- Ohio State and Nebraska are meeting for the 20th time overall and the 15th time as Big Ten foes.
- The Buckeyes lead the all-time series 11-8 and are 8-6 against the Huskers since Nebraska joined the conference in 2011.
- Ohio State has won seven of the last eight meetings including each of its last four in Lincoln.
- The Buckeyes are coming off a great come from behind overtime victory at Iowa on Wednesday. They defeated the Hawkeyes 84-82 to remain undefeated on the season.
- The 7-0 start is the best start to a season for Ohio State since the 2011-12 team won the first 15 games of the season.
- Nebraska comes in at 6-4 overall and 4-2 in the conference. Two of those wins were over Northwestern and Rutgers. Five of Nebraska's games have been decided by single digits including each of the last four by four points or less.
- By contrast, the Buckeyes just played their first game of the season (at Iowa) that was decided by single digits.
- Sophomore Jacy Sheldon continues to lead five Buckeyes in double-figures at 18.3 ppg. She has made at least one three-pointer in each of the last six games. She is also shooting over 67 percent from inside the arc.
- Point guard Madison Greene scored 16 of her team-high 20 points after halftime in the Buckeyes' win at Iowa on Wednesday. She is third on the team in scoring at 14.3 ppg and has a 3-to-1 assist to turnover ratio.
- Freshman Gabby Hutcherson has averaged nearly 25 minutes per game over the last three games and is scoring 8.0 points and grabbing 4.7 rebounds over that stretch.
- The Buckeyes are still shooting over 50 percent as a team through the first seven games. That is fifth-best in the country as is their 58 percent shooting from inside the arc.

RECAPPING THE IOWA GAME

- The Buckeyes had to fight and claw their way out of a 14-point hole and eventually came all the way back for an 84-82 overtime victory.
- It was a true team effort as all nine Buckeyes who played, scored at least two points and contributed in some way. Sophomore Madison Green led the team down the stretch as she scored 16 of her team-high 20 points in the second half.
- Fellow sophomore Jacy Sheldon and senior Braxtin Miller each shot 7-of-15 from the floor and finished with 18 points apiece. Miller had two big buckets in the overtime period.
- Forward Aaliyah Patty was the fourth Buckeye in double figures with 12 points and nine rebounds. Freshman Gabby Hutcherson finished with just five points but her three-pointer with 1:29 to play in regulation gave the Buckeyes their first lead of the second half.
- Redshirt-freshman Rikki Harris came off the bench and played 10 big minutes. She grabbed three rebounds and finished with three points.
- Iowa's Caitlin Clark scored 13 points in the opening quarter, but the Buckeyes did a good job slowing her down after that. She scored just 14 points the rest of the way to finish with 27.
- The Hawkeyes made seven first-half three-pointers to build a 44-32 halftime lead. Iowa made the first bucket of the second half to extend the lead to 14 points and it took the rest of the second half for the Buckeyes to finally close the gap. An Iowa free throw with :54 seconds left evened the game and the teams would trade misses in the final 20 seconds.
- Sheldon's jumper with 1:23 to play in OT gave OSU a two-point lead and the Buckeyes lead 84-82 with :19 seconds to go. Iowa's final shot for three didn't fall and the Buckeyes had just its second win in Iowa City since 2008.

HITTING 100

- Ohio State has topped the 100-point mark twice this season, scoring 103 vs. Kent State and 104 vs. Miami (Ohio).
- This marks just the fifth time in the "non-Kelsey Mitchell Era" that the team has had two 100-point games in the same season.
- The team hit 100 four times during Mitchell's senior year (2017-18) and three times in both her freshman (2014-15) and sophomore (2015-16) seasons.

RARITY IN IOWA CITY

- Wins are not easy to come by in Iowa City for anyone, especially for the Buckeyes.
- Ohio State's comeback overtime victory at Iowa on Jan. 13 was just the second win in Carver-Hawkeye Arena for the Buckeyes since 2008 and just the 10th win all time.
- The win also snapped Iowa's 42-game home winning streak.

RECORD TURNS...IN A GOOD WAY

- The Buckeyes obviously did a lot right in their runaway 103-47 victory over Kent State on Dec. 2.
- Scoring over 100 points is a little easier when you don't turn the ball over and the Buckeyes did that in record fashion.
- The three turnovers were the fewest in a game in school history.
- The three turnovers also tied Northwestern from Feb. 10, 2020 for the fewest turnovers in a game by a Big Ten team since 2011.

BEST ASSIST-TO-TURNOVER RATIO

- Ohio State dished-out 23 assists to go along with the school-record low three turnovers in their win over Kent State on Dec. 2.
- That 7.7-to-1 ratio is the highest ratio in any game in school history.
- It was also the best ratio by a Power Five team since the start of the 2016-17 season.
- Eight of the 11 Buckeyes had at least one assist while Braxtin Miller and Madison Greene led the team with six apiece.

HITTING PAUSE

- The Buckeyes opened the year with four dominating victories but then had to hit the pause button on Dec. 14 due to COVID-19 protocols.
- The pause was extended to a seven-day shutdown on Dec. 18 and the team had to postpone three games.
- Ohio State returned to the court vs. Penn State on Jan. 4, marking a 24-day break between games.

POSTSEASON BAN

On Dec. 22, Ohio State released a statement: "The Ohio State University Department of Athletics is currently working cooperatively with the NCAA Enforcement Staff on an infractions case involving three sports programs: fencing, women's golf and women's basketball. Ohio State has self-imposed post-season competition bans for each of the sports for the 2020-21 year. As always, we are focused on supporting our student-athletes. NCAA rules and procedures prohibit us from sharing morning information at this time."

SERIES HISTORY VS. NEBRASKA

- Saturday’s game will be the 20th meeting all-time between Ohio State and Nebraska.
- Ohio State stopped Nebraska’s five-game win streak in the series in 2015 and has since won seven of the last eight meetings.
- The Buckeyes lead the series 8-6 since Nebraska joined the conference in 2011.
- With wins in its last four trips to Lincoln, OSU has taken a 5-3 edge in games at Nebraska.
- The 39 points OSU scored in the game on Feb. 14, 2013 were the fewest points scored by Ohio State in a Big Ten game.

MCGUFF VS. NEBRASKA

- Head coach Kevin McGuff is 7-3 in his meetings against Nebraska.
- He lost 61-58 in the opening round of the 2008 NCAA Tournament in College Park, Md., when he was coaching at Xavier. He also lost his first meeting with Nebraska as Ohio State’s coach in 2014.
- Since then, McGuff and the Buckeyes have won seven of the last eight games in the series, including the last four contests in Lincoln.

LAST SEASON VS. NEBRASKA

- The Buckeyes swept the season series last year with the Cornhuskers, winning an overtime thriller in Lincoln and then stifling the Huskers a little more than two weeks later in Columbus.
- **In the first meeting**, Ohio State trailed by 15 points at halftime and slowly chipped away the entire second half before making two clutch baskets in overtime to steal an 80-74 road victory at Nebraska on Feb. 2.
- The Buckeyes allowed a season-high 49 points in the first half but limited Nebraska to just 25 points in the second half and overtime.
- The 15-point halftime deficit was the largest halftime deficit OSU has overcome in a victory in program history.
- Three Buckeyes recorded double-doubles in the game and five players reached double figures led by Braxtin Miller with 17 points. She made three three-pointers and also dished-out a team-high four assists.
- Dorka Juhasz scored 12 points and grabbed a game-high tying 13 rebounds for her fourth double-double of the season. Aaliyah Patty notched her third career double-double with 12 points and 12 rebounds. Freshman guard Kierstan Bell scored 16 points and had career-highs of 12 rebounds and four blocks for her first collegiate double-double. Her two big baskets late in regulation finally pulled the Buckeyes even and forced overtime.

- The game was truly a story of two halves for the Buckeyes. Nebraska shot 55 percent and made six threes in route to 49 first half points. But after halftime was a different story. The Buckeye defense limited Nebraska to just 6-of-38 shooting for 15.8 percent and forced 10 turnovers.
- Despite the defensive effort, the Buckeye needed all of the second half time make up the 15 point halftime deficit. They cut the lead to three at one point in the third quarter but the Cornhuskers pushed the lead back to 59-53 heading to the fourth.
- A lay-up by Bell with 5:39 to play in regulation cut the margin to two but again, Nebraska shoved the lead back out to six a minute later.
- Bell knocked away a pass in the back court and drove in for a lay-up with 1:45 to play to cut the Nebraska lead to two. Then after another Husker miss inside, Bell knocked down a jumper from just outside the free throw line on the ensuing possession to tie the game with 1:03 left. Neither team was able to convert in the final minute of regulation and the game headed to overtime tied at 68-68.
- Nebraska took a 74-72 lead on a free throw with 2:40 to play in the extra session but that would be the Huskers’ final points. Patty’s three-point play and Miller’s three gave the Buckeyes the lead for good and secured their second overtime road victory of the season.
- **The second meeting** wasn’t as thrilling. After a sluggish first quarter, the Buckeyes outscored Nebraska 21-8 in the second quarter and would hold the Huskers at arm’s length the rest of the way for a 65-52 victory.
- The 52 points were the fewest Nebraska has scored in the all-time series with Ohio State.
- Braxtin Miller was the star of the night again as she finished with 13 points and in the process, notched her 1,000 career point.
- Dorka Juhasz registered another double-double with 16 points and a career-high tying 16 rebounds.
- Aaliyah Patty was the third Buckeye in double figures with 11 points to go along with seven rebounds.
- Nebraska shot just 34 percent for the game and committed 16 turnovers.

JUHASZ NEARING 1,000

- Dorka Juhasz has scored 798 points in her Buckeye career and this season, she will likely become the 35th player in school history to record 1,000 career points
- Juhasz is just 202 points away
- She also has pulled down 576 career rebounds. If she remains on the same pace as her first two seasons, she would likely become the ninth player in school history with more than 1,000 career points and 750 career rebounds

JUHASZ NAMED PRESEASON ALL-BIG 10

- Buckeye junior Dorka Juhasz enters the season as one of the best post players in the conference and was recognized as such as she was named to the 10-member Preseason All-Big Ten Team.
- Juhasz led the team in scoring and rebounding each of the last two seasons, including averaging 13.2 points and 9.4 rebounds a season ago.
- She earned first team All-Big Ten honors last year after being named to the second team as a freshman in 2018-19

CREATING THE EXTRA POSSESSION

- When the Buckeyes commit fewer turnovers and have more rebounds in the same game, thus creating more possessions, good things usually happen.
- Under McGuff, Ohio State is 55-1 when creating those extra possessions.

SHARING THE LOVE

- Under head coach Kevin McGuff, the Buckeyes have dished-out 20 or more assists in a game 38 times and are 37-1 in those games.
- Dating back to the 2009-10 season, the Buckeyes have won 66 of the last 69 games when sharing on 20 or more of their field goals.

HITTING THE GLASS

- When the Buckeyes win the battle on the boards, they usually end up winning the game.
- Ohio State is 92-12 under McGuff when out-rebounding the opponent.

250-STRAIGHT WITH A THREE

- Ohio State has made at least one three-point field goal in 250-straight games.
- The last time the Buckeyes failed to make a three-pointer in a game was on Feb. 10, 2013 at Northwestern. OSU was 0-of-6 from long range that game.

- Over the streak, the Buckeyes have made 10 or more threes in a game 52 times.
- Ohio State has made 34.2 percent (1,772-5,187) of its shots from beyond the arc and is averaging 7.1 threes per game during the streak.

MAGIC NUMBER 70

- Head coach Kevin McGuff's style of fast paced offense leads to more possessions and hopefully more points.
- Since he took over at the start of the 2013-14 season, the Buckeyes are 102-11 when scoring at least 80 points and 141-24 when scoring at least 70 points.
- This season, the Buckeyes have scored 80 or more points six times.
