HUSKERS SALUTE NINE SENIORS VS. ILLINI

The Nebraska swimming and diving team plays host to its lone dual meet of the abbreviated 2021 season today, when the Huskers take on the Fighting Illini of Illinois at the Devaney Natatorium.

The Huskers will honor nine seniors who have developed into the most accomplished class of swimmers and divers at Nebraska in the past 20 years. The 2021 seniors have led Nebraska to their best Big Ten Conference finishes in school history while also joining forces to capture six individual All-America awards. They have combined for nearly 240 top-five individual finishes and more than 80 individual titles in their careers. Outside the pool, every member of the class has captured at least one Academic All-Big Ten award, while the group has combined for seven CSCAA Scholar All-America honors and 11 Big Ten Distinguished Scholar awards.

Abi Knapton, a fifth-year senior from Omaha, Neb., headlines the seniors making their final appearances in competition at the Devaney Center today. The most successful diver in Nebraska history, Knapton is a four-time All-American who has claimed first-team All-America honors on platform on three occasions at the NCAA Championships. Knapton, who redshirted in 2019-20, was a finalist for Nebraska's Outstanding Female of the Year across all sports in 2018-19 after being named Nebraska's Outstanding Female Newcomer of the Year across all its programs in 2016-17. A two-time NCAA Zone Champion on platform, Knapton owns 30 career titles including a sweep of the one- and three-meter boards at Iowa last weekend. Knapton is a three-time CSCAA Scholar All-American.

Knapton returns to lead one of the most talented diving corps in Nebraska history, including 2020 CSCAA All-American Sara Troyer (Goshen, Ind.), 2019 NCAA qualifier Jessica Warak (Omaha, Neb.) senior Grace Tiernon (Fishers, Ind.), junior Hallie Roman (Port Huron, Mich.) and redshirt freshman Reagan Hinze (Conroe, Texas).

Autumn Haebig (Grafton, Wis.) captured CSCAA All-America honors in the 200 freestyle in 2020 and was scheduled to swim in the 100, 200 and 500 free at the 2020 NCAA Championships. She also competed at nationals in the 100 back, 200 free and 500 free in 2018. A three-time U.S. Olympic Trial qualifier, Haebig holds Nebraska records in five events and brought home a top-eight finish in the 500 free at the 2020 Big Ten Championships. She owns 28 career individual titles, including three last weekend at Iowa. Haebig joined Knapton as a CSCAA Scholar All-American in 2018.

Madison Coughlen joins Haebig as a CSCAA All-American in the pool and the classroom for the Huskers. The senior from Frisco, Texas swam to a school-record time in the 200 butterfly last season and finished sixth in the event at the 2020 Big Ten Championships on her way to All-America honors. An NCAA qualifier in both the 200 fly and 400 IM last season, she owns nine career titles.

Junior Audrey Coffey (Naperville, Ill.) also returns to the water after earning All-America honors in the 1,650 free in 2020. The school-record holder in both the 1,000 (9:48.15) and 1,500-meter free (16:48.76), Coffey was also a CSCAA Scholar All-American in 2020. She opened the 2021 season with a win in the 1,000 free at Iowa last weekend.

Nebraska's senior class also features Izzie Murray (North Bend, Ohio), who posted a seventh-place finish in the 200 fly at the 2019 NCAA Championships. Murray owns 11 career individual titles and is a two-time CSCAA Scholar All-American. She is also a leader for the Huskers in the community as a Sam Foltz 27 Hero Leadership Award winner in 2020.

Swimmers Gabby Baratta (Old Tappan, N.J.), Jessica Pentlarge (San Diego, Calif.) and Mira Rhodes round out the list of active seniors prepared to compete for the Huskers today against the Illini. Nebraska will also honor Sutton Marvin for her career contributions, while current senior Rachel Powers is not active on this year's roster while redshirting due to an injury.

Illinois comes to Nebraska following a 173-122 season-opening loss at Purdue last Saturday. The Fighting Illini suffered a 185-115 loss to the Huskers last season in Lincoln. Nebraska is 7-2 against Illinois as Big Ten dual opponents, meeting every season since the Huskers joined the conference in 2011-12. The Huskers own five straight wins in the series.
