HUSKERS SET FOR FIVE GAMES AT ASU INVITATIONAL

The Nebraska softball team (8-10) will travel to Tempe, Ariz., this weekend for its last major non-conference road trip. The Huskers will play five games as part of the ASU invitational from March 6-8. NU begins the trip against Oregon State Friday at 10 a.m. CT followed by a game against Wright State at 12:30 p.m. CT. On Saturday, the Huskers will play Lehigh (3 p.m. CT) and host-school Arizona State (5:30 p.m. CT). Nebraska will conclude the tournament on Sunday with a game against New Mexico State. First pitch against the Aggies is set for 11 a.m. CT.

SCOUTING THE OPPONENTS

Oregon State has a record of 14-7 but will play Wright State on Thursday before playing the Huskers on Friday.

As a team, OSU is hitting .252 but has three hitters that are batting at least .300. Mariah Mazon has a team-high .377 average, while Missy Nunes and Xiao Gin are hitting .348 and .328, respectively. Mazon, Nunes and Gin have started all 21 games for Oregon State so far this season. However for OSU, the story is in the circle. The Oregon State pitching staff has been impressive in 2020 with a team ERA of just

1.30. The Beavers have given up just 27 earned runs and are averaging under 2.0 runs a game. Additionally, OSU is averaging more than eight strikeouts a game.

Wright State has a record of 5-8 but will have the opportunity to pick up two more wins before seeing the Huskers The Raiders face Oregon State and Arizona State on Thursday. Emily Daniel leads WSU at the plate with a .515 batting average. Daniel has started all 13 games and has a team-best 12 runs, 17 hits and three doubles. Daniel is also adding six RBIs and has a slugging percentage of .606.

Lehigh is 6-4 heading into the Arizona State Invitational. Last weekend, the Mountain Hawks went 3-2 at the NC State Invitational in Raleigh, N.C. Lehigh lost to host school NC State and beat North Carolina twice. The team then split two games with No. 24/25 James Madison.

Lehigh is hitting .289 as a team. Emily Cimino has a team-best .469 through 10 starts. She also leads the starters on the team with a .969 slugging percentage as she has two doubles, one triple and four home runs on the season so far. Cimino also has a team-high nine runs and 11 RBIs.

Arizona State is ranked 15th in the ESPN/USA Softball Poll and holds a No. 17 ranking in the NFCA/USA Today Poll. 2019 NFCA Third-Team All-American Kindra Hackbarth leads the Sun Devil offense with a .424 batting average through 22 starts. Hackbarth has a team-best 26 runs, nine doubles and a .773 slugging percentage. Hackbarth is also adding four homers, 22 RBIs and 11 walks for Arizona State.

New Mexico State is 11-6 but will play Wright State, Arizona State and Oregon State before facing Nebraska on Sunday. The Aggies are hitting .342 as a team and are led by the 2019 WAC Player of the Year Nikki Butler. Butler has started all 17 games and leads the starters with a .479 batting average. She leads the team with 15 runs, 23 hits, four doubles, seven home runs and 20 RBIs. She is also slugging 1.000 with an on-base percentage of .574.

NU SET FOR 55-GAME SCHEDULE

Nebraska is scheduled to play 55 games in 2020, including 18 home games, 20 road games and 17 games at a neutral site.

HUSKERS TRAVEL TO 11 STATES IN 2020

Nebraska will travel to 10 states this season, playing games in Arizona, California, Georgia, Illinois, Kansas, Maryland, Michigan, Minnesota, Missouri, Nebraska and New Mexico.

NU SET FOR SIX OF GAMES AGAINST 2019 WCWS TEAMS

Nebraska is slated to play four of the eight teams that advanced to the Women's College World Series last season, Oklahoma, Florida, Washington and Minnesota. The Huskers will see the first three at the Mary Nutter Collegiate Classic, before traveling to Minnesota for a three-game conference series against the Golden Gophers. Additionally, Nebraska will play six more teams that made it to the NCAA Tournament in 2019 when the team takes on Arkansas, Arizona State, BYU, Illinois, Missouri and Wisconsin.

HOME SWEET HOME

Nebraska hosts a 10-game homestand in April and 2020 is the fourth straight year the Huskers have played at least 10 home games in one month.

ILLINOIS HOSTS BIG TEN TOURNAMENT

The 2020 Big Ten Tournament is set for May 7-9 at Illinois' Eichelberger Field. The top 12 teams in the final regular-season standings will compete in the tournament, with the top four seeds earning a bye.

POSTSEASON FORMAT UNCHANGED

The NCAA Tournament will feature a 64-team field for the 18th consecutive season in 2020 and will include a regional-super regional format for the 16th straight year, with super regionals lasting three days.

OKC HOSTS WCWS

The 2020 Women's College World Series will be held at ASA Hall of Fame Stadium in Oklahoma City for the 23rd straight season and the 30th time overall.

SEASON NOTEBOOK

HUSKERS ADD OREGON STATE TRANSFER

During the offseason, Nebraska added junior infielder Cam Ybarra to its roster. Ybarra spent two seasons at Oregon State before coming to Nebraska.

As a sophomore in 2019, Ybarra appeared in 35 games, which included 31 starts. The Mission Viejo, Calif., native spent most of the season as the designated player. Hitting in the three spot, Ybarra averaged .326 in Pac-12 play, which ranked second on the team. Overall, Ybarra recorded 23 hits and 10 RBIs, while leading the team with nine doubles. In her first season with the Beavers, Ybarra started all 53 games at second base and was named to the Pac-12 All-Freshman and All-Defensive teams. She hit .226 overall and .259 in conference-only games. Ybarra registered 35 hits, scored 14 runs, had five doubles, three homers and 14 RBIs in 2018.

NEBRASKA NICE

The 2020 Husker roster includes nine native Nebraskans, which ties for the most in Rhonda Revelle's 28 seasons as Nebraska's head coach. The Huskers had nine Nebraskans on the 2019 roster as well. Previously, Nebraska had never had more than eight Nebraskans on its roster under Revelle.

The group consists of juniors Olivia Ferrell, Rylie Unzicker and Sarah Yocom, sophomores Payton Huscroft, Carson Fischer, Peyton Glatte, Karlee Seevers and Courtney Wallace and freshman Brooke Andrews.

SUPPORT STAFF UPDATE

Nebraska's Volunteer Coach, former All-American and professional player Taylor Edwards will not be seen in the dugout this spring as she was named to Team USA and will represent the United States in the 2020 Tokyo Olympics this summer. Edwards spent last season as NU's volunteer coach and was with the team up until January before leaving to train with Team USA.

Former Howard pitcher Mackenzi Steele begins her first season as a graduate manager. Steele played under former Husker Tori Tyson at Howard.

SENIOR TRISTEN EDWARDS WILL LEAD HUSKER OFFENSIVE IN 2020

Senior outfielder Tristen Edwards returns for her senior season in 2020 after an explosive junior campaign. Edwards earned back-to-back first-team All-Big Ten honors in 2018 and 2019. She also was an NFCA All-Region pick in 2019.

Nebraska's best hitter in 2019, Edwards led the team with a .376 batting average, a .758 slugging percentage, 42 runs, 56 hits, 12 doubles, 15 homers, 50 RBIs and 33 walks.

EDWARDS GAINES NATIONAL ATTENTION

Edwards was one of 50 players nationally named to the preseason USA Softball Player-of-the-Year Watch List. She became the first Husker on the watch list since former All-American MJ Knighten.

YOUNG PITCHING STAFF IN 2020

Nebraska's core pitching staff consists of junior Olivia Ferrell and sophomores Lindsey Walljasper and Courtney Wallace.

Ferrell enters the season as Nebraska's most experienced pitcher with 168.2 innings pitched over the last two years. She leads the group with 49 career appearances.

In 2018, Ferrell became the first Husker freshman pitcher to start a season opener against a ranked opponent when she kicked off the season against No. 19 BYU. She'll help lead a pitching staff as the only upperclassmen this season.

With only one upperclassmen pitcher, Wallace and Walljasper are expected to carry a large load this season. While they are young, the duo saw a lot of action and impacted the team right away as freshman in 2019. Walljasper made a team-high 31 appearances and racked up 91 strikeouts. Wallace appeared 29 times which ranked second on the team and recorded 63 strikeouts.

Sophomore Karlee Seevers also adds depth to the pitching staff in 2020.

IT'S IN THE CLUB

Several Huskers have been teammates long before arriving in Lincoln, playing together in high school and on the same club team. California natives Tristen Edwards, Cam Ybarra and Keana "KP" Pola played for the Corona Angels. In Nebraska, Rylie Unzicker, Payton Huscroft, Olivia Ferrell, Carson Fischer, Peyton Glatte, Courtney Wallace and Brooke Andrews all played for Nebraska Gold.

WALLACE, WALLJASPER RETURN AFTER BIG FRESHMEN SEASONS IN 2019

Sophomore pitchers/utility players Courtney Wallace and Lindsey Walljasper had impressive freshman seasons in 2019 both offensively and defensively and look to build upon that momentum in 2020.

Wallace played in 47 games last season and hit .227. She tied a Nebraska single-game record with two triples in two separate games. She became the first Husker to record multiple triples in multiple games. The Omaha, Neb., native finished the season with four triples which tied for second in school history among freshman and tied for 10th in school history across all classes.

Lindsey Walljasper started in the circle in the 2019 season opener, becoming just the third freshman to start a season opener since 1995. She saw the most action in 2019, pitching 106.1 innings and recorded a team-high 91 strikeouts.

At the plate, Walljasper hit .255 which ranked second among freshman and fourth overall among regular hitters.

REVELLE REACHES CAREER MILESTONE

On Feb. 8, Nebraska smashed UTEP 16-3 in a five-inning run-rule win. With the win, the Huskers gave Head Coach Rhonda Revelle her 1,000th win overall as a head coach. This includes her eight wins with Nebraska Wesleyan in 1987. Revelle became the 14th active D1 coach to claim 1,000 career victories.

NEBRASKA NOTES

EDWARDS OFF TO A HOT START

As expected, senior Tristen Edwards has been impressive throughout the first four weekends. Edwards leads the Husker starters with a .417 batting average, a .933 slugging percentage, 23 runs, 24 hits, seven doubles and eight home runs.

In fact, Edwards is the only Big Ten player with at least 20 runs and 20 hits this season as of March 4.

In Nebraska's opening weekend at the Troy Cox Classic in Las Cruces, N.M last weekend and was named the Big Ten Player of the Week for her efforts. Edwards started all five games and led the team at the plate going 7-for-16 (.438) with nine runs and five RBIs. She drew five walks to finish with an on-base percentage of .550 and slugged 1.313 with two doubles and four homers.

At the Mary Nutter Collegiate Clasic, Edwards led Nebraska going 8-for-16 (.500) with five runs, two doubles, two homers and seven RBIs. She slugged 1.000 over the weekend.

Most recently, Edwards went 6-for-14 (.429) with seven runs, two doubles, two homers and four RBIs at the Mizzou Tournament.

Edwards is moving her way up in several other Husker career categories.

A SENIOR CLASS AWARD CANDIDATE

Senior outfielder Tristen Edwards was selected as one of 30 candidates for the Senior CLASS Award, announced on Feb. 18. To be eligible for the award, a student-athlete must be classified as an NCAA Division I senior and have notable achievements in four areas of excellence: community, classroom, character and competition.

FERRELL A DOUBLE THREAT

Not only does junior pitcher Olivia Ferrell lead the Husker pitching staff in ERA (4.17), appearances (13), starts (10), innings pitched (50.1) and strikeouts (31), she also has been impressive at the plate as well for Nebraska. Ferrell leads Nebraska with a .450 batting average through 14 games played. She is also slugging .850 with two doubles and two home runs. Additionally, Ferrell has been even more remarkable this season against ranked teams, hitting a team-high .500 (4-for-8). The Huskers have played six games against ranked teams so far this season (Arkansas, Oklahoma, Washington, Florida, Missouri (2)) and will play another ranked foe this weekend in Arizona State.

Most recently, Ferrell went 5-for-9 (.556) with one double, one home run, three runs and three RBIs through three starts at the Mizzou Tournament.

YBARRA MAKING IMMEDIATE IMPACT

A new addition to the roster has already made an impact on the team through the first 18 games. Oregon State transfer Cam Ybarra has started every game at second base for the Huskers. In the opening weekend, Ybarra ranked second on the team with a .323 batting average. Overall, Ybarra is hitting .230 and ranks second with 14 hits and five doubles.

Additionally, Ybarra started her Husker career with an eight-game hit streak. Overall, Ybarra has had a hit in all but three games for Nebraska in 2020.

UNZICKER ADDING OFFENSIVE SPARK

Junior outfielder Rylie Unzicker has gotten hot at the plate. She's hitting .324 overall which ranks fifth on the team, but has been even more impressive lately. Last weekend at the Mizzou Tournament, Unzicker went 7-for-15 (.467) with five runs, three doubles, one homer and six RBIs through four starts. Over the last six games, Unzicker is hitting 9-for-19 (.474).

REVELLE APPROACHING NU MILESTONE

Head Coach Rhonda Revelle enters the weekend with 997 victories at Nebraska. With three wins this weekend, Revelle will become just the eighth active D1 coach to earn 1,000 wins at his or her current school.

Nebraska has won 62 games in its 24 NCAA Tournament appearances while posting an overall record of 62-52 (.544 winning percentage). The Huskers' 62 postseason wins rank 19th in NCAA history.

30 ACADEMIC ALL-AMERICANS

A total of 22 Huskers have combined to earn 30 CoSIDA Academic All-America honors, including eight first-team accolades. The 30 academic All-Americans are the most of any softball program in the country and rank third among all female athletic programs in NCAA history.

27 ALL-AMERICANS

Nebraska has produced 27 All-Americans in school history, including eight first-team All-Americans, seven two-time honorees and a pair of three-time All-Americans.

24 NCAA TOURNAMENT APPEARANCES

In the 39 years softball has been an NCAA sport, the Huskers have made 24 appearances in the NCAA Tournament, including 13 straight from 1995 to 2007. Nebraska's 24 postseason appearances rank 13th in NCAA history.

21 ALL-AMERICANS UNDER REVELLE

In her first 27 years as Nebraska's head coach, Rhonda Revelle has guided 13 players to a total of 21 All-America honors.

OPPONENT SCOUTING REPORTS

OREGON STATE

Oregon State has a record of 14-7 but will play Wright State on Thursday before playing the Huskers on Friday.

Last weekend, the Beavers went 4-2 in Honolulu, Hawaii, beating Hawaii (twice), Seattle and Nevada and losing to Nevada and Seattle.

As a team, OSU is hitting .252 but has three hitters that are batting at least .300. Mariah Mazon has a team-high .377 average, while Missy Nunes and Xiao Gin are hitting .348 and .328, respectively. Mazon, Nunes and Gin have started all 21 games for Oregon State so far this season.

However for OSU, the story is in the circle. The Oregon State pitching staff has been impressive in 2020 with a team ERA of just 1.30. The Beavers have given up just 27 earned runs and are averaging under 2.0 runs a game. Additionally, OSU is averaging more than eight strikeouts a game.

Mazon leads the way in the circle as well with a team-high 16 appearances and 13 starts. She's pitched a total of 93.1 innings and has 108 strikeouts. Mazon has a record of 8-5 and a 0.90 ERA.
