HUSKERS READY FOR CHALLENGING FIELD AT MARY NUTTER

The Nebraska softball team (5-4) will head west to Cathedral City, Calif., for the Mary Nutter Collegiate Classic this weekend. The Huskers will play five games from Feb. 21 to 23 and will face some of their toughest opponents of the season. Nebraska plays three of the top 10 teams in the country which include No. 2 Washington and No. 3 Oklahoma.

A pair of former Big 12 foes, the Huskers and Sooners will clash on Feb. 21 at 12:30 p.m. CT. Later that day, Nebraska will take on BYU at 5:30 p.m. CT. On Saturday, Nebraska will compete against Cal and second-ranked Washington at 4:30 p.m. CT and 7 p.m. CT, respectively. The weekend will conclude on Sunday against No. 7/9 Florida (11 a.m. CT).

SCOUTING THE OPPONENTS

One of the most dominant programs in recent history, third-ranked Oklahoma is off to a hot start in 2020 after a runner-up finish at the 2019 Women's College World Series. The Sooners have just one loss through nine games so far this season.

OU returns 2019 NFCA All-Americans Jocelyn Alo and Grace Green. Both have started all nine games for the Sooners. Green ranks third on the team with a batting average of .357, while Alo is

hitting .346. Reigning Big 12 Player of the Week Lynnsie Elam is hitting .346 as well.

BYU enters the weekend with a 5-4 record and will play UC Riverside and Notre Dame on Thursday before facing the Huskers on Friday.

BYU is coming off a 3-2 outing at the Campbell Cartier Tournament in San Diego after splitting a pair of games with both San Diego State and Cal State Fullerton and beating Southern Utah.

On offense, BYU is not a power team. The Cougars have just three home runs on the season and are slugging .327.

Cal has a 6-4 record and will have the opportunity to pick up three more wins before the game against Nebraska. The Bears take on Saint Mary's on Wednesday before competing against Auburn and Missouri at Mary Nutter prior to the match up with the Huskers.

Most recently, Cal went 3-2 at the Fresno State Tournament, beating Fordham and Saint Mary's twice and falling to Fresno State and Cal Poly.

Washington returns two NFCA All-Americans from its 2019 squad that placed third at the WCWS in catcher Morganne Flores and pitcher Gabbie Plain.

Flores has started all 11 games so far this season and is hitting .361 on the year. She leads

the team with three home runs, 13 RBIs and a .722 slugging percentage.

Senior Taryn Atlee is hitting a team-high .467 through 11 starts this season. She has 12 runs and 14 hits - all team bests.

The Gators lost All-Americans Kelly Barnhill (pitcher) and Amanda Lorenz (outfielder), but return All-American utility player Kendyl Lindaman. Lindaman earned third-team honors in 2019 after transferring from Minnesota.

In 2020, Lindaman has started the first 12 games and ranks third on the team with a .394 batting average.

Sophomore Charla Echols leads the Gators with a .500 batting average through 12 starts and a .917 slugging percentage. She has 12 runs, 1 hits, four homers and 18 RBIs - all team highs.

NU SET FOR 55-GAME SCHEDULE

Nebraska is scheduled to play 55 games in 2020, including 18 home games, 20 road games and 17 games at a neutral site.

HUSKERS TRAVEL TO 11 STATES IN 2020

Nebraska will travel to 10 states this season, playing games in Arizona, California, Georgia, Illinois, Kansas, Maryland, Michigan, Minnesota, Missouri, Nebraska and New Mexico.

NU SET FOR SIX OF GAMES AGAINST 2019 WCWS TEAMS

Nebraska is slated to play four of the eight teams that advanced to the Women's College World Series last season, Oklahoma, Florida, Washington and Minnesota. The Huskers will see the first three at the Mary Nutter Collegiate Classic, before traveling to Minnesota for a three-game conference series against the Golden Gophers. Additionally, Nebraska will play six more teams that made it to the NCAA Tournament in 2019 when the team takes on Arkansas, Arizona State, BYU, Illinois, Missouri and Wisconsin.

HOME SWEET HOME

Nebraska hosts a 10-game homestand in April and 2020 is the fourth straight year the Huskers have played at least 10 home games in one month.

ILLINOIS HOSTS BIG TEN TOURNAMENT

The 2020 Big Ten Tournament is set for May 7-9 at Illinois' Eichelberger Field. The top 12 teams in the final regular-season standings will compete in the tournament, with the top four seeds earning a bye.

POSTSEASON FORMAT UNCHANGED

The NCAA Tournament will feature a 64-team field for the 18th consecutive season in 2020 and will include a regional-super regional format for the 16th straight year, with super regionals lasting three days.

OKC HOSTS WCWS

The 2020 Women's College World Series will be held at ASA Hall of Fame Stadium in Oklahoma City for the 23rd straight season and the 30th time overall.

SEASON NOTEBOOK

HUSKERS ADD OREGON STATE TRANSFER

During the offseason, Nebraska added junior infielder Cam Ybarra to its roster. Ybarra spent two seasons at Oregon State before coming to Nebraska.

As a sophomore in 2019, Ybarra appeared in 35 games, which included 31 starts. The Mission Viejo, Calif., native spent most of the season as the designated player. Hitting in the three spot, Ybarra averaged .326 in Pac-12 play, which ranked second on the team. Overall, Ybarra recorded 23 hits and 10 RBIs, while leading the team with nine doubles. In her first season with the Beavers, Ybarra started all 53 games at second base and was named to the Pac-12 All-Freshman and All-Defensive teams. She hit .226 overall and .259 in conference-only games. Ybarra registered 35 hits, scored 14 runs, had five doubles, three homers and 14 RBIs in 2018.

REVELLE REACHES CAREER MILESTONE

On Feb. 8, Nebraska smashed UTEP 16-3 in a five-inning run-rule win. With the win, the Huskers gave Head Coach Rhonda Revelle her 1,000th win overall as a head coach. This includes her eight wins with Nebraska Wesleyan in 1987. Revelle became the 14th active D1 coach to claim 1,000 career victories.

NEBRASKA NICE

The 2020 Husker roster includes nine native Nebraskans, which ties for the most in Rhonda Revelle's 28 seasons as Nebraska's head coach. The Huskers had nine Nebraskans on the 2019 roster as well. Previously, Nebraska had never had more than eight Nebraskans on its roster under Revelle.

The group consists of juniors Olivia Ferrell, Rylie Unzicker and Sarah Yocom, sophomores Payton Huscroft, Carson Fischer, Peyton Glatte, Karlee Seevers and Courtney Wallace and freshman Brooke Andrews.

SUPPORT STAFF UPDATE

Nebraska's Volunteer Coach, former All-American and professional player Taylor Edwards will not be seen in the dugout this spring as she was named to Team USA and will represent the United States in the 2020 Tokyo Olympics this summer. Edwards spent last season as NU's volunteer coach and was with the team up until January before leaving to train with Team USA.

Former Howard pitcher Mackenzi Steele begins her first season as a graduate manager. Steele played under former Husker Tori Tyson at Howard.

YOUNG PITCHING STAFF IN 2020

Nebraska's core pitching staff consists of junior Olivia Ferrell and sophomores Lindsey Walljasper and Courtney Wallace.

Ferrell enters the season as Nebraska's most experienced pitcher with 168.2 innings pitched over the last two years. She leads the group with 49 career appearances.

In 2018, Ferrell became the first Husker freshman pitcher to start a season opener against a ranked opponent when she kicked off the season against No. 19 BYU. She'll help lead a pitching staff as the only upperclassmen this season.

With only one upperclassmen pitcher, Wallace and Walljasper are expected to carry a large load this season. While they are young, the duo saw a lot of action and impacted the team right away as freshman in 2019. Walljasper made a team-high 31 appearances and racked up 91 strikeouts. Wallace appeared 29 times which ranked second on the team and recorded 63 strikeouts.

Sophomore Karlee Seevers also adds depth to the pitching staff in 2020.

IT'S IN THE CLUB

Several Huskers have been teammates long before arriving in Lincoln, playing together in high school and on the same club team. California natives Tristen Edwards, Cam Ybarra and Keana "KP" Pola played for the Corona Angels. In Nebraska, Rylie Unzicker, Payton Huscroft, Olivia Ferrell, Carson Fischer, Peyton Glatte, Courtney Wallace and Brooke Andrews all played for Nebraska Gold.

SENIOR TRISTEN EDWARDS WILL LEAD HUSKER OFFENSE IN 2020

Senior outfielder Tristen Edwards returns for her senior season in 2020 after an explosive junior campaign. Edwards earned back-to-back first-team All-Big Ten honors in 2018 and 2019. She also was an NFCA All-Region pick in 2019.

Nebraska's best hitter in 2019, Edwards led the team with a .376 batting average, a .758 slugging percentage, 42 runs, 56 hits, 12 doubles, 15 homers, 50 RBIs and 33 walks.

EDWARDS GAINES NATIONAL ATTENTION

Edwards was one of 50 players nationally named to the preseason USA Softball Player-of-the-Year Watch List. She became the first Husker on the watch list since former All-American MJ Knighten.

WALLACE, WALLJASPER RETURN AFTER BIG FRESHMEN SEASONS IN 2019

Sophomore pitchers/utility players Courtney Wallace and Lindsey Walljasper had impressive freshman seasons in 2019 both offensively and defensively and look to build upon that momentum in 2020.

Wallace played in 47 games last season and hit .227. She tied a Nebraska single-game record with two triples in two separate games. She became the first Husker to record multiple triples in multiple games. The Omaha, Neb., native finished the season with four triples which tied for second in school history among freshman and tied for 10th in school history across all classes.

Lindsey Walljasper started in the circle in the 2019 season opener, becoming just the third freshman to start a season opener since 1995. She saw the most action in 2019, pitching 106.1 innings and recorded a team-high 91 strikeouts.

At the plate, Walljasper hit .255 which ranked second among freshman and fourth overall among regular hitters.

NEBRASKA NOTES

HUSKER HISTORY AT MARY NUTTER

Nebraska is competing in the Mary Nutter Collegiate Classic for the 10th straight season and the 11th time overall. Nebraska owns a 20-27 record at the tournament. Nebraska is 8-19 all-time vs. ranked teams at the event. Nebraska has defeated one ranked team in eight of the last nine years at the Mary Nutter Collegiate Classic. Seventeen of Nebraska's last 21 losses at the Mary Nutter Collegiate Classic have come to a ranked team.

Last season, Nebraska went 1-4, defeating BYU and falling to San Diego State, No. 13 Arizona State and No. 2 UCLA.

A LOADED FIELD IN CATHEDRAL CITY

This weekend, Nebraska will face its toughest battles yet. The Huskers play a total of five games in three days and will take on three top 10 teams and two of the top three times in the country in both the NFCA poll and the USA Softball poll. Nebraska plays No. 2 Washington, No. 3 Oklahoma, No. 7/9 Florida, BYU and Cal.

NEW FACES MAKING IMMEDIATE IMPACT

Several new additions to the roster have already made an immediate impact on the team through the first nine games.

Oregon State transfer Cam Ybarra has started every game at second base for the Huskers. In the opening weekend, Ybarra ranks second on the team with a .323 batting average and leads the Huskers with four doubles. Additionally, Ybarra started her Husker career with an eight-game hit streak.

Freshmen Brooke Andrews and Keana "KP" Pola have both played in eight games, with Pola making seven starts and Andrews making six.

EDWARDS OFF TO A HOT START

As expected, senior Tristen Edwards has been impressive throughout the first two weekends. Edwards leads the Huskers with a .367 batting average, a .867 slugging percentage, 11 runs, 11 hits and four home runs.

In Nebraska's opening weekend at the Troy Cox Classic in Las Cruces, N.M. last weekend and was named the Big Ten Player of the Week for her efforts. Edwards started all five games and led the team at the plate going 7-for-16 (.438) with nine runs and five RBIs. She drew five walks to finish with an on-base percentage of .550 and slugged 1.313 with two doubles and four homers.

The four home runs brings her career total to 35 which is tied for sixth in school history. Additionally, her six extra-base hits on the weekend brings her career total to 70 which ranks eighth in school history.

Nebraska has won 62 games in its 24 NCAA Tournament appearances while posting an overall record of 62-52 (.544 winning percentage). The Huskers' 62 postseason wins rank 19th in NCAA history.

30 ACADEMIC ALL-AMERICANS

A total of 22 Huskers have combined to earn 30 CoSIDA Academic All-America honors, including eight first-team accolades. The 30 academic All-Americans are the most of any softball program in the country and rank third among all female athletic programs in NCAA history.

27 ALL-AMERICANS

Nebraska has produced 27 All-Americans in school history, including eight first-team All-Americans, seven two-time honorees and a pair of three-time All-Americans.

24 NCAA TOURNAMENT APPEARANCES

In the 39 years softball has been an NCAA sport, the Huskers have made 24 appearances in the NCAA Tournament, including 13 straight from 1995 to 2007. Nebraska's 24 postseason appearances rank 13th in NCAA history.

21 ALL-AMERICANS UNDER REVELLE

In her first 27 years as Nebraska's head coach, Rhonda Revelle has guided 13 players to a total of 21 All-America honors.

19 CONFERENCE TITLES

Nebraska has won 19 conference titles in its 43 seasons as a varsity sport. The Huskers won 12 Big Eight titles, six Big 12 crowns and captured their first Big Ten title in 2014.

15 TOP-25 NATIONAL RANKINGS

Nebraska has been ranked in the final NFCA poll in 15 of the 26 years the poll has existed. The Huskers were one of only six teams nationally to be ranked in the final poll in each of the first 12 years it existed (1995 to 2006).

14 REVELLE ACADEMIC ALL-AMERICANS

Rhonda Revelle has produced 14 academic All-Americans in her first 27 seasons at Nebraska. Over that time frame, Revelle has produced the fourth-highest total of academic All-Americans of any coach in the country.

A total of five former Huskers have competed in the Olympics, beginning with Lori Sippel at the 1996 Olympics in Atlanta. The 2008 Beijing Olympics and the 2004 Athens Games featured a pair of former Huskers. Taylor Edwards will represent Nebraska as part of Team USA in the 2020 Tokyo Olympics.

N OPPONENT SCOUTING REPORTS

NO. 3 OKLAHOMA (8-1)

One of the most dominant programs in recent history, third-ranked Oklahoma is off to a hot start in 2020 after a runner-up finish at the 2019 Women's College World Series. The Sooners have just one loss through nine games so far this season.

OU returns 2019 NFCA All-Americans Jocelyn Alo and Grace Green. Both have started all nine games for the Sooners. Green ranks third on the team with a batting average of .357, while Alo is hitting .346. Reigning Big 12 Player of the Week Lynnsie Elam is hitting .346 as well.

While the Sooners lost six seniors from the 2019 squad, several newcomers are stepping up in big ways for OU this season. Freshman catcher Kinzie Hansen leads the starters with a .394 batting average, while classmate Rylie Boone leads the team with a .467 batting average in four starts.

In the circle, Oklahoma brings back a two-time first-team All-America pick in senior Giselle "G" Juarez. While Juarez has only pitched 2.2 innings in 2020, the lefty finished 2019 with a 1.39 ERA and a 28-4 record. She pitched 186.1 innings and finished with 269 strikeouts. She finished the 2019 season ranked second in OU career history in opponent batting average (.151) and strikeouts per seven innings pitched (10.11) and ninth in walks per seven innings pitched (1.31) and ERA (1.39).

Fellow senior Shannon Saile has done most of the work so far this season. She has pitched a team-high 23.2 innings through nine appearances and has a team-high 35 strikeouts. With a record of 2-1, Saile has an ERA of 0.59.

BYU (5-4)

BYU enters the weekend with a 5-4 record and will play UC Riverside and Notre Dame on Thursday before facing the Huskers on Friday.

BYU is coming off a 3-2 outing at the Campbell Cartier Tournament in San Diego after splitting a pair of games with both San Diego State and Cal State Fullerton and beating Southern Utah.

On offense, BYU is not a power hitting team. The Cougars have just three home runs on the season and are slugging .327.

Senior outfielder Rylee Jensen-McFarland leads the starters with a .321 batting average. She has a team-best nine hits and has seven RBIs which rank second on the team. She also has the team's only triple and one of BYU's three home runs on the season.

In the circle, BYU has given up just 14 earned runs in nine games and has a team ERA of 1.63. Aris Paulson has pitched 23.0 innings and has a 3-0 record with an ERA of 0.91. She also has 20 strikeouts on the season.

However, with a fielding percentage of .961, the Cougars are averaging one unearned run a game.

Amani Bradley and Makena Smith have both started all 10 games for the Bears. Bradley ranks second overall on the team with a .412 batting average, while Smith is hitting .400. Kacey Zobac has an average of .429 and is slugging a team-high .619 through seven starts.

In the circle, Alexandra Perez and Chloe Romero are handling most of the work. Together, the pair has pitched all but 0.1 inning this season. Perez has a record of 4-3 with a 2.89 ERA while Romero is 2-1 with a 2.92 ERA. Perez also leads the team with 21 strikeouts, while Romero has 14.
