (.767 in 130 years).
- Nebraska is 423-137-13 in Memorial Stadium (.750 in 97 years dating back to 1923).
- The Huskers are 47-8 all-time in Memorial Stadium night games.

NEBRASKA AMONG TOP ALL-TIME PROGRAMS

Nebraska is playing its 131st season this fall, and the Huskers boast a 903-398-40 all-time record in 1,341 games (.688). Nebraska is one of seven programs with 900 wins.

- Nebraska joined the 900-win club at Illinois on Sept. 21, 2019, along with Michigan, Ohio State, Texas and Alabama in that club. Notre Dame and Oklahoma have since joined that elite club.
- Since 1970, Nebraska owns a 469-157-5 record (.747) with five national championships. The Huskers rank second among all FBS programs in national titles and third in wins since 1970.
- Nebraska boasts 27 10-win seasons in school history, including 24 since 1970. The Huskers also
 have 12 seasons with 11 or more wins, seven seasons with 12 or more wins and three 13-win
 seasons.
- The Huskers own 50 nine-win seasons, tied with Alabama for the most in NCAA history. Fortytwo of those nine-win seasons have come since 1970 and 48 since 1962, 13 more than any other school.
- Nebraska was the first team in NCAA history to win 100 games in consecutive decades, leading the nation with 103 wins in the 1980s and ranking second with 108 wins in the 1990s.

HUSKERS RANK HIGHLY IN NATIONAL CHAMPIONSHIPS

Nebraska has won five national championships, including three outright titles (1971, 1994, 1995) and two shared championships (1970, 1997). In 1970, Nebraska was awarded the Associated Press national title, but was No. 3 in the coaches poll behind No. 1 Texas and No. 2 Ohio State, both of whom lost their bowl games (the coaches' poll was voted on before bowl games). In 1997, undefeated Nebraska was voted No. 1 in the coaches' poll, while undefeated Michigan was No. 1 in the AP poll.

- Nebraska's four AP national championships rank seventh all-time.
- The Huskers' four coaches' poll national championships rank fourth all-time.

NEBRASKA NO. 2 IN CONFERENCE TITLES

Nebraska is one of only five schools in NCAA history that has won at least 40 conference championships, ranking second all-time with 46 conference titles. In 36 seasons (1962-97) under Hall-of-Fame coaches Bob Devaney (8) and Tom Osborne (13), the Huskers won 21 conference titles.

NEBRASKA BOASTS HIGHEST-EVER GSR SCORE

Nebraska student-athletes have posted a 94 percent NCAA Graduation Success Rate (GSR), continuing the Huskers' long tradition of being a national leader in the classroom. The NCAA released its GSR scores on Nov. 17, with Nebraska recording its highest all student-athlete rate for the eighth consecutive year. It also marked the third straight year Nebraska has achieved a GSR of 90 percent or higher.

At the conference level, the 94 percent mark is tied for second among 14 Big Ten schools. On the national scale, Nebraska's GSR ranks in a tie for 10th among 65 Power Five Schools, and third among public institutions at the Power Five level.

The Husker football program continues a long tradition of ranking among national academic leaders. The football program achieved an 88 percent GSR, well above the national average of 80 percent among FBS schools. Nebraska's 88 percent GSR in football ranks 10th among public institutions at the Power Five Conference level.

The 94 percent GSR rate is another milestone for a program that has long been a national leader in academic and athletic achievement. Nebraska leads the nation with 340 CoSIDA Academic All-Americans in school history across all sports. Nebraska also leads the nation with 18 NCAA Today's Top 10 Award winners.

NEBRASKA ALSO EXCELS IN THE CLASSROOM

Nebraska's rich tradition is not limited to the field, as the Huskers have been outstanding in the classroom as well.

- Nebraska owns the NCAA record with 340 CoSIDA Academic All-Americans across all sports.
- Husker football has produced 108 CoSIDA Academic All-Americans, the most of any single sport in NCAA history.
- Nebraska owns the NCAA record with 17 NCAA Top 10 Award Winners, which is considered the "Heisman Trophy" of academics for NCAA student-athletes.
- Nebraska football has produced nine NCAA Top 10 Award winners, the most of any single team in NCAA history.
- Nebraska recorded an all-time high in the most recent NCAA Graduation Success Rate numbers released on Nov. 17. Nebraska's all-sports GSR rate of 94 percent marked the eighth consecutive year the Huskers GSR rate had improved.
- The football team posted a program-record team grade-point average of 3.297 in the 2020 spring semester. Entering this fall, the team's 3.149 cumulative GPA was also the highest in program history.
- A total of 11 Huskers are playing the 2020 season as graduates, including 10 of 18 seniors.
- Six more Huskers are on track to graduate in December. If that happens, 15 members of the 18-player senior class and two juniors will have earned their degrees before season's end.

 Nebraska is wearing a helmet decal this year in honor of George Flippin. Flippin, who lettered from 1892-94, was NU's first African-American player. He was elected a captain for the 1895 season, but did not participate in that year. Flippin went on to practice medicine in Stromsburg, Neb.

 Nebraska was scheduled to play more than half of its schedule against top-15 teams from a year ago, facing a top-15 team in five of its eight scheduled games.

- Nebraska and Arkansas are the only teams in the country that were scheduled to play more than four top-15 opponents from a season ago. Arkansas faces five 2019 top-15 opponents in 10 games, while Nebraska faces five top-15 opponents in its eight scheduled games.
- The Huskers' original 12-game schedule was altered to become a 10-game conferenceonly schedule on Aug. 5. Six days later on Aug. 11, the Big Ten Conference postponed the season. The Big Ten then announced a nine-game conference-only slate on Sept. 16.
- With a nine-game schedule, now reduced to eight games, Nebraska is set to play its fewest regular-season games since an eightgame slate in 1944. Nebraska also opened the season on its latest date (Oct. 24) since 1892.

COACHING STAFF NOTES

- Scott Frost is in his fifth season as a head coach. Frost is one of four former Husker players to return to the Nebraska sideline as head coach, and he is one of 17 FBS head coaches coaching at his alma mater in 2020.
- Nebraska's staff also includes former Huskers Greg Austin (2003-06), Ryan Held (1993-96) and Barrett Ruud (2001-04).
- Frost is one of only four FBS head coaches to win a national title as a player. Both Frost (1995 & 1997) and Ryan Held (1994 & 1995) were two-time national champions as players at Nebraska.
- Frost and seven of his 10 assistant coaches are in their fifth consecutive season working together, including two seasons at UCF.
- There are two new addition to the staff in 2020.
 Matt Lubick is in his first season as the Huskers'
 offensive coordinator and wide receivers coach.
 Mike Dawson, who spent the 2016 and 2017
 seasons on Frost's UCF staff and the 2018
 season on Frost's Nebraska staff, returns to
 Lincoln to coach the outside linebackers.

• Frost was the consensus choice as the 2017 national coach of the year, while offensive coordinator Matt Lubick was a finalist for AFCA Assistant Coach of the Year in 2012. Defensive coordinator Erik Chinander was a nominee for the 2016 Broyles Award and quarterbacks coach Mario Verduzco was a Broyles Award nominee in 2018.

ROSTER NOTES

- Nebraska's roster features 154 players. NU is believed to have the largest roster of any non-service academy in the country.
- The roster features players from 27 states, including 64 homegrown Huskers. Besides Nebraska, the states with at least five players on the roster are: Florida (10), Georgia (8), lowa (8), Texas (7), Colorado (6), Arizona (5) and Oklahoma (5).
- The roster also features three players from foreign countries in Daniel Cerni (Australia), Barron Miles Jr. (Canada) and Nouredin Nouili (Germany).
- The roster features 53 newcomers, including 39 true freshmen and 14 transfers. NU added five FBS transfers - four from Power Five teams - one FCS transfer and eight junior college transfers.
- More than two-thirds of the Husker roster is underclassmen, as 109 of the 154 players are either freshmen or sophomores (71 percent).
- Nebraska has 79 freshmen on its roster, more than the sophomore, junior and senior classes combined. Fifty-one percent of NU's roster is freshmen, the second straight season freshmen have made up more than half of the roster.
- Nebraska has four sets of brothers on its 2020 roster (Brant & Brig Banks; lan & Nate Boerkircher; Matt & Will Farniok; Connor & Corbin Ruth). The four sets of brothers ties for the second-most brothers on any FBS roster.
- The Husker team captains are seniors Dicaprio Bootle, Matt Farniok and Collin Miller and juniors Adrian Martinez and Kade Warner. Farniok and Martinez are serving as captains for the second straight season.

HEAD COACH SCOTT FROST



HISTORIC TURNAROUND AT UCF

At UCF, Frost produced the greatest two-year turnaround in college football history, inheriting an 0-12 team and leading the Knights to a 13-0 record just two years later.

- In his first season in 2016, Frost made history as the only first-time head coach in FBS history to make a bowl game with a team that was winless the previous season.
- UCF tied for the national lead with a six-win improvement from the 2015 to 2016 season.
 The Knights then ranked third nationally after improving by seven wins from the 2016 to 2017 season.
- The Knights' seven-win improvement from 2016 to 2017 ranked 11th in NCAA history and marked just the second time ever a bowl team improved by more than six wins the next season.
- UCF was the American Athletic Conference and Peach Bowl champions and was the only FBS team to go undefeated in 2017.
- Frost called UCF's plays, orchestrating the greatest two-year offensive turnaround in NCAA history. The Knights went from last to fifth in total offense, improving their output by more than 260 yards per game. UCF also went from third-to-last to first in scoring offense, improving by nearly 35 points per game.

13-0 AS A PLAYER & COACH

In his second year as a head coach, Scott Frost guided UCF to a 13-0 record in 2017, when the Knights were the nation's only undefeated team.

- Frost became the fourth coach in FBS history to post a 13-0 record or better in either his first or second season as a head coach. Among that quartet, Frost is the only coach who inherited a team that won fewer than five games, as UCF went 0-12 the year before Frost's arrival.
- Frost is one of only seven active FBS head coaches who has posted a 13-0 season or better, joining Jimbo Fisher, Ed Orgeron, Gary Patterson, Nick Saban, Dabo Swinney and Kyle Whittingham.
- Frost also led Nebraska to a 13-0 record and a national title as the Huskers' starting quarterback in 1997. Frost was the first person in NCAA history to be part of a 13-0 season as both a player and a head coach.

NATIONAL COACH OF THE YEAR

Frost was the consensus choice as the 2017 national coach of the year, earning the honor from at least eight different organizations.

- Frost won the 2017 Paul "Bear" Bryant Award as the national coach of the year. He joined Chris Petersen (2006 & 2009, Boise State) as the only coaches in the 32-year history of the award to win the honor while coaching a team outside of a Power Five Conference.
- Frost was also the AP Coach of the Year, becoming the sixth coach to win the award in his first or second season as a head coach.

FROST A TOP OFFENSIVE COACH

For each of the last 12 years, Scott Frost has either been an offensive assistant, offensive coordinator or head coach who calls the offensive plays. During that time, he has consistently proven to be one of the nation's finest offensive coaches.

- In 11 previous seasons coaching offense, Frost has worked with eight units that finished in the top 10 nationally in scoring, including seven that ranked in the top five.
- Frost has also been a part of seven teams that ranked in the top 10 nationally in total offense the past 11 seasons.

FROST A PROVEN WINNER

Frost is a proven winner. In his 14-year full-time coaching career, Frost's teams have combined for a 132-43 record.

- Frost teams have averaged more than 10 wins per season, including seven 12-win campaigns.
- He has won seven conference titles in 13 years.
- Frost has coached in two national title games and his teams have finished with a top-10 ranking eight times in the past 13 years.
- In two seasons as UCF's head coach, the Knights were the nation's most improved team in 2016 and were the only FBS team to go undefeated in 2017.
- As a Husker quarterback, Frost was a two-time national champion who helped NU to a 36-2 record, including a 24-2 mark as a starter.
- Frost is one of four active head coaches who won a national title as a player and is the only coach who won multiple national titles.

Kirk Ferentz is in his 22nd year as head football coach at the University of Iowa, and 31st season overall at the University. With Iowa's 33-7 win over Northern Illinois in the opening game of the 2018 season, Ferentz recorded win No. 144 as Iowa's head coach, surpassing the late Hayden Fry as the winningest football coach in program history.

Ferentz is the longest tenured head football coach in the nation. Under Ferentz' leadership the lowa football program has made 17 bowl game appearances since 2001.

Ferentz has guided the Hawkeyes to eight wins or more each of the past five seasons and 12 seasons overall since 2003. Iowa has appeared in 11 January bowl games under Ferentz. The Hawkeyes have won three straight bowl games for the second time under Ferentz (2008-10 and 2017-19).

lowa began playing football in 1889, one year before Nebraska. The Hawkeyes have won more than 660 all-time games. Iowa claims five national championships in 1921, 1922, 1956, 1958 and 1960. The Hawkeyes have also won 11 Big Ten Conference championships, with the first coming in 1900 and the most recent in 2004. Four of the 11 Big Ten titles have been outright titles, while the other seven have all be co-championships. Iowa has appeared in 33 bowl games and has had one Heisman Trophy winner, Nile Kinnick in 1939.

Recently, Iowa is perhaps best known for its coaching stability. The Hawkeyes have had only two coaches since 1979. Hayden Fry led Iowa to a 143-89-6 record in 20 seasons from 1979 to 1998, and Kirk Ferentz is 162-104 with the Hawkeyes since his first season in 1999.

Columbus, Ohio (Oct. 24) - Adrian Martinez and Luke McCaffrey combined for 165 rushing yards, but Nebraska was unable to keep pace in a 52-17 loss to fifth-ranked Ohio State.

Nebraska generated 370 yards of total offense, including 210 rushing yards and 160 passing yards, as McCaffrey tallied 80 yards on nine carries, including a 47-burst on Nebraska's opening drive. His run set up a 10-yard touchdown trot for Martinez to cap a four-play, 75-yard drive to give NÚ an early lead. Martinez finished with a team-high 85 rushing yards on 13 carries for the Big Red. Martinez added an efficient passing day by completing 12-of-15 passes for 105 yards, while McCaffrey completed 4-of-5 passes for 55 yards.

While Nebraska's quarterbacks combined to complete 16-of-20 passes, Ohio State's Justin Fields was even more efficient, completing 20-of-21 passes

for 276 yards and two TDs. Fields added 15 carries for 54 yards and another

After Nebraska took a quick 7-0 lead, Fields pushed the Buckeyes down the field for an 11-play, 75-yard drive in 5:05 to tie the score. NU tied the score at 14 midway through the second quarter on Dedrick Mills' three-yard touchdown run. Ohio State answered with an 11-play drive of its own that covered 71 yards, but Nebraska held and forced a 34-yard Blake Haubeil field goal with 3:12 left in the half. NU struggled on its next possession, and OSU took advantage, going 46 yards in just five plays capped by a Master Teague III six-yard run to put the Buckeyes ahead 24-14. OSU extended its lead on the opening series of the second half, as Fields' 17-yard run put the Buckeyes ahead 31-14.

The three consecutive scores by Ohio State in just 6:48 of game time put Nebraska in a must-score position on its opening drive of the second half, and the Huskers started marching. However, on the sixth play of Nebraska's drive, Martinez fumbled at the OSU 45, and Sevyn Banks scooped up the ball and raced 55 yards for a touchdown to give Ohio State a 38-14 lead. Nebraska ended Ohio State's surge with a 22-yard Connor Culp field goal with 3:56 left in the period to send the Huskers to the fourth trailing 38-17. OSU added a pair of fourth-quarter touchdowns to complete the scoring.

Evanston, III. (Nov. 7) - In another game between Nebraska and Northwestern that came down to the final play, Luke McCaffrey's pass to Wan'Dale Robinson fell incomplete as the Wildcats escaped with a 21-13 win.

Nebraska lost despite putting up 442 yards of total offense and 28 first downs against Northwestern, while holding the Wildcats to just 317 total yards.

The Huskers led 13-7 at the half, but Peyton Ramsey threw a pair of secondhalf touchdowns passes for Northwestern, including a 10-yard pass to Riley Lees with 9:53 left.

Nebraska had two opportunities to get the tying score in the fourth quarter, but could not crack the end zone. Luke MaCaffrey drove the Huskers down the field, and Nebraska had the ball first-and-goal at the Northwestern 3-yard line and had another first and goal at the Wildcat 2, but Chris Bergin's interception snuffed out the drive.

After forcing a punt, the Huskers got the ball back at their 8-yard line with 2:14 remaining. NU eventually got the ball to the Wildcat 14, but his fourthdown incompletion on fourth-and-4 with five seconds left ended the Huskers' scoring threat. McCaffrey completed 12-of-16 passes for 93 yards in just over one quarter of action, while added 49 yards on eight carries. Adrian Martinez led the Nebraska ground game with 102 yards on 13 carries, while adding 125 yards by completing 12-of-27 passes.

Northwestern jumped out to a 7-0 lead on Drake Anderson's 41-yard run, capping a seven-play, 80-yard drive. The Huskers chipped away, getting two Connor Culp field goals to pull within 7-6 midway through the second quarter.

Late in the second quarter, Myles Farmer gave the Big Red their best opportunity of the day, intercepting a Peyton Ramsey pass and taking it down to the Northwestern 3. Dedrick Mills scored on the next play to give the Huskers a 13-7 lead with 1:25 left in the half.

Farmer, making his first career start, picked off two Ramsey passes for Nebraska, while Luke Reimers added a career-high 10 stops and a sack for the Big Red.

Northwestern went back in front with its opening drive of the second half. Ramsey found John Raine on a two-yard pass to cap a 10-play, 61-yard drive that used up 4:57 to put the Wildcats up 14-13 with 9:53 left in the third. Ramsey, who went 16-of-27 for 169 yards and two scores, added his second

scoring toss early in the third quarter to stake the Wildcats an eight-point cushion.

Lincoln (Nov. 14) - Nebraska's defense helped the Huskers build a 27-6 halftime lead and preserved it with a pair of fourth-quarter stands in a 30-23 victory over Penn State.

Nebraska held a 30-23 lead after Penn State's Devyn Ford scored on a five-yard touchdown with 9:30 left. The Husker defense made the margin stand by snuffing out a pair of Penn State drives inside the Husker red zone in the final five minutes.

The Nittany Lions got the ball at the NU 48 with 7:39 left after a Brandon Smith interception. PSU quarterback Will Levis led the Lions to the NU 11, but the Huskers forced four consecutive incompletions, culminating with a Marquel Dismuke breakup on fourth down.

After a Husker punt, PSU marched from its own 31 to the NU 9 on its final drive before the Blackshirts stiffened. After a pair of incompletions, Luke Reimer sacked Levis on third down before Ben Stille pressured Levis into an incompletion to seal NU's first win of 2020.

Dismuke recorded a career-high 15 tackles, including a tackle for loss to o along with his breakup, as four Huskers totaled double-figure tackles. The Blackshirts also forced two turnovers that led to 10 points, including a 26-yard scoop and score from Deontai Williams.

NU jumped out quickly, as Luke McCaffrey led NU on an 11-play, 75-yard drive to open the game. McCaffrey accounted for 69 yards on the drive, including a key 12-yard run to keep the chains moving. On Penn State's first possession, Cam Taylor-Britt intercepted a Sean Clifford pass and returned it 55 yards to the PSU 15 to set up a 22-yard field goal by Connor Culp, one of three for the Husker kicker on the day.

PSU was within 10-3 in the opening minute of the second quarter before the Huskers struck for 14 points in a 2:32 span. Freshman Zavier Betts got into the scoring column, taking a flip from McCaffrey and racing 45 yards for a TD, capping a 3-play, 65-yard drive. On the next drive, the Williams strip sack and score extended the margin to 21 with 11:29 left in the half.

McCaffrey picked up a victory in his first career start, completing 13-of-21 passes for 152 yards and a touchdown. He also rushed 13 times for 67 yards and another score. Wan'Dale Robinson added a season-high 16 carries for 60 yards while catching five passes. NU was out-gained 501-298, but the Blackshirts allowed just 16 points on Penn State's six red zone trips.

Lincoln (Nov. 21) - Nebraska committed five turnovers, and visiting Illinois converted the miscues into 17 points in a 41-23 victory over the Huskers.

Luke McCaffrey rushed for 122 yards and two touchdowns on 26 carries while

adding 134 yards on 15-of-26 passing but threw three interceptions and fumbled on the game's first play from scrimmage. Three plays and 21 yards later, Chase Brown's three-yard scoring run put Illinois up 7-0 just 1:29 into the game.

Nebraska regrouped as McCaffrey engineered a 12-play, 71-yard march that

culminated with his five-yard touchdown run to tie the game at seven.

Illinois regained the lead on its next drive, as Brown's second touchdown of the day made it 14-7. Nebraska was driving on its next possession, but McCaffrey's fourth-down pass was intercepted by Tarique Barnes at the Illinois 35.The Illini would take advantage, going 65 yards in seven plays, as Brandon Peters found Josh Imatorbhebhe on a 28-yard touchdown pass to make it 21-7.

Nebraska pulled to within 21-10 after a Connor Culp field goal, but Illinois answered with a four-play, 89-yard drive, highlighted by a 58-yard run by Mike Epstein, who scored from one yard out two plays later.

The Fighting Illini finished with 490 total yards, including 285 on the ground and 205 yards passing. Brown finished the game with 110 yards and two touchdowns, while Epstein added 113 yards. Brandon Peters completed 18-of-25 passes for while Epstein added 113 yards. Will Honas led the Nebraska defense with 10 total tackles, including a sack, another half TFL and a hurry, while JoJo Domann added eight tackles including a pair of TFLs and breakup.
